Series Notes: Alabama and Ole Miss will meet for the 66th time on Saturday. The Crimson Tide leads the all-time series, 49-11-2 (after vacations), and won last year's meeting, 66-3, in Tuscaloosa. Alabama rallied from a 21-point second quarter deficit to defeat Ole Miss, 48-43, in its last visit to Oxford in 2016. Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 13-3 all-time (12-3 after vacations) and 9-2 at Alabama (8-2 after vacations) in his career against the Rebels. Ole Miss head coach Matt Luke is 0-1 against the Tide.

RANKINGS: Alabama remains No. 1 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls this week following the Tide's 57-7 win over Arkansas State last Saturday. Ole Miss was among the teams receiving votes in the AP poll this week following its 76-41 win over Southern Illinois.

NEXT GAME: The Crimson Tide will return home to host SEC West rival Texas A&M. Alabama and A&M will meet for the 11th time in a series that dates back to 1942. The Crimson Tide leads the all-time series, 8-2, including a 3-1 record at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama won last year's meeting, 27-19, in College Station and is 5-1 against the Aggies since Texas A&M joined the Southeastern Conference in 2012.

SABAN IN SEC ROAD OPENERS: Nick Saban is 10-1 (.909) in SEC road openers since he arrived in 2007, falling at Ole Miss 23-17 in 2014. Counting his time at LSU, Saban is 12-4 (.750) in the opening SEC road game of his previous 16 SEC seasons. Saban is also 7-0 at Alabama when the Tide's first Southeastern Conference game of the season is also on the road.

UNRANKED, NO PROBLEM UNDER SABAN: With its 57-7 win over Arkansas State on Sept. 8, Alabama has defeated 75 consecutive unranked teams under head coach Nick Saban, the longest streak in FBS history. Alabama's last loss to an unranked team was a 17-10 defeat at the hands of Auburn on Nov. 24, 2007. The current streak began with a win over Colorado on Dec. 30, 2007 in the Independence Bowl. The previous record was 72 games, shared by Miami (Fla.) (1984-95) and Florida (1989-2000). Under Saban, Alabama holds a 79-3 (.963) (75-3, .962 after vacations) mark against unranked opponents.

SABAN'S 65th GAME AS AP NO. 1: The matchup with Ole Miss on Saturday will be Nick Saban's 65th career game coaching Alabama as the Associated Press No. 1 team, the most games coached as No. 1 at one school. At 57-7 (.891), Saban has won more games coaching as the No. 1 team at one school than any other coach in college football history. Woody Hayes (Ohio State) and Bobby Bowden (Florida State) are tied for second with 40 wins apiece. Bowden was 40-5 (.889) at Florida State as No. 1 and Hayes went 40-6 (.870) with Ohio State. This is also Alabama's 75th week as the No. 1 team in the AP rankings during the Saban era. In addition to the 65 game weeks at No. 1, Alabama was ranked No. 1 during its bye weeks in 2008, 2012, 2013, 2016 and 2017 and topped the postseason poll following its five national championship victories under Saban.

OUTSIDE THE TOP 15: In addition to its 75-game winning streak against unranked teams, Alabama has lost just one game to a team ranked outside the top 15 in the Associated Press poll since the start of the 2008 season (No. 19 South Carolina in 2010). For perspective, no team in the FBS has lost fewer than 10 games to teams outside the top 15 in that same time frame.

MORE THAN A DECADE AT NO. 1: With Alabama's preseason No. 1 ranking, the Crimson Tide has now been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll at least once each season since 2008. The 11-year streak is the longest in the history of the AP rankings. The previous long streak was seven seasons by Miami (Fla.) from 1986-92.

CRIMSON TIDE NO. 1 AT NO. 1: With its Sept. 9 ranking at No. 1, Alabama has sat atop the Associated Press Top 25 a total of 106 times since the poll's inception in 1936, which surpasses Ohio State (105) for the most appearances at No. 1 in AP poll history.

LONGEST ACTIVE TOP-10 STREAK: Alabama's No. 1 ranking in the Sept. 9 Associated Press Top 25 marks the 46th consecutive week the Tide has appeared in the AP top-10, which leads the Football Bowl Subdivision for most consecutive weeks in the top-10 in the writers' poll. Alabama's last appearance below No. 10 was the week of Sept. 27, 2015, when the Tide was No. 13 heading to a matchup at Georgia, which resulted in a 38-10 UA victory over the No. 8 Bulldogs.

SABAN LEADS IN WINS VS. TOP-5 TEAMS: Alabama's 26-23 win over then-No. 3 Georgia in the CFP National Championship Game was Nick Saban's 21st career victory against a team ranked in the top 5 of the Associated Press Top 25, the most in college football history. Saban's 21-12 career record in those contests gives him a .636 winning percentage, which is also college football's best. Following Saban on the all-time victory list are Bobby Bowden (18/.378 winning percentage), Barry Switzer (15/.516), Woody Hayes (15/.516), Steve Spurrier (15/.429) and Lou Holtz (15/.419). That record includes five wins in the College Football Playoff: No. 3 Michigan State (38-0) and No. 1 Clemson (45-40) in 2015; No. 4 Washington (24-7) in 2016 and victories over No. 1 Clemson (24-6) and No. 3 Georgia (26-23) in 2017. Alabama also went 3-0 in BCS National Championship Games (vs. Texas, 37-21, 2009; vs. LSU, 21-0, 2011; vs. Notre Dame, 42-14, 2012).

AGAINST THE TOP 10: Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 27-9 overall record against top-10 teams, including a 12-3 mark vs. the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff. In Saban's five national championship seasons at Alabama, his teams have gone 17-2 against top-10 opponents.

SABAN VS. AP TOP 25: Alabama's 26-23 win over then-No. 3 Georgia in the CFP National Championship Game gave head coach Nick Saban 77 career wins vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams, good for third all-time. Former Penn State head coach Joe Paterno leads the list with 86, four victories ahead of Florida State's Bobby Bowden (82). Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant is fourth at 66. Former Duke, Florida and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier is fifth at 64. Saban's winning percentage against AP ranked teams (77-39, .664) tops Bryant (.592), Bowden (.557), Spurrier (.529) and Paterno (.512).

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 53-14 (.791) against the Associated Press Top 25, including a 29-8 (.784) mark against AP top-10 teams since the start of 2008. Alabama opened the 2017 season with a 24-7 win over then-No. 3 Florida State on Sept. 2, posted a 24-10 win over No. 19 LSU on Nov. 4, downed No. 18 Mississippi State, 31-24, on Nov. 11 before falling to No. 6 Auburn, 27-14, on Nov. 25. The Tide rebounded to defeat No. 1 Clemson, 24-6, in the Allstate Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1 and captured its 17th national championship with a 26-23 overtime victory over No. 3 Georgia in the CFP National Championship Game on Jan. 8. In 2016, the Tide faced 10 teams ranked in the AP poll, going 9-1 and outscoring those opponents by an average score of 38.0-17.3. Alabama finished 8-1 in 2015 against the AP Top 25 after going 5-2 in 2014, 3-2 in 2013 and 5-1 in 2012. The Tide held a 4-1 mark vs. top-25 teams in 2011 and went 5-3 in 2010.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 125 of 128 regular season games that have had national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU during the 2010 calendar year, UA was essentially eliminated from a chance to keep itself in the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 11 seasons.

NON-OFFENSIVE TDs IN THE SABAN ERA: Savion Smith's 38-yard interception return for a touchdown against Arkansas State was Alabama's 64th non-offensive touchdown of the Nick Saban era. Alabama totaled a single-season record 15 non-offensive scores in 2016, which led the Football Bowl Subdivision and was the most in a season by a FBS team in the last 20 years. Alabama scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 consecutive games dating from to the CFP semifinal vs. Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015, to the Texas A&M game on Oct. 22, 2016, and had 14 non-offensive touchdowns in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return.

ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 127 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014, 14-1 in both 2015 and 2016, and was 13-1 this past season. Ohio State is second with 114 wins, followed by Boise State (113), Oklahoma (107) and Clemson (106) to round out the top five.

FIRST TIME STARTERS: Sophomore Jerry Jeudy became the 12th Crimson Tide student-athlete to make his first career start this season when he took the field for the opening snap against Arkansas State on Sept. 8. The Crimson Tide had 11 student-athletes make their first career start vs. Louisville on Sept. 1, including four on offense, four on defense and three specialists. Getting their first career nod on offense were offensive lineman Alex Leatherwood, wide receivers Henry Ruggs III and DeVonta Smith and quarterback Tua Tagovailoa. Making their first start on defense were defensive lineman Quinnen Williams and defensive backs Saivion Smith, Xavier McKinney and Shyheim Carter. Placekickers Austin Jones and Joseph Bulovas along with punter Skyler DeLong started for the first time on special teams.

ALABAMA ON 2018 NFL ROSTERS: The National Football League season opened with a league-leading 54 former Alabama players dotting the rosters of 27 of the league's 32 teams. Among the 54 are 16 players from the Tide's 2017 national championship team, the most of any college football team from a season ago. Alabama also boasts an astounding 16 defensive players from its 2016 and 2017 teams currently on NFL rosters..

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 10 drafts (77) than any other college in the nation. Twenty-six of those picks have been first-round selections and 41 have gone in the first two rounds. The list of 77 features five Super Bowl champions, nine Pro Bowl selections, six All-Pro members and one Offensive Rookie of the Year. Alabama has had 22 players selected in the last two drafts, including eight in the first round and 11 in the first two rounds. The Tide had six players picked on offense, 15 on defense and one specialist in the 2018 draft. The defensive draftee total from the last two drafts includes all 11 of Alabama's 2016 season-opening defensive starters.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 777 of the 1,139 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 469-129-8 (.781) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 110-17 (.866) mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 164th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid-1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started seven seasons at No. 1 (2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 28 seasons (1991-2018), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017 seasons. The Tide has compiled five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 & 1979) and five USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017) coaches poll national titles.

NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw 12 former UA players selected in the 2018 NFL Draft, including four first-round picks in Minkah Fitzpatrick (No. 11, Miami Dolphins), Da'Ron Payne (No. 13, Washington Redskins), Rashaan Evans (No. 22, Tennessee Titans) and Calvin Ridley (No. 26, Atlanta Falcons). Ronnie Harrison (No. 93, Jacksonville Jaguars) followed in the third round with Da'Shawn Hand (No. 114, Detroit Lions) and Anthony Averett (No. 118, Baltimore Ravens) going in the fourth round. JK Scott (No. 172, Green Bay Packers) was selected in the fifth round while Shaun Dion Hamilton (No. 197, Washington Redskins) and Bradley Bozeman (No. 215, Baltimore Ravens) were chosen in round six. Bo Scarbrough (No. 236, Dallas Cowboys) and Joshua Frazier (No. 246, Pittsburgh Steelers) rounded out the former Alabama players taken in the seventh round. The 12 selections is a new high for UA players taken in one draft under head coach Nick Saban. The total is also the most in school history, surpassing the 10 Tide players chosen in 2017 and in what was a 32-round draft in 1945.

OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past 11 seasons under Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. The 2018 squad enters the season with 12 players who already had degrees in hand going into the season, which ties for eighth nationally first in the Southeastern Conference. The 12 graduates are: Keaton Anderson, Joshua Casher, Ronnie Clark, Johnny Dwight, Hale Hentges, Austin Jones, Derek Kief, Christian Miller, Jamey Mosley, Richie Petitbon, Ross Pierschbacher and Deionte Thompson. Since 2013, Alabama has seen 136 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate) by players who were still suiting up for the Crimson Tide following graduation. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen 15 players earn a master's degree before stepping foot on the field for the final time.

GRADUATING WITH THE BEST: The Alabama football team has not only been dominant on the field, but also in the classroom. The Crimson Tide is tied for seventh among Associated Press Preseason Top 25 teams for its graduation rate of 84 percent. Ahead of Alabama were Stanford (96 percent), Notre Dame (96), UCF (92), Miami (Fla.) (88), Virginia Tech (86) and Clemson (84). Mississippi State and Penn State tied with the Tide for sixth place. Alabama's percentage tied for fourth among Southeastern Conference football programs.

ALABAMA SHARES 2017 AFCA ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD: The Alabama football program was among seven recipients of the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. The award is the first for the Crimson Tide. Alabama is one of seven programs that recorded a 100-percent graduation rate for members of its 2010 freshman football class. Joining the Tide as honorees this year are Cincinnati, Middle Tennessee, Northwestern, Utah, Utah State and Virginia. The Academic Achievement Award is presented annually to the school or schools with the highest score in the NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and a federal graduation rate of 75 percent or higher. The GSR is based on a six-year graduation window for student-athletes and was developed by the NCAA as part of its academic reform initiative to more accurately assess the academic success of student-athletes. The GSR holds institutions accountable for transfer students, unlike the federal graduation rate. The GSR also accounts for midyear enrollees.

ACADEMIC PROWESS: The Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the academic highlights under Nick Saban.

- A total of 12 Crimson Tide players will take the field with their degrees in hand for the season opener with Louisville.
- Earned Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 84 in 2016-17 tied for fourth among SEC football programs.
- In 2017, Alabama ranked among the national leaders with 25 graduates on its roster during postseason play. The Tide led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play in 2015 (29), 2014 (22) and 2013 (28), as well.
- Alabama's five national title football teams under Nick Saban (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017) included 114 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That 2011 team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- In 2017-18, Alabama finished second in the number of football student-athletes being named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll with 10 honorees. Alabama topped that list in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and shared the top spot in the 2015-16 academic year.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY: Last season, Alabama worked 400-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered its time across numerous areas during the 2017 season including in schools, hospitals, with Habitat for Humanity and on campus.

ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE: The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won 11 national championships in five different sports and 24 SEC championships in eight different sports.
- Alabama claimed another SEC team title during the 2017-18 academic year with men's track & field winning the 2018 SEC indoor title.
- On a department-wide basis, Alabama's approximately 600 student-athletes earned a 3.27 grade point average. All 17 programs earned better than a 2.75 GPA with 15 earning better than a 3.0. A total of eight Tide teams earned over a 3.5 GPA in 2017-18, marking the eighth year in a row that at least five teams have met that standard.
- Alabama was also prolific when it came to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, earning the accolade 391 times during the 2017-18 academic year. The Crimson Tide had 106, 57 and 136 student-athletes named to the SEC Fall, Winter and Spring Academic Honor Rolls and 92 named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- Alabama once again led the nation in Academic All-America honors, totaling 11 during the 2017-18 academic year. The Crimson Tide's total makes Alabama the only school to earn double-digit honors the last five years in a row.
- Alabama has earned Academic All-America honors a Division I-best 88 times since 2009-10 and 56 times over the last five years. The Tide's five-year total is 11 better than second-place Stanford over that span. Alabama has also made a significant jump in the rankings when it comes to honors since 2000, jumping Notre Dame in 2017-18 to move up to second place with 134.
- Since 2009-10, UA leads all NCAA Division I schools with 88 Academic All-America honors. Stanford is second over that span with 82, while Nebraska is third at 62.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS: Saivion Smith's second-quarter interception return for a touchdown against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 gives the Crimson Tide at least one forced turnover in 44 of its last 46 games dating to the start of the 2015 season. During the current run, the Crimson Tide has forced 76 turnovers (53 interceptions, 23 fumbles) and returned 19 of those miscues for touchdowns.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 187 touchdowns over the last 127 games. That is 49 fewer than the second most in the nation (LSU with 236).

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama has permitted just 21 scores on the ground in its last 46 games dating to the start of the 2015 season. Alabama allowed nine rushing touchdowns a season ago and led the nation in 2016 with just five rushing touchdowns allowed. In 2015, the Crimson Tide allowed just seven rushing touchdowns in 15 games, the second-lowest total in the country. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 77 rushing touchdowns. Ohio State is No. 2 in that category, giving up 120 since 2007, followed by Iowa (130), TCU (138) and Utah (140).

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: Clemson's 188 yards in total offense in the Allstate Sugar Bowl last season marked the 48th time in the last 141 games under Nick Saban (since the start of the 2008 season) that the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposition to fewer than 200 yards of total offense.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: The Crimson Tide's defensive performance against Louisville on Sept. 1 marks the 97th time in 154 games (63.0 percent) under head coach Nick Saban that the Tide has held an opponent to less than 300 yards of total offense. The Tide has now held nine of its last 16 opponents below 300 yards, dating to the start of the 2017 season.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Alabama has surrendered only 18 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that is the lowest in the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed 13 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game: Auburn's Kerryon Johnson (104 on Nov. 25, 2017), Ole Miss' Jordan Wilkins (101 on Sept. 30, 2017), Georgia's Nick Chubb (146 on Oct. 3, 2015), Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliott (230 on Jan. 1, 2015), Auburn's Tre Mason (164 on Nov. 30, 2013), Virginia Tech's Trey Edmunds (132 on Aug. 31, 2013), Georgia's Todd Gurley (122 yards on Dec. 1, 2012), LSU's Jeremy Hill (107 on Nov. 3, 2012), Georgia Southern's Dominique Swope (153 on Nov. 19, 2011), Tennessee's Tauren Poole (117 on Oct. 23, 2010), Ole Miss' BenJarvus Green-Ellis (131 on Oct. 13, 2007), Houston's Anthony Alridge (100 on Oct. 6, 2007) and Darren McFadden of Arkansas (195 on Sept. 15, 2007).

FIRST CAREER INTERCEPTION FOR SMITH AGAINST ARKANSAS STATE: Defensive back Saivion Smith recorded his first career interception against Arkansas State. The junior picked off an errant Red Wolves pass in the second quarter on Sept. 8 and returned it 38 yards for a touchdown to give the Tide a 40-0 second quarter lead. The score was the second interception return for a touchdown for UA this season.

DOUBLE-DIGIT TACKLES FOR LOSS: Alabama's 11 tackles for loss against Louisville on Sept. 1 marked the second consecutive game the Tide reached double digits in that category. Alabama had a 2017 season-high 12 stops behind the line against Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game.

CARTER RECORDS FIRST CAREER INTERCEPTION AND SCORE: Shyheim Carter's 45-yard interception return for a touchdown against Louisville on Sept. 1 was his first career interception. The score was also the first by interception for Alabama since Mack Wilson's 18-yard return against Clemson in the 2018 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

CAREER NIGHT EARNS QUINNEN WILLIAMS SEC DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS: Alabama defensive lineman Quinnen Williams earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his performance against Louisville on Sept. 1. The Birmingham, Ala., native finished with career highs in tackles (six) and tackles for loss (3.5) in his first career start. Williams' previous career best in tackles was five vs. LSU in 2017. His previous high in tackles for loss was two on two occasions.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

MOVING THE CHAINS: The Alabama offense has proven very effective on third down in 2018, converting 20-of-30 opportunities for a conversion rate of 66.7 percent that is tied for third nationally. The Crimson Tide has converted on 10-of-15 third down chances in each of its two games this season. Starting quarterback Tua Tagovailoa has led the Tide to third-down conversions on 11-of-14 attempts in two games this season (78.6 percent). He helped the Tide convert all five of his third-down chances in the season opener against Louisville on Sept. 1 and was 6-of-9 on third down opportunities in the home opener against Arkansas State on Sept. 8. Alabama converted 40 percent of its third-down opportunities a season ago.

TIDE TOPS 500 YARDS IN TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama's 599 yards in total offense against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 marks the 14th time since the start of the 2015 season that the Crimson Tide has surpassed the 500-yard mark and, coupled with the 519-yard output against Louisville on Sept. 1, gives UA back-to-back 500+ yard total offense games for the second time in the last two seasons. Alabama recorded 677 yards against Vanderbilt and 613 against Ole Miss in consecutive games in 2017.

BRYANT-DENNY OPENER POINTS HIGH UNDER SABAN: Alabama's 57 points against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 is the most scored by a Nick Saban team in its Bryant-Denny opener. The previous high under Saban occurred in a 52-6 win over Western Carolina in Saban's first game at Alabama on Sept. 1, 2007. The total is also the most points scored by the Tide in its Bryant-Denny season debut since a 63-14 win over Southern Miss on Sept. 27, 1969.

CONSECUTIVE 50+ POINT GAMES TO START THE SEASON: The Crimson Tide's 57-7 win over Arkansas State on Sept. 8 and its 51-14 victory over Louisville on Sept. 1 marks the first time since 1925 that Alabama has scored 50 or more points in the first two games of a season.

SIX SCORING TOSSES BY THE TIDE: Alabama's six touchdown passes in its win over Arkansas State on Sept. 8 – four by Tua Tagovailoa and two by Jalen Hurts – ties for the second-most in school history. Hurts and Tagovailoa combined for six against Mercer a season ago. The school record of seven scoring tosses came in Alabama's 53-0 win over Southern Miss on Nov. 11, 1950.

OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS: With its 57-7 win over Arkansas State on Sept. 8, Alabama has now won 17 straight games when scoring a touchdown on its first offensive possession of a game. The Tide's last loss after finding the end zone on its first drive was to Oklahoma in the 2014 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

TOUCHDOWN PASSES IN A QUARTER: Tua Tagovailoa's three first quarter touchdown passes against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 were the most in a single quarter by an Alabama quarterback since AJ McCarron threw three in the second quarter against Auburn on Nov. 24, 2012.

CAREER DAY FOR TAGOVAILOA: Quarterback Tua Tagovailoa established new career highs for passing yards and passing touchdowns in the win over Arkansas State on Sept. 8. The sophomore finished the game with 228 yards passing and four scoring tosses. The touchdown total ties for No. 2 on the single-game touchdown passes record. Gary Hollingsworth threw for five touchdowns in a 62-27 win over Ole Miss on Oct. 7, 1989.

NAJEE HARRIS TOPS THE CENTURY MARK AGAINST ARKANSAS STATE: Running back Najee Harris established a new career high in rushing yards against Arkansas State with the first 100-yard rushing performance of his Alabama career. The sophomore finished with 135 yards and one touchdown on 13 carries, averaging 10.4 yards per rush.

OPENING DAY QUARTERBACKS: Tua Tagovailoa's two touchdown passes against Louisville on Sept. 1 equal the most for an opening day starting quarterback during the Nick Saban era at Alabama. AJ McCarron and John Parker Wilson threw for a pair of scores against Michigan (2012) and Clemson (2008), respectively. Tagovailoa's 227 passing yards against the Cardinals ranks No. 3 for an opening night starter in the Saban era. The sophomore's total trails only Blake Sims' 250 yards against West Virginia in 2014 and Greg McElroy's 230 yards against Virginia Tech in 2009.

BY ANY MEANS NECESSARY: Alabama's 51-14 victory over Louisville on Sept. 1 marked the first time Alabama has scored on a rush, reception, kickoff return and interception since the Crimson Tide's 35-10 win over Virginia Tech on Aug. 31, 2013 in Atlanta.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama extended its school record for scoring in consecutive games to 229 games against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 with Tua Tagovailoa's opening drive 58-yard touchdown pass to Jerry Jeudy. The Crimson Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama has a 177-52 (.773) record over the course of the current streak.

RUSHING TO SUCCESS: Alabama rushed for 278 yards against Arkansas State last Saturday and is now 105-6 (.946) since the start of the 2008 season when rushing for at least 140 yards. The only losses were at Auburn in 2013 and 2017, at Ole Miss and vs. Ohio State in 2014, against Ole Miss in 2015 and against Clemson in 2016. The Tide has topped the 140-yard mark 38 times in its last 46 games dating to the start of the 2015 season. UA rushed for 140 yards or more 10 times in 2015 and 13 times in 2016 and 2017 and has done so twice this season.

BALL PROTECTION: In the last 141 games dating to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has turned the ball over only 158 times (89 fumbles, 69 interceptions) for 1.12 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 140 times in 127 games (1.10/game). That number since 2009 includes 54 interceptions in 3,214 attempts (1 INT every 59.5 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 21 fumbles in 3,424 carries (one fumble every 163.0 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

SOPHOMORE TRIO TD GRABS: For the first time in the careers of sophomores Jerry Jeudy, Henry Ruggs III and DeVonta Smith, the trio each caught a touchdown pass in the same game. Jeudy caught two against Arkansas State to give him four this season, while Ruggs III and Smith hauled in their first scores of the year. Jeudy leads the team with eight catches for 151 yards while Smith's 176 receiving yards is a team high with Ruggs pulling in five grabs for 71 yards.

TUA AT THE HELM: Through two games in 2018, Tua Tagovailoa has directed 13 drives as the Tide's starting quarterback with nine resulting touchdowns and one culminating in a field goal. In those drives, the Tide offense was 11 for 16 on third down conversions, accounting for 671 yards on 76 snaps for an average of 8.8 yards per play and 64 of the 88 points scored by the UA offense. If you go back to last year's CFP National Championship Game, Tagovailoa has directed 22 drives as Alabama's quarterback, the scoring 12 touchdowns while leading the offense on three drives that resulted in field goals. On those 22 drives, Alabama has snapped the ball 126 times, accumulated 978 yards of offense, scored 91 points and averaged 7.8 yards per play.

THIRD DOWN IS TUA TIME: In third down passing situations through two games this season, Tua Tagovailoa is 10 for 10 for 207 yards and four touchdowns, a quarterback rating of 405.88. He was 3-for-3 passing for 65 yards and a touchdown against Louisville on third down and 7 for 7 for 142 yards and three touchdowns against Arkansas State. Seven of the 10 third down situations have been third-and-10 or more and have covered 139 yards with three touchdowns and three first downs. The sophomore has also rushed twice on third down for 19 yards and two first downs, giving the Tide four touchdowns and six first downs in his 12 touches on third down this season.

TAGOVAILOA PASSING TD PER ATTEMPT: Crimson Tide starting quarterback Tua Tagovailoa has thrown six touchdown passes in two game this season on only 35 attempts, an average of a touchdown every 5.8 attempts. During his two seasons in an Alabama uniform, Tagovailoa has thrown 17 touchdowns in 112 career passing attempts, which averages out to a passing touchdown every 6.6 attempts.

WHEN UNDER PRESSURE: Tua Tagovailoa is the second-highest ranked QB in the Football Bowl Subdivision when pressured according to Pro Football Focus. He has completed 5-of-9 attempts on 13 dropbacks for 94 yards, two touchdowns and four first downs in his first two games. He posted a 131.5 NFL passer rating on those nine attempts, second only to Boise State's Brett Rypien (149.3) (min. 15 attempts per game).

A LOOK AT TUA'S STARTS: Tua Tagovailoa is the highest rated passer in the nation through the first two weeks of the college football season. He led a passers in the ESPN's Total QBR metric at 98.5 (out of 100) and his 153.2 NFL passer rating is the highest among all FBS QBs with at least 35 attempts. He ranks second in collegiate passer efficiency at 237.2. He has passed for 455 yards on 25-of-35 passing (71.4 percent) with six touchdowns and no interceptions while rushing nine times for 46 yards and one score.

CHARTING TAGOVAILOA'S 16 PASSES VS. LOUISVILLE: Tua Tagovailoa completed 12-of-16 passes for 227 yards and two touchdowns against Louisville. He was able to work all areas of the field as he picked apart the Cardinals for a 235.4 passer rating. He completed all three of his passes beyond 20 yards with a touchdown. Tagovailoa was 2-for-4 passing with a touchdown from 10-19 yards while going 5-for-5 in the 0-9 yard range and was 2-of-3 behind the line of scrimmage (does not account for batted balls or throw aways).

CAREER NIGHTS FOR JEUDY AND SMITH AGAINST LOUISVILLE: DeVonta Smith and Jerry Jeudy established career highs in multiple categories against Louisville on Sept. 1. Smith set career bests for receptions (four) and yards (99). Smith caught one pass in eight different games as a freshman in 2017 and had a career high 41 yards receiving against Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game. Jeudy's four catches and two touchdown receptions were also career bests. He caught one touchdown in two games as a freshman a season ago and had three receptions on two occasions in 2017.

HARRIS NO. 3 ON UA CAREER YARDS PER CARRY LIST: Through 43 career games, running back Damien Harris has averaged 6.7 yards per carry, which ranks No. 3 all-time at Alabama for backs with at least 200 rushing attempts. Harris has rushed for 2,310 yards and 14 touchdowns on 346 career attempts. Eddie Lacy (2010-12) is second at 6.8 yards per attempt (2,402 yards on 355 carries). Wilbur Jackson (1971-73) is the UA career leader at 7.2 yards per carry (1,529 yards on 212 attempts).

HARRIS 14TH ON UA CAREER RUSHING YARDS CHART: Senior running back Damien Harris' 61 rushing yards against Arkansas State gives the Madison, Ky., native 2,310 rushing yards for his career. Harris is just the 20th back in UA history to surpass the 2,000-yard mark. His total currently ranks No. 14 all-time at Alabama. Eddie Lacy (2010-12) is No. 13 at 2,402. Derrick Henry is Alabama's career rushing leader with 3,591 yards.

HARRIS RANKS AMONG THE SEC'S BEST: Though he does not yet have enough career attempts to qualify for the SEC career yards per carry list (minimum 400 attempts), Damien Harris' 6.7 yards per carry average ranks with the conference career leaders at the 300-carry mark. Harris' current average over his first 334 career carries is second to SEC career leader Bo Jackson of Auburn, who averaged 6.8 yards over his first 350 collegiate attempts.

HURTS TOPS UA QUARTERBACK CAREER RUSHING TOUCHDOWN LIST: Jalen Hurts' 21 career rushing touchdowns is an Alabama career high for quarterbacks, surpassing the previous career best of 19 established by Harry Gilmer from 1944-47.

HURTS NO. 2 ON UA QUARTERBACK CAREER RUSHING LIST: Jalen Hurts' 1,850 career rushing yards ranks No. 2 all-time for quarterbacks at Alabama. Harry Gilmer (1944-47) tops the chart with 2,025 yards. Hurts' total also ranks No. 22 on Alabama's all-time career rushing list.

HURTS' CAREER TOUCHDOWN RESPONSIBILITY: Jalen Hurts' combined 63 career rushing and passing touchdowns ranks No. 2 on the Alabama career touchdown responsibility list. AJ McCarron (2010-13) is the UA career leader with 80 in 53 games. Hurts has thrown 42 touchdown passes and rushed for 21 scores in 31 career games.

HURTS THIRD ON UA CAREER TOUCHDOWN PASSES LIST: Quarterback Jalen Hurts' two touchdown passes against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 gives the junior 42 touchdown passes in his 31-game career, moving him into third place on the Alabama career list. John Parker Wilson (2005-08) is second with 47. AJ McCarron is Alabama's career leader with 77 touchdown passes from 2010-13.

HURTS THIRD ON UA CAREER TOTAL OFFENSE LIST: With 6,874 total offensive yards in his 31-game career, Jalen Hurts ranks third on the Alabama career total offense list. John Parker Wilson (2005-08) is second with 8,099 yards. AJ McCarron (2010-13) is the UA career leader with 8,969 yards.

HURTS SEVENTH ON UA CAREER PASSING YARDS LIST: Jalen Hurts' 93 yards passing against Arkansas State on Sept. 8 gives the junior 5,024 career passing yards, which ranks seventh on the Alabama career passing yards list. Jay Barker (1991-94) is sixth at 5,689 yards. AJ McCarron (2010-13) is the UA career leader with 9,019 yards.

WADDLE NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK: Alabama freshman receiver/punt returner Jaylen Waddle was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his performance against Louisville on Sept. 1. In his Alabama debut, the Houston, Texas, native returned four punts for 80 yards with a long of 31. He also caught three passes for 66 yards, including a 49-yard reception to set up the Crimson Tide's third touchdown.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

KICKOFF RETURN TOUCHDOWN: Josh Jacobs' 77-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Louisville on Sept. 1 was Alabama's first kickoff return for a score by the Crimson Tide since Kenyan Drake's 95-yard return against Clemson in the 2016 CFP National Championship Game.

SERIES NOTES

ALABAMA-OLE MISS SERIES: Alabama leads the Ole Miss series 53-10-2 (49-11-2 after NCAA rulings) with wins in 28 of the last 33 games dating back to the 1977 season (including NCAA rulings). Alabama defeated the Rebels, 66-3, in the most recent meeting last season in Tuscaloosa.

ALABAMA-OLE MISS BY LOCATION: Alabama and Ole Miss have met 65 times across nine different cities in three states. The Tide is 16-8-1 all-time (13-9-1 after vacations and forfeits) in games played in Mississippi, including a 9-3 record (6-4 after vacations and forfeits) in Oxford, a 6-4-1 mark in Jackson, a 1-0 record in Columbus and an 0-1 slate in Greenville. Alabama owns a 28-2 advantage (27-2 after vacations) in games played in Tuscaloosa and is 36-2-1 (34-2-1 after vacations) in the state of Alabama. The Tide is 7-0-1 in games played in Birmingham and 1-0 in the two rivals' lone meeting in Mobile. In the only meeting outside of their home states, Alabama defeated the Rebels 12-7 in the 1964 Sugar Bowl in New Orleans, La.

GENERAL NOTES

SABAN IN SEC OPENERS: Head coach Nick Saban owns a 10-1 (.909) record in SEC openers (home and away) during his time at Alabama and is 12-4 (.750) for his career as a head coach in the Southeastern Conference. While at Alabama, he has outscored his opponents 457-214 (41.5-19.4 ppg) and has two shutout victories. For his career, Saban-coached teams have put up 549 points compared to 307 for opponents. Saban owns a 6-1 (.857) record when opening his conference slate at home and a 7-3 (.700) mark when starting SEC play on the road.

SABAN IN SEC ROAD GAMES: Head coach Nick Saban owns a 49-15 (.767) mark in SEC road games across his time at LSU and Alabama, including a 37-7 (.841) mark with the Crimson Tide. Saban has notched seven perfect SEC road seasons (2003, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016).

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban's 107 conference wins (including SEC championship games) moves him into sole possession of third place on the SEC career conference wins list. Saban ranks first in league history in SEC regular season winning percentage at .805 (107-26). He is also second in SEC history in winning percentage in all games at .830 (177-36). Saban is sixth on the SEC career wins at 177 victories.

119-7 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide is 119-7 (.944) when leading at the half. Alabama has held the lead in 36 of its last 46 games dating back to the start of the 2015 season. Alabama is also 103-4 (.962) when leading by seven or more points at the break during the Saban era.

PRESEASON THREEPEAT: This year marks Alabama's third straight appearance at No. 1 in the Associated Press preseason rankings. The Crimson Tide now joins Oklahoma (1985-87) as just the second team to start the season at No. 1 in three consecutive seasons since the poll began in 1936.

SABAN AMONG 20-YEAR LEADERS: Alabama's 45-40 win over Clemson in the 2016 College Football Playoff Championship Game was head coach Nick Saban's 191st victory in his first 20 years as a college head coach. That total is the second-most in FBS history for a coach in the first 20 seasons of his career. Former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne won 195 games in the opening two decades of his tenure in Lincoln. Long-time Penn State head coach Joe Paterno ranks third with 187. Saban's five national championships in 20 seasons tops both Osborne (none) and Paterno (1).

TIDE REACHES 11 WINS FOR THE 21st TIME: With the win against Mercer on Nov. 18 last season, Alabama secured its 11th victory of the year, marking the 21st time in program history that the Tide has achieved the feat. Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama has had nine 11-win seasons (2008-09, 2011-17). It is the seventh straight season with at least 11 wins, which is the longest streak of its kind in SEC history. The SEC has had three streaks of three seasons with at least 11 victories, including Alabama from 1973-75, LSU from 2005-07 and South Carolina from 2011-13.

10-YEAR RUN: Nick Saban compiled a 125-14 (.899) record over the past 10 seasons in Tuscaloosa (2008-17), which is the best of any major college school over a 10-year span since Bud Wilkinson and Oklahoma in the late 1940s through the late 1950s. UA's 125 wins over the past decade are the most for any FBS school during a 10-year span in the Associated Press poll era (since 1936).

10-WIN SEASONS: Alabama's 31-24 victory over Mississippi State on Nov. 11 last season marked the 10th consecutive season the Crimson Tide has reached the 10-win mark. The 10 straight years with 10 wins extends the school record. The previous total for most consecutive 10-win seasons was five, set by coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's teams from 1971-75. In 122 seasons, the Tide has won 10 or more games 37 times, the most in college football history. Alabama has produced 12 10-win seasons since 2002 (2002, 2005, 2008-2017). Bryant had a school-record 13 10-win seasons at Alabama while Nick Saban is second with 10.

SEC RECORD: Alabama extended its record for most consecutive 10-win seasons in SEC history in 2017 when it defeated Mississippi State, 31-24, on Nov. 11, to improve to 10-0 on the year. UA had a 12-2 record in 2008, 14-0 in 2009, 10-3 in 2010, 12-1 in 2011, 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014 and 14-1 in 2015 and 2016.

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama's game with Arkansas State on Sept. 8 was the Tide's 405th televised game. Alabama has compiled a 268-133-4 (.667) all-time record in televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts).

124 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 141 GAMES: With the Tide's appearance on ESPN2 against Arkansas State on Sept. 8, Alabama has played in 124 nationally televised games since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of the 2014 season.

FIRST TIME PLAYERS: Alabama had some new faces on the field for its season opener against Louisville on Sept. 1. True freshmen Eyabi Anoma (LB), Slade Bolden (WR), Skyler DeLong (P), Jerome Ford (RB), Josh Jobe (DB), Ale Kaho (LB), Cameron Latu (LB), Jaylen Moody (LB), Patrick Surtain II (DB) and Jaylen Waddle (WR), made their collegiate debuts against the Cardinals while redshirt freshmen Markail Benton (LB), Joseph Bulovas (PK), Mac Jones (QB), Phidarian Mathis (DL), Kyriq McDonald (DB), Tyrell Shavers (WR) and Chadarius Townsend (WR), saw their first career action for the Tide. Junior transfers Tevita Musika (DL) and Saivion Smith (DB) and senior transfer Austin Jones made their Crimson Tide debuts, as well.

RETURNING SUCCESS: The Crimson Tide returns 12 starters and 53 letterwinners from its 2017 squad that finished 13-1 and won its 17th national championship. The 2018 team returns seven starters on offense and three on defense. The offense is highlighted by 2,000-yard career rusher Damien Harris at running back and quarterback Jalen Hurts, who enters the season with a 26-2 career record as a starter. Other returning starters on offense are linemen Lester Cotton Sr., Ross Pierschbacher, Jonah Williams and Matt Womack along with tight end Hale Hentges. Alabama's defense returns defensive Isaiah Buggs and Raekwon Davis and linebacker Anfernee Jennings. Davis earned first team All-SEC honors a season ago when he led the Tide with 8.5 sacks.

NEW HIRES: Nick Saban made six new additions to his 2018 staff during the offseason, hiring Jeff Banks as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach, Dan Enos as associate head coach and quarterbacks coach, Josh Gattis as co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach, Pete Golding as co-defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach, Craig Kuligowski as associate head coach and defensive line coach and Karl Scott as defensive backs coach. In addition, holdovers Michael Locksley and Tosh Lupoi assumed the roles of offensive and defensive coordinators, respectively.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban ranks third all-time among college coaches who have tutored first round draft picks. Saban has coached a total of 31 players who were chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 26 from Alabama. Florida State's Bobby Bowden is the career leader with 35, followed by Penn State's Joe Paterno at 32.

ALABAMA IN THE NFL (WEEK 1): This past weekend marked the start of the 2018 season in the National Football League. A total of 33 former Alabama players earned playing time throughout opening weekend. Below is a look at some of the highlights from former Crimson Tide players currently in the NFL.

Julio Jones continued his consistent ways for the Atlanta Falcons in their loss to the reigning Super Bowl Champion Philadelphia Eagles, leading the Falcons in receptions. The All-Pro wideout hauled in 10 catches for 169 yards while carrying it once for 11 yards in the NFL's season-opening game. Jones' totals for catches and yards each ranked second among all wideouts in week one.

The Washington defense received a standout effort from four former member of the Crimson Tide in linemen **Jonathan Allen** and **Da'Ron Payne**, along with linebackers **Ryan Anderson** and **Shaun Dion Hamilton**. The foursome contributed to the Redskins' 24-6 win over the Arizona Cardinals. The standout defensive effort saw Washington limit the Cardinals to only 68 rushing yards rushing and 153 yards through the air.

Running back **T.J. Yeldon** had a big day in the Jacksonville Jaguars' 20-15 victory over the New York Giants. Yeldon carried for 51 yards on 14 attempts and added three catches for 18 yards and a touchdown. In that same game, the Giants received five tackle performances from both **Dalvin Tomlinson** and **Landon Collins**, tying the duo for third on the team.

Houston Texans safety **Kareem Jackson** shined in a 27-20 loss to the New England Patriots. Jackson led the team with eight tackles and forced two fumbles in his first career game at the safety spot.

CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS: The Alabama football program is again well-represented in the NFL heading into the start of Week 2 of the 2018 season with numerous former players on league rosters. The Tide has a league-high 54 former players (active, injured reserve, practice squad) working on an NFL roster. In the last 10 NFL Drafts (including 2018), Alabama has had 77 players selected, including 26 players in first round, 23 in the second and third rounds, eight in the fourth, eight in the fifth, three in the sixth and nine in the seventh round.

- Saban has a 225-62-1 (.783) record as a college head coach to date (220-62-1, .779 after vacations). He has six national championships – five at Alabama – eight conference championships and 19 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff Semifinals each of the last four seasons including the last three CFP National Championship Games.

- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships, the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships and the only coach to win multiple CFP National Championships. He has won six titles in his last 14 years coaching college football after capturing CFP National Championship following the 2017 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame - 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska - 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the second coach in the poll era to win six national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant) and the first two ever win five titles in a nine-year span.

- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He took down Clemson 45-40 to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game. He captured his sixth national championship - and fifth at Alabama - in 2017 with a 26-23 overtime win over Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game.

- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and a daughter-in-law, Kelsé.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise roughly \$8 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 16 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that struck Tuscaloosa.

- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

ORLANDO, Fla. — The top-ranked Alabama Crimson Tide were in control from start to finish in a 51-14 win over Louisville in the Camping World Kickoff at Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Fla., in the 2018 season opener for both teams.

The Crimson Tide used a balanced attack to outgain the Cardinals, 519-268, in total offense, including a 222-16 mark in the rushing game. UA's victory improved head coach Nick Saban's record in season openers to a perfect 12-0 while at UA.

Sophomore quarterback Tua Tagovailoa led the UA offense, totaling three touchdowns with 253 yards of offense in his first career start. Tagovailoa went 12-of-16 for 227 yards with two passing scores to fellow sophomore Jerry Jeudy, while rushing for 26 yards and a score. On the receiving end, sophomore wideout DeVonta Smith led the charge with four catches for 99 yards.

The Tide defense was led by sophomore lineman Quinnen Williams, who finished the game with six tackles including a team-high 3.5 tackles for loss to go along with one quarterback pressure and a pass breakup. Redshirt junior defensive back Deionte Thompson had a solid performance with five tackles, 1.5 for a loss, three pass breakups and an interception.

Alabama added a pair of non-offensive touchdowns thanks to the defensive and special teams units. Junior defensive back Shyheim Carter returned an interception 45 yards for a score while third-year back Josh Jacobs took a kickoff back for a 77-yard return late in the third quarter to add to the Tide's cushion.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The No. 1-ranked Alabama football team cruised to a 57-7 win over Arkansas State in the Crimson Tide's home opener at Bryant-Denny Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Alabama threw five touchdown passes in the first half with sophomore Tua Tagovailoa completing three and junior Jalen Hurts connecting for two scores. For the game, Tagovailoa completed 13-of-19 passing attempts for 228 yards and four touchdowns - both career-high marks, while Hurts went 7-for-9 for 93 yards and two scores.

The six scoring tosses equals the second-most in a game in Alabama football history. Tagovailoa's four touchdown passes also ranks second on the individual single-game touchdown passes list.

Sophomore running back Najee Harris eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career after running for 135 yards and a touchdown on just 13 carries. Five different receivers caught touchdown passes, including two by sophomore Jerry Jeudy for a second consecutive game.

Offensively, the Tide finished with 599 yards of total offense - 321 through the air and 278 on the ground.

On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore defensive back Xavier McKinney paced the Tide with a career-high seven tackles as Alabama limited the Red Wolves to a single third quarter touchdown. Junior defensive back Saivion Smith posted the Tide's third non-offensive touchdown of the season with a 38-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter.


