JOHNS HOPKINS VS. MARYLAND - B1G SEMIFINALS

The Game

« Johns Hopkins (7-6, 3-2 B1G) opens post-season play as the Blue Jays travel to Piscataway, New Jersey to take on Maryland (11-3, 3-2 B1G) in the Big Ten Semifinals.
« The 119th installment of the greatest rivalry in college lacrosse will be the second of the two semifinal games at Rutgers on Thursday, May 2. Top-seeded Penn State will play host and fourth-seeded Rutgers in the first game at 5 pm with the second-seeded Blue Jays and third-seeded Terrapins to follow at approximately 7:30 pm.
« Johns Hopkins is coming off a 16-11 victory at then second-ranked Maryland last Saturday in College Park.



The Facts

« This is the 132nd season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 990-340-15.
« JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

Poll Position

« Johns Hopkins is ranked 15th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 16th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. These are the two official in-season polls conducted throughout the regular season.
« Maryland is ranked fourth in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and fifth in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. Both complete polls can be found on page 13.
« This week's game will be Johns Hopkins' fourth straight against a team ranked in the top 10 in the nation at the time of the game.
« This week's game will be Johns Hopkins' 10th of the season against a team ranked in this week's USILA Top 20.

Helmet Stickers

« Johns Hopkins is wearing three stickers on the back of its helmets in 2019.
« The old Houston Oiler logo with "RSO" is for Ralph S. O'Connor, a 1951 Johns Hopkins graduate, who passed away on December 30, 2018. O'Connor was a long-time supporter of the Blue Jay lacrosse program.
« The football with "JM" is for Jim Margraff, the Blue Jays' highly-successful football coach who passed away suddenly on January 2, 2019. Margraff guided his 2018 team to the NCAA Semifinals and was named Division III National Coach of the Year just two weeks before he died.
« The "JB41" is for Jim Bidne, who passed away suddenly on April 21, 2019. Bidne was a co-captain on the Blue Jays' 1980 NCAA Championship team and assisted on the game-winning goal in the 9-8 win over Virginia in the title game.

Things to Know - Maryland

« Maryland is making its fifth straight appearance in the Big Ten Tournament. Maryland and Johns Hopkins are the only two teams to appear in all five tournaments.

« Maryland is seeded third in this year's tournament; this is the first time the Terps haven't been seeded first or second in the Big Ten Tournament.

« Maryland has won at least 10 games in a national-best 17 consecutive seasons. The next closest run of active consecutive 10-win seasons is 13 (Duke). A win this week would give Maryland 12+ wins for the sixth consecutive year.

« Despite the loss to Johns Hopkins last week, the Terps scored on 11-of-21 shots and are now scoring on 34.7% of their shots on the year (182-of-524).

« Maryland has scored at least 10 goals in all 14 games this season and in 30-of-32 games since the start of the 2018 season.

« Maryland is 122-39 (.758) this decade (2010s). The Terps are on pace to shatter the school record for highest winning percentage in a defined decade (.694 / 2000s)

Terrapins to Watch**Jared Bernhardt (Jr. • A)**

« Two-time All-American ranks second on the team in points (66) and assists (24) and first in goals (42).

« Recorded 100th career goal with the game-winner in overtime at Ohio State (April 20). 15th player in school history to score 100+ goals. Tallied 100th career point earlier this season in a win against Colgate.

Austin Henningsen (Sr. • FO)

« Has won 143-of-237 (.603) faceoffs this season and counts a team-high 64 GBs to his credit.

« Three-time Big Ten Specialist of the Week this season and became just the fourth Maryland player to win 500 faceoffs when he reached the mark on April 14 at Rutgers.

Logan Wisnauskas (So. • A)

« Maryland's leading scorer with 38 goals and 31 assists for 69 points.

« Recorded 100th career point in a 16-12 win over Michigan on April 6. Reached 100-point mark quicker than any Maryland player in history (29 games).

Johns Hopkins and ESPNU

Johns Hopkins enjoys an exclusive national television agreement with ESPNU. All Johns Hopkins home games air on the ESPN family of networks with a majority of the games airing on ESPNU.

Johns Hopkins is the only lacrosse program in the nation - men or women - with its own exclusive national television agreement.

**Series History**

« This week's game will be the 119th game in a series that dates to a 10-0 Johns Hopkins win in 1895.

« JHU leads the all-time series 73-44-1 after grabbing the 16-11 win at Maryland last week. The Blue Jays have won the last two game in the series.

« This will be the second straight year, the third time in five years and the 16th time since 1972 that the teams meet twice in one season.

« This will be the first time in series history that the teams meet in back-to-back games.

Hopkins-Maryland Rematches

« This will be the 16th time Johns Hopkins and Maryland meet twice in the same season.

« In the previous 15 instances, there have been eight sweeps (six by Johns Hopkins, two by Maryland) and seven times the loser of game one has come back to win the rematch.

« Since 1987, there have been seven Johns Hopkins-Maryland rematches. In those seven, the loser of game one has come back to win game two six times, including last season's 13-10 Johns Hopkins win in the Big Ten Championship game, which came a week after Maryland topped the Blue Jays, 8-7, in triple overtime.

Getting Offensive in the BIG Tournament

« This week's game against Maryland will be the seventh Big Ten Tournament game Johns Hopkins has played since the inception of the league in 2015.

« In the previous six Big Ten Tournament games, Johns Hopkins has scored 12 or more goals in five of the six and 13+ in four of the six.

« The only time Johns Hopkins failed to score at least 12 goals in a Big Ten Tournament game came in the 2018 semifinals against Ohio State, when the Blue Jays topped the Buckeyes, 6-5, on an **Alex Concannon** goal with 11.3 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter.

BIG Tournament - A Little History

« The Big Ten Men's Lacrosse Tournament is in its fifth year of existence as the league added men's lacrosse in 2015.

« There has never been a Big Ten Championship game without either Johns Hopkins or Maryland. In 2018, JHU and Maryland met in the title game (a 13-10 Blue Jay victory).

Kuhn Wearing #19

Senior **Robert Kuhn** will wear #19 this season after wearing #10 in 2017 and 2018. The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through last spring, when he would have been a senior and nobody else wore 19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, head coach **Dave Pietramala** met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, Kuhn was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber.

Visitors to Homewood Field are greeted by a statue commemorating former Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse coach and Director of Athletics Robert H. Scott. The statue, which was unveiled in October 2016, is positioned at the main campus entrance to the stadium.

Scott, who passed away on September 15, 2016, spent 20 years as the men's lacrosse coach at Johns Hopkins (1955-74) and guided the Blue Jays to seven national championships, including the program's first NCAA title in 1974. He continued to serve the University as the Director of Athletics until 1995.

Many Johns Hopkins teams wore patches on their uniforms in honor of Scott the year after he died; the men's lacrosse patches included seven stars to commemorate his seven national championships.

On This Date

« This week's game against Maryland will be Johns Hopkins' 13th game on May 2nd since 1955 (dates for games prior to 1955 not all available). The Blue Jays are 9-3 in the previous 12 games played on this date.

« On this date in 2015, Johns Hopkins defeated Ohio State, 13-6, in the 2015 Big Ten Tournament Championship game.

At HighPoint.com Stadium

« Johns Hopkins has played two games at HighPoint.com Stadium since joining the Big Ten in 2015. The Blue Jays split those two games against Rutgers (lost 16-9 in 2016, won 13-12 in 2018).

More HighPoint.com Stadium

« Johns Hopkins is no stranger to playing post-season games in HighPoint.com Stadium. In fact, this will be the seventh post-season game the Blue Jays play here. « Three of JHU's nine NCAA titles were won in this stadium (1974, 1978, 1987) with the 1987 title being won with a sophomore defenseman named **Dave Pietramala** leading the way.

For What It's Worth

« This week's game will be JHU's 14th game of the season. Not including their games against JHU, the Blue Jays' first 13 opponents are a combined 111-55 (.669) through games of April 28. That ranks as the highest opponent winning percentage in the nation.

Into Something BIG

« The Blue Jays posted a 3-2 record in Big Ten regular season play in 2019 and are now 16-9 (.640) in BIG regular season games since the league was formed in 2015.

Doing the Little Things

« In the last nine games, JHU is 177-of-205 (.863) on clears and has won 175-of-300 (.583) faceoffs. This is a big improvement from the Blue Jays' first two games of the season, when they were 28-of-40 (.700) on clears and 25-of-61 (.417) on faceoffs in losses to Towson and Loyola.

Lending a Hand

« Through 13 games, 94 of Johns Hopkins' 156 goals have been assisted ... that's 60.3%. By comparison, JHU collected assists on 62.3% of its goals last season.

« For the record, the last time Johns Hopkins assisted on better than 65% of its goals for an entire season was in 2003, when the Blue Jays totaled 151 assists on 224 goals (67.4%).

Spreading it Around

« Johns Hopkins has 19 different goal-scorers and 23 different players have registered at least one point through 13 games.

« By comparison, Maryland has 14 players who have scored at least one goal and 17 players have registered at least one point for the Terps.

A Season-High

« Johns Hopkins scored a season-high 16 goals in last week's game at Maryland. That also represented the most goals the Terrapins have allowed since 2013, when they lost to Cornell, 16-8, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

« JHU is averaging 12.0 goals per game and has scored 12+ in seven of 13 games.

Class Act

« Johns Hopkins has scored 156 goals and collected 94 assists for 250 points through 13 games with a strong balance in the scoring breakdown among the four classes.

« Blue Jay seniors lead the way with 47 goals and 70 points, while the team's juniors lead the way with 26 assists.

« The balance in scoring has been remarkable as each class has totaled at least 27 goals and 49 points through 13 games. The freshman, junior and senior classes all have at least 65 points in 13 games.

Non-Offensive Scoring

« With the addition of a shot clock this season, the pace of play has quickened and has resulted in more transition lacrosse. This has resulted in more scoring for Johns Hopkins' non-offensive players.

« Through 13 games, non-offensive players (defensemen, long & short-stick defensive middies, faceoff specialists & goalies) have accumulated 13 goals and 19 assists (32 points) for the Blue Jays.

« By comparison, in 17 games last season, the Blue Jays' non-offensive players totaled 10 goals and 7 assists (17 points).

Pietramala Wins 200th at JHU

« JHU's non-offensive players have combined for 29 points (12g, 17a) in the last 11 games - an average of 2.64 points per game after they totaled two goals in the win at Maryland. They combined for three goals and three assists in the 11-10 win at North Carolina and two goals and three assists in the wins over Princeton and Rutgers.

Winningest Program in Lacrosse History

« Johns Hopkins enters this week's game against Maryland with an all-time record of 990-340-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.

« JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just four with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.
