NOTABLE

- Coming off a victory over Morgan State, Rutgers will open Big Ten play by traveling to Nebraska. The Scarlet Knights also opened the conference schedule in 2016 with a Big Ten West opponent by hosting Iowa. Before that, RU played a home-and-home with Penn State to start Big Ten play (2014-15).
- Rutgers is scheduled for five conference road games in a season for the first time since joining a league in 1991.
- Rutgers, "The Birthplace of College Football," is in its 149th year and 148th season of competition. The program has played the most games in the history of the sport (1,328). Nebraska ranks fourth at 1,304.

VERSUS NEBRASKA

- Rutgers will take on cross-divisional opponent Nebraska for the third time in four seasons since joining the Big Ten in 2014. The Scarlet Knights have yet to line up against Purdue and Northwestern in a league game.

MEDIA POLICIES & INFORMATION

RUTGERS ATHLETIC COMMUNICATIONS

The Rutgers Athletic Communications Office is committed to assisting members of the media with their coverage of the Rutgers football team. Hasim Phillips serves as the primary contact for the football program with support from Jimmy Gill and Brad Derechailo.

The Athletic Communications Office is located on level one of the press box at High Point Solutions Stadium. For information regarding credentials, interviews, statistics, press conferences, etc., please call the Athletic Communications Office at 732-445-7028, visit CollegePressBox.com or e-mail Hasim Phillips at hphillips@scarletknights.com. To assist in your coverage throughout the year, please read the media information on this page. All interview requests must be directed to and arranged through the Athletic Communications Office at least one day (24 hours) in advance. Coaches, players and support staff are prohibited from participating in any interviews without prior authorization from the Athletic Communications Office.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All media credential requests must be submitted via email to credentials@scarletknights.com. Admittance to the High Point Solutions Stadium press box is limited to working media members only. Credential requests must be made formally to the credential email address.

Requests for game day credentials must be received at least two weeks in advance of the date of the contest to provide sufficient time for processing and mailing. Media credentials which cannot be mailed will be left at the West Gate Media Will Call (Media Entrance) beneath the press box at High Point Solutions Stadium.

Working space in the High Point Solutions Stadium Press Box is allotted on the following basis: (1) daily newspaper writers covering for next-day publication covering Rutgers or the current game opponent; (2) sports editors of newspapers in New Jersey, New York and Eastern Pennsylvania; (3) radio personnel for broadcast originations; (4) official school student daily newspaper; (5) approved special coverage; (6) press and TV working photographers; (7) weekly press representatives; non-originating radio representatives of AM news stations; and Internet writers for sites affiliated with established, nationally-recognized media outlets will be considered on a game-by-game basis as space permits. Visiting freelance and amateur photographers are not eligible for media credentials.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Sideline photographers and media members must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the Green Lot, which is located adjacent to the Indoor Practice Bubble. To enter the Green Lot, take River Road to Sutphen Road. Once on Sutphen, make your first left at Fitch Road and attendants will direct you to the media lot. You should request your parking at the same time you request your game credential. If time permits, both will be mailed to you. There is no day-of-game media parking list and therefore members of the media must have a media parking pass in advance of the game.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete NCAA statistics, play-by-play and quote sheets from both teams are all regular services on gameday. Upon your arrival, you will receive information with a game program, flipcard, updated stats and game day notes.

The press box has wireless internet access. Login information will be provided on the day of game.

PHONES

A limited number of courtesy phones are available in the press box at High Point Solutions Stadium. The phones are all operator-assisted calls, or third-party billing calls can be made. Should you wish to have a phone installed at High Point Solutions Stadium, contact Verizon at 1-800-564-9911 or 9922.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office at least one day (24 hours) in advance. Players are available in person on Monday at the weekly Rutgers football press conference, and following practice on Tuesday and Wednesday, pending class schedules/availability.

Please consult with Hasim Phillips regarding availability as it will vary from week to week. A time mutually convenient for the player and media member can be set up by the Athletic Communications Office. During a traditional game week, there will be no player interviews after Wednesday until following the game.

COACH ASH INTERVIEWS

All interview requests for Rutgers head coach Chris Ash must be arranged through Hasim Phillips. In addition to post-practice media availability, coach Ash will be available to the media every Monday morning at his weekly press conference in the team meeting room of the Hale Center and on the weekly Big Ten teleconference on Tuesday at noon.

POST PRACTICE INTERVIEWS

On Tuesday, select offensive coaches and players will be available to the media post practice, while select defensive coaches and players will be available on Wednesday. Head coach Chris Ash will address the media following practice on Thursday.

PRACTICE COVERAGE

The use of social media (Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat or Periscope) is strictly prohibited during practice. Live reporting is NOT permitted during practice. Live video/audio broadcast of any kind is also NOT permitted. This includes the use of social media platforms such as Facebook Live, Instagram, Snapchat or Periscope. All reports must be filed at the conclusion of any open media practice windows.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Head coach Chris Ash and select players, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available for interviews after each game. Following home games, the press conference for coach Ash will take place in the team meeting room on the second floor of the Hale Center, which is located on the east side of the stadium opposite the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Hale Center.

The visiting team's press conference will be held in the defensive line meeting room on the second floor of the Hale Center.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

Requested players will be available each Monday at the Rutgers football press conference at 12:30 p.m. in the team room on the second floor of the Hale Center. Live video/audio broadcast of any kind will not be permitted during the weekly press conference. This includes the use of live video features on social media platforms such as Facebook Live, Instagram, Snapchat, Twitter or Periscope.

RUTGERS RADIO NETWORK

All Rutgers football games will be broadcast over the Rutgers IMG Sports Network to 50,000 watt WOR 710-AM in New York City and Central Jersey's WCTC 1450-AM.

Play-by-play announcer Chris Carlin is well known to sports radio fans throughout the State of Rutgers. Carlin is in his 17th year with the Rutgers Radio Network, including his 14th as the play-by-play voice of Rutgers football. Carlin, who has nearly 20 years of experience in radio and television, is the afternoon host on WIP in Philadelphia. He began his career as producer with Mike & The Mad Dog on WFAN and later hosted joined SNY hosting "Loud Mouths," "Geico Sportsnite," as well as New York Mets pregame and post-game shows.

Former Rutgers standout quarterback Ray Lucas begins his ninth season as the color analyst on the Rutgers Radio Network. The seven-year NFL veteran has also been an analyst for SNY on its New York Jets programming since 1996 and won a New York Emmy for best analyst in 2010 for his work on SNY.

Anthony "Fooch" Fucilli returns for his 14th season as the Rutgers Radio Network sideline reporter. Fucilli has also worked as a field producer and reporter for MSG Network since 1989.

Marc Malusis is back for his ninth year as the pre-game and post-game host on the Rutgers Radio Network. The pre-game shows starts one hour prior to kickoff while the post-game show stays on the air one hour following the game.

Former Rutgers defensive lineman Eric LeGrand begins his seventh season on the Rutgers Radio Network. LeGrand will provide insight and commentary on the pre-game show, halftime report and post-game.

- In the last meeting in 2015 at High Point Solutions Stadium, RU fell behind 21-0 before scoring two touchdowns to make it a one-score game in the third quarter. Robert Martin had a one-yard touchdown run and Janarion Grant added a passing score in the 31-14 defeat. The defense snagged three interceptions.
- Martin also found the end zone in the 2014 meeting in Lincoln with a four-yard run, while Leonte Carroo had 127 receiving yards with a 71-yard touchdown. The 16th-ranked Cornhuskers won, 42-24, in RU's first trip to Nebraska.
- The first meeting between the programs took place in 1920 in a game played at the Polo Grounds in New York City, as the Cornhuskers prevailed, 28-0.
- Rutgers faced NU quarterback Tanner Lee, who previously played at Tulane, in a 2014 game at High Point Solutions Stadium. Lee went 7-of-9 passing for 81 yards with two sacks against.

LEWIS EARNS BIG TEN CO-FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR

- After accounting for five touchdowns in the win over Morgan State, freshman quarterback Johnathan Lewis was named Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week on Monday.
- He is the first Scarlet Knight to earn the honor since the program joined the league for the 2014 season. The last RU true freshman to pick up a conference weekly honor was Janarion Grant (American Athletic Conference Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 23, 2013).
- Lewis rushed for four touchdowns versus Morgan State, the most by a Rutgers quarterback in a game in program history. He became the eighth player in program history to rush for four or more touchdowns in a game and the second true freshman in that group (Justise Hairston with four at Navy in 2003). Ray Rice was the last Scarlet Knight to rush for four scores in a single game in his final collegiate game in the 2008 International Bowl.
- Lewis is one of five players at the FBS level this season to rush for four or more touchdowns in a game. He is the only freshman on the list.
- Lewis also threw an 18-yard touchdown pass to Nakia Griffin-Stewart on his first collegiate passing attempt in the second quarter to finish with five touchdowns accounted for. The last Rutgers quarterback responsible for five touchdowns in a game was Gary Nova at Fresno State in the 2013 opener (all passing scores).

MORGAN STATE VICTORY

- Rutgers routed Morgan State, 65-0, to round out a three-game non-conference homestand to start the season.
- It was the first shutout for the Scarlet Knights since blanking Norfolk State, 38-0, in 2013. It was the largest shutout since beating Columbia, 69-0, in 1978 at Giants Stadium.
- Rutgers scored 65 points in the game (nine touchdowns, one field goal), the most since tallying 68 versus Colgate in 1993 at Giants Stadium. The number is the fifth-highest scored by an FBS team through three weeks this season.
- Rutgers' 34 points at halftime were the most through two quarters since totaling 42 versus Howard in 2009.
- Rutgers scored on 9-of-10 trips inside the red zone to improve to 12-of-13 on the season. The defense held the Bears to zero red zone trips during the game.
- Rutgers held Morgan State to 80 rushing yards (no rushing first downs) and has out-rushed its opponent in each game this season. The Scarlet Knights have held 2-of-3 opponents under 100 rushing yards this season.
- Rutgers recorded three interceptions in a game for the first time since the 2015 game against Nebraska.

- Raheem Blackshear had a game-high 102 rushing yards (132 all-purpose yards) with two touchdowns. He was the first true freshman to reach the century mark on the ground since Josh Hicks (202) and Robert Martin (100) in the 2014 Quick Lane Bowl versus North Carolina.
- A total of 71 different players saw action for the Scarlet Knights in the game, including 17 who made their collegiate debut.
- Rutgers improved to 14-0 all-time against teams from the MEAC, winning by a combined score of 623-88.

SEASON OPENER

- Rutgers opened its 2017 season by hosting No. 8/7 Washington. The Scarlet Knights took the early lead, but the Huskies rallied for a 30-14 win in front of a crowd of 46,093 at High Point Solutions Stadium.

GAME 4: RUTGERS AT NEBRASKA

- The Scarlet Knights held UW's offense out of the end zone in the first half and to only 84 rushing yards overall compared to 131 for RU.

- In addition, Rutgers held the advantage in first downs (19 to 17), total plays (77 to 54), third downs (9-of-19 to 3-of-11) and time of possession (38:09 to 21:51). It was the first time since the 2012 game at Arkansas that RU held the ball for over 38 minutes.

- Rutgers received an immediate impact from transfers on offense. Kyle Bolin (24-for-34, 178 yards, two touchdowns) made his RU debut at quarterback, while Gus Edwards led the team in rushing (24 attempts, 79 yards), Jerome Washington had the most receptions (6) and Damon Mitchell collected the highest amount of receiving yards (46).

- RU opened a season against a top-10 opponent for the first time since traveling to No. 3 Florida to begin the 1985 campaign. The Scarlet Knights have hosted 11 top-10 opponents on campus, with five of those being since the start of the 2015 season.

COLLEGIATE DEBUTS

- Rutgers has debuted 40 players through three games this season. A total of 22 players suited up for the first time as a Scarlet Knight in the opener versus Washington, with one more adding to the list versus Eastern Michigan and 17 more against Morgan State.

- Among the group of 40, 34 have made their collegiate debut, with six transfers rounding out the list.

- A total of 22 new players appeared in the game against Washington, the most in an opener in the last 16 seasons. Rutgers played nine true freshmen in the season opener for the first time since 10 saw action in the first game of the 2007 season.

BATTAGLIA PRACTICE COMPLEX

- Rutgers Athletics held a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the newly dedicated Marco Battaglia Practice Complex on Aug. 6. Named for the former consensus All-American and Big East Offensive Player of the Year, the complex will serve as the practice site for the football program. The upgraded practice facility features two new Kentucky Bluegrass fields equipped with a state-of-the-art drainage and irrigation system. A separate FieldTurf playing surface with CoolPlay technology was installed, providing the Scarlet Knights with an additional area for practice drills. The complex has been fitted with a high-powered Musco LED light system. Two permanent 54-foot film towers were constructed in the complex along with two new scoreboards, a new LED video board and six game clocks. A 5,000 square foot storage unit was installed along with new maintenance equipment and permanent restrooms. In addition to the functional improvements, the practice complex also underwent several aesthetical changes, including a new brick entranceway and wall, fencing around the perimeter and redesigned landscaping throughout the facility.

STAFF CHANGES

- Head coach Chris Ash hired three new members of the coaching staff in the off-season - offensive coordinator/quarterback coach Jerry Kill, cornerbacks coach Henry Baker and running backs coach Lester Erb.

- A native of Paterson, N.J., Baker spent the previous six years at Delaware. He coached cornerbacks with the Blue Hens from 2011-16 and served as special teams coordinator in 2012.

- Erb returns to the Big Ten after spending the last four seasons at Nevada. With over 25 years of coaching experience, he worked at Iowa from 2000-12. A standout recruiter throughout his career, Erb was twice recognized by *Rivals.com* as one of the nation's top-25 recruiters in 2005 and 2011.

CAPTAINS

- Rutgers football voted on its 2017 representatives for captain, selecting fifth-year senior offensive lineman Dorian Miller, fifth-year senior quarterback Kyle Bolin, fifth-year senior defensive lineman Darnell Davis and junior linebacker Deonte Roberts.

- Miller: A fifth-year senior on the offensive line, who appeared in 28 career games with 24 starts. Sophomore offensive lineman Jonah Jackson on Dorian Miller during spring practice: "He's the calming factor. When I'm out there amped up, excited to go, he lets me know it's good (and that) there's no need to be nervous. He helps me with everything."

- Bolin: A fifth-year graduate transfer from Louisville, who appeared in 19 career games at quarterback. Head coach Chris Ash on Bolin in the offseason: "Kyle is really a grown man. He's mature. He's intelligent. You can tell he's been around a high-level game of football. He's been well-coached, understands offense and concepts. He's a competitor, and he's just a good teammate, too."

- Davis: A fifth-year senior defensive lineman, appeared in 36 career games, including eight starts. Had 41 tackles, forced two fumbles and recovered two others, including one for a touchdown in 2016. Davis on his decision to come to Rutgers: "I wanted to stay at home. A lot of guys don't stay at home. I got the opportunity to come to Rutgers. Rutgers is a great institution. I'm a business guy. This is a great business school. Football, I knew they were going into the Big Ten and that's one of the best conferences in the country."

- Roberts: A junior linebacker, who started in 15 of 26 career games and was second on the team in 2016 with 95 total tackles. Defensive coordinator Jay Niemann on Deonte Roberts during spring practice: "With his own play and the quality of where we were defensively at the end of the season, it wasn't where we wanted it or needed it to be. He's gone to extreme measures to push in the right direction and really get things going. You can't say enough good things about all the hard work he's put in."

BIG TEN BATTLE IN THE BRONX

- The Rutgers University Department of Intercollegiate Athletics announced in Sept. 2016 it will host the "Big Ten Battle in the Bronx," a football and wrestling doubleheader between the Scarlet Knights and Maryland, at Yankee Stadium on Saturday, Nov. 4,

2017. The wrestling match, which will be the first in the history of the Stadium, will take place first, before head coach Chris Ash leads the football team into action later that day. "Never before has a doubleheader such as this taken place at a venue so iconic," said Director of Athletics Patrick Hobbs. "We are thrilled to provide our fans this one-of-a-kind experience while enhancing the Big Ten brand in the world's media capital. This is certain to be a very special day. We are thankful to the New York Yankees, the Big Ten Conference and the University of Maryland for helping to make it possible."

ADIDAS

- When the clock struck midnight to begin the month of July, the "Three Stripe Life" officially launched "On the Banks." Via a partnership originally announced on Feb. 13, adidas is now the official athletic footwear, apparel and accessory brand of the Scarlet Knights through the 2023-24 season. "The excitement has continually grown since the initial announcement," said Director of Athletics Pat Hobbs. "adidas is a global brand that makes an impact not just athletically, but socially, due to its innovative design and initiatives. The positive sentiment that we receive from student-athletes and recruits on a daily basis is tremendous. adidas is the ideal partner for us to enhance and expand our brand." With the all-school deal, adidas will outfit RU's 24 athletic teams, including new strategic uniforms for the football and basketball teams. Additionally, Rutgers receives adidas' product & marketing expertise and the two will collaborate on marketing opportunities and the development and enhancement of the licensed retail landscape on campus.

LIFE BEYOND THE GAME

- Rutgers head coach Chris Ash instituted the "Life Beyond the Game" program, designed at preparing football players for their careers after their college playing days have ended. "The percentage of our guys going to the NFL is very small," said Ash. "Even if you do go to the NFL, your lifespan there could be very short and then what are you going to do for the rest of your life? Universities have programs set up to help the general students population with alumni, but I think it's our obligation to help student-athletes in their life after football."

ACADEMICS

- Rutgers returns six student-athletes who earned Academic All-Big Ten status last fall: Marcus Applefield, David Bonagura, Darnell Davis, Jimmy Hogan, Sebastian Joseph and Trevor Morris.

PLAYER NUTRITION

- Upon taking over the Rutgers football program, head coach Chris Ash hired Allison Kreimeier, the team's first full-time director of performance nutrition who's responsible for making sure players understand the do's and don'ts of eating right and staying hydrated. "There is so much that we're putting into sports science and nutrition. We're trying to promote the right type of lifestyle that helps you maximize performance."

THE HUNT

- Throughout the Rutgers football facilities are signs that read "The Hunt." "The Hunt' is really the theme of the team," said Ash. "We're basically chasing the other teams in the Big Ten. We can't make any secret about that. To chase them, we gotta go hunt every single day. Whether it's in the weight room, out in the indoor (bubble) with our special workouts or in practice."

OFFENSE

- Under Jerry Kill, the Scarlet Knights are multiple on offense with elements of the spread and pro-style in the playbook.
- Rutgers has scored on 12-of-13 trips to the red zone this season. The only non-scoring drive took place with RU up 65-0 versus Morgan State.
- The offense has held the ball for over 30 minutes in each game, including 38:09 versus Washington. RU ranks No. 17 nationally in time of possession (34:01).

Kyle Bolin

- Started the first three games at quarterback.
- Went 11-of-17 in the win over Morgan State with a season-long 48-yard completion to Bo Melton.
- Threw for 198 yards on 17 completions versus Eastern Michigan. Had five passes result in gains of at least 20 yards in the game.
- Tied his career high with 24 completions against Washington, previously done versus Syracuse in 2014. Completed passes to eight different receivers in the season opener.
- Led an 11-play, 59-yard drive over 5:59 on the first series of the season that resulted in a three-yard passing touchdown to Janarion Grant on third-and-goal.
- Went 11-of-13 on first-down throws versus Washington.
- Became the fourth different Rutgers quarterback to start the opener in as many years. Also just the ninth different quarterback to start a game for the Scarlet Knights since the start of the 2006 season (excluding the wildcat formation).
- Graduated from Louisville in May and transferred to Rutgers in the summer.
- Voted a team captain.
- Played in 17 career games for Louisville with six starts. Totaled 2,104 passing yards with 13 touchdowns for the Cardinals. Had a career-high 381 passing yards in a 2014 win over Kentucky. Served as the backup be-

hind Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson last season.

Giovanni Rescigno

- Made season debut versus Morgan State and had a 19-yard rush.
- Started the last five games of the 2016 season. Had three games with at least 200 passing yards.
- Threw for a career-best 258 yards versus Indiana with one passing and one rushing score. Accounted for seven touchdowns last season (five passing, two rushing).
- Made first career start at Minnesota and went 22-for-38 with 220 passing yards and three touchdowns. It was the most passing yards by a RU quarterback in their first career start since Chas Dodd had 322 versus Connecticut in 2010.
- Ran for a 42-yard touchdown on first collegiate carry versus Howard.

Running Backs

- Rutgers has three backs who average over 5.0 yards per carry in their career (Edwards 5.1, Hicks 5.3, Martin 5.2).

Gus Edwards

- Started the first three games and leads team with 201 rushing yards. Had first touchdown for Rutgers (13th overall) on a 23-yard run versus Eastern Michigan.
- Matched career-best with a 25-yard yard rush versus Morgan State.
- Leads the team with 12 first downs picked up so far this season.
- Made the start in the season opener against Washington and totaled 79 yards on the ground. Picked up eight first downs (six rushing, two receiving).
- Had career-highs with 27 carries and three receptions in the game against the Huskies.

Robert Martin

- Recorded 16th career touchdown on a 13-yard rush versus Morgan State.
- Has 1,980 career rushing yards and needs 20 to become the 14th player in program history to reach 2,000. Ray Rice and Brian Leonard were the last two to join the group in 2006.
- Needs 145 more rushing yards to join the program top-10 list.
- Led the team with 68 rushing yards on 13 attempts versus Eastern Michigan.
- Led the team in rushing in each of the last two seasons with 625 yards in 2016 and 763 yards in 2015.
- Ranks sixth in the school record books with 5.2 yards per carry.
- Has five career 100-yard games, with the most recent being a 106-yard performance against Iowa last season.

Damon Mitchell

- Totaled three receptions for 48 yards, all in the fourth quarter, against Eastern Michigan.
- Led the team with 46 receiving yards against Washington, including a 21-yard grab.
- Graduated from Arkansas last December and enrolled at Rutgers in Jan. 2017.
- Appeared in 28 career games for the Razorbacks.

Tight Ends

Myles Nash

- Has started each of the three games this season at tight end.
- Continued to play both ways versus Morgan State and recorded first collegiate reception and a career-high six tackles.
- Started at tight end versus Eastern Michigan and later saw action on the defensive line in the first half. He is the first Scarlet Knight to play on both sides of the ball in a game since Ruhann Peele (CB, WR) at Connecticut in 2013, with Edmond Laryea (FB, LB) doing it previously in 2010 versus Norfolk State.

Jerome Washington

- Collected first career touchdown reception against Morgan State.
- Has five first downs and one touchdown on 12 receptions. Averaging nine yards per catch.
- Had a team-high six receptions in Rutgers debut against Washington. It was the most catches by an RU tight end in a game since Tyler Kroft had eight at Maryland in 2014.

DEFENSE

- Rutgers has held opponents to 11-of-46 on third downs, ranked 12th in the nation.
- The team had seven pass break-ups against Washington, a total reached twice last season (Howard, Indiana). RU added six against Eastern Michigan and five versus Morgan State with three interceptions.
- Rutgers finished sixth in the nation last season in red zone defense (.727).
- The unit ranked No. 18 nationally with 186.5 passing yards permitted per game in 2016, down from 207.1 in 2015 (-20.6).
- Rutgers also increased its sack total by seven last season.

- Had 60 assisted tackles, tied for ninth-most in a season in RU history.
- Had a team-season-high 17 tackles at Michigan State last season, adding a forced fumble. Notched first career interception versus Indiana.

Blessuan Austin

- Had a career-long punt of 69 yards in 2015.

Justin Davidovicz

- Had six touchbacks against Morgan State. Rutgers totaled four touchbacks in 12 games last season.

Andrew Harte

- Went 8-for-8 on extra points versus Morgan State and added a 38-yard field goal.
- Made first two career field goals against Eastern Michigan.
- Went 2-for-2 on PATs and 0-for-1 on field goals in Rutgers debut versus Washington.
- Started career at Minnesota under head coach Jerry Kill, who is now the offensive coordinator at Rutgers. Saw action in three games, with one PAT kick and three on-side kick attempts.

Lewis Rushes for Four Touchdowns in 65-0 Shutout of Morgan State

PISCATAWAY, N.J. – Fueled by four rushing touchdowns from true freshman quarterback Johnathan Lewis, Rutgers football dominated Morgan State in a 65-0 shutout on Saturday afternoon at High Point Solutions Stadium in front of 39,892 fans. It was the largest shutout by RU since 1978.

Overall, Lewis was responsible for five RU touchdowns, including four rushing and one passing. It marked the most rushing touchdowns for a quarterback during a single game in school history and the second time a true freshman ran for four scores.

Freshman running back Raheem Blackshear also posted two rushing touchdowns, pacing the offense with 132 all-purpose yards, which included 102 rushing yards on 14 carries. Senior running back Robert Martin contributed a rushing touchdown of his own, while tight ends Jerome Washington and Nakia Griffin-Stewart each posted a TD grab to wrap up the RU scorers.

Fifth-year senior quarterback Kyle Bolin posted his third start for RU, recording 140 yards and a touchdown on 11-of-17 passes.

Fifth-year senior defensive end Darnell Davis led the defense with 10 total tackles, along with a sack and a forced fumble. Freshman wide receiver Hunter Hayek registered a blocked punt, marking RU’s second blocked kick of the season and 49th dating back to 2009, which leads the nation.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. – In a game that saw three lead changes, Rutgers football (0-2) was edged by Eastern Michigan (2-0) by a score of 16-13 on Saturday afternoon at High Point Solutions Stadium.

Fifth-year senior wide receiver Janarion Grant led the Scarlet Knights with 157 all-purpose yards, including nine receptions for 91 yards. Senior running back Robert Martin paced the team with 68 rushing yards on 13 carries, while fifth-year senior quarterback Kyle Bolin registered his second start for Rutgers and recorded 198 yards passing on 17 completions.

Fifth-year senior running back Gus Edwards added his first touchdown as a Scarlet Knight, adding 56 yards on the ground. Fifth-year senior kicker Andrew Harte contributed two field goals in the contest.

Defensively, fifth-year senior defensive lineman Sebastian Joseph registered his second career field goal block, marking RU's 48th blocked kick since 2009. Football Drops Opener to No. 8/7 Washington

PISCATAWAY, N.J. – Rutgers football opened its 2017 season against No. 8/7 Washington on Friday night at High Point Solutions Stadium. Despite the close margin in the first half of the contest thanks to the Scarlet Knights' hot start, the Huskies took the lead in the second quarter en route to a 30-14 win in both teams' season opener.

Rutgers' first strike came from fifth-year senior wide receiver Janarion Grant registering a three-yard touchdown grab from classmate and quarterback Kyle Bolin to give RU a 7-0 lead with 7:08 remaining in the first quarter. However, Washington responded with 27 unanswered points spanning into the fourth quarter to claim the advantage. An RU touchdown from Bolin to sophomore wide receiver Dacoven Bailey in the fourth frame would break up the surge, but it was not enough to erase the deficit.

Bolin finished his first game "On the Banks" with a pair of touchdown passes on 178 yards (24-of-34 passing), along with two interceptions. Fifth-year senior running back Gus Edwards also made his Rutgers debut with 79 yards on 24 rushes, with his highlight coming on a 13-yard scamper in the second quarter. Bailey totaled three catches for 42 yards receiving to go with his score, while fifth-year senior Damon Mitchell paced the wideouts with 46 yards on four receptions.

Rutgers held margins of victory in first downs (19-17), rushing yards (131-84), time of possession (38:09-21:51) and third-down conversions (47%-27%).

HEAD COACH CHRIS ASH • SECOND SEASON



Chris Ash took over the helm of the Rutgers football program, his first season as a head coach in 2016, culminating a nearly 20-year career as an assistant coach.

A coach with a national championship pedigree, Ash enjoyed a decorated and accomplished career prior to arriving “On the Banks,” including five years in the Big Ten Conference (four as a defensive coordinator) with four Big Ten championships.

An accomplished and decorated coach, Ash built a reputation as a relentless and tireless worker throughout his various stops. Upon becoming the 30th head coach in the 147-year history at the Birth-place of College Football, Ash made clear his vision for the Scarlet Knights program - “I want to build a first-class program here, a program that the University, the State of New Jersey, high school coaches and high school players can be proud to say that this program is theirs and they want to come here and be a part of it.”

Ash has embarked on outlining the plans to complete that vision, which includes a mission to create an environment to develop student-athletes mentally, physically and spiritually to reach their full potential and to be successful in life after football.

In his previous post before Rutgers, Ash served as co-defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Ohio State and helped lead the Buckeyes to the 2014 national championship.

In his five seasons as a defensive coordinator, Ash pioneered four groups ranked in the top 25 statistically, including a top-10 defensive unit in 2015. As the defense coordinator at Wisconsin in 2011 and 2012, the Badgers put together back-to-back seasons ranked 15th overall in total defense. The 2011 squad was 13th in scoring defense while the 2012 team turned in a 17th-place ranking.

Ash was hired by Ohio State head coach Urban Meyer in January 2014 to improve a Buckeye defense that placed 112th in pass defense and 47th in total defense in 2013. In his first season, OSU’s defense ranked 19th nationally in total defense and 29th in pass defense. The Buckeyes also ranked fourth in the country with 24 interceptions en route to Big Ten, Sugar Bowl and national championships.

In 2015, the Ohio State defense continued its strides under Ash, ranking second in scoring defense nationally and ninth-best in total defense. The Buckeyes earned a berth in the Fiesta Bowl, finishing the season with a 12-1 record after defeating Notre Dame in the bowl game.

The 2016 NFL Draft saw numerous players from Ash’s defensive unit selected, including the first overall defensive player in Joey Bosa, who was picked third by the San Diego Chargers. In all, the draft featured six defensive players taken from Ohio State with three in the first round.

Prior to taking over the OSU defense, Ash held the defensive coordinator post and coached the secondary at the University of Arkansas in the Southeastern Conference in 2013 under head coach Bret Bielema. He helped improve Arkansas’ pass defense in his one season in Fayetteville, with the Razorbacks’ defense finishing 72nd nationally in passing yards allowed after ranking 113th in 2012.

Ash was first promoted to the defensive coordinator role in the Big Ten while at the University of Wisconsin, where he spent three seasons with the Badgers. His 2011 defense led the Big Ten (conference games only) in total defense and pass defense efficiency, and it ranked fourth nationally in fewest passing yards allowed (163.6), 13th in scoring (19.0) and 15th in total defense (316.4). In 2012, the UW defense ranked 15th nationally in total defense (322.5), 17th in scoring (19.1), 18th in fewest passing yards allowed (193.6), 22nd in pass efficiency and 24th against the run (128.9).

Ash began his coaching career as a defensive graduate assistant at his alma mater, Drake University, in 1997. He was promoted to defensive coordinator for the next two seasons before moving on to Iowa State University in 2000. Ash spent eight seasons over two different stints in Ames, including the 2009 season, during which current Texas head coach Tom Herman was also on the staff. Ash progressed from graduate assistant with the Cyclones in 2000-01 to defensive backs coach for a total of six seasons.

Ash spent the 2007 and 2008 seasons at San Diego State University as the defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator under head coach and College Football Hall of Fame inductee Chuck Long.

Ash has produced numerous instructional videos, including a three-video series -- “Aggressive 4-3 Defense” -- that includes shutting down the passing game and stuffing the run segments. He has coached 34 different players that have gone on to sign NFL contracts.

A native of Ottumwa, Iowa, Ash earned his undergraduate degree from Drake in 1996, and was a two-time letterwinner at defensive back for the Bulldogs. He is one of three from that era of Drake football who became a FBS head coach, joining Dave Doeren (NC State) and Charlie Partridge (formerly with Florida Atlantic). Ash completed his master’s degree in education from Iowa State in 2005.

Ash and his wife, Doreen, are the parents of a son, Brady and daughter, Alexis. Ash also has a son, Tanner, and a daughter, Jacey.
