Series Notes: Alabama and Missouri will meet for the sixth time on Saturday. The Crimson Tide leads the all-time series, 3-2, and won the most recent meeting, 42-13, at the 2014 SEC Championship Game in Atlanta, Ga. Alabama has won the last three contests against the Tigers and welcomes Missouri to Tuscaloosa for the first time in series history. Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 2-0 in his career against Missouri, with both wins coming during his tenure at UA. Missouri head coach Barry Odom is in his third season with the Tigers and will be facing Alabama for the first time in his career on Saturday.

RANKINGS: Alabama remains No. 1 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls this week following the Tide's 65-31 win at Arkansas last Saturday. Missouri is unranked following the Tigers' 37-35 loss at South Carolina.

NEXT GAME: Alabama travels to Knoxville to face Tennessee for the 101st time in series history. The Crimson Tide leads the all-time series 55-37-8 (54-38-7 after vacations) and has won the last 11 between the two teams, including a 45-7 win last season in Tuscaloosa. Alabama and Tennessee have met every season since 1928, with the exception of 1943 when neither school fielded a team due to World War II.

EASTERN STREAK: Alabama's 26-23 win over Georgia in the 2018 College Football Playoff National Championship Game was the Crimson Tide's 21st consecutive victory over an SEC Eastern Division opponent, dating back to a 35-21 loss at then-No. 19 South Carolina on Oct. 9, 2010. The 21 wins include a 4-0 record in SEC Championship Games. During the current run, the Tide is 8-0 vs. Tennessee, 4-0 vs. Florida (2-0 in SECCG), 3-0 vs. Georgia (1-0 in SEC CG, 1-0 in CFP CG), 2-0 vs. Missouri (1-0 in SECCG), 2-0 vs. Kentucky and Vanderbilt. Overall, under Nick Saban the Tide is 31-3 (.912) against the SEC East, including a 5-1 (.833) record in the SEC Championship Game.

ALABAMA HOMECOMING ALL-TIME: Alabama's 41-9 victory over Arkansas in its 2017 Homecoming Game improved the Crimson Tide's all-time record on Homecoming to 83-13-1 (.861). The victory over the Razorbacks extended Alabama's winning streak in Homecoming Games to 15. The last Homecoming Game loss for the Tide was a 35-21 defeat to LSU on Nov. 3, 2001. This will be Alabama's first meeting with Missouri on Homecoming weekend.

22 IN A ROW AT HOME: With its 56-14 win over Louisiana on Sept. 29, Alabama has now won 22 consecutive games at Bryant-Denny Stadium, the second-longest home winning streak in school history. The Crimson Tide won 24 in a row at home (Bryant-Denny and Legion Field combined) from Sept. 18, 1971 to Nov. 9, 1974.

SABAN'S SEC HOME RECORD: Alabama head coach Nick Saban owns a 55-10 (.846) all-time record when playing in a Southeastern Conference game at home, going 16-4 (.800) during his time at LSU and owning a 39-6 (.867) record at Alabama. While with the Crimson Tide, Saban has posted five perfect home SEC slates and has not lost more than one home conference game in any season other than 2007 (two losses). All six of his losses at home have been by seven points or less with half of those by three or fewer. Under Saban, Alabama has outscored its SEC home opponents 1,532-620 (34.0-13.8 points per game) and has limited the opposition to 14 points or less on 29 occasions, including six shutout victories.

500 YARDS IN TOTAL OFFENSE FOR A UA-RECORD SIXTH GAME IN A ROW: Alabama's 639 yards in total offense against Arkansas on Oct. 6 marks the sixth time the Crimson Tide has topped 500 yards this season and the 18th time in the last 50 games dating to the start of the 2015 campaign. This is Alabama's first six-game run of 500-yard total offense performances in program history.

45-FOR-6: With its 65-31 win over Arkansas on Oct. 6, Alabama has scored 45 or more points in six consecutive games for the first time in school history. The 1945 Crimson Tide held the previous record with four in a row (Kentucky, 60-19; Vanderbilt, 71-0; Pensacola Naval Air Station, 55-6; Mississippi State, 55-13).

POINTS OFF TURNOVERS: Alabama's scoring differential stands at 40.0 points per game (56.0-16.0) in 2018. A big reason for the margin is the Crimson Tide's performance following a turnover. UA has scored 80 points off 13 opponent giveaways this season, scoring on 12 of the turnovers and intercepting a pass to end the first half against Louisiana on Sept. 29. The Tide defense has directly accounted for 28 points on four interception returns, while the offense has posted 52 points on its eight post-turnover possessions.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM: Alabama has won 22 straight and 37 of the last 38 games at its home stadium. Prior to the Sept. 19, 2015 loss to Ole Miss, the Crimson Tide had not lost a game at home since falling to Texas A&M in 2012. Alabama boasts the third-best all-time home winning percentage in the FBS at .829 (262-53-3) at Bryant-Denny Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. Houston is the leader with a winning percentage of .833 (25-5) at TDECU Stadium (2014). Georgia Southern is second at .830 (191-39) at Paulson Stadium (1984), just percentage points ahead of the Tide. Boise State's Albertsons Stadium (1970) is fourth at .826 (261-55), while Marshall's Joan C. Edwards Stadium (1991) is fifth at .821 (156-34). The Crimson Tide is 75-7 (.915) and Bryant-Denny Stadium during the tenure of Nick Saban and 71-4 (.947) since the 2008 season.

UNRANKED, NO PROBLEM UNDER SABAN: With its 65-31 win over Arkansas on Oct. 6, Alabama has defeated 78 consecutive unranked teams under head coach Nick Saban, the longest streak in FBS history. Alabama's last loss to an unranked team was a 17-10 defeat at the hands of Auburn on Nov. 24, 2007. The current streak began with a win over Colorado on Dec. 30, 2007 in the Independence Bowl. The previous record was 72 games, shared by Miami (Fla.) (1984-95) and Florida (1989-2000). Under Saban, Alabama holds an 82-3 (.965) (78-3, .963 after vacations) mark against unranked opponents.

OUTSIDE THE TOP 15: In addition to its 78-game winning streak against unranked teams, Alabama has lost just one game to a team ranked outside the top 15 in the Associated Press poll since the start of the 2008 season (No. 19 South Carolina in 2010). For perspective, no team in the FBS has lost fewer than 10 games to teams outside the top 15 in that same time frame.

SABAN'S 69th GAME AS AP NO. 1: The matchup with Missouri on Saturday will be Nick Saban's 69th career game coaching Alabama as the Associated Press No. 1 team, the most games coached as No. 1 at one school. At 61-7 (.897), Saban has won more games coaching as the No. 1 team at one school than any other coach in college football history. Woody Hayes (Ohio State) and Bobby Bowden (Florida State) are tied for second with 40 wins apiece. Bowden was 40-5 (.889) at Florida State as No. 1 and Hayes went 40-6 (.870) with Ohio State. This is also Alabama's 79th week as the No. 1 team in the AP rankings during the Saban era. In addition to the 69 game weeks at No. 1, Alabama was ranked No. 1 during its bye weeks in 2008, 2012, 2013, 2016 and 2017 and topped the postseason poll following its five national championship victories under Saban.

ALABAMA AT NO. 1 UNDER SABAN: Alabama's 61 wins at No. 1 under Nick Saban are 49 more victories than any other No. 1 team since 2007 (12 - Ohio State) and the 68 games played are 53 more than the next-highest total (15 - Ohio State). The Crimson Tide is one of 15 teams to appear at No. 1 since 2007, the other 14 have a collective record of 75-16 (.824). Six of the 16 losses those teams have suffered have come at the hands of the Tide. Of the Tide's 61 wins under Saban since 2007, 13 have been by 45 points or more. No other team in that span has more than 12 wins by any margin.

ALABAMA VS. THE NATION AT NO. 1: Alabama is 76-10 (.884) when playing as the nation's No. 1 team over the last 50 years. The 76 wins and 86 games played are more than any other program in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide has played 92 games at No. 1 since reaching the top spot for the first time in 1961 and has an all-time record of 80-12 (.870).

MORE THAN A DECADE AT NO. 1: With Alabama's preseason No. 1 ranking, the Crimson Tide has now been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll at least once each season since 2008. The 11-year streak is the longest in the history of the AP rankings. The previous long streak was seven seasons by Miami (Fla.) from 1986-92.

CRIMSON TIDE NO. 1 AT NO. 1: With its Oct. 7 ranking at No. 1, Alabama has sat atop the Associated Press Top 25 a total of 110 times since the poll's inception in 1936, which ranks No. 1 in AP history. Ohio State held the previous record with 105 appearances in the top spot.

LONGEST ACTIVE TOP-10 STREAK: Alabama's No. 1 ranking in the Oct. 7 Associated Press Top 25 marks the 50th consecutive week the Tide has appeared in the AP top-10, which leads the Football Bowl Subdivision for most consecutive weeks in the top-10 in the writers' poll. Alabama's last appearance below No. 10 was the week of Sept. 27, 2015, when the Tide was No. 13 heading to a matchup at Georgia, which resulted in a 38-10 UA victory over the No. 8 Bulldogs. The Tide has also appeared in 168 consecutive AP polls, dating back to the 2007 Independence Bowl vs. Colorado.

SABAN LEADS IN WINS VS. TOP-5 TEAMS: Alabama's 26-23 win over then-No. 3 Georgia in the CFP National Championship Game was Nick Saban's 21st career victory against a team ranked in the top 5 of the Associated Press Top 25, the most in college football history. Saban's 21-12 career record in those contests gives him a .636 winning percentage, which is also college football's best. Following Saban on the all-time victory list are Bobby Bowden (18/.378 winning percentage), Barry Switzer (15/.516), Woody Hayes (15/.516), Steve Spurrier (15/.429) and Lou Holtz (15/.419). That record includes five wins in the College Football Playoff: No. 3 Michigan State (38-0) and No. 1 Clemson (45-40) in 2015; No. 4 Washington (24-7) in 2016 and victories over No. 1 Clemson (24-6) and No. 3 Georgia (26-23) in 2017. Alabama also went 3-0 in BCS National Championship Games (vs. Texas, 37-21, 2009; vs. LSU, 21-0, 2011; vs. Notre Dame, 42-14, 2012).

AGAINST THE TOP 10: Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 27-9 overall record against top-10 teams, including a 12-3 mark vs. the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff. In Saban's five national championship seasons at Alabama, his teams have gone 17-2 against top-10 opponents.

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 54-14 (.794) against the Associated Press Top 25, including a 29-8 (.784) mark against AP top-10 teams since the start of 2008. In 2017, Alabama faced 10 teams ranked in the AP poll, going 9-1 and outscoring those opponents by an average score of 38.0-17.3. Alabama finished 8-1 in 2015 against the AP Top 25 after going 5-2 in 2014, 3-2 in 2013 and 5-1 in 2012. The Tide held a 4-1 mark vs. top-25 teams in 2011 and went 5-3 in 2010.

SABAN VS. AP TOP 25: Alabama's 45-23 win over then-No. 22 Texas A&M on Sept. 22 was head coach Nick Saban's 78th career wins vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams, good for third all-time. Former Penn State head coach Joe Paterno leads the list with 86, four victories ahead of Florida State's Bobby Bowden (82). Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant is fourth at 66. Former Duke, Florida and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier is fifth at 64. Saban's winning percentage against AP ranked teams (78-39, .667) tops Bryant (.592), Bowden (.557), Spurrier (.529) and Paterno (.512).

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 128 of 131 regular season games that have had national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU during the 2010 calendar year, UA was essentially eliminated from a chance to keep itself in the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 11 seasons.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 781 of the 1,143 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 473-129-8 (.782) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 114-17 (.870) mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 168th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid-1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started seven seasons at No. 1 (2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 28 seasons (1991-2018), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and six USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017) coaches poll national titles.

ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 131 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014, 14-1 in both 2015 and 2016, and was 13-1 this past season. Ohio State is second with 118 wins, followed by Boise State (114), Oklahoma (110) and Clemson (110) to round out the top five.

NON-OFFENSIVE TDs IN THE SABAN ERA: Junior Shyheim Carter's fourth quarter 44-yard interception return for a touchdown at Arkansas on Oct. 6 is Alabama's 67th non-offensive touchdown of the Nick Saban era and its sixth this season. Alabama totaled a single-season record 15 non-offensive scores in 2016, which led the Football Bowl Subdivision and was the most in a season by a FBS team in the last 20 years. Alabama scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 consecutive games dating from to the CFP semifinal vs. Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015, to the Texas A&M game on Oct. 22, 2016, and had 14 non-offensive touchdowns in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return.

FIRST TIME STARTERS: Freshman Patrick Surtain II and redshirt senior Christian Miller became the 13th and 14th Crimson Tide student-athletes to make their first career starts this season when they took the field for the Tide's opening defensive snap against Texas A&M Sept. 22. Surtain II and Miller join sophomore Jerry Jeudy, who made his first career start against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 and 11 Crimson Tide student-athletes who started for the first time against vs. Louisville on Sept. 1. Starters against the Cardinals included offensive lineman Alex Leatherwood, wide receivers Henry Ruggs III and DeVonta Smith, quarterback Tua Tagovailoa, defensive lineman Quinnen Williams and defensive backs Saivion Smith, Xavier McKinney and Shyheim Carter, placekickers Austin Jones and Joseph Bulovas and punter Skyler DeLong.

ALABAMA ON 2018 NFL ROSTERS: The National Football League season opened with a league-leading 54 former Alabama players dotting the rosters of 27 of the league's 32 teams. Among the 54 are 16 players from the Tide's 2017 national championship team, the most of any college football team from a season ago. Alabama also boasts an astounding 16 defensive players from its 2016 and 2017 teams currently on NFL rosters.

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 10 drafts (77) than any other college in the nation. Twenty-six of those picks have been first-round selections and 41 have gone in the first two rounds. The list of 77 features five Super Bowl champions, nine Pro Bowl selections, six All-Pro members and one Offensive Rookie of the Year. Alabama has had 22 players selected in the last two drafts, including eight in the first round and 11 in the first two rounds. The Tide had six players picked on offense, 15 on defense and one specialist in the 2018 draft. The defensive draftee total from the last two drafts includes all 11 of Alabama's 2016 season-opening defensive starters.

NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw 12 former UA players selected in the 2018 NFL Draft, including four first-round picks in Minkah Fitzpatrick (No. 11, Miami Dolphins), Da’Ron Payne (No. 13, Washington Redskins), Rashaan Evans (No. 22, Tennessee Titans) and Calvin Ridley (No. 26, Atlanta Falcons). Ronnie Harrison (No. 93, Jacksonville Jaguars) followed in the third round with Da’Shawn Hand (No. 114, Detroit Lions) and Anthony Averett (No. 118, Baltimore Ravens) going in the fourth round. JK Scott (No. 172, Green Bay Packers) was selected in the fifth round while Shaun Dion Hamilton (No. 197, Washington Redskins) and Bradley Bozeman (No. 215, Baltimore Ravens) were chosen in round six. Bo Scarbrough (No. 236, Dallas Cowboys) and Joshua Frazier (No. 246, Pittsburgh Steelers) rounded out the former Alabama players taken in the seventh round. The 12 selections is a new high for UA players taken in one draft under head coach Nick Saban. The total is also the most in school history, surpassing the 10 Tide players chosen in 2017 and in what was a 32-round draft in 1945.

OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama’s success on the field over the past 11 seasons under Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide’s success in the classroom. The 2018 squad enters the season with 12 players who already had degrees in hand going into the season, which ties for eighth nationally first in the Southeastern Conference. The 12 graduates are: Keaton Anderson, Joshua Casher, Ronnie Clark, Johnny Dwight, Hale Hentges, Austin Jones, Derek Kief, Christian Miller, Jamey Mosley, Richie Petitbon, Ross Pierschbacher and Deionte Thompson. Since 2013, Alabama has seen 136 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate) by players who were still suiting up for the Crimson Tide following graduation. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen 15 players earn a master’s degree before stepping foot on the field for the final time.

ALABAMA’S HALE HENTGES NAMED A SEMIFINALIST FOR THE WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY: Alabama tight end Hale Hentges was named a semifinalist for the 2018 William V. Campbell Trophy, the National Football Foundation announced Sept. 26. Hentges is among 179 candidates from all levels of the NCAA and NAIA named to this year’s semifinalist list. Barrett Jones was Alabama’s first Campbell Trophy recipient in 2012. The National Football Foundation will announce this year’s finalists for the award on Oct. 31. This year’s winner will be announced at the 61st NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 4 in New York.

HENTGES ONE OF 30 SEMIFINALISTS FOR THE SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Alabama senior tight end Hale Hentges was named to a list of 30 candidates for the 2018 Senior CLASS Award, it was announced Sept. 26. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Hentges joins former Crimson Tide stars Barrett Jones (2012), AJ McCarron, (2013), Reggie Ragland (2015), O.J. Howard (2016) and JK Scott (2017) as the sixth UA player to be named a semifinalist under head coach Nick Saban. The 30 candidates will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season. This year’s winner will be announced during the bowl season in early January following nationwide balloting by media, coaches and fans.

GRADUATING WITH THE BEST: The Alabama football team has not only been dominant on the field, but also in the classroom. The Crimson Tide is tied for seventh among Associated Press Preseason Top 25 teams for its graduation rate of 84 percent. Ahead of Alabama were Stanford (96 percent), Notre Dame (96), UCF (92), Miami (Fla.) (88), Virginia Tech (86) and Clemson (84). Mississippi State and Penn State tied with the Tide for sixth place. Alabama’s percentage tied for fourth among Southeastern Conference football programs.

ALABAMA SHARES 2017 AFCA ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD: The Alabama football program was among seven recipients of the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. The award is the first for the Crimson Tide. Alabama is one of seven programs that recorded a 100-percent graduation rate for members of its 2010 freshman football class. Joining the Tide as honorees this year are Cincinnati, Middle Tennessee, Northwestern, Utah, Utah State and Virginia. The Academic Achievement Award is presented annually to the school or schools with the highest score in the NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and a federal graduation rate of 75 percent or higher. The GSR is based on a six-year graduation window for student-athletes and was developed by the NCAA as part of its academic reform initiative to more accurately assess the academic success of student-athletes. The GSR holds institutions accountable for transfer students, unlike the federal graduation rate. The GSR also accounts for midyear enrollees.

ACADEMIC PROWESS: The Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the academic highlights under Nick Saban.

- A total of 12 Crimson Tide players will take the field with their degrees in hand for the season opener with Louisville.
- Earned Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 84 in 2016-17 tied for fourth among SEC football programs.
- In 2017, Alabama ranked among the national leaders with 25 graduates on its roster during postseason play. The Tide led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play in 2015 (29), 2014 (22) and 2013 (28), as well.

- Alabama's five national title football teams under Nick Saban (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017) included 114 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That 2011 team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- In 2017-18, Alabama finished second in the number of football student-athletes being named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll with 10 honorees. Alabama topped that list in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and shared the top spot in the 2015-16 academic year

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY: Last season, Alabama worked 400-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered its time across numerous areas during the 2017 season including in schools, hospitals, with Habitat for Humanity and on campus.

ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE: The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won 11 national championships in five different sports and 24 SEC championships in eight different sports.
- Alabama claimed another SEC team title during the 2017-18 academic year with men's track & field winning the 2018 SEC indoor title.
- On a department-wide basis, Alabama's approximately 600 student-athletes earned a 3.27 grade point average. All 17 programs earned better than a 2.75 GPA with 15 earning better than a 3.0. A total of eight Tide teams earned over a 3.5 GPA in 2017-18, marking the eighth year in a row that at least five teams have met that standard.
- Alabama was also prolific when it came to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, earning the accolade 391 times during the 2017-18 academic year. The Crimson Tide had 106, 57 and 136 student-athletes named to the SEC Fall, Winter and Spring Academic Honor Rolls and 92 named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- Alabama once again led the nation in Academic All-America honors, totaling 11 during the 2017-18 academic year. The Crimson Tide's total makes Alabama the only school to earn double-digit honors the last five years in a row.
- Alabama has earned Academic All-America honors a Division I-best 88 times since 2009-10 and 56 times over the last five years. The Tide's five-year total is 11 better than second-place Stanford over that span. Alabama has also made a significant jump in the rankings when it comes to honors since 2000, jumping Notre Dame in 2017-18 to move up to second place with 134.
- Since 2009-10, UA leads all NCAA Division I schools with 88 Academic All-America honors. Stanford is second over that span with 82, while Nebraska is third at 62.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK: Through six games in 2018, Alabama is second in the Southeastern Conference in sacks per game (3.17) with 19 for a loss of 90 yards. Senior Isaiah Buggs leads the Tide with 6.0 sacks (-20 yards) and is tied for second in the SEC in sacks per game (1.00). Redshirt senior Christian Miller ranks No. 5 in the league with 4.5 (-12 yards).

DEFENSIVE SCORING: Alabama's offense isn't the only unit among the leaders nationally in scoring. The Crimson Tide defense is tied for second in the Football Bowl Subdivision in defensive scoring with four touchdowns in 2018. Alabama defensive backs Shyheim Carter (Louisville, Arkansas), Saivion Smith (Arkansas State) and Xavier McKinney (Ole Miss) have each returned interceptions for scores this season, giving the Tide 16 pick-sixes over the last 50 games, dating to the start of the 2015 season.

TIDE AMONG FBS INTERCEPTION LEADERS: Alabama defenders have intercepted 10 passes through six contests this season, which ties for fourth in the Football Bowl Subdivision and leads the SEC. Shyheim Carter, Xavier McKinney and Deionte Thompson share the team lead with two picks apiece while Trevon Diggs, Saivion Smith, Patrick Surtain II and Mack Wilson have all snared one. Carter has returned two of his interceptions for touchdowns while McKinney and Smith each have a pick-six. Carter is one of just four players in the FBS with two interception returns for scores.

FIRST HALF DEFENSE: The Alabama defense has proven to be just as dominant as the Crimson Tide offense in the first two quarters of play this season. The Tide defenders have limited the opposition to just 34 points (four touchdowns, two field goals) and 981 yards of offense (163.5 per game) in the first half in 2018. UA has outscored the opposition by 208 points (238-34) and outgained them by 1,273 yards (2,254-981) before the break this season.

TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS: Alabama's three forced turnovers against Arkansas (1 fumble, 2 interceptions) on Oct. 6 gives the Crimson Tide at least one forced turnover in 48 of its last 50 games dating to the start of the 2015 season. During the current run, the Crimson Tide has forced 85 turnovers (59 interceptions, 26 fumbles) and returned 21 of those miscues for touchdowns.

THREE-AND-OUT: The Alabama defense has totaled 36 three-and-outs in 2018 (6.00 per game) and is tied for third nationally. The Crimson Tide has forced a three-and-out on 36 of 79 drives this season (45.6 percent).

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 196 touchdowns over the last 130 games. That is 51 fewer than the second most in the nation (LSU with 247).

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama has allowed three rushing touchdowns in 2018 and has permitted just 24 scores on the ground in its last 50 games dating to the start of the 2015 season. Alabama allowed nine rushing touchdowns a season ago and led the nation in 2016 with five rushing touchdowns allowed. In 2015, the Crimson Tide allowed only seven rushing touchdowns in 15 games, the second-lowest total in the country. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 80 rushing touchdowns. Ohio State is No. 2 in that category, giving up 125 since 2007, followed by Iowa (132), TCU (142) and Utah (145). Alabama is tied for third nationally in fewest rushing touchdowns allowed this season.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: Clemson's 188 yards in total offense in the Allstate Sugar Bowl last season marked the 48th time in the last 145 games under Nick Saban (since the start of the 2008 season) that the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposition to fewer than 200 yards of total offense.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: The Crimson Tide's defensive performance against Louisiana on Sept. 29 marked the 99th time in 158 games (62.7 percent) under head coach Nick Saban that the Tide has held an opponent to less than 300 yards of total offense. The Tide has now held 11 of its last 20 opponents below 300 yards, dating to the start of the 2017 season.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Alabama has surrendered only 20 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that is the fewest in the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed 15 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game.

THOMPSON LEADING THE WAY: Redshirt junior Deionte Thompson posted a career-high nine tackles in Alabama's win at Arkansas on Oct. 6. The performance continues a strong start to the season for the Orange, Texas, native. He leads the Crimson Tide defense in tackles with 36 stops, including a team-high 23 unassisted, and shares the team lead with two interceptions and ranks second with five pass breakups. His seven passes defended ranks fourth in the Southeastern Conference and his interception total is tied for fifth in the league.

CARTER TWO-FOR-TWO ON INTERCEPTION RETURNS: Shyheim Carter's 44-yard interception return for a touchdown at Arkansas on Oct. 6 was the junior's second career interception and pick-six. Carter recorded his first career interception and score on a 45-yard return against Louisville on Sept. 1. As a team, Alabama has intercepted 10 passes this season with four going back for scores.

DOUBLE-DIGIT TACKLES FOR LOSS: Alabama's 10 tackles for loss against Texas A&M on Sept. 22 marked the second time this season the Crimson Tide has reached double digits in stops behind the line of scrimmage. UA had 11 tackles for loss against Louisville on Sept. 1. Alabama has 43 TFLs this season (-139 yards) and is averaging 7.2 TFLs per game. Senior Isaiah Buggs leads the squad with 6.5 (-20 yards), followed by redshirt senior Christian Miller, redshirt sophomore Quinnen Williams and sophomore Dylan Moses who each have 5.5.

WILLIAMS EQUALS CAREER TACKLES HIGH AGAINST OLE MISS: Defensive lineman Quinnen Williams led Alabama in tackles for the second time this season, equaling his career high with six stops against Ole Miss on Sept. 15. The redshirt sophomore also had six in the Crimson Tide's season-opening win over Louisville on Sept. 1. Williams leads all Tide defensive linemen with 22 tackles and has a team-high six quarterback hurries.

McKINNEY NOTCHES FIRST PICK SIX AT OLE MISS: Defensive back Xavier McKinney's third quarter 30-yard interception return for a touchdown at Ole Miss on Sept. 15 was the sophomore's first pick and score of his career. The interception return was the third for a score for the Tide this season. He picked up his second INT of the season against Louisiana on Sept. 29 to move into a tie for the team lead with Deionte Thompson.

FIRST CAREER INT FOR SMITH AGAINST ARKANSAS STATE: Defensive back Saivion Smith recorded his first career interception against Arkansas State on Sept. 8. The junior picked off an errant Red Wolves pass in the second quarter and returned it 38 yards for a touchdown to give the Tide a 40-0 second quarter lead. The score was the second interception return for a touchdown for UA up to that point in the season.

BUGGS EARNS SEC DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK: Senior Isaiah Buggs was named the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his performance against Texas A&M on Sept. 22. The Ruston, La., native recorded a career-high 3.5 sacks (14 yards) and a career-best 4.0 tackles for loss (-12 yards) against the Aggies. The sack total ranks No. 4 all-time in a single game at Alabama and the tackles for loss number ties for the seventh-most in a game in Alabama history. Buggs leads the Tide with 5.5 sacks (-18 yards) and 6.0 tackles for loss (-16 yards) this season.

MILLER EARNS SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR PERFORMANCE AT OLE MISS: Alabama football's Christian Miller was selected as the Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his performance at Ole Miss on Sept. 15. Miller had a career night in Oxford, helping Alabama to a dominant 62-7 victory over the Rebels. The redshirt senior totaled a career-high five tackles, including 2.5 sacks (-11 yards), also a career-best mark. His 2.5 sacks were part of the Crimson Tide's then-season-high tying four sacks (-16 yards) in the game. Miller helped lead an Alabama defensive effort that limited the SEC's top scoring offense to only seven points, 54.5 points below the Rebels' season average entering the matchup. The Crimson Tide defense limited Ole Miss to just 248 yards of total offense, 348 yards below its season average going into the conference contest.

CAREER NIGHT EARNS WILLIAMS SEC DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK

HONORS: Alabama defensive lineman Quinnen Williams earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his performance against Louisville on Sept. 1. The Birmingham, Ala., native finished with career highs in tackles (six) and tackles for loss (3.5) in his first career start. Williams' previous career best in tackles was five vs. LSU in 2017. His previous high in tackles for loss was two on two occasions.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

NATION'S LEADING PASSER: Sophomore Tua Tagovailoa is the highest rated passer in the nation. He leads all passers in the ESPN's Total QBR metric at 98.5 (out of 100) and his 156.5 NFL passer rating is the highest among all FBS quarterbacks with at least 100 attempts (a perfect NFL rating of 158.3). The sophomore leads the nation in collegiate passer efficiency at 258.4. He has thrown for 1,495 yards on 76-of-101 passing (75.2 percent) with 18 touchdowns and no interceptions while rushing 23 times for 122 yards and two scores. Tagovailoa's 98.5 QBR rating is the highest for a quarterback through six games in a season in the last 15 years (since ESPN began tracking the stat). The previous high was 96.4 by Wisconsin's Russell Wilson in 2011.

NATIONAL RANKINGS: Along with leading the nation in NCAA passing efficiency, Tua Tagovailoa also ranks No. 1 in completion percentage (75.2), passing yards per completion (19.67) and yards per pass attempt (14.80). He ranks eighth nationally in points responsible per game (20.0 points per game/120 points) and sixth in passing touchdowns (18 TD).

PERFECT IN THE POCKET: Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa is one of two quarterbacks in college football with a perfect passer rating with a clean pocket this season according to Pro Football Focus. The sophomore has completed 49-of-62 passes (79.0 percent) for 936 yards, 10 touchdowns and 34 first downs for a rating of 158.3, which is the highest rating possible.

TAGOVAILOA VS. SEC: In three games against Southeastern Conference opponents this season, quarterback Tua Tagovailoa has thrown for 912 yards and 10 touchdowns on 43-of-58 passing (.741) and an efficiency rating of 263.12.

ALABAMA LEADS THE NATION IN PASSING EFFICIENCY, SCORING OFFENSE:

Alabama is ranked No. 1 nationally in passing efficiency with a rating of 239.50. The Crimson Tide also ranks No. 1 in scoring at 56.0 points per game and has outscored its opponents 336-96 so far this season. Alabama is also fourth nationally in total offense at 567.5 yards per game and sixth in passing offense at 345.3.

DRIVES UNDER A MINUTE: Fifteen of the Crimson Tide's scoring drives this season have lasted less than a minute with seven lasting less than 30 seconds. The 12 quick scores leads the nation in scoring drives lasting less than a minute. Clemson, Houston and Memphis are tied for second with 10 drives under 60 seconds. Ole Miss, Utah State and UMass are tied for fourth with nine.

QUICK STRIKE OFFENSE: Twenty-four of Alabama's 44 offensive drives directed by Tua Tagovailoa this season have lasted five plays or less (54.5) percent. Sixteen of those 24 drives have resulted in touchdowns (66.7) and one has ended in a field goal for 17 total scoring drives of five or fewer plays (70.8). Nine of those quick-strike drives have been 50 yards or longer.

ALABAMA AT 600 YARDS AGAIN: Alabama's 639 yards in total offense at Arkansas on Oct. 6 is the Crimson Tide's second 600-plus total yardage game in as many weeks and is the eighth-best offensive tally in school history. It was the 13th 600-yard game of the Nick Saban era at Alabama and fourth-highest total of his tenure.

SEC SCORING: Alabama is outscoring its opponents by 240 points through six games this season (40.0 points per game). That is the most in SEC history for an entire season.

60 POINTS IN SEC PLAY: Alabama's 65-31 win at Arkansas on Oct. 6 was the Crimson Tide's second 60+-point effort in Southeastern Conference play. UA is just the third team in league history to score 60 or more points twice in conference play, joining the 1995 Florida Gators and Alabama's 1945 squad.

THREE CONSECUTIVE 50+ POINT GAMES TO START THE SEASON: With Alabama's 62-7 win over Ole Miss on Sept. 15, the Crimson Tide scored 50-plus points in three straight games to open the season, which is the first time that has been accomplished in Southeastern Conference history. It is also the first time UA has scored 50-plus points in a three-game span since the 1945 season (Kentucky, 60-19; Vanderbilt, 71-0; Pensacola Naval Air Station, 55-6; Mississippi State, 55-13).

FIRST HALF SCORING: Through six games this season, Alabama is outscoring its opponents, 238-34 (39.7-5.7), in the first half. That total includes a 124-21 (20.7-3.5) first quarter advantage and a 114-13 (19.0-2.2) difference in the second quarter. The first half total is 68 more than any other team in the country. If Alabama had not scored a single point this season in the second half, the Crimson Tide would still rank 25th nationally in points per game (39.7). The Tide's average of 39.7 points would rank 26th nationally and fourth in the SEC in full game scoring offense.

FIRST QUARTER SCORING: Alabama has scored 124 points in the first quarter this season, which is 30 more than any other team. The opening quarter total exceeds the full-season scoring output of 21 FBS teams.

FIRST HALF TOTAL OFFENSE: With 463 total yards in the first two quarters against Arkansas on Oct. 6, Alabama is averaging 375.7 yards in total offense in the first half this season. The Crimson Tide has racked up 340 or more total yards in before the break in five of six games this season. UA had 340 vs. Louisville, 395 vs. Arkansas State, 418 at Ole Miss, 357 and vs. Louisiana prior to the Arkansas game.

OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS: With its 65-31 win at Arkansas on Oct. 6, Alabama has now won 21 straight games when scoring a touchdown on its first offensive possession of a game. The Tide's last loss after finding the end zone on its first drive was to Oklahoma in the 2014 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

TRACKING TUA: Tua Tagovailoa is authoring one of the top starting debut seasons by a quarterback in 2018. The sophomore is the highest-rated passer in the nation and has completed 75.2 percent of his passes for 1,495 yards and 18 touchdowns despite not playing into the fourth quarter in any game this season. A deeper look at his numbers shows he's been a consistent performer regardless of quarter, down or field position.

TUA AT THE HELM: Sophomore Tua Tagovailoa has directed 44 drives as the Tide's starting quarterback this season with 31 resulting touchdowns (70.5 percent) and two culminating in field goals for 33 total scoring drives (75.0). In 44 those drives, the Tide offense is 21-for-31 on third down conversions, accounting for 2,219 yards on 219 snaps for an average of 10.13 yards per play and 220 of the 302 points scored by the UA offense. If you go back to last year's CFP National Championship Game, Tagovailoa has directed 53 drives as Alabama's quarterback, the scoring 34 touchdowns while leading the offense on four drives that resulted in field goals. On those 53 drives, Alabama has snapped the ball 269 times, accumulated 2,536 yards of offense, scored 247 points, averaged 9.4 yards per play and scored a touchdown or field goal on 71.6 percent of the drives.

THIRD DOWN IS TUA TIME: In third down passing situations this season, Tua Tagovailoa is 18-for-21 for 392 yards and seven touchdowns with a quarterback rating of 352.51. He was 3-for-3 passing for 65 yards and a touchdown against Louisville on third down; 7-for-7 for 142 yards and three touchdowns against Arkansas State; 3-for-3 for 91 yards and two touchdowns against Ole Miss; 4-of-7 for 74 yards and three first downs against Texas A&M and 1-of-1 passing for 20 yards and a touchdown against Louisiana (he did not have a third down passing attempt at Arkansas). Seven of the third down situations have been third-and-10 or more and have covered 139 yards with three touchdowns and three first downs. The sophomore has also rushed six times on third down for 40 yards and five first downs, giving the Tide seven touchdowns and nine first downs in his 28 touches on third down this season. As a team, Alabama has converted 21-of-31 (67.7 percent) of its third down attempts with Tagovailoa at quarterback. The Crimson Tide offense ranks third nationally as a team at 58.8 percent on third down.

TAGOVAILOA PASSING TD PER ATTEMPT: Crimson Tide starting quarterback Tua Tagovailoa has thrown 18 touchdown passes in six games this season on 101 attempts, an average of a touchdown every 5.6 attempts or 17.8 percent of his attempts. During his two seasons in an Alabama uniform, Tagovailoa has thrown 29 touchdowns in 178 career passing attempts, which averages out to a passing touchdown every 6.1 attempts or 16.3 percent of his career attempts.

TAGOVAILOA UNDER PRESSURE: Tua Tagovailoa is the third-highest ranked quarterback in the Football Bowl Subdivision when pressured according to Pro Football Focus. He has completed 10-of-18 attempts (55.6) on 25 dropbacks for 174 yards, four touchdowns and nine first downs for a 128.3 NFL passer rating on those 18 attempts. Memphis' Brady White leads the nation with a rating of 133.3.

TUA IN THE RED ZONE: Alabama has scored 18 touchdowns on 19 red zone possessions with Tagovailoa at quarterback and is averaging a touchdown every 7.06 plays with him in the game.

LAST TWO FIRST HALVES FOR TAGOVAILOA: Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa is 18-for-20 with 462 yards passing and six touchdowns in the first half against Louisiana and Arkansas for a passing efficiency rating of 383.04.

FINDING THE MARK: With four touchdowns and three incompletions at Arkansas on Oct. 6, Tua Tagovailoa finished a game with more touchdown passes than incompletions for the second week in a row. The sophomore was 8-for-8 passing with two scores the previous week against Louisiana. For the season, Tagovailoa has 18 touchdown passes against just 25 incomplete passes.

300+ AND FOUR AT THE HALF: Tua Tagovailoa's 334 passing yards and four touchdown passes at Arkansas on Oct. 6 marked the first time a Power 5 quarterback had thrown for 300 or more yards and four scores in the first half of a conference game since Patrick Mahomes vs. Baylor on Nov. 25, 2016.

TAGOVAILOA EQUALS NO. 5 PASSING TOTAL IN UA HISTORY: Tua Tagovailoa's 387 passing yards against Texas A&M on Sept. 22 equals the fifth-best passing total in school history (AJ McCarron vs. Oklahoma, Jan. 2014) and ties for the second-highest total under Nick Saban. Blake Sims holds the record under Saban with 445 vs. Florida on Sept. 20, 2014. Tagovailoa is also UA's first 300-yard passer since Jalen Hurts threw for 347 against Mississippi State on Nov. 12, 2016.

TUA TIDBITS: The Alabama offense is off to a record start with Tua Tagovailoa at quarterback. Below is a look at some of the numbers through the season's first six games.

- Tua Tagovailoa has more 20-yard pass plays (28) than incompletions (25) this season.
- He has thrown for four touchdowns in a game four times in six games this season. Alabama has played 1,268 games in the history of the program entering the Missouri game this weekend and only 13 times had a quarterback thrown for four touchdowns in a game prior to Tagovailoa.
- The 44 drives directed by Tagovailoa this season account for 60.3 percent of Alabama's offensive possessions and 55.6 percent of the Crimson Tide's offensive snaps (219 of 395) and 72.8 percent of UA's points (220 of 302)
- Tagovailoa has been on the field for roughly eight of 12 quarters during Alabama's three SEC games. In those eight quarters, basically two games, he has thrown for 912 yards on 43-of-58 passing with 10 passing touchdowns, one rushing score, no turnovers and a passer efficiency rating of 263.1.
- He has led Alabama to a touchdown on each of the Crimson Tide's six opening drives this season.

MOVING THE CHAINS: The Alabama offense has proven very effective on third down in 2018, converting 40-of-68 opportunities for a conversion rate of 58.8 percent that ranks third nationally. Starting quarterback Tua Tagovailoa has led the Tide to third-down conversions on 21-of-31 attempts this season (67.7 percent). He helped the Tide convert all six of his third-down chances in the season opener against Louisville on Sept. 1, was 6-of-9 on third down opportunities in the home opener against Arkansas State on Sept. 8, 3-of-4 against Ole Miss on Sept. 15, 4-of-8 against Texas A&M on Sept. 22, 2-of-2 against Louisiana on Sept. 29 and 0-2 vs. Arkansas on Oct. 6. Alabama also has 16 scoring drives this season in which the Tide did not reach third down at any point.

RUSHING TO SUCCESS: Alabama rushed for 246 yards against Arkansas on Oct. 6 and is now 108-6 (.947) since the start of the 2008 season when rushing for at least 140 yards. The only losses were at Auburn in 2013 and 2017, at Ole Miss and vs. Ohio State in 2014, against Ole Miss in 2015 and against Clemson in 2016. The Tide has topped the 140-yard mark 41 times in its last 50 games dating to the start of the 2015 season. UA rushed for 140 yards or more 10 times in 2015 and 13 times in 2016 and 2017 and has done so five times this season.

BALL PROTECTION: In the last 145 games dating to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has turned the ball over only 160 times (90 fumbles, 70 interceptions) for 1.10 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 142 times in 131 games (1.08/game). That number since 2009 includes 54 interceptions in 3,267 attempts (1 INT every 60.7 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 21 fumbles in 3,491 carries (one fumble every 166.2 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama extended its school record for scoring in consecutive games to 233 against Arkansas on Oct. 6 with Tua Tagovailoa's 76-yard touchdown pass to Irv Smith, Jr. The Crimson Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama has a 181-52 (.777) record over the course of the current streak.

FIRST QUARTER POINTS: Alabama scored 28 points in the first quarter for the second time this season when it posted four touchdowns against Louisiana on Sept. 29. The Tide first hit the 28-point mark at Ole Miss on Sept. 15 to tie for the most in an opening quarter for the Crimson Tide during the Nick Saban era. The Tide scored 28 in the opening quarter against Duke in 2010 and Charleston Southern in 2015. The 28 points against Rebels was also just the fourth time in the last 15 seasons an SEC team scored 28 or more first-quarter points against a conference opponent. The Alabama record for points in a quarter is 35 in the second quarter against Texas A&M in 2014.

JEUDY OFF TO A HOT START FOR THE TIDE: Wide receiver Jerry Jeudy is quickly establishing himself as one of the nation's top receiving threats. The sophomore has a team-leading 558 yards and eight touchdowns on 23 receptions and is averaging 24.3 yards per catch. The Deerfield Beach, Fla., native leads the nation in yards per route run at 4.85, according to Pro Football Focus, is tied for second nationally in touchdown receptions and ranks third in the country in yards per reception.

TWO OVER 100: Alabama has had back-to-back games (Louisiana and Arkansas) with multiple 100-yard receivers (Jaylen Waddle, 138; Henry Ruggs III, 116 vs. UL & Jerry Jeudy, 135; Irv Smith Jr., 123 at Arkansas). Prior to that, Alabama had only seen multiple receivers have 100-yard games five times in program history and only once in the Nick Saban era (2007-present).

FIRST-PLAY SCORE AGAINST THE HOGS AGAIN: Tua Tagovailoa's 76-yard touchdown pass to Irv Smith Jr. on Alabama's first play from scrimmage on Oct. 6 marked the second consecutive game against the Razorbacks that UA has scored on its first offensive snap. Running back Damien Harris opened the 2017 contest at Bryant-Denny Stadium with a 75-yard touchdown run.

SECOND-LONGEST TOUCHDOWN PASS IN SCHOOL HISTORY: Freshman Mac Jones' 94-yard touchdown pass to fellow frosh Jaylen Waddle equals the second-longest scoring pass in school history, trailing only the 99-yard AJ McCarron to Amari Cooper scoring strike at Auburn in 2013. The pass against Louisiana was also Jones' first career passing touchdown and Waddle's second scoring catch of the game.

THREE QUARTERBACKS WITH TOUCHDOWN PASSES VS. LOUISIANA: Quarterbacks Tua Tagovailoa, Jalen Hurts and Mac Jones combined for four touchdown passes in the Crimson Tide's 56-14 win over Louisiana on Sept. 29, marking the first time since 1977 that a trio of UA quarterbacks have thrown scoring passes in the same game. Jeff Rutledge (2), Kevin Jones (1) and Steadman Shealy (1) combined for four touchdowns in a 55-6 Homecoming win over Louisville on Oct. 22, 1977. Jones' scoring toss that day was his only completion of the season.

400 YARDS PASSING AGAINST TEXAS A&M: Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa and Jalen Hurts combined for 415 yards passing against Texas A&M on Sept. 22. The total ranks No. 4 in school history and marks the first time the Crimson Tide has surpassed the 400-yard mark through the air since throwing for 449 yards against Florida on Sept. 20, 2014.

SCORING AGAINST OLE MISS: Since Ole Miss took a 24-3 lead against Alabama with 2:43 remaining in the first half of the 2016 game, the Crimson Tide has outscored the Rebels, 173-29 in the last 12+ quarters of play in the series. The Sept. 22 contest also marked the first time UA has topped 60 points in consecutive games against Ole Miss.

BRYANT-DENNY OPENER POINTS HIGH UNDER SABAN: Alabama's 57 points against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 is the most scored by a Nick Saban team in its Bryant-Denny opener. The previous high under Saban occurred in a 52-6 win over Western Carolina in Saban's first game at Alabama on Sept. 1, 2007. The total is also the most points scored by the Tide in its Bryant-Denny season debut since a 63-14 win over Southern Miss on Sept. 27, 1969.

SIX SCORING TOSSES BY THE TIDE AGAINST ARKANSAS STATE: Alabama's six touchdown passes in its win over Arkansas State on Sept. 8 – four by Tua Tagovailoa and two by Jalen Hurts – ties for the second-most in school history. Hurts and Tagovailoa combined for six against Mercer a season ago. The school record of seven scoring tosses came in Alabama's 53-0 win over Southern Miss on Nov. 11, 1950.

WADDLE BREAKS OUT AGAINST LOUISIANA: Freshman Jaylen Waddle outscored Louisiana on his own on Sept. 29 as the freshman found the end zone on a punt return and two touchdown catches in Alabama's 56-14 win over the Ragin' Cajuns. Waddle put the Tide up 21-0 midway through the first quarter with a 63-yard return of a UL punt. He ended the first half scoring with a 20-yard touchdown reception from Tua Tagovailoa before tallying UA's final score of the day on a 94-yard catch from Mac Jones. Waddle has 15 receptions this season for 313 yards and two touchdowns and is averaging 20.9 yards per catch.

CAREER DAY FOR RUGGS III: Sophomore Henry Ruggs III had a career day in Alabama's win over Louisiana on Sept. 29. The Montgomery, Ala., native led the Tide receiving corps with five catches for 116 yards and two touchdowns to establish new career highs in all three categories. Ruggs III has 17 catches for 329 yards and six touchdowns this season and is averaging 19.4 yards per reception.

UA TOUCHDOWN PASSES IN A QUARTER RECORD: Tua Tagovailoa's three first quarter touchdown passes against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 were the most in a single quarter by an Alabama quarterback since AJ McCarron threw three in the second quarter against Auburn on Nov. 24, 2012.

NAJEE HARRIS TOPS THE CENTURY MARK AGAINST THE RED WOLVES: Running back Najee Harris established a new career high in rushing yards against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 with the first 100-yard rushing performance of his Alabama career. The sophomore finished with 135 yards and one touchdown on 13 carries, averaging 10.4 yards per rush.

OPENING DAY QUARTERBACKS: Tua Tagovailoa's two touchdown passes against Louisville on Sept. 1 equal the most for an opening day starting quarterback during the Nick Saban era at Alabama. AJ McCarron and John Parker Wilson threw for a pair of scores against Michigan (2012) and Clemson (2008), respectively. Tagovailoa's 227 passing yards against the Cardinals ranks No. 3 for an opening night starter in the Saban era. The sophomore's total trails only Blake Sims' 250 yards against West Virginia in 2014 and Greg McElroy's 230 yards against Virginia Tech in 2009.

BY ANY MEANS NECESSARY: Alabama's 51-14 victory over Louisville on Sept. 1 marked the first time Alabama has scored on a rush, reception, kickoff return and interception since the Crimson Tide's 35-10 win over Virginia Tech on Aug. 31, 2013 in Atlanta.

SOPHOMORE TRIO TD GRABS: For the first time in the careers of sophomores Jerry Jeudy, Henry Ruggs III and DeVonta Smith, the trio each caught a touchdown pass in the same game. Jeudy caught two against Arkansas State to give him four up to that point in the season, while Ruggs III and Smith hauled in their first scores of the year.

CAREER NIGHTS FOR JEUDY AND SMITH AGAINST LOUISVILLE: DeVonta Smith and Jerry Jeudy established career highs in multiple categories against Louisville on Sept. 1. Smith set career bests for receptions (four) and yards (99). Smith caught one pass in eight different games as a freshman in 2017 and had a career high 41 yards receiving against Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game. Jeudy's four catches and two touchdown receptions were also career bests at the time. He caught one touchdown in two games as a freshman a season ago and had three receptions on two occasions in 2017.

HARRIS AMONG UA CAREER YARDS PER CARRY LEADERS: Through 47 career games, running back Damien Harris has averaged 6.8 yards per carry, which is tied for second all-time at Alabama with Eddie Lacy (2010-12). Harris has rushed for 2,555 yards and 17 touchdowns on 378 career attempts. Wilbur Jackson (1971-73) is the UA career leader at 7.2 yards per carry (1,529 yards on 212 attempts).

HARRIS RANKS AMONG THE SEC'S BEST: Though he does not yet have enough career attempts to qualify for the SEC career yards per carry list (minimum 400 attempts), Damien Harris' 6.7 yards per carry average is tied for third among SEC career leaders with 370 collegiate rushing attempts. Bo Jackson's career average of 6.62 yards per carry on 650 career rushes ranks No. 1 in SEC history.

HARRIS 11TH ON ALABAMA CAREER RUSHING LIST: With 111 yards rushing at Arkansas on Oct. 6, Damien Harris is now 11th on the Alabama career rushing list with 2,555 yards. Bobby Marlow (1950-52) is 10th with 2,604 yards. Derrick Henry is Alabama's career rushing leader with 3,591 yards. Harris is just the 13th back in UA history to surpass the 2,500-yard rushing mark for his career.

HURTS TOPS UA QUARTERBACK CAREER RUSHING TOUCHDOWN LIST: Jalen Hurts' 21 career rushing touchdowns is an Alabama career high for quarterbacks, surpassing the previous career best of 19 established by Harry Gilmer from 1944-47.

HURTS NO. 2 ON UA QUARTERBACK CAREER RUSHING LIST: Jalen Hurts' 1,906 career rushing yards ranks No. 2 all-time for quarterbacks at Alabama. Harry Gilmer (1944-47) tops the chart with 2,025 yards. Hurts' total also ranks No. 22 on Alabama's all-time career rushing list.

HURTS' CAREER TOUCHDOWN RESPONSIBILITY: Jalen Hurts' combined 66 career rushing and passing touchdowns ranks No. 2 on the Alabama career touchdown responsibility list. AJ McCarron (2010-13) is the UA career leader with 80 in 53 games. Hurts has thrown 45 touchdown passes and rushed for 21 scores in 35 career games.

HURTS THIRD ON UA CAREER TOUCHDOWN PASSES LIST: Quarterback Jalen Hurts' 45 touchdown passes in his 35-game career ranks No. 3 on the Alabama career list. John Parker Wilson (2005-08) is second with 47. AJ McCarron is Alabama's leader with 77 touchdown passes from 2010-13.

HURTS THIRD ON UA CAREER TOTAL OFFENSE LIST: With 7,220 total offensive yards in his 35-game career, Jalen Hurts ranks third on the Alabama career total offense list. John Parker Wilson (2005-08) is second with 8,099 yards. AJ McCarron (2010-13) is the UA career leader with 8,969 yards.

HURTS SEVENTH ON UA CAREER PASSING YARDS LIST: Jalen Hurts' 5,314 career passing yards ranks seventh on the Alabama career passing yards list. Jay Barker (1991-94) is sixth at 5,689 yards. AJ McCarron (2010-13) is the UA career leader with 9,019 yards.

PIERSCHBACHER NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK FOR PERFORMANCE AT ARKANSAS: Alabama football's Ross Pierschbacher was selected as the Southeastern Conference's Offensive Lineman of the Week, the league office announced Oct. 8. Pierschbacher graded out at a team-high 93 percent in the Crimson Tide's 65-31 victory at Arkansas last Saturday. The redshirt senior accounted for four knockdown blocks as the Tide backs accumulated 246 yards rushing and five touchdowns. Pierschbacher did not allow a quarterback pressure or commit a penalty in 56 snaps and allowed time for the UA quarterbacks to accumulate 393 yards passing and four scores through the air. His efforts, along with his fellow linemates, helped Alabama roll up a season-high 639 yards of total offense without allowing a sack to helped the offensive line unit improve to sixth nationally with just 0.67 sacks allowed per game.

WILLIAMS NAMED OUTLAND TROPHY PLAYER OF THE MONTH FOR SEPTEMBER: Alabama offensive lineman Jonah Williams has been named the Outland Trophy National Player of the Month on offense for the month of September, the Football Writers Association of America announced Oct. 6. Williams, who has started every game of his Crimson Tide career, graded out at over 90 percent in every contest in September and led an offensive line that protected for the nation's leading scoring offense (54.2) in the season's opening month. Alabama ranked No. 5 in total offense (553.2) and averaged more than 200 yards a game on the ground (217.4) in September. UA was No. 9 nationally in sacks allowed per game (0.80) and surpassed the 500-yard mark in total offense in all five of its September contests.

TAGOVAILOA NAMED EARNS A PAIR OF PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS FOR CAREER PERFORMANCE AGAINST TEXAS A&M: Quarterback Tua Tagovailoa earned SEC Player of the Week and Maxwell Award Player of the Week honors following his career performance against Texas A&M on Sept. 22. The sophomore threw for a career-high 387 yards on 22-of-30 passing and four touchdowns and rushed for a fifth score. The completions, attempts and five total touchdowns are new career highs. His four touchdown passes equal his previous career high set against Arkansas State on Sept. 8. The passing yardage total ranks No. 5 all-time in Alabama history for a single game.

WADDLE NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK: Alabama freshman receiver/punt returner Jaylen Waddle was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his performance against Louisville on Sept. 1. In his Alabama debut, the Houston, Texas, native returned four punts for 80 yards with a long of 31. He also caught three passes for 66 yards, including a 49-yard reception to set up the Crimson Tide's third touchdown.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

WADDLE FOURTH NATIONALLY IN PUNT RETURN AVERAGE: Freshman Jaylen Waddle's 19.9 yards per punt return is second in the SEC and ranks No. 4 nationally. The Houston, Texas, native has 10 returns for 199 yards and a touchdown in six games this season. As a team, Alabama is averaging 19.6 yards per return, which is second in the league and 12th nationally.

NO RETURN FOR YOU: Alabama has yet to allow a punt return in 15 attempts this season. The Tide is averaging 35.9 yards per punt with six fair catches, four punts downed inside the 20 and no touchbacks.

SPECIAL TEAMS SHINE AGAINST THE RAGIN' CAJUNS: Alabama's punt return unit played a key role in the Crimson Tide's fast start against Louisiana on Sept. 29. On consecutive punt attempts, senior Derek Kief blocked and recovered a Ragin' Cajuns punt to set up the Tide's second touchdown of the game and freshman Jaylen Waddle scampered 63 yards for UA's next touchdown less than 90 seconds later to give Alabama a 21-0 lead less than seven minutes into the game. Kief's block was the first for the Tide since Damien Harris' third-quarter block in the 2017 season opener against Florida State while Waddle's return was the first for a touchdown since Eddie Jackson went 79 yards for a score at Tennessee in 2016.

KICKOFF RETURN TOUCHDOWN: Josh Jacobs' 77-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Louisville on Sept. 1 was Alabama's first kickoff return for a score by the Crimson Tide since Kenyan Drake's 95-yard return against Clemson in the 2016 CFP National Championship Game.

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-MISSOURI SERIES: Alabama leads the series with Missouri, 3-2. The most recent meeting occurred in 2014 when the Crimson Tide defeated the Tigers, 42-13, in the SEC Championship Game en route to UA's 16th national championship. Missouri won the first two contests between the schools, taking a 35-10 decision from the Tide at the 1968 Gator Bowl. The teams met again at Legion Field in 1985 with the Tigers emerging with a 20-7 victory that day. Alabama began its three-game winning streak against MU with a 38-20 win in Columbia, Mo., on Sept. 16, 1978. The two teams would not meet again until 2012, when Alabama handed Missouri a 42-13 loss in Columbia during the Tigers' first season in the Southeastern Conference. Saturday's game will be Missouri's first visit to Tuscaloosa.

GENERAL NOTES

SABAN'S HOME RECORD: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 131-19 (.873) in home games during his college head coaching career. He owns the advantage at every stop he has made as a college head coach, including a 72-7 (.911) mark while at Alabama. Saban has won 43 of his last 45 contests at Bryant-Denny Stadium and has lost back-to-back matchups only once, with consecutive losses coming at the end of the 2007 season (LSU and ULM).

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban's 110 conference wins (including SEC championship games) ranks No. 3 on the SEC career conference wins list. Saban ranks first in league history in SEC regular season winning percentage at .809 (110-26). He is also second in SEC history in winning percentage in all games at .834 (181-36). Saban is sixth on the SEC career wins at 181 victories.

123-7 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide is 123-7 (.946) when leading at the half. Alabama has held the lead in 40 of its last 50 games dating back to the start of the 2015 season. Alabama is also 107-4 (.964) when leading by seven or more points at the break during the Saban era.

PRESEASON THREEPEAT: This year marks Alabama's third straight appearance at No. 1 in the Associated Press preseason rankings. The Crimson Tide now joins Oklahoma (1985-87) as just the second team to start the season at No. 1 in three consecutive seasons since the poll began in 1936.

SABAN AMONG 20-YEAR LEADERS: Alabama's 45-40 win over Clemson in the 2016 College Football Playoff Championship Game was head coach Nick Saban's 191st victory in his first 20 years as a college head coach. That total is the second-most in FBS history for a coach in the first 20 seasons of his career. Former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne won 195 games in the opening two decades of his tenure in Lincoln. Long-time Penn State head coach Joe Paterno ranks third with 187. Saban's five national championships in 20 seasons tops both Osborne (none) and Paterno (1).

TIDE REACHES 11 WINS FOR THE 21st TIME: With the win against Mercer on Nov. 18 last season, Alabama secured its 11th victory of the year, marking the 21st time in program history that the Tide has achieved the feat. Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama has had nine 11-win seasons (2008-09, 2011-17). It is the seventh straight season with at least 11 wins, which is the longest streak of its kind in SEC history. The SEC has had three streaks of three seasons with at least 11 victories, including Alabama from 1973-75, LSU from 2005-07 and South Carolina from 2011-13.

10-YEAR RUN: Nick Saban compiled a 125-14 (.899) record over the past 10 seasons in Tuscaloosa (2008-17), which is the best of any major college school over a 10-year span since Bud Wilkinson and Oklahoma in the late 1940s through the late 1950s. UA's 125 wins over the past decade are the most for any FBS school during a 10-year span in the Associated Press poll era (since 1936).

10-WIN SEASONS: Alabama's 31-24 victory over Mississippi State on Nov. 11 last season marked the 10th consecutive season the Crimson Tide has reached the 10-win mark. The 10 straight years with 10 wins extends the school record. The previous total for most consecutive 10-win seasons was five, set by coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's teams from 1971-75. In 122 seasons, the Tide has won 10 or more games 37 times, the most in college football history. Alabama has produced 12 10-win seasons since 2002 (2002, 2005, 2008-2017). Bryant had a school-record 13 10-win seasons at Alabama while Nick Saban is second with 10.

SEC RECORD: Alabama extended its record for most consecutive 10-win seasons in SEC history in 2017 when it defeated Mississippi State, 31-24, on Nov. 11, to improve to 10-0 on the year. UA had a 12-2 record in 2008, 14-0 in 2009, 10-3 in 2010, 12-1 in 2011, 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014 and 14-1 in 2015 and 2016.

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama's game at Arkansas on Oct. 6 was the Tide's 409th televised game. Alabama has compiled a 272-133-4 (.670) all-time record in televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts).

128 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 145 GAMES: With the Tide's appearance on ESPN at Arkansas on Oct. 6, Alabama has played in 128 nationally televised games since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of the 2014 season.

FIRST TIME PLAYERS: Junior Giles Amos (TE), senior D.J. Lewis (DB) and freshman Eddie Smith (DB) became the 23rd, 24th and 25th Crimson Tide student-athletes to debut this season. They joined true freshmen Emil Ekiyor (OL) and Stephon Wynn Jr. (DL), who made their Alabama debuts at Ole Miss on Sept. 15 and the 20 players who made their first UA appearances in the season opener against Louisville on Sept. 1. Appearing for the first time against the Cardinals were true freshmen Eyabi Anoma (LB), Slade Bolden (WR), Skyler DeLong (P), Jerome Ford (RB), Josh Jobe (DB), Ale Kaho (LB), Cameron Latu (LB), Jaylen Moody (LB), Patrick Surtain II (DB) and Jaylen Waddle (WR). Redshirt freshmen Markail Benton (LB), Joseph Bulovas (PK), Mac Jones (QB), Phidarian Mathis (DL), Kyriq McDonald (DB), Tyrell Shavers (WR) and Chadarius Townsend (WR) also saw their first career action for the Tide as did junior transfers Tevita Musika (DL) and Saivion Smith (DB) and senior transfer Austin Jones.

RETURNING SUCCESS: The Crimson Tide returns 12 starters and 53 letterwinners from its 2017 squad that finished 13-1 and won its 17th national championship. The 2018 team returns seven starters on offense and three on defense. The offense is highlighted by 2,000-yard career rusher Damien Harris at running back and quarterback Jalen Hurts, who enters the season with a 26-2 career record as a starter. Other returning starters on offense are linemen Lester Cotton Sr., Ross Pierschbacher, Jonah Williams and Matt Womack along with tight end Hale Hentges. Alabama's defense returns defensive Isaiah Buggs and Raekwon Davis and linebacker Anfernee Jennings. Davis earned first team All-SEC honors a season ago when he led the Tide with 8.5 sacks.

NEW HIRES: Nick Saban made six new additions to his 2018 staff during the offseason, hiring Jeff Banks as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach, Dan Enos as associate head coach and quarterbacks coach, Josh Gattis as co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach, Pete Golding as co-defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach, Craig Kuligowski as associate head coach and defensive line coach and Karl Scott as defensive backs coach. In addition, holdovers Michael Locksley and Tosh Lupoi assumed the roles of offensive and defensive coordinators, respectively.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban ranks third all-time among college coaches who have tutored first round draft picks. Saban has coached a total of 31 players who were chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 26 from Alabama. Florida State's Bobby Bowden is the career leader with 35, followed by Penn State's Joe Paterno at 32.

ALABAMA IN THE NFL (WEEK 5): The fifth week of the 2018-19 season in the National Football League wrapped up on Monday. Below is a look at some of the highlights from former Crimson Tide players currently playing in the NFL during week five.

The New Orleans Saints dominant 43-19 win over the Washington Redskins included a solid performance from running back **Mark Ingram II**. In his first game this season, Ingram carried 16 times for 53 yards and reached the end zone twice on the ground, while also catching two passes for 20 yards. In that same game, Redskins defensive lineman **Jonathan Allen** recorded five tackles while fellow linemate **Da'Ron Payne** added for four stops, including a sack.

Kareem Jackson etched his name in the Houston Texans' record books with his effort against the Dallas Cowboys. In the Texans' 19-16 win, Jackson combined for five tackles, broke up a pass and picked off his 15th career pass. The interception secured him the top spot on the all-time interceptions list for the Texans. **Marlon Humphrey** also contributed a strong effort for the Ravens defensive backfield, recording four tackles while adding a pass breakup and forced fumble to his stat line in Baltimore's overtime loss to the Cleveland Browns.

Miami Dolphins running back **Kenyan Drake** had a big day despite a losing effort to the Cincinnati Bengals. Drake carried the ball six times for 46 yards to average 7.7 yards per carry, while contributing seven catches for 69 yards and a touchdown. Also providing a strong output on the ground was Jacksonville running back **T.J. Yeldon**. The tailback accounted for one of the Jaguars' two touchdowns on the day as part of his eight receptions totaling 69 yards. In addition, Yeldon contributed 53 rushing yards to total 122 all-purpose yards.

Defensive lineman **Da'Shawn Hand** put together a solid game for the Detroit Lions in a 31-23 win over the rival Green Bay Packers. Hand combined for four tackles, including a sack, and forced a fumble. Also excelling on defense was **Mark Barron**, who recorded a team-leading nine tackles in the Los Angeles Rams' 33-31 win over the Seattle Seahawks.

CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS: The Alabama football program is again well-represented in the NFL during the 2018 season with numerous former players on league rosters. The Tide has a league-high 54 former players (active, injured reserve, practice squad) working on an NFL roster. In the last 10 NFL Drafts (including 2018), Alabama has had 77 players selected, including 26 players in first round, 23 in the second and third rounds, eight in the fourth, eight in the fifth, three in the sixth and nine in the seventh round.

- Saban has a 229-62-1 (.786) record as a college head coach to date (224-62-1, .782 after vacations). He has six national championships – five at Alabama – eight conference championships and 19 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff Semifinals each of the last four seasons including the last three CFP National Championship Games.

- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships, the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships and the only coach to win multiple CFP National Championships. He has won six titles in his last 14 years coaching college football after capturing CFP National Championship following the 2017 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame - 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska - 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the second coach in the poll era to win six national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant) and the first two ever win five titles in a nine-year span.

- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He took down Clemson 45-40 to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game. He captured his sixth national championship - and fifth at Alabama - in 2017 with a 26-23 overtime win over Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game.

- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and a daughter-in-law, Kelsé.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise roughly \$8 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 16 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that struck Tuscaloosa.

- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

ORLANDO, Fla. — The top-ranked Alabama Crimson Tide were in control from start to finish in a 51-14 win over Louisville in the Camping World Kickoff at Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Fla., in the 2018 season opener for both teams.

The Crimson Tide used a balanced attack to outgain the Cardinals, 519-268, in total offense, including a 222-16 mark in the rushing game. UA's victory improved head coach Nick Saban's record in season openers to a perfect 12-0 while at UA.

Sophomore quarterback Tua Tagovailoa led the UA offense, totaling three touchdowns with 253 yards of offense in his first career start. Tagovailoa went 12-of-16 for 227 yards with two passing scores to fellow sophomore Jerry Jeudy, while rushing for 26 yards and a score. On the receiving end, sophomore wideout DeVonta Smith led the charge with four catches for 99 yards.

The Tide defense was led by sophomore lineman Quinnen Williams, who finished the game with six tackles including a team-high 3.5 tackles for loss to go along with one quarterback pressure and a pass breakup. Redshirt junior defensive back Deionte Thompson had a solid performance with five tackles, 1.5 for a loss, three pass breakups and an interception.

Alabama added a pair of non-offensive touchdowns thanks to the defensive and special teams units. Junior defensive back Shyheim Carter returned an interception 45 yards for a score while third-year back Josh Jacobs took a kickoff back for a 77-yard return late in the third quarter to add to the Tide's cushion.

For the game, Tagovailoa completed 13-of-19 passing attempts for 228 yards and four touchdowns - both career-high marks, while Hurts went 7-for-9 for 93 yards and two scores.

The six scoring tosses equals the second-most in a game in Alabama football history. Tagovailoa's four touchdown passes also ranks second on the individual single-game touchdown passes list.

Sophomore running back Najee Harris eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career after running for 135 yards and a touchdown on just 13 carries. Five different receivers caught touchdown passes, including two by sophomore Jerry Jeudy for a second consecutive game.

Offensively, the Tide finished with 599 yards of total offense - 321 through the air and 278 on the ground.

On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore defensive back Xavier McKinney paced the Tide with a career-high seven tackles as Alabama limited the Red Wolves to a single third quarter touchdown. Junior defensive back Saivion Smith posted the Tide's third non-offensive touchdown of the season with a 38-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter.

OXFORD, Miss. — The No. 1 Alabama football team scored 62 unanswered points to cruise to a 62-7 victory over Ole Miss in its Southeastern Conference opener at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday night in Oxford, Miss.

The Crimson Tide became the first team in SEC history to score 50-plus points in its first three games of a season, after putting up 51 against Louisville in the season-opening contest and 57 against Arkansas State in the Tide's home opener.

Playing in just the first half, sophomore quarterback Tua Tagovailoa went 11-for-15 passing for 191 yards and two scores to lead the Alabama offense while adding five carries for 47 yards rushing to his totals. On the receiving end, sophomore wideout Jerry Jeudy led the way with three catches for 136 yards and two touchdowns. The two-touchdown performance was Jeudy's third consecutive this season. Alabama's offensive output doubled Ole Miss thanks to a 516-248 yard output from both teams.

On defense, sophomore lineman Quinnen Williams finished the game with a team-high six tackles, while linebacker Christian Miller accounted for five tackles and 2.5 sacks - both career-high marks for the redshirt senior. Redshirt junior defensive back Deionte Thompson recorded his second interception of the season with a return of 40 yards, while sophomore safety Xavier McKinney picked off his first career pass, returning the interception for a pick-six totaling 30 yards, and added a forced fumble to his stat line.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The top-ranked Alabama football team beat No. 22 Texas A&M by a score of 45-23 in front of a capacity crowd of 101,821 Saturday afternoon at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Sophomore quarterback Tua Tagovailoa led the Tide on offense with a career-best five touchdowns, four passing and one rushing. He threw for a career-high 387 yards on 22-of-30 passing. The completions and attempts are also new career-high marks for the second-year player. His four touchdown passes equaled his previous career high. His passing yardage total also ties for the fifth-best performance in school history.

Alabama had three players with 70-plus receiving yards, including sophomore wide receiver Henry Ruggs III (84 yards and a touchdown), sophomore wideout Jerry Jeudy (78 yards) and junior tight end Irv Smith Jr. (74 yards). Senior tight end Hale Hentges had two catches for 29 yards with both going for touchdowns. On the ground, senior Damien Harris led the way with 52 yards on seven carries.

On defense, the Crimson Tide came away with seven sacks, led by senior defensive end Isaiahuggs, who finished the game with 3.5 sacks and seven total tackles. Sophomore linebacker Dylan Moses led the Tide with nine total tackles, including five solo stops. The UA defense added a pair of interceptions with junior Mack Wilson picking off his first pass of the season and freshman defensive back Patrick Surtain II recording his first career interception, returning the Aggie miscue for 20 yards.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The No. 1-ranked Alabama Crimson Tide jumped out to a 28-0, first-quarter lead and never looked back en route to a 56-14 win over the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns Saturday at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Alabama finished the game with 608 total yards, surpassing the 500-total yard mark for the fifth time this season, marking the first time in school history a Tide team has reached that milestone in five consecutive games. The 56 points also gives the Crimson Tide a school-record string of five games in a row with 45-plus points.

Sophomore quarterback Tua Tagovailoa was perfect on the day, going 8-for-8 passing for 128 yards and two touchdowns while leading scores in his other pair of offensive drives across his four series of action. Tagovailoa, junior Jalen Hurts and redshirt freshman Mac Jones combined for 340 yards and four touchdowns on 13-of-16 attempts.

Freshman Jaylen Waddle returned a punt 63 yards for a first-quarter touchdown and snared the first two touchdown receptions of his career, including a 94-yarder from Jones that equals the second-longest scoring strike in school history. Sophomore wideout Henry Ruggs III led the Tide and set career-high marks in receiving yards (115), catches (5) and touchdowns (2).

On the ground, junior running back Josh Jacobs tied his career high with two rushing touchdowns, while sophomore Najee Harris led the way with 73 yards and a touchdown as the Tide amassed 268 yards on the ground.

Defensively, junior Deionte Thompson paced UA with a team-high seven tackles. Junior Trevon Diggs and sophomore Xavier McKinney each recorded an interception as Alabama limited Louisiana to 288 total yards and a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns.

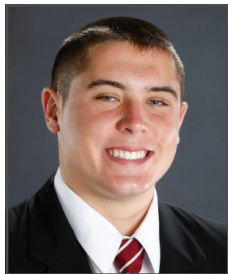
