GAME NOTES

DROPPING THE PUCK:

Marian University NCAA men's hockey takes on No. 11/12 Trine in the NCHA Harris Cup Quarterfinals February 20-21.

COMING IN HOT:

Marian had a strong finish to the regular season going 6-2-0 over the final eight games of the regular season earning 15 conference points along the way. The Sabre defense especially found its stride allowing two or fewer goals in five of those six victories.

PICKING PICKART:

Senior Noah Pickart had another dominating season at the blue line and enters the postseason ranked 21st in the nation with 0.84 assists per game. Pickart has 57 career assists over just 81 games putting him third on the all-time defenseman assists list at Marian.

SECOND INTERMISSION JINX:

Marian is 8-1-2 this season when leading or tied at the end of two periods with the lone defeat coming in game one of the Trine series. When trailing at the second intermission, the Sabres are 1-13-0. The lone victory came in the final game of the regular season against CUW.

FREE HOCKEY:

The Sabres are no stranger to playing past regulation this season having gone to overtime seven times this season. Marian went 4-1-2 in overtime games this season and enter on a three-game winning streak for overtime games.

REGULAR SEASON SERIES:

The Sabres gave the Thunder a scare twice but Trine was able to secure a sweep. The two sides were tied 1-1 going into the final period of the opener, and the game winner for game two was scored with just 1:59 left to play.

SABRE HARRIS CUP HISTORY:

Marian enters with a 13-19-0 record in the NCHA Harris Cup Playoffs. The Sabres have dropped eight straight and are in search of their first postseason victory since being crowned the NCHA Harris Cup Champions in 2021.

MARIAN UNIVERSITY MEN'S HOCKEY HISTORY

- Marian University men's hockey played its inaugural season in 1995-96 going 5-2-0 under Rich Blakey.
- The Sabres have earned a pair of conference championships and have won three conference tournament championships.
- Marian has reached the 20-win plateau twice and in 2017-18 became the first program in the entire athletic department to earn an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament.

BLUE LINE ICE CENTER FACTS

- Blue Line Family Ice Center has three sheets of ice with Marian primarily playing games on Rink "A". Rink A is an Olympic sheet and the Sabres are one of two programs in the West region to play primarily on Olympic ice.
- Rink "B" at Blue Line Family Ice Center is a standard sheet of ice.
- Both the men's and women's programs enjoy state-of-the-art locker rooms with individual locker stalls, HD projectors, and television.
- Blue Line Ice Center is considered one of the premier rinks in Wisconsin and thus is one of the busiest in the state all year round.
