- Radford has the only first round MLB Draft pick in Big South history. Eddie Butler was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the 2012 draft.

HIGHLANDER HIGHLIGHTS

SETTING THE STAGE

- The second edition of the New River Valley showdown comes to RU Baseball Stadium tomorrow as Radford hosts NRV foe Virginia Tech for a 5 p.m. meeting. The first edition of the Commonwealth clash between the two saw the Hokies put together an incredible comeback, taking a 4-3 victory in 10 innings. Radford looks to even the series as the two teams will meet one more time on April 12 in a neutral site contest at Calfee Park in Pulaski, Va. The Highlanders are 7-17 versus the Hokies on their home turf, with only two wins coming in the new millennium.
- Series: Virginia Tech leads 42-12

LAST MEETING (March 1, 2016)

- Radford received eight innings of shutout pitching from Tyler Swarmer and Travis McQueen, but fell victims of a 4-3 comeback victory by Virginia Tech in 10 innings on March 1.
- The Highlanders and Hokies were locked in a pitchers duel for five innings, as both teams combined for only three hits.
- Swarmer allowed only two hits, while striking out three batters in five innings. McQueen followed with five strikeouts in three innings pitched.
- RU scored two runs in the sixth on a Virginia Tech error and Shane Johnsonbaugh sacrifice fly.
- An insurance run came in the top of the ninth as Danny Hrbek lined a double into left field, scoring Johnsonbaugh.
- Trailing 3-0 in the bottom of the ninth, Virginia Tech put together a miraculous comeback as Phil Sciretta led off the inning with a walk as Max Ponzurick followed with a home run down the left field line, just hooking inside the foul poll. The Ponzurick two-run home run pulled the Hokies within 3-2 of the Highlanders. RU closer Daniel Bridgeman retired the next two Hokie batters, before Dauby tied the game at three on a towering home run to left-center field.
- Looking to regain the lead in the 10th inning, Chris Coia reached first on a throwing error by the Virginia Tech shortstop. A perfectly executed sac bunt by Wise, put Coia on second base with one out. RU was unable to advance Coia further, stranding him on second.

SCOUTING VIRGINIA TECH

- The Hokies are coming into the NRV matchup on a six-game skid. Virginia Tech dropped a threegame conference series at No. 22 Georgia Tech this past weekend. Their last win came on March 11 in a 14-3 victory over No. 5 Miami.
- Virginia Tech is 2-5 away from English Field to start the season.
- The Hokie offense is still being powered by Phil Sciretta (.368), Saige Jenco (.329) and Tom Stoffel (.319).
- Sciretta leads the way with 32 hits and 21 runs driven in. He is averaging 1.60 hits per game and 1.00 RBI per game.
- The senior ranks in the Top 10 of several offensive categories in the ACC: hits (4th), RBI (7th) and batting average (10th).
- Jenco ranks fourth with 17 walks and seventh with 21 runs scored.
- Virginia Tech's bullpen has been a dominate force to begin the season, striking out 78 batters in 71.0 innings pitched.
- Aaron McGarity and Connor Coward have been the bell cows of the Hokie bullpen. In nine appearances. McGarity has tallied 18 strikeouts in 10.1 innings. Also making nine appearances, Coward has collected 15 punch outs in 11.2
- Nic Enright, a 19th round selection by the New York Mets in the 2015 First-Year Player Draft, will make his fourth start of the season. In four appearances, Enright has allowed 12 earned runs in 14 innings. Opposing batters are hitting .305 off the freshman.

RADFORD ROUNDUP

- Radford is coming off a weekend in which they won two out of three games, taking two versus USC Upstate and dropping one to Lafayette.
- On Sunday, the Highlander offense finally caught fire rattling off 13 runs on 16 hits in a 13-2 win over USC Upstate.
- Putting together a career day in the win was Kyle Butler. Butler went 3 for 5 at the plate with three doubles, six RBI and two runs scored.
- Butler's three doubles are the most by a High-

- lander since Chris Coia collected three at Liberty on March 21, 2015.
- The six RBI are the most by a Highlander since Hunter Higgerson drove in six on May 16, 2015.
- Joining Butler with three hits, Coia collected his 12th three-hit game of his career.
- Putting together a strong weekend, **Jonathan** Gonzalez went 6 for 12 with four RBI in the three contests
- Two RU pitchers found themselves in unexpected roles as Travis McQueen was used as a pinch runner on March 19 and Nygeal Andrews served in a pinch hit role on March 20. McQueen came around to score his first run as a Highlander and Andrews went 1 for 2 with a RBI.
- In three starts versus Power Five conferences, Tyler Swarmer has only allowed seven earned runs in 15.1 innings pitched. The senior southpaw has punched out eight batters in the three outings.

STREAKING HIGHLANDERS

- Six Highlanders currently have a hitting streak with Jonathan Gonzalez leading the way with a five-game streak. Danny Hrbek follows with a four gamer. Hrbek had a five-game hitting streak earlier in the season.
- Chris Coia and Trevor Riggs collected a hit in all three games this past weekend.
- Kyle Butler and Zach Duff have two-game hitting streaks.
- Colby Higgerson and Gonzalez have reached base in five consecutive games.
- Putting together four-game on-base streaks are Jordan Taylor, Riggs and Hrbek.

ON DECK

- Radford will have one of its fastest turnarounds of the season, traveling to in-state Big South foe Longwood on Thursday for a three-game series.
- The series is set for March 24-26.
- In 2015, Radford did not play Longwood in the regular season, but defeated the Lancers 5-3 in the first round of the Big South Tournament.
- The Highlanders are 12-13 all-time versus the Lancers.

Joe Raccuia, a 1995 Radford graduate, returned to his roots on July 10, 2007 when he was named the fifth head coach in Radford baseball history. Entering his ninth season as the head man for the Highlanders, a Radford uniform has been a winning fit for Raccuia. Throughout his 12 seasons in a Highlander uniform, Raccuia has been apart of 323 total wins as a player (1994-95), assistant coach (1996) and head coach (2008-present), better than 47 percent of the program's all-time victories dating back to 1985.

Raccuia's most successful season in a Radford uniform came during an historic 2015 season as the Highlanders finished with a 45-16 record, setting a new school record in wins. The season also saw the programs first Big South regular season and conference championships, while earning a trip the NCAA Nashville Regional. In the regional, RU went 2-2, including wins over No. 3 Indiana and No. 4 Lipscomb.

RU finished Big South play with a 20-4 record, earning Raccuia the Big South Coach of the Year award. Raccuia becomes only the third RU head coach to earn the honor. Including a record six all-conference selections in 2015, 32 of Raccuia's players have earned all-conference honors.

The 2015 squad posted a .289/.386/.425 line, while leading the Big South with 122 doubles and 362 RBI. The Highlander bats were led by Big South first-teamers Josh Gardiner and Patrick Marshall. Gardiner narrowly missed the Big South batting title, finishing second with a .368 average, while leading the league with a .451 on-base percentage. Marshall led the conference and set a new RŬ single-season record with 59 RBI. Big South second team member Hunter Higgerson finished with 25 doubles, leading the Big South and setting a new RU season record. Higgerson finished second behind Marshall in RBI, driving in 53 runs. Shane Johnsonbaugh earned Big South second team honors after leading RU in hits (76), runs scored (50) and walks (38)

Radford can attest their 2015 success to their pitching staff and bullpen. The Highlanders finished with a 3.95 ERA, a new single-season record. RU

ranked second in the Big South, holding opposing batters to a .255 average. The Highlanders only allowed 276 runs, their lowest since the 2000 season. Big South First Team member, Ryan Meisinger was named a finalist for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year award after leading the NCAA in saves with 17. Meisinger finished his career with a 2.60 ERA, a new RU career mark. Michael Boyle earned Big South First Team honors after leading the Big South in wins (10) and finishing second in innings pitched (105.1). With the 10 wins, Boyle became the first Highlander to lead the league in wins, while setting a new RU single-season record.

The 2015 senior class concluded their careers with a 137-93-1 overall record, the most wins for a four-year class in program history. The group led RU to three consecutive 30-plus win seasons.

Getting players to the professional ranks has been a staple for Raccuia during his time as the headman at RU. Raccuia has oversaw 10 players drafted in the MLB First Year Player Draft, with two players signing non-drafted free agent contracts.

In 2012, Eddie Butler was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the draft the highest draft selection in Radford University program history and the first Big South Conference player to be selected in the draft's first round. On

June 6, 2014, Butler became the third Radford player to make it to the big leagues with his MLB debut for the Colorado Rockies.

Raccuia's success has come both on and off the field of play, including facilities, player development, recruiting and academics.

On his watch, two major baseball facilities have opened: the on-campus hitting facility and RU Baseball Stadium. The stadium, which opened on April 8, 2011, became the cornerstone of Radford's program thanks in part to Raccuia's extensive fund-raising and planning efforts. The project went from conception in the Fall of 2010, to completion during the 2011 season as a result of his work. Raccuia also spearheaded the work done to the playing surface and dugouts in time for the 2010 season. All of the improvements to the facilities marked the first major capital upgrades since Raccuia's playing days at RU.

On the academic side, the program has earned several honors under Raccuia. The 2008 season saw Alex Gregory collect the second Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year award in program history. During the Raccuia reign, RU has placed six players on the Big South All-Academic Team and two on the CoSIDA Academic All-District


