RUTGERS HEAD COACH FRED HILL



The Rutgers Baseball program is one of the best in the Atlantic 10 and one of the best in the Northeast because of Fred Hill.

Because of a tireless and relentless dedication to making the Rutgers program one of the best in college baseball, his efforts are reknowned in the Northeast and his results are nothing short of outstanding. He has guided the Scarlet Knights to five NCAA

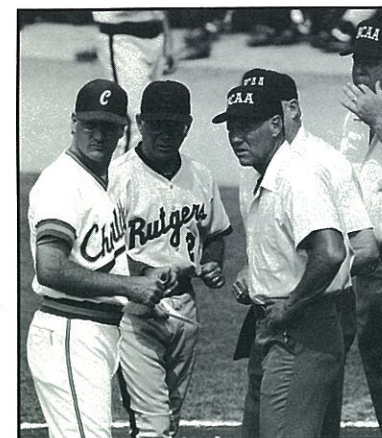
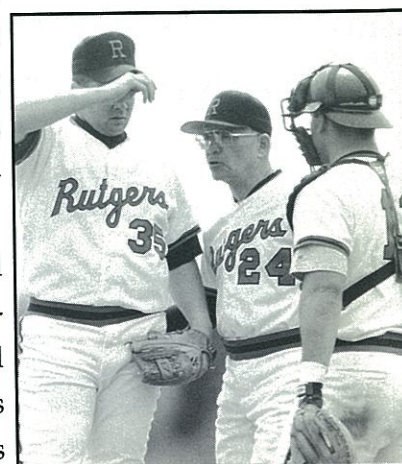
Championships in the last eight years, one of only two programs to accomplish this in the Northeast. His domination of the Atlantic 10 is well documented. He has been selected the conference's Coach of the Year for the past three seasons and his winning percentage in conference games is an unbelievable 709.

A coach for over 18 years, Hill had had only one a losing season. Beginning his baseball coaching career at Montclair State University, he guided the Red Hawks to 151 wins and three post-season appearances. Hill took MSU to the Division III World Series once and was named District III Coach of the Year in 1983.

When he arrived at Rutgers in 1984, he began building a powerhouse. In just his third season, he guided the Scarlet to the Atlantic 10 Championship and the NCAA Tournament. That is where the ball began rolling. In the following seasons, he directed Rutgers to four more conference championship and NCAA Tournaments. He has won over 300 games "On The Banks" and has an incredible .629 winning percentage.

Twice Rutgers has won a school record 38 games, the first time in 1988, and most recently in 1993. In 1990, he took the Scarlet to the brink of the College World Series, advancing the team to the finals of the East Region where the team lost to eventual national champion Georgia. To get to that point, Rutgers defeated three Top 20 teams (Maine, North Carolina, and Georgia) in successive games.

Hill couldn't have been this successful without some great players. Possibly his greatest attribute is his ability to teach the game and develop talent. During his tenure, four players have earned All-America honors and 22 players



relief pitcher for the Detroit Tigers. There are several Scarlet Knights in other Major League organizations.

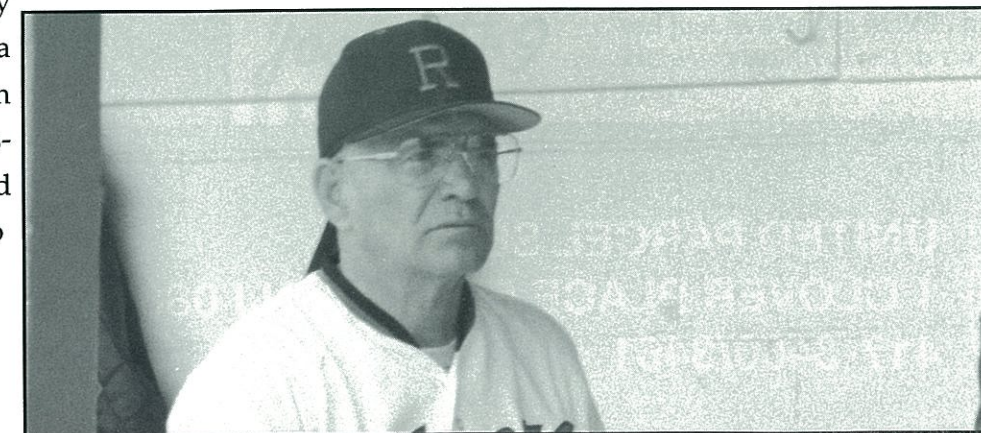
Hill has also seen many of his assistants move on and become very successful head coaches. Former Hill assistant Norm Schoenig guided the Montclair State Red Hawks to the Division III National Championship in 1993 and was named Division III Coach of the Year.

Another former assistant Mike Garlatti is now a primary scout for the the Colorado Rockies, and former player Joe Lynch was the head coach at Kean College.

A resident of New Jersey his entire life, Hill earned an amazing 11 varsity letters as a standout college athlete at Upsala University. An 1957 graduate, Hill earned four letters in baseball, four in football, and three in basketball.

He led the baseball team in batting twice, was named the football team's Most Valuable Back three times, and the basketball team's Most Improved Player his senior year. Chosen as Small College All-American following his final football season, Hill was honored by his alma mater, in 1992, as a distinguished alumnus who

have signed professional contracts including three Scarlet Knights last season. In fact, two Hill disciples star in the the Major Leagues. Eric Young now plays for the Colorado Rockies and Bob MacDonald is a

has achieved excellence in his chosen profession.

After his graduation, he began his coaching career as freshman baseball coach at Upsala and also played semi-pro baseball for the East Orange Soverals.

His next move was to Clifford Scott High School, where he was an assistant baseball coach for five years and head coach for another six. During those six years, Hill led the Scotties to a 94-58 record, two state sectional championships, and also served time as an assistant football coach. He moved on to coach the Pequannock High School football team for four years and then returned to Upsala as an assistant baseball coach for three years.

In 1977, he was named head baseball and football coach at Montclair State. In his career with Montclair State, he developed the baseball team into a Division III power, winning 62 per cent of his games and earning a trip to the Division III World Series. There he also developed Sam Mills, now an inside linebacker and Pro Bowl selection for the New Orleans Saints, and Jay Aldrich, a Major League ballplayer with two different organizations. For these contributions and many more to the Montclair State Athletic Department, he was selected to their Sports Hall of Fame in 1991.

The tremendously successful and decorated head coach is just as dedicated to his family. He lives in Verona with his wife Evelyn and has six children: Nancy, Fred Jr., Linda, Jim, Tracey, and Karen. He and

Evelyn also have three grandchildren; Jessica, Danielle, and Brian, named after Fred's brother Brian, now the head coach of the Orlando Magic in the NBA.

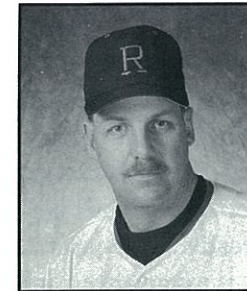

PITCHING COACH

Tom Baxter is now in his fifth season with the Scarlet Knights. Baxter is the Scarlet Knight pitching coach and a top recruiter.

In his five-year career, he has seen eight of his pitchers drafted, and one, Bob MacDonald, is a reliever for the Detroit Tigers.

Last season, the Scarlet Knights posted a slim 3.96 team ERA. The team's ace, Phil Schneider was drafted by the Colorado Rockies.

Prior to his arrival at Rutgers, Baxter spent six years as a high school coach in Hudson County. In 1984, he began a three-year

stint at Dickinson High School in Jersey City before moving to his alma mater, Marist High School in Bayonne.

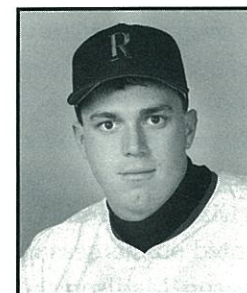
Baxter was very successful at Marist, leading the team to the 1988 Parochial B State Championship. While at Marist, one of his players, Joe Borowski was named All-State and selected by the Chicago White Sox on the 1989 Major League Baseball Amateur draft, himself.

A stellar ballplayer at Marist, Baxter was an All-State selection following a 16-0 senior season.

He accepted a full scholarship to the University of Miami following his senior year. At Miami, he helped lead the Hurricanes to the 1973 College World Series with an 8-3 record.

He left Miami to join the Oakland A's organization where he developed arm trouble after two seasons, ending his career.

Tom and his wife Terri reside in Brick, NJ and have two children, T.J. (seven) and Mary Kate (four) and Claire.

A 1986 All-American, Glen Gardner is now in his fourth season with Rutgers, and his main responsibilities are to work with the hitters and coach third base.

He was one of the all-time great hitters in Scarlet Knight history. Gardner holds the Scarlet Knight record for at-bats (237) and doubles (22) in a season, (1988), and career marks in hits (201), doubles (44) and total bases (336).

Gardner also ranks among Rutgers' top

10 in 11 offensive categories.

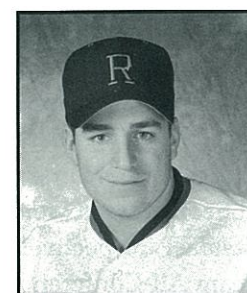
Last season, a pair of Gardner pupils, Mike Higgins and Doug Alongi, had the most memorable seasons in years.

Alongi set Scarlet Knight records for runs, hits, total bases and stolen bases. Higgins set the standard in RBI and stands second in doubles, third in walks.

For most of the season, Rutgers, as a team, batted over .300 before finishing with a .298 average.

While an outfielder for Rutgers, Gardner was an All-Atlantic 10 honoree three times and drafted twice. In 1987, the San Diego Padres chose him in the 13th round. He opted to stay at RU and was selected by Atlanta the next year.

Gardner advanced to Sumpter, SC in the the Atlanta Braves Organization before being struck in eye by a batted ball, which ended his career.

Litterio begins his first year with the Scarlet Knights after two seasons as the teams second baseman.

Known for his defense, Litterio committed just five errors in 263 chances last season. He was also involved in turning 36 double plays.

When it mattered the most, Litterio played his best. His glove work in the Atlantic 10 Tournament put him second in the MVP voting, and he hit his first career HR against Clemson in the ensuing NCAA tournament.

While finishing his undergraduate studies, Litterio will work with the infielders and assist coach Hill with the day-to-day responsibilities of the program.

The goals have been the same for the Rutgers baseball program since Fred Hill became the coach: win the Atlantic 10, win an NCAA Regional, compete in the College World Series. Every Scarlet Knight believes this is possible and every Scarlet Knight does his best to achieve those goals.

Each year different Scarlet Knights are asked to step up and contribute to the team more than they have before. This year is no different. There are some heavy losses to make up for, but with the outstanding recruiting and development through the system coach Hill has designed, there is no doubt that there are Scarlet Knights who will "Step Up."

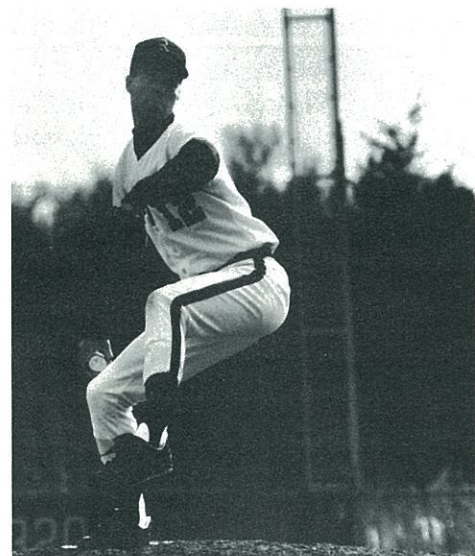
As always, the Scarlet Knights will be a team built around pitching and defense. This was most prevalent last season when Rutgers had a team ERA of just over 3.5 and the defense finished seventh in the nation.

What may be the biggest factor in the Scarlet season is the depth of the team. Throughout fall practice and winter conditioning, the work ethic, the competition and the dedication displayed by almost every ballplayer was more than encouraging. In fact, this may be the hardest working team coach Hill has had in years.

A fierce battle has been waged to replace five position players and two starting pitchers. As a result, more Scarlet Knights will enter the lineup than in the past, another factor that may bode well for a team determined to make a post-season run.

PITCHING

The pitching is one of the cornerstones this team is built on. Returning for the Scarlet are three regulars of the pitching rotation who hope to continue the rich pitching tradition.

1994 PREVIEW

Scott Simpson (Eatontown, NJ) may be the best control pitcher on the team. He has walked just 51 in 158.6 innings of his career. He plays the best defense on the staff which suits him well because his style dictates so many ground balls. What Simpson did for the team last season cannot be understated. Already a two-year starter, Simpson began the season as a starter but became the stopper and saved six games. His ERA led the team at 3.13 and he will be the anchor throughout the season.

Junior **Chris Cochrane** and senior **Neil Ioviero** have also been starters for the past two seasons. Cochrane started the year as a closer but found his strength was starting. In his six starts, he lost only one game (Kansas) and pitched at least six and two-thirds innings. Cochrane finished with seven wins, which is the most by a returning pitcher for the Scarlet. Meanwhile, Ioviero didn't have the season he would have liked, but still managed a 4-1 record. His control was his greatest problem. But as his career 14-7 record indicates, he finds a way to win.

Backing them up is a group of young and talented hurlers that make this staff deeper than last year's. Sophomore **Mike Seel** is as talented as any pitcher on the staff, however he has missed a major part of the last two seasons with injuries. He is fully recovered and could be pitching on the weekends by mid-season.

Sophomores **Scott Madison**, **Bob Prusiensky** and **Mike DeFosse** will be counted on this season to step up and play better than last season. Madison showed glimpses of outstanding pitching last season out of the bullpen. His biggest win was a six-inning relief effort in the Atlantic 10 Championship Game where he held WVU to just one unearned run.

Prusiensky and DeFosse looked tremendously better at the end of the season. Mike earned his first collegiate save against Rider in the last regular season game, while Prusiensky finished the year with a 1-1 record.

Also look to freshman **Brian Reagan** and sophomore **Chris Checchetto** to do some good things this season. Reagan has a chance to be the team's stopper, boasting an outstanding curveball.

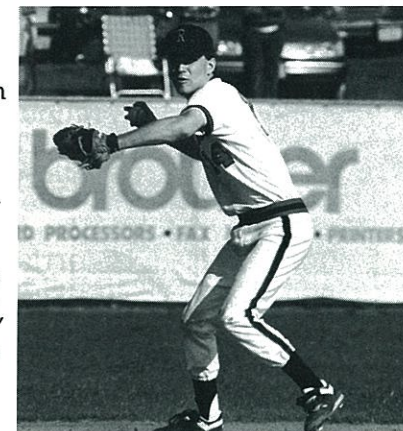
INFIELD

In the infield, two positions are open, two aren't. Juniors **Bob Windows** and **Scott Kassin** were everyday starters at shortstop and firstbase, respectively.

Windows, a first-team All-Conference selection hit .315 in the two slot. His range increased and by the end of the year he was showing some leadership. Meanwhile, Kassin hit .317 with some power, 4 HRs. His skillful

glovework in the NCAA tournament opened the eyes of many. Freshman **Brian Stegan** has impressed everyone in the early season practice and will get some playing time.

Meanwhile, a host of players will battle for the second and third base position. The leading candidate at second is junior **Brian Giallella**. He may be quicker defensively than departed Joe Litterio and has a better bat. His pinch-hit home run against George Washington was one of the highlights of the season. Senior **Vincent Mazzilli** may be the everyday third-baseman. He has worked hard and could fit the bill, but there will be strong competition from freshman transfer **Kent Speedy**, an honorable mention All-American at Toms River High School, and true freshmen **Rich Saitta** and **Paul Gallucci**, a first-team All-State **Bob Windows** selection. All three possess the same characteristics: speed, good glove and a solid bat. Which one of the three steps up and plays the best will see the most action. Saitta and Speedy will also battle Giallella for time at second, which again is only positive for the team.



OUTFIELD

More competition. Centerfielder **Andrew Dengler** is great defensively. Period. He is quick and gets a great jump on the ball. His eye at the plate and ability to steal bases may dictate that he leads off. He played in all but two games last season and is a veteran who will be asked to "Step Up."

It is wide open in left and right field. Doug Alongi and Brian Donnelly are gone. Whoever steps up and performs the best will appear in the most games. **Dave Fazekas**, **Craig Fleming**, **Ed Belko** and **Sal Aquino** will all battle for playing time. Fleming has an edge in right field, becoming an everyday DH last late last season. Fazekas could be the leftfielder. He's a power hitter with a good arm.

CATCHER

A fierce battle has been waged between **Mike Lukacs** and **Kevin James**. Both are very powerful hitters and good behind the plate. After spending two seasons

watching Mike Higgins set the standard, one or both will have to step up and give the leadership, offense and defense that this team needs. Both have the ability to do it.

Sophomore **Seth Ayers** opened some eyes during fall camp and earned himself a place on the roster. The strong-armed backstop will see some time at DH along with James and Lukacs. Also look for freshman Chris Dorsett to get some time behind the dish after a strong showing early in practice.

DH

A lot of what happens at DH will depend on the the lineup defensively. There are at least half-a-dozen players who will be a designated hitter this season.

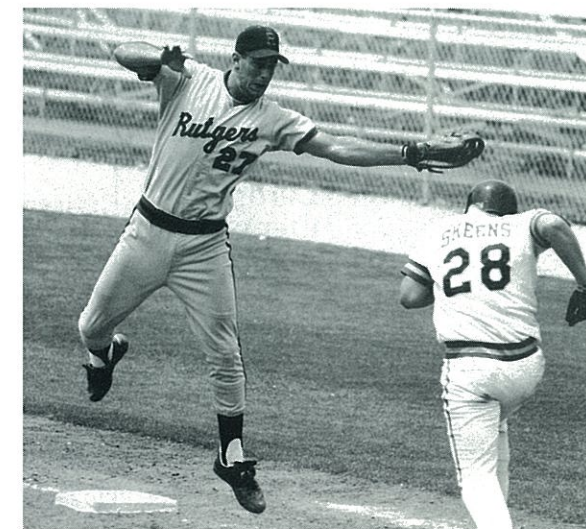
It seems like one thing is for certain, the lefthanded DH will be sophomore **Joe Bischoff**. A proven hitter in high school and summer leagues, Bischoff is an intense competitor who seems bent on driving the ball every time he steps to the plate.

A host of freshman can make an impact at DH including **Shawn Williams**, **Jonathan Wilson**, **Joe Waleck** and **Jason Laub**.

SCHEDULE

Right off the bat, the Scarlet Knights will be tested. A trip to Central Florida kicks off the season followed a three game set with pre-season No.1 Georgia Tech in Atlanta. The Scarlet continue their season with a week in Florida where they will face perennial top 20 Miami for a two-game set among other teams. After the Miami trip, the conference games begin on the weekends.

How the Scarlet fare in 1994 will depend on who "Steps Up." The goals are the same and if the past is any indication, there will be some memorable performances again in '94.

38 Wins, Atlantic 10 Champions, NCAA Mid-east Regional

What a Ride! The 1993 edition of the Scarlet Knights Baseball team won the Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament championships, competed in the NCAA Baseball Tournament and equalled a school record 38 wins.

Year after year, coach Fred Hill has his team competing with the best in the nation and once again the Scarlet Knights stood tall.

Beginning with two wins in a three-game series against

then 24th-ranked Tulane in New Orleans, and ending with a win over UNC-Charlotte in the Mid-east Regional of the NCAA Baseball Tournament, the Scarlet Knights competed with and defeated some of the best collegiate baseball teams in the nation.

It was obvious to the Scarlet fans, early, that this season would be special. After taking the two games from Tulane, doing the same at Virginia Commonwealth, and winning four of seven games in Florida, RU had managed its best start in coach Hill's 10 years "On The Banks," eventually coming North with an 8-5 record.

After playing .500 ball over their first eight games back home, the Scarlet Knights recaptured the form with which they began the season and reeled off a 13-game winning streak. That put them out in front in the conference and on pace to have one of the best seasons in the school's history. The great season was buoyed by some great performances.

ALONGI AND HIGGINS ALL-AMERICAN

Two Scarlet Knights had seasons that were among the best in the country. Junior right fielder Doug Alongi and senior catcher Mike Higgins seemingly put this team on their backs and carried them to victory after victory. Both were named American Baseball Coaches Association third-team All-American for 1993.

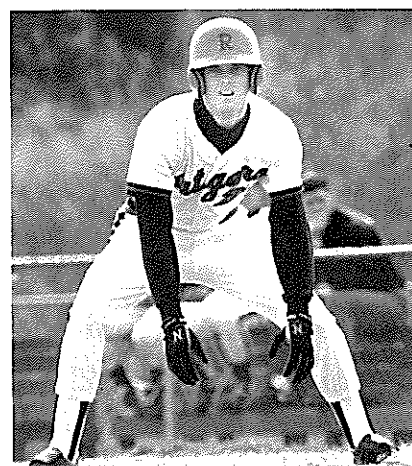
Alongi, a catalyst all season, became Rutgers' single-season and all-time leading base-stealer with his 39 thefts in '93, which gave him 85 for his career. Doug also became Rutgers' single-season record holder in hits (86) and runs (62). This was the kind of season that earned him the Atlantic 10 Player of the Year award (the first ever for an RU player) along with New Jersey College Baseball Association and ECAC honors.

Higgins also earned All-Conference, New Jersey College Baseball Association and ECAC honors for his outstanding year. The team's field general batted in the cleanup spot and led the team in RBI (56), also a single-season record, and was walked a team-high 39 times (two short of the record).

While Higgins and Alongi were providing the offense, the Scarlet Knight defense was among the top 10 in the nation in fielding percentage all year long.

DEFENSE RANKED SEVENTH

Higgins, shortstop Bob Windows, second baseman Joe Litterio and center fielder Andrew Dengler were

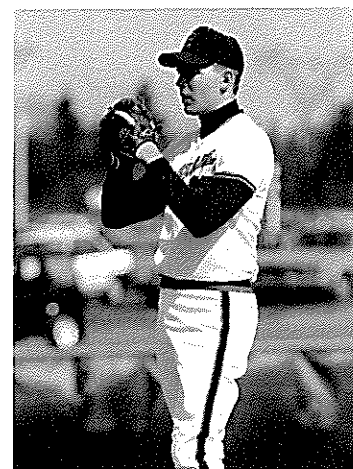

Rutgers strength up the middle defensively. While Higgins was blocking pitches in the dirt, Windows and Litterio were turning double plays and Dengler was tracking down balls in the gap and over the fence. This quartet led a defensive unit that finished with a .972 fielding percentage, ranking them seventh in the country.

As a team, the Scarlet Knights made just 57 errors, while turning 52 double plays. Litterio was outstanding, starting all 55 games, he made just five errors in 122 chances. Windows was one of the team's leading hitters and earned first-team All-Conference recognition.

Along with offense and defense, the Scarlet Knights had some outstanding pitching depth. Three starters emerged as the cornerstones of the staff. Senior Mike Barckley and junior Phil Schneider were mainstays on conference weekends, while sophomore Chris Cochrane started during the week and relieved on weekends.

Barckley went the distance allowing just two runs, as the Scarlet defeated GW 4-2, to put Rutgers in the winner's bracket. Barckley also went to the mound in against UNC Charlotte in an elimination game of the NCAA Tournament and, if it was possible, looked even stronger. In the 90-degree heat, Barckley threw his second consecutive complete-game win, allowing just one run on six hits, and walked none. Mike's outing in the Atlantic 10 Championship was just one in a list of memories from Boyertown.

Rutgers entered the tournament with the top seed as the regular season champions, boasting a 14-6 conference record, which included sweeps over UMass, Temple and St. Joe's, and a 34-15 overall record, easily the best in the conference and one of the best records in the East. For guiding his team to one of the best seasons in recent memory, coach Fred Hill was given the Atlantic 10 Conference Coach of the Year Award for an unprecedented third consecutive year.

After Barckley's outing in the opening game of the A-10 Championship, Phil Schneider went to the mound against Temple and gave the Scarlet seven and two-thirds innings of solid pitching, and Higgins drove in two runs with a pair of two-out hits. Scott Simpson relieved Schneider to get his sixth save of the season as Rutgers defeated Temple 5-2 and advanced to the A-10 Championship round to face West Virginia.

What transpired in that championship game has been labeled "The Miracle at Boyertown." RU fell behind 6-1 and it looked bleak for the Rutgers nine as they headed into the bottom of the ninth, down by five runs and with just four hits off Mountaineer starter Jeff Fennessey.

But an error, a walk and a pinch-hit two-RBI double by sophomore Kevin James to lead off the bottom of the ninth closed the gap to 6-3 and gave the Scarlet some hope. With pinch-runner Ed Belko on second, Brian Stone

Cochrane and Barckley tied for the team lead in wins with seven apiece. While Schneider was right behind with six. Mike was also a second-team All-Conference honoree.

Barckley's 1993 season was another that Scarlet fans won't soon forget. When the games meant the most, he pitched his best. In the opening game of the Atlantic 10 Tournament,

walked and up to the plate came Alongi.

West Virginia brought in its relief ace Mike Marz to face Alongi. Doug quickly fell behind 0-2 to the Mountaineer stopper. The next pitch, a fastball down the middle, wound up over the left field fence, and the score was tied. Once again Alongi had come through for Rutgers. But the job was not finished. Rutgers fans who had been chanting "RU... RU" throughout the ninth inning hardly had a chance to sit down as Windows followed that with a HR of his own, over the same left field fence, to give the Scarlet Knights the Championship and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Alongi's three-run, game-tying HR earned him the tournament's MVP award.

As the conference champion, Rutgers was given a ticket to Knoxville, Tennessee and a fifth seed for the Mid-east Regional of the NCAA Baseball Tournament.

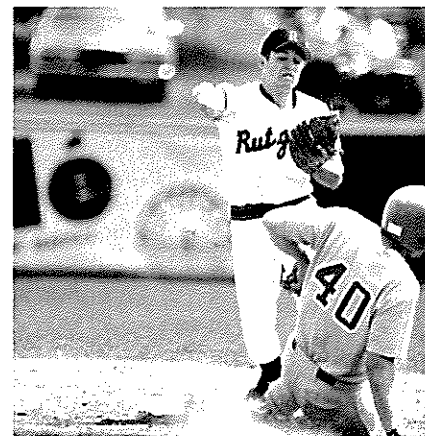
There the Scarlet lost the opening round game to Clemson, 7-3. Litterio provided the only Scarlet Knight offense with a three-run HR, the first HR of his career. Heading into the regional, Litterio was hitting just .192 but when the games counted the most, he played his best.

Rutgers rebounded by defeating UNC Charlotte 5-1 on the strength of Barckley's arm and Alongi's 4-5, 3-run, 2-stolen-base performance. With the win, Rutgers equalled a school record 38 wins and would face Kansas in another elimination game.

This is where the ride ended for the Scarlet. Cochrane struggled through seven innings, allowing six runs. While Rutgers managed just two runs of its own. The final score was 8-2. The Scarlet Knights could take solace in the fact that Kansas won the Mid-east Region and went to the College World Series in Omaha, Nebraska.

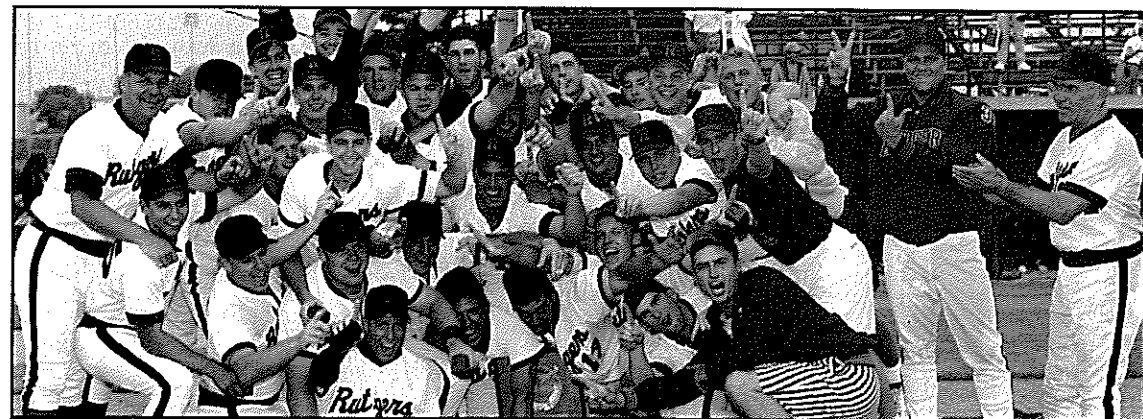
The Major League organizations couldn't wait to get their hands on some of Rutgers' talent. Higgins was the first to go in the 1993 Major League Amateur draft, as he was selected in the 22nd round by the Colorado Rockies. Schneider was also taken by the Rockies in the 48th round and both join former Scarlet Knights Eric Young and Angel Echevarria in the organization.

Alongi also went in the draft, selected in the 32nd round by the Cubs.

In one of the most memorable games in Rutgers' history, Bob Windows hit a line-drive home run in the bottom of the ninth inning to give the Scarlet Knights a 7-6 win over West Virginia in the championship game of the Atlantic 10 Tournament.

Rutgers faced a five-run deficit, 6-1, going into the bottom of the ninth, and if the game stayed its course, Rutgers would be forced to play one more game against West Virginia for the championship. Things looked dim, the Scarlet had managed just one-run on four hits off Mountaineer starter Jeff Fennessey, and coach Fred Hill sent Chris Cochrane to the bullpen to warmup for the next game.

When Scott Kassin reached first on an error by Andy Srebroski to begin the inning the excitement began to build. Brian Donnelly drew a walk on four-straight pitches, putting runners at first and second. Kevin James was called upon to pinch-hit for Joe Litterio. He lined a 1-1 pitch down the third-base line for a double, scoring both Kassin and pinch-runner Ed Belko to narrow the gap to 6-3. The decidedly Rutgers crowd began to make some noise.

The next batter Brian Stone, pinch-hitting for Andrew Dengler, drew a walk putting runners on first and second, bringing to the plate conference Player of the Year Doug Alongi.

West Virginia stopper Mike Marz was summoned to face Alongi and quickly jumped ahead, 0-2. With the crowd chanting RU... RU..., Alongi, who had delivered in the clutch all season, drove Marz's next pitch over the leftfield wall tying the game at six.

The stadium went wild and before a single fan had a chance to sit down, the next batter Bob Windows won the game with his solo blast. Rutgers became Atlantic 10 Champions for the fifth time.

Scott Madison earned the win with six strong innings of relief. For his heroic game-tying home run, Alongi was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

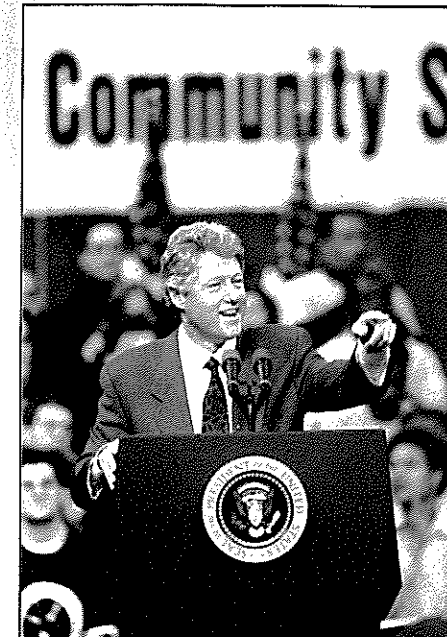
It is the University's commitment to

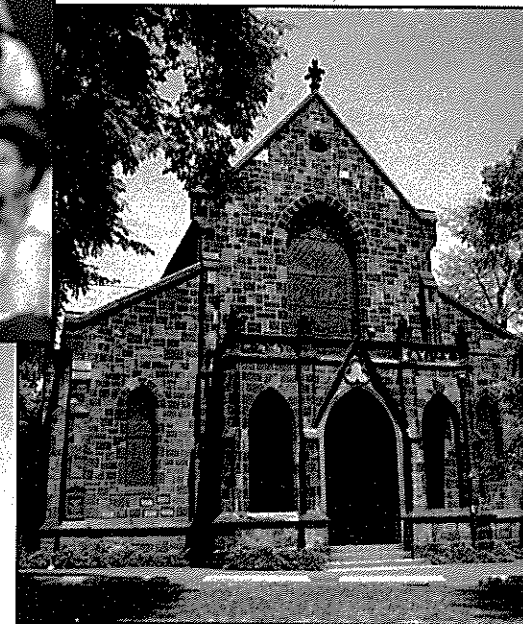

Rutgers began its extraordinary history as Queen's College, which was chartered in 1766, the eighth institution of higher learning founded in the colonies. In 1825, the name of the college was changed to Rutgers to honor the benefactor and Revolutionary War veteran, Colonel Henry Rutgers. In 1946, the University of Newark merged with Rutgers and the College of South Jersey in Camden was incorporated into Rutgers in 1950.

Its 227-year history has made Rutgers rich in tradition, yet its approach to teaching, research and public service has made it a national leader both in traditional fields of scholarship and in emerging fields, such as ceramics, molecular biology and women's studies. Today, Rutgers stands as a model of the contemporary American state university, contributing to the economic, civic, recreational and cultural life of our rich diverse society.

As the sole comprehensive public research university in the New Jersey system of higher education, and the state's land-grant institution, Rutgers is committed to promoting excellence in undergraduate and graduate education, in research and scholarship, and in service to the state and the nation. DR. FRANCIS L. LAWRENCE – PRESIDENT

Dr. Francis L. Lawrence, a noted author and critic of French literature, was named the 18th president in the history of Rutgers, The State University, on July 18, 1990. More than 47,000 students attend the 25 colleges and schools of the State University of New Jersey, which is the eighth oldest institution in the country. The University has 175,000 living alumni.

Dr. Lawrence comes to Rutgers from Tulane University in New Orleans, Louisiana, where he spent 28 years as a teacher and administrator. From 1962 through 1969, Lawrence was an instructor in French. He was then elected as French Department chair, a position he held until 1976, when he was named to his first administrative position as the Acting Dean of Newcomb College.

Lawrence, a native of Woonsocket, R.I., became Academic Vice President and Provost and Dean of the Graduate School in 1982. In that position, Lawrence served as the chief academic officer of the over 11,000 students at Tulane, administered a budget of over \$100 million, and was responsible for the administration of the academic programs in the colleges of liberal arts and sciences, the Graduate School, and the professional schools of law, social work, business, architecture and engineering.

Lawrence attended Saint Louis University, from which he graduated, with honors, with a Bachelor of Science Degree in French and Spanish in 1959. He earned his Ph.D. in French Classical Literature, as a N.D.E.A. Fellow, from Tulane in 1962.

A distinguished writer and editor of numerous volumes of French Literature, Lawrence is the author of the book "Moliere: The Comedy of Unreason." He has regularly contributed to the publications "Visages de Moliere" and "The Influence of Rhetoric on Seventeenth Century French Literature."

In 1977, he was decorated chevalier by the Palmes Academiques and received the John H. Stibbs award, given by the Tulane Student Senate for outstanding service to students, in 1977 and 1985.

Dr. Lawrence and his wife, Mary Kay, are the parents of four children: Elizabeth Ann Hurley, Christopher,

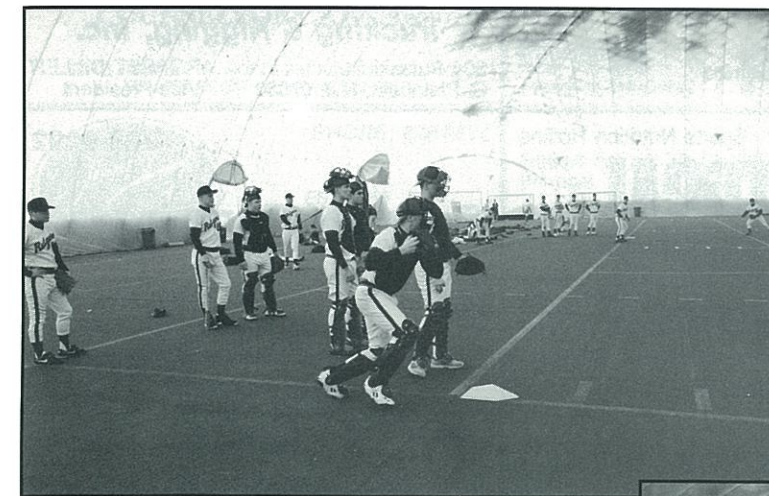
Now beginning his 21st year as Director of Athletics, Fred Gruninger has guided the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics at Rutgers to unprecedented growth and recognition. Since his appointment in January, 1973, The State University's athletic program has grown to 31 sports, and has achieved a stature respected across the nation. Numerous Scarlet Knights and Lady Knights squads have enjoyed tremendous success.

It is with firm commitment, long experience and unbounded energy that Gruninger directs the Division. His association with the department began in 1963, when he was named head golf coach. He was appointed Assistant Athletic Director in 1968. Three years later, he was named Associate Athletic Director. A 1953 Rutgers graduate, Gruninger coached the golf team between 1963 and 1972, recording a 109-30-2 record and consistently taking teams and individuals into post-season competition.

Currently a member of the NCAA Council, the governing body of collegiate athletics, as well as serving on the Host Committee of the Kickoff Classic and the ECAC Council, Gruninger has also served on many prestigious NCAA and regional committees. These bodies make major decisions which affect football, basketball and other sports. He was a member of the College Football Association's Board of Directors and is currently a member of the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness. Additionally, he was co-organizer of the Collegiate Athletic Administration of New Jersey, an organization founded to serve and foster relations among the 42 four-year and two-year colleges in New Jersey which compete in men's and women's athletics.

Gruninger, who has been involved in numerous local and state charitable and athletic endeavors, is a native of Fanwood, NJ and resides in Martinsville. He and his wife, Barbara, are the parents of two sons - Mark, who holds a Rutgers doctorate in Ceramic Engineering, and Jack, a graduate of the University of Virginia. Daughter Katherine is a 1985 Lafayette College graduate who played collegiate basketball and co-captained the squad as a senior.

and the temperature averages 30 degrees higher inside "The Bubble," than outside.

Coach Hill has the ability to lay out an actual size baseball diamond and work on positioning, plays and his defensive concept in the comfort of "The Bubble."

Before or after practice, the Scarlet Knights can improve their strength and conditioning for the upcoming baseball season. The strength room is one of the most popular places in the RAC for the athletes to train.

The Baseball lockerroom is one of the finest on the campus. Wall to wall carpeting, a stereo system and TV are just some of the features of the locker room. Coach hill has also been able to add a pool table and video game to the room which allows the team the ability to relax before and after practice.

Combined, these facilities are among the finest in college baseball. Coach Hill has taken advantage of what Rutgers can offer a baseball program and the sum total has been great success.












The Strength Room

One of the reasons Rutgers has been consistently successful is its ability to prepare in some of the best indoor practice facilities in the nation. The Rutgers campus boasts the world's largest fully air supported construction and the baseball team is able to take full advantage of it. "The Bubble" is a 120 yard tract of artificial turf surrounded by a four-lane running track. The latex material that covers the turf and track stands 80 feet high. Air is continually pumped into the facility

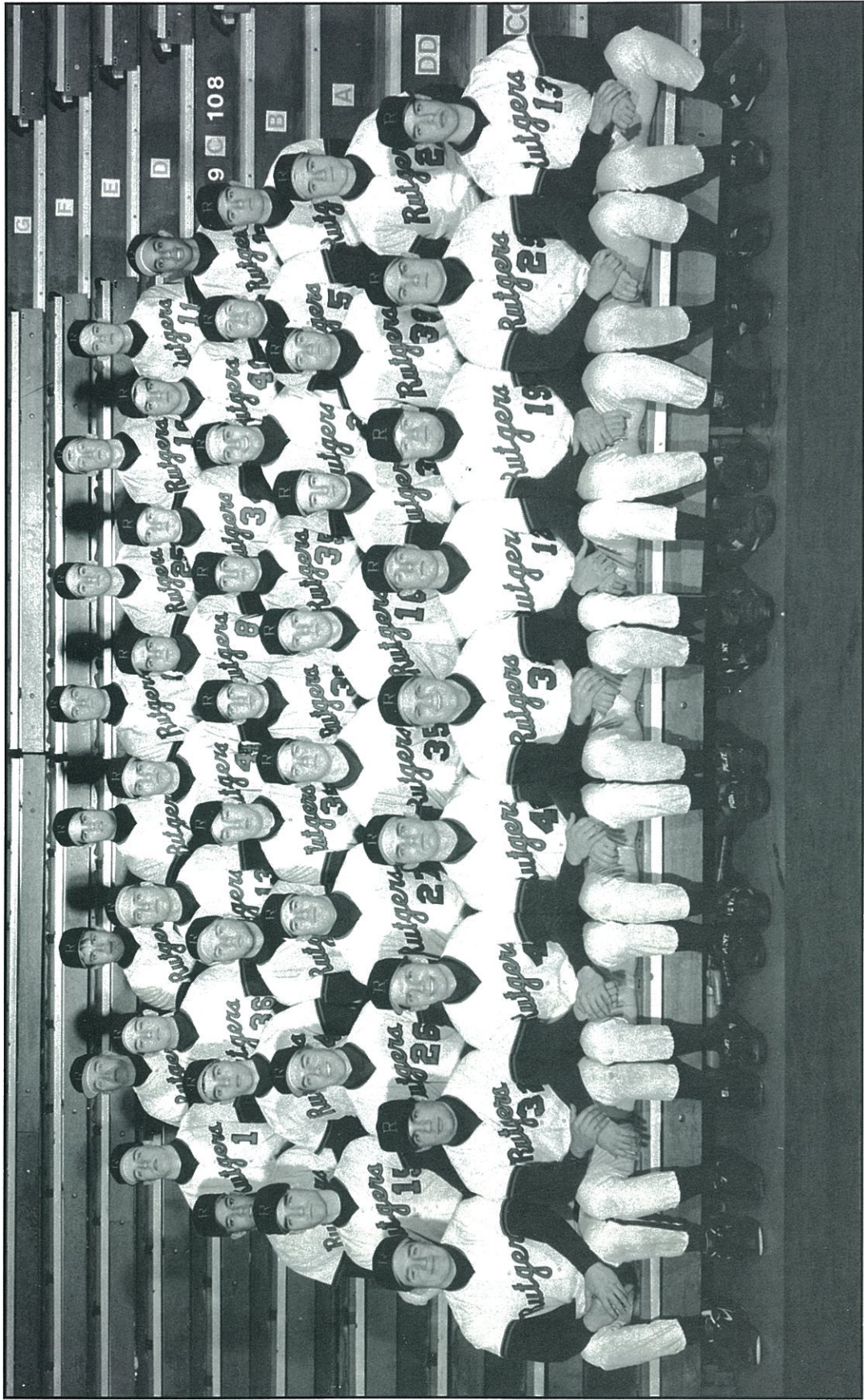
