WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Ole Miss continues its three-game home stand this week when it hosts Alabama to open SEC play.
- Ole Miss is 33-48-3 all-time in SEC openers ... This is the fourth straight year the Rebels have faced Alabama to open up SEC play.
- This is the 66th meeting between Ole Miss and Alabama ... The Crimson Tide hold a 49-11-2 series lead.
- The last time the Rebels faced the nation's No. 1 team was Alabama last season ... Ole Miss is 1-12 all-time versus the top-ranked team in the land.
- No. 1 Alabama is the Rebels' first ranked opponent this season ... Ole Miss went 1-3 against top-25 teams last year.
- Ole Miss is 164-87-7 (.649 winning pct.) all-time during the month of September.
- Ole Miss is 103-32-3 (.757 winning pct.) in September home games (including home contests played in Memphis and Jackson), including a 77-19-2 (.796 winning percentage) mark in September games played in Oxford.
- Ole Miss has averaged 61.5 points per game through the first two games this season, third in the nation.
- QB **Jordan Ta'amu** leads the SEC and is ranked second nationally with 392.0 yards passing per game.
- Ta'amu recorded a career-high in yards (448), total offense (446) and touchdowns (five) vs. SIU ... It was the third-best passing performance by a Rebel in school history.
- Four Rebels players recorded their first career touchdowns vs. SIU: **Matt Corral, Vernon Dasher, Elijah Moore** and **Isaiah Woullard**.

The 76 points scored Saturday against SIU are the fifth-most points scored in school history and are the most since 2015 when the Rebels scored 76 against Fresno State.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Ole Miss will host its weekly fall press conferences every Monday at 11:15 a.m. CT in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will take the podium first and will be followed by Coach Matt Luke at approximately 11:30 a.m. Defensive coordinator Wesley McGriff and offensive coordinator Phil Longo will follow Coach Luke at the podium. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may watch live on SEC Network+ (on the ESPN app) or on the Ole Miss Athletics Facebook page.

PLAYER/ASSISTANT INTERVIEWS: Coordinators will take part in the Monday press conference. Select players and assistant coaches will be available after practice on Tuesday. Coach Luke and select players will be available after practice on Wednesday. All media interviews will be held in the team meeting room. There is no availability on Thursday or Friday.

PRACTICES: All practices are closed to the public and open to media for select periods on Tuesdays. Media are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything related to practice until the post-practice interviews. This includes media who leave practice early. On available days, media will be alerted which periods are available for video. Live video is prohibited, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Videographers and photographers must use tight shots and not formations. If you have not previously attended practices, please contact the Communications office for prior approval and daily alerts on practice locations and times.

AUDIO/VIDEO RESTRICTIONS: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions. Ole Miss offers free FTP downloads of practice footage, interviews and game highlights for television stations to use during regularly scheduled news/sportscasts. WEEKDAY PARKING: Parking permits are required for everyone on campus Monday through Friday between 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Media that plan to regularly attend practices, press conferences and other on-campus events may purchase a Vendor Permit from Campus Parking (www.olemiss.edu/parking), which is good for the full academic year. Those without parking permits are advised to park in a metered spot in the east lot of the Manning Center and feed the meter. Day passes are also available online at www.olemiss.edu/parking/visitors.html.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must agree to the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) daily newspapers; 2) network affiliate television stations; 3) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 4) magazines, weekly newspapers and non-broadcast radio stations. All season credential requests need to be submitted by August 18. Credential demands are heavy, and we hope you understand the space limitations we must deal with each year. For those of you who are not credentialed for all of the games you requested, we hold onto your request and will contact you if space becomes available on a game-by-game basis.

GAMEDAY DRIVING DIRECTIONS: Media traveling to campus should take the Chucky Mullins Drive exit off of Highway 6 and travel north toward the 4-way stop. Those with garage parking passes should turn right onto Hill Drive, and those with Tad Smith Coliseum passes should continue straight on Chucky Mullins Drive. Both lots are located on the right side of their respective streets.

GAMEDAY PARKING: Gameday media parking is located in two locations: 1) garage adjacent to The Pavilion; and 2) lot near Tad Smith Coliseum. Media should check their pass to indicate for which lot they are designated. For passes marked for the garage, each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Passes marked for Tad Smith Coliseum are for a lot located west of the old arena.

MEDIA GATE: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located there, and photographers must show a photo I.D. to receive sideline vest. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested at least seven days prior to gameday to ensure delivery.

RECRUITS: Media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect -- from when they check in until after they have checked out or concluded their visit and are no longer inside our facilities. Media are also forbidden from having direct contact with the prospects' family members who are present at the visit. In addition, media may not be present during any recruiting contact and may not video or photograph a prospect during a visit.





LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST ALABAMA

Sept. 30, 2017 • Tuscaloosa, Ala. • #1 Alabama 66, Ole Miss 3: The eventual national champion Alabama was too much for Ole Miss in Tuscaloosa in 2017. The Rebels mustered just one Gary Wunderlich field goal in the first quarter as the Crimson Tide cruised to victory.

Sept. 17, 2016 • Oxford, Miss. • #1 Alabama 48, #17 Ole Miss 43: The Rebels flirted with a third straight win over Alabama thanks to a late comeback behind the arm of Chad Kelly. The Rebel QB neared Archie Manning's all-time passing marks against the Tide, throwing for 421 yards, but the Rebels couldn't quite match Alabama's power rushing attack as they came up five points short of the upset at home.

Sept. 19, 2015 • Tuscaloosa, Ala. • #11 Ole Miss 43, #2 Alabama 37: For the second straight year, Ole Miss and Alabama delivered an instant classic on the gridiron. And for the second straight year, Ole Miss took down the Tide. Behind five turnovers forced by the Landshark Defense, the No. 11 Rebels won 43-37, defeating No. 2 Alabama in consecutive seasons for the first time in program history. Chad Kelly was 18 of 33 for 341

with three TDs through the air and one on the ground. Ole Miss did not commit a turnover in the game.

Oct. 4, 2014 • Oxford, Miss. • #11 Ole Miss 23, #1 Alabama 17: No. 11 Ole Miss' thrilling 23-17 victory over No. 1 Alabama was a moment that won't soon be forgotten. It was the first win over a top-ranked team in program history, and it was the Rebels' first win over Alabama since 2003. The opportunistic Landshark Defense also created two turnovers, one of which the Rebels ultimately won the game on, and the other effectively ended the game as Senqueze Golson picked off Blake Sims with 37 seconds left.

Sept. 28, 2013 • Tuscaloosa, Ala. • #1 Alabama 25, #21 Ole Miss 0: The Rebels' fast-paced offense came in averaging 38 points and 490 yards, but never got going and managed just 46 yards on 25 rushes. Ole Miss trailed just 9-0 at halftime. Alabama's offense repeatedly stalled but Cade Foster hit field goals of 28, 42 and a career-long 53 yards. The offense could not get anything going, as the Crimson Tide won 25-0.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke (Ole Miss, 2000) is in his 11th season at Ole Miss and second season at the helm, taking the reins of his alma mater as the 38th head coach in program history. He was born a Rebel as his family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. During his 24 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others. On the field, he has mentored 20 all-league selections as well as All-Americans and first-round draft picks Laremy Tunsil and Laken Tomlinson. Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), spent five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach before being promoted to interim head coach for the 2017 season. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), he served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe.

ALABAMA HEAD COACH NICK SABAN

Nick Saban (Kent State, 1973) is in his 12th season at the helm for Alabama and has tallied a 134-20 record during his time in Tuscaloosa, including five national titles since 2009 and been named National Coach of the Year seven times. Saban has compiled a 225-62-1 (.781) record (220-62-1 after vacations) as a college head coach and has gone 127-14 (.899) in the past 10 seasons in Tuscaloosa, which is the best of any major college school over a 10-year span since Bud Wilkinson and Oklahoma in the late 1940s through the late 1950s. UA's 127 wins over the past decade are the most for any FBS school during a 10-year span in the Associated Press poll era (since 1936). Alabama has not lost to an unranked team since 2007 and have lost just one game to a team ranked outside the top 15 in the AP poll in the last 10 years (No. 19 South Carolina in 2010). For perspective, no team in the FBS has lost fewer than 10 games to teams outside the top 15 in that same time frame.

ALABAMA SCOUTING REPORT

Alabama is 2-0 on the season and is ranked No. 1 in both the AP and coaches polls this week. The Crimson Tide has won every game by at least 37 points, including a 51-14 win over Louisville to open the season two weeks ago. Since losing to the Rebels in Tuscaloosa during its 2015 national championship run, Alabama has won 41 of its last 43 games. The only two setbacks occurred vs. Auburn last season and the 2017 College Football Playoff National Championship to Clemson. The Alabama offense is led by sophomore QB Tua Tagovailoa, who has thrown for 455 yards, with six touchdowns and no interceptions. Tagovailoa is completing over 71 percent of his passes. RB Najee Harris is Alabama's leading rusher with 165 yards and two TDs, averaging 7.9 yards per carry. The Tide has limited opponents to 94.5 rushing yards per game, while racking up 250.0 yards per game on the ground on offense. Alabama has only returned one kickoff all season, but it was a 77-yard TD return from Josh Jacobs against Louisville.

SCOTTIE TODDY

RB **Scottie Phillips** has quickly burst onto the scene for Ole Miss and has been a key component in an Ole Miss offense that ranks third nationally in scoring (61.5) and eighth in total offense (596.0). Phillips, a junior college transfer from Jones County CC, leads the SEC and is ranked top five in the nation in rushing yards per game (155.5) and rushing touchdowns (4). Phillips followed up his historic 200-yard game against Texas Tech, with a 107-yard and two touchdown performance against Southern Illinois. His 204 rushing yards during week one were the second-most during College Football's opening weekend and are the most by an Ole Miss running back making his debut. Phillips became just the eighth running back to run for over 200 yards in a game.

- RB **KeShun Wells** was teammates with the Tide's Saivion Smith (DB) and Isaiah Buggs (DL) at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College.
- Ole Miss' **Peyton Cox** (OL) and Alabama's Bryce Musso (WR) were teammates at Jesuit High School in New Orleans.
- Ole Miss co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Jason Jones** played at Alabama from 1996-99 and graduated in 2001. He was a graduate assistant with the Crimson Tide in 2004 and earned his master's degree in sports management from Alabama in 2005.
- Ole Miss defensive line coach **Freddie Roach** played at Alabama from 2002-05, earning All-SEC honors twice to go along with collecting National Freshman of the Year honors in 2002. He was a strength and conditioning coach with the Crimson Tide from 2008-10 and served as UA's director of player development for the last two seasons (2015-16) under head coach Nick Saban.
- Alabama tight ends coach/special teams coordinator Joe Pannunzio hired Ole Miss head coach **Matt Luke** to serve on his staff at Murray State, Luke's first full-time coaching job; Pannunzio was the Racers head coach from 2000-05 with Luke serving as the team's offensive line coach for the first two seasons. Pannunzio was the Ole Miss tight ends/special teams coach from 1995-98, while Luke was a center for the Rebels.

DON'T BLINK

In 2017, Ole Miss' average touchdown drive was 99 seconds, the fastest in the nation; the Rebels wasted no time trying to repeat that stat in 2018. It took Ole Miss only two plays and 33 seconds to record its first touchdown of the 2018 season Sept. 1 vs. Texas Tech. 12 touchdowns later, Ole Miss is just off last year's torrid scoring pace and is averaging just over 101 seconds per TD drive. The Rebels are currently just one of three teams in the nation to have five scoring drives under one minute.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Ole Miss lit up the scoreboard Saturday against SIU, putting up 76 points vs. the Salukis, including two defensive touchdowns. The 76 points were the most points by Ole Miss since 2015 when the Rebels scored 76 against Fresno State and were the fifth-most points in school history. The 629 total yards of offense was the sixth-most in school history. Ole Miss' 479 team passing yards were the second-most in Ole Miss history. Quarterback **Jordan Ta'amu** finished the night 23-of-33 for 448 yards and five touchdowns, both career highs for the senior from Pearl City, Hawaii. Four different Rebels recorded their first career touchdowns.

SEVERAL NEW FACES OF nWo SHINE IN WIN

With Ole Miss wideout **DaMarkus Lodge** out due to injury, several new names from the Rebels' receiving corps emerged Saturday night against SIU. Making his first career start, sophomore **Braylon Sanders** hauled in four catches for a career-high 133 yards and one touchdown; just his second career TD. **Elijah Moore** made the best of his first career catch as the freshman from Fort Lauderdale, Florida, hauled in a 50-yard reception and found the endzone for the score. Not to be outdone, senior **Alex Weber** made a highlight catch on the back of an SIU defender that earned him ESPN's No. 1 play on SportsCenter's Top 10.

BROWN RAISES NEARLY 50K FOR ALS

When he was in seventh grade, Ole Miss punter **Mac Brown** had a modest goal of raising \$500 for a childhood friend's dad who had been diagnosed with ALS. Along with a group of neighborhood friends, Brown started a lemonade stand, Awesome Lemonade Stand, in Eden Prairie, Minnesota, to help his friend's family. Seven years later, that \$500 goal has ballooned to nearly \$50,000 raised by Brown and his friends for ALS research. The Awesome Lemonade Stand is held on a late day in June and this year's fundraiser raised more than \$15,000 alone.

- Ta'amu leads the SEC in passing yards per game (392) and is second in TDs (7) and passing efficiency (206.1).

DEFENSE STEPS UP

After allowing 38 first half points Saturday against Southern Illinois, the Ole Miss defense held SIU to just a single field goal in the final 30 minutes of the game. The Rebels forced three turnovers in three straight SIU possessions to start the fourth quarter. DB **Vernon Dasher** got things started with his first career touchdown after an 88-yard interception return. It was the first interception returned for a touchdown since 2016, when **Zedrick Woods** returned an interception 31 yards for a TD against Memphis in 2016. On the next defensive series, **Keidron Smith** picked off SIU's Sam Straub for Ole Miss' second fourth quarter turnover. After Ole Miss pushed its lead to 62-41, **Victor Evans** picked up a Saluki fumble and returned it 56 yards for another Ole Miss defensive score. It was the first time Ole Miss has scored two defensive touchdowns in a game since the Rebels returned two interceptions back for six against Fresno State in 2015.

SEC NATION HEADED TO THE GROVE

SEC Network's traveling pre-game show, SEC Nation, will be making its fifth appearance in The Grove prior to Saturday's game vs. Alabama. The show will take place on The Grove stage from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m., and airs on SEC Network. SEC Nation's "The Pit" open at 7 a.m. for those that want to be close to the action. SEC Nation will feature host Laura Rutledge, analysts Paul Finebaum, Marcus Spears and Tim Tebow, and reporter Lauren Sisler rejoining the SEC Nation desk. Ryan McGee, senior writer for ESPN The Magazine, comes back as a contributor for 2018. In addition, Oxford's own Wright Thompson and John T. Edge will visit the set to talk about their new SEC Network show, TrueSouth, which follows Edge as he travels around the South, introducing viewers to tastemakers, food, culture and the history that brings it together. The show's prior visits to The Grove were in 2014 for Ole Miss-Tennessee and the Egg Bowl vs. Mississippi State, 2015 for the Arkansas game and again in 2016 for Ole Miss-Alabama.

CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD

In the spring, senior DB **C.J. Moore** became the 28th different Rebel to be awarded the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a standout defensive player each year. The award honors the late **Chucky Mullins**, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. Moore wears the No. 38 jersey in Mullins' honor this season.

124TH SEASON OF OLE MISS FOOTBALL

This game will kick off the 124th season of football at Ole Miss and the second under head coach **Matt Luke**. The Rebels boast an all-time record of 667-517-35 (.562 winning percentage). Ole Miss did not field teams in 1897 due to an epidemic of yellow fever, and also in 1943 when football was abolished at all Mississippi state-supported institutions by the Board of Trustees.

RebTalk, the official weekly radio show of Ole Miss Athletics, is moving to a new day and location for this season. NEW MASCOT ROAMING THE SIDELINES

Ole Miss' new on-field mascot, Tony, was unveiled Aug. 11 at the annual Meet the Rebels event and will roam the sideline during the 2018 season. Ole Miss' Landshark mascot is named in honor of the first Rebel to throw "Fins Up," Tony Fein.

Fein, an Army veteran who served a one-year tour in the Iraq War before arriving in Oxford, was a two-year letterman after transferring from Scottsdale (Ariz.) Community College. He was the 2008 recipient of the Pat Tillman Award by the Military Order of the Purple Heart. Fein passed away in October 2009, but his legacy at Ole Miss continues through the Landshark.

At Ole Miss, Landshark is a term that was first adopted by the Rebel football team's defensive unit. As part of that identity, defensive players celebrate big plays by putting a hand to their forehead in the shape of a shark fin. A battle cry of "Fins Up" also contributes to the players' persona. With the popularity of both the players and the hand gesture, Ole Miss fans and student-athletes from other sports embraced the spirit of the Landshark, and in October 2017, the university announced the Landshark as the official mascot of the Ole Miss Rebels.

LAST WEEK VS. SIU: BEYOND THE NUMBERS

- Both **AJ Brown** and **DJ Metcalf** had a perfect 158.3 passer rating when targeted vs Southern Illinois. Brown caught eight-of-nine targets for 158 yards and two TDs while Metcalf caught all seven of his pass targets for 93 yards a TD. Longest reception by Brown: 46 yards. Longest reception by Metcalf: 51 yards. On the season, Brown and Metcalf are now two of the four WRs in the entire nation with perfect passer ratings when targeted in 2018 (the others: Missouri WR Emanuel Hall + West Virginia WR Gary Jennings)
- The Ole Miss offensive line currently owns the No. 1 pass block efficiency (95.5) in the entire FBS (min 40 pass plays) thru the first two weeks of the year. On 72 pass plays, the offensive line has allowed just one sack, no QB hits and three hurries. RT **Alex Givens** has yet to allow a QB pressure in 2018. Same can be said for LG **Javon Patterson** (no pressures allowed on 72 pass blocks)
- On deep pass attempts (throws targeted 20+ yards down the field) vs Southern Illinois, QB **Jordan Ta'amu** completed 7-of-12 attempts for 306 yards, four TDs and no INTs. On the season, Ta'amu now has thrown for more deep passing yards than any other QB in the nation (473). That's more than 100+ more deep passing yards than any other QB in the FBS has thrown for so far.
- Freshman LB **Jacquez Jones** was the highest graded Ole Miss defender in week 2 with a 91.8 overall grade. Jones ended the game with one sack, two QB hits, three tackles, one forced fumble and one reception allowed in his coverage for just nine yards. Jones has yet to miss on a tackle attempt in 2018.
- The Ole Miss defense has been excellent when defending vs HB non-screen passes. Opponents have only been able to complete 6-of-12 attempts to HBs coming out of the backfield on non-screens this year which is a very low completion percentage to HBs. The 2018 NCAA average completion rate on HB non-screens is currently 75%. With one INT and just 47 total passing yards allowed to these routes, the Ole Miss D has the No. 1 passer rating allowed vs HB non-screens in the FBS (25.3).

Leading the charge was a defensive squad that ranked fourth in the nation in rushing defense.

The term Landshark originated that season from senior linebacker Tony Fein, an Army veteran who served a one-year tour in the Iraq War before arriving in Oxford. A two-year letterman after transferring from Scottsdale (Ariz.) Community College, Fein was the 2008 recipient of the Pat Tillman Award by the Military Order of the Purple Heart. Fein passed away in October 2009, but his legacy at Ole Miss continues through the Landshark.

HEAD COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke was born a Rebel. His family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. Now, he has achieved a lifelong dream by taking over the reins of his alma mater. Ole Miss made it official on Nov. 27, 2017, removing the interim tag and introducing Luke as the 38th head coach in program history.

Under difficult circumstances and an uncertain future, Luke faced the daunting challenge of taking over the team just a week before 2017 fall camp and responded by helping the Rebels bounce back from a losing season to post a 6-6 record, including a 31-28 road win at Mississippi State to return the Golden Egg to Oxford. The Gulfport native continued that momentum by assembling a top-25 recruiting class in February.

During his 24 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others. On the field, he has mentored 17 all-league selections as well as All-Americans and first-round draft picks Laremy Tunsil and Laken Tomlinson.

Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), just wrapped up his 10th season as a coach at Ole Miss. Prior to taking over as interim head coach, Luke spent five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), Luke served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe.

Since returning to Oxford in 2012, Luke has helped the Rebels earn four bowl berths, including a 10-3 record and Sugar Bowl victory to cap the 2015 season.

Luke's 2017 Rebels saw breakout performances from all three phases of the game.

A.J. Brown, the SEC leader in multiple receiving categories, set single-season marks in both receiving yards and receiving touchdowns, while senior running back Jordan Wilkins became just the fifth Rebel to surpass the 1,000-yard mark in a single season. Two different quarterbacks threw for 350 or more yards in three games during the 2017 season, becoming just the fourth FBS team in the last 20 seasons to accomplish that feat.

The 2017 Rebel defense finished the season strong, forcing five turnovers in the season finale win against Mississippi State. Senior linebacker DeMarquis Gates ended the season with 114 tackles, the most in a single season since Patrick Willis had 137 in 2006.

Luke also saw senior kicker Gary Wunderlich become Ole Miss' career record-holder in points scored (350), points kicking (350), field goals made (64), PATs made (158) and PATs attempted (162).

A product of Gulfport High School, Luke lettered four seasons (1995-98) as a center at Ole Miss. A starter in 33 career games for the Rebels, he served as team captain in 1998 as Ole Miss posted a 7-5 ledger and defeated Texas Tech in the Independence Bowl. He was named the 1998 Ole Miss Most Valuable Senior by the Jackson (Miss.) Touchdown Club and twice earned Academic All-SEC honors.

Following his playing career, he served as a student assistant coach at Ole Miss in 1999, helping the Rebels to an 8-4 mark with regular-season wins against Auburn, South Carolina, LSU and Arkansas as well as a 27-25 triumph over Oklahoma in the Independence Bowl. He graduated in May 2000 with a degree in business administration.

Luke is married to the former Ashley Grantham of Oxford, Mississippi, and the couple has two sons, Harrison and Cooper. His father, Tommy, was a defensive back at Ole Miss in the 1960s while his brother, Tom, quarterbacked the Rebels from 1989-91. Tom is also on the Ole Miss football staff as assistant athletics director for player development.

LAST MEETING ALABAMA 66, OLE MISS 3

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. -- Alabama proved why it is the most dominant team SEC in more ways than one in its 66-3 win over Ole Miss.

After the two teams exchanged three-and-outs to begin the game, Alabama took control in every facet of the game. Bo Scarbrough opened up the scoring with a six-yard touchdown rush. Levi Wallace made it 14-0 less than a minute later when he picked off a Shea Patterson pass and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown.

Gary Wunderlich added a 26-yard field goal to make it 21-3, getting the Rebels on the board. The Rebels' tumultuous opening quarter was capped off by the first of two Jalen Hurts touchdown passes.

Alabama cruised the remainder of the way and piled on 31 second half points. Hurts was 12-19 for 197 yards and two touchdowns. He rushed for 101 yards and compiled a passer rating of 185.

Ole Miss struggled to find a rhythm offensively for much of the night, largely due to Alabama's fierce pass rush that repeatedly flushed Shea Patterson out of the pocket and sacked him five times. Patterson was 14 for 29 on the night and threw for 165. The Rebels did not reach the end zone. Ole Miss was 0-13 on third down.

Ole Miss gained 253 yards of total offense. Alabama wracked up 613 yards of total offense, 365 of which came on the ground.

Jordan Wilkins had his best game of the 2017 season in a night where Ole Miss rushed the football with more effectiveness than it did in the first three games. The senior running back tallied 101 yards on 12 carries and broke runs of 21 and 44 yards. D.K. Metcalf led all receivers with 3 catches for 46 yards.

OXFORD, Miss. - Senior quarterback Jordan Ta'amu surpassed career marks in touchdowns and total yards, while the Landshark D tallied two scores in the second half to power Ole Miss to a 76-41 victory over Southern Illinois on Saturday.

The first half was a back-and-forth showdown between the two hot offenses, with SIU coming out swinging. The Salukis forced a three-and-out on the initial Rebel drive of the game, and proceeded to run down the field and score on a nine-yard pass from Straub to Nigel Kilby less than two minutes into the action. The Salukis ended the half on a wild 70-yard catch-and-run by receiver Raphael Leonard (6 rec., 117 yards, 2 TD), but the Rebel defense started to slow Southern in the third quarter before the eventual fourth-quarter explosion.

At 117 points, both Ole Miss and Southern combined for the most single-game points scored in Rebel history. The Rebels' 76 points and two defensive touchdowns were the most since 2015.

Four Rebels scored their first-career touchdowns, as Elijah Moore (1 rec., 50 yards, 1 TD) and Braylon Sanders (4 rec., 133 yards, 1 TD) got in on the N.W.O. fun for their first-ever Rebel touchdowns. A.J. Brown (8 rec., 158 yards, 2 TD) and D.K. Metcalf (7 rec., 93 yards, 1 TD) didn't relinquish the belt for long, though, as both racked up huge numbers on the receiving end of the career day by Ta'amu.



HOUSTON, Texas - Ole Miss scored early and often in the AdvoCare Texas Kickoff en route to a 47-27 win over Texas Tech to open the season at 1-0.

It took just 33 seconds for the Rebels to reach the end zone to kick start the 2018 season. Jordan Ta'amu found D.K. Metcalf for a 58-yard scoring strike to put the Rebels up 7-0 early.

Texas Tech answered back with a scoring drive of its own, but the tie didn't stand for long. Jaylon Jones returned the ensuing kickoff 94 yards to the house to put the Rebels back ahead for good.

Ole Miss scored on all of its drives in the first quarter. Luke Logan tacked on a 24-yard field goal before running back Scottie Phillips found the end zone for the first time as a Rebel, racing 39 yards on 4th-and-1 to give Ole Miss a 24-7 lead.

The Rebels couldn't quite finish the push to the end zone on two long drives in the second quarter, but they came away with two more field goals by Logan.

The Red Raiders struck first with a field goal early in the second half, but Phillips once again exploded for a big touchdown run. This time, a 65-yard jaunt by the junior college transfer gave Ole Miss a 37-20 advantage. However, TTU answered with a rushing score of its own to cut the lead back to 10.

Ta'amu hit A.J. Brown on a 34-yard touchdown to cap a 0:20 scoring drive and make it a comfortable 44-27 lead.

Late in the fourth, Phillips exploded for another 44-yard run to go over 200 yards for the day, making him the first Rebel to run for 200-plus since Brandon Bolden in 2010. The run set up one final field goal from Logan to make it a 20-point Rebel lead.

OXFORD, Miss. - Senior quarterback Jordan Ta'amu surpassed career marks in touchdowns and total yards, while the Landshark D tallied two scores in the second half to power Ole Miss to a 76-41 victory over Southern Illinois on Saturday.

The first half was a back-and-forth showdown between the two hot offenses, with SIU coming out swinging. The Salukis forced a three-and-out on the initial Rebel drive of the game, and proceeded to run down the field and score on a nine-yard pass from Straub to Nigel Kilby less than two minutes into the action. The Salukis ended the half on a wild 70-yard catch-and-run by receiver Raphael Leonard (6 rec., 117 yards, 2 TD), but the Rebel defense started to slow Southern in the third quarter before the eventual fourth-quarter explosion.

At 117 points, both Ole Miss and Southern combined for the most single-game points scored in Rebel history. The Rebels' 76 points and two defensive touchdowns were the most since 2015.

Four Rebels scored their first-career touchdowns, as Elijah Moore (1 rec., 50 yards, 1 TD) and Braylon Sanders (4 rec., 133 yards, 1 TD) got in on the N.W.O. fun for their first-ever Rebel touchdowns. A.J. Brown (8 rec., 158 yards, 2 TD) and D.K. Metcalf (7 rec., 93 yards, 1 TD) didn't relinquish the belt for long, though, as both racked up huge numbers on the receiving end of the career day by Ta'amu.
