Take closest Hudson River crossing to reach New Jersey Turnpike into New Jersey. Follow Turnpike directions above.

FROM LONG ISLAND AND STATEN ISLAND:

Take Verrazano Bridge and Outerbridge Crossing into New Jersey. Follow signs to Route 287 North. Follow above directions.

FROM SOUTH JERSEY **VIA GARDEN STATE PARKWAY:**

Leave Parkway North at Exit 127. Follow signs to Route 287 North and follow directions above.

FROM TRENTON/PHILADELPHIA AREA:

Via New Jersey Turnpike: Leave Turnpike at Exit 9. Follow 18 West/North thru New Brunswick and over the Lynch Bridge. Go straight at the traffic light on to Metlars Lane. At the first traffic light make a right onto Avenue E.

Via Route 1: Route 1 North to Route 18 West/North and follow above directions.

FROM THE WEST AND **NORTHWEST VIA 287 SOUTH**



HEAD COACH: FRED HILL



FRED HILL

Dedicated: Noah Webster defines it as, "to set apart seriously for a special purpose; devote to some work, duty, etc." At Rutgers, it's simply defined as Fred Hill.

Coming to Rutgers last season, Hill had a mission: to build a winner at Rutgers as he had at every stop previous to New Brunswick, and, although last year's work may not show it, he has laid the groundwork for a baseball power at Rutgers.

Prior to taking over the reins at The State University of New Jersey,

Hill guided the Montclair State program and built it into one of the finest Division III programs in the nation. Hill spent seven seasons with the Indians where he compiled a 148-91-2 record. The highlight of his seven-year stint at Montclair came in 1983 when the Indians finished 31-14 and won the Mid-Atlantic Regional Championships. For his efforts, Hill was honored as NCAA Division III "Coach of the Year".

In addition to his baseball duties, Hill also was in command of Montclair's football program, putting together a 52-16-4 career record.

A 1957 graduate of Upsala College, Hill enjoyed tremendous success as an undergraduate, earning 11 varsity letters in three sports. In baseball, Hill received four letters and saw his best season as a junior by leading Upsala in hitting.

In football, the little running back was Upsala's leading rusher for four seasons as well as its leading scorer three times. For his accomplishments, he was named Most Valuable Back for the 1954, 1955 and 1956 seasons and capped off his career by being honored as a little All-American.

In basketball, Hill earned three varsity letters and garnered the Most Improved Player award in 1957. For all of his work, Upsala named Hill the Most Outstanding Athlete in 1955, 1956, and 1957.

Upon graduation, Hill began his coaching career after a brief stint with the Washington Senators. He returned to his alma mater in 1959

to assume the coaching duties of the freshman baseball team. At the same time, he served on the coaching staff at the East Orange Soverals, a semi-pro league in the Essex County league.

After a year, Hill went to the high school level to be an assistant at his old haunt, Clifford Scott High School in East Orange. After serving as an assistant for five years, Hill took control of the program in 1965 and led Scott to a six-year mark of 94-58, including two State sectional championships. While at Scott, Hill also served as its head football coach from 1966 to 1970.

In 1970, Hill moved on to Pequannock High School where he was both head baseball coach and football coach. Hill stayed at Pequannock for four years before going back to Upsala as an assistant baseball coach. He remained at Upsala until 1977 when he took over at Montclair State.

Now, at Rutgers, it is just a matter of time before the Scarlet Knights begin to reap the benefits of Fred Hill's many years of baseball knowledge. Known for his hard work and dedication, one can always find Fred Hill at the batting cage, bullpen or his office. No matter where, he'll be talking baseball.

Fred and his wife, Evelyn, reside in Verona and have six children, Nancy, Fred, Linda, Jim, Tracey, and Karen.

Hill will be assisted by Norm Schoenig, Chris Moran and Rick Matarante.

ASSISTANT COACHES




NORM SCHOENIG

Norm is entering his ninth season as an assistant under Fred Hill. Schoenig was in charge of the "B" program at Montclair State for two seasons where he had outstanding success. He then took over the responsibility of developing the pitching staff and has done an excellent job in that position. The Montclair State graduate has continued his fine work with the Scarlet Knights pitching corp and will again hold the duties in 1985 along with his coaching duties as the third base coach.

Schoenig is also involved with recruiting and is in charge of the summer baseball program. Schoenig resides in Verona with his wife, Pat, and daughter, Janine.

"Norm is a very fine baseball



CHRIS MORAN

Chris is entering his second season as an assistant to Fred Hill. The Rutgers gaduate will have the responsibility of coaching the Rutgers "B" team in its inagural season. While playing for the Scarlet Knights from 1980 to 1983, Moran hit .335 with eight home runs and 81 RBI's. The Hamilton Square native had his best year in 1981 when he hit .413, belting five home runs and knocking in 31 runs. In his junior year, Moran was the second-leading

hitter on the squad with a .367 average and he led the team in runs batted in (30), hits (33) and toal bases (51). A fine power hitter in college, the Scarlet Knights will reap the benefits from Moran's hitting experience.



RICK MATARANTE

Rick joins the coaching staff this season after playing for the Scarlet Knights for four seasons. A teamate of Moran at Rutgers, Matarante hit .305 in his four-year stint. He led the team in hitting in his junior year with a .425 average. An excellent base runner, Matarante was also the team leader in stolen bases with 14. His .568 on-base percentage and .466 slugging percentage were among the team leaders as well.

1985 SCARLET KNIGHTS BASEBALL OUTLOOK

Defense! That was the story for the Scarlet Knights in 1984 as they finished the season as the best fielding team in the nation, committing just 32 errors in 1,138 chances for a .972 fielding percentage.

This season, Fred Hill, entering his second full season as the Scarlet skipper, will complement the Scarlet defense with solid young pitching arms and a much-improved offensive attack.

Hill and his coaching staff has prepared the squad for a challenging 1985 schedule which will include national powers Miami and Seton Hall and area powers William Paterson, Montclair State and St. John's. The Scarlet Knights will also battle Atlantic 10 Conference foes, highlighted by a three-game series against defending A-10 champion Temple.

"We think we made a lot of progress," noted Hill. "We have a lot of fine players. But the big thing is how we will respond to league and schedule pressure."

Hill has brought a fine crop of freshmen, including six outstanding pitching prospects, to go along with an experienced group of returnees.

"I think we're going to benefit from playing the young kids last year," said Hill. "We should be a better hitting team and we should score more runs. Overall, we will be a better offensive team."

However, Hill says the key of the season may be pitching.

"The big question mark right now is pitching," says Hill. "Even though we've improved, we have to get a better performance than we did last year."

The Rutgers mentor continued, "We had a good fall and the players" work habits have been excellent." Here is how the Scarlet Knights baseball team looks for the 1985 season:

HITTING

Senior Don McSherry, the Scarlet Knights' leading hitter for the past two seasons, returns to the line-up giving the Knights a legitimate power-hitter. McSherry hit .397 a year ago with six doubles, two triples, a team-high four home runs and 27 RBI's. But McSherry won't be the only offensive threat. Adding to the Scarlet offensive attack will be lead-off hitter Tony Grundhauser (.321, seven doubles), sophomore Joe Lynch (.413, in the fall) and freshman Sam Ferretti (.321, 13 RBI's in the fall). Overall the Knights will be a much more balanced team at the plate and with the combination of power and speed, the Rutgers team will be putting more runs up on the board.

PITCHING

The Scarlet Knights' opponents will see six new faces on the mound when they battle the Scarlet hurlers as six freshmen join the pitching staff. Assistant coach Norm Schoenig's hard work with the pitching corps payed-off near the end of the season when Rutgers received a number of fine outings. Two lefthanders will lead the pitching staff - sophomore Bob MacDonald and senior Aaron VanderHorn. Bob went 5-3 last season with a 4.15 ERA while Aaron finished with a 1-4 mark and an ERA of 9.35. Scholastic strike-out artist Noel Gluck, a freshman, looked very impressive in the fall and will be used extensively by Fred Hill. Last year's late inning relievers Matt Shaffery (junior) and Steve Redrup (sophomore) should, again, add strength to the Scarlet bullpen.

INFIELD

Senior Tony Grundhauser will return at shortstop for the fourth season to solidify a young but talented infield. Grundhauser, a slick, sure-handed fielder, led the team in assists with 87 and finished the season with a fielding percentage of .950. Third base may be occupied by either Duane Stupienski or Scott Trochim. Both will have the unenviable task of trying to fill Mark Germann's shoes a 1984 draft choice of the Cincinnati Reds. At second base will be freshman Sam Ferretti and at first base will be either Doug Donofrio (sophomore) or Paul Johnson (freshman). Both are more than capable of filling that position.

OUTFIELD

Three returnees will give the Scarlet Knights a solid outfield. Sophomore Paul Schwendel will start in left field while All-American candidate Don McSherry moves from left field, where he played last season, to right field. After seeing some action last season, sophomore Sean Kauffman will start in center field. Kauffman, from Toms River South High School, possesses and excellent arm and fine speed.

CATCHING

Sophomore Joe Lynch looks like the starter behind the plate and is the only Scarlet Knight with experience. Backing up Lynch will be freshmen John Quinn and C.J. Reggie, playing his first year with the Scarlet Knights.






DOUG DONOFRIO






GARY GERAGHTY




NOEL GLUCK




STEVEN HOOEY




PAUL JOHNSON






JOE LYNCH

RUTGERS, THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW JERSEY



Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, with over 49,000 students on seven campuses in New Brunswick, Piscataway, Newark, and Camden, is one of the major state university systems in the nation. Chartered in 1766 as Queen's College, the eighth institution of higher learning to be founded in the colonies before the revolutionary war, it opened its doors in New Brunswick in 1771 with one instructor, one sophomore, and a handful of freshmen.

In 1825, the name of the college was changed to Rutgers to honor the former trustee and revolutionary war veteren Colonel Henry Rutgers. Rutgers College became the land-grant institution of New Jersey in 1864, and, in the same year, the trustees established Rutgers Scientific School, granting the B.S. degree. In 1880, the State Experiment Station for agricultural research was organized, and, in 1914, engineering was granted separate status as the College of Engineering. In 1921, the College of Agriculture (renamed Cook College in 1973) drew together the State Experiment Station, resident instruction, and the Extension programs.

Douglass College was established in 1918 as the New Jersey College for Women. In 1924, the School of Education, which later became the Graduate School of Education, was authorized, as was the title Rutger University. In 1926, the University Extension Service (now known as the Division of Continuing Education) was organized. The College of Pharmacy, which was founded in 1892, joined the university in 1927. In 1934, University College was established for adult evening students, with branches in New Brunswick and Newark.

In 1945, the state legislature affirmed state support for the university, and the entire institution was "collectively designated as the State University of New Jersey." In 1956, it became Rutgers – The State University.

The university expanded significantly in the forties and fifties in Newark and Camden. The University of Newark became a part of Rutgers in 1946, adding the Newark College of Arts and Sciences, the School of Law – Newark, and a school of business administration (now the Graduate School of Management) to the university system. In 1956, the College of Nursing was organized in Newark. In 1950, the College of South Jersey in Camden was incorporated into the Rutgers structure as the Camden College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Law – Camden, and a University College branch was set up.

Since the 1950's Rutgers University has continued to grow, especially in the area of graduate education. The Graduate Faculty became the Graduate School in 1952 and since that time the following graduate schools have been established: the Graduate School of Library and information Studies (formerly the Graduate School of Library Service) in 1953; the Graduate School of Social Work in 1954; the School of Criminal Justice (Newark) in 1974; and the Graduate School of Applied and Professional Psychology in 1974. Also in 1974, the Graduate Faculty of Rutgers – Newark received degree-granting authority, and, in 1981, the Graduate School – Camden became a separate unit. In addition, numerous specialized institutes and research centers have been established over the years.

At the undergraduate level, Livingston College was founded in 1969, emphasizing the urban environment. In 1976, the Mason Gross School of the Arts was established offering both undergraduate and graduate programs.

Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, will continue to grow, its direction dictated by the needs of the society it serves.

DR. EDWARD J. BLOUSTEIN - PRESIDENT

Edward J. Bloustein, the 17th president of Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, is a philosopher, lawyer, scholar and political activist.

Inaugurated as president of one of the largest universities in the country in 1971, he resolved to maintain a university "where men and women of good will may join together in restoring confidence in the institution of reason," calling the university a place "where reason resides."

Despite the vortex of campus tensions over the Vietnamese War, civil rights, university organization and traditional education, despite student protests and disruptions at Rutgers and nationwide, Dr. Bloustein worked to reinforce the role of reason within the University.

From the time of his inauguration, he has been outspoken about the role of the university, civil rights, women's rights, the difference between dissent and disruption, and about the mission of Rutgers in serving a new, more urban and more heterogeneous student population. In recent years, he has advocated a new partnership between the University and developing high technology industries in New Jersey.

Dr. Bloustein, who attended James Monroe High School in the Bronx, was also educated at New Yorks University's Washington Square College where he was a Phi Beta Kappa graduate in 1948. He went on to earn a Bachelor of Philosophy degree at Wadham College of Oxford University in 1950, attending Oxford as a Fulbright Scholar. He earned a Ph.D. in philosophy at Cornell and a J.D. degree from the Cornell School of Law in 1959.

Between 1965 and his inaugural at Rutgers, he was president of Bennington College, a small, highly regarded experimental liberal arts college in Vermont.


Recently, Dr. Bloustein took on the leadership of a national project to examine the purpose of State Research Universities in the 21st century. He did so as part of his current chairmanship of the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges.

Throughout his tenure, he has expressed his moral, ethical and educational philospohies openly and clearly through public statements and organizational commitments.

When Dr. Bloustein was about to assume the presidency of Rutgers, a local newspaper editorial noted that "the presidency of Rutgers, The State University, is an island of controversy surrounded by rebellious students, an independent faculty, a strong-willed governor, an ambitious bureaucracy, ax-wielding legislatures and a pinch-penny system of taxation."

Many aspects of that portrait have moderated in the past 13 years, but the role of the Rutgers president is still difficult. This year, a presitigious committee is expected to issue a major report on the future financing of the State University which will again find the Rutgers president in the center of a major reexamination of how Rutgers can achieve its goal of becoming one of the best state universities in the nation.

Dr. Bloustein is married to Dr. Ruth Ellen Steinman, a pediatrician, and they are the parents of two daughters, Elise and Lori.

FREDERICK E. GRUNINGER - DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Fred Gruninger has overseen the growth of the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics from 16 men's varsity sports a decade ago, to 32 today, including 16 women's teams. The 1953 Rutgers graduate took over the Division reins in 1973 and his aggressive leadership has vaulted Rutgers onto the national scene in a number of sports.

During his tenure as Director, the highlights have been an undefeated football team, eight post-season basketball appearances keynoted by the 1975-76 squad which won 31 consecutive gmes and advanced to the Final Four, and the women's basketball squad which won the AIAW national championship in 1982. Other teams and individuals have also participated in post-season events. Five teams – golf, lacrosse, lightweight crew, soccer and softball – qualified for post-season play in 1983-84.

A life-long New Jerseyan, Gruninger was born in East Orange, attended Scotch Plains High School, taught and coached at Rahway High School, earned a master's degree from Rutgers in 1961, and has been a member of the Rutgers administration since 1959. In 1965, he began his career in intercollegiate athletic administration and his athletic ties to the State of New Jersey have been long and continuous, spanning some 35 years as a student athlete, coach and administrator.

Following military service, Gruninger first returned to Rahway High School and then to Rutgers as Executive Director of the Rutgers Fund, then becoming Executive Secretary of the Rutgers Alumni Association and Associate Director of the alumni group. In 1964, he became a member of the athletic administration as Assistant to the Director charged with coordinating and cultivating the secondary school recruitment program for all sports.

He was named Assistant Athletic Director in 1968, and, three years later, was appointed Associate Athletic Director.

In addition to his administrative duties, Gruninger coached the Scarlet golf team between 1963 and 1972, recording a 109-30-2 mark and taking both teams and individuals to numerous post-season tournaments. He was also a member of the International Association of Basketball Officials and the intercollegiate official's organization for a period of 16 years until his appointment as Director of Athletics at the State University.

The energetic and enthusiastic administrator has held numerous offices in state, regional and national athletic organizations. He is currently a member of the Board of Directors of the College Football Association (CFA) and also serves on the director's board of the Major Independent Football Association. He is presently a member of the NCAA Post-Season Football Committee.

Gruninger was one of the organizing committee members for the College Athletic Administrators of New Jersey (CAANJ) and served as its first president. He has also served on many Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) committees and is a past president of several affiliate groups. He served as president of the Eastern 8 (now, Atlantic 10) Conference, also.

Locally, Gruninger has served as a member of the board of directors for the Raritan Valley Chamber of Commerce, the Heart Fund and the Multiple Sclerosis Fund and was a member of his Township Grrenacres Committee. He serves on the tournament committee of the New Jersey State Golf Association.

A resident of Martinsville, Gruninger is the efficient manager of programs that involve over 1,000 studentathletes and over 100 full and part-time coaches and support staff members.

Gruninger and his wife, Barbara, are the parents of two sons – Mark, a graduate student in Ceramic Engineering at Rutgers and Jack, a Bridgewater Raritan-East student active in football, basketball and baseball. Daughter Katherine is a senior at Lafayette College where she will be a co-captain of the Leopard's women's basketball team in 1984-85.
