

The Sunshine State Conference has issued guidance allowing institutional discretion to permit fan attendance at home athletic events at 25 percent capacity. The President and COVID-19 Incident Command Team have approved the following fan policy for the remainder of the 2020-21 academic year.

Saint Leo Fan Policy 2020-21

- Each student-athlete will be allowed to have up to two family members attend home athletic events up to a maximum of 25 percent capacity at all sporting event sites. Please note: if the pass list exceeds the 25 percent capacity, individuals will be admitted on a first-come-first-serve basis.
- 2. Only Saint Leo University student-athlete's family members are permitted to attend.
- 3. In order to attend the event, the family member must be on the player pass list and provide a valid issued ID.
- 4. Masks must be worn at all times during the sporting event, at both indoor and outdoor locations.
- 5. Social distancing is required. Seating will be in designated areas/seats only.
- 6. For Tennis, Lacrosse, Baseball and Softball we ask family members to bring chairs as some seating will be in areas where your own chair will be needed.
- 7. Prior to admission, all individuals must undergo a temperature screening.
- 8. No interaction with the student-athletes prior to the game is permitted. Post-game, student-athletes are able to meet their family in the stands or parking lot only. Parents and family members are not permitted in the locker room or tailgate areas.
- 9. No concessions will be available on site. Food and non-alcoholic beverages will be allowed into the venues.
- 10. No students, alumni, or family members from visiting schools will be permitted.

These procedures may be modified without notice based on the COVID positivity rate of the State of Florida, Pasco County, or the Saint Leo University campus. The safety of our student- athletes, fans, and community is of upmost importance.

These procedures are based on recommendations/requirements from the CDC, State of Florida Health Department, NCAA, SLU Incident Command Team, and best practices of various athletic facilities.
