GAME NOTES

START ME UP:

Marian University men's lacrosse plays host to Beloit in NACC action Wednesday, April 1 at 7 p.m.

NOLEN ANCHORING THE DEFENSE:

Senior Shay Nolen continues to have a strong season as the anchor of the Sabre defense. Nolen enters the week ranked fourth in the NACC with a 2.33 caused turnovers per game average. He has had multiple caused turnovers in all but one game this season.

SWEET AS SWEENEY:

Senior Jackson Sweeney has had a solid season so far and leads the NACC with his 17.83 saves per game. Sweeney also ranks sixth in the conference for save percentage at .591.

BUCKING THE BUCCANEERS:

Beloit enters on a four-game skid with all of those games being in NACC play. Freshman Christian Lewis ranks 12th in the conference for ground balls per game, and fellow sophomore Parker Davis is 12th in the NACC for caused turnovers per game.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

Marian enters with a 4-2 record against Beloit in the all-time series. The Buccaneers snapped a four-game winning streak for Marian with an 8-5 win last season in Beloit.

Marian hits the road for four of the next five games opening at Illinois Tech Saturday, April 4 at 1 p.m.

MARIAN UNIVERSITY MEN'S LACROSSE HISTORY

- Marian University men's lacrosse began in 2018 going 5-12 under Reid Mayberry.
- The Sabre men's lacrosse program has posted a winning season twice.
- Marian was originally a member of the Midwest Lacrosse Conference before the NACC added lacrosse in 2020.
- The program record for wins in a single season is 12 which came in 2019.
- Marian has qualified for the conference tournament twice in program history with the first coming in 2019.

SMITH FIELD FACTS

- Smith Field completed construction in 2002.
- Originally a grass pitch, Smith Field went under renovation in 2019 building a new turf surface to accommodate the addition of lacrosse and field hockey.
- Smith Field features a customizable scoreboard, full-service concession stand, men and women restrooms, team rooms, and lights to allow for night games. The second floor of Smith Field features a state-of-the-art press box and meeting room.
