SPRING HAS SPRUNG

This spring, Rutgers will move its annual Scarlet-White game to Friday night, a change from traditionally playing on Saturday afternoon. This marks the first time since 2003 that the Scarlet Knights will host their intra-squad scrimmage on a Friday night. The game, which will be followed by a fireworks show and an on-field autograph session, will serve as the kickoff to Alumni Weekend, with Rutgers Day activities set for Saturday.

ALL-BIG HONOREES

The Scarlet Knights return three players that received recognition from the Big Ten Conference as they were tabbed for the 2014 All- Big Ten Teams as voted on by the league's head coaches along with conference media members.

The media All-Big Ten Team featured wide receiver Leonte Carroo as he earned All-Big Ten First Team honors while defensive tackle Darius Hamilton and defensive end Kemoko Turay were selected honorable mention all-conference by the league's media members

Carroo was named honorable mention All-Big Ten by the league's head coaches. He finished the season ranked 23rd nationally and second in the Big Ten in receiving yards (1,086) and 19th nationally and third in the conference in receiving touchdowns (10), tying the Rutgers single-season record.

Hamilton has started all 13 games at defensive tackle for Rutgers. He led the defense with 11.5 tackles-for-loss, including a career-best six sacks. Overall, he has 45 tackles from the interior of the defensive line with a career-high-tying eight stops in a win at Maryland.

Turay emerged as a dominant pass rusher in his redshirt freshman season for the Scarlet Knights. He picked up a team-high 7.5 sacks, ranking eighth among Big Ten players. Turay also led the nation with three blocked kicks, including one on a late field goal

attempt by Michigan to prevent a potential go-ahead score.

CARROO LEADS RECEIVING CORPS

Leonte Carroo, one of the surest hands in college football, returns for his senior season. Carroo led the Scarlet Knights in every receiving category, including receptions (55), receiving yards (1,086) and touchdowns (10). His 19.7 yards per catch average also led the nation (minimum 51 receptions). Janarion Grant was second with 25 receptions, while Andrew Turzilli, who departs RU after his graduate season, was second with 347 receiving yards and four touchdowns.

Andre Patton and John Tsimis also turned in solid campaigns in 2014. Patton appeared in nine games, catching 20 passes for 223 yards and three touchdowns. Tsimis saw action in 12 games with 19 receptions for 188 yards and three scores.

COMPETITION IN THE BACKFIELD

Rutgers returns its full compliment of running backs from 2014. Senior tailback Paul James will miss spring practice and looking to handle the ball carrying duties will be three of the team's top running backs from last season. The Scarlet Knights leading rusher Desmon Peoples tallied 447 yards on the ground with three touchdowns, while Quick Lane Bowl MVP Josh Hicks

gained 440 yards on 69 careers with two touchdowns. Also in the mix at running back is Robert Martin who also topped 400 yards (434) for the season with a team-best seven touchdowns.

RU'S NEXT STARTER UNDER CENTER

With the departure of quarterback Gary Nova to graduation, the Scarlet Knights will be in search for their next leader under center. Nova, one of the most decorated signal callers in school history, started all 13 games in 2014 (41 starts in 46 career games), throwing for 2,851 yards and 22 touchdowns. He leaves Rutgers as the career leader in touchdowns (73), second in passing (9,258) and completions (689).

The Scarlet Knights return sophomore quarterback Chris Laviano, who appeared in five games last season, throwing for 107 yards on 11 completions. Fellow sophomore Hayden Rettig, a transfer from LSU, will compete for time under center. Redshirt freshman Giovanni Rescigno will also take snaps this spring.

GRANT POWERS RETURN GAME

Janarion Grant was the Scarlet Knights' top returner in 2014, ranking fourth nationally and leading the Big Ten Conference in combined returns (kickoff/punt) with 955 yards. He was 26th in the country and fourth in the conference in kickoff returns, averaging 25.3 yards per return. Grant posted a pair of 71-yard kickoff returns in wins against Indiana (11/15) and at Maryland (11/29).

RUTGERS KNOWS SPECIAL TEAMS

Rutgers special teams will be under its third coordinator in six seasons, however, the Scarlet Knights have remained consistent during this span. Since 2009, Rutgers has led all schools nationally with 42 blocked kicks/punts. RU has scored 15 touchdowns via special teams from 2009-14.

The Scarlet Knights have blocked at least four kicks every year since 2007. Rutgers led the nation in blocked kicks (six) in 2014 as redshirt freshman defensive end Kemoko Turay was tops in the country with three blocked kicks.

FLOOD BEGINS YEAR FOUR

Rutgers head coach Kyle Flood holds a number of distinctions that no other former Scarlet Knights head coach can boast in the program's 145-year history. The 23 wins in his first three seasons are more than any other Rutgers head coach, while the team's three-straight bowl appearances are a first for a Scarlet Knights mentor. He is also the only coach in RU history to lead a team to a bowl and conference championship in their first season.

ENTERING THE MIX

Rutgers will add four members of its 2015 recruiting class to spring practice. Blessuan Austin (Queens, N.Y.), Jon Bateky (Boyds, Md.), Isaiah Johnson (Oakland, Calif.) and Deonte Roberts (Brooklyn, N.Y.) are enrolled at Rutgers and will compete during the spring. Austin, a 6-1 defensive back, Bateky, a 6-4 defensive lineman and Roberts, a 6-1 linebacker are the true freshmen in the group. Johnson is a 6-2 linebacker who transferred from City College of San Francisco.

2015 RECRUITING CLASS

Rutgers head coach Kyle Flood officially welcomed 25 student-athletes to the football program on National Signing Day. The class added players to all offensive and defensive positions.

B1G FOOTBALL: YEAR TWO

Rutgers enters its second year as a Big Ten member and with that comes several first-time visitors to High Point Solution Stadium this fall. The Scarlet Knights will face Kansas in the first-ever matchup between the two programs, while Ohio State and Nebraska will make its first trip to Piscataway to take on Rutgers.

OFFSEASON COACHING MOVES

Rutgers head football coach Kyle Flood announced the appointment of assistant coach Ben McDaniels as the new offensive coordinator. McDaniels previously served as the wide receivers coach in his first season. Former offensive coordinator Ralph Friedgen will transition to the role of special assistant to the head coach.

Additional coaching updates included Phil Galiano taking over special teams and coaching the tight ends, while Anthony Campanile will transition to wide receivers. Galiano spent 2014 as the director of recruiting operations and Campanile coached the tight ends.

Friedgen directed an RU offense in 2014 that rushed for 340 yards in the Quick Lane Bowl and enabled the biggest comeback in school history in a 41-38 regular season finale win at Maryland. Quarterback Gary Nova led the nation in passing yards per completion (15.25) en route to completing his career with a program-record 73 touchdown passes. Prior to his arrival "On the Banks," Friedgen spent 10 years (2001-10) as head coach at Maryland and had 32 years of assistant coaching experience (including 21 as an offensive coordinator either in college or the NFL). He was the consensus National Coach of the Year in 2001.

McDaniels directed a receiving corps in 2014 that enabled RU to rank sixth nationally in passing yards per completion and saw wide receiver Leonte Carroo catch 10 touchdowns for 1,086 yards. Carroo ranked 19th nationally in receiving scores and 23rd in receiving yards. Prior to Piscataway, McDaniels spent two seasons as an offensive assistant for the Tampa Bay Buccanears, where he assisted with the development of quarterback Mike Glennon, who finished with the top passer rating (82.0) among rookies and was named to the Pro Football Writers of America All-Rookie team.

Galiano, who previously coached defensive line (2011), tight ends (2010) and defensive ends/linebackers (2003-06) at Rutgers, served as director of recruiting operations this past season. After 12 years at the collegiate level, he spent two seasons (2012-13) as an assistant special teams coach with Tampa Bay and helped the Buccaneers lead the NFL in blocked punts. Kicker Connor Barth tied the league lead in made field goals of 40-plus yards and punter Michael Konen led the NFL in touchbacks.



KYLE FLOOD



Kyle Flood is entering his fourth season as the head football coach at Rutgers and 11th overall with the Scarlet Knights. In the 145-year history of Rutgers football, Flood holds the distinction of being the only coach to lead the program to three bowl appearances in his first three seasons at the helm.

Flood led the Scarlet Knights through one of its most defining moments in program history – entrance into the prestigious Big Ten Conference. He currently owns a 23-16 record, the most wins of any RU head coach after three seasons.

Flood guided Rutgers to eight wins in 2014 in the program's first season as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Rutgers won all five of its non-conference games and earned Big Ten victories over Michigan, Indiana and Maryland. Following the season, four players (wide receiver Leonte Carroo, defensive lineman Darius Hamilton, defensive lineman Kemoko Turay, offensive lineman Kaleb Johnson) were named all-conference, with Carroo earning First Team All-Big Ten in the media vote. Defensive end Kemoko Turay also earned FWAA Freshman All-America honors and defensive lineman David Milewski was named Academic All-America.

Flood led Rutgers to a convincing 40-21 win in the Quick Lane Bowl against North Carolina in Detroit, the program's ninth bowl appearance over the last 10 seasons. The Scarlet Knights earned their first-ever Lambert-Meadowlands Trophy, emblematic of the top team in the East in the Bowl Subdivision.

Following the 2013 season, Flood had the second-highest total of victories for any coach after two seasons in school history. Four players garnered all-conference honors under Flood's watch - tight end Tyler Kroft (first team), running back Paul James (first team), center Betim Bujari (second team) and Janarion Grant (second team).

In addition, Kroft earned All-America status from SI.com, becoming the first Rutgers tight end to be named an All-American since Marco Battaglia in 1995. Redshirt freshman middle linebacker Steve Longa earned several Freshmen All-America honors as he ended the season as the first middle linebacker at Rutgers to total over 100 tackles in a season since Gary Brackett in 2002.

Six players from the 2013 squad signed NFL free agent contracts following the 2014 NFL Draft. In all, 20 players have inked NFL contracts in Flood's first two years as head coach at Rutgers.

Flood was named the 29th head coach at the Birthplace of College Football on January 31, 2012. His first year as head coach of the Rutgers football program was as memorable as any first-year coach in Rutgers football history. Flood guided Rutgers to its first BIG EAST Championship, earned BIG EAST Coach of the Year honors and won more games (nine) than any rookie head coach in RU history.

Eight players garnered All-BIG EAST honors as the Scarlet Knights tied a school-record with a 5-2 league record. Khaseem Greene became the second player in league history to be named BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year for two consecutive seasons.

Greene also became the fourth player in school history to be named to the Walter Camp Football Foundation All-America team, joining former RU standouts Ray Rice, Anthony Davis and Battaglia on the prestigious list. Greene and cornerback Logan Ryan both earned various All-America accolades after the 2012 campaign.

Following the championship 2012 season, a school-record seven players were selected in the 2013 NFL Draft. In addition, seven players also signed NFL free agent contracts as a total of 14 players from the 2012 squad joined the professional football ranks.

While being part of a program producing victories at a rate unprecedented in Rutgers' history, Flood has understood the value of academics for the Scarlet Knights. The Rutgers football program was the lone state university to be ranked in the top 10 percent nationally in Academic Progress Rate (APR) for the seventh consecutive year in 2014.

The latest APR figure coincides with the best football team grade point average since 2000. Three players earned a perfect 4.0 GPA during the fall semester while the team grade point average of 2.96 was a record high for the team for the fourth consecutive semester.

Forty-three players finished the 2013 fall semester with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher while 24 student-athletes earned Dean's List honors during the fall semester with at least a 3.5 GPA.

Off the field, Flood has made an impact in community service. He has served the past three years as the honorary coach of the New Jersey Special Olympics, serves on the honorary board of directors for Lauren's First and Goal Foundation and has taken an active role with volunteering with Embrace Kids Foundation.

Flood was one of 17 people honored by the White House among Hurricane Sandy "Champions of Change," earning the nod for Rutgers' relief efforts after the deadly fall storm hit the Northeast region. The Rutgers football program under Flood's leadership has helped raise over \$175,000 for the New Jersey Hurricane Sandy Relief Fund.

The Rutgers football team helped after Hurricane Sandy in several ways, including selecting 22 children affected by Hurricane Sandy to play a flag football game in the final five minutes of the Scarlet-White spring football game, asking game attendees to make a \$5 donation and working to remind everyone that there is still a lot to do before the state fully recovers from Hurricane Sandy.

The Champions of Change program gave the White House a chance to honor groups of people doing great work in their communities.

One constant on any coaching staff with Flood is how successful those teams have fared. In 16 of Flood's 17 seasons as an assistant coach, his teams finished with winning records, including earning a National Championship at Delaware.

A highly respected figure in the coaching profession, Flood has served as the assistant head coach of the program since 2008 and has been a key part in Rutgers' six bowl appearances over his seven-year tenure as an assistant in Piscataway. In addition to his four years as the assistant head coach, Flood has been in charge of the offensive line since coming to RU in 2005.

During his time "On the Banks", the Rutgers offensive line has consistently produced top-level talent, including several of which who have gone on to the National Football League. Most recently, Anthony Davis became the highest player ever drafted in Rutgers history as the 11th overall pick of the 2010 NFL Draft. Davis started every game in his first three seasons with the San Francisco 49ers at right tackle and helped guide the 49ers to the Super Bowl in 2013.

In 2011, Flood helped tutor true freshman right tackle Kaleb Johnson into one of the nation's premier rookie offensive linemen, earning Freshman All-America honors. In addition, offensive guard Art Forst collected All- BIG EAST First Team honors while offensive guard Desmond Wynn was named to the All-BIG EAST Second Team. Wynn was signed as a free agent by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers following the 2012 NFL Draft.

During his time as an assistant coach, Flood has

coached 10 All-BIG EAST First or Second Team selections on the offensive line, one All-American and two Freshman All-America honorees.

Flood has helped engineer some of the most potent offenses in Rutgers history - evident in a record-breaking 2007 season. The Scarlet Knights' offensive line ranked second in the nation with just 10 sacks allowed in addition to an RU offense that became the first in NCAA history to have a 3,000yard passer, 2,000-yard rusher and two 1,000-yard receivers in the same season.

The Rutgers offense was ranked 18th nationally in total offense in 2007. The offensive line featured two of the top tackles in the nation in Pedro Sosa and Jeremy Zuttah. Both players earned All-BIG EAST honors and were also invited to the NFL Scouting Combine in Indianapolis, with Zuttah becoming a third round selection by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Flood added run game coordinator to his duties in 2007 and his offensive line helped pave the way for All-American running back Ray Rice, who rushed for a school and then-BIG EAST record 2,012 yards that season. Rice was selected in the second round of the 2008 NFL Draft by the Baltimore Ravens and went on to consecutive Pro Bowl appearances in 2010 and 2011, and a Super Bowl title in 2012.

In 2006, Flood coached an offensive line that helped Rutgers to one of its most productive seasons, as the group relinguished the fewest sacks in the nation with just eight. His unit was regarded as one of the best in the country and featured Cameron Stephenson and Darnell Stapleton, both who played in the NFL. Flood's corps of hard-nosed blockers helped guide Rice to an All-America season, as he finished second in the nation with 1,794 yards.

Flood came to Rutgers after three seasons at the University of Delaware, where he helped the Blue Hens to a 30-11 record, including a 15-1 mark in 2003 en route to the NCAA FCS National Championship and a share of the Atlantic 10 title in 2004. He also served as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator during his stint.

Prior to his three seasons at Delaware, Flood was offensive line coach at Hofstra from 1997-2001. While at Hofstra, he helped the Pride earn berths in the NCAA FCS playoffs in 1997 and 1999-2001. The Pride were among the top offensive teams in the nation during his tenure, ranking second in total offense, fourth in passing and fifth in scoring in 2001.

Flood, a 1993 graduate of Iona College, was a four-year letterwinner for the Gaels. A high school teammate of former Rutgers All-American tight end Marco Battaglia at St. Francis Prep High School in Queens, N.Y., Flood earned First Team All-Liberty Conference honors in 1991 and served as team captain of the Gaels in 1992. Flood was a 2013 inductee into the Iona College Goal Club Hall of Fame.

Flood's first college coaching position came in 1995-96 as offensive line coach at Long Island University-C.W. Post. While coaching at C.W. Post, he helped the team to the ECAC Division II Eastern title in 1996. Flood began his coaching career at St. Francis Prep in 1993, as both offensive and defensive line coach in 1993-94.

Flood and his wife, Amy, are the proud parents of three children, Kyle, Isabella and Joseph.

Ben McDaniels is in his first season as offensive coordinator and second season overall on the Rutgers coaching staff. McDaniels served as wide receivers coach last sea-

son

In 2014, McDaniels directed a receiving corps that enabled RU to rank sixth nationally in passing yards per completion and saw Leonte Carroo catch a school-record tying 10 touchdowns for 1,086 yards. Carroo ranked 19th nationally in receiving touchdowns and 23rd in receiving yards.

McDaniels spent two seasons as an offensive assistant for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In 2013, he assisted with the development of rookie quarterback Mike Glennon, who finished with the top passer rating (82.0) among rookies and was named to the Pro Football Writers of America All-Rookie team. Glennon set rookie franchise marks for passing yards and touchdowns.

McDaniels served previously on the coaching staff of the Denver Broncos, working as a coaching assistant in 2009 and quarterbacks coach in 2010, before being hired as Columbia University's offensive coordinator in December 2011.

While with the Broncos in 2010, McDaniels helped direct the seventh-ranked pass offense in the National Football League as quarterbacks Kyle Orton and Tim Tebow combined for 4,307 passing yards and 25 touchdowns to just 12 interceptions, while Tebow also added 227 yards rushing and six rushing scores.

McDaniels worked for the University of Minnesota as a graduate assistant under head coach Glen Mason from 2004-05. The Golden Gophers posted a 7-5 record and earned a berth in the Music City Bowl during each of those two seasons, as McDaniels worked with the wide receivers in 2004 and the defensive backs in 2005.

Joe Rossi is in his second season as defensive coordinator after spending previous two seasons as special teams coordinator. Rossi directed one of the nation's top special teams units over his first two seasons "On the Banks."

Rossi coached a defense in 2014 that produced a pair of All-Big Ten honorees in Darius Hamilton and Kemoko Turay. Hamilton led the RU defense with 11.5 tackles-for-loss, including a career-best six sacks. Turay emerged as a dominant pass rusher in his redshirt freshman season for the Scarlet Knights as he picked up a team-high 7.5 sacks, ranking eighth among Big Ten players.

In 2013, Rutgers scored four special teams touchdowns, including two kickoff returns and a punt return touchdown. True freshman Janarion Grant earned All-AAC Second Team honors as a return specialist.

Rossi served as interim defensive coordinator in the 2013 New Era Pinstripe Bowl against No. 25 Notre Dame. He was officially promoted to his current role Jan. 31, 2014.

In 2012, the Scarlet Knights put together a strong special teams unit, ranking first in the nation with eight blocked kicks, ninth in kickoff return yardage defense (18.09) and

34th in kickoff return average (23.21). He also assisted with the fourth-ranked scoring defense (14.2 points per game) in the nation.

Under Rossi's tutelage, kick returner Jeremy Deering ranked third in the BIG EAST and among the national leaders in kickoff returns in 2012. Rossi also oversaw the development of two first-year place-kickers in true freshman Kyle Federico and redshirt freshman Nick Borgese, who combined for 11 made field goals last season. Federico continued his progression as a sophomore in 2013, making eight of his last 10 field goal attempts.

Rossi came to Rutgers after working alongside former RU defensive coordinator Robb Smith at Maine (2007-08). Rossi, who coached at Maine from 2007-11, was promoted to defensive coordinator following Smith's departure to Rutgers after the 2008 season.

Maine annually had one of the top defensive units in the Football Championship Subdivision under Rossi's watch. In 2011, the Black Bears ranked 26th nationally in sacks, 31st in pass defense and 25th in pass efficiency defense.

Phil Galiano is in the third season of his third stint 'On the Banks'. He returns to the sideline to coach special teams and tight ends, following a season serving as the director

of recruiting operations.

Galiano worked as the director of recruiting operations in 2014, helping the Scarlet Knights build depth with the signing of players from every position group on offense and defense. He previously coached the Scarlet Knights defensive line in 2011 and tight ends in 2010. He also tutored the defensive ends and linebackers in his first term from 2003-06.

After 12 years at the collegiate level, Galiano jumped to the NFL in 2012 and helped the Tampa Bay Buccaneers lead the league in blocked punts with three, including linebacker Dekoda Watson tying for the league lead with two, and earning NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for November. Galiano also worked with kicker Connor Barth, who tied for the league lead in made field goals of 40+ yards and punter Michael Koenen, who led the league in touchbacks and touchback percentage on kickoffs.

Prior to returning to Piscataway for the second time, Galiano served as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Florida International for three seasons. While at FIU, Galiano helped the Panthers achieve marked improvements on the defensive side of the ball.

Galiano was a member of the Rutgers staff that saw the Scarlet Knights earn just their second bowl berth in school history and the first-ever victory with a 37-10 win over Kansas State in the Texas Bowl. Galiano's career at RU began as a defensive assistant in 2003 before being elevated to linebackers coach in 2004. He later spent the 2005 and 2006 seasons coaching the defensive ends.

Norries Wilson is in his fourth season as the running backs coach for Rutgers and third as the assistant head coach.

Rutgers saw two true freshmen running back top 400 yards on the season under the guidance of Wilson in 2014. In the Scarlet Knights' Quick Lane Bowl win, Josh Hicks and Robert Martin both reached 100 yards rushing in the game - the first time since 2006 that RU had two players rush for over 100 yards. Hicks rushed for 202 yards on 19 carries en route to being named Quick Lane Bowl MVP.

The Scarlet Knights finished the 2014 season with 2,114 yards rushing, the most since accumulating 2,574 in 2007.

Wilson helped mentor running back Paul James to First Team All-American Athletic Conference status in 2013, as he totaled 881 yards and nine touchdowns on the ground in nine games. James led the nation in rushing early in the season and went on to lead the conference with 97.9 yards per game. Justin Goodwin also broke through under the tutelage of Wilson with 521 yards rushing on the season, including three total touchdowns in a triple-overtime victory at SMU.

In his first season "On the Banks," Wilson played a crucial role in the development of Rutgers' young running backs. Wilson helped sophomore Jawan Jamison have one of the most successful seasons in school history, as the ball carrier became just the seventh player in program history to record 1,000 yards in a season and the third since 1976. He earned Second Team All-Big East honors.

After 16 successful seasons as an assistant coach, Wilson became Columbia's 18th head football coach in 2005. Wilson's student-athletes earned 33 All-Ivy League honors from 2006-12, including two Rookie of the Year awards and 12 first team selections.

In 2009, Wilson led Columbia to a fourth-place finish in the Ivy League, the Lions' best league finish in six years. Columbia also posted its most wins in six years as eight players earned All-Ivy honors.

Wilson, who served as offensive coordinator at UConn for four seasons, was one of five finalists for the Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2004, a season in which the Huskies led the Big East in both total and scoring offense. In 2003, he guided UConn's offense that posted 477.5 yards per game, which ranked eighth in the nation. In 2002, Wilson was promoted to the Huskies' offensive coordinator after joining the UConn staff in 1999 as offensive line coach.

Mitch Browning is in his second season as the offensive line coach at Rutgers. He has 35 years of coaching experience, including stops at six BCS programs and appearanc-

es in 12 previous bowl games (seven in 10 years at Minnesota).

Browning joined the Scarlet Knights prior to the 2013 New Era Pinstripe Bowl. In his first full season with RU in 2014, Browning coached an offensive line that was part of a unit that ranked second in the Big Ten in red zone offense, third in sacks allowed and sixth in passing offense.

Prior to arriving 'On the Banks,' Browning spent 2013 as assistant head coach at Davidson University, coaching the offensive line and tight ends.

Browning spent 10 years as an assistant at Minnesota from 1997-2006, including seven years as the offensive line coach. He came to Minnesota after spending nine years as an assistant coach at Kansas (1988-96). He was part of two Kansas teams that finished in the Top 25.

Browning was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2003, which is presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. In 2003, Browning was co-offensive coordinator at Minnesota as the Golden Gophers set a school and Big Ten record of 6,430 yards of total offense. Minnesota finished the 2003 campaign with 3,789 yards rushing (fourthbest total at the time in Big Ten history) and scored 503 points (sixth-best total at the time in Big Ten history).

In 2005, Minnesota became the first team in Big Ten history to post three consecutive 3,000-yard rushing seasons and the first team in NCAA history to have two 1,000-yard rushers in three consecutive seasons. The Golden Gophers led the Big Ten in rushing offense, total offense and scoring offense, placing second nationally in rushing offense and fifth in total offense.

Anthony Campanile is in his fourth season on the Rutgers coaching staff and third as a full-time assistant coach. Campanile will coach the wide receivers in 2015 after

spending the previous two seasons as tight ends coach and 2012 as a defensive assistant.

In 2013, he helped mentor tight end Tyler Kroft to SI.com Honorable Mention All-America and First Team All-American Athletic Conference. Kroft led the team in receiving yards (573) and receptions (43). Kroft was the only Scarlet Knight to record a reception in all 13 games and earned John Mackey National Tight End of the Week after racking up six catches, 133 yards and a touchdown versus Arkansas.

The former Scarlet Knight safety and linebacker (2001-04) previously served as offensive coordinator at Don Bosco Prep in Ramsey, N.J., leading the Ironmen to NJSIAA Group IV State Championships in 2010 and 2011. Don Bosco's 2011 squad compiled an 11-0 record and earned a No. 1 national ranking in several polls, including USA Today.

Campanile started his coaching career as a student assistant coach for Rutgers in 2005. He then went on to Fair Lawn High School in Fair Lawn, N.J., for a season. Campanile began as linebacker coach at Don Bosco Prep in 2007 before assuming offensive coordinator duties in 2010. A 2007 graduate of Rutgers, Campanile earned a degree in history.

Bob Fraser is in his third tenure at Rutgers and second season as linebackers coach. He was on the coaching staff from 2006-11 in various capacities, including defensive co-

ordinator in 2011. Fraser began his coaching career at Rutgers as a graduate assistant in 1987.

In his return to Rutgers, Fraser helped coach linebacker Steve Longa to a standout rookie season in 2013 as Longa led the Scarlet Knights with 123 tackles, becoming the first RU player to top 100 tackles in a season in over a decade (Gary Brackett, 130 in 2002). Longa followed that campaign with a team-leading 102 tackles in 2014.

Fraser was the assistant defensive coordinator for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2013. For the first time since 2005, the Buccaneers placed two players on the Associated Press All-Pro First Team in defensive tackle Gerald McCoy and outside linebacker Lavonte David.

In 2012, Fraser coached David to an outstanding rookie campaign. He led the team in both tackles and tackles for loss, while ranking in the top 10 in the NFL in tackles and among the top five in the league in solo tackles and tackles for loss. David was named NFL Rookie of the Month for November, becoming the first Buccaneer to win the award.

During his second stint at RU, Fraser was instrumental in helping orchestrate some of Rutgers' finest defensive units. In 2011, his defense finished first in the Big East Conference in four defensive categories: total defense, scoring defense, pass defense and pass efficiency defense. It was also ranked in the top 20 nationally in total defense (14th), scoring defense (8th), pass defense (9th), pas efficiency defenses (5th), sacks (15th) and tackles for loss (8th). In addition, Rutgers linebacker Khaseem Greene was named both an All-American and the first Big East Co-Defensive Player of the Year in school history.

In his first season as a defensive coordinator in 2009, Fraser helped the Scarlet Knights to top-20 national rankings in six categories, including leading the nation in tackles for loss and ranking fourth in sacks. RU was 15th in the country in rushing defense, 16th in scoring defense and 18th in total defense.

Jim Panagos, a native of Brooklyn, N.Y., is in his fourth season as defensive line coach at Rutgers. He has served as an assistant at both on the collegiate level and in the NFL

In Rutgers' first season in the Big Ten, Panagos helped guide a pair of Scarlet Knights to all-conference awards. Defensive tackle Darius Hamilton and defensive end Kemoko Turay each received honorable mention on the All-Big Ten team.

Hamilton led the defense with 11.5 tackles-for-loss, including a career-best six sacks. Turay picked up a team-high 7.5 sacks, ranking eighth among Big Ten players.

Panagos has been integral in the development of Hamilton, who led RU with 11.5 TFL and was second with 4.5 sacks as a sophomore in 2013. He earned Phil Steele Third Team All-American Athletic Conference. As a unit, RU ranked fourth in the nation in rushing, limiting opponents to 100.8 yards per game.

Following the 2013 season, Marcus Thompson, who played rush end for the Scarlet Knights, signed an NFL contract with the Miami Dolphins. Thompson led Rutgers with 5.5 sacks his senior season.

In 2012, the Scarlet Knights finished fourth in the nation in scoring defense (14.15 points allowed/game), tied for ninth in turnovers gained (32) and 10th in total defense (311.62 yards allowed/game) in his first season "On the Banks." Scott Vallone was named First Team All-Big East under the guidance of Panagos on the defensive line after recording 52 tackles and three sacks.

The defensive line was also a key part in a Rutgers defense that ranked 16th nationally with 7.31 tackles-for-loss per game in 2012. In addition, Rutgers ranked sixth nationally in rushing defense in 2012 yielding just 97.2 yards per contest. The 97.2 rushing yards allowed per game ranked as the third-best rushing defense in school history. Rutgers also allowed only six rushing touchdowns the entire 2012 season, the third-lowest amount in the nation.

Panagos competed five seasons as defensive line coach at the University of Central Florida before coming to Piscataway.

Darrell Wilson, who spent 13 years in the Big Ten previously (11 at Iowa, two at Wisconsin), is in his third season as the defensive backs coach at Rutgers. He served as the run-

ning backs coach for the Scarlet Knights in 1999.

In 2013, Wilson helped develop a unit that saw five freshmen start at cornerback.

Wilson coached the secondary for the Hawkeyes in 2012, while assisting with special teams. He worked with all the linebacker positions and special teams for the four seasons prior after working with special teams and outside linebackers in his first six seasons in Iowa City. He was named byRivals.comin Feb. 2011 as one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation, primarily recruiting New Jersey, Maryland and Pennsylvania.

Iowa won 89 games during his tenure, with 52 Big Ten victories. The program participated in 10 bowl games since 2001 with six taking place in January. The Hawkeyes finished ranked in the final top 10 of both major polls four times in his 11 seasons.

SEATTLE, Wash. (Aug. 28, 2014) - After spending the first 59 minutes trying to slow down Washington State's pass-happy offense with only moderate success, Rutgers' defense saved its best for last. With the Scarlet Knights clinging to a three-point lead, the defense held firm against quarterback Connor Halliday on his final drive tonight, enabling Rutgers to emerge with a 41-38 victory over Washington State at CenturyLink Field in the season opener. Halliday finished 40-of-56 for 532 yards and five touchdowns but could not solve the Scarlet Knights' defense when it mattered most. Rutgers was able to take that 41-38 lead in a back-and-forth second half just when things looked bleak. Trailing 38-34 after Halliday's five-yard touchdown pass to Rickey Galvin with 8:13 to play, the Scarlet Knights were forced to punt. But Johnathan Aiken's hit on returner River Cracraft forced a fumble that teammate Anthony Cioffi recovered at midfield. From there, the Scarlet Knights marched the rest of the way for the eventual game-winning touchdown, getting it when Paul James scored from three-yards out with 3:24 to play, his third rushing touchdown of the game. James rushed for 173 yards on 29 carries, while Gary Nova passed for 281 yards and two scores. Wide receiver Leonte Carroo caught six passes for 151 yards and a touchdown as Rutgers beat a Pac-12 school for the first time in its history. Nova's second touchdown pass of the game, and John Tsimis' first of his career, had given Rutgers the lead back at 34-31 with 10:50 to play after those two hooked up on a 29-yard scoring play. Prior to that, Washington State had taken its first lead of the game at 24-21 on its opening possession of the second half as Halliday continued his hot hand. Rutgers would force a 24-24 tie on Kyle Federico's 36-yard field goal on the very next series before Halliday picked up where he left off. This time he finished a drive with a 14-yard touchdown pass - his fourth of the game - to Isiah Myers to get Washington State back on top at 31-24. But Rutgers wasn't finished. Federico, who has made 10 of his last 12 field goals, connected on a 25-yard and to make it 31-27 and Nova then capitalized on a defensive stop. He did that by engineering a 73-yard drive that ended with the touchdown pass to Tsimis, giving the Scarlet Knights the lead back a 34-31 in the wild passing affair. Rutgers' ability to make just enough plays - thanks in large part to James and a defense that did its best to hold firm in the onslaught of Washington State's passing game - was the difference as the Scarlet Knights claimed a 21-17 halftime lead. James tore through the Cougars' defense in the first two quarters, rushing for 110 yards and two touchdowns on 13 carries. The highlight was a 56-yard touchdown run late in the second quarter that pushed the Scarlet Knights' lead to 21-10. Though Rutgers led

from the very first play from scrimmage - literally - Washington State's relentless passing attack kept the Pac-12 team always within arm's length through the first two quarters. Cougars' quarterback Connor Halliday finish the first half 20-of-29 for 289 yards with two touchdown passes and an interception. But he was always playing catchup early, starting with Nova's 78-yard touchdown strike to Carroo on Rutgers' first play. Halliday had his share of big plays in the first half, but the Scarlet Knights' defense had theirs as well, most notably on a fourth and two play midway from the Rutgers six yardline through the first quarter. Halliday completed a crossing pass to Vince Mayle, who was stopped short of the first down by safety Johnathan Aiken. That preserved Rutgers' 7-O lead. But the offenses and the offensive stars were just getting warmed up. Rutgers built a 14-3 lead early in the second quarter thanks to a 12-play, 75-yard drive capped by James' one-yard touchdown run. Halliday answered with a four-vard touchdown pass to Isiah Myers that finished off an 80-yard drive, making it 14-10. That's when Rutgers responded once more, with James breaking loose for that 56-yard touchdown run to push the Scarlet Knights' advantage back to 21-10. Back came Halliday for more, though. This time he moved the Cougars 72 yards in eight plays, connecting with Mayle for a 26-yard touchdown. Washington State was within 21-17 with 1:42 left before the half at that point. The Cougars had a chance to get even closer, but Eric Powell's 50-yard field goal try on the final play of the first half glanced off the upright. Nova, meanwhile, finished the half 5-for-10 for 107 yards with a touchdown pass and interception. And while Washington State managed gaudy passing numbers as usual, the Cougars rushed for just 18 yards on nine carries in the opening half.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (Sept. 6, 2014) - This was probably the furthest thing from the sharp, flawless performance Rutgers was looking for as a final tuneup for next Saturday's Big Ten Conference opener against Penn State. But on a steamy, sweltering Saturday, the Scarlet Knights fought through the weather and distractions for a sluggish 38-25 victory over Howard before a crowd of 48,040 at High Point Solutions Stadium, enabling them to finally turn their attention to the anticipated visit by the Nittany Lions. Gary Nova (15-of-19 for 282 yards) threw four touchdown passes and running back Paul James scored three times - all in the first half - as Rutgers improved to 2-0. James caught two passes for 100 yards and two touchdowns, becoming the first running back in 25 years to have a 100-yard receiving game for the Scarlet Knights. James was in for just one play in the second half after Rutgers built a 24-point halftime advantage.

Desmon Peoples led the Scarlet Knights' rushing attack with a career-high 55 vards on 11 carries. Nova's final pass of the day came with 44 seconds left in the third quarter when he threw a 19-yard touchdown to John Tsimis to give Rutgers a 38-13 lead. Because of sacks, the running game struggled to break the 100-yard mark, finishing with 109 yards on 38 carries. Howard (0-2) then scored two touchdowns in the final 12:33, the first on a seven-yard run by quarterback Greg McGhee, with running back Terrance Tusan later breaking free for a 70yard scoring run with 5:22 to play. McGhee carried the offense for the Bison, throwing for 168 yards while rushing for 79 yards and a touchdown. The visitors totaled 437 yards of offense, getting 269 on the ground. James' singular ability to change a game - this time when Rutgers surprisingly needed a pick-me-up - had helped the Scarlet Knights wind up where they expected to be at halftime with a 31-7 lead at the break. Coming off a 173-yard, three-touchdown rushing performance in the opener, James scored all three of his touchdowns in the first half, including the first two touchdown catches of his career. That enabled Rutgers to shake off a stunning early Howard score that saw the Bison take a 7-0 lead after their opening possession. James, with an assist from Nova's sharp first half (11-of-14 for 251 yards and three touchdowns), eventually had Rutgers back in control in the opening half. It started simply enough, with James taking a swing pass from Nova. He shook off an early tackle attempt from diving cornerback Tamlin Antoine and then raced 69 yards down the sideline for the longest pass play of his career. It was also his first career touchdown catch, pushing the Scarlet Knights to a 10-7 lead. From there, Rutgers took over the game on both sides of the line in the first half. Nova connected with Leonte Carroo on a snappy 38-yard touchdown pass, James turned a

lost Howard fumble into a seven-yard touchdown run and James then added a 31-yard score on yet another swing pass from Nova, shedding two would be tacklers to make it 31-7. It marked James' second straight game with three touchdowns and was his fifth multiple-touchdown game in 10 career starts. The fourth-year junior finished with 43 rushing yards on 13 attempts to go along with those 100 receiving yards. Rutgers rolled up 343 yards of total offense on 34 plays through the first two quarters, adding just 54 yards in the second half. Rutgers' special teams weighed in as well. Placekicker Kyle Federico converted a 42-yarder on his only field goal try - he has made 10 of his last 12 now - while Kemoko Turay blocked a 28-yard field goal try by the Bison. It was the first of two blocked kicks in the game for the Scarlet Knights.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (Sept. 13, 2014) - One bad defensive series -- after nearly 57 minutes of stellar play by the unit -- proved to be Rutgers' undoing in its naticipated Big Ten Conference opener last night. Penn State's Christian Hackenberg drove his team 80 yards in six plays, with Bill Belton finishing the drive with a five-yard run with 1:13 to play, as the Nittany Lions rallied for a 13-10 victory over the Scarlet Knights before a record crowd of 53,774 at High Point Solutions Stadium tonight. Held in check most of the game, Hackenberg needed just 1:49 to drive those 80 yards after Penn State (3-0) took over at its 20 yard line trailing 10-6. A 53-yard completion to Geno Lewis followed shortly after by a 23-yard completion to Lewis were the key plays in the drive. Rutgers (2-1) could not overcome five interceptions by quarterback Gary Nova despite the strong defensive effort. Hackenberg finished 25-of-44 for 309 yards despite game-long pressure. The Scarlet Knights led all evening until that Belton touchdown run with 73 seconds remaining, limiting the Nittany Lions to a pair of Sam Ficken field goals in the second half until the game-winning drive by Penn State. It had been the return of Rutgers' stout defensive play - and just enough fancy footwork by Nova - that turned out to be the difference in a surprisingly low-scoring first half that saw Rutgers claim a hard-fought 10-0 halftime lead tonight. Though Nova struggled with his passing early on (he was 8-of-15 for 125 yards with two interceptions in the first half), his new-found mobility proved to be a fitting reward for a defense that deserved some help from the offense. Facing a third and two from the Nittany Lions 14 yard line, Nova took off on a scramble, using a spin move at the 3 yard line to avoid safety Malik Golden before diving into the end zone for a touchdown - the second rushing score of his career. That gave Rutgers a 7-0 lead with 11:32 left in the second quarter, and provided some relief for a defense that kept Hackenberg and Penn State's offense in check despite several tests. An assist by the special teams was critical to Rutgers' ability to take an early lead, with Leonte Carroo blocking a punt (in addition to catching three passes for 52 yards in the first half) and Kemoko Turay blocking a 34-yard field goal try by the Nittany Lions to keep the game scoreless. Roughed up in the second half against Howard last week (259 yards allowed after halftime), and victimized for a school-record 532 passing yards by Washington State in the opener, Rutgers' defense returned to its dominant ways. Penn State managed just 102 yards of total offense in the first half, with the Nittany Lions limited to 23 rushing yards. Hackenberg, victimized by several drops, finished the first half 9-of-17 for 79 yards. Nova's two first quarter interceptions, though, had Rutgers' defense on its heels. But the unit responded every time it

needed to in the first half. The offense, meanwhile, did just enough to make that defensive effort pay dividends. In addition to Nova's touchdown run, which capped a 10play, 80-yard drive, Rutgers did just enough on its final drive to get a double-digit halftime lead.

Pinned at their own seven yard line with 5:05 left before halftime, Rutgers moved deep enough and far enough to get 32-vard field goal from Kyle Federico just 12 seconds before the break. Rutgers' running game had some early success, most of it by Desmon Peoples, finishing with 74 yards on 19 carries through the first two quarters. The Scarlet Knights had 199 yards of total offense then.

ANNAPOLIS, MD. (Sept. 20, 2014) - It's no surprise that the winning team in today's Rutgers-Navy game rushed for 284 yards and four touchdowns. The surprise was that it was the Scarlet Knights powering their way to that total on the ground, not a Navy team that entered the game leading the nation at 403 rushing yards. With Justin Goodwin and Desmon Peoples taking over after leading rusher Paul James suffered a first-half injury. Rutgers ran for its biggest yardage total in seven seasons and then needed a late goal line stand to hold on for a 31-24 victory over the Midshipmen before a crowd of 33,655 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The win improved Rutgers' record to 3-1. Goodwin, who was the Scarlet Knights' starting cornerback in the opener, rushed for 104 yards and a touchdown on 26 carries while Peoples added a career-high 82 rushing yards. But Navy (2-2) battled back from a 31-17 deficit, built on the second of quarterback Gary Nova's two one-yard sneaks with 6:20 left in the third quarter. The Midshipmen were within 31-24 on quarterback Keenan Revnolds 14-vard touchdown pass to Brendan Dudek with 5:26 to play. That followed Kyle Federico's missed 42-yard field goal try, apparently due to an errant snap, that could have give Rutgers a a three-score lead. Instead it gave the Mids renewed life., . They eventually drove to the Rutgers six yard line in the final minute before back-to-back sacks set them back, one a critical sack of 10 yards by Andre Hunt. That left Navy to heave a desperation pass into the end zone on its final offensive play. It was complete but out of the end zone with 17 seconds left. Nova, in addition to his two sneaks, was an efficient 11-of-14 for 151 yards. Though Rutgers held Navy to 232 yards below its rushing average, the nation's worst passing team entering the game passed for 231 yards. All of that happened espite a potentially disastrous start - and the loss of James to a leg injury in the second quarter - with Rutgers able to immediately turn the ground-dominant tables on Navy in building a 24-14 halftime lead. The Scarlet Knights powered their way to 200 rushing yards on 27 carries in the opening two quarters, although that accomplishment was dampened by the loss of James... The fourth-year junior was hit directly on the right knee by the helmet of Brendon Clements at the end of a 13yard run with Rutgers holding a 10-7 second quarter lead. James was helped off the field before leaving for the locker room on crutches and did not return. There was no update issued on his status at halftime. James had 96 rushing yards on just seven carries to that point. including a two-tackle-breaking 38-yard touchdown run in the first quarter that forged a 7-7 tie at the time. That followed an uncharacteristic lost fumble by James on the game's first offensive play deep in Rutgers territory

that the Midshipmen quickly turned into a touchdown for a 7-0 lead after just 1:13 had elapsed. But Goodwin was able to take over from there, going for 71 yards on 13 carries the rest of the half, including a three-yard run just 27 seconds before halftime that gave the Scarlet Knights their 10-point halftime advantage. That capped an eightplay, 91-yard drive for Rutgers. In general, the first half looked as if the teams switched offenses. Navy actually attempted more passes (a season-high 10) in the first two quarters than Rutgers, with the Scarlet Knights running the ball more often than Navy, which came into the game leading the nation in rushing. The Mids had just 112 rushing yards on 23 carries, though Reynolds did pass for 75 yards in the first half. After taking a 10-7 lead, Rutgers pushed the advantage to 17-7 on the drive James was injured on when quarterback Nova scored on a one-yard sneak. Navy responded immediately with a 75-yard drive to make it 17-14 before the Scarlet Knights embarked on that season-long 91 yard drive to make it 24-14. Nova finished the first half 7-of-9 for 97 yards.

RUTGERS 31, TULANE 6

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (Sept. 27, 2014) - Rutgers' final tune-up before a run of seven straight Big Ten games was exactly what the Scarlet Knights were looking for - and exactly what quarterback Gary Nova needed. In control from the start, Rutgers rode Nova's record-breaking four touchdown performance, with three of those scoring passes going to wide receiver Leonte Carroo, to cruise to a 31-6 victory today over Tulane before a crowd of 48,361 at High Point Solutions Stadium. The Scarlet Knights, 4-1 overall, finished 4-0 in non-conference play, their first unbeaten showing out of league since the 2009 season. They host Michigan next Saturday. Nova's 60th career touchdown pass, which enabled him to surpass Mike Teel's former school record of 59, was a 93-yard completion to Andrew Turzilli in the second quarter. He added his fourth touchdown pass of the game (No. 61 of his career) on a roll out with 6:57 to play, hitting a crossing Carroo in the back of the end zone. Rutgers outscored Tulane (1-4), 10-0, in the second half. Nova finished 14-of-21 for 291 yards with those four touchdown passes and one interception. Carroo had seven catches for 140 yards and three scores. Desmon Peoples led the rushing attack with career highs of 83 yards on 21 carries, adding two catches for 50 yards. Justin Goodwin added 82 yards on 12 carries. The Scarlet Knights' defense, meanwhile, added four sacks. Nova's early entry into the Rutgers record book, off what was one of the sharpest halves of the senior quarterback's career, highlighted a first half that was dominated by the Scarlet Knights for all but one play - setting the tone for what was to come. As it was, on the strength of Nova's three touchdown passes, Rutgers had a 21-6 halftime lead over Tulane, and the school record book actually had two new entries - from the same play. Nova, who was 9-of-9 for 195 yards through the first two quarters, staked Rutgers to a 14-0 first quarter lead by throwing two touchdown passes to Carroo. The first, a beautiful lob over the outstretched arms of cornerback Lorenzo Doss that wound up as a three-yard touchdown pass to Carroo, capped a 53-yard drive that gave the Scarlet Knights a 7-0 lead after 7:29 had elapsed in the game. Nova's second touchdown pass to Carroo was a 25-yarder on the next series, a strike in which he caught the junior wide receiver in stride in the end zone. That finished an 80-yard drive covered in three plays, thanks in large part to a 46-yard completion from Nova to Carroo one play before the touchdown pass that made it 14-0. The record breaker - Nova's 60th career touchdown pass - was a 93-yard pass in stride to Andrew Turzilli that made it 21-0 in the second quarter. Turzilli caught the ball at the 22 yard line and raced untouched the rest of the way for his first touchdown at Rutgers. The play was the longest from scrimmage in stadium history, and capped

a 99-yard, three-play drive. Tulane, which lost starting quarterback Tanner Lee midway through the second quarter to an undisclosed injury, produced its only highlight of the first half shortly thereafter when Sherman Badie raced 86 yards for a touchdown after bouncing a running play outside. He raced down the right sideline without interference or the threat from a Rutgers defender. The extra point was missed, making it 21-6. Minus Paul James, out for the year with a season-ending injury, Rutgers' running back tandem of Desmon Peoples and Justin Goodwin combined for just 50 yards on 17 carries. But the defense produced three sacks to keep Tulane playing from behind most of the half. Devin Powell, who replaced Lee, was 3-of-6 passing for 36 yards during his time in the first half.

The senior quarterback, in one of his finest performances, threw for a career-high 404 yards and three touchdowns as the Scarlet Knights earned their first Big Ten victory with a 26-24 win over Michigan tonight before a sellout crowd of 53,327 at High Point Solutions Stadium, Nova's Big Game Caps Memorable Night But the historic win wasn't secured until Kemoko Turay blocked the potential go-ahead field goal - a 56-yard attempt - with 3:01 to play. It was Turay's third blocked kick this year, with the redshirt freshman leaping high to deflect Matt Wile's long try with his left hand. On a night when Rutgers' running game managed just 74 yards, Nova - who last week set the school record for career touchdown passes - was up to the task of making up for it in helping the Scarlet Knights move to 5-1 overall (1-1 in Big Ten play) as they head into a bye week. It was his third touchdown pass of the game, a 14-yard pass to Andrew Turzilli with 13:12 to play, that proved to be the game winner. That gave Rutgers a 26-17 lead and was the result of Davon Jacobs' interception off Devin Gardner - the senior quarterback's only turnover of the game. Because of Gardner and a revived running game, however, Michigan wasn't done yet. Gardner (13of-22 for 178 yards) drove the Wolverines immediately following the Rutgers score, capping the drive with a 19yard scramble for a touchdown that made it 26-24 with 9:17 to play. Michigan then reached the Rutgers 39-yard line with 3:07 to play when a third and nine pass from Gardner to Aamara Darboh was ruled incomplete and held up upon review. That left the Wolverines (2-4 overall and 0-2 in the Big Ten for the first time since 1967) in noman's land, with coach Brady Hoke opting to try for the potential game-winning 56-yard field goal on fourth and nine. With the best of Nova on display right from the outset - and the senior showing he can do damage with his feet as well as his arm - Rutgers had been able to claim a 19-17 halftime lead. In addition to throwing for 282 yards and two touchdowns against the nation's No. 9-ranked defense through the first two quarters. Nova was also the Scarlet Knights' leading rusher in the first half with 26 yards on two scrambles. Nova and Rutgers' offense answered the call every time it needed to through those first 30 minutes, too. After building a 6-3 first quarter lead on the strength of two Kyle Federico field goals, the Scarlet Knights were quickly down 10-6 when Michigan drove 75 yards in seven plays. Gardner, the quarterback who came into the game with the reputation as a dual threat, completed that drive by racing four yards for a touchdown off a play-action fake. Two series later, Rutgers answered - needing just one play to do so.

That happened on an 80-yard strike from Nova to a wide-open Turzilli, who caught the pass in stride at the Michigan 41 yard line and raced in for what would be a 12-10 Scarlet Knights lead after the extra point try was blocked. Both teams would have one more response left in an eventful first half. Despite being limited to 218 yards of total offense in the first half, the Wolverines capitalized on a failed Rutgers fake punt to re-take the lead at 17-12 just 1:43 before halftime. De'Veon Smith capped that short 43-yard drive with a one-yard run, and when Rutgers took over at its 25 yard line with 1:43 to play the Scarlet Knights' hopes of moving into scoring position depended on getting a couple of first downs. That's exactly what hannened with Nova first finding Janarion Grant on a critical third and six play for a 27-yard pass play. But Nova would save his best for last. Facing a third and goal from the Michigan seven yard line, Nova was forced to backpedal to the 21 as defensive lineman Frank Clark came charging up the middle with a clear shot. Nova shrugged off Clark and fired a strike to John Tsimis in the end zone for a touchdown just 22 seconds before halftime. That gave the Scarlet Knights the lead back at 19-17. Nova finished the half 14-of-25 passing with no turnovers and no sacks. And he did that despite a non-existent running game, with Desmon Peoples and Justin Goodwin combining for one yard on seven carries. Rutgers managed just 43 rushing yards on 10 carries in the half, with Nova and wide receiver Janarion Grant, on a 16-yard end around, accounting for all but one of those yards. Gardner, meanwhile, was 10-of-15 for 149 yards with two sacks. Michigan managed just 69 rushing yards. on 20 carries through the first two quarters.

COLUMBUS, OH. (Oct. 18, 2014) - If there's one thing Rutgers learned today about life in the Big Ten it's the need for a short memory. No. 13-ranked Ohio State, a team predicted by many as a preseason national championship contender before losing quarterback Braxton Miller, showed exactly why the early hype was warranted in a 56-17 victory over the Scarlet Knights today before a crowd of 106.795 at Ohio Stadium, Rutgers, coming off the school's first-ever Big Ten victory (over Michigan), has to quickly put the loss in its rearview mirror with a game at Nebraska next Saturday. But the recurring image of Buckeyes redshirt freshman quarterback J.T. Barrett will be a tough one to shake. Barrett, the fill-in for the injured Braxton, passed for 261 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for 107 and two scores as Ohio State improved to 5-1 overall and 2-0 in the Big Ten. It was Ohio State's 18th straight conference victory. Rutgers (5-2 overall, 1-2 Big Ten) struggled all game to keep Barrett and the Buckeyes' explosive offensive in check, with Ohio State scoring 50 points or more for the fourth straight game. Running back Desmon Peoples provided one of the few bright spots on offense for the Scarlet Knights, matching his career high with 83 rushing yards and the first two touchdowns of his career. Peoples' second touchdown run was a 12-yard dash with 14:54 to play. In addition, wide receiver Leonte Carroo had five catches for 100 yards, the junior's third 100-yard receiving game of the season and fifth of his career. It was highlighted by a 40-yard catch in which Carroo wrested the ball away from Ohio State cornerback Gareon Conley. But Barrett was simply too much, helping the Buckeyes to a 49-7 lead late in the third quarter, highlighted by his 33-yard touchdown scramble early in the third quarter, before Rutgers showed a spark of offensive life with 10 points the rest of the way. The 6-1, 225-pound Barrett was impressive right from the outset, too, with his first-half performance and two costly turnovers first-half turnovers proving to be Rutgers' undoing early on in the program's first-ever Big Ten road game. Barrett, in a near-flawless opening 30 minutes, hurt the Scarlet Knights with both his arm and legs as Ohio State raced out to a 35-7 halftime lead. He connected on his first nine passes, finishing the first half 11-of-14 for 147 yards and two touchdowns, and also rushed for 50 yards in the half on four carries. As a team, Rutgers rushed for just 34 yards in the opening half. Barrett was on point from the first possession, too, leading the Buckeyes to touchdowns the first three times they had the ball, with drives covering 52, 74 and 67 yards. Rutgers' only answer then, after Ohio State opened a quick 14-0 first quarter lead, was a neatly-engineered 66-yard touchdown drive by quarterback Gary Nova. Though Peoples was the workhorse during Rutgers'

touchdown drive, rushing for 34 of those 66 yards, Nova kept the drive going with a scramble on third and four by running for a first down. Peoples eventually finished the drive with a one-vard run - his first career touchdown to make it 14-7 after the first quarter. From there, the Scarlet Knights simply couldn't keep pace, and those two turnovers proved costly in that regard. With Rutgers backed up at its 10 yard line in a 21-7 game. Nova threw a swing pass to Janarion Grant, who was immediately sandwiched by Ohio State defenders Rashad Frazier and Darron Lee, with Lee forcing the ball loose. Cornerback Eli Apple scooped up the fumble at the four yard line and ran the short distance for a touchdown and a 28-7 Ohio State lead. It grew to 35-7 before Rutgers showed a spark of offensive life again, moving from its 11 yard line to the Ohio State five yard line for a third and two play with 16 seconds left before halftime. But Nova's fade to Leonte Carroo in the corner of the end zone was intercepted by Ohio State cornerback Doran Grant. Nova finished the game - in front of the largest crowd ever to watch Rutgers play - 17-of-28 for 192 yards. He had that one interception and no touchdown passes.

LINCOLN, NEB. (Oct 25, 2014) - Rutgers is the latest team able to attest that the substance to Ameer Abdullah's Heisman Trophy campaign far exceeds the hype. Nebraska's star running back, among the leaders for the college football's most prestigious individual award, bolstered his candidacy by totaling 341 all-purpose yards today as the No. 16-ranked Cornhuskers claimed a 42-24 victory over Rutgers before a crowd of 91.088 at Memorial Stadium. Nebraska improved to 7-1 overall and 3-1 in the Big Ten. The Scarlet Knights fell to 5-3 and 1-3 in conference play. A 5-9 senior, Abdullah rushed for 225 yards (his fourth 200-yard rushing game this season) and three touchdowns on 19 carries, caught two passes for 26 yards and had 90 yards on two kickoff returns Though he didn't score in the third quarter, he was the catalyst for two key Nebraska touchdown drives that kept Rutgers at bay. His 49-yard run was the jump start to a 72yard touchdown drive that gave the Cornhuskers a 28-7 third-quarter lead, with Rutgers able to answer with Kyle Federico's 41-vard field goal to make it 28-10. His ensuing 76-yard kickoff return set up quarterback Tommy Armstrong's second touchdown pass of the game to push Nebraska's advantage to 35-10. But Rutgers would have another response. Forced to go the entire second half with backup quarterback Chris Laviano after Gary Nova was injured when he was hit by 300-pound defensive tackle Maliek Collins on the next to last play of the first half, the Scarlet Knights kept battling. When Armstrong mishandled a snap that was recovered by Rutgers' Quanzell Lambert at the Nebraska 21 yard line, Laviano and the offense were able to turn that into Desmon Peoples' three-yard touchdown run just before the end of the third quarter. That had the Scarlet Knights within 35-17. Abdullah, who entered the game as the nation's No. 3 rusher, negated that with a 23-yard touchdown run with 8:07 to play to make it 42-17. Laviano, in his first extensive action, provided a spark in the running game, scrambling on one play for 46 yards. He wound up as Rutgers' leading rusher with 54 yards on five carries, although true freshman running back Robert Martin flashed promise. In the most extensive action of his career. Martin rushed for 32 yards and his first college touchdown (a four-yard run with 5:11 to play). Wide receiver Leonte Carroo provided the other major offensive highlights, finishing with with five catches for 127 yards and one touchdown, a 71-yard score. It marked his fourth 100-yard receiving game this season and the sixth of his career. Nova left the game having gone 8-of-19 for 156 yards with one touchdown pass and one interception. But Abdullah was almost always the single response Nebraska had to all of Rutgers' offensive highlights, and he asserted himself almost immediately as Nebraska moved out to a 21-7 halftime lead.

Kept quiet in the first quarter, when he was limited to 19 yards on five carries by the Rutgers defense, Abdullah flashed his big-play ability with second quarter scoring runs of 53 and 48 vards. He finished the first half with 149 rushing yards on 16 carries. Rutgers' best answer to him, and with the running game unable to generate any consistent yardage, was Nova's 71-yard touchdown pass to Carroo. At the time, that forced a 7-7 tie, with Nebraska having scored first on Armstrong's 16-vard touchdown run. Nova, able to sidestep defensive end Randy Gregory, bought time by rolling right before finding Carroo. The touchdown was his 15th career receiving score, leaving him five shy of the school record. But Nova was done for the day after Collins twisted him to the ground after pressuring an incompletion just 31 seconds before halftime. Prior to that the entire second quarter was dominated by Abdullah. He answered the Carroo touchdown immediately, racing 53 yards for a touchdown. A series later, he boosted the Cornhuskers' lead to 21-7 on a 48yard scoring run. Rutgers had other first-half chances, getting an Anthony Cioffi interception in the second quarter, but failed to convert. A 50-yard field goal try by Kyle Federico late in the second quarter was blocked by Randy Gregory, and the early struggles in the running game - 29 net yards on 20 carries in the first half - prevented Rutgers' offense from getting fully untracked early on against Nebraska.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (Nov 1, 2014) - The toughest threegame stretch of Rutgers' season - and one of the more difficult ones in program history - was everything it was cracked up to be. Now the Scarlet Knights get a much-needed break to regroup in their quest for that elusive sixth victory for bowl eligibility. Unable to muster anything offensively, Rutgers was beaten, 37-0, by Wisconsin today, disappointing a rain-soaked sellout crowd of 52,797 at High Point Solutions Stadium - the Scarlet Knights' third straight defeat. It was the school's first time being shut out at home since West Virginia managed the feat on Oct. 12, 2002. Following a three-game stretch of playing at Ohio State, at Nebraska and then home to the Badgers, Rutgers (5-4 overall, 1-4 Big Ten) has a bye week to collect itself before closing out the home portion of its season on Nov. 15 when Indiana visits.Running back Melvin Gordon rushed for 128 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries and backfield partner Corey Clement added 128 yards and two scores on 19 carries as the Badgers improved to 6-2 overall and 3-2 in the Big Ten. Wisconsin left little doubt as to the outcome with Gordon and Clement each scoring on long second-half touchdown runs and placekicker Rafael Gaglianone converting a 46-yard field goal, his third of the game, in the second half. Those 17 points padded a 20-0 halftime lead. Gordon's third-quarter touchdown run, his 18th of the season, covered 18 yards. Clemet scored his second touchdown on a 36-yard run with 12:56 to play. Rutgers did not top 100 yards of total offense until 2:31 was left to play against the Big Ten's top-ranked defense. The Scarlet Knights had just five first downs to that point. They finished with 139 yards of offense. Not even the presence of senior Gary Nova at quarterback (he was a game-time decision after missing the second half of last week's Nebraska's game) could provide an offensive spark. The senior finished 5-of-15 passing for 46 yards with one interception before being replaced by redshirt freshman Chris Laviano. But Laviano struggled as well, missing on nine of his first 10 pass attempts. He finished 2-of-12 for 17 yards. The defense, for as long as it could, did its part in holding Wisconsin to 161 yards of total offense in the first half, but a couple of costly mistakes then proved to be Rutgers' undoing early, setting the tone for what would be a lopsided affair. With a defensive battle unfolding at the outset, the tenor of the first half changed when Wisconsin's A.J. PISCATAWAY, N.J. (Nov 15, 2014) - For the rousing success that Senior Day turned into, Rutgers can thank a couple of true freshmen for jumpstarting it all. Sparked by a 47-yard third-quarter touchdown run by Robert Martin and fortified by a nine-yard score later in the quarter from Josh Hicks, Rutgers became bowl eligible for the ninth time in the past 10 years with a 45-23 victory over Indiana today before a crowd of 47,492 at High Point Solutions Stadium. Taking the lead for good at 17-16 on Martin's career-long scoring run, the Scarlet Knights saw a game-changing third-quarter spree of 21 unanswered points capped by Hicks' score. Both are true freshmen. In between, quarterback Gary Nova tossed a 34-yard touchdown pass to Leonte Carron as Rutgers rallied from a 16-10 deficit to take command at 31-16 heading into the fourth quarter. The Scarlet Knights improved to 6-4 overall and 2-4 in Big Ten play with two games remaining, both on the road. They needed one of their better offensive showings of the season to overcome Tevin Coleman's 32 carries for 307 rushing yards - the most by a Rutgers opponent in Piscataway. Hicks finished with 114 yards on 20 carries while Martin had 83 rushing yards on 11 carries and ran for three scores. It marked the first 100-yard rushing game of Hicks' career. When Indiana (3-7 overall, 0-6 Big Ten) closed within 31-23 on Zander Diamont's 28-yard touchdown pass to Shane Wynn with 14:36 to play, Nova and Carroo had one more response, too. Nova (16-of-27 for 217 yards and two touchdowns in his final home game) found Carroo open for a 56-yard touchdown pass with 11:50 remaining to make it 38-23. Carroo finished with five catches for 125 yards and two scores, recording his fifth 100-yard receiving game of the season and seventh of his career. The high-scoring affair and individual highlights could not have been predicted following a lethargic first half - at least until the final 6:12 before halftime. One long run by Coleman and an unkind crossbar, with both surfacing in the final 18 seconds before halftime, proved to be the difference through the opening two quarters as the Hoosiers claimed a 13-10 halftime lead. Coleman's 67-yard touchdown run with 18 seconds left in the half gave Indiana that slim first-half advantage, which held up when the crossbar prevented Kyle Federico's 46-yard field goal try from going through as the clock hit :00 for the half. But the sleepy opening 23:48 of the game, dominated by both defenses, was nothing like the action-filled final 6:12 to end the first half. Locked in a 3-3 game through most of the first 23-minutes plus. Rutgers started a wild final 6:12 of the first half by finishing a 44-yard drive with Martin's two-yard touchdown run for a 10-3 Scarlet Knights lead. That opportunity was set up as a result of a fortuitous bounce and a head's up play by linebacker

Steve Longa. With Indiana back to receive a Joe Roth punt, the ball deflected off the Hoosiers' Andre Booker, with Longa there for the fumble recovery that would be converted into Martin's short scoring run. Then the game started to pick up. Coleman, held to 20 yards on his first nine carries midway through the second quarter, began finding a rhythm, helping Indian to a drive that ended with Griffin Oakes' 36-vard field goal, his second of the half. That cut Rutgers' lead to 10-6. The Scarlet Knights appeared to be in control then, too, but a failed third and one run from the Indiana 33 yard line, followed by a failed fourth down sneak by Nova, gave the Hoosiers the ball with just 36 seconds left. Where a kneel down seemed possible a touchdown resulted instead as Coleman bolted around the right side for that 67-yard touchdown run and the 13-10 Indiana lead just 18 seconds before halftime. That gave him 122 yards on 13 carries in a half when it appeared Rutgers had kept him in check. But the action wasn't done. Janarion Grant took the ensuing kickoff 71 yards to the Indiana 29-yard line with four seconds left, where Federico's field goal try to tie hit the crossbar and bounced back into the end zone.

EAST LANSING, MICH. (Nov. 22, 2014) - The challenge of facing a top 10 team on the road becomes even more daunting when that nationally-ranked team is playing at the top of its game - even if it's only for a half. Rutgers found that out the hard way today. No. 10-ranked Michigan State parlayed a near-flawless first half into a 45-3 victory over the Scarlet Knights before an announced crowd of 70.902 at Spartan Stadium, using all of its star power early to dismiss Rutgers' upset hopes. The Spartans (9-2 overall, 6-1 Big Ten) received contributions from all of their marquee offensive players in building a 35-0 halftime lead. That proved to be more than enough of a cushion in a second half that saw the teams exchange field goals until Nick Hill's 16-yard touchdown run with 5:53 to play. Michigan State quarterback Connor Cook, who finished with 254 passing yards, had 205 of those and both of his touchdown passes in the first half. Running back Jeremy Langford, who extended his streak of 100-yard games to eight by rushing for 126 yards, went for 92 yards and both of his scores before the halftime break. And wide receiver Tony Lippett had four catches for 54 yards and a score in the first two quarters. He finished with five catches for 72 yards. Both teams went to their back-up quarterbacks for most of the fourth quarter. The only points for Rutgers (6-5 overall, 2-5 Big Ten) came off the foot of placekicker Kyle Federico, who made a 44-yard field goal at the end of the third quarter. The Scarlet Knights finish the regular season next Saturday at Maryland. They will look to get back on track offensively after senior quarterback Gary Nova struggled to generate consistent drives against a unit ranked No. 9 nationally in total defense. Nova finished 11-of-26 for 108 yards and was intercepted twice. True freshman running back Robert Martin was the bright spot on offense, rushing for 62 yards on 15 carries. As much as the star power carried the Spartans early, so did their offensive efficiency. Michigan State was also 7-of-8 on third down conversions in the first half, keeping touchdown drives alive every time. Rutgers couldn't keep pace during the opening two quarters because it was just 2-of-8 on third down conversions, a season-long struggle for the Scarlet Knights. Michigan State had a 14-0 first quarter lead on Cook's 30-yard touchdown pass to Lippett and Langford's 18-yard scoring run. Langford added a 34yard second quarter touchdown run, Nick Hill scored on a one-yard touchdown run and Cook connected with R.J. Shelton for a seven-yard touchdown pass with 28 seconds left before halftime for the 35-0 advantage. Michigan State's early dominance saw the Spartans total 334 yards of offense in the first half to Rutgers' 117, with the Scarlet Knights' best scoring chance then a 46-yard field goal try by Federico that was short and wide in the sec-

ond quarter.

COLLEGE PARK, MD. (Nov. 29, 2014) – Led by a rejuvenated Gary Nova, who passed for four touchdowns and had three receivers top 100 yards, Rutgers rallied from the biggest deficit in school history to stun Maryland, 41-38, in the regular-season finale before a crowd of 36,673 at Byrd Stadium. The Scarlet Knights (7-5 overall, 3-5 Big Ten) trailed 35-10 with 2:52 left in the second quarter before storming back for the victory in the second half, getting the game-winning points on Kyle Federico's 25-yard field goal with 6:14 to play. The biggest comeback in Rutgers history had been at Vanderbilt in 2004, when the Scarlet Knights rallied to win after facing a 27-3 deficit. But for all of the offensive heroics by Nova and Rutgers, two late breaks were needed for Kyle Flood's team to secure its first Big Ten road win. Maryland placekicker Brad

cure its first Big Ten road win. Maryland placekicker Brad Craddock missed a potential game-tying field goal from 54 yards with 3:44 to play and Rutgers holding that 41-38 lead. He had made all 18 of his attempts this season, including a 50-varder earlier in the game. Rutgers then had to survive a lost fumble by freshman running back Robert Martin at the Scarlet Knights' 45 yard line with under three minutes to play. But on a fourth and two from the Scarlet Knights' 36 yard line, the Terps eschewed a 53-yard field goal try, running Brandon Moss instead. Moss was stuffed by Rutgers' defense, led by linebacker Kevin Snyder, with 1:01 to play. Nova passed for 347 yards overall to lead the second-half charge, with Janarion Grant, Andre Patton and Leonte Carroo becoming the first trio of Rutgers receivers ever to top 100 yards in the same game. Grant had career highs of eight catches for 105 yards, Patton had career highs of eight catches for 101 yards (and two touchdowns) and Carroo topped the 1,000-yard mark for the season with six catches for 102 yards and two scores. Trailing 35-17 at halftime, Rutgers was jumpstarted immediately by Janarion Grant's 71-yard kickoff return to start the second half. That led to a oneyard touchdown run by Martin to make it 35-24. Nova then moved Rutgers 70 yards in 10 plays on Rutgers' next possession, finishing the drive with an eight-yard touchdown throw to Carroo. It was 35-31 then, and all Maryland could do - despite having twer o 100-yard rushers and totaling 476 yards of offense - was answer with a 50-yard field goal by Craddock to make it 38-31. The game-tying touchdown came on Nova's 10-yard touchdown pass to Andre Patton on third and eight with 14:55 to play. That made it 38-38. Federico's game-winner came at the end of a 10-play, 72-yard drive.Maryland finished the regular

season 7-5 overall and 4-4 in the Big Ten.

DETROIT, MICH (Dec 26, 2014) - Any debate about Rutgers' inaugural Big Ten season being anything but a rousing success can end once and for all now The Scarlet Knights put an exclamation point on their season today. In control from the outset, Rutgers thoroughly dominated North Carolina in a 40-21 victory in the Quick Lane Bowl at Ford Field, turning in one of its stronger performances of the year to finish the campaign at 8-5. Quarterback Gary Nova threw two touchdown passes, freshmen running backs Josh Hicks and Robert Martin proved to be a dynamic 1-2 punch in the running game, with each topping 100 yards rushing, and the Scarlet Knights' defense quieted the most productive offense in North Carolina history for all but the final 6:45 of the game. After falling behind, 40-7, the Tar Heels scored two touchdowns in the final 6:45. Nova, 9-of-20 for 184 yards, had pushed the Scarlet Knights' 23-0 halftime lead to 30-7 with his second touchdown pass - this one a 34yard strike to Andrew Turzilli - with 7:33 left in the third quarter. The advantage grew to 37-7 on Martin's 28-vard touchdown run with 14:11 to play. Kyle Federico tacked on a 31-yard field goal with 10:04 remaining to make it 40-7. Martin and Hicks joined Ray Rice (three times) and Jawan Jamison as the only Rutgers backs to rush for 100 yards in a bowl game. Martin (19 carries for 100 yards and two touchdowns) and Hicks (202 yards and one touchdown on 19 carries) also joined Rice as the only true freshmen to reach 100 in a bowl for the Scarlet Knights. Hicks was named MVP of the game for his efforts. The rushing totals for both Martin and Hicks were career highs, with Rutgers' 340 rushing yards overall the most in program history in a bowl game and the highest total this season. Marquise Williams, the Tar Heel's record-setting dual threat quarterback, was 25-of-37 passing for 198 yards and one touchdown and added 51 rushing yards and a touchdown on 15 carries. As dominant as Rutgers was from the outset, the Scarlet Knights weren't quite flawless in the first half despite that commanding 23-0 lead. But they didn't have to be. North Carolina made almost all of the mistakes, Rutgers took advantage of most of them and the result was a little bowl history. That halftime advantage marked the largest ever in a bowl game for the school. And it followed on the heels of that dazzling second half against Maryland, when Rutgers pulled off the biggest comeback in school history for a 41-38 road victory. Unlike that regular-season finale this impressive half was the result of a little bit of everything: Just enough of Nova's passing, just enough running production from Hicks and Martin and more than enough defense to slow a North Carolina team that entered the game averaging 34.2 points and 425.4 yards per game. The Tar Heels' most significant contribution to the lopsided first 30 minutes wound up being their mistakes: Two lost fumbles (both recovered by Lorenzo Waters), a botched fake field goal attempt, a blocked field goal (by Waters) and the only two penalties of the opening half. Nova, 7-of-14 for 142 yards and a touchdown in the first half, put North Carolina on its heels immediately by engineering a 75-yard, five-play drive on the game's first possession that ended with his 34-vard touchdown pass to Andre Patton. Rutgers would have to wait until the second quarter to pad that lead but did so following a curious decision by Tar Heels coach Larry Fedora. On a 22-yard field goal try, he had new holder Joey Mangili - subbing for suspended punter and holder Tommy Hibbard - try a fake field goal run. Darius Hamilton sniffed it out immediately, dropping Mangili for a two-yard loss. From there, with Hicks taking over the running workload, Rutgers went 91 yards in seven plays. Hicks capped that drive with a 21-yard run, with fullback Michael Burton getting a key block on safety Sam Smiley to spring Hicks the final 10 yards for the score and a 14-0 Rutgers lead. Hicks finished the first half with 59 yards on seven carries and one touchdown. Martin had 65 yards on 13 carries and a score, as the Scarlet Knights rolled up 281 yards of offense (to North Carolina's 197). The Tar Heels' second lost fumble, caused by a Steve Longa hit on wide receiver Romar Morris, led to another Rutgers touchdown and a 20-0 lead (Kyle Federico missed the extra point). Martin did the bulk of the work on that drive with four carries, ending it with an eight-yard touchdown run, shedding defensive end DeJuan Drennon early before racing in. And neither the Scarlet Knights nor Waters were done for the opening half, either. Waters' block of Thomas Moore's 31yard field goal try with 7:09 left before halftime continued to keep North Carolina off the scoreboard.Rutgers went on to add a 19-yard field goal by Federico with 16 seconds left before halftime for that 23-0 lead.


