## SDSU INTERVIEW POLICY

The South Dakota State University Sports Information Office strives to comply with all legitimate interview requests for Jackrabbit coaches, student-athletes and administrators in a timely fashion.

Interview times can be arranged through the SDSU Sports Information Office, preferably arranged 24 hours in advance Monday through Thursday.

Media members should not contact student-athletes directly without prior approval.

The SDSU Sports Information Office does not release the phone numbers of student-athletes to the media, and return calls must be made collect, or via a toll free number, unless the student-athlete does the interview from the sports information office.

The media **may not** interview student-athletes prior to a contest on the day of the game, but may do so 10 minutes after the conclusion of contests by contacting a member of the sports information staff or coaching staff.

## CREDENTIALS

All media credential requests for SDSU softball home games should be directed to sports information director Jason Hove or assistant director Ryan Sweeter at least 24 hours prior to the event.

The sports information office mails credentials or requests received a week or more in advance. Otherwise, the sports information office can make arrangements to pick them up.

Due to limited seating at the softball field, only working media may sit in the press area. Media requiring access to phone lines and Internet for photo or story transmission should contact the SDSU sports information office.

**—ALL CREDENTIALS ARE NON-TRANSFERABLE—**

The following guidelines apply specifically to Internet sites:

- No more than two people working for the official web site of the opponent and/or its official conference site will be issued credentials.
- Web sites whose content centers around message boards and chat rooms where users can post anonymous information and/or rumors are ineligible for any consideration for credentials or access.

- Credentials will not be granted to any agency operating sites that are in any way affiliated with gambling, or to freelance or fan-based sites not affiliated with a legitimate news-gathering organization.

The final decision for credentials remains at the sole discretion of SDSU sports information personnel. Failure to abide by the guidelines outlined on this page may result in revocation of media credentials.

## STATISTICS

The South Dakota State University Sports Information Office keeps official statistics and distributes final statistics to teams and members of the media within 15 minutes after the conclusion of the game.

## PHOTOGRAPHERS

The South Dakota State Athletic Department asks that photographers (live and still) do not interfere with the sight lines of spectators, and stay in the designated photography areas located along the baselines.

## BROADCASTS

KBRK Radio 1430-AM broadcasts select Jackrabbit softball games with Tyler Merriam or Dallas Cole calling the play-by-play.

Broadcasts begin approximately 15 minutes prior to the scheduled first pitch.

South Dakota State enters the 2008 season as a young team overall, but key veteran players return poised to make an impact for the Jackrabbits in their inaugural Summit League season.

The Jackrabbit coaching staff looks for their lone senior, Kiley Schwedhelm, to lead the charge and be both the defensive anchor at first base and in the pitching circle. Couple that with a promising fall offensively, and Schwedhelm's roll expands as offensive leader as well.

Five juniors on the roster bring both experience and productivity to this year's squad, including pitcher Jenna Marston, who threw over 200 innings last season. With a limited pitching staff in 2008, Marston again assumes her role as the workhorse of the SDSU staff.

Three junior outfielders return in 2008 to make that this team's most seasoned and cohesive unit. A true offensive threat, Sam Heinzman started every game as a sophomore, led the team in batting average and stole 14 bases.

Brittany Postma also started all 49 games, finished second on the team in batting average and stole 25 bases. A knee injury ended Brooke Postma's season on the second to last day of the season, but she still finished third on the team in batting average and stole an SDSU single-season record 27 bases in 28 attempts.

Stacey Evans rounds out the junior class and brings some power into a lineup built on speed. After not competing in 2007, Evans worked extremely hard to return her game to a higher level. Defensively, she can play first base or catcher, but should see most of her time at the designated player spot.

In the sophomore class, the Jacks need both shortstop Jessica Vineyard and catcher Dani Broshar to play every day this spring. Vineyard made defensive plays of highlight quality throughout the fall, while Broshar continues to do a good job of managing the pitching staff. Broshar also developed into one of the most impressive hitters this fall, and Head Coach Joanna Lane expects Dani to continue improving throughout the spring.

Sophomore outfielder Stephanie Peters earned the team's "Degree of Separation" award for her work ethic throughout the fall. Her efforts and intensity, combined with her improved game play, earned Peters an increased number of opportunities for playing time this spring.

Coach Lane and her staff looks for the freshman class to come in and contribute right away. Greta Stroh knocked in more than 30 percent of the team's runs in the fall and expects to pick up this spring where she left off in the fall. Ashley Durazo gets the nod as the starter at third base and as a contact hitter, can hit almost any pitch and work opposing pitchers by going deep into the count.

Freshman outfielder Dana Wilson provides some depth and options in the lineup as a power hitter, which complements the team's speed on the bases to help manufacture runs.

Injuries limited freshman pitcher Sam Przybelski in the fall, but the coaching staff expects her to throw her share of innings as she continues to regain her dominance and adapt to the college game.

### INFIELD

The Jackrabbit infield mixes a dash of experience with a handful of young players into one unique situation.

"I'm very impressed by the defensive play of Jessica Vineyard at shortstop and Kiley Schwedhelm at first base," said Lane. "Jessica made some stellar plays this fall, and may be one of the best, if not the best shortstop, that I've ever coached."

Schwedhelm's range allows the infield to stretch plays because of her dependable glove work.

"You don't always notice a good first baseman, and that's exactly the case with Kiley," said Lane. "She goes to work everyday and makes it look easy."

True freshmen Greta Stroh at second base and Ashley Durazo at third base continue to learn the defensive schemes, but because Lane expects them to play every inning, she says that they should pick it up quickly once the season starts.

"Ashley already shows glimpses of being terrific at third base, even though she came in primarily as a middle infielder," said Lane. "I expect Greta to hit her stride mid-season, as she gets more comfortable with the faster pace of college softball."

Dani Broshar took over the catching duties in 2007, and according to Lane, earned the right to hold on to that spot for the majority of innings in 2008.

"I expect Dani to continue improving throughout the season. She came a long way in her management of not only the pitching staff, but in her ability to frame the ball and block the plate. That, along with her strong arm and quick delivery, only solidified her place behind the plate."

Stacey Evans provides the Jacks with flexibility in the infield both at catcher and at first base, but she should make her biggest impact as the designated player.

### **OUTFIELD**

With all three starters returning in 2008, the Jackrabbit outfield comes into the season as the team's strongest and most consistent unit.

"We really challenged Sam, Brooke and Brittany to increase their range and accuracy this fall and they continue to work hard in both of those areas," said Lane.

The three returning outfielders combined to start all but two games in 2007, but with the emergence of Stephanie Peters, Lane knows she can rest an outfielder at any time, without losing play making ability in the outfield.

"Stephanie worked extremely hard this fall, earning herself a chance to compete for her share of starts in the outfield. And with Brooke and Brittany both back from injuries, Pete gives me the option to give all three returnees an occasional day off."

Sam Heinzman leads this group on both sides of the ball and enters the season prepared to repeat her 2007 success.

"Sam worked hard to diversify herself offensively and will be a mainstay in centerfield," said Lane. "As a triple threat offensively, Sam should be a catalyst for our lineup."

Freshman Dana Wilson adds some depth to the outfield as she adjusts to the college game, and gives the team a pinch-hitting option with power.

### **PITCHERS**

The ace of the Jackrabbit staff in 2007, Jenna Marston pitched almost two-thirds of the teams innings, and

returns to that roll in 2008.

"Jenna proved that she could shoulder the load last year," said Lane. "But we want to lower her pitch count this year and let the defense do the work for her."

By working with pitching coach Tracie Adix in the fall, Marston added some movement to her pitches, which should help her to go deeper into games with a lower pitch count.

Freshman Sam Przybelski worked all fall and winter to return to form from a pre-existing injury, but comes into the season ready to give the team as many innings as possible as she regains her strength.

With Marston carrying the bulk of the load and Przybelski coming off an injury, Kiley Schwedhelm can expect to see some time in the circle, which should not only give Marston and Przybelski some rest, but keep other teams off balance as well.

During the 2007 season, the Jackrabbit softball team broke records and made strides to set up the program for future success.

A young roster featuring only two seniors took the opportunity to travel across the country to play the nation's elite, including ranked opponents Oregon and Oregon State.

A 7-1 record at the Rebel Spring Games in Orlando, Fla., in early March during the team's Spring Break trip highlighted a 17-32 season. The Jacks left for Florida with a 2-6 record, but went 7-1 over the next four days, and left the games with a 9-7 record.

SDSU opened the games with wins over Monmouth and Detroit Mercy, before dropping a 2-1 contest to La Salle. The Jacks rebounded from that loss with four straight wins to get above .500 for the first time in the season.

The Jackrabbits then took their game to Oregon for the Cascade Clash, where they ran into the #15 Oregon State Beavers and the #16 Oregon Ducks.

Upon returning to the Midwest, the Jackrabbits recorded impressive road

victories at Creighton, 11-3, on March 22, and at Minnesota, 4-0, on April 24.

Another highlight for the softball program came with the ribbon-cutting to SDSU's new on-campus facility. The Jacks first game in Jackrabbit Softball Stadium on April 20, against North Dakota State marked the Jackrabbits first appearance on campus in more than ten years.

The Jackrabbits first win on their new field came five days later, when SDSU downed former North Central Conference foe Augustana 2-0.

The record setting season began with senior Steph Kuhl, who entered her senior season ranked in the top-ten in ten different career categories, including home runs and runs batted in. When Kuhl's final season ended, she ranked in the top-ten in 13 different categories, including being the SDSU career leader in runs batted with 131, home runs with 25 and tied with Julie Sudbeck (1990-93) with eight sacrifice flies.

SDSU employed an aggressive, up-tempo style of play, which led to shattered records on the bases. For the second consecutive season, the Jackrabbits set a school record for stolen bases in a season with 94, surpassing the previous mark of 82, set in 2006.

Sophomore outfielders Brooke Postma, Brittany Postma and Sam Heinzman already rank among the school's top ten for career stolen bases.

Madison, S.D., native Brooke Postma successfully stole 14 bases in as many attempts in her freshman season, then stole 21 more as a sophomore for a total of 35 bases before being caught for the first, and only time in her career, in the home opener.

For the season, Brooke stole an SDSU single-season record 27 bases in 2007, giving her 41 for her career, six shy of the SDSU record of 47.

Brooke's sister Brittany tied the old record for stolen bases in a season with 25, and enters her junior season ranked fifth on the all-time steals list with 35.

An Omaha, Neb., native, Heinzman stole 14 bases in 2007 to bring her career total to 27, good for eight all-time at SDSU.

The Jacks also received several individual honors. Heinzman earned all-tournament team honors at the Buzz Classic hosted by Georgia Tech, while freshman Amanda Fedson played to an all-tournament selection at the Division I Independent Tournament in Kennesaw, Ga.

Along with their play on the field, the SDSU softball team placed an emphasis on academics as well. The team compiled a cumulative grade-point average of 3.26, and four players earned D-I Independent All-Academic Team honors; Samantha Heinzman, 3.875 GPA in pre-economics; Teresa Howell, 3.253 in business economics; Jenna Marston, 3.488 in biology, and Kim Westendorf, 3.452 in chemistry.

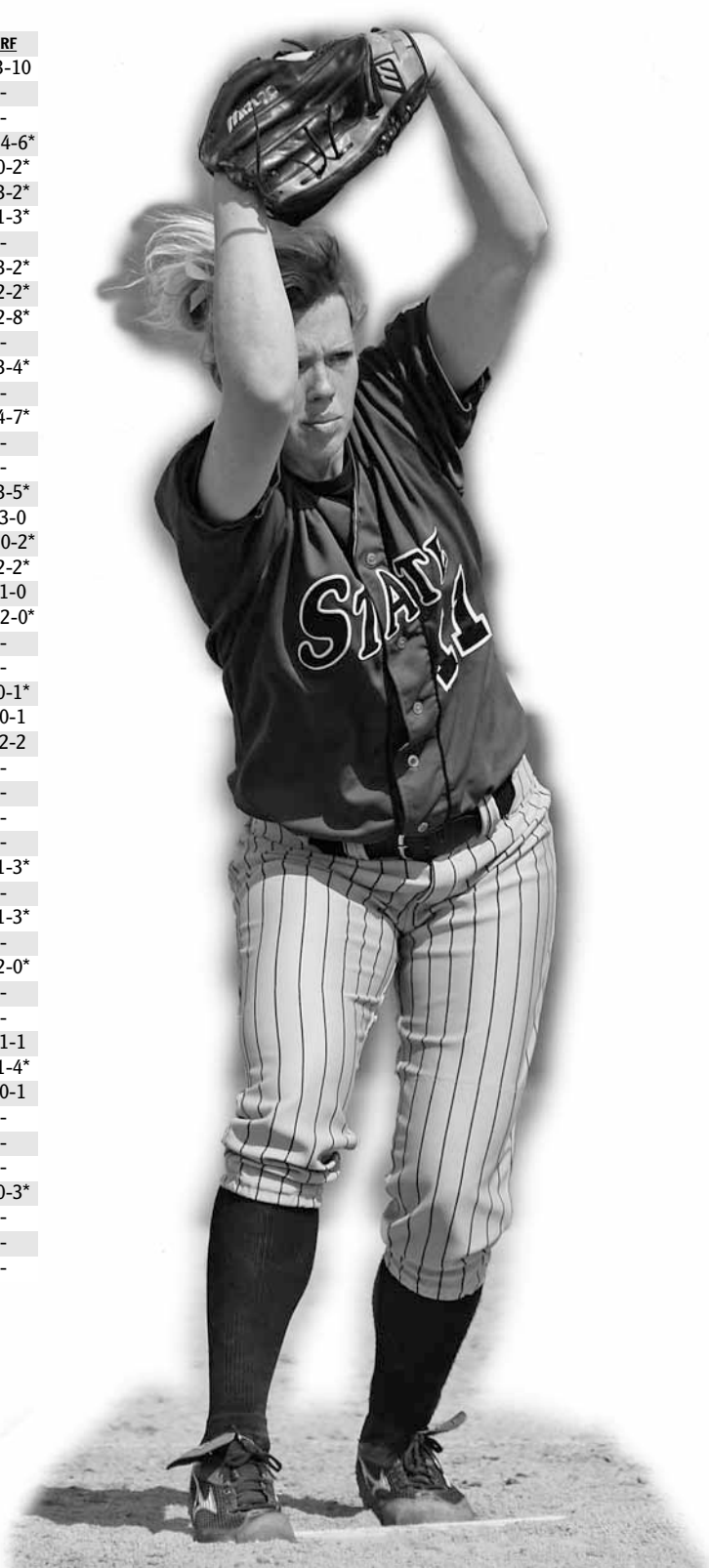

Joanna Lane became the 13th head coach South Dakota State softball history, when she took over the program on Aug. 1, 2007, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach at Northern Illinois University.

A native of Circleville, Ohio, Lane began her collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant at Florida State University during the 2002-03 academic year, where she worked under the winningest coach in softball history and five-time Atlantic Coast Conference Coach-of-the-Year, Dr. JoAnne Graf.

Lane's duties with Florida State included working with the infielders and assisting with the hitting.

A year before Lane arrived at Florida State, the Seminoles set the school record for walks in a season with 327. Following the arrival of Lane to the coaching staff in 2003, they equaled that mark, but did it in 18 fewer games,

and struck out 143 fewer times. The 2003 team also recorded the highest batting average in school history and hit the third most home runs in school history (22) on their way to winning the ACC title with an undefeated conference record.

At FSU, Lane helped coach a total of five all-conference players, including a pair of four-time all-conference selections, a two-time ACC Player-of-the-Year, a National Player-of-the-Year and three All-Americans.

After graduating Suma Cum Laude from Florida State with a Master's Degree in sport management, Lane took over as head coach at Wesleyan College in Macon, Ga., in 2004. During her first season with the Pioneers, Lane doubled the team's conference wins from the year before and beat the number one team in the region. In two years at Wesleyan, she coached a total of four

All-Great South Conference performers and six all-academic selections.

Following the 2005 season, Lane joined Donna Martin's staff at Northern Illinois, where she assisted in all areas of player development, recruiting and academic monitoring, as well as coaching infield and hitting.

In just her first year at NIU, the Huskies doubled their number of stolen bases, increased their number of hits, boosted the team batting average by a total by 13 percent and increased walks from 107 to 136. Along with all of the improvements, Lane also helped the Huskies decrease their strikeout totals in both of her seasons on the staff.

In two years at NIU, Lane coached four All-Mid-America Conference performers, three Academic All-MAC players, four National Fastpitch Coaches Association Academic All-Americans, and one CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Lane graduated with a degree in history education from Georgetown College (Ky.) in 2002, but not before making her mark on the diamond.

A four-year starter and three-year team captain, Lane led the LadyTigers to back-to-back Mid-South Conference titles in 2001 and 2002, and earned the school's Women's Athlete-of-the-Year award in 2001.

Tracie Adix made the transition from player to coach after joining the Jackrabbit coaching staff in 2008. Adix comes to South Dakota State after a standout pitching career at DePaul University in Chicago, Ill., that included a run deep into the Women's College World Series in 2007.

"Making the transition from player to coach can be tough for elite players like Tracie," said SDSU Head Coach Joanna Lane. "But her big game experience is a huge asset to the team, and she's really beginning to understand how to teach what comes natural to her, which gives the Jackrabbit pitchers the tools that made her one of the best in the nation.

The Blue Demon's fourth ever run to the WCWS came, in large part, on the right arm of Adix, who went a perfect 10-0 in Big East Conference play, and did not walk a batter in 22 appearances (108 innings), all while holding conference opponents to a .160 batting average.

For the season, the Edmonds, Wash.,

native finished with a 22-4 overall record, including wins over seven ranked opponents and the nation's fifth best earned run average at 0.89. She threw a total of ten shutouts and struck out 168 batters, while walking just 28.

In the post season alone, Adix combined on a no-hitter at the Carbondale Regional, striking out the side in two innings pitched against Mississippi Valley State and tossed a complete game shutout against Missouri in the semifinals.

She followed that up with 11 scoreless innings at the Super Regional in Norman, Okla., scattering three hits and striking out six Oklahoma batters to earn the victory in both games over the fourth ranked Sooners, a team that entered the tournament averaging 6.8 runs a game and with a .324 team batting average.

All told, Adix went 6-2 in the NCAA Championship, and did not allow a run in her first 23 and two-thirds innings during the NCAA Championship, before the eventual National Champion Arizona Wildcats ended DePaul's season in the quarterfinal round of the WCWS.

Along with being named the Blue Demon's Most Outstanding Player, Adix earned Big East Pitcher-of-the-Year honors, and took home National Fastpitch Coaches Association Second-Team All-American and NFCA First-Team All-Mideast Region honors in 2007. She also earned NFCA Second-Team All-Region honors in 2005.

Adix will pursue a master's degree in sports pedagogy at South Dakota State.

New Liberty, Iowa, native Megan Meyer joins the Jackrabbit staff in 2007 after two years away from the game, but South Dakota State head coach Joanna Lane says that did not effect Meyer's ability to immediately immerse herself back into a softball mentality.

"Megan is doing incredibly well after being out of the college game for the past two seasons," said Lane. "She has a great rapport with the student-athletes and keeps all of us organized and on task. She is very detail oriented and is a good instructor when it comes to breaking down hitting and communicating with the players."

Meyer comes to SDSU after a stint as a Personnel Manager for the Oakland A's Class A minor league affiliate Kane County Cougars and after making her mark on the diamond for the Northern Illinois Huskies.

A 2005 NIU graduate with degrees in Marketing and Human Resource Management, Meyer batted .247 with 18 doubles, a pair of triples and eight home runs in her career with the

Huskies, including a 2-for-3, 2 RBI career total against fellow SDSU assistant Tracie Adix.

Her first career home run came during her freshman year against the reigning Mid-American Conference Pitcher-of-the-Year, but statistically, Meyer's best year at NIU came in 2002 as a sophomore, when she started 47 of the team's 49 games, batted .301 with seven doubles, three homers and 13 RBI. Off the field in 2002, Meyer made the MAC academic honor roll and earned Huskie Scholar honors.

Meyer battled some injuries as a junior, but hit a career-best three home runs, including her first postseason dinger in the first round of the Mid-American Conference Tournament. She also earned NIU's Heidi Hutchinson Award in 2003 for her efforts on and off the field.

Injuries forced her to redshirt in 2004, but Meyer came back in 2005 to earn an Academic All-MAC selection after batting .265 with eight doubles, a triple and three home runs.

Prior to her college years, Meyer played, and started, for five years on the softball team at Durant (Iowa) High School, garnering All-State selections in her sophomore through senior years. Meyer also earned First-Team All-Eastern Iowa Hawkeye Conference recognition in each of her final three seasons after a second-team selection as a freshman.

All told, Meyer earned 16 varsity letters in high school, including five in softball, four in basketball, three in volleyball and golf and one in track.

Meyer will pursue a master's degree in sports pedagogy at South Dakota State.

Teresa Howell returns to South Dakota State in 2008 to fill the role as Student Manager for the Jackrabbits after spending the last three years in the Jackrabbit infield.

Despite a year of eligibility remaining, Howell came back to the team in 2008 with a unique blend of manager and student assistant responsibilities.

"Teresa has been a true asset to the coaching staff's transition into the program," said Head Coach Joanna Lane. "She would make a great coach if she ever decided to give up accounting!"

Howell's best season with Jacks came in 2007, when she played in 42 games with 30 starts, and set career-highs with 18 hits, including three doubles, a pair of triples and ten RBI. She also stole a career-high seven bases in as many attempts in 2007.

Howell started the 2006 season playing primarily off the bench, but ended up starting 32 of the Jacks final 33 games, mostly at shortstop. She recorded 58 put-outs and 71 assists in 143 chances for a .902 fielding percentage and successfully stole four bases in five attempts.

An early season injury ended Howell's season in 2004 after just seven games,

so she spent the 2005 season working her way back into form, primarily as a pinch runner off the bench. She capitalized on that role by going 5-for-5 in stolen bases and scoring ten runs in 22 games.

Prior to coming to South Dakota State, Howell played on back-to-back Class A state championship teams at Papillion-LaVista High School in 1999 and 2000, then moved on to play on two state qualifying teams at Elkhorn High School in 2001 and 2002, including a Class B runner-up finish in 2001.

The *Omaha World Herald* and *Lincoln Journal Star* tabbed Howell first-team Class B All-State in 2002, after earning second-team accolades in 2001.

A two-time all-conference and all-metro selection, she hit .351 during her senior season on her way to academic all-conference recognition.

In addition to her high school team, Howell played club ball on the metro champion Omaha Finesse for five years, earning American Fastpitch Association All-America honors at the 2000 national tournament.

**DAVID CHICOINE**  
**PRESIDENT**

A 1969 graduate of South Dakota State, Dr. David Chicoine took over as the 19th President in SDSU history on January 1, 2007.

Prior to his return to SDSU, the Elk Point native served as the vice president for technology and economic development at the University of Illinois.

In addition to his agribusiness degree from SDSU, Chicoine holds master's degrees in economics from Western Illinois University and in agriculture economics from the University of Delaware. He earned his Ph.D. in agriculture economics from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

An accomplished applied economics scholar, Chicoine earned recognition and numerous awards in writing more than 100 scholarly publications. He also sat on the board of trustees for the Chicago-based Farm Foundation and served as a trustee of Carle Foundation Hospital in Urbana, Illinois. He also served on the board of the John Warner Bank in Clinton, Illinois, and as a board member of the Champaign County Community Foundation.

Chicoine's father, Roland, who served 18 years in the South Dakota Legislature, attended SDSU prior to World War II. All seven of Chicoine's siblings also attended SDSU. In 1986, South Dakota State honored the Roland and Evelyn Chicoine family by naming them the SDSU Family of the Year.



**FRED OIEN**  
**ATHLETIC DIRECTOR**

Dr. Fred Oien became the 11th director of athletics at South Dakota State University on July 1, 1990.

Oien earned his bachelor's degree at SDSU in 1972 and has been on the SDSU staff since 1979, serving as athletic business/ticket manager from 1981 until his appointment as director of athletics. Oien is a 1968 graduate of Baltic (S.D.) High School. He added a master's degree at SDSU in 1975, then completed his doctorate (Ed.D) at the University of Massachusetts-Amherst in 1979.

Oien taught physical education and health at the Brookings Middle School from 1973-76, during which time he was varsity golf coach for both boys and girls, and middle school basketball and football coach. His golf teams won state championships for both boys and girls. Oien also was women's golf coach at SDSU, guiding the Jackrabbits to one North Central Conference championship. The SDSU women's golf team of 1982 was voted South Dakota Women's College Team of the Year.



**JIM BOOHER**  
**ATHLETIC TRAINER**

Dr. James Booher was inducted into the National Athletic Trainers Association Hall of Fame during the summer of 1998. He heads one of the top athletic training operations not only in the Upper Midwest, but the country.

He has been responsible for the development and growth of the athletic training-physical therapy program at SDSU and has had exceptional results in placing students as they advance toward their physical therapy degree.

A native of Ashland, Neb., Booher earned a bachelor's degree in biology at Nebraska Wesleyan in 1965.

He received physical therapy training at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn., then earned a master's degree in HPER at SDSU in 1969. He completed his doctorate at the University of Utah in 1976.

Booher has been on the SDSU staff since 1967, although he split time between the university and the Brookings Hospital until 1975, when he became a full-time staff member at SDSU.

Co-author of a textbook entitled "Athletic Injury Assessment," Booher also is a member of the North Central Conference and the South Dakota Athletic Trainers Association halls of fame.



**MYLO HELLICKSON**  
**FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE**

Dr. Mylo Hellickson has been South Dakota State University's faculty representative to the North Central Conference and NCAA since 1977, and as such also is chairman of the Athletic, Intramural and Recreation Committee on campus.

Hellickson recently returned to the classroom as a professor in agricultural engineering after serving several years as director of agriculture Extension at SDSU. He has been on the SDSU staff since 1969, serving as a professor in agricultural engineering until he was appointed as head of that department during the summer of 1982.

Dr. Hellickson's specialty has been in the area of livestock structures and environment with recent emphasis on solar energy use in agriculture.

A native of Belfield, N.D., he earned a bachelor's degree in agricultural engineering from North Dakota State University in 1964, added a master's degree in ag engineering from NDSU in 1966, then earned a Ph.D. in engineering at West Virginia University in 1969.

With a record enrollment of 11,706 students in the fall of 2007, South Dakota State remains the state's largest institution of higher learning.

**SDSU EARLY HISTORY**

Located in Brookings, The Territorial Legislative Assembly authorized SDSU in 1881 to serve as the state's land grant institution. Territorial Council member John O'Brien Scobey managed to secure Dakota Agricultural College for his city.

Although allocations fell short of the actual cost, the school did open in the fall of 1884 because the president, George Lilley, advanced \$500 — one-third of his salary — to finish three rooms in the new Central Building. "Old Central" was soon joined by South (1885) and North (1887), forming the nucleus of campus for a decade and a half.

During the first year of operation, the college only held preparatory classes. College classes started in 1885 with five teachers, 17 freshman and 61 preparatory students. Growth stayed slow and erratic for many years, but by the turn of the 20th century, 242 students enrolled and by 1990, SDSU enrollment grew to more than 9,000 students.

**COLLEGES ESTABLISHED**

SDSU granted Nearly 50,000 degrees since its charter in 1881.

The structure of the college became more complex as enrollments increased. The first nine chairs of instruction established in 1884 included agriculture, science, mathematics, English, modern languages, military tactics, veterinary science, practical business, political & domestic economy, and music.

By 1907, the year the name of the institution changed to South Dakota State College of Agriculture and

Mechanic Arts, there were 22 departments on campus.

Reorganization into the five divisions that formed the basis for the designation of colleges was completed under President Charles W. Pugsley in 1923.

In 1964, when "State College" became South Dakota State University, the school included six colleges. Now, students can earn degrees offered through eight colleges.

Students can choose from more than 200 majors, minors and options at SDSU with more than 2,500 different course offerings.

Master's degrees can be earned in more than 30 areas, with doctorates available in eight fields.

SDSU also offers degree programs through the South Dakota Public Universities and Research Center in

Sioux Falls. The Office of Academic Affairs and Outreach coordinates evening, RDTN, Internet and off-campus courses.

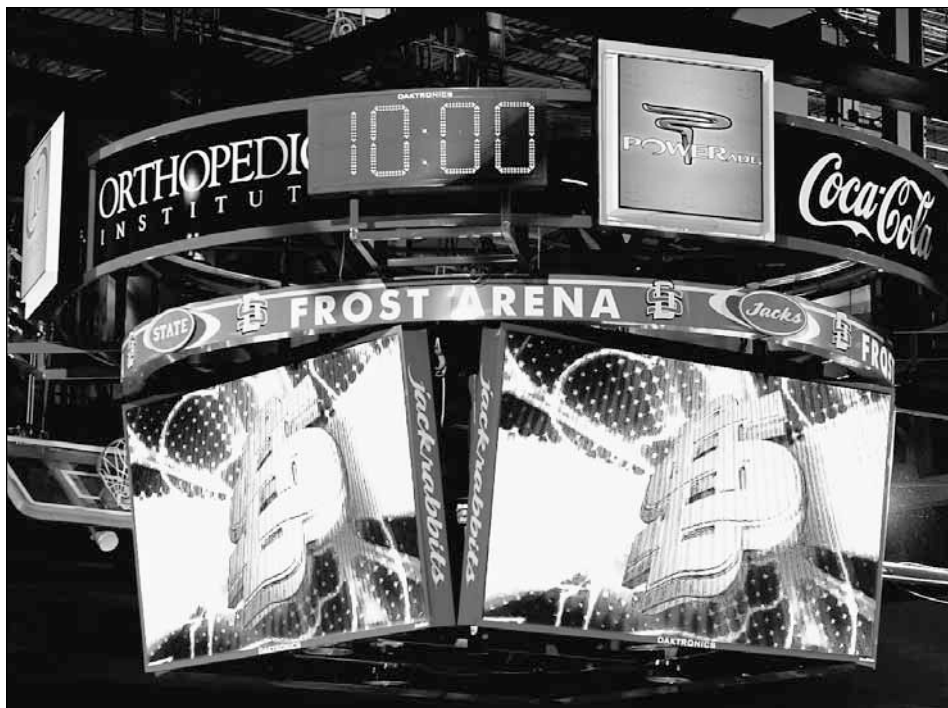
SDSU is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and numerous departments on campus hold accreditation from various agencies.

SDSU celebrated its 125th anniversary in 2006, a yearlong event that culminated with the 2006 Hobo Day football game.

Over those 125 years, SDSU grew from a campus of 80 acres in 1881 to a 271-acre campus with facilities worth more than \$220 million.

The university owns or leases another 15,000 acres for research throughout the state. Recently, the Printing and Journalism Building — now named Anson and Ada May Yeager Hall — underwent a \$2.1 million expansion and renovation project.

Other recent campus construction projects include a \$7 million expansion to Crothers Engineering Hall, the renovation of Solberg Hall and the building of a \$9 million performing arts center, which opened in the fall of 2002.

A new residence hall (Caldwell Hall) and the University Student Union expansion and renovation opened in the fall of 2005, and the Enterprise Institute, located on the southwest corner of campus opened in 2004.

In 2005, SDSU spent more than \$3 million to install new state of the art scoreboards in Frost Arena and at Coughlin Alumni Stadium.

### **AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH**

The university reaches all corners of the state through the Cooperative Extension Service and the Agricultural Experiment Station, offering service to improve the quality of rural life.

Also at SDSU are the Center for Innovation, Technology and Entrepreneurship; Engineering Experiment Station, Office of Remote Sensing; Water Resources Institute;

Engineering and Environmental Research Center; Animal Disease Research and Diagnostic Laboratory; and Northern Grain Insect Research Laboratory. These units help strengthen the university's growing commitment to research and support of state and local economic development efforts. The Northern Great Plains Biostress Laboratory, dedicated in 1993, houses scientists who focus on research aimed at developing new technologies to protect crops and livestock.

SDSU is also one of just five universities to serve as a regional center for the Sun Grant Initiative, which is a concept to solve America's energy needs and revitalize rural communities with Land-Grant university research, education and Extension programs on renewable energy and bio-based non-food industries.

The Harding Distinguished Lecture Series, the F.O. Butler Lectures, the Lusk Lecture and the Amdahl, Schultz-Werth and Griffiths endowments all supplement classroom instruction.

Students can also choose from more than 100 clubs and organizations on campus.

### **MUSEUMS & ATTRACTIONS**

The educational opportunities do not end in the classroom or laboratory, as South Dakota State University houses several facilities, including museums and gardens.

Dedicated in 1970, and expanded in 2000, the South Dakota Federation of Women's Club first envisioned the South Dakota Art Museum in 1949.

The museum's collections include early Sioux Indian tribal art, the famed Harvey Dunn paintings of pioneer life and the exclusive Vera Way Marghab linens.

The State Agricultural Heritage Museum transformed the former Stock Judging Pavilion into a home for exhibits that record and preserve the agrarian heritage of South Dakota.

The 70-acre McCrory Gardens and South Dakota Arboretum, located south and east of campus, provide a beautiful setting for area residents and tourists to enjoy a stroll through the radiant colors and fragrances of one of the top 10 small ornamental gardens in the nation.

It is also recognized as an All-American Display Garden, one of only 13 in the nation. In 1993 McCrory Gardens was designated an All-American Judging Garden to conduct research on annual flowers.

Since 1985, private contributions made many new gardens possible including the Rose, Rock, Centennial Prairie, Iris, True Lily, Mum, Native Prairie Collection, Oak Tree Memorial Garden, All-Red Specialty Garden,

Peony Garden, Shrub Rose Collection, and Children's Maze.

In August 1994, McCrory Gardens dedicated the Mickelson Grove Memorial in honor of former governor and Brookings resident George S. Mickelson.

In 1982, they dedicated the area north of the formal garden to the planting and testing of ornamental trees and shrubs. The 45-acre site was designated the South Dakota State Arboretum in 1988.

The arboretum's purpose is to test woody plants needed to protect agricultural fields and livestock from the region's harsh environment, to provide hardy trees to shade our towns and cities, and to test ornamental shrubs for both durability and beauty.

SDSU Horticulture, Forestry, Landscape and Parks Department manage the arboretum and gardens.

McCrory Gardens continues to develop more gardens, tree and shrub collections.

**THE COUGHLIN CAMPANILE**

South Dakota State's most recognizable landmark may be the 165-foot Coughlin Campanile, the state's largest chimes tower. A climb of 179 steps leads to a panoramic view of the city.

1909 Engineering graduate Charles Coughlin, who later went on to become head of the Briggs & Stratton Corporation, donated the statuesque structure on the west end of campus at a cost of \$65,000.

Coughlin laid the campanile's cornerstone on June 10, 1929. Since then, its chimes call students to classes with the famous Westminster peals.

An alumni-sponsored project to restore the campanile was completed in the summer of 2001.

Named after a former SDSU President, The Hilton M. Briggs Library, the state's largest, opened in 1977 and joined South Dakota's statewide automated library network in 1988. Through the library, users can access holdings from all 10 of the state's libraries, including official documents and more than 1 million other holdings at Briggs.

Adjacent to the campanile, Coolidge-Sylvan Theatre provides a restful, green haven for students since its dedication by President Calvin Coolidge in September 1927.

Over the years the outdoor amphitheater hosted concerts, graduations and inaugurations for university presidents.

Woodbine Cottage, the home of the university president, is a charming example of Queen Anne architecture. Built in 1887 by South Dakota Agricultural College's second president, Dr. Lewis McLouth, the home is crowned by multiple rooflines. The house also served as a women's dormitory, music hall and infirmary.

### THE JACKRABBITS

Two theories exist as to how and why SDSU's athletic teams became known as the "Jackrabbits".

Most believe that the name "Jackrabbits" came from a story and cartoon sketch that appeared in a Minneapolis newspaper following a 1905 football game between the University of Minnesota and South Dakota State College. Many believe that a reporter for the newspaper, knowing of the preponderance of jackrabbits in the Brookings area, wrote that the SDSC team was as quick as jackrabbits. Many people believe that the school adopted the Jackrabbits as its official nickname from that beginning.

The other theory about the origin of the nickname came in *The Jackrabbit*, SDSU's yearbook. A poem in the 1907 yearbook puts forth the idea that the yearbook is called The Jackrabbit because a group of juniors wished to immortalize themselves by changing the name of the yearbook. Athletic teams followed suit, adopting the nickname.

Prior to the adoption of the Jackrabbit nickname, fans knew the school athletic teams as the Barn Yard Cadets as SDSU was known as South Dakota State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts in 1907.

The Jackrabbit can run at speeds of 30-to-35 miles per hour, with bursts up

to 45, making it the second fastest animal in North America, second only to the pronghorn antelope, which can run at speeds up to 60 miles per hour.

Jackrabbits are, properly speaking, not rabbits but hares, with longer feet and longer ears than rabbits. Most hares live in open country, whereas rabbits - like cottontails - live in brushy habitats.

Jackrabbits can grow up to two feet long, weigh from six to nine pounds, with ears up to eight inches long. Hares are vegetarians, eating tender herbs in summer, and woody twigs and bark in the winter.

### BROOKINGS, SOUTH DAKOTA

Named after W.W. Brookings, who came to the area in 1857. That winter, his legs froze so badly they had to be amputated. Undaunted, Brookings stayed and eventually became president of the territorial council and a judge in the state supreme court. In honor of his support of railroad construction, and possibly because of his stalwart nature, South Dakota's first locomotive was named the "Judge Brookings."

Situated at the intersection of U.S. Highway 14 and Interstate 29, about 20 miles west of the Minnesota border and 50 miles north of Sioux Falls, the Brookings community of about 18,500 people continues to grow. The community also houses several recognizable companies including Rainbow Play Systems, Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing (3M medical products), Larson Manufacturing (doors and windows), and Daktronics, a leading manufacturer of scoreboards and display systems. The largest gasohol production plant in South Dakota (Vera Sun Energy) sits just east of Brookings while soybean production plant operates just west of the city.
