

WHAT TO WATCH FOR #ALAvsTAMU:

The No. 22 Aggies begin conference play as Texas A&M travels to No. 1 Alabama in a 2:30 p.m. contest at Bryant-Denny Stadium on CBS.

- Saturday marks the 11th meeting between the Aggies and Crimson Tide. Alabama holds a 8-2 ledger and have won the last five meetings.
- This weekend's contest is the seventh time Texas A&M and Alabama have squared off with both teams ranked in the top 25.
- Head coach Jimbo Fisher faces his former boss, Nick Saban, for the second time in his career. The two previously met in the season opener last season. Fisher served as Saban's offensive coordinator at LSU from 2000-04.
- Since joining the SEC in 2012, the Aggies have been featured on CBS 12 times and hold a 6-6 record including a 29-24 victory at No. 1 Alabama in 2012.
- With a balanced offense propelling the nation's fifth-best offense (596.3 YPG), Texas A&M sits alongside Houston, Ohio State and Oklahoma State as the only teams that rank in the top 25 in rushing *and* passing
- Texas A&M is just one of three teams nationally with a top 15 rushing offense and defense (Air Force & Mississippi State).
- Texas A&M carries a 30-game streak of scoring at least 14 points into Saturday's game, which is the longest such streak in the SEC and ranks third among Power 5 schools (Oklahoma, 43 & West Virginia, 34).

HIGH POWERED OFFENSE

For the first time since 2009, the Aggie offense, which ranks fifth nationally in yards per game at 596.3, has produced three consecutive games of 500 or more yards to begin the season.

- In fact, the Aggies are in the midst of a four-game streak of 500-yard total offense games dating back to last season, which hasn't been done since 2013.
- The Aggies reeled off eight-straight games of 500+ yards of offense in 2013 against Sam Houston State (714), Alabama (628), SMU (581), at Arkansas (523), at Ole Miss (587), Auburn (602), Vanderbilt (558), UTEP (564) and Mississippi State (537).

SEC RUSHING LEADER

Junior RB Trayveon Williams leads the SEC with an average of 133.0 rushing yards (No. 6 in FBS) and is tied for the SEC lead with four rushing TDs.

- Through three games, Williams has rushed for 399 yards on 59 carries (6.8 yards per carry) with a pair of 100-yard rushing games.
- Williams ran roughshod through an over-matched Northwestern State defense in the season-opener to the tune of 240 yards with three touchdowns on 20 carries. The 240 rushing yards rank No. 2 in school history behind Bob Smith's 297 vs. SMU in 1950.
- The 240-yard outburst is the No. 2 single-game effort in FBS this season. Williams is the only FBS player with 200-yard rushing games in 2016, 2017 2018.
- Always a breakaway threat, Williams has 11 runs of 40+ yards in his 28-game career, including four over 70 yards.
- Williams has bulked up to 205 pounds after playing at under 200 his previous two seasons.

INSTANT IMPACT

Newly-hired Jimbo Fisher's first commitment at Texas A&M was a little-known junior college tight end. Nine months later, Jace Sternberger has become a huge part of the Aggies' offense.

- Sternberger already has three TD catches, which is tops in the SEC and FBS among tight ends and he's already within reach of the Aggies' TE school record of five.
- Has posted at least one 20-yard+ catch in every game.
- He earned John Mackey TE of the Week honors after making five catches for 56 yards with two TDs in the Aggies' season-opener against NSU (8/30).

MILESTONES TO WATCH

- Junior RB Trayveon Williams is 156 all-purpose yards shy of the 3,000-yard barrier.
- Senior LB Otaru Alaka ranks as the team's most experienced player in terms of career starts and is slated to make the 37th start of his career against Alabama. The fifth-year senior is the team's only player with 30 or more starts.
- Alaka and junior OL Erik McCoy are the team's leaders in consecutive starts at 29.
- Senior 12th Man (and fullback) Cullen Gillaspia has made 29 consecutive appearances as the Aggies' 12th Man. He is chasing Sam Moeller's school record of 39 starts in the Aggies' hallowed No. 12 jersey.

ABOUT MOND'S NIGHT

Sophomore QB Kellen Mond passed for a career-high 430 yards and three touchdowns on 23-of-40 attempts against No. 2 Clemson's vaunted defense.

- Mond's 333 passing yards in the second half were the most-ever by a Texas A&M QB (previous high was 283 by Jerrod Johnson vs. Kansas State in 2008).
- Mond's 206 fourth-quarter passing yards were the second most in school history behind Johnson's 219 vs. Oklahoma State in 2010.
- Mond's 430 passing yards were the eighth-most ever by a Texas A&M QB.
- Mond is the fourth sophomore to surpass the 400-yard barrier in passing yards (Kenny Hill (2 times), Johnny Manziel (4), Jerrod Johnson (1)).
- Mond used eight receivers, including at least two catches by six Aggies.
- Mond joins Johnny Manziel, Kenny Hill and Ryan Tannehill as the only Aggie QBs with 400-yard passing games against AP Top 25 opponents.
- Mond's 430 were the second-most by a Texas A&M passer against a AP top five opponent behind Manziel's 464 against No. 1 Alabama in 2013.

WAITING HIS TURN

Junior P Braden Mann showed a glimpse of his bright future with a huge day against Clemson.

- Mann averaged a whopping 55.0 yards on five punts, while flirting with the great Shane Lechler's single game school record of 57.2 yards (min. 5 punts).
- After opening the game with 44- and 41-yard punts, he closed the game with bombs of 69 yards and 73 yards.
- Mann's 73-yard boot is the third-longest punt in FBS this season.
- While he doesn't meet the minimum requirement (3.5 punts per game), Mann's 51.7 average would rank second nationally.

RISING TO THE OCCASION

Redshirt sophomore Kendrick Rogers entered the Clemson game with a career-best game of four catches for 29 yards vs. New Mexico in 2017 and was still seeking his first career touchdown. That changed in a big way against the No. 2 Tigers.

- The 6-foot-4 Rogers reeled in career bests in catches (7), receiving yards (120) and had the first two TD catches of his career -- a 9-yard high-point effort in the third quarter and a spectacular juggling 24-yarder with 46 seconds remaining in regulation.



BIG MAROON GOONS

Calling themselves the Maroon Goons since 2012, the Aggies' starting offensive line for the season-opener against NSU collectively tipped the scales at 1,565 pounds, or 313.0 pounds per goon. They are the heaviest starting five in school history, just ahead of 2014's group that weighed 312.0 per player.

- Behind the biggest offensive front in school history, the Aggies rushed for 503 yards in the season-opener while gaining 758 total yards.
- It marked the second time in school history that the Aggies rushed for 500+ yards and passed for 200+ yards in the same game.

CONNECTIONS

- Legendary coach Paul "Bear" Bryant coached the Aggies from 1954-57 before a long tenure at Alabama. Two of Bryant's proteges served as head coach at Texas A&M: Gene Stallings (1965-71) and Jackie Sherrill (1982-88). Stallings played for Bryant at Texas A&M and served as an assistant coach at Alabama from 1958-64. He would later coach the Tide from 1990-96, and led them to the 1992 national title. Sherrill played for Bryant at Alabama from 1963-65.
- John David Crow was the single Heisman Trophy winner of Bryant's career in 1957 at Texas A&M, and he was an assistant coach at Alabama from 1969-71.
- Dennis Franchione served as head coach at both schools -- at Alabama from 2001-02 and Texas A&M from 2003-07.
- Tide special teams coordinator/tight ends coach Jeff Banks served in a similar capacity at Texas A&M from 2013-17.
- Tide Director of Performance Nutrition Amy Bragg served the same capacity at A&M from 2005-10.
- Texas A&M Senior Associate AD for External Affairs Doug Walker served as Alabama's Director of Communications for 11 years before returning to his alma mater in 2017.
- Texas A&M Director of Football Recruiting Leah Knight served in a similar capacity at Alabama in 2017 and earned her bachelor's degree at the school.

- Texas A&M has a 30-game streak of scoring at least 14 points, which is the longest in the SEC (3rd among P5 schools).

OFFENSE

- Texas A&M has gained over 500 total yards in all three games in 2018 and four straight dating back to last year's Belk Bowl shootout with Wake Forest.
- RB Trayveon Williams is the SEC's rushing leader (No. 6 in FBS) with an average of 133.0 rushing yards per game. His 6.8 yards/carry average leads the SEC among player with more than 45 carries.
- Williams is also tied for the SEC lead with three rushing TDs. Williams is the only FBS player with 200-yard rushing games in 2016, 2017 2018.
- QB Kellen Mond has improved his completion percentage from .515 as freshman to .629 as a sophomore. Similarly, his passer rating has jumped from 108.8 in 2017 to 162.9 in 2018.
- Mond has accounted for three TDs in every game in 2018.
- Mond has attempted 89 passes without an interception in 2018. His last pickoff came on Oct. 28, 2017 vs. Mississippi St.
- Mond and his favorite target, WR Jhamon Ausbon, were high school teammates at the IMG Academy in Florida.
- A 50-catch receiver as a freshman in 2017, Ausbon leads the team with 13 catches for 201 yards.
- Cullen Gillaspia, the Aggies' 12th Man since 2016, was shifted to FB by Coach Fisher's staff. No 12th Man has ever scored a TD.
- Nebraska transfer fullback Ben Miles, former LSU coach Les Miles' son, has received a transfer waiver and saw his first action last week vs. ULM.
- JC transfer TE Jace Sternberger has had an immediate impact on the team with 10 catches for 146 yards. His three receiving TDs lead all SEC tight ends.

- The team's Overall MVP in the spring, Sternberger was the John Mackey TE of the Week after making 5 catches for 56 yards and 2 TDs in season-opener.
- The Aggies' top four tight ends in 2018 were not on the team in 2017.
- The Aggies' top five WRs, statistically, are all sophomores, with four of them hailing from the 2017 signing class. The super sophs have combined for 42 catches, 662 yards and 3 TDs.
- WR Kendrick Rogers had a career game against No. 2 Clemson (9/8), recording career highs in catches (7), yards (120) and TDs (2). He missed the ULM game (9/15) due to injury.
- WR Quartney Davis redshirted in 2016 and played sparingly in 2017 while recovering from a pre-college injury, but he's making an impact in 2018 with 6 catches for 92 yards and a TD.
- Always a breakaway threat, Williams has 11 runs of 40+ yards in his 28-game career, including four over 70 yards.
- C Erik McCoy (29 starts) and LG Keaton Sutherland (26) have a combined 55 games of starting experience.
- The Aggies' O- and D-lines are the largest in school history (in terms of tonnage).
- A sign of the depth that the Aggies have at OL is the fact that three former starters have been relegated to reserve status: Connor Lanfear, Ryan McCollum, Colton Prater (OG starter in 2016).

DEFENSE

- The Aggies have yet to give up a point on the opening drive of either half this season.
- SAF Donovan Wilson, who suffered a season-ending injury in the 2017 season opener, is tied for second on the team with 15 tackles. Wilson is the team's active leader with 6 interceptions.
- Kingsley Keke was a starter at DT the past two seasons, but the 300-pounder has started at DE in the Aggies' first 3 games.
- Junior LB Tyrel Dodson, who led the team in tackles in 2017 with 105, is tied for second on the team with 15 tackles. At 242 pounds, he's one of the biggest linebackers in school history.
- Sophomore DT Justin Madubuike's sister, Julia, is a member of the Texas A&M track and field team and earned a gold medal with Team USA's 4x400-meter relay at the World U20 Championships in Tampere, Finland in July.

- DE Landis Durham tied for the SEC lead with 10.5 QB sacks in 2017. Durham, who came to Texas A&M as a LB, was a lightly used reserve for his first two seasons at Texas A&M before flourishing into one of the SEC's top pass rushers last season.
- LB Otaru Alaka, the team's career leader with 213 tackles, was third on the team with 78 stops in 2017 and is team leader with 16 tackles this season. Entering his third year as a starter, Alaka was the Defensive MVP in the Liberty Bowl win over West Virginia as a freshman in 2014.
- LB Buddy Johnson was his high school team's leading rusher and receiver and also passed for nearly 300 yards as a senior at Dallas Kimball HS.
- LB Riley Garner, a local product from College Station, Texas, is Texas A&M's nominee for the Wuerffel Trophy and the Campbell Trophy (Academic Heisman).
- SAF Derrick Tucker finished out 2017 with 36 tackles in the last three games of the season, which includes a 12-tackle effort in the second half of the Belk Bowl after sitting out the first two quarters for a targeting infraction in the regular season finale vs. LSU.
- The son of longtime NBA star Robert Horry, Camryn Horry shifted from TE to DL after spring drills in 2018.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Senior PK Daniel LaCamera and junior P Braden Mann earned preseason All-SEC mention.
- LaCamera missed the ULM game (9/15) due to a foot injury and was replaced by freshman PK Seth Small, who responded with 2 FGs and 6-of-6 on PATs.
- Mann put forth a stellar effort against Clemson, flipping the field twice with punts of 69 and 73 yards. His net average of 55.0 challenged Shane Lechler's single game net punt average record of 57.2.
- Mann is averaging 51.7 on punts, and the Aggies rank No. 2 in FBS with a 46.2 net punt average.
- Roshaud Paul, who led nearby Bremond HS to three straight state titles while compiling a 47-0 record as a QB, won the Aggies' kickoff and punt return job.
- Deep snapper Austin Frey is entering his third year as a starter. A lifelong Aggie fan, Frey played 6-man football for a home school team near Houston.

- Since the start of The Associated Press poll era in 1935, Jimbo Fisher was just the sixth coach to win a national title, then leave for another school. He was the first to do it since Johnny Majors left Pittsburgh for his alma mater, Tennessee, in 1977. (Source: Gridiron Now)
- Fisher was hired at Texas A&M on Dec. 4, 2017 after eight successful seasons at Florida State, which included the 2013 BCS National Championship.
- In his eight seasons in Tallahassee, Fisher established himself as one of the elite coaches in college football. He led the Seminoles to an 83-23 record, winning three Atlantic Coast Conference championships, four Atlantic Division titles and five bowl games.
- Fisher is one of four active coaches to have won a National Championship.
- Twelve of Fisher's FSU players earned consensus All-America honors, with quarterback Jameis Winston winning the Heisman Trophy in 2013.
- Fisher saw 83 of his student-athletes graduate, and NFL teams drafted 51 of his players, including 21 first- or second-round selections.
- The Seminoles set a modern-day NFL draft record with 29 players selected over a three-year period (2013-15), and Fisher had a first-round NFL draft choice every year he was head coach.
- The 2013 Rawlings College Football Coach of the Year, Fisher has twice been a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award (2013, 2014) and was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award in 2014.
- Fisher has been active in the community through his foundation, Kidz1stFund. The non-profit was founded in 2011 to raise awareness and funds to find a cure for Fanconi anemia, a rare blood disorder that affects thousands, including Fisher's youngest son, Ethan.
- Fisher played quarterback at Salem College for Terry Bowden for three seasons and followed Bowden to Samford for his final season. Fisher became NCAA Division III's national player of the year in 1987 and recently earned induction into Samford's Hall of Fame.

WILLIAMS WITH A BURST

Junior RB Trayveon Williams, who struggled with a nagging injury in 2017, is back to full speed in 2018 and back to terrorizing opposing defenses with his rare blend of speed, strength and elusiveness.

- Williams leads the SEC with an average of 133.0 rushing yards (No. 6 in FBS) and is tied for the SEC lead with four rushing TDs.
- Williams ran roughshod through an over-matched Northwestern State defense in the season-opener to the tune of 240 yards with three touchdowns on 20 carries. The 240 rushing yards rank No. 2 in school history behind Bob Smith's 297 vs. SMU in 1950.
- The 240-yard outburst is the No. 2 single-game effort in FBS this season.
- Always a breakaway threat, Williams has 11 runs of 40+ yards in his 28-game career, including four over 70 yards.
- Williams has bulked up to 205 pounds after playing at under 200 his previous two seasons.
- Entered 2018 as one of just three running backs in college football with multiple 200-yard rushing games vs. Power 5 opponents on his resume – others were Bryce Love of Stanford and Jonathan Taylor of Wisconsin.
- In 2016, Williams became Texas A&M's first true freshman to surpass the 1,000-yard barrier (1,057 yards on 156 carries).
- A vocal team leader, Williams is a two-time team captain and a member of the Aggies' 2018 Unity Council.
- Family's neighborhood in northeast Houston was flooded and evacuated (via boat, dump truck and eventually school bus) during Hurricane Harvey last fall.

MOND ON A MISSION

Sophomore QB Kellen Mond came out of fall camp as the Aggies' starter and he's quickly proving himself as one of the nation's top dual threat signal-callers.

- Mond had record-breaking game against No. 2 Clemson (9/8) with 430 passing yards (No. 8 in school history) and set a school record with 333 second-half passing yards. His 206 passing yards in fourth quarter were the second-most by an Aggie passer in the final stanza.
- Has been responsible for three touchdowns in all three games in 2018. Rushed for two TDs in a game for first time in his career vs. ULM on 9/15.
- Mond has been noticeably more accurate as a passer as a sophomore with a 62.9 completion percentage after connecting on just over 50 percent of his attempts last year as a freshman.
- As a runner, Mond is tied for the team lead with three first down rushes on third-down situations (on four rushes). Has been effective on designed runs.
- Forced into the starting role as a true freshman after then-QB1 Nick Starkel suffered a broken foot in the season opener, Mond started eight games and the Aggies compiled a 5-3 record in those games with SEC wins over South Carolina and Arkansas.
- In 2017, his 301-yard passing day vs. Louisiana was the first-ever 300-yard game by a true freshman Aggie QB.
- Also in 2017, Mond earned weekly honors from the Davey O'Brien Award and the Manning Award after passing for 216 yards and rushing for a game-high 109 yards in the Aggies' overtime win over the Hogs. Connected on an 81-yard TD pass and also contributed a 79-yard run.

KYLE FIELD

- Home of the Aggies since 1905. Stadium built in 1927 and the horseshoe enclosed in 1929.
- Capacity: 102,733
- Stadium record crowd is 110,633 (A&M vs. Ole Miss, 10/11/2014).
- Kyle Field is named for former A&M Dean of Agriculture Edwin Jackson Kyle, who donated a 400 x 400-foot area of the southern edge of campus that had been assigned to him for horticultural experiments. It became the home of the Aggies.
- Texas A&M finished a \$485 million redevelopment of Kyle Field in time for the 2015 season that made the Home of the 12th Man the largest football stadium in the SEC and the state of Texas.
- Texas A&M has led the SEC in home attendance three of the last four seasons and ranked No. 5 in FBS in 2017.

Texas A&M ranked No. 5 nationally in home attendance in 2017 with an average of 98,802 per game and drew more than 600,000 fans to Kyle Field for the fifth straight year.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) -- Trayveon Williams ran for 240 yards and three touchdowns in just more than two quarters as Texas A&M routed Northwestern State 59-7 in coach Jimbo Fisher's debut with the Aggies on Thursday night.

Williams scored Texas A&M's first touchdown on a 73-yard run, and a 2-yard scamper made it 21-0 in the second quarter. The junior pushed the lead to 42-0 when he burst through the line and simply outran everyone else for a 40-yard score early in the third quarter in his last play of the night.

It was the second-best rushing performance in school history behind the 297 yards Bob Smith ran for against SMU on Nov. 11, 1950, and Williams became the 20th player in Texas A&M history to reach 2,000 career yards rushing (2,095). Kwami Etwi added 83 yards rushing and a score to help the Aggies rush for more than 400 yards (503) for the first time since 2003.

Kellen Mond started at quarterback for the Aggies after vying with Nick Starkel for the job throughout camp and threw for 184 yards and touchdown passes of 7 and 8 yards and added a score on a 1-yard run. Starkel took over in the third quarter with the game out of hand and threw for 63 yards and a touchdown.

The Aggies handled business easily against Northwestern State, an FCS school which plays in the Southland Conference, to help Fisher to a victory in his first game since leaving Florida State for a 10-year, \$75 million contract.

Northwestern State split plays at quarterback between Shelton Eppler and Clay Holgorsen. Eppler started and threw for 105 yards and Holgorsen finished with 125 yards passing and touchdown.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) -- Kelly Bryant threw for 205 yards and a touchdown and ran for another score to help No. 2 Clemson escape with a 28-26 victory over Kellen Mond and Texas A&M on Saturday night.

Mond was spectacular in the second half, throwing for three touchdowns, with a 14-yard pass to Kendrick Rogers cutting the lead to 28-26 with 46 seconds left. But his big performance came up just short when the 2-point conversion attempt was intercepted in the end zone.

Mond finished with a career-high 430 yards passing and Rogers had 120 yards receiving and two TDs.

Freshman Trevor Lawrence started the second half, but failed to move the ball effectively and Bryant took over and led the Tigers on two touchdown drives in the last five minutes of the third quarter to extend the lead to 15 points.

Mond got the Aggies to 28-20 when he threw a 14-yard pass to Quartney Davis with about 14 minutes left.

The Aggies were driving with about two minutes left when Davis ran after making a catch and K'Von Wallace caused him to fumble the ball out of the back of the end zone for a touchback to give Clemson the ball. The call was reviewed but upheld and Texas A&M coach Jimbo Fisher got in the face of one of the referees and yelled for a bit as Davis doubled over in disbelief and covered his face as he was consoled by teammates.

Clemson's vaunted defensive line, led by first-team All-America end, Clelin Ferrell and tackle Christian Wilkins and second-team All-America tackle Dexter Lawrence, helped the Tigers pile up 10 tackles for losses and four sacks.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) -- Trayveon Williams ran for 240 yards and three touchdowns in just more than two quarters as Texas A&M routed Northwestern State 59-7 in coach Jimbo Fisher's debut with the Aggies on Thursday night.

Williams scored Texas A&M's first touchdown on a 73-yard run, and a 2-yard scamper made it 21-0 in the second quarter. The junior pushed the lead to 42-0 when he burst through the line and simply outran everyone else for a 40-yard score early in the third quarter in his last play of the night.

It was the second-best rushing performance in school history behind the 297 yards Bob Smith ran for against SMU on Nov. 11, 1950, and Williams became the 20th player in Texas A&M history to reach 2,000 career yards rushing (2,095). Kwami Etwi added 83 yards rushing and a score to help the Aggies rush for more than 400 yards (503) for the first time since 2003.

Kellen Mond started at quarterback for the Aggies after vying with Nick Starkel for the job throughout camp and threw for 184 yards and touchdown passes of 7 and 8 yards and added a score on a 1-yard run. Starkel took over in the third quarter with the game out of hand and threw for 63 yards and a touchdown.

The Aggies handled business easily against Northwestern State, an FCS school which plays in the Southland Conference, to help Fisher to a victory in his first game since leaving Florida State for a 10-year, \$75 million contract.

Northwestern State split plays at quarterback between Shelton Eppler and Clay Holgorsen. Eppler started and threw for 105 yards and Holgorsen finished with 125 yards passing and touchdown.
