SAMFORD TO OPEN 2016 SEASON THURSDAY

The Samford football team will play its season opener for the 2016 season by taking on Mars Hill Thursday evening at 6 p.m. at Seibert Stadium.

Samford is coming off a season in which the Bulldogs posted a record of 6-5 overall and 3-4 in Southern Conference play. Samford returns eight starters on offense and seven starters on defense from last year's squad.

Mars Hill posted a record of 6-5 overall and 5-2 in the South Atlantic Conference in 2015. The Lions return eight starters on offense and seven starters on defense as well.

THE SERIES

The Samford Bulldogs and Mars Hill are meeting for the fourth time, with Samford winning each of the three previous meetings.

The teams first met on November 3, 1973, with Samford earning a 45-27 win at Seibert Stadium. The second meeting in the series came on October 29, 1988, and Samford came away with a 30-13 victory, also at Seibert Stadium. The most recent meeting came on Oct. 31, 1998, a 20-2 Samford in at home.

SAMFORD AT SEIBERT STADIUM

Samford has an all-time record of 153-80-4 in games played at Seibert Stadium. This season, Samford has five home games on its schedule, with Thursday night's game marking the first of those contests.

Last season, Samford posted a record of 3-3 in home games. In the last five years, Samford has a combined record of 20-8 when playing in the friendly confines of Seibert Stadium.

SAMFORD IN SEASON OPENERS

Samford has an all-time record of 44-51-4 in season-opening games. Last season, the Bulldogs earned a 45-16 win over Central Arkansas in the season opener for both teams.

Entering this season, Samford has won two of its last three season openers. Over the last 10 seasons, Samford is 6-4 in season openers. The Bulldogs are 5-1 over that stretch in season openers played at home.

SAMFORD AGAINST SAC TEAMS

Samford has an all-time record of 14-13-1 against the current members of the South Atlantic Conference, including a 3-0 record against Thursday night's opponent, Mars Hill.

Samfod has played the following SAC teams: Carson-Newman (6-11), Catawba (1-0), Mars Hill (3-0), Newberry (3-1-1) and Wingate (1-1).

THE LAST TIME OUT

Samford wrapped up the 2015 season with an impressive 47-21 road Southern Conference win at Mercer University.

In the win, quarterback Devlin Hodges completed 30-of-44 passes for 392 yards and a touchdown. Emmanuel Obajimi caught eight passes for 157 yards and a 94-yard touchdown, setting a Samford record for longest touchdown reception. Karel Hamilton had eight catches for 101 yards in the win. K'rondis Larry rushed four times for 102 yards, including a school-record 94-yard touchdown.

Defensively in the game for Samford, linebacker Justin Cooper led the way with 15 tackles, while Tonne Osaigbovo added nine tackles. James Bradberry had an interception and three pass break-ups.

SAMFORD VERSUS NORTH CAROLINA TEAMS

Samford has an all-time record of 33-20 against teams from the state of North Carolina, including a 3-0 record against this week's opponent, Mars Hill.

Samford has played the following North Carolina schools: Appalachian State (2-6), Catawba (1-0), East Carolina (0-2), Elon (5-7), Fayetteville State (1-0), Gardner-Webb (6-2), Guilford College (3-0), Mars Hill (3-0), Western Carolina (11-2) and Wingate (1-1).

WHAT'S RETURNING

Samford returns eight starters on offense and seven starters on defense from last year's team that posted a record of 6-5 overall and 3-4 in SoCon play.

Among the returning starters on offense are the team's leading passer (Devlin Hodges) and receiver (Karel Hamilton).

ON THIS DATE

Samford has an all-time record of 2-1-1 in games played on September 1. The Bulldogs last played on the date in 2012, defeating Furman, 24-21 on a last-second field goal. Below is a list of every Samford game played on September 1.

SCORING POINTS

Samford has scored in its last 167-consecutive games. The last time Samford was shut out in a football game was on Nov. 9, 2000, a 29-0 loss at Tennessee Tech.

SAMFORD IN OVERTIME GAMES

Since overtime was added to college football in 1996, Samford has a record of 6-2 in overtime games. Samford has had an overtime game in two of the last four seasons, defeating Wofford in double overtime by a score of 24-17 in 2012, and defeating Chattanooga, 17-14 in overtime in 2013. Prior to the win over Wofford in 2012, Samford's last overtime game came in 2004.

HODGES RETURNS AS STARTING QUARTERBACK

Redshirt sophomore Devlin Hodges returns as the Bulldogs' starting quarterback after taking over as the team's top signal-caller midway through the 2015 season.

Last season, Hodges played in nine games, starting five contests. He completed 200-of-288 passes for 2,230 yards and 12 touchdowns. Hodges threw for at least 300 yards in three of the five games he started.

In addition to his passing accomplishments, Hodges also rushed 74 times for 327 yards and two touchdowns.

MCKNIGHT LOOKS TO CONTINUE SUCCESS OF ROOKIE YEAR

Sophomore wide receiver Kelvin McKnight made an immediate impact on the Samford football team as a freshman in 2015. He caught 57 passes for 616 yards and two touchdowns.

McKnight also returned 15 punts for an average of 12.6 yards per return. He returned one for a 77-yard touchdown at Mercer.

At the conclusion of the season, McKnight was named the SoCon's Freshman of the Year.

OBAJIMI LOOKS TO BUILD ON BREAKOUT YEAR

Senior wide receiver Emmanuel Obajimi is coming off a break-out year in 2015. Last season, Obajimi caught 54 passes for 826 yards and a team-high seven touchdowns. He set a school record in the team's win at Mercer with a 94-yard touchdown reception.

HAMILTON CHASING CAREER RECEIVING YARDS RECORD

Senior wide receiver Karel Hamilton needs 640 receiving yards this season to tie the school record in the category. Efrem Hill currently holds the record with 3,054 yards in his career from 2001 to 2004. Hamilton enters this season with 2,414 receiving yards in his three seasons in a Samford uniform.

PRESEASON NATIONAL HONORS

Samford seniors Armando Bonheur and Jamerson Blount were both named preseason All-American by both STATS and College Sports Madness. In addition, College Sports Madness also named freshman TaDarryl Marshall as its preseason Freshman of the Year.

BIG PLAY POTENTIAL

Samford hopes to continue the trend of big plays coming often that the 2015 squad established. Through the 11 games of last season, the Samford offense produced 30 plays of 30 yards or more. Of those 30 plays, 17 went for touchdowns.

QUICK STRIKES

Samford's offense is built on running quickly. In fact last season, the Bulldogs produced 28 scoring drives that lasted less than two minutes, and 16 that lasted less than a minute. RETURNING TO HIS ROOTS

Entering the 2016 season, Samford head coach Chris Hatcher has decided to go back to coaching the quarterbacks and calling offensive plays. Hatcher and offensive coordinator Russ Callaway will share the play-calling duties this season.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

Head Coach Chris Hatcher welcomed a few new additions to his staff this season. Derrick Foster has been hired to coach the team's running backs. Mike Krysl will coach the special teams and offensive tackles. Taylor Edwards has been hired as the team's director of player personnel. Also, Russ Callaway was promoted to offensive coordinator, and Ricky Turner has been hired as director of football operations.

SCHMITT NAMED WINNER OF CHARLES WILLIAMS MEMO-RIAL JERSEY

Senior tight end Devon Schmitt has been named the 12th recipient of the Charles Williams Memorial Jersey. The jersey, the No. 5, is given each year to a senior leader on the Samford team. The jersey honors former Samford player Charles Williams, who died in a car accident on May 23, 2003.

Previous winners of the jersey were Ossie Buchannon (2005), T.C. Myers (2006), Jay McCurty (2007), Rodney Shepherd (2008), Jon Weber (2009), Bryce Smith (2010), Sean Thompson (2011), Ryan Dudchock (2012), Justin Shade (2013), Brinson Porter (2014) and Carson Barnett (2015).

SOCON PRESEASON HONORS

Samford had eight players named to the preseason All-SoCon teams when the league released the teams in July. Included in the group were four players on the first team and four more on the second team.

The team's first-team honorees were Armando Bonheur (OL), Karel Hamilton (WR), Ahmad Gooden (DL) and Jamerson Blount (DB). Samford's representatives on the second team were Devlin Hodges (QB), Kelvin McKnight (WR), Xavier Forrest (DL) and Austin Barnard (P).

SOCON PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

The SoCon released its preseason polls for both the coaches and media in July, and Samford was picked to finish third in the preseason coaches' poll, and the Bulldogs placed fifth in the media's preseason poll. Samford received one first-place vote in the coaches' poll.

Chattanooga was picked as the preseason favorite in both polls. The Citadel, which shared the conference title with Chattanooga in 2015, was picked second in both polls.

CHRIS HATCHER HEAD COACH

Thris Hatcher was named Samford's 36th head football coach on Dec. 11, 2014.

Now entering his second season at Samford, Hatcher boasts a career record of 127-62 in 16 years as a college head coach, having previously coached at Murray State, Georgia Southern and Valdosta State.

In his first season at Samford in 2015, Hatcher put his stamp on the Bulldog program. Samford finished the season third in the nation in passing offense (332.9 ypg.), seventh in the nation in total offense (479.7 ypg.) and seventh in fourth down conversions (66.7%). Hatcher's special teams also stood out, ranking fifth nationally in kickoff return average (24.34 ypr.).

Hatcher led the Bulldogs to a 6-5 record, ending the season with a pair of impressive Southern Conference road wins at Wofford and Mercer. The 6-5 record marks Samford's fifth-straight winning season, tying for the longest streak in program history. The 2015 team also produced a pair of All-Americans in cornerback James Bradberry and place-kicker Anthony Pistelli.

Hatcher came to Samford after serving as the head coach at Murray State University from 2010 to 2014. In five seasons as the head coach of the Racers, Hatcher's teams employed the high-powered "Hatch Attack" offense to top the Division I-FCS football charts. In 2014, the Racers ranked second in the nation in passing offense, averaging 327.2 yards per game. The team also ranked 15th in total offense at 468.3 yards per contest.

MSU used a balanced attack in 2013. The Racers rushed the ball 424 times, while throwing it 458, in averaging 398.6 yards of offense. The offense was spearheaded by All-America wide receiver Walter Powell, who hauled in 66 passes for 837 yards and 13 touchdowns in just 10 games.

The 2012 Murray State offense led the Ohio Valley Conference for the third-straight season. MSU averaged a school-record 484.4 yards of offense per game, while also setting a new single-season record by averaging 348.9 yards through the air.

The 2011 season saw the Racers go 7-4 and post back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since the 1999-2000 seasons. MSU closed the season winning five of its final six games, including going on the road and knocking off nationally-ranked Tennessee Tech.

The Racer offense was among the most prolific in the nation as MSU ranked third in scoring offense, fourth in total offense and seventh in passing offense. The 5,070 yards of total offense marked just the fifth time in school history MSU amassed over 5,000 yards, while the 460.9 yards per game were the third-most all time. The Racers also rushed for 152.27 yards per game.

The defense was not to be outdone as the Racers recorded their first shutout in seven years with a 39-0 victory over Mississippi Valley State. It also marked the first shutout on the road since 1986, and the first non-conference road shutout since the 1979 season.

In 2010, the Racer offense led the OVC in passing offense, total offense and scoring offense, while ranking fourth nationally in passing offense, fifth in total offense and fifth in scoring offense.

Hatcher is no stranger to the Southern Conference, as he served as the head coach at Georgia Southern from 2007 to 2009.

In his first season with the Eagles in 2007, Hatcher led GSU to the second-best regular season turnaround in program history, a plus-4 improvement from 2006. The Eagles ranked among the national leaders in various categories on offense, defense and special teams. He also coached five All-America players, including quarterback Jayson Foster, the second Walter Payton Award winner at GSU.

The Eagles returned to the national rankings after a 14-week hiatus as the Hatcher era got off to a 4-1 start. GSU climbed as high as No. 11, after the Eagles recorded three-straight victories at No. 5 Appalachian State, ending the Mountaineers 30-game home winning streak, at home against No. 25 The Citadel and at No. 10 Wofford.

The prolific offense ranked first in rushing, eighth in total offense, eighth in scoring offense and 23rd in sacks allowed. The defense was 14th in turnover margin and 17th in fumbles recovered, while the special teams ranked 25th in net punting.

The 2008 season saw Hatcher guide the Eagles to the program's 25th winning season in 27 years.

In late October, the Eagles set an NCAA record for the largest fourth-quarter comeback as GSU erased a 31-3 deficit for a thrilling 38-31 overtime victory at Western Carolina. The OT contest was just the first of an NCAA record four overtime games played by the Eagles in 2008.

Hatcher's team provided impressive numbers in all three phases. The offense ranked 20th nationally in passing and scoring, while the defense ranked 26th in sacks and 22nd in tackles-for-loss. The special teams units finished 14th in punt returns and 36th in kickoff returns.

All of this was done as Hatcher and his staff were forced to play close to 30 freshmen on a consistent basis throughout the season. In all, five Eagles received All-SoCon honors and seven freshmen representing offense, defense and special teams were named to the inaugural SoCon All-Freshman Team.

Prior to his time at GSU. Hatcher molded Valdosta State into one of the most dominant teams in Division II.

The winningest coach in Blazers' history, Hatcher was 76-12 at his alma mater. In his first year back at VSU, Hatcher took a 4-7 squad the previous year and produced a 10-2 overall record (8-1 in GSC action) and a berth in the Division II playoffs. He coached quarterback Dusty Bonner, who was a two-time winner of the Harlon Hill Trophy as the NCAA Division II Player of the Year, an award Hatcher won himself in 1994.

His 2001 and 2002 teams posted back-to-back undefeated records during the regular season, part of a Gulf South Conference record 35 straight victories during the regular season.

During the 2004 championship season, the Blazers lost their season-opener before rattling off 13 consecutive victories, capped by a 36-31 victory over Pittsburg State in the title game. Hatcher was named National Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association and was the offensive coordinator for the East squad at the Hula Bowl.

In 2005, Valdosta opened the season ranked No. 1 for four-straight weeks and saw the season culminate with a sixth-straight NCAA postseason appearance. Despite an 8-2 record in 2006, the 10th-ranked Blazers did not receive an invitation to the playoffs, marking the first time that occurred in the Hatcher era.

The 2006 team finished sixth nationally in passing offense (283 yards per game), 12th in scoring offense (34.9 ppg.) and 19th in total offense (389.9 ypg.). In addition to the offensive success, the 2006 defense ranked 27th nationally in scoring defense (15.7 ppg.) while the special teams ranked third in punt returns (17.3 ypr.) and blocked seven kicks.

The Macon, Ga., native spent one year as quarterbacks/tight ends coach at the University of Central Florida where he worked with future NFL quarterback Daunte Culpepper. He then spent three years working with the quarterbacks at the University of Kentucky where he worked under former VSU head coach Hal Mumme. During his time with the Wildcats, he coached the No. 1 NFL draft pick, All-America quarterback Tim Couch.

While at UK, Hatcher and the Wildcats played in the 1999 Outback Bowl, the program's first New Year's Day Bowl in 47 years, then followed that the following year with a

berth in the '99 Music City Bowl. It marked the first time the Wildcats had consecutive bowl appearances in 15 years.

Hatcher carried his success on the playing field to help him develop into one of the nation's winningest coaches. A two-time All-American quarterback at VSU (1993 and 1994), Hatcher threw for 11,363 yards and 121 touchdowns during his stellar career. During his senior year in 1994, he led the Blazers to their first postseason berth, advancing to the quarterfinals, and when it was all said and done set 29 VSU passing and total offense records.

Among the national records he once set were a 68.5 career completion percentage and a streak of 20-straight completions in a game against New Haven. Hatcher held 14 Valdosta State, 13 Gulf South Conference and 17 Division II national records. He also started 41 consecutive games, posting a 29-10-2 record.

Not only did Hatcher excel on the field, he was just as successful in the classroom. Twice he received the Gulf South Conference's Commissioner's Trophy which is awarded to the league's Most Outstanding Student-Athlete. He finished his senior year by winning several national honors including: the NCAA Top Eight Award, the CoSIDA Academic All-America National Player of the Year and a postgraduate scholarship from the National Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

At the time when Harcher won the Harlon Hill Trophy, he won by the second-largest voting margin in the then-19-year history of the award. Hatcher was also voted to the GSC Football team of the 1990s.

The honors continued to add up even after his playing days. Hatcher was named to the Valdosta State University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001, in his first year of eligibility. He was also elected into the Macon Sports Hall of Fame the same year.

In 2005, Hatcher was inducted into the Division II Hall of Fame. Hatcher was also inducted into the inaugural class of the GSC Hall of Fame in 2014.

Hatcher graduated from Valdosta State in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education.

He and his wife, Lori, also a graduate of VSU, are the parents of a son, Ty, and daughter, Talley.
