

HILL TAKES THE HELM

Fred Hill begins his first season as head coach of the Rutgers baseball program. Hill replaces Matt Bolger who retired after serving as head coach of the Rutgers Scarlet Knights for 23 seasons.

Hill comes to Rutgers by way of Montclair State College, where he built one of the finest NCAA Division III baseball programs in the nation.

As the skipper of the Montclair State Indians for seven seasons, Hill compiled a fine 148-91-2 record. He saw his most productive results come in 1983, a season that won Hill NCAA District III "Coach of the Year" accolades.

In 1983, the Indians posted a 31-14 record and won the Mid-Atlantic Regional Championships, thus qualifying as one of only six teams to appear in the Division III World Series. The Indians, however, dropped two games in the series.

Under Hill's guidance the Indians also appeared in the Mid-Atlantic playoffs in 1978 and 1982 and won New Jersey State Athletic Conference titles in 1978, 1980 and 1983

In addition to his baseball coaching duties with the Indians, Hill also served as head coach of the Montclair State football team. In his seven-year tenure, Hill equalled the success he enjoyed on the baseball diamond as the Montclair gridders established themselves as one of the top teams in Division III football. In seven years the Indians put together a 52-16-4 mark under Hill.

The fine success that has followed Fred Hill as a head coach is a carbon copy of the triumphs he achiev-

ed as a scholastic and collegiate athlete.

Attending Clifford J. Scott High School in East Orange, New Jersey, Hill was a stellar three-sport athlete. He won 11 varsity letters with four coming in football and baseball and three in basketball.

Serving as the team captain in all three sports, Hill went on to earn many All-State honors.

On the gridiron, Hill was named to the First Team All-State (All-Group) team in addition to receiving Second Team All-Metropolitan honors. On the hardwood Hill won First Team All-State Group II honors and on the baseball diamond he was a Second Team All-State (All-Group) choice as well as being a First Team (Group II) selection.

Hill capped his high school athletic career by being named the school's "Most Outstanding Athlete" in 1953.

The all-round athlete decided to

continue his academic and athletic careers in New Jersey and enrolled at Upsala College.

At Upsala, Hill continued to excel in athletics as he gathered a total of 11 varsity letters in football, basketball and baseball.

As a running back on the Upsala football team, Hill was the leading ground gainer for four seasons as well as leading the team in scoring for three seasons. Based on his accomplishments, Hill was named "Most Valuable Back" from 1954-56 and ended-up his career by receiving Little All-America honors.

As a three-year basketball letterwinner, Hill won the "Most Improved Player" Award in 1955 and ended his basketball campaign as a team co-captain.

Hill also continued to enjoy success in baseball. As a four-year letterwinner, he saw his best year come in 1956 when he led the team in hitting.

Upsala College named Hill the "Most Outstanding Athlete" in 1955, 1956 and 1957.

Following graduation from Upsala College, Hill decided to continue his baseball career playing for the Washington Senators organization. After spending a year with the Senators, Hill made the choice to become involved with coaching.

His first stop in the coaching ranks was in 1959 when he returned to Upsala as coach of the freshman baseball team. Hill also was on the coaching staff of the East Orange Soverals, a semi-probaseball team in the Essex County League.

After spending a year in both positions, Hill returned to his scholastic stomping grounds to be assistant coach of the Clifford Scott baseball team, a position he held for five years until he was named head coach.

As head coach of Clifford Scott from 1965 to 1970, Hill's teams compiled a 94-58 record, including two State Sectional Championships.

At Clifford Scott, Hill had his first taste of football coaching, serving as the head man from 1966-1970.

In 1970, Hill took over the head football and assistant baseball coaching duties at Pequannock High School. After holding both positions for four years, along with coaching the Verona American Legion baseball team that won the State Championship in 1974, Hill moved on to become the assistant baseball coach at Upsala College, where he stayed until 1977 when he took over the head job at Montclair State.





1984 SCARLET KNIGHTS BASEBALL OUTLOOK

With a schedule that includes some of the top teams in the East, as well as in the New Jersey area, Fred Hill is preparing his young Scarlet Knights for a challenging 1984 season.

"We have a tough schedule and we'll just have to see how our kids handle it," says Hill.

Hill will find out very quickly just where his freshman-dominated team stands as they open up the new season in Miami, Florida against Southern Illinois and Miami, among others.

"Right now we look very solid defensively and our pitching staff has some experience, however, I just don't know how many runs we'll score," noted Hill.

During a 17-game fall schedule, Hill and his staff had the opportunity to evaluate the talent they had to work with for the coming season.

"We entered the fall season with the attitude that we are going to concentrate more on watching how the players would perform in certain situations as opposed to what happened in the game," Hill explained.

Hill's overall impression of the team is quite a favorable one, though he shy's away from the question of how the team will do this year. "I really don't know that much about the teams that we are playing, especially the ones in our conference, however we have a lot of questions that must be answered first."

The new Rutgers skipper continued, "One thing I will say is that the players are working very hard to ready themselves for the season and they also have great attitudes."

Here is how coach Hill sizes up the 1984 Scarlet Knights baseball team:

HITTING

The Scarlet Knights return the leading hitter from a year ago in junior Don McSherry (.321) and the leading run producer in senior Gary Elefante (29). Elefante also paced the team in triples in 1983 with three. Adding a much needed punch to the lumber department is junior Tony Grundhauser. Grundhauser, a .302 career hitter, batted .270 last season.

PITCHING

Pitching is one of the brighter spots with five hurlers who saw considerable action last year returning. Leading the way will be junior Tom Kingsley. The right-handed Kingsley led the staff as he recorded 33 strike-outs in 1983. Two other right-handers, Andy Kulinski and Duane Stupienski, should strengthen the Rutgers pitching staff. Two lefties return to help even out the pitching rotation. Junior Aaron Vander Horn and sophomore Al Mejia are back and will get some southpaw assistance from two freshmen, Bob Mac Donald and Paul Schwendel. Mac Donald was 11-1 last year at Point Pleasant Boro High School and Swindel went on to win All-State honors as a senior at Jefferson High School.

INFIELD

Fred Hill calls the infield the "soundest part of his team" as a veteren lineup returns. Senior Mark Germann, a three-year starter, returns to man the hot corner at third base and Tony Grundhauser is back at shortstop. Grundhauser led the team in assists last year with 102 while compiling a .925 fielding percentage.

OUTFIELD

Questions abide in the outfield as three relatively inexperienced players will battle for full-time duty. Senior Pat Douglas, who was not on the team last year, looks to be a candidate for one of the positions along with Don McSherry. McSherry, a first baseman a year ago, will take his .976 fielding average to the outfield. The other outfield position looks to go to freshman Sean Kauffman. Kauffman comes to Rutgers from Toms River South High School and possesses an excellent arm and fine speed.

CATCHING

Last year's leading fielder, Gary Elefante (.984) will be the man behind the plate. Elefante's back-up will be junior Steve Matarante.






PAT DOUGLAS, Junior, Outfield, Willingboro, NJ.

Dr. Edward J. Bloustein President

The 17th president of Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, Dr. Edward J. Bloustein is at once a lawyer, a political theorist, a former political analyst for the State Department, professional philosopher and an international scholar and educator.

And he is without a doubt Rutgers' number one sports buff, present and urging on the Scarlet Knights at every sporting event that he is able to attend.

Dr. Bloustein, who attended James Monroe High School in the Bronx, was educated at New York University's Washington Square College, where he was a Phi Beta Kappa graduate in 1948. He went on to earn a Bachelor of Philosophy degree at Wadham College of Oxford University in 1950 after attending Oxford as a Fulbright Scholar. He earned a Ph.D. in philosophy at Cornell University in 1954 and received a J.D. degree from the Cornell University School of Law in 1959.

Dr. Bloustein was a lecturer in the Philosophy of the Law and Social Philosophy at Brooklyn College in 1950-51 and instructor of Logic and Philosophy at Cornell in 1954-55. He also served as a political analyst for the State Department in 1951-52 and again in 1955-56.

Dr. Bloustein served as a law clerk to Judge Stanley H. Fuld of the New York State Court of Appeals from 1959-61 and then joined the faculty of the New York University School of Law. Dr. Bloustein, who reached the rank of full professor in 1964, served on the NYU faculty until 1965. During the 1964-65 academic year, Dr. Bloustein taught torts and jurisprudence at NYU.

When Dr. Bloustein assumed the presidency of Rutgers in 1971, the eighth oldest university in the United States, he had been president, since 1965, of Bennington College, a small, highly-regarded experimental liberal arts college in Bennington, Vt.

As befits a man of logical thought and training, Dr. Bloustein is a decisive administrator and is constantly challenging the future.



Frederick E. Gruninger
Director of Athletics

A member of the Rutgers Athletic Department since 1964 Fred Gruninger assumed the duties of Athletic Director in January, 1973, and is now in his 10th year as head of the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics. His leadership has beer one of indefatigable effort, unbridled enthusiasm and confident energy, combined with a deep interest in the student athlete.

A 1953 Rutgers graduate, Gruninger played football and baseball as a collegiate athlete and later excelled at golf, turning to the professional links for a brief period. As the Scarle Knights golf coach from 1964 to 1973, Gruninger recorded ar outstanding 109-30-2 record. Prior to his appointment at Director of Athletics in 1973, Gruninger served as assistant then associate athletic director for nine years after a five-year stint in the alumni relations department.

Gruninger's aggressive leadership, during which Rutgers has fielded an undefeated football team, a men's basketball squad which won 31 consecutive games and advanced to the NCAA Final Four, a women's basketball team which has beer ranked among the best in the nation, and a women's swimming team which won 28 straight meets, the intercollegiate athletic program has grown from 16 men's sports to 29 programs for both men and women. His scheduling expertise has generated football contests with such major opponents as Penn State Alabama, Tennessee and Pittsburgh, among others.


During the 1978-79 and 1979-80 seasons, Gruninger served as president of the Eastern Athletic Association, one of the East's top intercollegiate conferences.
