RU BASEBALL HISTORY LESSON

- Radford is in its 32nd season as a varsity baseball program. RU has compiled a 688-874 record during that span.
- Ninth-year head coach **Joe Raccuia** is the program's fifth head coach and second longest tenured.
- The Highlanders have won 30-plus games in four of the last five seasons, including three straight.
- Radford has the only first round MLB Draft pick in Big South history. **Eddie Butler** was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the 2012 draft.

HIGHLANDER HIGHLIGHTS

SETTING THE STAGE

- Riding a two-game winning streak, Radford will kick off Big South play with a trip up to Farmville to take on Commonwealth foe Longwood in a three-game clash before the Easter holiday. The Highlanders will be making their first trip to Longwood since the Highlanders' three-game sweep during the 2013 season.
- Series: Longwood leads 12-13
- Radford is 4-9 at Longwood.

LAST MEETING (May 19, 2015)

- The two teams did not meet in the 2015 regular season, but met in the first round of the Big South Tournament.
- In the opening round contest, the two teams were tied at three after the top of the seventh, but a **Patrick Marshall** solo home run in the seventh and **Brad Keen** sacrifice fly gave the Highlanders a 5-3 victory.
- **Zack Ridgely** threw six strong innings, allowing only two runs on five hits with both runs coming as unearned.
- Marshall led the RU offense with a 3 for 3 day with two RBI.
- **Trevor Riggs** gave the Highlanders an early 3-0 lead with a two-run home run in the fourth.

SCOUTING LONGWOOD

- The Lancers are coming off a 5-2 loss to VCU on Tuesday. Longwood collected 10 hits, but only manufactured two runs. The difference in the game was a three-run triple in the fourth inning off the bat of VCU's Logan Farrar. Four Lancers finished with two hits a piece in the loss.
- Longwood opened Big South play last weekend versus No.22 Coastal Carolina, taking the first game of the series, before dropping the final two games of the opening series.
- In game one of the double header on March 18, Travis Burnette allowed two runs on seven hits, striking out eight batters in 5.2 innings to earn the win. The Lancer bullpen only allowed one hit in 3.1 innings of relief.
- The lone bright spot in the Longwood lineup has

been Alex Lewis, who leads the team with a .306 average, four home runs and 22 RBI.

- Lewis ranks fifth in the Big South in home runs and eighth in RBI.
- Sammy Miller provides Longwood with a lot of speed at the top of the order. Miller leads the Lancers with 18 runs scored and has successfully stolen eight bases in 10 attempts. In addition to his speed, Miller stays patient at the dish, ranking seventh in the Big South with 15 walks.
- Longwood ranks just above Radford in the Big South with a .238 team batting average.
- Burnette is off to one of the best starts among Big South throwers. The righty has compiled a 3-1 record and a 2.38 ERA in 34 innings pitched. He ranks seventh in the league with 30 strikeouts. Opposing batters are only hitting .222 against Burnette.
- Cody Boydston was named The Crons Brand Pitcher of the Week in the Big South on March 7. Boydston earned the honor after going 4 for 4 in save opportunities. He struck out two and did not allow a run or a walk in 4.1 innings, aiding the Lancers to their longest winning streak of the season at five games.

RADFORD ROUNDUP

- After starting the season with one of the hardest schedules in the country, Radford is starting the reap the benefits of facing tough competition. The Highlanders have scored 25 runs on 31 hits in their last two games.
- Radford evened the New River Valley series at one with a 12-8 victory over rival Virginia Tech on Tuesday night. The Highlanders scored in every inning but one, while collecting 15 hits.
- With a three-run home run in the victory, **Jonathan Gonzalez** is currently on a six-game hitting streak. Over the span, the junior is 10 for 23 with seven RBI, six runs scored, one double and one home run.
- In the situation of runners in scoring position and two outs, **Chris Coia** has three hits and four RBI.
- Radford's bell cow in the bullpen, **Travis McQueen**, has shutdown opposing lineups of late. The redshirt senior has only allowed two earned

runs in his last 8.2 innings pitched. McQueen has collected 11 strikeouts over the last three games, giving him 24 on the season.

- Highlander pitchers have been able to induce groundballs this season, forcing 203 groundouts. RU is averaging 9.67 groundouts per game.

JOE'S COACHING TREE

- Longwood head man Ryan Mau spent two years coaching beside **Joe Raccuia** at Marist during the 2004 and 2005 seasons.
- After Raccuia left to become an assistant at Alabama, Mau moved on to VMI, where he served in various roles at recruiting coordinator and associate head coach.

DYNAMIC DANNY

- **Danny Hrbek** continues to dominate opposing pitchers as the toughest out in the Big South. Hrbek has only struckout twice in 72 at bats, collecting hits in 17 of his 20 starts. The junior is riding a five-game hitting streak, going 10 for 20 with four RBI, four runs scored, two triples and one double.
- Hrbek ranks ninth nationally in the toughest to strikeout category. Averaging one strikeout per 36 at bats.

OUCH!

- **Shane Johnsonbaugh** has been plunked six times on the season, giving him 19 HBP in his career, which ranks 12th in program history.
- Johnsonbaugh ranks 39th nationally in the category, while holding down second in the Big South in a category no one wants to lead in. Only Campbell's Brian Taylor (9) has more.

SMALL BALL

- Radford ranks third in the conference with 15 sacrifice bunts. Coastal Carolina leads the way with 27.
- **Colby Higginson** leads the Highlanders with four sacrifice bunts.
- The Highlanders have successfully bunted for five hits in 12 opportunities.
- **Luke Wise** and **Trevor Riggs** have two each.

Joe Raccua, a 1995 Radford graduate, returned to his roots on July 10, 2007 when he was named the fifth head coach in Radford baseball history. Entering his ninth season as the head man for the Highlanders, a Radford uniform has been a winning fit for Raccua. Throughout his 12 seasons in a Highlander uniform, Raccua has been apart of 323 total wins as a player (1994-95), assistant coach (1996) and head coach (2008-present), better than 47 percent of the program's all-time victories dating back to 1985.

Raccua's most successful season in a Radford uniform came during an historic 2015 season as the Highlanders finished with a 45-16 record, setting a new school record in wins. The season also saw the programs first Big South regular season and conference championships, while earning a trip the NCAA Nashville Regional. In the regional, RU went 2-2, including wins over No. 3 Indiana and No. 4 Lipscomb.

RU finished Big South play with a 20-4 record, earning Raccua the Big South Coach of the Year award. Raccua becomes only the third RU head coach to earn the honor. Including a record six all-conference selections in 2015, 32 of Raccua's players have earned all-conference honors.

The 2015 squad posted a .289/.386/.425 line, while leading the Big South with 122 doubles and 362 RBI. The Highlander bats were led by Big South first-teamers Josh Gardiner and Patrick Marshall. Gardiner narrowly missed the Big South batting title, finishing second with a .368 average, while leading the league with a .451 on-base percentage. Marshall led the conference and set a new RU single-season record with 59 RBI. Big South second team member Hunter Higerson finished with 25 doubles, leading the Big South and setting a new RU season record. Higerson finished second behind Marshall in RBI, driving in 53 runs. Shane Johnsonbaugh earned Big South second team honors after leading RU in hits (76), runs scored (50) and walks (38).

Radford can attest their 2015 success to their pitching staff and bullpen. The Highlanders finished with a 3.95 ERA, a new single-season record. RU

ranked second in the Big South, holding opposing batters to a .255 average. The Highlanders only allowed 276 runs, their lowest since the 2000 season. Big South First Team member, Ryan Meisinger was named a finalist for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year award after leading the NCAA in saves with 17. Meisinger finished his career with a 2.60 ERA, a new RU career mark. Michael Boyle earned Big South First Team honors after leading the Big South in wins (10) and finishing second in innings pitched (105.1). With the 10 wins, Boyle became the first Highlander to lead the league in wins, while setting a new RU single-season record.

The 2015 senior class concluded their careers with a 137-93-1 overall record, the most wins for a four-year class in program history. The group led RU to three consecutive 30-plus win seasons.

Getting players to the professional ranks has been a staple for Raccua during his time as the headman at RU. Raccua has oversaw 10 players drafted in the MLB First Year Player Draft, with two players signing non-drafted free agent contracts.

In 2012, Eddie Butler was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the draft - the highest draft selection in Radford University program history and the first Big South Conference player to be selected in the draft's first round. On

June 6, 2014, Butler became the third Radford player to make it to the big leagues with his MLB debut for the Colorado Rockies.

Raccua's success has come both on and off the field of play, including facilities, player development, recruiting and academics.

On his watch, two major baseball facilities have opened: the on-campus hitting facility and RU Baseball Stadium. The stadium, which opened on April 8, 2011, became the cornerstone of Radford's program thanks in part to Raccua's extensive fund-raising and planning efforts. The project went from conception in the Fall of 2010, to completion during the 2011 season as a result of his work. Raccua also spearheaded the work done to the playing surface and dugouts in time for the 2010 season. All of the improvements to the facilities marked the first major capital upgrades since Raccua's playing days at RU.

On the academic side, the program has earned several honors under Raccua. The 2008 season saw Alex Gregory collect the second Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year award in program history. During the Raccua reign, RU has placed six players on the Big South All-Academic Team and two on the CoSIDA Academic All-District team.




