RU BASEBALL HISTORY LESSON

- Radford is in its 32nd season as a varsity baseball program. RU has compiled a 685-872 record during that span.
- Ninth-year head coach **Joe Raccuia** is the program's fifth head coach and second longest tenured.
- The Highlanders have won 30-plus games in four of the last five seasons, including three straight.
- Radford has the only first round MLB Draft pick in Big South history. **Eddie Butler** was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the 2012 draft.

HIGHLANDER HIGHLIGHTS

SETTING THE STAGE

- Radford travels to West Virginia on Tuesday to take on the Mountaineers for the first time since 1994. The Highlanders have hosted the Mountaineers twice in the last 20 years, but will make the trip to Morgantown for the first time since the two foes split a doubleheader on April 6, 1994. Action between the border state foes is set for 3 p.m. at Monongalia County Ballpark.
- Series: West Virginia leads 5-4-1

LAST MEETING (2015)

- The two teams combined for 10 runs in the final four frames of Radford's 9-4 win on April 29.
- Patrick Marshall** led the Highlanders with four hits and three runs scored in the win. The offense was provided by two-RBI each from **Shane Johnsonbaugh** and **Brad Keen**.
- Zack Ridgely** turned in the best outing of his freshman campaign, allowing only one run on five hits in six innings pitched. The lefty struckout nine Mountaineers in the win.
- West Virginia was led by two hits each from KC Huth, Kyle Davis and Caleb Potter.

SCOUTING WEST VIRGINIA

- The Mountaineers' series win over Old Dominion saw two extra inning affairs on Saturday. In game one of the doubleheader, West Virginia came back from a 4-1 deficit, scoring three runs in the ninth. Old Dominion led off the 10th inning with a solo home run as the Mountaineers were unable to comeback, dropping game one 5-4 in 10 innings. Game two saw another Mountaineer comeback, tying the game at four in the bottom of the ninth. The two teams would need two more innings before deciding a winner as freshman shortstop Jimmy Galusky hit a walk-off single in the 12th inning, giving the Mountaineers a 6-5 victory.
- West Virginia is off to a hot start to begin the season, winning three of its first four series to begin the season
- Offensively, the Mountaineer bats have yet to cool off, posting a .299 team batting average and

outscore opponents 72-41.

- Six players sport a batting average of .300 or higher with Kyle Gray's .364 average standing atop to statistics.
- Darius Hill, KC Huth, Kyle Davis and Jimmy Galusky have contributed 15-plus hits each through 13 games.
- Hill leads the Mountaineers with 19 hits, 13 runs, 10 RBI and seven doubles.
- West Virginia has been a doubles machine, posting 34 two-sackers.
- Few teams have been able to score on the Mountaineers due to a strong rotation and lockdown bullpen. West Virginia ranks third in the Big 12 with a 2.95 ERA.
- In 38 innings pitched, the Mountaineer bullpen has only allowed 10 earned runs for a 2.37 ERA, while punching out 42 batters.
- This matchup is one of only six home games for the Mountaineers in the first 23 games to start the season.

RADFORD ROUNDUP

- Radford is coming off a three-game non-conference sweep from Kent State. The series saw the Golden Flashes outscore the Highlanders, 21-9.
- The Highlanders dropped a heart-rending 7-6 decision on Saturday. Radford jumped out to an early 5-1 lead after the Golden Flashes scored first in the second inning. Kent State battled back, scoring four runs in the top of the fourth. Trailing 7-5 in the ninth, RU mounted a comeback as **Trevor Riggs** led off the inning with a hit by pitch and Jordan Taylor followed with a walk. A **Colby Higginson** sacrifice bunt, advanced the runners to second and third. Following a **Luke Wise** strikeout, **Chris Coia** hit a groundball to third base. A wide throw by the Golden Flash third baseman allowed Riggs to score easily from third, but pinch runner **Adam Whitacre** was thrown out at home, attempting to knot the game at seven. The heads up play by the Golden Flash defense ended the Highlander comeback in dramatic fashion.
- The series saw the Highlanders strand 19

runners on base.

- Trevor Riggs** put together one of his best series as a Highlander, finishing 4 for 8 with a two-run home run, three runs scored and one walk.
- Riggs started the season 4 for 36 with one home run and three RBI.
- After only collecting two hits in his first 13 at bats to start the season, **Jordan Taylor** went 3 for 6 with a two RBI and a run scored in the final two games of the Kent State series.
- Carrying the RU offense through the first 16 games, **Danny Hrbek** has collected a hit in 12 contests, leading the way with a .345 average.
- With a double in the fifth inning of the 8-3 loss to Kent State on Sunday, **Shane Johnsonbaugh** broke a 0 for 17 streak, giving the senior his first hit since March 4.
- Through 16 games, Radford's bullpen has struck-out 48 batters in 49.1 innings pitched.

MORE IS BETTER

- The Radford offense has compiled 24 multi-hit contests with Danny **Hrbek** leading the way with six.
- Following Hrbek; **Zach York**, **Colby Higginson** and **Chris Coia** have three multi-hit games each.
- The Highlanders have only saw three players collect three-plus hits on the season as **Jonathan Gonzalez**, York and Hrbek round out the category.

PINCH HITTING

- Radford is 5 for 19 in pinch hitting situations.
- The Highlanders have tallied two RBI in the situation.
- Matt Roth** has been the most effective in the situation off the bench with two hits in three tries.

MOVING ON UP

- The Highlanders are 81 for 202 (40.1%) in the success of advancing runners stat category.
- Zach York** has been the most successful, advancing 13 runners in 22 opportunities for 59.1-percent.

Joe Raccua, a 1995 Radford graduate, returned to his roots on July 10, 2007 when he was named the fifth head coach in Radford baseball history. Entering his ninth season as the head man for the Highlanders, a Radford uniform has been a winning fit for Raccua. Throughout his 12 seasons in a Highlander uniform, Raccua has been apart of 323 total wins as a player (1994-95), assistant coach (1996) and head coach (2008-present), better than 47 percent of the program's all-time victories dating back to 1985.

Raccua's most successful season in a Radford uniform came during an historic 2015 season as the Highlanders finished with a 45-16 record, setting a new school record in wins. The season also saw the programs first Big South regular season and conference championships, while earning a trip the NCAA Nashville Regional. In the regional, RU went 2-2, including wins over No. 3 Indiana and No. 4 Lipscomb.

RU finished Big South play with a 20-4 record, earning Raccua the Big South Coach of the Year award. Raccua becomes only the third RU head coach to earn the honor. Including a record six all-conference selections in 2015, 32 of Raccua's players have earned all-conference honors.

The 2015 squad posted a .289/.386/.425 line, while leading the Big South with 122 doubles and 362 RBI. The Highlander bats were led by Big South first-teamers Josh Gardiner and Patrick Marshall. Gardiner narrowly missed the Big South batting title, finishing second with a .368 average, while leading the league with a .451 on-base percentage. Marshall led the conference and set a new RU single-season record with 59 RBI. Big South second team member Hunter Higerson finished with 25 doubles, leading the Big South and setting a new RU season record. Higerson finished second behind Marshall in RBI, driving in 53 runs. Shane Johnsonbaugh earned Big South second team honors after leading RU in hits (76), runs scored (50) and walks (38).

Radford can attest their 2015 success to their pitching staff and bullpen. The Highlanders finished with a 3.95 ERA, a new single-season record. RU

ranked second in the Big South, holding opposing batters to a .255 average. The Highlanders only allowed 276 runs, their lowest since the 2000 season. Big South First Team member, Ryan Meisinger was named a finalist for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year award after leading the NCAA in saves with 17. Meisinger finished his career with a 2.60 ERA, a new RU career mark. Michael Boyle earned Big South First Team honors after leading the Big South in wins (10) and finishing second in innings pitched (105.1). With the 10 wins, Boyle became the first Highlander to lead the league in wins, while setting a new RU single-season record.

The 2015 senior class concluded their careers with a 137-93-1 overall record, the most wins for a four-year class in program history. The group led RU to three consecutive 30-plus win seasons.

Getting players to the professional ranks has been a staple for Raccua during his time as the headman at RU. Raccua has oversaw 10 players drafted in the MLB First Year Player Draft, with two players signing non-drafted free agent contracts.

In 2012, Eddie Butler was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the draft - the highest draft selection in Radford University program history and the first Big South Conference player to be selected in the draft's first round. On

June 6, 2014, Butler became the third Radford player to make it to the big leagues with his MLB debut for the Colorado Rockies.

Raccua's success has come both on and off the field of play, including facilities, player development, recruiting and academics.

On his watch, two major baseball facilities have opened: the on-campus hitting facility and RU Baseball Stadium. The stadium, which opened on April 8, 2011, became the cornerstone of Radford's program thanks in part to Raccua's extensive fund-raising and planning efforts. The project went from conception in the Fall of 2010, to completion during the 2011 season as a result of his work. Raccua also spearheaded the work done to the playing surface and dugouts in time for the 2010 season. All of the improvements to the facilities marked the first major capital upgrades since Raccua's playing days at RU.

On the academic side, the program has earned several honors under Raccua. The 2008 season saw Alex Gregory collect the second Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year award in program history. During the Raccua reign, RU has placed six players on the Big South All-Academic Team and two on the CoSIDA Academic All-District team.

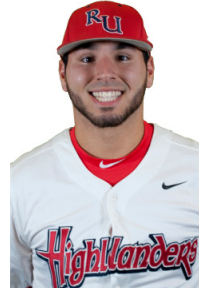
