PISCATAWAY, N.J. (Feb. 27, 2020) – Winners of the last four games, Rutgers baseball travels to Peoria, Arizona, to face Washington State in a three-game series starting Friday. The trip will mark the Scarlet Knights' first venture into Arizona and the furthest west the program has ever trekked to play.

The set will be played at the Peoria Sports Complex, the spring training home of both the San Diego Padres and Seattle Mariners. Friday's game will be contested inside the Main Stadium, while Saturday and Sunday are set to take place on Mariners Field #2. Admission is free. Washington State will serve as the home team and bat second each day.

SCOUTING RUTGERS

Most Recently: The Scarlet Knights topped Wagner, 15-3, Tuesday in the home opener at Bainton Field. Using a bases-loaded walk drawn by redshirt sophomore Tim Dezzi and a three-run triple by senior Kevin Welsh, RU opened up a 4-0 lead after one inning. The Seahawks rallied for three in the third, but the bullpen entered and worked six scoreless frames. Sophomore Jared Bellissimo was credited the win after stranding the bases loaded on a pair of strikeouts to preserve a one-run lead at the time. Rutgers posted 11 unanswered runs from there, including a three-run homer by redshirt sophomore Richie Schiekofer. Schiekofer knocked in a career-high four runs and scored four times, while junior Mike Nyisztor reached 4-of-5 trips and crossed home three times.

In the last weekend series, the Scarlet Knights picked up their first February weekend sweep since 2012 and first road sweep since March 2017 with three wins at North Florida, 14-3, 16-4 and 7-6. The 37 runs scored in the set were the most in a three-game series by RU since May 2013. Rutgers hit .377/.470/.500 as a team on 46 hits.

Hitting: Rutgers has plated 52 runs over the past four games, the best four-game stretch since tallying 56 from March 10-14, 2010. That has vaulted RU into the Big Ten lead with 8.7 runs per game, ranked 15th nationally.

Sophomore Chris Brito and Nyisztor have both reached safely in all seven games, each driving in nine runs. Brito is slashing a team-best .458/.563/.875 with three homers. Sophomore Peter Serruto has crushed two long balls on a .522 on-base percentage. In addition, redshirt junior Danny DiGeorgio has collected nine hits over the past four games.

Pitching: RU will stick with the same rotation as the past two weeks: junior Harry Rutkowski, fifth-year senior Tommy Genuario and senior Tevin Murray. Rutkowski went seven innings with only two runs and no walks permitted to beat North Florida, while Genuario also posted a quality start with three runs allowed over six frames to win on Saturday. Murray surrendered three runs in the first in the Sunday victory, but rebounded to post four consecutive scoreless frames after that, striking out six in the outing.

Out of the bullpen, redshirt junior Kyle Muller has not allowed a run in 5.1 innings this season. Sophomore Parker Scott paces the staff with a 0.99 WHIP in 8.1 innings.

SERIES HISTORY

All-Time: Washington State lead, 2-0

Last Game: Washington State 16, Rutgers 3 (March 22, 1990 in Coral Gables, Fla.)

Rutgers and Washington State have two prior meetings on record, the first at the 1950 College World Series and the second in Coral Gables, Florida, during spring break in 1990. The Cougars won both.

1950 CWS Recap: On Monday, June 19, Rutgers met Washington State in the winner's bracket final... The game was a terrific pitcher's duel between Al Willenbrock for Rutgers and Rod Keogh for the Cougars... Willenbrock gave up an early home run to Ted Tappe of the Cougars, but the Scarlet tied it in the fourth on a triple by Jim Monahan and an infield out... That would prove to be the only hit off Keogh, but he walked eight and was frequently in trouble... In the seventh, Rutgers loaded the bases, with Willenbrock up... without warning, (Rutgers later said it was not a called play), the runner on third tried to steal home and was tagged out... As he broke, the runner on second started toward third, then hesitated, and was eventually run down and tagged out to complete an unusual double play, killing the potential rally... In the top of the ninth, Washington State loaded the bases with no outs... Don Paul grounded sharply to third baseman Steve Kalapos, who threw home for the force there... catcher Hardy Peterson then threw to first to double Paul, and Suba, the first baseman, then spotted Gordon Brunswick, the runner at second, trying to make a surprise dash to home... Suba threw back to Peterson, who tagged Brunswick to complete the triple play... It was the second of three triple plays in the CWS... In the top of the 10th, Washington State finally broke through on an out-field error, hit batter and a two-run double by Terry Carroll to take a 3-1 lead, and Keogh completed his one hitter by retiring the side in the bottom of the 10th... Washington State improved to 3-0, and Rutgers fell to 2-1... Van Cleef, after going seven-for-nine in the first two games was held to 0-for-5...

UP NEXT

Rutgers is set for five games next week, starting Tuesday at St. Joseph's at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday is a home game at Bainton Field versus St. Peter's before heading to Old Dominion for the three-game weekend series.

HEAD COACH STEVE OWENS • FIRST SEASON



Director of Athletics Pat Hobbs named Steve Owens the 13th head coach in Rutgers University baseball history on June 26, 2019. An 11-time conference coach of the year who has mentored 22 All-Americans and 49 professional players, Owens brings 28 winning seasons of head coaching experience to Piscataway, including the past nine at Bryant University. His 914-483 after 2019 career record features 20 30-win seasons, five 40-win seasons and 13 NCAA Tournament appearances.

Owens, who has been a collegiate head coach since 1992 with 1,400 games under his belt, ranks among the top 15 active Division I coaches in winning percentage (.654) and in overall wins (914) entering 2020. He has picked up 71 of those victories in postseason play with a 71-48 mark (.600). In addition, Owens has mentored 10 Freshman All-America picks, 36 All-Region nods and four Academic All-Americans as a head coach.

"Steve has a remarkable record of achievement," Hobbs said. "His level of sustained success is among the nation's best. He now brings that formula to Rutgers and the Big Ten. Steve's great at developing student-athletes and putting them on a path to success, both on and off the field. We have a rich history and Steve will write the next great chapter for Rutgers baseball. I'm

delighted to welcome him, his wife Catharine and his family to our family."

"I would first like to thank Director of Athletics Pat Hobbs, Ryan Pisarri and the other members of the search committee for selecting me as the newest leader of the baseball program," Owens said. "I am honored to have the opportunity to work in a program with such rich history and tradition. I believe my vision for the program is consistent with the department's strategic priorities of student-athlete excellence, cultural excellence and sustaining long-term excellence. I am looking forward to meeting the players and recruits, and starting to build the relationship and trust necessary to succeed. We will have talented athletes who will work hard, compete to win and play with Jersey toughness and grit. Our immediate goal is to establish ourselves as a consistent contender in the Big Ten. In addition, we aspire to be a top team in our region of the country, consistently develop professional players and work toward postseason opportunities."

BRYANT

Owens took over the Bryant program for the 2011 season and earned 327 wins at the helm, an average of 36.3 victories per year, the most victories among Northeast programs during that span. The Bulldogs went 192-59 (.765) in NEC play with eight-straight regular-season crowns and three tournament titles, being the No. 1 seed all seven trips to the conference tournament.

The program, which became eligible for NCAA postseason competition in 2013 after its transition to Division I in 2009, made a splash with an upset over Arkansas at the 2013 Manhattan (Kan.) Regional. That season was sparked by a 19-game winning streak, the longest in the nation. The team returned to the NCAA Tournament the following season with an appearance at the 2014 Baton Rouge (La.) Regional. In 2016, Bryant won a school-record 47 games, emerged in the national rankings as high as No. 15, had the highest winning percentage in the nation (.797) and became the first NEC school to earn a No. 2 seed at the NCAA Tournament with a trip to the Charlottesville (Va.) Regional.

Owens earned five NEC Coach of the Year awards (2012, '13, '14, '16, '19) and claimed ABCA Northeast Region Coach of the Year honors in 2013 and 2014. Additionally, 64 players garnered all-conference honors and 13 collected All-America honors in his nine seasons piloting the Rhode Island school. Owens also successfully recruited the NEC Rookie of the Year seven times and produced 18 MLB Draft picks over the last seven seasons.

Most recently in 2019, Owens led Bryant to a 40-win season, winning 12-of-14 weekend series and pacing the nation with 23 road wins during the regular season. Propelled by the bats, the Bulldogs set school and NEC records for home runs (81), hits (679), RBIs (455) and runs scored (487). The 8.1 runs per game ranked ninth nationally, placing seventh in batting average (.311), 13th in home runs per game (1.35) and 15th in on-base percentage (.398). Bryant also set school and NEC records for strikeouts with 501 on the mound. The Bulldogs had eight earn All-NEC honors and 10 more garner All-New England honors, while Chris Wright and Steve Theetge, a 2019 Gold Glove winner, both picked up All-America distinction. Owens also saw three members of his class of 2020 recruiting class selected in the first 22 rounds of the MLB Draft.

LE MOYNE

Prior to coming to Bryant, Owens spent 11 seasons (2000-10) as the head coach at Le Moyne College in Syracuse, N.Y. He led the Dolphins to 11-straight winning seasons and three NCAA tournament berths. He guided Le Moyne to back-to-back NCAA Regionals at Arkansas (2003) and North Carolina State (2004), and then took the Dolphins to the Texas A&M Regional in 2007. Over his tenure, Owens was named the MAAC Coach of the Year twice, (2004, '06) and was also bestowed the ABCA/Diamond Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2003. Owens reached an even more impressive milestone during the 2007 season as he became one of the youngest coaches in the country to reach the 500-win plateau. He finished his Dolphins career with an impressive 342-217 record, as the program amassed 32 All-MAAC selections.

CORTLAND STATE

A native of Sauquoit, New York, Owens started his head coaching career at Division III Cortland State. Over eight seasons (1992-99) in the dugout, Owens led the Red Dragons to six 30-win seasons, seven NCAA regional tournaments and four trips to the Division III College World Series. He guided the 1997 and 1998 teams to third-place finishes at the national tournament, finishing a game short of a shot at a national championship. Owens went 245-82-1 in his eight seasons with Cortland State and was named the New York Regional Coach of the Year and the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) Coach of the Year four times each.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE

Owens is a 1987 graduate of St. Lawrence University, where he earned a Bachelor of Science in sport and leisure studies. Playing baseball and football at St. Lawrence, he was named a two-time MVP in baseball playing at both third base and shortstop. He finished his career with a .349 batting average, including .454 as a senior, and stole 73 bases in 80 attempts. In football, he led the team in rushing his junior and senior seasons, scoring 18 career touchdowns, and was named offensive MVP as well as Outstanding Senior Athlete. He has been inducted into the St. Lawrence Athletic Hall of Fame (Fall 2010), the Cortland State Hall of Fame (Fall 2017) and the Greater Utica Hall of Fame (June 2019).

Drafted by the Chicago Cubs as a third baseman, Owens spent two seasons with the organization, including stints in Geneva (New York-Penn League champions) and with the Charleston (W.Va.) Cubs in the South Atlantic League.

Following his playing days, Owens began his coaching career as a graduate assistant in football and baseball at Ithaca College, where he received a Master of Science degree in 1991.

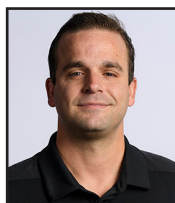

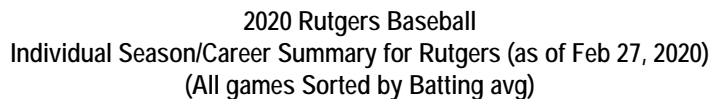
