#### RU BASEBALL HISTORY LESSON

- Radford is in its 32nd season as a varsity baseball program. RU has compiled a 692-882 record during that span.
- Ninth-year head coach **Joe Raccuia** is the program's fifth head coach and second longest tenured.
- The Highlanders have won 30-plus games in four of the last five seasons, including three straight.
- Radford has the only first round MLB Draft pick in Big South history. **Eddie Butler** was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the 2012 draft.

## HIGHLANDER HIGHLIGHTS

**LAST MEETING (MAY 22, 2016)**

- Radford advanced to its second Big South Tournament Championship game in program history with a 4-2 win over Winthrop in the tournament semifinals.
- With two outs in the bottom of the first, the Highlanders plated two early runs on **Danny Hrbek** and **Aaron Scoville** RBI singles up the middle.
- Commanding a 2-0 lead through the first five innings, RU starter **Dylan Nelson** allowed only one Winthrop hit.
- Winthrop got to Nelson in the sixth, loading the bases, eventually scoring its first run on a bases loaded walk by John Menken. One batter later, the Eagles knotted the game at two on a Babe Thomas sacrifice fly.
- The game's dramatics intensified in the seventh inning. With one out and runners on the corners, Winthrop's Tyler Asbill struck out swinging at a **Daniel Bridgeman** breaking ball in the dirt. It bounced away from **Josh Reavis**, and Jace Whitley broke from third to try and give the Eagles their first lead of the game. Reavis made a diving tag to complete the double play and get the Highlanders out of the jam.
- The dramatics for the Radford captain were not done, however. With one out in the eighth, he lifted a 1-0 fastball from Winthrop starter Michael Green over the left-center field wall to give RU a 4-2 lead and its first berth in the conference title game in 22 years. Radford has been to the championship just once in its history, in 1993.

**SCOUTING WINTHROP**

- Winthrop is currently on a five-game losing streak, dropping a 9-2 decision to in-state foe Wofford, Wednesday night. The losing steak has saw the Eagles be outscored 31-10.
- Sporting a .282 team average, the Eagles possess three players hitting over .300 and two with a .280-plus average. Mark Lowrie ranks 12th in the Big South with a .362 average.
- Five players have 40 or more hits through 33

games.

- Anthony Paulsen leads the Eagles with 47 hits and 36 runs scored, while swiping seven bags in nine attempts. Paulsen leads the Big South in runs scored.
- Carrying one of the most dangerous bats in the lineup, Roger Gonzalez holds a .333/.508/.425 line.
- Gonzalez leads the Eagles with 30 RBIs, 10 doubles and three home runs.
- Winthrop has been without its ace and Big South Preseason Pitcher of the Year Matt Crohan for most of the season. Crohan has not pitched since March 4. The MLB Draft prospect posted a 2-0 record with a 2.37 ERA in three starts.
- Zach Sightler and Sam Kmiec have picked up the slack for the Eagles. Sightler is holding opposing batters to a .237 average, going 4-2 with a 3.74 ERA in eight starts. Kmiec is 4-4 with a 3.81 ERA in eight starts.
- The Eagles do not have a reliever with an ERA under 5.00.

**RADFORD ROUNDUP**

- Radford is coming off its New River Valley rivalry series win for the second consecutive season, taking a 5-1 over Virginia Tech at historic Calfee Park on Wednesday.
- The Highlanders added two early runs on RBI singles by **Jonathan Gonzalez** and **Chris Coia**. With a 2-1 lead, **Shane Johnsonbaugh** broke the game wide open for the Highlanders with a two-run blast over the right-center field wall, bringing the Radford dominated crowd to its feet.
- RU pitchers yielded only four hits and one unearned run in the win, striking out eight Hokies in the process.
- Johnsonbaugh's two-run round tripper was the senior's second multi-run home run on the year. The left-handed swinger has belted a team-high five home runs, giving him 12 in his career. The home run was the first by a Highlander since March 26 at Longwood.

- Danny Hrbek** continues to be one of the toughest outs in the country, being held hitless in only six contests this season. Hrbek has reached base safely in 29 of his 32 starts.
- Only a sophomore, **Zack Ridgely** has developed into ace for the Highlanders. In three conference starts this season, Ridgely holds a 1-1 record and 2.78 ERA. The lefty has allowed only seven earned runs in 22.2 innings pitched, racking up 17 strikeouts in league play.
- Since **Joe Raccuia** took over in 2008, Radford is 18-9 against the Eagles.

**COUNT ON COLBY**

- Catching fire in the Radford lineup, **Colby Higgerson** is 11 for 25 over the last seven games. The span has saw three two-hit performances and one three-hit performance.
- The freshman has seven multi-hit games on the season.
- Higgerson leads the team with 15 RBIs, driving in 10 over the last nine contests.
- In nine conference games, Higgerson is 10 for 28 with four runs scored and eight RBIs.
- With eight sacrifice bunts, Higgerson ranks second in the Big South and ranks 21st in the country.

**DEPENDABLE DYLAN**

- Dylan Nelson** has been one of the most dependable pitchers in the Highlander rotation the past four seasons and in program history.
- Nelson currently ranks seven all-time with 252 innings pitched and could finish as high as third.
- The senior has started 46 game in his RU career, which ranks tied for fourth in RU history. Nelson only needs five more starts to set a new program record.
- With 165 career strikeouts, Nelson stands in ninth place.
- Nelson has compiled an 18-17 record over his time in a Radford uniform.
- The 18 wins are tied for fifth most by a RU pitcher.

Joe Raccua, a 1995 Radford graduate, returned to his roots on July 10, 2007 when he was named the fifth head coach in Radford baseball history. Entering his ninth season as the head man for the Highlanders, a Radford uniform has been a winning fit for Raccua. Throughout his 12 seasons in a Highlander uniform, Raccua has been apart of 323 total wins as a player (1994-95), assistant coach (1996) and head coach (2008-present), better than 47 percent of the program's all-time victories dating back to 1985.

Raccua's most successful season in a Radford uniform came during an historic 2015 season as the Highlanders finished with a 45-16 record, setting a new school record in wins. The season also saw the programs first Big South regular season and conference championships, while earning a trip the NCAA Nashville Regional. In the regional, RU went 2-2, including wins over No. 3 Indiana and No. 4 Lipscomb.

RU finished Big South play with a 20-4 record, earning Raccua the Big South Coach of the Year award. Raccua becomes only the third RU head coach to earn the honor. Including a record six all-conference selections in 2015, 32 of Raccua's players have earned all-conference honors.

The 2015 squad posted a .289/.386/.425 line, while leading the Big South with 122 doubles and 362 RBI. The Highlander bats were led by Big South first-teamers Josh Gardiner and Patrick Marshall. Gardiner narrowly missed the Big South batting title, finishing second with a .368 average, while leading the league with a .451 on-base percentage. Marshall led the conference and set a new RU single-season record with 59 RBI. Big South second team member Hunter Higerson finished with 25 doubles, leading the Big South and setting a new RU season record. Higerson finished second behind Marshall in RBI, driving in 53 runs. Shane Johnsonbaugh earned Big South second team honors after leading RU in hits (76), runs scored (50) and walks (38).

Radford can attest their 2015 success to their pitching staff and bullpen. The Highlanders finished with a 3.95 ERA, a new single-season record. RU

ranked second in the Big South, holding opposing batters to a .255 average. The Highlanders only allowed 276 runs, their lowest since the 2000 season. Big South First Team member, Ryan Meisinger was named a finalist for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year award after leading the NCAA in saves with 17. Meisinger finished his career with a 2.60 ERA, a new RU career mark. Michael Boyle earned Big South First Team honors after leading the Big South in wins (10) and finishing second in innings pitched (105.1). With the 10 wins, Boyle became the first Highlander to lead the league in wins, while setting a new RU single-season record.

The 2015 senior class concluded their careers with a 137-93-1 overall record, the most wins for a four-year class in program history. The group led RU to three consecutive 30-plus win seasons.

Getting players to the professional ranks has been a staple for Raccua during his time as the headman at RU. Raccua has oversaw 10 players drafted in the MLB First Year Player Draft, with two players signing non-drafted free agent contracts.

In 2012, Eddie Butler was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the draft - the highest draft selection in Radford University program history and the first Big South Conference player to be selected in the draft's first round. On

June 6, 2014, Butler became the third Radford player to make it to the big leagues with his MLB debut for the Colorado Rockies.

Raccua's success has come both on and off the field of play, including facilities, player development, recruiting and academics.

On his watch, two major baseball facilities have opened: the on-campus hitting facility and RU Baseball Stadium. The stadium, which opened on April 8, 2011, became the cornerstone of Radford's program thanks in part to Raccua's extensive fund-raising and planning efforts. The project went from conception in the Fall of 2010, to completion during the 2011 season as a result of his work. Raccua also spearheaded the work done to the playing surface and dugouts in time for the 2010 season. All of the improvements to the facilities marked the first major capital upgrades since Raccua's playing days at RU.

On the academic side, the program has earned several honors under Raccua. The 2008 season saw Alex Gregory collect the second Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year award in program history. During the Raccua reign, RU has placed six players on the Big South All-Academic Team and two on the CoSIDA Academic All-District team.


