ABOUT THIS WEEK'S GAME

Samford will open Southern Conference play by hosting defending league champion and 10th-ranked Chattanooga Saturday at 2:30 p.m. at Seibert Stadium.

Samford enters the game with a record of 2-0. The Bulldogs are coming off a 58-21 win over Florida A&M last week.

Chattanooga is currently 1-1 on the young season. The Mocs defeated Mars Hill by a score of 44-34 last week.

Saturday's game will be televised live on the American Sports Network. The game can also be heard in the Birmingham area on WVSU-FM 91.1, or worldwide on the internet at www.samford.edu/wvsu.

GAME NOTES

** Samford and Chattanooga are meeting for the 41st time, with UTC holding a 27-10-3 advantage in the series.

** In Samford's seven seasons in the SoCon, the Bulldogs are 2-5 against the Mocs.

** Last season, Chattanooga defeated Samford by a score of 38-24 in a game played at UTC's Finley Stadium.

** The first meeting in the series came on Nov. 3, 1906, with Samford (then Howard) defeating Chattanooga (then Grant), 63-0 at West End Park in Birmingham.

** Samford's last win over Chattanooga came on Nov. 16, 2013, with Samford coming away with a 17-14 overtime win. That season, Samford, Chattanooga and Furman shared the Southern Conference title.

SAMFORD AGAINST SOCON TEAMS

Now in its eighth season as a member of the Southern Conference, Samford has a record of 29-26 in league games. Saturday's game is the first SoCon game of the season for Samford.

Against the current members of the Southern Conference, Samford has an all-time record of 52-56-4. The Bulldogs are 10-27-3 all-time against Saturday's opponent, Chattanooga. Since joining the SoCon, Samford is 2-5 against the Mocs.

Samford's overall record against each current SoCon member is: Chattanooga (10-27-3), The Citadel (4-4), Furman (8-9), Mercer (10-10-1), VMI (2-0), Western Carolina (11-1) and Wofford (7-5).

THE LAST TIME OUT

Samford overcame a slow start to take a 58-21 win over Florida A&M Sept. 12, at Seibert Stadium. In the win, Samford rolled up a school-record 752 yards of total offense.

Individually for Samford in the win, Michael Eubank completed 24-of-32 passes for 280 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. Karel Hamilton caught eight passes for 104 yards. Denzel Williams rushed 11 times for 106 yards and a touchdown, while K'rondis Larry had 16 rushes for 98 yards and a score. Defensively for Samford, Justin Cooper intercepted a pass and returned it for a 13-yard touchdown late in the second quarter.

SAMFORD VERSUS TENNESSEE TEAMS

Samford has an all-time record of 83-76-9 against teams from the state of Tennessee, including a mark of 10-27-3 against Saturday's opponent, Chattanooga.

Samford has played the following teams from the Volunteer State: Austin Peay (8-1), Bethel (2-0), Carson-Newman (6-11), Chattanooga (10-27-3), Cumberland (1-0), ETSU (3-0), Knoxville College (1-0), Maryville (6-3-1), Memphis Navy (2-4), Morgan School (1-0-1), Sewanee (8-7-2), Tennessee (0-2), UT-Martin (15-3-1), Tennessee State (2-3), Tennessee Tech (12-10), Tennessee Wesleyan (1-2), Union (5-1-1) and Vanderbilt (0-2).

SAMFORD AT SEIBERT STADIUM

Samford has an all-time record of 152-77-4 in games played at Seibert Stadium. This season, Samford has six home games on its schedule, and the Bulldogs are currently 2-0 in those contests.

Last season, Samford posted a record of 5-1 in home games. In the last four-plus years, Samford has a combined record of 19-5 when playing in the friendly confines of Seibert Stadium.

ON THIS DATE

Samford has an all-time record of 7-2 in games played on September 19, 3-1 since reinstating football in 1984. The Bulldogs last played on the date in 2009, earning a 31-12 win over Miles College. Below is a list of every Samford game played on September 19 since 1984.

SCORING POINTS

Samford has scored in its last 158-consecutive games. The last time Samford was shut out in a football game was on Nov. 9, 2000, a 29-0 loss at Tennessee Tech.

SAMFORD IN OVERTIME GAMES

Since overtime was added to college football in 1996, Samford has a record of 6-2 in overtime games. Samford has had an overtime game in two of the last three seasons, defeating Wofford in double overtime by a score of 24-17 in 2012, and defeating Chattanooga, 17-14 in overtime in 2013. Prior to the win over Wofford in 2012, Samford's last overtime game came in 2004.

AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS

Through the first two weeks of the season, Samford ranks second nationally in total offense (644.0 ypg.), passing offense (399.5 ypg.) and first downs (59). The Bulldogs also rank third in the nation in scoring offense (51.5 ppg.).

OFFENSE POSTS SCHOOL-RECORD TOTAL

In last week's 58-21 win over Florida A&M, Samford rolled up a school-record 752 yards of total offense. The total eclipses the previous record of 698 set by the 1987 team against Maryville.

SPREADING THINGS AROUND

Through the first two games of the season, Samford quarterbacks have completed passes to 15 different receivers. Junior Karel Hamilton has the most catches with 15 receptions for 183 yards and a touchdown. Freshman Kelvin McKnight has seven catches for 164 yards and a score.

QUICK STRIKES

In its first two games, Samford has had 10 scoring drives that have lasted less than two minutes. In the season-opening win over Central Arkansas, Samford had six scoring drives that took less than two minutes. The times of those drives were: 0:38, 1:24, 0:39, 0:40, 0:47 and 1:45. In last week's win over FAMU, the four under two minute scoring drives lasted: 1:58, 1:25, 0:45 and 0:20.

WEEKLY SOCON HONORS

Samford has already had two players earn SoCon Player of the Week honors. Senior quarterback Michael Eubank was named Offensive Player of the Week following the Central Arkansas game, when he threw for a career-high 372 yards and a career-high four touchdowns. Following the FAMU win last week, senior linebacker Justin Cooper was named Defensive Player of the Week after intercepting a pass and returning it for a touchdown in the second quarter of the win.

SAMFORD IN SEPTEMBER GAMES

Samford has an all-time record of 95-106-6 in games played in the month of September. Last season, Samford was 2-2 in four games in September. This season, Samford has four games scheduled for September, and the Bulldogs are currently 2-0 in those games.

BARNETT NAMED WINNER OF CHARLES WILLIAMS MEMORIAL JERSEY

Senior quarterback Carson Barnett has been named the 11th recipient of the Charles Williams Memorial Jersey. The jersey, the No. 5, is given each year to a senior leader on the Samford team. The jersey honors former Samford player Charles Williams, who died in a car accident on May 23, 2003.

Previous winners of the jersey were Ossie Buchannon (2005), T.C. Myers (2006), Jay McCurty (2007), Rodney Shepherd (2008), Jon Weber (2009), Bryce Smith (2010), Sean Thompson (2011), Ryan Dudchuck (2012), Justin Shade (2013) and Brinson Porter (2014).

SOCON PRESEASON HONORS

Samford had nine players named to the preseason All-SoCon teams when the league released the teams in July. Included in the group was defensive lineman Michael Pierce, who was named the preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

Pierce was joined on the first team by running back Denzel Williams, offensive lineman Gunnar Bromelow, wide receiver Karel Hamilton, linebacker Justin Cooper and defensive back James Bradberry. Samford's second team representatives were Tony Philpot, Alec Hulmes and Jamerson Blount.

SOCON PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

The SoCon released its preseason polls for both the coaches and media in July, and Samford was picked to finish second in the preseason coaches' poll, and the Bulldogs placed third in the media's preseason poll.

Chattanooga was picked as the preseason favorite in both polls. In the coaches' polls, Western Carolina was picked third, while the Catamounts came in second in the media poll.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala.—The Samford football team opened the 2015 season and the Chris Hatcher era with a 45-16 win over the Central Arkansas Bears at Seibert Stadium.

Samford senior quarterback Michael Eubank completed 21-of-37 passes for a career-high 372 yards and a career-high four touchdowns. Eubank completed touchdown throws of 66, 55, 35 and 16 yards in the contest. Freshman wide receiver Kelvin McKnight turned in an impressive performance in his collegiate debut. McKnight caught six passes for 157 yards and a touchdown. Karel Hamilton had seven catches for 79 yards and a touchdown. Vaquan Small caught one pass for a 35-yard score. Denzel Williams rushed 15 times for 91 yards and a touchdown, and he had one receiving touchdown as well. K'rondis Larry had seven rushes for 68 yards and a touchdown.

Central Arkansas struck first when Dominique Thomas scored on a 29-yard run. Jace Denker added the extra point to give the Bears a 7-0 lead with 5:48 to go in the first quarter. Samford answered just two plays later when Eubank hit Hamilton for a 55-yard touchdown. Anthony Pistelli kicked the extra point to knot the score at 7-7 with 5:03 left in the opening quarter.

The Bulldogs took the lead early in the second quarter. Eubank hit Small for a 35-yard touchdown with 10:56 left before halftime. Pistelli's extra point gave Samford a 14-7 lead. Samford added to its lead when Williams scored on a 49-yard run with 9:09 to go in the second quarter. Pistelli added the PAT to push the Bulldogs' lead to 21-7. Central Arkansas came back with a 26-yard field goal by Denker to cut the Samford lead to 21-10 with 6:24 left in the second quarter.

Eubank hit McKnight for a 66-yard touchdown with 1:18 left in the second quarter, and Pistelli's PAT stretched Samford's lead to 28-10. Central Arkansas' Matt Cummins nailed a 50-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter to end the first half with Samford holding a 28-13 advantage.

The first points in the second half came with a 21-yard field goal by Pistelli to make the score 31-13 with 4:55 to go in the third quarter. With 13:33 to go in the fourth quarter UCA's Denker kicked a 34-yard field goal to cut the Samford lead to 31-16.

Samford's Larry added to the Bulldogs' lead with a 54-yard touchdown run with 12:41 left in the fourth quarter. Pistelli added the extra point to make the score 38-16. Samford stretched its lead to 45-16 when Eubank hit Williams for a 16-yard touchdown, and Pistelli added the PAT with 9:13 to go in the game.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala.—The Samford football team rolled up a school-record 752 yards of total offense on its way to a 58-21 win over Florida A&M at Seibert Stadium.

The 752 yards eclipses the previous record of 698 gained by the 1987 team against Maryville. Individually, Michael Eubank completed 24-of-32 passes for 280 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. Karel Hamilton caught eight passes for 104 yards. Denzel Williams rushed 11 times for 106 yards and a touchdown, while K'rondis Larry had 16 rushes for 98 yards and a score.

Samford jumped on top first, scoring on the opening drive of the game. Anthony Pistelli kicked a 25-yard field goal with 12:01 to go in the first quarter to give Samford an early 3-0 lead. On Samford's second possession of the game, FAMU's Akil Blount picked off a Eubank pass and returned it 65 yards for a touchdown. The score gave the Rattlers a 7-3 lead with 9:42 left in the first quarter.

Samford took the lead back on the ensuing possession. Eubank hit Gavin Sinclair for a 12-yard touchdown in the corner of the end zone to give the Bulldogs a 10-7 lead with 6:32 left in the first quarter. FAMU's Gerald Hearn scored on a one-yard run with 48 seconds to go in the first quarter to give the Rattlers a 14-10 lead over the Bulldogs.

Samford took the lead back for good on its first drive of the second quarter. Eubank hit Tony Philpot for an eight-yard touchdown, giving the Bulldogs a 17-14 lead with 13:23 to go in the second quarter. The Bulldogs added to their lead when Larry scored on a 10-yard run with 6:01 left before halftime. The score gave Samford a 24-14 lead over FAMU. Eubank then scored on a six-yard run to make the score 31-14 with 3:16 left in the second quarter. Justin Cooper then picked off a FAMU pass and returned it 13 yards for a touchdown to push the lead to 38-14. Pistelli ended the half with a 27-yard field goal with two seconds remaining to send Samford to halftime with a 41-14 advantage.

Williams scored on a 29-yard run to make the score 48-14 with 9:52 left in the third quarter. Pistelli kicked a 37-yard field goal with 6:00 to go in the third quarter to push the Samford lead to 51-14. FAMU's Devin Bowers scored on a 73-yard run with 7:20 left in the fourth quarter to cut the Samford lead to 51-21. Samford backup quarterback Devlin Hodges put the final points on the scoreboard, scoring on a 13-yard run with 59 seconds to go to make the final score 58-21.

CHRIS HATCHER HEAD COACH

Chris Hatcher was named Samford's 36th head football coach on Dec. 11, 2014.

Now in his first season at Samford, Hatcher boasts a career record of 122-57 in 15-plus years as a college head coach, having previously coached at Murray State, Georgia Southern and Valdosta State.

Hatcher comes to Samford after serving as the head coach at Murray State University since 2010. In five seasons as the head coach of the Racers, Hatcher's teams employed the high-powered "Hatch Attack" offense to top the Division I-FCS football charts. In 2014, the Racers ranked second in the nation in passing offense, averaging 327.2 yards per game. The team also ranked 15th in total offense at 468.3 yards per contest.

MSU used a balanced attack in 2013. The Racers rushed the ball 424 times, while throwing it 458, in averaging 398.6 yards of offense. The offense was spearheaded by All-America wide receiver Walter Powell, who hauled in 66 passes for 837 yards and 13 touchdowns in just 10 games.

The 2012 Murray State offense led the Ohio Valley Conference for the third-straight season. MSU averaged a school-record 484.4 yards of offense per game, while also setting a new single-season record by averaging 348.9 yards through the air.

The 2011 season saw the Racers go 7-4 and post back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since the 1999-2000 seasons. MSU closed the season winning five of its final six games, including going on the road and knocking off nationally-ranked Tennessee Tech.

The Racer offense was among the most prolific in the nation as MSU ranked third in scoring offense, fourth in total offense and seventh in passing offense. The 5,070 yards of total offense marked just the fifth time in school history MSU amassed over 5,000 yards, while the 460.9 yards per game were the third-most all time. The Racers also rushed for 152.27 yards per game.

The defense was not to be outdone as the Racers recorded their first shutout in seven years with a 39-0 victory over Mississippi Valley State. It also marked the first shutout on the road since 1986, and the first non-conference road shutout since the 1979 season.

In 2010, the Racer offense led the OVC in passing offense, total offense and scoring offense, while ranking fourth nationally in passing offense, fifth in total offense and fifth in scoring offense.

Hatcher is no stranger to the Southern Conference, as he served as the head coach at Georgia Southern from 2007 to 2009.

In his first season with the Eagles in 2007, Hatcher led GSU to the second-best regular season turnaround in program history, a plus-4 improvement from 2006. The Eagles ranked among the national leaders in various categories on offense, defense and special teams. He also coached five All-America players, including quarterback Jayson Foster, the second Walter Payton Award winner at GSU.

The Eagles returned to the national rankings after a 14-week hiatus as the Hatcher era got off to a 4-1 start. GSU climbed as high as No. 11, after the Eagles recorded three-straight victories at No. 5 Appalachian State, ending the Mountaineers 30-game home winning streak, at home against No. 25 The Citadel and at No. 10 Wofford.

The prolific offense ranked first in rushing, eighth in total offense, eighth in scoring offense and 23rd in sacks allowed. The defense was 14th in turnover margin and 17th in fumbles recovered, while the special teams ranked 25th in net punting.

The 2008 season saw Hatcher guide the Eagles to the program's 25th winning season in 27 years.

In late October, the Eagles set an NCAA record for the largest fourth-quarter comeback as GSU erased a 31-3 deficit for a thrilling 38-31 overtime victory at Western Carolina. The OT contest was just the first of an NCAA record four overtime games played by the Eagles in 2008.

Hatcher's team provided impressive numbers in all three phases. The offense ranked 20th nationally in passing and scoring, while the defense ranked 26th in sacks and 22nd in tackles-for-loss. The special teams units finished 14th in punt returns and 36th in kickoff returns.

All of this was done as Hatcher and his staff were forced to play close to 30 freshmen on a consistent basis throughout the season. In all, five Eagles received All-SoCon honors and seven freshmen representing offense, defense and special teams were named to the inaugural SoCon All-Freshman Team.

Prior to his time at GSU, Hatcher molded Valdosta State into one of the most dominant teams in Division II.

The winningest coach in Blazers' history, Hatcher was 76-12 at his alma mater. In his first year back at VSU, Hatcher took a 4-7 squad the previous year and produced a 10-2 overall record (8-1 in GSC action) and a berth in the Division II playoffs. He coached quarterback Dusty Bonner, who was a two-time winner of the Harlon Hill Trophy as the NCAA Division II Player of the Year, an award Hatcher won himself in 1994.

His 2001 and 2002 teams posted back-to-back undefeated records during the regular season, part of a Gulf South Conference record 35 straight victories during the regular season.

During the 2004 championship season, the Blazers lost their season-opener before rattling off 13 consecutive victories, capped by a 36-31 victory over Pittsburg State in the title game. Hatcher was named National Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association and was the offensive coordinator for the East Squad at the Hula Bowl.

In 2005, Valdosta opened the season ranked No. 1 for four-straight weeks and saw the season culminate with a sixth-straight NCAA post-season appearance. Despite an 8-2 record in 2006, the 10th-ranked Blazers did not receive an invitation to the playoffs, marking the first time that occurred in the Hatcher era.

The 2006 team finished sixth nationally in passing offense (283 yards per game), 12th in scoring offense (34.9 ppg.) and 19th in total offense (389.9 ypg.). In addition to the offensive success, the 2006 defense ranked 27th nationally in scoring defense (15.7 ppg.) while the special teams ranked third in punt returns (17.3 ypr.) and blocked seven kicks.

The Macon, Ga., native spent one year as quarterbacks/tight ends coach at the University of Central Florida where he worked with future NFL quarterback Daunte Culpepper. He then spent three years working with the quarterbacks at the University of Kentucky where he worked under former VSU head coach Hal Mumme. During his time with the Wildcats, he coached the No. 1 NFL draft pick, All-America quarterback Tim Couch.

While at UK, Hatcher and the Wildcats played in the 1999 Outback Bowl, the program's first New Year's Day Bowl in 47 years, then followed that the following year with a berth in the '99 Music City Bowl. It marked the first time the Wildcats had consecutive bowl appearances in 15 years.

Hatcher carried his success on the playing field to help him develop into one of the nation's winningest coaches. A two-time All-American quarterback at VSU (1993 and 1994), Hatcher threw for 11,363 yards and 121 touchdowns during his stellar career. During his senior year in 1994, he led the Blazers to their first postseason berth, advancing to the quarterfinals, and when it was all said and done set 29 VSU passing and total offense records.

Among the national records he once set were a 68.5 career completion percentage and a streak of 20-straight completions in a game against New Haven. Hatcher held 14 Valdosta State, 13 Gulf South Conference and 17 Division II national records. He also started 41 consecutive games, posting a 29-10-2 record.

Not only did Hatcher excel on the field, he was just as successful in the classroom. Twice he received the Gulf South Conference's Commissioner's Trophy which is awarded to the league's Most Outstanding Student-Athlete. He finished his senior year by winning several national honors including: the NCAA Top Eight Award, the CoSIDA Academic All-America National Player of the Year and a postgraduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

At the time when Hatcher won the Harlon Hill Trophy, he won by the second-largest voting margin in the then-19-year history of the award. Hatcher was also voted to the GSC Football team of the 1990s.

The honors continued to add up even after his playing days. Hatcher was named to the Valdosta State University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001, in his first year of eligibility. He was also elected into the Macon Sports Hall of Fame the same year.




