### Opening Tip

- The Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference slate tips for Saint Peter's this weekend with a home series against Niagara University at the John Moore Athletics Center in Jersey City.
- The Peacocks and Purple Eagles will link up on Friday (Dec. 11) and Saturday (Dec. 12) at 8 p.m., under the revised league schedule format which was announced by the MAAC on Nov. 16 due to COVID-19.
- Saint Peter's is coming off of a 90-57 setback at Maryland Friday afternoon, a meeting the team accepted on short notice just two days prior, following the cancellation of Maryland's game with its original opponent George Mason due to a positive COVID-19 test from a Mason player.
- Sophomore guard Daryl Banks III was the lone Peacock to score in double-figures, recording a team-high 11 points to go along with two boards, one assist and one steal.
- Fousseyni Drame and KC Ndefo each scored nine points to follow, with the former grabbing a team-best six rebounds and the latter leading the way defensively with three steals and a pair of blocks.
- The Peacocks are aiming to stay unbeaten at home this season, holding a 1-0 mark in Jersey City behind an 82-68 win over Stony Brook on Dec. 1.
- Niagara visits New Jersey with just one game under its belt, a 75-45 defeat at the hands of ACC foe, Syracuse.

### Things to Know Before the MAAC Opening Series

#### Series History

- Friday's and Saturday's engagements will be the 89th and 90th all-time meetings between Saint Peter's and Niagara.
- Dating back to 1937, the Peacocks are behind in the series 36-52, and trail 22-39 in MAAC meetings against the Purple Eagles since 1989-90 when the Western New York institution joined the conference.
- In 2019-20, the team's split the season series, with the home team defending their court.
- On Jan. 26, the Peacocks earned a 58-53 win in the Yanitelli Center, while Niagara posted a 63-54 victory on Feb. 27 at home.
- Saint Peter's will look to sweep a season series against Niagara for the second time under Shaheen Holloway, having also done so during his inaugural season in 2018-19.
- The Peacocks have not lost in Jersey City to the Purple Eagle since January of 2017 and the team has won four out of the last five meetings when playing host.

#### Launching into League Play

- Charter MAAC member Saint Peter's is seeking its third MAAC Regular season crown and fourth MAAC Championship title in 2020-21 following a historic, curtailed 2019-20.
- The Peacocks are coming off of a program-tying 14-6 league campaign, holding an all-time MAAC tally of 298-348, with 20 total seasons above .500.
- In conference openers, Saint Peter's is 21-18 all-time and 8-10 when beginning MAAC action at home.
- Under Holloway, the Peacocks are a perfect 2-0 in conference openers, having topped Siena (2018-19) and Iona (2019-20) the previous two seasons.

#### Next Up

- Saint Peter's will open its MAAC away schedule with a series at hOURglass Rival Monmouth University next weekend, Dec. 18-19. Both contests will tip at 5 p.m. in the OceanFirst Bank Center in West Long Branch, NJ.

# Shaheen Holloway (Seton Hall '00)

## Head Coach • Third Season



Shaheen Holloway became the 15th head coach of the men's basketball program at Saint Peter's University in April 2018.

In just his second season at the helm of the men's basketball program, Holloway was named as the 2020 The Rock MAAC Coach of the Year. He became the third head coach from Saint Peter's to win the conference's top coach award, joining Bob Dukiet (1982) and Ted Fiore (1987, 1989, and 1991). Holloway guided the Peacocks to an 18-12 overall record and 14-6 MAAC mark, good enough for a second-place finish, which was the best finish since 2016-17. Under his guidance, the team made the biggest NET Rankings improvement in the MAAC and 14th nationally from 2018-19 to 2019-20, improving by 105 spots. The 14 league wins under Holloway tied the program record for most conference victories in a season and the team's nine MAAC home wins were the most ever by the program. His team also won 11 games at the Yanitelli Center in 2019-20, the most in almost 30 years, having last been done in 1990-91. Holloway's squad ended the campaign as the conference leaders in field goal percentage defensive, rebounding margin, offensive rebounds, offensive rebounding percentage, blocked shots per game, and total blocks. Additionally, he guided the program to a MAAC record four major awards, a program record of four Peacocks to five All-MAAC teams, a MAAC record three freshmen to the All-Rookie Team, and a league-record five individual freshmen to MAAC Rookie of the Week awards.

The men's basketball team opened the 2018-19 campaign with a 93-86 overtime home win against Lafayette to jump start Holloway's first year at the helm. The Peacocks closed out the regular season as winners of 3 out of 4 games, improving two spots on the MAAC final standings chart. Holloway's squad advanced to the MAAC quarterfinal round after defeating Marist 71-68 in the first round. His duo of senior leaders in guard Davauhnte Turner and forward Samuel Idowu were top-ranked player in the MAAC. Turner ranked top-10 in scoring, assists, steals, free throw percentage, and 3-point field goals made, being named to the All-MAAC Third Team. Idowu became the program's fifth player to surpass 100 career blocks and finished his career fourth all-time in blocked shots, while leading the MAAC in blocked shots. Holloway's teams, behind the rim protection of Idowu and freshman KC Ndefo, led the MAAC and ranked third nationally in blocked shots to close out the 2018-19 season.

Holloway brings superlative credentials to Jersey City after spending the past eight seasons as the associate head coach at his alma mater, Seton Hall, under Kevin Willard. With Holloway on the sideline serving as Willard's top assistant, Seton Hall became one of the BIG EAST's premier programs, winning the 2015-16 BIG EAST Tournament title for the first time since 1993. In the last three seasons from 2016 to 2018, Seton Hall recorded three straight 20-win seasons, the first time the program had done that since 1991-93, and three straight BIG EAST seasons of 10 wins or more for the first time in program history. Holloway helped Seton Hall advance to the NCAA Tournament in three consecutive seasons and in 2018, the Pirates won the program's first NCAA Tournament game since 2004 with him on the bench. The Pirates also climbed back into the na-

tional rankings on multiple occasions. The Pirates enjoyed being ranked by the Associated Press 15 times with Holloway aboard since 2010, and this included a No. 13 ranking on Jan. 8, 2018, the highest the program had reached since 2001.

With Holloway serving as the lead recruiter, the Pirates experienced an abundant amount of success during his tenure, producing three Associated Press All-America honorable mention selections, 12 All-BIG EAST selections, three BIG EAST All-Rookies and 36 BIG EAST All-Academic team selections. His recruiting ability helped Seton Hall produce a top-15 national recruiting class in 2014 which included Isaiah Whitehead, the program's first McDonald's All-American since 2001, who went on to become a 2016 NBA Draft pick; Angel Delgado, the 2018 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award National Center of the Year and BIG EAST all-time rebounds leader; and Khadeen Carrington, who finished his Seton Hall career as the ninth all-time leading scorer in program history.

Prior to joining Seton Hall, Holloway served on Willard's staff at Iona, where he helped turn the Gaels program around. Inheriting a team that went 2-28 in 2006-07, Holloway and Willard recruited and coached student-athletes to one of the greatest turnarounds in college basketball history as their 2009-10 team won 21 games to complete a 19-win turnaround in only the third year of the administration.

During his original stint on the Seton Hall coaching staff, Holloway was an administrative assistant for head coach Bobby Gonzalez from 2006-07. Holloway was responsible for coordinating film exchange, analyzing game tapes and assisting with scouting of opponents. He supervised fall conditioning as well as the year-round weight training program. Holloway was also responsible for academic progress reports for team members as well as the organization of all aspects of team travel for the Pirates.

Holloway started his coaching career serving as an assistant coach at the high school level at Bloomfield Tech.

Holloway was a four-year standout at Seton Hall from 1996-00 and helped lead his team to the 2000 NCAA Sweet Sixteen, where he hit the game-winning layup in overtime to defeat Oregon in the NCAA first round. A 2012 inductee of the Seton Hall Athletics Hall of Fame, Holloway's preeminent playing career landed him in the Seton Hall record books as the all-time assist leader with 681, 17th in scoring with 1,588 points, fourth in steals with 231 steals, and eighth with 185 three-pointers in 116 games. In 2000, he was named the BIG EAST's Most Improved Player, while earning All-BIG EAST status three times and All-Metropolitan accolades in each of his four seasons at Seton Hall.

After his collegiate success, Holloway played professionally in England for the Chester Jets and London Towers as well as a season in Ulm, Germany and Istanbul, Turkey. Back in the U.S., he had stints with the Brooklyn Kings of the USBL and Newark, Las Vegas and Chicago in the ABA. He was invited to three preseason NBA camps with the Knicks, Nets and Golden State Warriors.

The Queens, NY native was a McDonald's All-American who played at St. Patrick's High School in Elizabeth, NJ.

Holloway has two children, a son, Xavier and a daughter, Shatanik. He is married to Kim Holloway.





## NOTES & NOTABLES

### Outstanding Opening

- Led by the reigning MAAC Coach of the Year Shaheen Holloway, Saint Peter's men's basketball is out to a 2-1 start to the 2020-21 campaign; the program's best three game start in out of conference action since going 3-0 at the beginning of the 2012-13 season.
- The double-digit margin of victory over La Salle (62-51) and Stony Brook (82-68) are the most in back-to-back out of conference matches since 2016 when the Peacocks throttled FDU (84-58) and Boston U. (80-67) in succession.
- The two straight wins were also the first pair of consecutive non-conference wins under Holloway's leadership.

### Big Bounce Back

- Saint Peter's bounced back after a heartbreaking defeat in its season opener against St. John's by dispatching Atlantic 10 member La Salle in impressive fashion last Friday.
- Sophomore wing Fousseyni Drame was the star of the show, as his 19 points, eight baskets and three steals either tied or set career highs; his eight rebounds were two shy of his personal best.
- Sophomore Daryl Banks III tied his single-game high with four made triples; he finished with 14 points, with all of his field goals coming from long range in that outing.
- Junior wing KC Ndefo added another block alongside 11 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Matt Lee set a new career best with 10 assists, becoming the first player to post 10 dimes in a game since Elijah Gonzalez (Siena, Feb. 25, 2018).

### Early Hardware

- While the Peacocks, as a team, settled for runner-up honors for the season-opening Lapchick Tournament hosted by St. John's, two individuals claimed all-tournament accolades in sophomore Fousseyni Drame and junior KC Ndefo.
- The two wings finished the week with impressive stat lines; Drame posted a team-high 31 points over the two games (15.5 ppg) and hauled down 13 boards (6.5 rpg) while adding a team-high four steals and a block.
- Those efforts earned Drame his first career MAAC Player of the Week award; he was named the top weekly rookie three times in 2019-20.
- Ndefo finished with 27 points between the two games (13.5) and held the slight edge with 14 rebounds; the reigning MAAC Defensive Player of the Year is living up to those accolades with four blocks and three steals through two games.

### Right Where He Left Off

- Junior KC Ndefo picked up right where he left off at the end of last season in a rock-solid opening performance against St. John's.
- Ndefo led all scorers with 16 points on 7-of-9 shooting; he hauled down seven boards and had three steals and three blocks to round out his impressive opening night in 32 minutes of work.

### Welcome Aboard

- Three players made their Saint Peter's debuts on Wednesday night.
- True freshman Marty Silvera logged 10 minutes and chipped in five points and two dimes while shooting 2-of-2 (1-for-1 3PT).
- Murray State transfer Noah Kamba saw 14 minutes of work and added two helpers and a rebound, while graduate transfer Tarojae Brake had six points in just eight minutes of action (2-for-2 3PT).

### Pick 'Em

- Saint Peter's was picked to finish in a tie for third according to the 2020-21 MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll.
- Saint Peter's shared the third position with Monmouth, a team that it swept in 2019-20. In fact, the Peacocks owned a 6-1 record against the three schools that were picked ahead/in the same spot, posting 1-1 records against unanimous preseason favorite Siena, a 3-0 mark against second-place Iona and a 2-0 sweep vs. the Hawks.
- Last year, the Peacocks were slotted ninth in the preseason poll and promptly blew by those expectations en route to a second-place finish; they were a game out of first at season's end.

- Saint Peter's is 3-8 over the last 11 years in season openers after dropping Wednesday's affair to St. John's.
- The Peacocks also dropped a 69-44 decision at home against Bryant in the 2019-20 opener; the team went on to win 18 games (14 in conference play) and reached the MAAC Championship Semifinals.
- The Peacocks last won their season opener for the 2018-19 campaign, a 93-86 overtime home win over Lafayette.

### Closing The Books on 2019-20

- Despite the abbreviated ending, Saint Peter's is coming off of a remarkable 2019-20 campaign that saw the Peacocks "arrive" ahead of schedule, at least in terms of the prognostications.
- After being picked to finish in ninth place according to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference's preseason coaches' poll, Saint Peter's put the league on notice by posting a 14-6 mark in conference play and was in contention for the MAAC regular season title up until the last game.
- Ultimately, the program settled for second place -- by a single game -- and posted wins against every other school in the conference for the first time in history.
- The Peacocks won four-of-five end-of-year conference awards, becoming the only school in MAAC history to do so. Head coach Shaheen Holloway was recognized for his masterful performance by claiming Coach of the Year honors; rising junior KC Ndefo earned both Defensive and Sixth Player of the Year accolades, and then-freshman Aaron Estrada was the league's Rookie of the Year.
- Saint Peter's also set records with nine MAAC home wins, and 14 overall conference victories.
- Peacock rookies shined last winter, as a record five freshmen won at least one MAAC Rookie of the Week award, a league record. They combined to win 10 weekly honors, a school

### Awards Aplenty

- Saint Peter's won four out of the five MAAC end-of-year awards, becoming the first school in league history to do so.
- Head coach Shaheen Holloway became the third head coach from Saint Peter's to win the conference's top coach award and first since 1991 --- Bob Dukiet (1982) and Ted Fiore (1987, 1989, and 1991).
- Sophomore KC Ndefo became the first Peacock to win Sixth Player of the Year, the second to claim Defensive Player of the Year, and just the third player in MAAC history to win two awards in the same year.
- Freshman guard Aaron Estrada claimed MAAC Rookie of the Year accolades, becoming the fifth rookie from Saint Peter's to win the honor --- Harun Ramey (1992), Ricky Bellinger (1997), Keydren Clark (2003), and Shane Nichols (2004).

### A Historic Haul

- The Peacocks placed a league-high four individuals across five spots on All-MAAC teams at the conclusion of the 2019-20 regular season, two more than the next closest MAAC schools (Rider & Siena).
- In doing so, Saint Peter's became the first conference squad in league history to place three freshmen on the All-Rookie Team, and the three are the first trio of teammates to make the same all-conference team in a decade, last being done by the 2009-10 Siena squad which placed three teammates on the first team.
- The five all-conference honors were a Saint Peter's single-season record, surpassing the previous program high of three, which was done three times in 2004, 2006, and 2016.

### The Debutants

- Last year, it didn't matter what your class year was; if you were wearing a Saint Peter's uniform, you were likely contributing in some way, shape or form.
- That philosophy saw an unprecedented amount of newcomers log key minutes for the Peacocks over the course of the season, and they delivered time and time again.
- Need proof? Look no further than the league-record five separate Rookie of the Week accolades garnered by a Saint Peter's player.
- Altogether, the Peacocks won 10 overall weekly accolades to lead all MAAC schools, toppling a previous record from 2003-04.

notion was a fact in 2019-20.

- Saint Peter's finished the 2019-20 regular season as winners of eight straight in Jersey City and 11-of-12 overall, finishing the year with an 11-3 home record (9-1 against MAAC foes).
- The nine MAAC home wins were the most ever by the program and the 11 overall home wins were the most in almost 30 years, having last been done by the 1990-91 MAAC Championship squad, one which earned 12 wins in Jersey City that season.

### Take 'Em All Down

- The 2019-20 Saint Peter's team earned a win over every other conference school in the regular season, a first for the program both in the current 11-team MAAC format (2014-15 to present) and 10-team league (1997-98 to 2013-14).
- This was just the third time in the 39 years of the MAAC's existence that Saint Peter's defeated every other conference team at least once, doing it twice previously in 1981-82 and 1983-84, back when the conference was composed of eight teams both years.

### Everybody Eats

- Saint Peter's returns an extremely well-balanced and versatile roster that features seven players who appeared in over 20 games.
- Some may call it unconventional, but for the Peacocks in 2019-20, it worked. That Saint Peter's lineup rotation that featured nearly every player on the roster getting involved on a given night, which -- in turn -- led to one of the most balanced offenses in the league.
- Last year, there were 15 times in which 10 or more players scored in a game. And by season's end, no player averaged double-digit scoring figures, while eight players averaged between 5-9 points per game.
- One of the more poignant examples of that balanced approach was in a Saint Peter's win at Manhattan last February when all 12 players to see action in the win scored at least one point. That was one of two times in 2019-20 in which 12 players recorded at least a point.
- Saint Peter's had 10 different players lead the team in scoring once.

### Defensive Force

- Saint Peter's left its mark in MAAC play last season in a number of ways, but perhaps none more so than on the defensive end.
- Saint Peter's boasted the league's second-best scoring defense, one that yielded only 64.1 points per game.
- The Peacocks also limited opponents to a modest 40.3% shooting from the field, the best defensive shooting percentage in the league.
- From downtown, opponents converted only 32.1% of their shots, the second-worst shooting clip by league constituents.
- The Peacocks also forced 15.1 turnovers per game (3rd/MAAC).

### Above the Rim

- The Peacocks established themselves as one of the best teams on the glass in 2019-20.
- Last year, Saint Peter's led the MAAC and ranked 23rd nationally averaging 12.57 offensive boards.
- Their rebounding margin of +5.4 was also tops in the MAAC and ranked 35th in the country.
- The team hauled down 37.5 rebounds per game overall, good for second in the league.
- Two returning players ranked in the top-ten in the league in offensive rebounding average: junior KC Ndefo (2.0) and

sophomore Hassan Drame (1.8); they both ranked in the top-15 in the league in overall rebounding average.

### Block Party

- Saint Peter's was once again one of the nation's top rejectors by averaging 4.6 blocks per game, a figure that ranked 31st nationally and first in the MAAC.
- When it was all said and done, Saint Peter's returned 138 opposing shots back to their senders.
- A prime reason why rising junior KC Ndefo was named MAAC Defensive Player of the Year was his dominance in the paint, where he led the MAAC and ranked in the top-25 nationally by averaging 2.39 blocks per game.
- Ndefo's 67 blocks were also tops in the MAAC circuit and ranked 25th in the country.

### Garden State Greetings

- The Peacocks will welcome six newcomers to their ranks as the 2020-21 season commences.
- In addition to a duo of true freshmen in Oumar Diahome and Marty Silvera, the program has also added two transfers in sophomore Noah Kamba (Murray State) and graduate transfer Tarojae Brake (Kutztown).

### African Born

- Saint Peter's was one of two teams in the country last year to have four players on its roster that were born in Africa, joining Oklahoma State.
- The same figure holds true in 2020-21, as Fousseyni and Hassan Drame (Mali), Oumar Diahome (Senegal) and KC Ndefo (Nigeria) all hail from Africa.
