The Game

Rowan University hosts New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) opponent The College of New Jersey on Friday night in the regular season finale. The Profs will clinch the NJAC Championship with a victory tonight. Rowan and TCNJ are both coming off victories on Saturday. The Profs defeated Kean, 7-6, while the Lions won over William Paterson, 27-3.

The Series

This is the 55th meeting between Rowan University and The College of New Jersey. The Profs hold a 35-17-2 series advantage.

The Last Meeting: Rowan 26, TCNJ 0 (11/9/12)

Louie Bianchini accounted for three touchdowns to lead Rowan University to a 26-0 victory over The College of New Jersey.

Bianchini completed 13 of 26 passes for 178 yards and two touchdowns. He added 93 yards and one touchdown on 12 rushes. Keith Corcoran ran for 87 yards on 23 attempts. Warren Oliver made four receptions for 109 yards and one touchdown. Darren Dungee led the way with 16 tackles and one interception. Dominic Caruso registered 10 stops and Patrick Ruley had six.

For TCNJ, Daniel Dugan had 21 completions in 36 attempts for 141 yards. Glenn Grainger hauled in five balls for 55 yards. Nick Bricker posted a game-high 18 tackles and one tackle for a loss. Greg Burns followed with 15 stops. Thomas Hoppe and Jeff Aduabato both blocked one kick.

Rowan took a 6-0 lead at 11:45 in the second quarter on a seven yard touchdown catch by Dan Reed. The extra point attempt was blocked by Hoppe. With 2:32 left, Bianchini threw an 86 yard touchdown to Oliver. Aduabato blocked the PAT.

At 6:32 in the third, Withler Marcelin scored on a six-yard run to make the advantage, 19-0. With 5:52 remaining, Bianchini found the end zone on a 47 yard touchdown scamper.

NJAC Championships

Rowan has won the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) Championship 17 times, 14 outright and three shared. The Profs captured the conference title in 2006, 2005, 2004, 2002, 2001, 1997, 1995, 1993, 1992, 1991, 1977, 1976, 1975 and 1974. Rowan shared the NJAC Championship in 2010, 1983 and 1972.

NCAA Tournament

Since 1991, Rowan has made 14 appearances in the NCAA Championship Tournament. The Profs have a 30-14 mark in the national tournament. Rowan has played in the championship game, the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl, five times (1999-98-96-95-93). In 2005, 2004, 2001, 1997 and 1992, Rowan reached the semifinals of the tournament. In 2012, Rowan fell in the first round at Salisbury.

NJAC Continues to Changes

This season the conference has eight teams. This is the final season for Brockport in the NJAC. Next season Southern Virginia will be added to the conference for football to keep the number at eight teams.

Rowan University was selected to finish first with five first place votes in the NJAC Preseason Coaches Poll. The Profs return 14 starters on both offense and defense and two on special teams.

Win and the Profs are In

A win by Rowan tonight over TCNJ gives the Profs the NJAC Championship and the conference's automatic berth into the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament. The field will be announced on Sunday at 6 p.m. on www.ncaa.com. There is one scenario that has Rowan winning the NJAC with a loss and that includes Morrisville State defeating Brockport on Saturday.

Continuing to Win in November

Since Jay Accorsi took over as head coach, the Profs are 23-11 in games played during November. In the last six seasons, Rowan is 7-5. During the four seasons that the Profs won NJAC titles (2002, 2004, 2005 and 2006), they are 10-2 in November.

Trends Under Accorsi

The football team has a 65-21 record in NJAC games with Accorsi as head coach. At home, the Profs are 49-10 overall and 35-8 in the NJAC. On the road, Rowan is 45-24 overall and 30-13 in conference games.

Home Sweet Home

Since 2004, the Profs are 41-7 at home. In six of those seasons, Rowan went unbeaten at home and it has only lost more than one home game twice. This season, Rowan is 4-0 at home.

Accorsi Against TCNJ

Accorsi is 8-3 overall against the Lions. The Profs' three losses were all in Glassboro.



**Rowan University Head Coach
Jay Accorsi**

Jay Accorsi is heading into his 12th season as the head coach of the Rowan University football team. Accorsi is the seventh coach for the sport at the University. He took over the head position after nine years as an assistant coach with the Profs. Accorsi has guided Rowan to five appearances in the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament, two trips to the national semifinals and five conference championships.

His coaching record stands at 94-34. Accorsi is now the all-time wins leader, passing K.C. Keeler for coaching victories at Rowan. In 2012, he guided the Profs

to a 7-3 overall record, 6-1 in the NJAC for a second place finish. Rowan was awarded an at-large bid into the NCAA Championships. The Profs fell to Salisbury in the first round. In 2011, Rowan posted a 5-5 record with a 5-4 conference mark.

In 2010, the Profs were 9-1 overall and 8-1 in the conference. Rowan earned a share of the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) title with Montclair State University and SUNY Cortland. Rowan posted a 7-3 record in 2009 and an 8-2 mark in 2008. In 2007, the Profs went 4-6. In 2006, Rowan finished the season with a 9-3 record. The Profs won their third consecutive NJAC Championship and fifth in six years and they advanced to the quarterfinals of the national tournament.

In 2005, Rowan had an 11-2 mark. The Profs won the NJAC Championship and reached the semifinals of the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament for the second consecutive season. Accorsi was selected the NJAC Coach of the Year and received the Maxwell Football Club Tri-State Coach of the Year Award.

The Profs finished the 2004 season with a 10-3 record and they advanced to the semifinal game of the national tournament. The Profs had a record of 7-3 in 2003. In his first year, Accorsi guided the Profs to the conference title and their 10th appearance in the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament. The football team had a final record of 10-1 and Accorsi was selected the NJAC Coach of the Year.

Prior to Rowan, Accorsi was an assistant football and baseball coach at Nichols College in Dudley, MA from 1989-93. He coached the wide receivers and quarterbacks. In baseball, Accorsi coached the outfielders and infielders. At Nichols, Accorsi also assisted the athletic director and was a dorm director while working on his master's degree.

Accorsi graduated from Nichols College (MA) in 1985 with a bachelor's degree in business administration. He earned a master's in sports science from the U.S. Sports Academy (Daphne, AL) in 1992 and a master's in business administration from Rowan in 1997. At Nichols, Accorsi was a running back for four years and was captain of the football team his senior year.

He is a member of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), Maxwell Football Club and the New Jersey Football Coaches Association (NJFCA). He is on the South Jersey Chapter of the National Football Foundation committee. Accorsi served as a NCAA representative during the 2007 NCAA Division III Championship Tournament. He is on the NCAA Division III East Region and Adam Taliaferro Foundation Advisory Committees. Accorsi is currently on the AFCA Program Committee and has served on the Rules, Exhibits and Division III All-America Team Selection Committees in the past. He is also a voting member of the AFCA Division III Coaches Poll and the NCAA Division III East Region Ranking Committee.

Accorsi resides in Mullica Hill, NJ with his wife Nancy and daughters, Gabrielle and Rachel and son, Jack.

The College of New Jersey Interim Head Coach Wayne Dickens

This is Wayne Dickens' first season as the interim head coach at The College of New Jersey. Prior, he was the head football coach at Kentucky State University from 2009 through 2012. Dickens has nearly 40 years of experience, 20 at the collegiate level.

In 2008, he was the wide receivers assistant coach at Kentucky State. The following season he became the interim head coach. During his tenure, Dickens served as the offensive and special team's coordinator for three years before switching to defensive coordinator in 2012.

Dickens started his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Washington from 1992 to 1993. He assisted with the defensive line, linebackers and special teams. The Huskies won the Pacific 10 Conference Championship and played in the 1993 Rose Bowl. In 1994, he served as the linebackers coach and special teams coordinator at the University of San Diego. He coached the wide receivers at San Diego State University from 1995-2001. Dickens was the offensive coordinator at Morehouse College in Atlanta, GA then he moved on and had the same title at Norfolk State University in Norfolk, VA.

In 2002, Dickens was the receivers coach for the British Columbia Lions Football Club. In addition, he was a regional scout for the Hamilton Tigers Football Club of the Canadian Football League.

A native from Orange (NJ), he graduated from Rutgers College in 1973 with an English degree. He has taken graduate classes in educational psychology and industrial education. Dickens has participated in the National Football League Minority Summer Internship Program with the Chicago Bears (1996 and 1997) and the Miami Dolphins (2003).

Rowan University (7-2, NJAC 5-1)

Last Time Out: Rowan 7, Kean 6 (11/9/13)

Bill McCarty's 33-yard touchdown pass to Ed Eisenhart as the second quarter expired was enough to give Rowan University a 7-6 conference victory over Kean University. The touchdown came after the Profs drove the ball 54 yards in six plays during the final 1:16 of the second quarter.

Kean's Bill Cullen kicked a 35-yard field goal to make the score 7-3 at the beginning (14:55) of the fourth quarter. At the 10:01 mark, Cullen hit a 38-yard field goal, trimming the Rowan lead to 7-6.

McCarty was 9 of 15 for 106 yards. Withler Marcelin ran the ball 24 times for 112 yards. Marcelin now has 1,054 rushing yards on the season, making it just the fourth time in Rowan history that a player has rushed for more than 1,000 yards. Eisenhart caught four passes for 54 yards. Darren Dungee recorded 18 tackles. Josh Popper tallied 10 tackles and two tackles for a loss. Chris Alvarez collected seven tackles, 1.5 for a loss and forced a fumble.

For Kean, Robert Meade completed 14 passes in 24 attempts for 134 yards. He also ran the ball 14 times for 37 yards. Sean McKee carried the ball 21 times for 107 yards. Patrick Stewart made five catches for 55 yards, while tight end Jonathan Scmitt had five receptions for 41 yards. Tyler Jones and David Ricca each made seven tackles. Ricca also had 2.5 tackles for a loss.

Dungee Named NJAC Defensive Player of the Week

Dungee earns NJAC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the second time this season. He registered a game-high 18 tackles, including 11 solo stops. He also garnered a tackle for a loss in a contest in which the Prof defense held the Cougar offense to just two fourth quarter field goals. Dungee currently ranks fourth in the NJAC in tackles (9.8 per game).

Defense Shines Once Again

During Rowan's four game winning streak, the defense has held its opponents to just 10.25 ppg and only four touchdowns. The Profs allowed just two field goals in the victory over Kean. The defense has given up just 92.5 rushing yards per game, 173.25 passing yards per game and 265.75 total yards per game. Teams have entered the redzone just eight times, scoring on five of the opportunities.

Marcelin Enters the Record Books

Running back Withler Marcelin is just the third player to run for 1,000 yards in a season. Robbie Reid ran for 1,271 yards in 1973 and 1,144 yards in 1974. Pat Thompson eclipsed the 1,000 yards mark in 2004 with 1,234 yards. Marcelin now has 1,054 yards on 212 rushing attempts. Reid holds the record for rushes in a season with 242 in 1974 and yards in a season with 1,271 in 1973.

Diedrichsen on Pace to Break Punting Record

Mark Diedrichsen has punted the ball 56 times for 2,280 yards and a per punt average of 40.7. The Rowan record for punt average in a season is 39.6.

The College of New Jersey (5-4, NJAC 4-2)

Last Time Out: TCNJ 27, William Paterson 3 (11/9/2013)

The College of New Jersey controlled the ball for 42:43 as it defeated William Paterson University, 27-3 on Saturday afternoon.

TCNJ quarterback Sam Paladino tossed a pair of touchdown passes, while freshman Craig Cicardo also contributed with his first two TD passes of the season. Andrew Lachawiec caught two touchdown passes, while Victor Scalici and Conor Mulholland each had one touchdown catch in the victory. Scalici finished with 93 yards rushing, while Brad Young gained 82 yards on the ground. Nick Bricker led the defense with six tackles. Patrick Kimball had five tackles and two sacks.

Ryan Gresik threw for 131 yards on 11 completions (23 attempts) for William Paterson. Dwaine Dabney carried the ball five times for 15 yards and Nickolas Burke made four receptions for 39 yards. Pat Thomas and Ben Allen led the defense with 19 and 17 tackles respectively.

Paladino found Andrew Lachawiec for a five-yard touchdown strike to give TCNJ a 7-0 lead at the 10:49 mark of the first quarter. Robert Sinegra hit a 24-yard field goal with 8:13 to play in the first to close the gap to 7-3. At 6:56 of the second quarter, Cicardo connected with Lachawiec on a 13-yard touchdown and a 14-3 lead.

Scalici caught an eight-yard touchdown pass from Paladino with 6:32 on the clock in the third to make the score 21-3. Cicardo found Mulholland in the end zone from six yards out to cap the scoring with two minutes remaining after a 10-minute drive.

Defense Leading TCNJ

The Lions' defense is leading the NJAC in six categories, including scoring defense (13.4 ppg), total defense (273.1 ypg), rushing defense (99.9 ypg), opponent first downs (16.0 pg), opponent fourth down conversions (23.1%) and redzone defense (60.7%). The Lions are ranked 15th in the nation in total defense, 16th in scoring defense and 21st in redzone defense. In three of TCNJ's wins, it did not allow a touchdown. In the Lions' five victories they are giving up 8.2 ppg, but in their four losses they are allowing 20 ppg.

Bricker Leader on the Defense

Linebacker Nick Bricker is first in the NJAC in total tackles (103) and tackles per game (11.4). Bricker currently has 329 career tackles and ranks second all-time in program history. The record is held by former teammate Greg Burns who finished with 353. Bricker also reached 100 tackles in a season for the second time in his career.

Block That Kick

The Lions rank 27th nationally in blocked kicks. They have batted five down this season - three by Matthew Chierici coming around the end and two by Jeffrey Adubato.
