

- Radford is in its 32nd season as a varsity baseball program. RU has compiled a 696-888 record during that span
- Ninth-year head coach **Joe Raccuia** is the program's fifth head coach and second longest tenured.
- The Highlanders have won 30-plus games in four of the last five seasons, including three straight.
- Radford has the only first round MLB Draft pick in Big South history. Eddie Butler was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the 2012 draft.

HIGHLANDER HIGHLIGHTS

LAST MEETING (May 20, 2015)

- Michael Boyle tossed eight shutout innings, allowing only three hits as the Highlanders took a 4-0 win over High Point in the second round of the Big South Tournament.
- Boyle was efficient in his 8.0 innings of work. He threw 102 pitches and coaxed 13 ground ball outs with two walks and four strikeouts. He allowed just three hits, all singles. Ryan Meisinger worked a scoreless ninth in a non-save situation to combine with Boyle for the first shutout of the season for the Highlanders.
- The win marked Boyle's 10th on the year, marking the first Highlander in program history to reach double-digit wins in a season.
- Boyle got all the help he would need when RU broke on top in the third. Brad Keen led off the inning with a double and scored on Chris Coia's RBI two-bagger. Josh Reavis singled home Coia, and the Highlanders would rely on their steady left-handed ace.
- Keen drove in a run with a single in the fourth after Hunter Higgerson added to his school record with his 25th double of the season.
- Shane Johnsonbaugh added an important insurance run in the eighth with his seventh homer of the season. With a double as well, he extended his hitting streak to 17 games.
- The win was the second in the tournament for Radford, marking the third time in program history that a Highlander squad had won two games in the Big South Tournament.

RIGGS EARNS FIRST POW

- There was no hotter hitter in the RU lineup over the four games than Trevor Riggs. Riggs went 6 for 14 with four RBIs, four runs scored, two home runs and two doubles.
- Riggs extended his hitting streak to seven games as the Highlanders went 3-1 on the week. Over the span the sophomore is 10 for 24 with seven runs scored, six RBIs, four home runs and three

doubles

- The April 30th double-dip saw Riggs drive in three runs on two home runs and two doubles as the Highlanders won their second Big South series of the season.
- After the offensive output, Riggs was rewarded with his first Big South Player of the Week honor on Monday.

SENSATIONAL SOUTHPAW

- Radford swept the league's weekly awards as Zack Ridgely collected his second Big South honor on the year dominating performance in series opener on April 29 against Gardner-Webb.
- The southpaw held the Runnin' Bulldogs to a minimal four singles over eight shutout innings in the 1-0 win. Ridgely punched out five batters in the performance.
- With the win, Ridgely improves to 2-1 in Big South contests, while lowering his league ERA to 1.86.
- In 38.2 innings, the sophomore has only allowed eight earned runs, while striking out 28 batters in five conference starts.
- Big South teams are only hitting. 218 off of
- Currently, Ridgely ranks seventh in the league with a 2.38 ERA and second in innings pitched with 75.2.

RU ON THE ROAD

- In 20 road starts, Danny Hrbek has collected 28 hits in 77 plate appearances for a .364 average.
- The junior has scored 10 runs, while driving in eight on four doubles, one triple and a home run.
- Shane Johnsonbaugh's power numbers have came primarily from road contests. Johnsonbaugh has driven in 12 of his 19 RBIs on the road, including four of his five home runs.
- The Highlanders have received good road starts from the left-handed duo of Zack Ridgely and Mitchell MacKeith. The duo has combined for a

- 3-1 record and a 2.45 ERA.
- Ridgely boasts a 1-0 record and 2.06 ERA in five starts, including a complete game.
- MacKeith holds a 2-1 record with 3.05 ERA.

SHANE'S STREAKING

- Shane Johnsonbaugh paces the Highlanders with a 14-game on-base streak and eight game hitting streak.
- Johnsonbaugh is 17 for 57 with seven RBIs, three doubles, triple and home run.
- The senior has kept the on-base streak alive with four walks and two hit by pitches.

ETCHING NAME IN RU HISTORY

- Chris Coia has appeared in 213 career games as a Highlander, starting in 212.
- The 213 games rank second in program history behind Brett Mollenhauer's 217.
- Coia ranks seventh in Radford history with 715 at bats. The senior could move as high as fourth place by the end of his career.
- One of the more painful categories to rank in, Coia has been plunked 33 times in his career, ranking second only to Jeff Kemp's 39 HBP.

LATEST RPI POLL

- Radford comes in at 198 in the latest RPI ratings.
- The Highlanders have four opponents on their schedule that rank in the Top 60: Vanderbilt (12), Virginia (16), Coastal Carolina (17) and Hartford (60).
- Rounding out the non-conference opponents: Kent State (76), Mercer (92), West Virginia (116), Georgia Southern (127), Virginia Tech (187), USC Upsate (235), VMI (254), Lafayette (265), ETSU (266) and George Mason (274).
- Big South RPI: Coastal Carolina (17), High Point (63), Liberty (135), Longwood (153), Gardner-Webb (156), Winthrop (162), Campbell (166), Presbyterian (181), Charleston Southern (258) and UNC Asheville (284)

Joe Raccuia, a 1995 Radford graduate, returned to his roots on July 10, 2007 when he was named the fifth head coach in Radford baseball history. Entering his ninth season as the head man for the Highlanders, a Radford uniform has been a winning fit for Raccuia. Throughout his 12 seasons in a Highlander uniform, Raccuia has been apart of 323 total wins as a player (1994-95), assistant coach (1996) and head coach (2008-present), better than 47 percent of the program's all-time victories dating back to 1985.

Raccuia's most successful season in a Radford uniform came during an historic 2015 season as the Highlanders finished with a 45-16 record, setting a new school record in wins. The season also saw the programs first Big South regular season and conference championships, while earning a trip the NCAA Nashville Regional. In the regional, RU went 2-2, including wins over No. 3 Indiana and No. 4 Lipscomb.

RU finished Big South play with a 20-4 record, earning Raccuia the Big South Coach of the Year award. Raccuia becomes only the third RU head coach to earn the honor. Including a record six all-conference selections in 2015, 32 of Raccuia's players have earned all-conference honors.

The 2015 squad posted a .289/.386/.425 line, while leading the Big South with 122 doubles and 362 RBI. The Highlander bats were led by Big South first-teamers Josh Gardiner and Patrick Marshall. Gardiner narrowly missed the Big South batting title, finishing second with a .368 average, while leading the league with a .451 on-base percentage. Marshall led the conference and set a new RŬ single-season record with 59 RBI. Big South second team member Hunter Higgerson finished with 25 doubles, leading the Big South and setting a new RU season record. Higgerson finished second behind Marshall in RBI, driving in 53 runs. Shane Johnsonbaugh earned Big South second team honors after leading RU in hits (76), runs scored (50) and walks (38)

Radford can attest their 2015 success to their pitching staff and bullpen. The Highlanders finished with a 3.95 ERA, a new single-season record. RU

ranked second in the Big South, holding opposing batters to a .255 average. The Highlanders only allowed 276 runs, their lowest since the 2000 season. Big South First Team member, Ryan Meisinger was named a finalist for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year award after leading the NCAA in saves with 17. Meisinger finished his career with a 2.60 ERA, a new RU career mark. Michael Boyle earned Big South First Team honors after leading the Big South in wins (10) and finishing second in innings pitched (105.1). With the 10 wins, Boyle became the first Highlander to lead the league in wins, while setting a new RU single-season record.

The 2015 senior class concluded their careers with a 137-93-1 overall record, the most wins for a four-year class in program history. The group led RU to three consecutive 30-plus win seasons.

Getting players to the professional ranks has been a staple for Raccuia during his time as the headman at RU. Raccuia has oversaw 10 players drafted in the MLB First Year Player Draft, with two players signing non-drafted free agent contracts.

In 2012, Eddie Butler was the 46th overall selection of the Colorado Rockies in the draft the highest draft selection in Radford University program history and the first Big South Conference player to be selected in the draft's first round. On

June 6, 2014, Butler became the third Radford player to make it to the big leagues with his MLB debut for the Colorado Rockies.

Raccuia's success has come both on and off the field of play, including facilities, player development, recruiting and academics.

On his watch, two major baseball facilities have opened: the on-campus hitting facility and RU Baseball Stadium. The stadium, which opened on April 8, 2011, became the cornerstone of Radford's program thanks in part to Raccuia's extensive fund-raising and planning efforts. The project went from conception in the Fall of 2010, to completion during the 2011 season as a result of his work. Raccuia also spearheaded the work done to the playing surface and dugouts in time for the 2010 season. All of the improvements to the facilities marked the first major capital upgrades since Raccuia's playing days at RU.

On the academic side, the program has earned several honors under Raccuia. The 2008 season saw Alex Gregory collect the second Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year award in program history. During the Raccuia reign, RU has placed six players on the Big South All-Academic Team and two on the CoSIDA Academic All-District




