



First Place on the Line Thursday

- With a potential Summit League regular-season title, win streaks, state bragging rights and a Showdown Series point on the line, the South Dakota State women's basketball team plays in-state rival South Dakota Thursday. Tipoff for the South Dakota Showdown Series game, presented by South Dakota Corn, is at 7 p.m. in the friendly confines of Frost Arena.
- Tom Nieman will call the play-by-play, Brad Newitt will provide the color commentary and Elaina Lanson will be reporting from the sidelines for the Midco Sports Network. The game can also be heard live on The Jackrabbit Sports Network with Brad Peterson on WNAX 570 AM.
- The Jackrabbits are 16-4 overall and 5-0 in The Summit League and are just one of two teams— South Dakota—still undefeated in league play.
- SDSU won its seventh consecutive home game Jan. 20, defeating Western Illinois, 84-48. Summit League Player of the Year candidate Macy Miller tied a career high by netting a season- and gamehigh 31 points on 11-of-18 shooting from the field.
- SDSU has won 10 of the last 13 games against league members, dating to last season.
- South Dakota is 15-5 overall and 6-0 in league play. The Coyotes defeated Omaha, 70-46, Jan. 20. Four USD players scored in double figures led by Allison Arens' 18 points.
- Thursday's game will be the 83rd meeting between the Jackrabbits and the Coyotes. SDSU leads the series 56-26 and is 29-9 in Frost Arena.

Noteworthy

- South Dakota State has a 16-game home winning streak against Summit League opponents. Its last home loss was Jan. 17, 2016, to South Dakota. The streak ranks ninth in the latest NCAA statistics.
- The Jacks' seven-game overall win streak versus league opponents, dates to a win at Fort Wayne Feb. 18, 2017.
- After the Western Illinois win, the Jackrabbits have

now won six games in row, the longest since winning six consecutive games between Jan. 5 and Jan. 21, 2017.

■ SDSU is 477-120 (.798) all-time in home games, including 79-7 (.918) in home Summit League games.

- State has started 6-0 in Summit League twice—2012-13 and 2013-14. The best start to a league season was by the 2013-14 team, which won its first eight games.
- South Dakota State was ranked second in Graham Hays' Jan. 9 espnW mid-major poll. It was ranked No. 1 in the Nov. 15 poll and second in the Nov. 29 and Dec. 13 polls.
- The Jackrabbits eight of their last 10 contests.

- State has held 13 of its 20 opponents to 65-orfewer points, including four to less than 50.
- There have had at least three Jackrabbits scoring in double digits in 13 of 20 games. In the last five games, two Jacks are averaging double figures, led by Macy Miller's 22.4 ppg.
- Miller has scored 20-or-more points 10 times. She averages 18.6 points per game.

Poll Positions

- South Dakota State received a vote in this week's Associated Press poll.
- The last time the Jacks received votes in either poll was Dec. 11, when they had three votes in the AP and Coaches polls.
- The highest SDSU has ever been ranked is 16th in the AP poll March 9, 2009, and 14th in the Coaches poll March 2, 2009.

Jackrabbits in Mid-Major Poll

- South Dakota State was ranked third in the Jan. 23 CollegeInsider Mid-Major poll.
- SDSU has been ranked in the Mid-Major Top 25 Poll 111 of the last 112 weeks.
- The Jackrabbits, who were picked No. 1 in last year's preseason poll, finished 15th at the end of the 2016-17 season.

A Quick Glance at South Dakota State

- Eighteenth-year head coach Aaron Johnston's probable starters for the South Dakota game are:

 - Madison Guebert, guard
 - Macy Miller, guard

- The starting lineup is 3-0 overall this season.
- Summit League Player of the Year candidate Macy Miller is currently The Summit League's overall and league-leading scorer and SDSU's leading scorer, averaging 18.6 points per game. Madison Guebert (15.0) ranks fourth in the league in scoring.
- SDSU averages 75.4 points per game and limits foes to 63.3 points per outing.
- On the boards, Tagyn Larson is SDSU's leading rebounder, grabbing 5.6 caroms an outing. The Jackrabbits are outrebounding opponents by 4.9.
- The Jackrabbits' top 3-point threat is Guebert, who is sinking 2.5 treys per game.
- Miller is the Jacks' top playmaker, dishing 2.9 assists per game.
- The Jacks have a plus-1.1 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- SDSU is shooting 43.0 percent from the field, 34.5 percent from 3-point range and 78.6 percent from the free-throw line.

Glance at South Dakota

- South Dakota has a nine-game winning streak entering Thursday game after knocking off Omaha Jan. 20. The streak ranks 10th in the NCAA.
- The Coyotes are 15-5 overall and 6-0 in league play, are 5-2 on the road, winning their last four outings.

- USD is led offensively by junior Allison Arens. The guard is averaging 12.4 points per game. Sophomore guard Ciara Duffy and junior guard Jaycee Bradley average 11.9 and 10.2 points per game, respectively.
- The Coyotes average 73.0 points per game and give up 58.5.
- Senior guard Jasmine Trimboli and Duffy each average a team-leading 4.9 rebounds. The Yotes are outrebounding opponents by 1.1 caroms a game.
- Sophomore guard Madison McKeever is dishing 2.6 assists per game and five Coyotes have 30-or-more assists.
- Bradley is USD's top 3-point threat, sinking 43.8 percent (42-96) of her shots. She ranks fourth in The Summit League 3-point field goals and in 3-point field goals per game and fifth in 3-point field goal percentage.
- South Dakota has seven players averaging five-or-more points and nine averaging 10-or-more minutes per game.
- The Yotes are shooting 46.5 percent from the field, 36.8 percent from 3-point range and 79.6 percent from the free-throw line.

Breaking Down the USD Series

- Thursday's game marks the 83rd meeting between South Dakota State and South Dakota, dating to a 35-26 Jackrabbits' victory Feb. 4, 1967, in Vermillion. It was the second game in SDSU's first season as a varsity program.
- Overall, the Jackrabbits hold a 56-26 series advantage, winning 38 of the last 50 meetings, and hold a 29-9 record in Frost Arena.
- SDSU won the first 14 games in the series before the Coyotes won 18 of 23 matchups between the 1977-78 and 1990-91 seasons. The Jackrabbits followed with 25 consecutive victories.
- The Jackrabbits won six meetings in a row, starting with an 87-63 victory in the championship game of the 2003 NCAA Division II North Central Regional at Frost Arena. However, that streak came to an end in 2012 as the two squads split the series in their first year together as members of The Summit League.
- Last year, each team won on its home court. In Vermillion, USD won 65-62, Dec. 31, 2016, and in Frost, SDSU won 70-58, Feb. 4, 2017.
- In nine of the last 15 games, SDSU has limited USD to 65-or-fewer points, including 48 points Feb. 15, 2010, in Frost Arena.
- In six games, Macy Miller is averaging 18.2 points and 6.0 rebounds against the Coyotes. Madison Guebert is scoring 15.0 per game in five games, while Ellie Thompson is shooting 53.3 percent from the field and scoring 11.1 points and grabbing 4.5 rebounds per game in eight outings against USD.

Second-Quarter Explosion Powers Jacks

- BROOKINGS, S.D.—Jan. 20, 2018—South Dakota State head coach Aaron Johnston set The Summit League records for wins as the Jackrabbits recorded an 84-48 win over Western Illinois in front of 2.129 fans at Frost Arena.
- The win gives Johnston 144 victories in Summit League play and 261 overall wins since the Jackrabbits entered The Summit League in 2007-08. Oral Roberts' Jerry Finkbeiner was the previous record-holder.
- Macy Miller tied her career high with 31 points to lead South Dakota State. Tylee Irwin tied her career high with 14 points while Madison Guebert added 10 points. Miller added eight rebounds, four assists, four steals and tied a personal best with two blocked shots.
- Western Illinois was led by Emily Clemens' 16 points.
- After Western Illinois closed the first quarter with a 9-2 run to tie game 12-12, the Jackrabbits opened the second quarter with a 15-3 run for a 27-15 lead when Tagyn Larson scored inside with 6:06 left in the half.
- After making four of 17 shots in the first quarter, SDSU made 14 of 17 shots, including four 3-point field goals, in the second quarter. Miller made eight-straight field goals to close the first half as the Jackrabbits scored 34 points in the second quarter to take a 46-23 lead at halftime.
- The Jackrabbits forced Western Illinois into 9-of-42 shooting and 11 turnovers through three quarters and had 44-point lead, 79-35, with 4:43 to play in the final quarter.

Western Illinois Leftovers

- South Dakota State made 16 of 22 free throws, marking the 18th game with 10-or-more makes from the foul line.
- The Jackrabbits won by 30-plus points for the fourth time this season.
- SDSU held WIU to just 14 field goals, the fewest by an opponent since limiting Fort Wayne to 13 field goals Jan. 13, 2016, in Fort Wayne.
- State limited the Leathernecks for 23.0 percent field goal percentage, the lowest since TCU shot just 19.2 percent from the field Nov. 27, 2013.
- The Jacks collected a season-high 12 steals. It was the most since having 12 versus NDSU Feb. 2, 2017.
- State outrebounded its sixth consecutive opponent and 12th of the year.
- SDSU's 45 defensive rebounds were a season best.

Jackrabbits in Frost Arena

- SDSU is 10-1 this season, averaging 77.3 points per game and giving up 56.5.
- Macy Miller, Madison Guebert and Myah Selland average 17.7, 14.0 and 10.5 points per game, respectively.
- Tagyn Larson is grabbing 6.4 rebounds per game and

- In five-plus seasons, South Dakota State has buried 1,342 3-pointers for 8.6 per game. In 2008-09, State sank a school-record 291 trevs.
- The Jacks have made 200-or-more 3-point field goals in 16 of the last 17 seasons.
- South Dakota State ranks second in 3-pointers made (8.6) overall and third in league games (9.3).

Guebert + Miller = Threes

- The junior pairing of Madison Guebert and Macy Miller has established itself as one of the top long-range shooting duos in SDSU history.
- Already this year, the two Jackrabbit guards have combined for 86 State's 172 3-pointers. The prolific outside shooting from these two is nothing new as they continue to move up the all-time SDSU 3-point charts.
- Only one other South Dakota State duo has tallied more threes over a three-year stretch than the 328 that Guebert and Miller have combined for since the 2015-16 season.
- Jill Young and Kristin Rotert are the most prolific 3-point shooting duo in school history as they netted 412 treys while they played together from 2008-10.

Showdown Series

- South Dakota State and South Dakota meet in the South Dakota Corn Utilization Showdown Series Thursday, a yearlong collegiate athletics and academic competition started in fall 2012.
- The Jackrabbits lead the all-time series 3-2, and Thursday's women's basketball is the eighth event this year. SDSU leads 4-3 with 14 events to go.
- The South Dakota Showdown Series, presented by South Dakota Corn, operates on a point system in which each school can earn a maximum of 24 points per year based on head-to-head competition and Summit League Championship finishes between the Jackrabbits and the Coyotes in a total of 17 men's and women's sports. There is an academic component as well, and the university compiling the most points by the end of the school year will earn bragging rights to the specially designed traveling trophy.
 In addition to focusing on the points
- earned by both schools respectively, promoting values of good sportsmanship will be strongly emphasized among SDSU and USD fans.

 Complementing the competition aspect, SDSU, USD and South Dakota Corn have designated Feeding South
- Corn have designated Feeding South Dakota as the nonprofit organization to benefit from the rivalry series. As the state's primary hunger relief operation, Feeding South Dakota feeds thousands of people every year and provided 10.1 million meals to individuals in need in 2015. It was imperative to both schools and South Dakota Corn that Feeding South Dakota benefits, and concessionaire Aramark is ensuring that happens as fans attending Showdown Series' headto-head athletic events are encouraged to make a monetary donation for Feeding South Dakota while making their concession purchases.
