ALABAMA BEGINS RECORD-TYING SEVEN GAME HOMESTAND WITH TWO GAMES THIS WEEKEND

- Alabama will play its first home games of the 2018 season when it hosts FGCU and Kennesaw State this weekend at the Alabama Soccer Complex. The contest kicks off a seven-game homestand, which matches the program record for consecutive games played on UA's home pitch.
- This year's stretch begins Friday, Aug. 24, against FGCU and will last through Sept. 13 when the Tide opens SEC play against Ole Miss.
- The only other time in program history that Alabama played seven consecutive home matches came in 2007. The Tide finished 5-1-1 over the stretch that season.

ONE MORE MEANS SCHOOL RECORD

- Senior Emma Welch needs just one assist to break the all-time career assist record at the University of Alabama.
- Welch, who was named a CoSIDA Academic All-American and earned a spot on the all-district and all-conference teams a year ago, has collected 19 career assists. Last season, she led the Tide with eight helpers on the year, which tied for second on the school's single-season assist chart.
- She is currently tied for the most assists in program history, matching the 19 career assists by former standout Libby Probst (2002-05).

ABOUT ALABAMA

- Head coach Wes Hart is looking to build off a stellar 2017 campaign, returning eight starters and 16 letterwinners from last season's team that finished with a 12-8-1 overall record.
- The 12 wins by Alabama was the third-most wins in a season in program history, highlighted by thrilling 1-0 win over then-No. 4 Florida State – the highest-ranked team the Tide has beaten in program history.
- Alabama earned an at-large berth to the 2017 NCAA Tournament, which marked its first NCAA appearance since 2011 and just the third in program history.
- Hart enters his fourth season at Alabama, with an improved record in each of his first three seasons at the helm of the program. He owns a career record of 26-29-6 (.458) over his four seasons, but is 21-17-4 (.549) since the 2016 campaign.
- Alabama was picked to finish eighth in the SEC by a vote of the league's head coaches. The Tide had five players who were selected to the SEC Preseason Watch List: Forwards Abbie Boswell and Casey Wertz and midfielders Christina Maartensson, Taylor Morgan and Emma Welch.

ABOUT FRIDAY'S OPPONENT - FGCU

- Friday's contest against FGCU will mark the second meeting in series history. The Crimson Tide won the only other match played between the squads, taking a 1-0 victory at FGCU on Sept. 14, 2016 in Fort Myers, Fla.
- The Eagles bring a 1-0 record into Friday's match-up at Alabama, taking a 3-0 victory over Georgia Southern on Aug. 17. FGCU was supposed to take on 15th-ranked UCF on Sunday, but the game was cancelled due to inclement weather.
- Leading the offensive attack for FGCU is Preseason A-Sun Player of the Year Marjorie Boilesen, who was named to the 2018 MAC Hermann Watch List. Last year, Boilesen topped the A-Sun in both goals (11) and points (31) on her way to earning First Team All-Atlantic Sun and First Team United Soccer Coaches All-Southeast Region Team.
- FGCU is a heavy favorite to repeat as A-Sun Champions for the ninth straight year in 2018 after receiving eight of nine first place votes in the preseason coaches' poll.
- The Eagles currently have the longest active conference championship streak in the nation and are slowly creeping up on the all-time mark of 15 set by Penn State from 1998-2012.

ABOUT SUNDAY'S OPPONENT - KENNESAW STATE

- Kennesaw State enters the weekend with a perfect 2-0 mark after opening weekend play. The Owls, who take on Troy on Friday night, opened with a 3-0 home victory over Western Carolina on Aug. 17 and followed that with a 1-0 win over Georgia State on Aug. 19.
- It is the first 2-0 for Kennesaw State since 2010 and the first time it has posted consecutive shutouts to open a season for the first time since 2002.
- The Tide and Owls will square off for the sixth time in program history and second time in as many seasons when they meet on Sunday evening at the Alabama Soccer Complex. Alabama, which is riding a four-game winning streak against Kennesaw State, captured a 3-1 victory when the two teams met a year ago at KSU.
- Kennesaw State concluded the 2017 campaign with an 8-7-4 mark, including a 3-3-1 mark in A-Sun Conference play.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Tiffany Sornpao, who was voted to the A-Sun All-Freshman team a year ago, anchors the Owls' defense. She recorded back-to-back shutouts
- Kennesaw State was picked to finish sixth in the A-Sun Conference preseason coaches' poll.

ALABAMA DURING OPENING WEEKEND

- Alabama opened the 2018 season with a two-game road swing in the state of Texas, closing with an 0-1-1 mark against TCU (L, 1-0) and North Texas (T, 1-1).
- Against the Horned Frogs on Aug. 17, the Tide played a man down over the final 36 minutes, eventually allowing a goal in the 88th minute in the season-opener for both teams.

ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS

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- The victory didn't come without controversy. With the game knotted in a scoreless tie in the 54th minute, the Horned Frogs had a breakaway in which starting goalkeeper Alex Plavin attempted to stop. The TCU forward collided with Plavin, who was given a straight red card, forcing the Crimson Tide to finish the match with 10 players on the field for the final 36-plus minutes.
- The Tide closed out its two-game road swing with a 1-1 draw at North Texas on Aug. 19. The Crimson Tide controlled the run of play throughout regulation and both overtimes, outshooting the Mean Green 29-14 in the match, but was unable to find a game-winner.
- The lone UA goal was scored by senior Abbie Boswell, while redshirt freshman Kaylee Hammer, who earned her first career start, made six saves on the day.

ALABAMA UPENDS NO. 25 TENNESSEE, 1-0, IN EXHIBITION PLAY

- In its lone exhibition contest of the season, Alabama defeated No. 25 Tennessee, 1-0, in Knoxville. The two teams will not play during the regular season, which allowed them to square off in an exhibition match.
- Junior midfielder Taylor Hubbard scored the game's lone goal in the 86th minute. Last season, Hubbard played in just four games and did not score a goal. Hubbard's goal came at the 85:23 mark when she found the back of the net from 10 yards out.
- The Tide finished the match with 15 shots, eight of which were on frame. Meanwhile, the Vols had 17 shots but only had four on goal. Senior Christina Maartensson had three shots on the night to lead Alabama, while five UA players ended with two shots apiece to help lead a balanced offensive attack. Tide goalkeeper Alex Plavin finished with four saves in the shutout victory.
- Coach Wes Hart's postgame comments: "This is a great way to start the 2018 season. We found a way to get a result against a very good Tennessee team. We've made it a priority of ours to shut teams out this fall. To keep Tennessee off the scoreboard is a huge statement. They are a team with a ton of attacking weapons, including one of the best forwards (Bunny Shaw) in the country. Tennessee created their fair share of chances and exposed us a couple times, but (goalkeeper) Alex Plavin came up big when we needed her. There are a ton of positives that we will be able to take from this game. We still have plenty of work ahead of us, but I'm excited for what's to come."

HOME OPENERS

- Alabama owns a record of 23-4 in home season-opening matches in program history
- The Crimson Tide has won eight consecutive home openers dating back to the 2009 campaign when it dropped a 2-0 result to UAB.
- Head coach Wes Hart has guided Alabama to a 3-0 record in home openers under his tenure, outscoring its opponents by a combined total of 11-1 in those contests.

UNDER HEAD COACH WES HART

- The Crimson Tide enters its fourth year under the guidance of Wes Hart, as the program continues to make significant strides under his leadership.
- The 2017 season was a breakout year for the Crimson Tide, earning its third NCAA Tournament bid in program history after posting a 12-8-1 overall record. It was the most wins in a single season since 2002, helping the Tide clinch an at-large tournament berth.
- Alabama finished the regular season non-conference slate with an 8-1 record, including an upset victory over then-No. 4 Florida State (Aug. 27), which marked the first victory over a top-10 opponent in program history. In conference play, the Tide capped the regular season with a four-game winning streak, which was the longest streak against conference foes since 1998.
- In 2016, Hart implemented drastic improvements nearly doubling the previous year's number of wins and registered his first winning season at the Capstone with a 9-8-2 record. Alabama finished ninth in the conference and made their first postseason appearance at the SEC Tournament since 2014.
- Home game attendance increased significantly in Hart's first three seasons, as the Tide averaged 969 fans a game in 2015, the highest average since 2012 (1,015), 799 in 2016 and 825 in 2017. The Alabama Soccer Complex saw a crowd of 1,575 for its first game against Troy (Aug. 23, 2015), the second-highest single-game home attendance in program history.

CRIMSON TIDE HAS THREE EARN ALL-SEC HONORS IN 2017

- After an outstanding regular season, Celia Jimenez Delgado, Emma Welch and Abbie Boswell earned all-conference honors a year ago. Jimenez Delgado was named to the first team while Welch and Boswell were tabbed to the second team.
- Jimenez Delgado snagged first team All-SEC honors for the first time in her career after serving as the team captain, knocking in two goals and assisting on six scores. Welch and Boswell both earned their first ever SEC postseason honors of their careers. Welch tallied two goals, delivered seven assists and totaled 11 points, while Boswell notched a team-high of eight goals and tallied a pair of goals in three games this season.

COMING UP

- Alabama continues its seven-game homestand when it welcomes Virginia Tech on Thursday, Aug. 30 at 7 p.m., followed by taking on Rice on Sunday, Sept. 2, at 7 p.m. Both contests can be seen on SEC Network +.

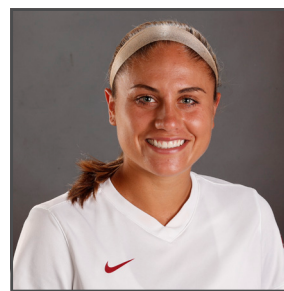
