### SEC GYMNASTICS WEEKLY HONORS

**SEC Gymnast of the Week** – Oklahoma’s Faith Torrez, a junior from Bristol, Wis., helped lead the Sooners to their first 198 of the season and a victory over a top-five opponent in the win over No. 5 Florida before leading OU to another 198 in the victory over No. 24 North Carolina at the Metroplex Challenge. Against the Gators, Torrez tied her career high with a 39.775 to win the all-around and recorded all scores of 9.9 or higher in the meet, including earning the first perfect 10 of the season for the Sooners on floor. Along with her all-around and floor titles, Torrez also claimed vault (9.95) and beam (9.925) and placed second on bars (9.90). Against the Tar Heels, she earned her fifth event title of the weekend with a 9.975 on beam and second on floor with a 9.925, her seventh straight mark of 9.9 or higher on the event this season.

**SEC Co-Specialists of the Week** – Georgia’s Anya Turner, a sophomore from Highlands Ranch, Colo., tied for first place on beam with a career-high 9.975 at No. 8 Missouri. Turner’s performance helped Georgia register a season-high team score of 49.550 in the event and a season-high overall score of 197.350, the GymDogs’ third-consecutive week breaking 197.000 this season.

Missouri’s Helen Hu, a senior from Chicago, Ill., tied for first place on beam with a 9.975 in the win over No. 12 Georgia. It was the fourth time Hu has scored a 9.975 or better in the event this season, which has helped the Tigers to own an NQS of 49.295, tying them for eighth place nationally.

**SEC Freshman of the Week** – LSU’s Kailin Chio, a freshman from Henderson, Nev., helped lead the Tigers to victory at No. 9 Kentucky after she won her fourth consecutive all-around title with her score of 39.575. Chio also earned a share of the event titles on vault (9.925) and bars (9.875) and tied for second place on beam (9.925). Her three event titles against the Wildcats moved her career total to 13 during her rookie campaign.

The No. 17 Alabama gymnastics program fell to No. 11 Auburn, 197.750-197.350, on February 21.

The Crimson Tide posted a season-high team score at its annual Power of Pink meet. Despite a slow start on vault, Alabama rattled off season-high rotation scores on bars (49.450), beam (49.375) and floor (49.600). Additionally, the team posted meet-high scores on bars and floor, while the Tigers on beam (49.375).

Alabama finished 1-2 in the all around, with Lilly Hudson taking the top spot with a 39.625 and Gabby Gladieux finishing second with a 39.550. Both athletes earned a share of first place on floor, tying Auburn's Sophia Groth with 9.95s. Gladieux also shared the beam title with Auburn's Paige Zancan with a pair of 9.925s.

Alabama will travel to Fayetteville, Ark., for the next conference meet on Friday, February 28 vs. Arkansas. It will begin at 6:30 p.m. CT, live on SEC Network.

The Gymbacks made their fifth appearance at the Metroplex Challenge on February 21 and won the meet for the first time ever as Arkansas defeated Arizona, Oregon State and SEMO with a team score of 196.400.

No. 19 Arizona came in second with a 196.125, and Oregon State came in third with a 196.025, cementing Arkansas' third victory over a top 10 opponent this season. SEMO rounded out the team standings in fourth with a score of 192.350.

Freshman Joscelyn Roberson earned a 39.300 all-around score, which put her in second behind elite teammate Jade Carey. Roberson notched another two top three finishes as well: she tied for second on beam with a mark of 9.875 and tied for second on floor with a 9.900 score.

Senior Kalyxta Gamiao also had a solid night with top three finishes on both of her events. She matched Roberson's 9.875 on beam to tie for second and earned a 9.875 on floor, placing her in third.

Arkansas returns home for a showdown with No. 17 Alabama on Friday, February 28 at Bud Walton Arena. It is the team's second annual Compete for a Cause meet and Alumni Night. The show starts at 6:15 p.m. and will also be broadcast live on SEC Network.

No. 11 Auburn gymnastics started out fast and never let up, scoring a season-high 197.750 on February 21 to outdistance No. 17 Alabama (197.350) and earn the program's first victory at Coleman Coliseum.

The overall team score of 197.750 tied the program best road score and was the team's highest score of the 2025 season. In addition, it stands tied for fifth overall in program history.

On top of that, the team tied a program record on vault with a 49.500. The Tigers set a season high on bars with a 49.425 to lead off the meet.

The Tigers won at least a share of four of five possible individual titles. Freshman Katelyn Jong won vault, while Jong and sophomore Alex Irvine shared the win on bars. Sophomore Paige Zancan took the first beam title of her career, and senior Sophia Groth won her fourth floor crown of the season.

The Tigers return to Neville Arena to take on No. 1 Oklahoma on February 28. Auburn and the Sooners will go head-to-head at 7 p.m. CT and the meet will be streamed on SEC Network+.

It was a rough night for No. 5 Florida gymnastics with All-Americans Anya Pilgrim and Sloane Blakely suffering injuries in the 198.075 – 196.625 loss to No. 1 Oklahoma in front of 9,880 on February 21 at the Lloyd Noble Center.

Florida turned in five solid routines following Pilgrim’s fall in the lead-off spot. Pilgrim was able to finish the routine but did not appear in the other lineup she was slated to compete (balance beam). Two Gators were among a four-way tie for second at 9.90 in the final bars standings - Skye Blakely and Leanne Wong.

Two Gators posted vault mark of 9.9 or better: Selena Harris-Miranda (9.925) and Wong (9.90). Harris-Miranda shared second with OU’s Keira Wells in the vault standings. Sophomores Danie Ferris and Gabby Disidore also turned in vault marks of 9.875, which was a collegiate best for Disidore.

Sloane Blakely was unable to complete her floor routine after her opening tumbling pass. Florida was led on floor by Wong’s 9.925 and Harris-Miranda’s 9.90.

Florida could not keep pace with OU’s floor scores on the final rotation. Every Sooner posted a mark of 9.925 or better, including a 10.0 by Faith Torrez, and the Gators were forced to count a miss on balance beam. Victoria Nguyen and Wong led Florida on the event at 9.875 to be among a five-way tie for second.

Torrez won the all-around at 39.775, followed by teammate Jordan Bowers (39.65). Wong was third at 39.60 with Harris-Miranda taking fourth at 39.50.

Florida closes February action when No. 8 Missouri comes to Gainesville on February 28 for Equality Night presented by GFL Environmental. The meet marks the seventh consecutive competition in which the Gators face a top-15 opponent.

The No. 12 Georgia GymDogs secured a season-high 197.350 on the road, but ultimately fell to No. 8 Missouri, 197.425 – 197.350, on February 21 at the Hearn Center.

The highlight of the night for the Bulldogs came on the beam rotation, where they put up a season-high of 49.550, championed by sophomore Anya Turner’s career-high 9.975. Turner’s routine tied for first and for the highest individual score of the meet on any event. The sophomore’s score is the highest earned by any GymDog’s routine this season.

Georgia also captured an event season-high on the bars with a 49.475. Sophomore Lily Smith took the crown in the event by matching her season-high 9.950. Junior Ja’ Free Scott and sophomore Holly Snyder both matched their season highs as well, performing a 9.925 and a 9.875, respectively.

Snyder additionally secured a season high on the floor with a 9.900, helping the GymDogs to a 49.225 in the event. Freshman Nyla Aquino also shined on the floor, capturing a 9.925, her second-highest career score in the event.

Georgia Gymnastics will return to Stegeman on Sunday, March 2 to take on Kentucky at 6 p.m., ET, live on SEC Network.

The No. 2 LSU Gymnastics team defeated No. 9 Kentucky on February 21 in the Historic Memorial Coliseum by a final score of 197.200-197.075. The win marked LSU's first in Lexington since 2017.

Kailin Chio claimed her fourth straight all-around title on the night with her 39.575 performance, also taking home the titles on vault (9.925) and bars (9.875). The freshman has now taken home at least one event title in all but one meet this year, moving her career total to 13.

Freshman Lexi Zeiss took home the first title of her career on bars, along with Ashley Cowan, who split the four-way bars title with Chio and Kentucky's Delaynee Rodriguez.

Fifth-year senior Haleigh Bryant earned a 39.500 in her first all-around appearance this year, finishing as the second top performer on the night.

LSU will pause conference competition to host George Washington on Friday, February 28 at 6:30 p.m. CT.

University of Missouri gymnastics posted its best team score of the season en route to defeating Georgia, 197.425-197.350, on February 21 at Hearn Center before 3,700 spectators.

Missouri's 197.425 marks the fifth consecutive meet to reach an overall score of 197.000 or higher. The team accumulated 10 scores of at least 9.900, including three by Amari Celestine.

No. 8 Mizzou posted 10 scores of at least a 9.900 to earn its best start to a season since 2009. The Tigers and 12th-ranked Bulldogs were tied heading into the final routine of the fourth rotation, where Kennedy Griffin scored a 9.925 to seal the win. Griffin and Elise Tisler tied for second place with Georgia's Nyila Aquino, while Celestine won the floor title with a 9.95.

Sophomore Hannah Horton tied her season-best score of 9.925 on vault to win the event title for the second time this season. Redshirt senior Helen Hu claimed a share of the beam title with a 9.975.

The Tigers notch their 11th win of the year, which marks the third time under head coach Shannon Welker the team has reached the number in the regular season.

Missouri heads to Gainesville to compete against fifth-ranked Florida on Friday, February 28 at 5 p.m. CT at Exectech Arena on SEC Network's Friday Night Heights.

In the first meet of the weekend, No. 1 Oklahoma earned its first 198 of the season with a 198.075-196.625 victory over No. 5 Florida on February 21 in 9,880 fans, the second largest crowd in program history.

The exclamation point of the meet was Faith Torrez earning the first perfect 10 of the season for the Sooners, anchoring floor with the second perfect score of her career. Torrez's 10 solidified her all-around victory, her fourth of the season, with a career-high 39.775. Torrez also claimed event titles on vault with a 9.95, on beam with a 9.925 and on floor. Jordan Bowers claimed the bars title with a 9.925 as the Sooners swept the event titles on the night.

The Sooners then claimed their seventh consecutive Metroplex Challenge title with a 198.050-196.200 victory over No. 24 North Carolina on February 23.

Bowers secured the all-around title with a 39.650 and floor with a near-perfect 9.975. Keira Wells claimed the vault title with a 9.925, while North Carolina's Lali Dekanoidze won bars with a 9.95. Torrez took home the beam title with a near-perfect 9.975 of her own.

OU returns to SEC competition Friday, February 28 against Auburn. The teams will face off in Auburn, Ala., at 6:45 p.m. on SEC Network+.
