BROOKINGS, S.D. — The South Dakota State University football team will take a two-game winning streak into a key Missouri Valley Football Conference matchup Saturday at Northern Iowa.

Kickoff is set for 4 p.m. at the UNI-Dome in Cedar Falls, Iowa. Television coverage of the game will be available exclusively through ESPN3.com.

The Jackrabbits enter the week with a 4-1 overall record and 2-1 mark in the MVFC following a 36-7 Hobo Day victory over Youngstown State on Oct. 13. SDSU is ranked second in this week's STATS FCS media poll and has returned to the No. 3 spot in the poll conducted by the American Football Coaches Association.

Northern Iowa, meanwhile, evened its overall record at 3-3 and improved to 2-1 in league play with a 42-28 road win at South Dakota last week. The Panthers re-entered the STATS FCS media rankings at No. 25 this week and are the top team receiving votes in the coaches' poll.

THE SERIES: Saturday's game will mark the 54th meeting on the gridiron between South Dakota State and Northern Iowa. The two squads met regularly from the time the series started in 1935 until UNI (formerly Iowa Teachers College) left the North Central Conference in the late 1970s to join the Division I ranks.

UNI holds a 30-21-2 advantage in the series, including an 8-5 advantage since SDSU joined the Football Championship Subdivision in 2004.

Home-field advantage has meant little in the series' recent history as the road team has won each of the last four regular season meetings, starting with a 31-28 Jackrabbit victory in Cedar Falls, Iowa, during the 2014 season.

The two teams split the season series in 2017, with both games played at SDSU's Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

In the first matchup last season, Oct. 14, 2017, South Dakota State dug itself an early hole with multiple uncharacteristic mistakes and couldn't recover in falling, 38-18.

UNI led 17-0 after one quarter, cracking the scoring column with a field goal after a muffed punt. The Panthers also took advantage of a short field following an interception to push the margin to 10-0, then put together a six-play, 48-yard drive that was capped by an 11-yard touchdown run by Marcus Weymiller.

The Jackrabbits twice pulled within two scores, the last on a 19-yard touchdown catch by Dallas Goedert late in the third quarter.

SDSU was much sharper in the Dec. 2 rematch, which was a second-round Football Championship Subdivision playoff game won by the Jackrabbits, 37-22. The Jackrabbits led 10-0 after one quarter and 26-7 at halftime behind three touchdowns (two passing, one rushing) by Taryn Christion and a pair of Chase Vinatieri field goals, including a career-long 55-yarder.

ELITE COMPANY: South Dakota State is one of only four Football Championship Subdivision programs to reach the playoffs each of the last six seasons.

The three other programs to play in the postseason each year since 2012 are New Hampshire, North Dakota State and Sam Houston State.

RABBITS RANKED: South Dakota State entered the 2018 season with its highest-ever rankings in a Football Championship Subdivision poll, checking in at No. 3 in both the STATS FCS media poll and AFCA FCS Coaches' Poll. It marked the fifth time in six years the Jackrabbits have entered a season with a top-10 national ranking in the Football Championship Subdivision, surpassing their No. 4 ranking in the 2017 STATS FCS Preseason Poll.

Defending national champion North Dakota State continues to hold the top spot in both national polls, while the Jackrabbits have attained their highest-ever ranking in a Football Championship Subdivision poll by climbing to second in the STATS FCS media rankings.

Christion and Rozeboom are each in their second seasons as captains.

TOP OF THE CHARTS: The Jackrabbits enter the week leading the Football Championship Subdivision in team passing efficiency with a rating of 208.76. SDSU quarterbacks have combined to throw for 19 touchdowns and only one interception, while averaging 11 yards per pass attempt.

In addition, SDSU ranks second in scoring offense (48.4 points per game) and fourth in total offense (529.6 yards per game).

STIG COACHES 250TH GAME: Jackrabbit mentor John Stiegelmeier marked his 250th game as head coach with a 36-7 victory over Youngstown State on Oct. 13. In 22 seasons, Stiegelmeier has led the Jackrabbits to a 152-98 career record (.608 winning percentage), including a 57-26 mark in MVFC contests.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK: With its 90-point outburst Sept. 15 against Arkansas-Pine Bluff, South Dakota State broke a 96-year-old scoring record. The previous mark of 85 points was set against Columbus College in 1922.

The Jackrabbits also set new team standards for total offense (926 yards), passing yards (557) and passing touchdowns (8). Individually, Chase Vinatieri set a school record by kicking 11 extra points.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: Six different Jackrabbits scored their first collegiate touchdowns in the Sept. 15 rout of Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

Freshman tight end Blake Kunz opened the scoring with an 8-yard touchdown reception on SDSU's first drive of the game, while Adam Anderson followed with a 31-yard touchdown reception later in the first quarter for his first collegiate score.

In the second half, running backs Pierre Strong Jr. (66 yards) and C.J. Wilson (37 yards) found paydirt on screen passes, with Blair Mulholland (14-yard run) and Michael Wandmaker (76-yard reception) closing out the scoring.

WALLACE SIDELINED: South Dakota State's leading rusher, Isaac Wallace, suffered a season-ending injury in the Oct. 13 contest against Youngstown State.

A senior from Omaha, Wallace was enjoying his best season in a Jackrabbit uniform, highlighted by three touchdowns on runs of 50-plus yards.

Prior to his injury, Wallace ranked second among Football Championship Subdivision players with an average of 9.39 yards per carry, gaining 413 yards on only 44 carries. His first three touchdowns this season covered 58, 79 and 61 yards, while his fourth rushing touchdown of the season was a 2-yard run in overtime that lifted the Jackrabbits to a 54-51 victory over Indiana State on Oct. 6.

WILSON STEPS UP: After starting running back Isaac Wallace was lost to injury late in the first quarter Oct. 13 against Youngstown State, freshman C.J. Wilson emerged as the Jackrabbits' top rusher. Wilson went on to gain a career-best 119 yards on 16 carries, breaking off a 41-yard run late in the first half to set up a touchdown and later scoring his first career rushing touchdown on a 48-yard burst up the middle in the third quarter.

For the season, Wilson is averaging 6.8 yards per carry, gaining 271 yards on 40 carries.

TOP RECEIVING TANDEM: The duo of Cade Johnson and Adam Anderson have emerged as the top receiving tandem in the Missouri Valley Football Conference in the first half of the 2018 season.

Each has recorded consecutive 100-yard games this season, with Johnson leading the league with an average of 86.8 receiving yards per game and eight touchdowns.

Anderson, a junior who ranks fifth in the league with an average of 77.4 yards per game, hauled in a career-high eight catches in the Sept. 29 game at North Dakota State and recorded his first career multi-touchdown performance with two scoring catches Oct. 6 versus Indiana State.

JOHNSON TIES RECORD: South Dakota State wide receiver Cade Johnson became the latest Jackrabbit to tie the SDSU single-game record for touchdown receptions when he scored four times Sept. 8 against Montana State.

Don Bartlett originally set the record with four touchdown receptions against North Dakota State in 1949. That mark went unmatched for 67 years until Dallas Goedert caught four TDs against Western Illinois in 2016 and Jake Wieneke scored on four pass plays in the 2017 season opener against Duquesne.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: For the second time this season, South Dakota State University punter Brady Hale has been honored as the Missouri Valley Football Conference Special Teams Player of the Week.

A senior from Yankton, Hale averaged 42.6 yards on seven punts, booting a season-long 57-yarder and landing two attempts inside the 20-yard line, as the Jackrabbits dominated on special teams during a 36-7 Hobo Day victory over Youngstown State.

Hale also handled kickoff duties for the first time this season, recording touchbacks on three of his seven attempts.

Previously, Hale received the MVFC weekly award for his performance in SDSU's Sept. 8 season-opening win over Montana State.

BALANCED ATTACK: South Dakota State totaled 500-plus yards of total offense for the third time this season in its Oct. 6 overtime victory over Indiana State, but did so without a 100-yard rusher or receiver. Three running backs — Pierre Strong Jr., Isaac Wallace and Mikey Daniel — all ran for at least 70 yards, with Strong leading the way with 95 yards on only six carries.

The Jackrabbits' 20 receptions were spread among eight different players, with Kal Hart and Adam Anderson leading the receiving corps by each tallying four catches for 57 yards.

TAKEAWAY STREAK: Second-half interceptions by Zy Mosley and Christian Rozeboom in the Hobo Day victory over Youngstown State on Oct. 13 extended SDSU's streak of forcing at least one turnover to 20 consecutive games.

In those 20 games, the Jackrabbits have come out on the plus side of turnover margin nine times and have been even with their opponent on six other occasions. The most turnovers the Jackrabbits have forced during its current streak is five, which came in their 33-21 victory over North Dakota State last season.

For the season, the Jackrabbits are plus-8 in turnover margin, forcing 10 turnovers (seven interceptions, three fumbles) and committing only two turnovers in 264 offensive plays. SDSU is tied for second in the FCS or fewest number of turnovers lost.

VALLEY PREVIEW: For the second year in a row, South Dakota State was picked to finish second in the Missouri Valley Football Conference race.

The Jackrabbits finished second behind defending league and Football Championship Subdivision champion North Dakota State, which garnered all 39 first-place votes from a panel that included head coaches, sports information and media. The Bison tallied 390 points, followed by SDSU with 340 and Northern Iowa with 270.

Youngstown State (258) and Illinois State (248) rounded the top half of the 10-team field.

In addition, the Jackrabbits were well-represented on the preseason all-MVFC team.

On offense, quarterback Taryn Christion and kicker Chase Vinatieri were selected to the first team.

A senior from Sioux Falls, Christion posted his second consecutive season with 4,000 yards of total offense in 2017, passing for 3,515 yards and gaining another 500 yards on the ground as SDSU reached the Football Championship Subdivision semifinals for the first time in program history. Christion accounted for 44 touchdowns by passing for a school-record 35 touchdowns and scoring nine more times on the ground.

Christion was named MVFC Offensive Player of the Year in 2016 and was a second-team all-MVFC honoree last season.

A junior from Sioux Falls and a fellow Roosevelt High School graduate, Vinatieri connected on 13-of-14 field-goal attempts and 58-of-62 point-after tries during the 2017 campaign. He added a rushing touchdown on a fake field goal to finish with 103 points.

Vinatieri was a member of the all-MVFC Second Team a year ago.

Sophomore Cade Johnson led the Jackrabbit contingent on the second team by being honored as both a wide receiver and return specialist. A native of Papillion, Nebraska, Johnson ranked third on the squad last season with 23 receptions, tallying 318 yards and three touchdowns. He also set an Jackrabbit single-season record for kickoff return yardage with 839 yards, averaging 28 yards on 30 attempts, and became the first SDSU player in more than 50 years to return two kickoffs for touchdowns in the same season.

Also honored on the preseason second team were junior fullback Luke Sellers and sophomore long snapper Bradey Sorenson.

BLOCK THAT KICK: Sophomore linebacker Logan Backhaus provided a pivotal play in the Jackrabbits' last outing, blocking a Youngstown State field goal attempt in the first quarter that led directly to SDSU's first touchdown of the game.

It marked the second blocked kick of the season for the Jackrabbits, who have made a habit of coming up with a number of similar big plays in recent years. In 2017, SDSU ranked sixth in the Football Championship Subdivision with six blocked kicks.

LIMITED RETURNS: South Dakota State has excelled in other areas of special teams so far this season, entering the week ranked in the top 15 among FCS programs in both kickoff return and punt return defense. The Jackrabbits have limited the opposition to an average of 16.59 yards per kickoff return (13th nationally) and 2.4 yards per punt return (ninth nationally).

CHRISTION RECORD WATCH: Jackrabbit quarterback Taryn Christion has set career records in a pair of categories each of the past two weeks and is poised to add more top marks to his collection in the coming weeks.

A senior from Sioux Falls, Christion became SDSU's career leader in passing yards Oct. 6 against Indiana State and moved to the top of the Missouri Valley Football Conference charts for total offense last week. He enters the week with 9,675 passing yards (previous SDSU record was 9,458 yards by Austin Sumner from 2011-14) and 10,986 yards of total offense as he surpassed the previous MVFC mark of 10,952 yards by Illinois State quarterback Matt Brown from 2009-12.

Brown also holds the league passing yardage record at 10,591 yards.

Christion also holds the MVFC career mark for passing touchdowns with 88. He has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 17 consecutive games dating back to 2017.

Christion is on pace to establish new Jackrabbit career highs in a couple other passing categories by season's end. His 697 career completions trail the 737 set by Sumner, and his 1,142 pass attempts are 125 behind Sumner's 1,267 attempts.

In addition, Christion's average of 274.7 yards of total offense per game is well ahead of Sumner's mark of 211 yards per game. Christion also holds seven SDSU single-season records and five single-game marks.

Christion, who has thrown 16 touchdown passes and only one interception this season, currently leads the Football Championship Subdivision in passing efficiency at 191.8. His 16 touchdown passes and average of 9.75 yards per pass attempt both rank second.

After passing for one touchdown and running for two more in the 2018 Hobo Day game versus Youngstown State, it marked the second time this season and 17th time in Christion's career he accounted for scores both through the air and on the ground in the same game. Last season, he passed and rushed for touchdowns in the same game seven times.

Christion once again appears on the initial watch list for the 2018 STATS FCS Walter Payton Award, which is presented to the subdivision's top offensive player. He has been a two-time finalist for the award, placing seventh in the balloting in 2016 and sixth last year.

CHRISTION A CAMPBELL SEMIFINALIST: Jackrabbit quarterback Taryn Christion was recently named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, which is awarded annually to the top collegiate football scholar-athlete.

The list of 179 semifinalists will be pared to a list of 12-14 finalists on Oct. 31, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the 60th National Football Foundation's National Scholar-Athlete Class. The finalists will travel to New York City for the 61st NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 4, where their accomplishments will be highlighted in front of one of the most powerful audiences in all of sports. Live during the event, one member of the class will be declared as the winner of the 29th William V. Campbell Trophy® and have his postgraduate scholarship increased to \$25,000.

Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of playing eligibility, have a grade-point of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is made up of a prominent group of media, College Football Hall of Famers and athletics administrators.

SDSU has had three football student-athletes honored as members of the National Scholar-Athlete Class in the past decade: Ryan Berry (2008), Zach Zenner (2014) and Jake Wieneke (2017).

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS: South Dakota State University linebacker Christian Rozeboom and cornerback Jordan Brown were tabbed as members of the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Both players also received preseason first-team all-MVFC recognition.

A junior from Sioux Center, Iowa, Rozeboom was selected to the first team after posting his second consecutive 100-tackle season for the Jackrabbits in 2017. Rozeboom registered a team-high 127 tackles, including 7.5 tackles for loss, notching 10 or more tackles in seven of the team's 14 games. Also on the initial watch list for the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award for the subdivision's top defensive player, Rozeboom added three fumble recoveries and a pair of interceptions to earn a spot on multiple postseason All-America teams a year ago.

Brown, a senior from Scottsdale, Arizona, earned third-team recognition on the preseason All-America squad. In earning first-team all-MVFC honors last season, he tallied team bests of nine pass breakups and three forced fumbles, while ranking second in both tackles (72) and interceptions (3).

100 FCS WINS: South Dakota State recorded its 100th win as a Football Championship Subdivision program with a 62-30 victory at Missouri State on Oct. 21, 2017. Since moving to the FCS ranks at the start of the 2004 season, the Jackrabbits have posted a 108-65 overall record (.624 winning percentage).

SDSU has turned in a winning record in 12 of 14 full seasons and has compiled a 57-26 mark (.687 winning percentage) in Missouri Valley Football Conference games.

JACKRABBIT BLOODLINES: Several South Dakota State football players have strong family ties to South Dakota State Athletics.

Quarterback Taryn Christion's mother, Heather, played volleyball at SDSU and fullback Turner Blasius' father, Justin, was an NCAA Division II national wrestling champion in 1994.

In addition, linebacker Dalton Cox's father, Doug, wrestled for the Jackrabbits in the 1980s, while his younger brother, Colton, is a redshirt freshman on the SDSU baseball team.

Sophomore kicker Chase Vinatieri is the nephew of former Jackrabbit and current Indianapolis Colts standout kicker Adam Vinatieri. Chase Vinatieri made 13-of-14 field goal attempts last season to lead the nation in field goal percentage (.929), and entered the 2018 season with a string of nine consecutive made field-goal attempts. In the Jackrabbits' playoff victory over Northern Iowa last season, Vinatieri made a career-best three field goals, including a career-long 55-yarder in the second quarter.

Newcomer Logan Busch's father, Mike, played quarterback at SDSU from 1984-85 and ranks in the Jackrabbits' all-time top 10 for passing yards and touchdown passes. His older brother, Landon, was a pitcher on the Jackrabbit baseball team in 2015 and 2016.

Three sets of brothers are on the 2018 Jackrabbit roster: Jordan and Jacob Brown, Brandon and Jaden Snyder, and identical twins Jadon and Jaxon Janke.

Brandon Snyder joined the SDSU football program at the start of fall camp as a graduate transfer from Iowa.

JACKS IN THE PROS: With the regular season under way, three former South Dakota State University football standouts are currently featured on National Football League rosters, continuing the Jackrabbits' long tradition of developing players into pro prospects.

Headlining the list is Adam Vinatieri of the Indianapolis Colts, who established a new NFL career record for field goals Sept. 30 against Houston and enters with week with 570 in his 23-year career. Currently the oldest player in the NFL at age 45, Vinatieri holds 13 other NFL records, including 20 100-point seasons.

Considered one of the most clutch kickers in NFL history, Vinatieri's career totals include 570-of-676 on field goal attempts, 84.3 percent, and 2,535 career points. He ranks second in career scoring — nine points behind leader Morten Andersen (2,544 points from 1982-2007) — and third in career extra points (823).

After two Pro Bowl selections (2002, 2004), he left New England following the 2005 season as the team's career scoring leader with 1,058 points. In 2015, he became the first player in NFL to score 1,000 points for two different teams.

Also continuing his NFL career is offensive lineman Bryan Witzmann. A member of the Jackrabbits from 2010-13, Witzmann earned a starting role with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2017. However, he released by the Chiefs at the end of training camp and has since been signed by the Minnesota Vikings. Witzmann previously spent time with Houston, New Orleans and Dallas.

Making his professional debut recently was tight end Dallas Goedert. A two-time All-American, Goedert became the first Jackrabbit selected in the NFL Draft in eight years as he was a second-round pick by the defending Super Bowl champion Philadelphia Eagles. The Britton native caught one pass for four yards in a season-opening win over Atlanta on Sept. 6, then scored his first NFL touchdown Sept. 23 as part of a seven-catch, 73-yard performance against Indianapolis. For the season, he has caught 13 passes for 113 yards with the one score.

Former Jackrabbit running back Zach Zenner began the 2018 season with Detroit, but has since been released after playing in 28 games over three full seasons with the Lions.

During a highly decorated career at SDSU from 2011-14, Zenner became the first player in the history of Division I football to rush for 2,000 yards in three consecutive seasons.

Also in their first training camps this summer were 2017 All-Americans Jake Wieneke (Minnesota Vikings) and Jacob Ohnesorge (Dallas Cowboys). Neither made the final roster for their respective teams and have since signed with teams in the upstart Alliance of American Football — Wieneke with the Salt Lake Stallions and Ohnesorge with the Arizona Hotshots.

DANA J. DYKHOUSE STADIUM: Jackrabbit football moved into a new home in September of 2016 with the completion of Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

The stadium, which was constructed in phases on the site of SDSU's previous home field, Coughlin-Alumni Stadium, seats 19,340 spectators and cost \$65 million to build. The stadium is being funded through private gifts and long-term revenue streams, including concessions and suite, loge box and ticket sales. Bonds are financing nearly two-thirds of the project's construction, with the remaining dollars coming from private support. Lead gifts totaling \$12.5 million from Sioux Falls banker Dana Dykhouse and philanthropist T. Denny Sanford were announced in October 2013.

The stadium officially opened Sept. 8, 2016, featuring a concert by country music superstars Luke Bryan, Little Big Town and Lee Brice as part of the Jacks Bash opening weekend. The first football game was two days later, on Sept. 10, when the Jackrabbits defeated Drake, 56-28.

SDSU has gone on to post a 17-2 record at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium during its first three seasons of operation, including a 3-0 mark in FCS playoff games.

Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium was designed by Kansas City-based Crawford Architects, with the construction firm JE Dunn serving as the project manager at risk and Henry Carlson Company of Sioux Falls serving as general contractor. The stadium won the 2017 Alliant Build America Award from the Associated General Contractors of America South Dakota Building Chapter.

STIG SHOW: The John Stiegelmeier Radio Show airs each Monday throughout the 2018 football season.

The show is scheduled to air at 6 p.m. on the Jackrabbit Sports Network, originating with flagship station WNAX 570 AM in Yankton. In addition, the weekly show also will be streamed online free of charge at GoJacks.com.

Hosted by Tyler Merriam, the John Stiegelmeier Radio Show will also feature interviews with Jackrabbit student-athletes and assistant coaches. Jackrabbit fans are encouraged to attend the show in person at Cubby's Sports Bar and Grill, 307 Main Ave., in downtown Brookings.

A LOOK AHEAD: The Jackrabbits will close out their two-game road swing with a trip to nationally ranked Illinois State on Oct. 27. Kickoff is set for noon, with television coverage again available on ESPN3.com.

Next home action is slated for Nov. 3 versus Missouri State on Military Appreciation Day. Kickoff for that game is 2 p.m. at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

FIRST 2017 MEETING WITH NORTHERN IOWA

NORTHERN IOWA 38, #7/7 SDSU 18

South Dakota State dug itself an early hole with multiple uncharacteristic mistakes on special teams and couldn't recover in dropping a 38-18 Hobo Day decision to Northern Iowa in Missouri Valley Football Conference action Oct. 14 at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

With the loss, the seventh-ranked Jackrabbits fell to 4-2 overall and 1-2 in league play. UNI improved to 3-3 overall and 2-1 in the MVFC.

UNI broke into the scoring column midway through the first quarter on a 41-yard field goal by Sam Drysdale, capitalizing on a muffed punt by the Jackrabbits which gave the Panthers the ball at the SDSU 35.

The Panthers built their lead to 10-0 moments later after an interception. Elijah Campbell stepped in front of a Taryn Christion pass and returned the ball 46 yards to the SDSU 3. Two plays later, Christian Jegen scored from a yard out.

SDSU went three-and-out on its next offensive possession and UNI again took advantage of a short field to push its lead to 17-0 as Marcus Weymiller capped a six-play, 48-yard drive with an 11-yard touchdown run.

The Jackrabbits fumbled on the ensuing kickoff at their own 20, but after an unsportsmanlike conduct against UNI, the SDSU defense stopped the Panthers on three consecutive short-yardage plays to keep the deficit at 17 points.

The SDSU momentum carried over to the offensive side of the ball for the first time on the day as the Jackrabbits drove 73 yards on eight plays for their first score of the day. Christion connected with All-America wide receiver Jake Wieneke three times for a total of 46 yards, the final 11 of which came on a touchdown. However, the Jackrabbits missed the extra point and, despite a UNI fumble on the next possession, Chase Vinatieri's struggles continued as he missed a 24-yard field goal.

Weymiller's second touchdown of the day, a 15-yard around right end, made the score 24-6 in favor of UNI with four minutes to play in the first half. Weymiller, who had not registered a carry all season before Saturday, rushed 42 times for 170 yards.

Passes of 14 yards to Wieneke and 36 yards to Cade Johnson put the Jackrabbits in scoring position late in the first half, but a bobbled snap on a field goal attempt in windy and rainy conditions in the closing seconds prevented SDSU from further cutting into the deficit.

The Jackrabbits trimmed the margin to 24-12 late in the third quarter as All-America tight end Dallas Goedert hauled in a 57-yard reception from Christion on the first play of the drive, then the tandem hooked up again on the next play from 19 yards out for a touchdown. The two-point attempt failed.

Hopes of an SDSU comeback were dashed in the fourth quarter as Panther quarterback Eli Dunne threw a pair of touchdown passes three and a half minutes apart. The first score covered 18 yards to Daurice Fountain, followed by an 11-yarder to Isaiah Weston after the Jackrabbits turned the ball over on downs. Dunne completed 13-of-22 passes for 169 yards.

Mikey Daniel closed the scoring for the Jackrabbits with a 2-yard touchdown run with 6:48 to play.

UNI held a 387-332 advantage in total offense. Christion completed 14-of-35 passes for 280 yards, with Goedert recording 120 yards on four

catches. Wieneke ended the afternoon with four receptions for 60 yards. Brady Mengarelli carried seven times for a team-high 33 yards.

Defensively, the Jackrabbits were led by Christian Rozeboom with a game-high 14 tackles. Fellow Iowa natives Logan Backhaus and Chris Balster each tallied seven stops.

Jared Farley led the Panthers with seven tackles and added a pass breakup.

SECOND 2017 MEETING WITH NORTHERN IOWA

#6/6 SDSU 37, #20/21 NORTHERN IOWA 22

Dec. 2, 2017 • Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium (Att.: 7,518)

On a record-setting day by South Dakota State quarterback Taryn Christion, the Jackrabbits scored on all five of their offensive possessions in the first half and went on to defeat Northern Iowa, 37-22, in second-round action of the Football Championship Playoffs Saturday afternoon at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

With their sixth consecutive victory, the fifth-seeded Jackrabbits improved to 10-2 overall, reaching the 10-win mark for the first time in program history.

SDSU kicker Chase Vinatieri opened the scoring with a 29-yard field goal on the opening drive of the game, capping an 11-play, 63-yard drive. Christion completed passes of 13 and 11 yards to All-America tight end Dallas Goedert on the first two plays before turning to the ground game to set up the field goal.

The Jackrabbits upped the lead to 10-0 with a seven-play, 70-yard scoring march. Christion completed all five passes on the drive, including a 40-yard strike to Marquise Lewis that set up Cade Johnson's 2-yard touchdown reception on fourth-and-goal. The touchdown pass was the 66th of Christion's career, breaking a tie with Austin Sumner (65 touchdown passes from 2011-14).

UNI countered with its first touchdown of the game, putting together an 11-play, 72-yard scoring drive that bridged the end of the first quarter and start of the second. The Panthers' Daurice Fountain leaped up and over a Jackrabbit defender to haul in a 6-yard touchdown pass from Eli Dunne in the back left corner of the end zone.

Earlier in the game, Goedert went over the 1,000-yard mark for receiving for the second year in a row.

Johnson put the Jackrabbits back in scoring position with a 70-yard kickoff return to the UNI 29. The Panthers appeared to push SDSU out of scoring range with a sack on the ensuing drive, but Vinatieri came on to boot a career-long 55-yard field goal.

SDSU pushed the advantage to 26-7 with a pair of touchdowns in the final five minutes of the second quarter. The Jackrabbits again cashed in on a fourth-down play as Christion scored from 21 yards out on a quarterback keeper on fourth-and-1. The two-point attempt failed.

The Jackrabbits converted a third and final time on fourth down late in the first half. Mikey Daniel gained four yards on fourth-and-1 to extend the drive before Christion connected with Goedert over the middle for a 28-yard touchdown.

After a scoreless third quarter, the Jackrabbits sealed the victory with another record-setting touchdown pass from Christion. His 30-yard scoring pass to Jacob Brown at the 12:03 mark of the fourth quarter was his third of the game and 31st of the season, breaking the single-season mark he previously set a year ago and shared with Ryan Berry (30 touchdown passes in 2008).

This time, the Jackrabbits converted the two-point attempt on a pass from Christion to Jake Wieneke.

Vinatieri hit his career-best third field goal, a 44-yarder late in the fourth quarter that was sandwiched around 1-yard touchdown runs for Northern Iowa by the usual starting middle linebacker Jared Farley and Trevor Allen.

SDSU finished with a 380-369 advantage in total offense. Christion completed 19-of-28 passes for 237 yards and added 38 yards on seven carries. Brady Mengarelli led the rushing attack with 45 yards on 18 carries, with Isaac Wallace adding 40 yards on 10 attempts.

Goedert led the receiving corps with six catches for 83 yards.

For UNI, Dunne was 26-of-36 passing for 287 yards, with Briley Moore

recording six receptions for 90 yards. Marcus Weymiller gained 59 yards on 13 rushing attempts.

Redshirt freshman Logan Backhaus led the Jackrabbits with eight tackles, adding two pass breakups and a forced fumble. Dalton Cox, Jordan Brown and Nick Farina each registered seven stops.

The Panthers were led by Duncan Ferch with 12 tackles, followed by 10 from Farley.

GAME 1 RECAP

#3/3 SDSU 45, MONTANA STATE 14

Sept. 8, 2018 • Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium (Att.: 14,614)

Cade Johnson tied a South Dakota State single-game record with four touchdown receptions as the Jackrabbits officially kicked off the 2018 season by defeating Montana State, 45-14, in the Fifth Annual Dairy Drive at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

The third-ranked Jackrabbits, who had their scheduled season opener the previous at Iowa State canceled due to inclement weather, dominated both sides of the ball in the first half in racing out to a 24-0 lead through the first 30 minutes.

A sophomore from Papillion, Nebraska, Johnson scored each of the first three Jackrabbit touchdowns, starting with a 2-yard pass from Taryn Christion on third and goal late in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Johnson found paydirt after catching a shovel pass and rolling around left end for a 24-yard score, then tallied his third touchdown three minutes later with a one-handed catch in the back corner of the end zone from 19 yards out.

Chase Vinatieri added a 42-yard field goal later in the quarter to give SDSU its 24-0 halftime advantage.

Meanwhile, the Jackrabbit defense pitched a first-half shutout by limiting Montana State to one first down. The Bobcats were forced to punt seven times in the first two quarters and turned the ball over on their other possession – an interception by preseason All-America cornerback Jordan Brown.

The Jackrabbits made it 31-0 on the opening drive of the second half as Christion capped an 11-play, 75-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run.

The two squads traded touchdowns the rest of the way. Maleek Barkley put Montana State on the board with a 2-yard touchdown run in the third quarter and Lance McCutcheon scored on a 3-yard pass from Tucker Rovig on the first play of the fourth and final stanza.

Mikey Daniel added a third-quarter touchdown for SDSU with a 2-yard plunge that was set up by a 51-yard pass play from Christion to Adam Anderson. On the longest pass play of the night, Christion topped the 10,000-yard mark for total offense in his career, becoming the first Jackrabbit and only second player in Missouri Valley Football Conference to reach the milestone.

Johnson made history at the 10:38 mark of the fourth quarter as he caught his fourth touchdown of the game, this one from 7 yards following a Joshua Manchigiah interception. The mark of four touchdown receptions was first set by Don Bartlett in a 1949 game against North Dakota State. That record went unchallenged for 67 years and now has been matched each of the last three seasons by Dallas Goedert (2016 versus Western Illinois), Jake Wieneke (2017 versus Duquesne) and Johnson.

Johnson ended the game with career highs of nine catches for 138 yards, with Anderson adding a career-best 86 yards on four receptions.

Christion finished 21-of-29 passing for 319 yards as SDSU held a 512-193 advantage in total offense, including a 193-29 edge in the rushing department. The Jackrabbits were paced by freshman C.J. Wilson's 62 yards on 12 carries.

Dalton Cox led the SDSU defense with seven tackles.

Montana State, 1-1 overall, went with backup Tucker Rovig at quarterback, and he finished the game 13-of-25 passing for 164 yards. Kevin Kassis caught three passes for 74 yards. None of the six Bobcats with a rushing attempt managed to reach double figures for yards on the ground.



Cade Johnson became the third Jackrabbit in as many seasons to catch four touchdown passes in a game, tying a school record. Johnson also finished with career highs of nine receptions and 138 receiving yards in a 45-14 SDSU victory.

GAME 2 RECAP

#3/3 SDSU 90, ARKANSAS-PINE BLUFF 6

Sept. 15, 2018 • Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium (Att.: 14,526)

South Dakota State rewrote its record book numerous times, including setting new standards for points and total yards, in a 90-6 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff in the 52nd Annual Beef Bowl at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

The third-ranked Jackrabbits improved to 2-0 overall, while UAPB dropped to 1-2 on the season.

SDSU needed only five offensive plays to score its first three touchdowns — all on passes from senior quarterback Taryn Christion. After a 29-yard punt return by Marquise Lewis put SDSU deep in Golden Lion territory, the Jackrabbits needed only two plays to cash in as Christion found freshman tight end Blake Kunz over the middle for an 8-yard score.

A turnover on the next UAPB possession led to a 31-yard scoring pass from Christion to Adam Anderson, who leaped up and over two defenders to corral his first career touchdown. Moments later, Christion hooked up with reigning Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Week Cade Johnson deep down field for a 71-yard touchdown that gave SDSU a 21-3 lead.

On the play, Christion became the MVFC's career leader in touchdown passes, surpassing the 78 thrown by Illinois State's Matt Brown from 2009-12.

Jamie Gillan, who connected on a 47-yard field goal midway through the first quarter, added a 20-yarder later in the stanza to pull to within 21-6. However, the Jackrabbits would tally the final 69 points of the game and continued to churn out big plays as eight of the 13 touchdowns they scored on the night covered at least 30 yards.

Christion, who played only in the first half, threw two more touchdowns before exiting, finding Jacob Brown in the end zone from nine yards out late in the final minute of the first quarter and adding a 40-yard scoring strike to Johnson early in the second quarter. It marked the fifth five-touchdown game of Christion's career.

Combined, three Jackrabbit quarterbacks went 19-for-21 passing with single-game school records of 557 yards and eight touchdowns. Christion was 13-of-14 for 332 yards, while backup Kanin Nelson finished 4-of-5 passing for 136 yards with touchdowns on screen passes of 66 yards to Pierre Strong Jr. and 37 yards to C.J. Wilson.

Third-string signal-caller Justin Roberts completed both of his passes for 89 yards, including a 76-yarder to Michael Wandmaker, who caught a pass on a quick out pattern, broke a tackle along the right sideline and rambled the rest of the way to paydirt.

The Jackrabbit running game also got in the act, headlined by Isaac Wallace's 192 yards on only five carries. Wallace scored on runs of 58 and 79 yards, while Mikey Daniel plunged in twice on short runs and Blair Mulholland contributed a 14-yard touchdown run for his first collegiate touchdown.

SDSU tallied 369 rushing yards and a program-best 926 yards of total offense. The Jackrabbits' 90 points also established a new school record, eclipsing the 85 points scored against Columbus College way back in 1922.

Johnson posted his second consecutive 100-yard receiving game with five catches for 162 yards. Anderson also eclipsed the century mark with four catches for 128 yards.

UAPB, which played without regular starting quarterback Shannon Patrick, went with Roger Totten II under center. He completed 9-of-21

passes for 131 yards and was intercepted twice — both in the end zone by Zy Mosley.

Eric Kleinschmit paced the Jackrabbit defense with seven tackles.

GAME 3 RECAP

#1/1 NORTH DAKOTA STATE 21, #3/3 SDSU 17

Sept. 29, 2018 • Fargodome (Att.: 18,846)

FARGO, N.D. – Third-ranked South Dakota State took a lead into the fourth quarter against top-ranked North Dakota State inside the Fargodome, but the Bison came away with the lone score of the final stanza on a 5-yard touchdown run by quarterback Easton Stick to regain the Dakota Marker with a 21-17 victory.

In the Missouri Valley Football Conference opener for both teams, NDSU improved to 4-0 overall, while the Jackrabbits fell to 2-1.

Stick engineered an eight-play, 80-yard drive for the winning score and added key runs late in the game to seal the victory. He began the game-winning drive with a 28-yard pass to Darrius Shepherd and 24-yard strike to Dallas Freeman before the Bison tallied the final 18 yards on the ground.

On the ensuing possession, SDSU missed a 48-yard field goal attempt that would have brought the Jackrabbits within a point. The Jackrabbits got the ball back one final time deep in their own territory with under six minutes to play, but did not pick a first down and gave the ball back to NDSU via a punt with 3 minutes and 32 seconds remaining.

The Bison ran out the clock as Stick, who gained a team-high 63 yards on 15 carries, picked up a pair of first downs on third-down runs.

The Jackrabbits' offense clicked early as eight of their first 16 plays from scrimmage resulted in first downs. On its second possession of the game, SDSU strung together a 10-play, 89-yard drive that ended with a 3-yard touchdown pass from Taryn Christion to Cade Johnson. It was Johnson's seventh touchdown reception of the season.

SDSU was poised to go up by two scores on its next drive. Ten-yard runs by Isaac Wallace and Christion were followed by a 24-yard pass from Christion to Adam Anderson that moved the ball to the Bison 13. However, Christion's third-down pass to end zone was intercepted by Jalen Allison.

The Bison seized the momentum with the interception, putting together a pair of touchdown drives in the second quarter to take a 14-7 half-time lead. Stick scrambled for 22 yards and a first down on third-and-21, then connected with tight end Ben Ellefson on the next play from 17 yards for the game-tying score.

Later in the quarter, and after missing a 48-yard field goal moments earlier, the Bison took their first lead with a quick two-play, 56-yard drive. Ty Brooks ran for 15 yards before Stick found Shepherd over the middle for a 41-yard touchdown. Shepherd tallied a game-high 116 yards on five receptions.

The Jackrabbits went back in front, 17-14, by scoring all 10 points of the third quarter. Chase Vinatieri drilled a 39-yard field goal and Isaac Wallace followed on the next SDSU possession with a 61-yard touchdown run around right end. Wallace topped the 100-yard for the second game in a row with 110 yards on only nine carries.

Christion ended the day 19-of-29 passing for 202 yards, while Anderson paced the SDSU receiving corps with 102 yards, topping the century mark for the second consecutive game, on a career-high eight catches.

NDSU held a 389-357 advantage in total offense. Stick completed 9-of-20 passes for 182 yards.

Christian Rozeboom led the Jackrabbit defensive effort with a game-high 12 tackles, followed by redshirt freshman defensive tackle Krockett Krolikowski with seven stops, including 1.5 sacks. Ryan Earith also tallied a sack and a half for SDSU.



Krockett Krolikowski recorded seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks, in the Jackrabbits' Sept. 29 game at top-ranked North Dakota State. As a team, SDSU notched three sacks and five tackles for loss in the contest.

Jabril Cox and Robbie Grimsley each registered eight tackles to lead the Bison.

GAME 4 RECAP

#3/4 SDSU 54, INDIANA STATE 51 [OT]

Oct. 6, 2018 • Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium (Att.: 10,318)

Taryn Christion became South Dakota State's all-time passing yardage leader and tied a career high with five touchdown passes, but it was Isaac Wallace's 2-yard touchdown run in overtime that finally pushed the Jackrabbits over the finish line in a 54-51 victory over Indiana State Oct. 6 at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

With the win, the Jackrabbits improved to 3-1 overall and 1-1 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. Indiana State dropped to 2-3 overall and 0-2 in league play.

The Jackrabbits took a 42-24 lead into the fourth quarter after scoring three third-quarter touchdowns. Wallace scored on a 4-yard swing pass from Christion on SDSU's first drive of the half, then turned to some trickery to go ahead 35-17 as kicker Chase Vinatieri took a pitch from holder Brady Hale on a would-be field goal attempt and turned the corner around left end for a 15-yard touchdown run.

The Sycamores answered with a 62-yard touchdown run by Ja'Quan Keys, but SDSU countered as Christion hit Adam Anderson on the slant for a 3-yard touchdown that capped a five-play, 91-yard drive. Pierre Strong Jr. set up Anderson's second touchdown of the game with a 69-yard run to the Indiana State 3.

Indiana State would force overtime by scoring on its final five drives of regulation, starting with the Keys touchdown run midway in the third quarter. Ryan Boyle ran for a 4-yard touchdown on the second play of the fourth quarter, then hooked up with Rontrez Morgan for a 34-yard touchdown to pull the Sycamores to within 45-38. Morgan's second touchdown of the night came after Indiana State reached into its own bag of tricks by converting a fake punt.

After Vinatieri booted the second of his two field goals to give the Jackrabbits a 48-38 lead with 3 minutes and 16 seconds remaining, Keys rambed 57 yards to cut the margin to a field goal.

SDSU recovered the ensuing onside kick, but couldn't pick up a first down and was forced to punt. Hale's kick was downed at the 1-yard line, but the Sycamores quickly climbed out of the deep hole as Boyle completed passes of 30 yards to Dante Jones II and 47 yards to Morgan. Indiana State had first-and-goal from the 7 later in the drive, but settled for a game-tying 25-yard field goal by Jerry Nunez as time expired in regulation.

The Jackrabbits won the coin flip and elected to go on defense first. Indiana State had two shots from the 1-yard line, but linebacker Dalton Cox, with help from defensive end Ryan Earith on the second play, again forced the Sycamores to settle for a Nunez field goal.

Cox led the Jackrabbits with 10 tackles.

SDSU kept the ball in the hands of its playmakers during its overtime drive. Christion completed another screen pass to Wallace on third-and-8 to move the chains and again came up big on third down as the senior quarterback hit Cade Johnson for another nine yards. After a pass interference penalty moved the ball to the 2-yard-line, Wallace found paydirt over the right side of the line to end the game.

Wallace gained 81 yards on a career-high 21 carries, while Strong posted a team-high 95 yards on only six carries. Mikey Daniel added 70 yards on 10 carries.

The two squads each finished with 293 rushing yards as Keys tallied a game-high 159 yards on 19 carries.

Christion, who threw touchdown passes of 12 yards to Anderson on the opening drive of the game as well as 9- and 5-yarders to Jacob Brown and Mikey Daniel, respectively, ended the night 20-of-31 passing for 229 yards.



Chase Vinatieri scored on a fake field goal from 15 yards out and added two field goals to help lead the Jackrabbits to a 54-51 overtime win over Indiana State.

His completions were spread among eight different receivers, with Anderson and Kallan Hart each catching four balls for 57 yards.

For Indiana State, Boyle ran for two scores and threw for two more in a 19-for-29 effort with 276 yards. Morgan finished with game highs of nine catches and 155 receiving yards.

Jonas Griffith led all players with 18 tackles for Indiana State.

GAME 5 RECAP

#2/5 SDSU 36, YOUNGSTOWN STATE 7

Oct. 13, 2018 • Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium (Att.: 14,357)

South Dakota State entered its Hobo Day matchup against Youngstown State as one of the top passing teams in the Football Championship Subdivision, but it was the rushing attack that paced the Jackrabbits to a 36-7 Hobo Day victory over Youngstown State Oct. 13 at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

SDSU, ranked second in the STATS FCS media poll and fifth by the FCS coaches, improved to 4-1 overall and 2-1 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. The Penguins dropped to 2-4 overall and 1-2 in league play.

Youngstown State grabbed the momentum early, forcing the Jackrabbits to go three-and-out on their first possession and later putting together a solid first offensive drive of its own. However, Logan Backhaus blocked the Penguins' 41-yard field goal attempt, which was picked up near midfield by Dalton Cox and returned to the YSU 25.

SDSU cashed in two plays and 40 seconds later as Taryn Christian hooked up with Cade Johnson over the middle for a 23-yard touchdown. It was Johnson's eighth touchdown reception of the season. The extra point was missed.

The Penguins put together what would be their lone scoring drive of the afternoon, marching 78 yards on eight plays to take a momentary 7-6 lead. Christian Turner tallied the final 27 yards as he caught a screen pass from Montgomery VanGorder and rolled down the left sideline for a touchdown.

SDSU took the lead for good on the ensuing possession, putting together a nine-play, 61-yard drive that ended with a 31-yard field goal by Chase Vinatieri.

The Jackrabbits came into the contest minus two starters on their offensive line and lost leading rusher Isaac Wallace to injury late in the first quarter. However, freshman C.J. Wilson picked up the slack, setting up a 1-yard Mikey Daniel touchdown run late in the second quarter with a 41-yard run, then scoring on a 48-yard run on SDSU's first possession of the second half to give the Jackrabbits a 23-7 lead.

Meanwhile, the SDSU defense settled in, forcing Youngstown State to punt five times in the second half. The other two Penguin drives ended with interceptions by Zy Mosley and Christian Rozeboom. Mosley's interception, his team-leading third of the season, came in the end zone midway through the third quarter.

Christian, whose seven completions and 78 passing yards were career lows in a starting role, provided the final two Jackrabbit scores with his legs. The senior from Sioux Falls sliced through the Penguin defense for a 49-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter. On the play, Christian became the MVFC career leader in total offense.

Christian, who carried five times for 89 yards, capped the scoring four-and-a-half minutes later by scampering to the end zone from 11 yards out.

SDSU finished with a 253-136 advantage in rushing yardage as Wilson finished with a game-high 119 yards on 16 carries. The Jackrabbit defense limited YSU's leading rusher, Tevin McCaster, to 60 yards on 22 carries.

Ryan Earith and Seven Wilson each registered seven tackles to lead the Jackrabbit defense.

Wallace caught two passes for 31 yards, with Adam Anderson notching a pair of catches for 14 yards for the Jackrabbits.
