#### The Game

Rowan University travels to Johns Hopkins University on Saturday for the first round of the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament. Last Friday, the Profs claimed a share of the New Jersey Athletic Conference Championship, defeating The College of New Jersey, 14-6. The Blue Jays completed their undefeated regular season with a 48-17 victory over McDaniel College on Saturday.

#### The Bracket

The winner of Saturday's first round game will take on the winner of Hobart College and Ithaca College. That first round game will be played at noon in Geneva, NY. The second round game is scheduled for Saturday, November 29 on a campus site.

#### **The Series**

This is the first-ever meeting between Rowan and Johns Hopkins.

#### **NJAC Championships**

Rowan has won the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) Championship 19 times, 14 outright and five shared. The Profs captured the conference title in 2006, 2005, 2004, 2002, 2001, 1997, 1995, 1993, 1992, 1991, 1977, 1976, 1975 and 1974. Rowan shared the NJAC Championship in 2014, 2013, 2010, 1983 and 1972.

#### **NCAA Tournament**

Since 1991, Rowan has made 16 appearances in the NCAA Championship Tournament. The Profs have a 31-15 mark in the national playoffs. Rowan has played in the championship game, the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl, five times (1999-98-96-95-93). In 2005, 2004, 2001, 1997 and 1992, Rowan reached the semifinals of the tournament. In 2013, Rowan defeated Endicott College in the first round and lost to the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor in the second.

#### **NCAA Tournament Road Games**

The Profs are 14-8 on the road in NCAA Tournament games. Rowan has lost its last three away games. They fell at the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor in 2013, at Salisbury University in 2012 and at St. John Fisher in 2006.

#### **NCAA First Round Games**

Rowan is 12-3 in NCAA First Round games. They did not get past the first round in 1991, 2002 and 2012.

#### **NCAA First Round Road Games**

Rowan is 4-2 in NCAA First Round road games. Its two losses came in 2012 at Salisbury and 1991 at Ithaca College.

#### **NCAA Tournament Games vs. Centennial Conference**

Rowan has played a school from the Centennial Conference just one other time in the NCAA Tournament. The Profs defeated Ursinus College, 55-0 in the 1999 second round.

#### **Continuing To Win In November**

Since Jay Accorsi took over as head coach, the Profs are 28-11 in games played during November. In the last six seasons, Rowan is 13-6. During the seven seasons that the Profs won NJAC titles (2002, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2010, 2013 and 2014), they were 22-3 in November.

#### **Consecutive Non-Losing Seasons**

The Profs have guaranteed their seventh season in a row with a record of .500 or better. Their last campaign below .500 was in 2007 (4-6).

#### Winning Seasons for Accorsi

Accorsi has had 12 seasons with a record of .500 or better. In 11 campaigns, the Profs finished above .500. He has 11 years of at least seven wins and seven seasons with at least eight wins.

#### **NJAC Championships and NCAA Tournaments**

Accorsi has now won seven NJAC Championships and is making his seventh NCAA Tournament appearance. The Profs won the NJAC and made the NCAA Tournament in 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2013 and 2014.

#### **Accorsi in NCAA Tournament Games**

Accorsi has an 8-6 overall record in 14 NCAA Tournament games. The Profs are 5-1 at home and 3-5 on the road. Accorsi has led Rowan to two semifinal and one quarterfinal appearance.

#### **Accorsi Reaches The Century Mark**

Jay Accorsi became the first coach in University history to reach the 100 wins mark after a 31-0 victory over Morrisville State College on October 18. He passed KC Keeler to take the all-time wins lead last season. Accorsi is 103-38 overall.

#### **Knighton Continues To Impress**

Kicker Tyler Knighton's remarkable freshman season continues. Knighton has made 24 extra points in 26 attempts and is 11 out of 15 on field goal tries. His long was 42 yards against William Paterson. He is second on the team in scoring (57 points) and is ranked second in the NJAC in kick scoring (57 points). Knighton is first in field goal percentage (73.3). He has already set the record for field goals in a game (four vs. William Paterson) and tied the record for kicking points in a game (15 against William Paterson).

#### **Defense Tops In the NJAC**

Rowan's defense remains on top of the NJAC in four categories. Rowan leads the conference in scoring defense (13.7 ppg), total defense (267.0 ypg), rushing defense (77.5 ypg) and pass efficiency defense (93.6). They are second in interceptions (19) and red zone defense (70.0).

#### **Block That Kick**

The Profs have blocked nine kicks this season. That's the most blocks in a season since they recorded seven in 2008. Rowan is tied for third in the nation.

#### **Protecting The Quarterback**

The Rowan offensive line has kept quarterback Bill McCarty's jersey clean for most of the season. He has been sacked just 11 times. The Profs lead the NJAC and are tied for 31st in the nation.

#### Take That Ball Away

The Profs have forced 23 turnovers this season, 19 by way of the interception. Rowan intercepted five passes at Framingham State University (Sept. 13) which was the most in a game since setting the school record of seven against Western Connecticut State University on October 1, 2011. Eddie Davis leads the Profs with five.

#### **Marcelin Record Watch**

Withler Marcelin has already broken three records (200-yard games in a season, 200-yard games in a career and 100-yard games in a career) this season. He now has his sights set on five more.

#### Rowan University Head Coach Jay Accorsi

Jay Accorsi is in his 13th season as the head coach of the Rowan University football team. Accorsi is the seventh coach for the sport at the University. He took over the head position after nine years as an assistant coach with the Profs. Accorsi has guided Rowan to seven appearances in the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament, two trips to the national semifinals and seven conference championships.

His coaching record stands at 103-38 and he is the all-time wins leader at Rowan. He passed K.C. Keeler on September 27, 2013 after a 7-0 victory over Mont-

clair State University. Accorsi reached the 100-win plateau with a 31-0 win over Morrisville State College on October 18, 2014. Last season, he led the Profs to a 9-3 overall record, a 6-1 mark in the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) and a share of the conference championship. Accorsi was named the NJAC Coach of the Year for the fourth time. Rowan earned the NJAC's automatic berth to the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament and advanced to the second round.

In 2012, he guided the Profs to a 7-3 overall record and 6-1 in the NJAC for a second place finish. Rowan was awarded an at-large bid into the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament. In 2011, Rowan posted a 5-5 record with a 5-4 conference mark.

In 2010, the Profs were 9-1 overall and 8-1 in the conference. Rowan earned a share of the NJAC title with Montclair State University and SUNY Cortland. Rowan posted a 7-3 record in 2009 and an 8-2 mark in 2008. In 2007, the Profs went 4-6. In 2006, Rowan finished the season with a 9-3 record. The Profs won their third consecutive NJAC Championship and fifth in six years and they advanced to the quarterfinals of the national tournament.

In 2005, Rowan had an 11-2 mark. The Profs captured the NJAC Championship and reached the semifinals of the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament for the second consecutive season. Accorsi was selected the NJAC Coach of the Year and received the Maxwell Football Club Tri-State Coach of the Year Award.

The Profs finished the 2004 season with a 10-3 record and they advanced to the semifinal game of the national tournament. The Profs had a record of 7-3 in 2003. In his first year (2002), Accorsi guided the Profs to the conference title and their 10th appearance in the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament. The football team had a final record of 10-1 and Accorsi was selected the NJAC Coach of the Year.

Accorsi graduated from Nichols College (MA) in 1985 with a bachelor's degree in business administration. He earned a master's in sports science from the U.S. Sports Academy (Daphne, AL) in 1992 and a master's in business administration from Rowan in 1997.

He is a member of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), Maxwell Football Club and the New Jersey Football Coaches Association. He is on the South Jersey Chapter of the National Football Foundation committee. Accorsi served as a NCAA representative during the 2007 NCAA Division III Championship Tournament. He is on the Adam Taliaferro Foundation Advisory Committee and the AFCA Program Committee. Accorsi has served on the Rules, Exhibits and Division III All-America Team Selection Committees. and has been a voting member of the AFCA Division III Coaches Poll and the NCAA Division III East Region Ranking Committee.

Accorsi resides in Mullica Hill, NJ with his wife Nancy and daughters, Gabrielle and Rachel and son, Jack.

# Johns Hopkins University Head Coach Jim Margraff

Jim Margraff is in his 25th season as the head coach at Johns Hopkins University. He has a career record 177-82-3. Margraff has led the Blue Jays to 10 Centennial Conference Championships, five NCAA Division III Championship Tournament appearances and five Eastern Conference Athletic Conference Bowl games.

Margraff and the Blue Jays entered the 2014 campaign after another championship season that included a fifth straight Centennial Conference title, a third consecutive trip to the NCAA Playoffs and a 10-1 record. The Blue Jays also spent the entire season ranked in the top 25 for the third

consecutive year. Two All-Americans, three Capital One/CoSIDA First Team Academic All-Americans, two NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship recipients and a National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete highlighted the honors and awards that ranks among the best in school history.

The success of 2013 came off of the 2011 and 2012 seasons that ended with Centennial Conference titles, one trip to the second round of the NCAAs (2012), the first home NCAA playoff game in school history (2011) and the first 10-0 regular season record in school history.

JHU enjoyed the greatest regular season in school history in 2011 as the Blue Jays posted a 10-1 record, grabbed a third consecutive Centennial Conference title and advanced to the NCAA Playoffs for the second time in three years.

In his first year as head coach (1990), Margraff led the Blue Jays to their first winning season since 1985 the highest Conference finish ever (third). Margraff has since guided the Blue Jays to 19 winning campaigns during his tenure and 21 years with a record of at least .500. Prior to his arrival for the 1990 season, Johns Hopkins posted a winning record just seven times in the previous 18 seasons.

Margraff began his career coaching the quarterbacks at Hopkins. He then returned to his high school on Long Island and coached the Miller Place offensive and defensive backfields. In 1985 he moved back to the college ranks, coaching the offensive line at the University at Albany.

In 1987, Margraff became an assistant at the University of Pennsylvania and coached the tight ends. While at Penn, he coached All-Ivy League tight end Brent Novoselsky, who went on to play in the NFL. The following year he joined the staff at the University of Rochester, working with the offensive line.

At Rochester, he worked with head coach Ray Tellier, who brought Margraff with him to Columbia University in 1989. During his time at Columbia, he coached the offensive line and served as one of the staff's top recruiters.

Margraff was a four-year starting quarterback for the Blue Jays and he rewrote the Hopkins passing record book. Margraff ranked as the Blue Jays' all-time statistical leader in pass attempts, pass completions, passing yardage and touchdown passes when he concluded his career. As a co-captain during his final year, he helped lead Hopkins to a 7-2 finish, matching the school's all-time record for wins in a season at the time. In 1997, he was inducted into the Johns Hopkins Athletic Hall of Fame.

#### Rowan University (7-3, NJAC 6-1) Last Game: Rowan 14, The College of New Jersey 6 (11/14/14)

Rowan ended the regular season with a 14-6 victory over The College of New Jersey on November 14. The win gave the Profs a share of the New Jersey Athletic Conference Championship.

Running back Withler Marcelin carried the ball 41 times for 217 yards and two touchdowns. Quarterback Bill McCarty threw for 30 yards (5-10). Wide receiver Russ Forchion made three catches for nine yards. Linebacker Vinny Simone recorded seven tackles, two for a loss (4 yards). Defensive back Eddie Davis tallied four stops and one interception. Defensive back Jared Sanchez collected three tackles, one for a loss (2 yards) and an interception.

Marcelin gave Rowan the lead on a 16-yard touchdown run at the 7:54 mark of the first quarter. He then carried the ball on all seven plays of a 36-yard drive, scoring from four yards out for a 14-0 advantage with 7:32 on the clock in the third. On the third play of the fourth quarter, TCNJ quarterback Trevor Osler crossed the goal line on a one-yard run.

#### Winning The Tiebreaker

The Profs gained the conference's automatic bid by winning the tiebreaker over Morrisville State College and Montclair State University. The tiebreaker was first half scoring differential among the three teams (Rowan +24; Morrisville State -4; Montclair State -20).

#### **200-Yard Rushing Games**

Withler Marcelin produced over 200 yards rushing for the third time this season and the fourth time in his career at TCNJ. The Profs are 4-0 when he rushes for more then 200 yards.

#### Marcelin Named NJAC Offensive Player of the Week

Marcelin earned NJAC Offensive Player of the Week honors for the third time this season. He carried a season-high 41 times for 217 yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns in the 14-6 victory over TCNJ. The 41 carries marked the most by a NJAC player in a game this season. His performance also represented the third 200-yard rushing game this season. Marcelin currently leads the NJAC in rushing (145.7 yards per game).

#### **Shutout Streak Ended**

The Profs' defense had not allowed a point in over nine quarters (136:15). Prior to TCNJ's touchdown in the fourth quarter, Rowan had not allowed a score since the final play of the first half against Southern Virginia University.

#### Interceptions In A Season

Eddie Davis intercepted his fifth pass of the season against TCNJ. It's the most interceptions in a season since Ahmad Stokes picked off five passes in 2007. Dawaine Whetstone recorded seven interceptions in 2006 and 2005.

## Johns Hopkins University (10-0, Centennial 9-0) Last Game: Johns Hopkins 48, McDaniel College 17 multiple (11/15/14)

4-3 Johns Hopkins completed its undefeated regular season with a 48-17 victory over McDaniel College on November 15.

Quarterback Braden Anderson completed 14 passes in 18 attempts for 165 yards and two touchdowns. He also ran the ball two times for 38 yards and one TD. Backup quarterback Jonathan Germano carried the ball seven times for 58 yards and one touchdown. He also threw for 40 yards (3-6). Running back Alec Sinatro had 12 rushes for 39 yards. Wideout Bradley Munday had five receptions for 75 yards. Wide receivers David Brookhart and Quinn Donaldson and tight end Brad Foulke each caught a touchdown pass.

Defensive back Dan Johnson made six tackles, one for a loss (2) yards) and had one interception. Linebacker Jonah Reels and defensive back Jack Toner each had five stops.

The Blue Jays scored 28 points in the first quarter on a 14-yard run by running back Brandon Cherry (9:40), a 21-yard touchdown pass to Donaldson (6:35), a one-yard run by Anderson (5:51) and a seven-yard touchdown completion to Foulke (1:14). McDaniel's score came on a 20-yard pass from quarterback Matty Callahan to wideout JT Kotowski (3:56). In the second quarter, Johns Hopkins added 25 (8:56) and 23 (5:33) yard field goals. Quarterback Will Nunn then found Brookhart in the end zone from 17-yards out (0:24).

In the third quarter, Germano scored on a three-yard run (11:04). Kicker Spencer Wiersberg converted a 28-yard field goal for McDaniel with 9:35 to play in the fourth and running back Tayahd Campbell scored from 11-yards out (3:41).

#### Blue Jays In The Postseason

Johns Hopkins is making its fourth consecutive appearance in the NCAA Playoffs and the sixth in school history. All six trips have been since 2005. In 2009, they reached the quarterfinals and in 2012 they advanced to the second round. This will be the fourth straight year that the Blue Jays host a first round game.

#### **Ranked In Both Polls**

Johns Hopkins is ranked in the top 10 of both the D3football.com and American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Top 25 polls. The Blue Jays are seventh in the D3football.com poll and sixth in the AFCA poll.

#### Seniors Accustomed To Winning

This year's senior class has a record of 40-4 and is the winningest class in program history. They are just the second group of seniors in Centennial Conference history to win 40 games. They have never lost a regular season home game.


