**BROOKINGS, S.D.** — The South Dakota State University football team will be in search of reversing a recent trend on Hobo Day as it hosts Youngstown State in its annual homecoming game Saturday afternoon at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

Kickoff is slated for 2 p.m.

The Jackrabbits enter Saturday's matchup with a 3-1 overall record, including a 1-1 mark in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. SDSU has attained its highest-ever ranking in a Football Championship Subdivision poll, checking in at No. 2 in the latest STATS FCS media poll. In addition, SDSU is fifth in the poll conducted by the American Football Coaches Association.

Youngstown State, meanwhile, also is 1-1 in league play after pulling out a 17-14 home victory over Southern Illinois last week. Overall, the Penguins have posted a 2-3 overall record.

SDSU has dropped four of its last five Hobo Day games, including a 38-18 setback to Northern Iowa last season. One of the other losses was a 30-27 decision to Youngstown State in 2014 at Coughlin-Alumni Stadium.

The last Jackrabbit victory on Hobo Day was a 24-10 win over Youngstown State on Oct. 22, 2016, in what was the first homecoming game to be played at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium. That contest drew a Hobo Day-record crowd of 17,730.

**THE SERIES:** Today's game marks the 20th meeting on the gridiron between SDSU and Youngstown State, a series that dates back to the 1942 season. The Jackrabbits hold a 12-7 series advantage on the strength of winning eight of the 10 matchups between the two programs as members of the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

In last season's matchup, Sept. 30, 2017, at Stambaugh Stadium in Youngstown, Ohio, the Penguins dominated the line of scrimmage in recording a 19-7 victory in the MVFC opener for both teams. The game was a clash between two teams ranked in the top five at the time — SDSU was ranked fourth and Youngstown State fifth.

YSU's Tevin McCaster paced a ball-control offense with 183 rushing yards and a touchdown on 35 carries. The Penguins rushed for a total of 310 yards and possessed the football for more than 45 minutes, taking control after SDSU tied the game at 7-all early in the second quarter on a 10-yard touchdown pass from Taryn Christion to Jake Wieneke.

**HOBO DAY HISTORY:** Since a 6-3 victory over Yankton College in the first-ever Hobo Day game in 1912, the Jackrabbits have gone on to compile a 60-39-5 record in their homecoming games. While the records show 104 Hobo Day games, there have been 106 Hobo days. There was no game in 1918 during World War I and in 1943, the game was between two Army special training teams from campus.

The Jackrabbits' longest run of success on Hobo Day came in those early years, posting a 10-1-1 record in the first 12 Hobo Day contests. SDSU also put together another success string between 2003 and 2012, when the Jackrabbits won nine of 10 Hobo Day games. The only loss in the more recent span was a 46-44, triple-overtime loss to McNeese State in 2008.

**ELITE COMPANY:** South Dakota State is one of only four Football Championship Subdivision programs to reach the playoffs each of the last six seasons.

The three other programs to play in the postseason each year since 2012 are New Hampshire, North Dakota State and Sam Houston State.

**RABBITS RANKED:** South Dakota State entered the 2018 season with its highest-ever rankings in a Football Championship Subdivision poll, checking in at No. 3 in both the STATS FCS media poll and AFCA FCS Coaches' Poll. It marked the fifth time in six years the Jackrabbits have entered a season with a top-10 national ranking in the Football Championship Subdivision, surpassing their No. 4 ranking in the 2017 STATS FCS Preseason Poll.

Defending national champion North Dakota State continues to hold the top spot in both national polls, while the Jackrabbits this week attained their highest-ever ranking in a Football Championship Subdivision poll by climbing to second in the STATS FCS media rankings. SDSU stands fifth in the poll conducted by the American Football Coaches Association.

SDSU has now appeared in the top 25 of 85 consecutive media polls dating back to October 2012.

**CAPTAINS:** Leading the Jackrabbit football team on the field and in the locker room are four captains:

- Jordan Brown, Sr., cornerback, Scottsdale, Arizona;
- Taryn Christian, Sr., quarterback, Sioux Falls;
- Dalton Cox, Sr., linebacker, Aberdeen, and
- Christian Rozeboom, Jr., linebacker, Sioux Center, Iowa.

Christian and Rozeboom are each in their second seasons as captains.

**TOP OF THE CHARTS:** The Jackrabbits enter the week leading the Football Championship Subdivision in team passing efficiency with a rating of 223.81. SDSU quarterbacks have combined to throw for 18 touchdowns and only one interception, while averaging 11.9 yards per pass attempt.

In addition, SDSU ranks second in the following offensive categories:

- Scoring offense, 51.5 points per game;
- Completion percentage, .718, and
- Total offense, 579.3 yards per game.

**STIG FOR 150:** South Dakota State head coach John Stiegelmeier reached another coaching milestone when he recorded career win No. 150 in the Jackrabbits' 90-6 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Sept. 15.

Already the career wins leader at SDSU, Stiegelmeier has guided the Jackrabbits to a 151-98 career mark (.606 winning percentage) in 22 seasons. The Jackrabbits have turned in a winning record in 17 of his 21 full seasons and made seven Football Championship Subdivision playoff appearances.

Saturday's game will mark Stiegelmeier's 250th game as Jackrabbit head coach.

**REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK:** With its 90-point outburst Sept. 15 against Arkansas-Pine Bluff, South Dakota State broke a 96-year-old scoring record. The previous mark of 85 points was set against Columbus College in 1922.

The Jackrabbits also set new team standards for total offense (926 yards), passing yards (557) and passing touchdowns (8). Individually, Chase Vinatieri set a school record by kicking 11 extra points.

**FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING:** Six different Jackrabbits scored their first collegiate touchdowns in the Sept. 15 rout of Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

Freshman tight end Blake Kunz opened the scoring with an 8-yard touchdown reception on SDSU's first drive of the game, while Adam Anderson followed with a 31-yard touchdown reception later in the first quarter for his first collegiate score.

In the second half, running backs Pierre Strong Jr. (66 yards) and C.J. Wilson (37 yards) found paydirt on screen passes, with Blair Mulholland (14-yard run) and Michael Wandmaker (76-yard reception) closing out the scoring.

**BIG-PLAY ISAAC:** Isaac Wallace has continually broken off big runs this season, scoring three touchdowns on runs of 50-plus yards.

For the season, Wallace ranks second among Football Championship Subdivision players with an average of 9.39 yards per carry, gaining 413 yards on only 44 carries. His first three touchdowns this season covered 58, 79 and 61 yards, while his fourth rushing touchdown of the season was a 2-yard run in overtime that lifted the Jackrabbits to a 54-51 victory over Indiana State on Oct. 6.

Wallace ranks fifth in the Missouri Valley Football Conference and 21st nationally with an average of 103.3 rushing yards per game.

**TOP RECEIVING TANDEM:** The duo of Cade Johnson and Adam Anderson have emerged as the top receiving tandem in the Missouri Valley Football Conference in the first half of the 2018 season.

Each has recorded consecutive 100-yard games this season, with Johnson leading the league with an average of 102.8 receiving yards per game and seven touchdowns.

Anderson, a junior who ranks second in the league with an average of 93.2 yards per game, hauled in a career-high eight catches in the Sept. 29 game at North Dakota State and recorded his first career multi-touchdown performance with two scoring catches Oct. 6 versus Indiana State.

**JOHNSON TIES RECORD:** South Dakota State wide receiver Cade Johnson became the latest Jackrabbit to tie the SDSU single-game record for touchdown receptions when he scored four times Sept. 8 against Montana State.

Don Bartlett originally set the record with four touchdown receptions against North Dakota State in 1949. That mark went unmatched for 67 years until Dallas Goedert caught four TDs against Western Illinois in 2016 and Jake Wieneke scored on four pass plays in the 2017 season opener against Duquesne.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** South Dakota State University kicker Chase Vinatieri was honored Oct. 7 as the Missouri Valley Football Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the Jackrabbits' victory over Indiana State a day earlier.

A junior from Sioux Falls, Vinatieri kicked two field goals and scored his second career touchdown as part of the Jackrabbits' 54-51 overtime win at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium. Vinatieri scored on a 15-yard run on a fake field goal attempt in the third quarter, then kicked field goals of 30 and 27 yards later in the second half. His two field goals upped his career total to 28, passing his uncle, Adam (27 field goals from 1991-94), for fifth place in program history.

Chase Vinatieri also scored on a fake field goal (31 yards) last season at Montana State. It is the third time in his career that Vinatieri has earned the weekly award.

**BALANCED ATTACK:** South Dakota State totaled 500-plus yards of total offense for the third time this season in its Oct. 6 overtime victory over Indiana State, but did so without a 100-yard rusher or receiver. Three running backs — Pierre Strong Jr., Isaac Wallace and Mikey Daniel — all ran for at least 70 yards, with Strong leading the way with 95 yards on only six carries.

The Jackrabbits' 20 receptions were spread among eight different players, with Kal Hart and Adam Anderson leading the receiving corps by each tallying four catches for 57 yards.

**TAKEAWAY STREAK:** A fumble recovery by Dalton Cox in the third quarter of the Jackrabbits' 54-51 overtime victory against Indiana State on Oct. 6 extended SDSU's streak of forcing at least one turnover to 19 consecutive games.

In those 19 games, the Jackrabbits have come out on the plus side of turnover margin eight times and have been even with their opponent on six other occasions. The most turnovers the Jackrabbits have forced during its current streak is five, which came in their 33-21 victory over North Dakota State last season.

For the season, the Jackrabbits are plus-6 in turnover margin, forcing eight turnovers (five interceptions, three fumbles) and committing only two turnovers in 264 offensive plays. SDSU is tied for fourth in the FCS ranks for fewest number of turnovers.

**VALLEY PREVIEW:** For the second year in a row, South Dakota State was picked to finish second in the Missouri Valley Football Conference race.

The Jackrabbits finished second behind defending league and Football Championship Subdivision champion North Dakota State, which garnered all 39 first-place votes from a panel that included head coaches, sports information and media. The Bison tallied 390 points, followed by SDSU with 340 and Northern Iowa with 270.

Youngstown State (258) and Illinois State (248) rounded the top half of the 10-team field.

In addition, the Jackrabbits were well-represented on the preseason all-MVFC team.

On offense, quarterback Taryn Christion and kicker Chase Vinatieri were selected to the first team.

A senior from Sioux Falls, Christion posted his second consecutive season with 4,000 yards of total offense in 2017, passing for 3,515 yards and gaining another 500 yards on the ground as SDSU reached the Football Championship Subdivision semifinals for the first time in program history. Christion accounted for 44 touchdowns by passing for a school-record 35 touchdowns and scoring nine more times on the ground.

Christion was named MVFC Offensive Player of the Year in 2016 and was a second-team all-MVFC honoree last season.

A junior from Sioux Falls and a fellow Roosevelt High School graduate, Vinatieri connected on 13-of-14 field-goal attempts and 58-of-62 point-after tries during the 2017 campaign. He added a rushing touchdown on a fake field goal to finish with 103 points.

Vinatieri was a member of the all-MVFC Second Team a year ago.

Sophomore Cade Johnson led the Jackrabbit contingent on the second team by being honored as both a wide receiver and return specialist. A native of Papillion, Nebraska, Johnson ranked third on the squad last season with 23 receptions, tallying 318 yards and three touchdowns. He also set an Jackrabbit single-season record for kickoff return yardage with 839 yards, averaging 28 yards on 30 attempts, and became the first SDSU player in more than 50 years to return two kickoffs for touchdowns in the same season.

Also honored on the preseason second team were junior fullback Luke Sellers and sophomore long snapper Bradey Sorenson.

**BLOCK THAT KICK:** Defensive tackle Xavier Ward picked up where the Jackrabbits left off in the special teams department, blocking a Montana State extra-point attempt in the 2018 season opener.

In 2017, SDSU ranked sixth in the Football Championship Subdivision with six blocked kicks.

**CHRISTION EYES ANOTHER RECORD:** After setting the SDSU career passing yardage record last week, Jackrabbit quarterback Taryn Christion is poised to add another record to his collection in Saturday's Hobo Day contest.

A senior from Sioux Falls, Christion enters has tallied 10,819 yards of total offense in 39 career games, putting him within 133 yards of the Missouri Valley Football Conference record of 10,952 yards by Illinois State quarterback Matt Brown from 2009-12.

Christion already holds the MVFC career mark for passing touchdowns with 87, following a five-touchdown performance Oct. 6 against Indiana State. He has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 16 consecutive games dating back to the 2017 season.

Also in the game against Indiana State, Christion took over the SDSU career lead for passing yardage, ending the night with 9,597 yards as he moved past Austin Sumner (9,458 yards from 2011-14). Christion also slid into the second spot on the MVFC career passing yardage charts, again trailing Brown's 10,591 yards.

Christion is on pace to establish new Jackrabbit career highs in a couple other passing categories by season's end. His 690 career completions trail the 737 set by Sumner, and his 1,126 pass attempts are 141 behind Sumner's 1,267 attempts.

In addition, Christion's average of 277.4 yards of total offense per game is well ahead of Sumner's mark of 211 yards per game. Christion also holds seven SDSU single-season records and five single-game marks.

Christion, who has thrown 15 touchdown passes and only one interception this season, currently leads the Football Championship Subdivision in passing efficiency at 205.2. His 15 touchdown passes and .709 completion percentage both rank second.

After passing for four touchdowns and running for another in the 2018 season opener versus Montana State, it marked the 16th time in Christion's career he accounted for scores both through the air and on the ground in the same game. Last season, he passed and rushed for touchdowns in the same game seven times.

Christion once again appears on the initial watch list for the 2018 STATS FCS Walter Payton Award, which is presented to the subdivision's top offensive player. He has been a two-time finalist for the award, placing seventh in the balloting in 2016 and sixth last year.

**CHRISTION A CAMPBELL SEMIFINALIST:** Jackrabbit quarterback Taryn Christion was recently named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, which is awarded annually to the top collegiate football scholar-athlete.

The list of 179 semifinalists will be pared to a list of 12-14 finalists on Oct. 31, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the 60th National Football Foundation's National Scholar-Athlete Class. The finalists will travel to New York City for the 61st NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 4, where their accomplishments will be highlighted in front of one of the most powerful audiences in all of sports. Live during the event, one member of the class will be declared as the winner of the 29th William V. Campbell Trophy® and have his postgraduate scholarship increased to \$25,000.

Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of playing eligibility, have a grade-point of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is made up of a prominent group of media, College Football Hall of Famers and athletics administrators.

SDSU has had three football student-athletes honored as members of the National Scholar-Athlete Class in the past decade: Ryan Berry (2008), Zach Zenner (2014) and Jake Wieneke (2017).

**PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS:** South Dakota State University linebacker Christian Rozeboom and cornerback Jordan Brown were tabbed as members of the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Both players also received preseason first-team all-MVFC recognition.

A junior from Sioux Center, Iowa, Rozeboom was selected to the first team after posting his second consecutive 100-tackle season for the Jackrabbits in 2017. Rozeboom registered a team-high 127 tackles, including 7.5 tackles for loss, notching 10 or more tackles in seven of the team's 14 games. Also on the initial watch list for the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award for the subdivision's top defensive player, Rozeboom added three fumble recoveries and a pair of interceptions to earn a spot on multiple postseason All-America teams a year ago.

Brown, a senior from Scottsdale, Arizona, earned third-team recognition on the preseason All-America squad. In earning first-team all-MVFC honors last season, he tallied team bests of nine pass breakups and three forced fumbles, while ranking second in both tackles (72) and interceptions (3).

**100 FCS WINS:** South Dakota State recorded its 100th win as a Football Championship Subdivision program with a 62-30 victory at Missouri State on Oct. 21, 2017. Since moving to the FCS ranks at the start of the 2004 season, the Jackrabbits have posted a 108-65 overall record (.624 winning percentage).

SDSU has turned in a winning record in 12 of 14 full seasons and has compiled a 56-26 mark (.683 winning percentage) in Missouri Valley Football Conference games.

**JACKRABBIT BLOODLINES:** Several South Dakota State football players have strong family ties to South Dakota State Athletics.

Quarterback Taryn Christian's mother, Heather, played volleyball at SDSU and fullback Turner Blasius' father, Justin, was an NCAA Division II national wrestling champion in 1994.

In addition, linebacker Dalton Cox's father, Doug, wrestled for the Jackrabbits in the 1980s, while his younger brother, Colton, is a redshirt freshman on the SDSU baseball team.

Sophomore kicker Chase Vinatieri is the nephew of former Jackrabbit and current Indianapolis Colts standout kicker Adam Vinatieri. Chase Vinatieri made 13-of-14 field goal attempts last season to lead the nation in field goal percentage (.929), and entered the 2018 season with a string of nine consecutive made field-goal attempts. In the Jackrabbits' playoff victory over Northern Iowa last season, Vinatieri made a career-best three field goals, including a career-long 55-yarder in the second quarter.

Newcomer Logan Busch's father, Mike, played quarterback at SDSU from 1984-85 and ranks in the Jackrabbits' all-time top 10 for passing yards and touchdown passes. His older brother, Landon, was a pitcher on the Jackrabbit baseball team in 2015 and 2016.

Three sets of brothers are on the 2018 Jackrabbit roster: Jordan and Jacob Brown, Brandon and Jaden Snyder, and identical twins Jadon and Jaxon Janke.

Brandon Snyder joined the SDSU football program at the start of fall camp as a graduate transfer from Iowa.

**JACKS IN THE PROS:** With the regular season under way, three former South Dakota State University football standouts are currently featured on National Football League rosters, continuing the Jackrabbits' long tradition of developing players into pro prospects.

Headlining the list is Adam Vinatieri of the Indianapolis Colts, who established a new NFL career record for field goals Sept. 30 against Houston and enters with week with 568 in his 23-year career. Currently the oldest player in the NFL at age 45, Vinatieri holds 13 other NFL records, including 20 100-point seasons.

Considered one of the most clutch kickers in NFL history, Vinatieri's career totals include 568-of-674 on field goal attempts, 84.3 percent, and 2,523 career points. He ranks second in career scoring — 21 points behind leader Morten Andersen (2,544 points from 1982-2007) — and fourth in career extra points (819).

After two Pro Bowl selections (2002, 2004), he left New England following the 2005 season as the team's career scoring leader with 1,058 points. In 2015, he became the first player in NFL to score 1,000 points for two different teams.

Also continuing his NFL career is offensive lineman Bryan Witzmann. A member of the Jackrabbits from 2010-13, Witzmann earned a starting role with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2017. However, he released by the Chiefs at the end of training camp and has since been signed by the Minnesota Vikings. Witzmann previously spent time with Houston, New Orleans and Dallas.

Making his professional debut recently was tight end Dallas Goedert. A two-time All-American, Goedert became the first Jackrabbit selected in the NFL Draft in eight years as he was a second-round pick by the defending Super Bowl champion Philadelphia Eagles. The Britton native caught one pass for four yards in a season-opening win over Atlanta on Sept. 6, then scored his first NFL touchdown Sept. 23 as

part of a seven-catch, 73-yard performance against Indianapolis. For the season, he has caught 12 passes for 106 yards with the one score.

Former Jackrabbit running back Zach Zenner began the 2018 season with Detroit, but has since been released after playing in 28 games over three full seasons with the Lions.

During a highly decorated career at SDSU from 2011-14, Zenner became the first player in the history of Division I football to rush for 2,000 yards in three consecutive seasons.

Also in their first training camps this summer were 2017 All-Americans Jake Wieneke (Minnesota Vikings) and Jacob Ohnesorge (Dallas Cowboys). Neither made the final roster for their respective teams and is awaiting other professional opportunities.

**DANA J. DYKHOUSE STADIUM:** Jackrabbit football moved into a new home in September of 2016 with the completion of Dana J. Dykhous Stadium.

The stadium, which was constructed in phases on the site of SDSU's previous home field, Coughlin-Alumni Stadium, seats 19,340 spectators and cost \$65 million to build. The stadium is being funded through private gifts and long-term revenue streams, including concessions and suite, loge box and ticket sales. Bonds are financing nearly two-thirds of the project's construction, with the remaining dollars coming from private support. Lead gifts totaling \$12.5 million from Sioux Falls banker Dana Dykhous and philanthropist T. Denny Sanford were announced in October 2013.

The stadium officially opened Sept. 8, 2016, featuring a concert by country music superstars Luke Bryan, Little Big Town and Lee Brice as part of the Jacks Bash opening weekend. The first football game was two days later, on Sept. 10, when the Jackrabbits defeated Drake, 56-28.

SDSU has gone on to post a 16-2 record at Dana J. Dykhous Stadium during its first three seasons of operation, including a 3-0 mark in FCS playoff games.

Dana J. Dykhous Stadium was designed by Kansas City-based Crawford Architects, with the construction firm JE Dunn serving as the project manager at risk and Henry Carlson Company of Sioux Falls serving as general contractor. The stadium won the 2017 Alliant Build America Award from the Associated General Contractors of America South Dakota Building Chapter.

**STIG SHOW:** The John Stiegelmeier Radio Show airs each Monday throughout the 2018 football season.

The show is scheduled to air at 6 p.m. on the Jackrabbit Sports Network, originating with flagship station WNAX 570 AM in Yankton. In addition, the weekly show also will be streamed online free of charge at GoJacks.com.

Hosted by Tyler Merriam, the John Stiegelmeier Radio Show will also feature interviews with Jackrabbit student-athletes and assistant coaches. Jackrabbit fans are encouraged to attend the show in person at Cubby's Sports Bar and Grill, 307 Main Ave., in downtown Brookings.

**A LOOK AHEAD:** The Jackrabbits will be on the road each of the next two weeks, traveling Oct. 20 to Northern Iowa (4 p.m. kickoff) and to Illinois State (noon kickoff) on Oct. 27. Both games will be available for viewing via ESPN3.com.

Next home action is slated for Nov. 3 versus Missouri State on Military Appreciation Day. Kickoff for that game is 2 p.m. at Dana J. Dykhous Stadium.

## LAST MEETING WITH YOUNGSTOWN STATE

### #5/6 YOUNGSTOWN STATE 19, #4/4 SDSU 7

Sept. 30, 2017 • Stambaugh Stadium (Att.: 17,450)

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio – Youngstown State's Tevin McCaster paced a ball-control offense with 183 rushing yards and a touchdown on 35 carries to lead the Penguins to a 19-7 victory over fourth-ranked South Dakota State in the Missouri Valley Football Conference opener for both teams Sept. 30 at Stambaugh Stadium.

The Penguins, ranked fifth in the FCS coaches' poll and sixth in the STATS media poll, ran for 310 yards and possessed the ball for more than 45 minutes in improving to 3-1 overall. SDSU dropped to 3-1 overall.

Youngstown State set the tone on its first drive, putting together a 16-play, 94-yard march. Backup quarterback Nathan Mays, who entered the game in place of an injured Hunter Wells eight plays into the game, completed both of his pass attempts before capping the drive on a fourth-down play with a 4-yard touchdown run.

SDSU came back to knot the game at 7-all early in the second quarter with a 10-play, 75-yard scoring drive of its own. Taryn Christion connected with All-America wide receiver Jake Wieneke three times on the drive, the last of which covered 10 yards for what would be the only Jackrabbit score of the night.

The Penguins quickly countered with their second scoring drive of the game – all of it coming on the ground. McCaster carried seven times for 60 yards on the drive, including the final yard for a touchdown, to finish off a nine-play, 75-yard drive.

Each team squandered a red-zone opportunity on either end of the first half. The Jackrabbits took the opening kickoff and were on the doorstep of the end zone when Dallas Goedert had the ball jarred loose at YSU 6 by Jalyn Powell and the fumble was recovered by the Penguins' Kyle Hegedus after a 31-yard catch and run down the middle.

The Penguins looked to build on their 14-7 lead late in the first half. YSU converted on a pair of third downs to move the ball deep into Jackrabbit territory. With no timeouts remaining and the ball at the SDSU 5 with 11 seconds remaining, McCaster was tackled inbounds by Jordan Brown and Nick Farina after catching a swing pass at the 2-yard line, allowing the clock to run out.

The Jackrabbit defense thwarted another YSU drive deep in SDSU territory in the third quarter as backup safety Lorenzo Williams came up with an interception at the 1-yard line.


However, on the first play of the ensuing drive, Mikey Daniel was tackled in the end zone for a safety that upped the Youngstown State lead to 16-7.

The Penguins then put together another methodical drive after the free kick, pushing their lead to 19-7 with 10 minutes and 21 seconds to play in the game on a 24-yard field goal by Zak Kennedy that capped a 15-play, 60-yard march.

SDSU's comeback attempt ended in Youngstown State territory as Christion had a pass intercepted by Armond Dellovade at the Penguin 19 with 8:38 to play.

The Jackrabbits would not get the ball back as YSU converted on three third-down plays before time expired with the ball at the SDSU 1.

Youngstown State finished with a 448-222 advantage in total offense and ran 86 offensive plays compared to only 37 by the Jackrabbits.



Brady Hale punted three times for an average of 44.0 yards and booted a season-best 53-yarder in the Jackrabbits' MVFC opener at Youngstown State.

Besides McCaster's 183 yards on the ground, Mays accounted for 113 through the air on 14-of-19 passing and gained 65 rushing yards on 11 carries. Alvin Bailey led the Penguin receivers with a game-high six catches for 43 yards.

Christion ended the night 10-of-21 passing for 157 yards and paced the Jackrabbits on the ground with 28 yards on five carries. Wieneke tallied four catches for 61 yards, with Goedert adding three receptions for 58 yards.

Christian Rozeboom was credited with a game-high 14 tackles, followed by career-high 11 tackles from both Eric Kleinschmit and Jordan Brown.

## GAME 1 RECAP

### #3/3 SDSU 45, MONTANA STATE 14

Sept. 8, 2018 • Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium (Att.: 14,614)

Cade Johnson tied a South Dakota State single-game record with four touchdown receptions as the Jackrabbits officially kicked off the 2018 season by defeating Montana State, 45-14, in the Fifth Annual Dairy Drive at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

The third-ranked Jackrabbits, who had their scheduled season opener the previous at Iowa State canceled due to inclement weather, dominated both sides of the ball in the first half in racing out to a 24-0 lead through the first 30 minutes.

A sophomore from Papillion, Nebraska, Johnson scored each of the first three Jackrabbit touchdowns, starting with a 2-yard pass from Taryn Christion on third and goal late in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Johnson found paydirt after catching a shovel pass and rolling around left end for a 24-yard score, then tallied his third touchdown three minutes later with a one-handed catch in the back corner of the end zone from 19 yards out.

Chase Vinatieri added a 42-yard field goal later in the quarter to give SDSU its 24-0 halftime advantage.

Meanwhile, the Jackrabbit defense pitched a first-half shutout by limiting Montana State to one first down. The Bobcats were forced to punt seven times in the first two quarters and turned the ball over on their other possession – an interception by preseason All-America cornerback Jordan Brown.

The Jackrabbits made it 31-0 on the opening drive of the second half as Christion capped an 11-play, 75-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run.

The two squads traded touchdowns the rest of the way. Maleek Barkley put Montana State on the board with a 2-yard touchdown run in the third quarter and Lance McCutcheon scored on a 3-yard pass from Tucker Rovig on the first play of the fourth and final stanza.

Mikey Daniel added a third-quarter touchdown for SDSU with a 2-yard plunge that was set up by a 51-yard pass play from Christion to Adam Anderson. On the longest pass play of the night, Christion topped the 10,000-yard mark for total offense in his career, becoming the first Jackrabbit and only second player in Missouri Valley Football Conference to reach the milestone.

Johnson made history at the 10:38 mark of the fourth quarter as he caught his fourth touchdown of the game, this one from 7 yards following a Joshua Manchigiah interception. The mark of four touchdown receptions was first set by Don Bartlett in a 1949 game against North Dakota State. That record went unchallenged for 67 years and now has been matched each of the last three seasons by Dallas Goedert (2016 versus Western Illinois), Jake Wieneke (2017 versus Duquesne) and Johnson.

Johnson ended the game with career highs of nine catches for 138 yards, with Anderson adding a career-best 86 yards on four receptions.

Christion finished 21-of-29 passing for 319 yards as SDSU held a 512-193 advantage in total offense, including a 193-29 edge in the rushing department. The Jackrabbits were paced by freshman C.J. Wilson's 62 yards on 12 carries.

Dalton Cox led the SDSU defense with seven tackles.

Montana State, 1-1 overall, went with backup Tucker Rovig at quarterback, and he finished the game 13-of-25 passing for 164 yards. Kevin Kassis caught three passes for 74 yards. None of the six Bobcats with a rushing attempt managed to reach double figures for yards on the ground.



Cade Johnson became the third Jackrabbit in as many seasons to catch four touchdown passes in a game, tying a school record. Johnson also finished with career highs of nine receptions and 138 receiving yards in a 45-14 SDSU victory.

## GAME 2 RECAP

### #3/3 SDSU 90, ARKANSAS-PINE BLUFF 6

Sept. 15, 2018 • Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium (Att.: 14,526)

South Dakota State rewrote its record book numerous times, including setting new standards for points and total yards, in a 90-6 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff in the 52nd Annual Beef Bowl at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

The third-ranked Jackrabbits improved to 2-0 overall, while UAPB dropped to 1-2 on the season.

SDSU needed only five offensive plays to score its first three touchdowns — all on passes from senior quarterback Taryn Christion. After a 29-yard punt return by Marquise Lewis put SDSU deep in Golden Lion territory, the Jackrabbits needed only two plays to cash in as Christion found freshman tight end Blake Kunz over the middle for an 8-yard score.

A turnover on the next UAPB possession led to a 31-yard scoring pass from Christion to Adam Anderson, who leaped up and over two defenders to corral his first career touchdown. Moments later, Christion hooked up with reigning Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Week Cade Johnson deep down field for a 71-yard touchdown that gave SDSU a 21-3 lead.

On the play, Christion became the MVFC's career leader in touchdown passes, surpassing the 78 thrown by Illinois State's Matt Brown from 2009-12.

Jamie Gillan, who connected on a 47-yard field goal midway through the first quarter, added a 20-yarder later in the stanza to pull to within 21-6. However, the Jackrabbits would tally the final 69 points of the game and continued to churn out big plays as eight of the 13 touchdowns they scored on the night covered at least 30 yards.

Christion, who played only in the first half, threw two more touchdowns before exiting, finding Jacob Brown in the end zone from nine yards out late in the final minute of the first quarter and adding a 40-yard scoring strike to Johnson early in the second quarter. It marked the fifth five-touchdown game of Christion's career.

Combined, three Jackrabbit quarterbacks went 19-for-21 passing with single-game school records of 557 yards and eight touchdowns. Christion was 13-of-14 for 332 yards, while backup Kanin Nelson finished 4-of-5 passing for 136 yards with touchdowns on screen passes of 66 yards to Pierre Strong Jr. and 37 yards to C.J. Wilson.

Third-string signal-caller Justin Roberts completed both of his passes for 89 yards, including a 76-yarder to Michael Wandmaker, who caught a pass on a quick out pattern, broke a tackle along the right sideline and rambled the rest of the way to paydirt.

The Jackrabbit running game also got in the act, headlined by Isaac Wallace's 192 yards on only five carries. Wallace scored on runs of 58 and 79 yards, while Mikey Daniel plunged in twice on short runs and Blair Mulholland contributed a 14-yard touchdown run for his first collegiate touchdown.

SDSU tallied 369 rushing yards and a program-best 926 yards of total offense. The Jackrabbits' 90 points also established a new school record, eclipsing the 85 points scored against Columbus College way back in 1922.

Johnson posted his second consecutive 100-yard receiving game with five catches for 162 yards. Anderson also eclipsed the century mark with four catches for 128 yards.

UAPB, which played without regular starting quarterback Shannon Patrick, went with Roger Totten II under center. He completed 9-of-21

passes for 131 yards and was intercepted twice — both in the end zone by Zy Mosley.

Eric Kleinschmit paced the Jackrabbit defense with seven tackles.

## GAME 3 RECAP

### #1/1 NORTH DAKOTA STATE 21, #3/3 SDSU 17

Sept. 29, 2018 • Fargodome (Att.: 18,846)

FARGO, N.D. – Third-ranked South Dakota State took a lead into the fourth quarter against top-ranked North Dakota State inside the Fargodome, but the Bison came away with the lone score of the final stanza on a 5-yard touchdown run by quarterback Easton Stick to regain the Dakota Marker with a 21-17 victory.

In the Missouri Valley Football Conference opener for both teams, NDSU improved to 4-0 overall, while the Jackrabbits fell to 2-1.

Stick engineered an eight-play, 80-yard drive for the winning score and added key runs late in the game to seal the victory. He began the game-winning drive with a 28-yard pass to Darrius Shepherd and 24-yard strike to Dallas Freeman before the Bison tallied the final 18 yards on the ground.

On the ensuing possession, SDSU missed a 48-yard field goal attempt that would have brought the Jackrabbits within a point. The Jackrabbits got the ball back one final time deep in their own territory with under six minutes to play, but did not pick a first down and gave the ball back to NDSU via a punt with 3 minutes and 32 seconds remaining.

The Bison ran out the clock as Stick, who gained a team-high 63 yards on 15 carries, picked up a pair of first downs on third-down runs.

The Jackrabbits' offense clicked early as eight of their first 16 plays from scrimmage resulted in first downs. On its second possession of the game, SDSU strung together a 10-play, 89-yard drive that ended with a 3-yard touchdown pass from Taryn Christion to Cade Johnson. It was Johnson's seventh touchdown reception of the season.

SDSU was poised to go up by two scores on its next drive. Ten-yard runs by Isaac Wallace and Christion were followed by a 24-yard pass from Christion to Adam Anderson that moved the ball to the Bison 13. However, Christion's third-down pass to end zone was intercepted by Jalen Allison.

The Bison seized the momentum with the interception, putting together a pair of touchdown drives in the second quarter to take a 14-7 half-time lead. Stick scrambled for 22 yards and a first down on third-and-21, then connected with tight end Ben Ellefson on the next play from 17 yards for the game-tying score.

Later in the quarter, and after missing a 48-yard field goal moments earlier, the Bison took their first lead with a quick two-play, 56-yard drive. Ty Brooks ran for 15 yards before Stick found Shepherd over the middle for a 41-yard touchdown. Shepherd tallied a game-high 116 yards on five receptions.

The Jackrabbits went back in front, 17-14, by scoring all 10 points of the third quarter. Chase Vinatieri drilled a 39-yard field goal and Isaac Wallace followed on the next SDSU possession with a 61-yard touchdown run around right end. Wallace topped the 100-yard for the second game in a row with 110 yards on only nine carries.

Christion ended the day 19-of-29 passing for 202 yards, while Anderson paced the SDSU receiving corps with 102 yards, topping the century mark for the second consecutive game, on a career-high eight catches.

NDSU held a 389-357 advantage in total offense. Stick completed 9-of-20 passes for 182 yards.

Christian Rozeboom led the Jackrabbit defensive effort with a game-high 12 tackles, followed by redshirt freshman defensive tackle Krockett Krolikowski with seven stops, including 1.5 sacks. Ryan Earith also tallied a sack and a half for SDSU.



Krockett Krolikowski recorded seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks, in the Jackrabbits' Sept. 29 game at top-ranked North Dakota State. As a team, SDSU notched three sacks and five tackles for loss in the contest.

Jabril Cox and Robbie Grimsley each registered eight tackles to lead the Bison.

Taryn Christion became South Dakota State's all-time passing yardage leader and tied a career high with five touchdown passes, but it was Isaac Wallace's 2-yard touchdown run in overtime that finally pushed the Jackrabbits over the finish line in a 54-51 victory over Indiana State Saturday night at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

With the win, the Jackrabbits improved to 3-1 overall and 1-1 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. Indiana State dropped to 2-3 overall and 0-2 in league play.

The Jackrabbits took a 42-24 lead into the fourth quarter after scoring three third-quarter touchdowns. Wallace scored on a 4-yard swing pass from Christion on SDSU's first drive of the half, then turned to some trickery to go ahead 35-17 as kicker Chase Vinatieri took a pitch from holder Brady Hale on a would-be field goal attempt and turned the corner around left end for a 15-yard touchdown run.

The Sycamores answered with a 62-yard touchdown run by Ja'Quan Keys, but SDSU countered as Christion hit Adam Anderson on the slant for a 3-yard touchdown that capped a five-play, 91-yard drive. Pierre Strong Jr. set up Anderson's second touchdown of the game with a 69-yard run to the Indiana State 3.

Indiana State would force overtime by scoring on its final five drives of regulation, starting with the Keys touchdown run midway in the third quarter. Ryan Boyle ran for a 4-yard touchdown on the second play of the fourth quarter, then hooked up with Rontrez Morgan for a 34-yard touchdown to pull the Sycamores to within 45-38. Morgan's second touchdown of the night came after Indiana State reached into its own bag of tricks by converting a fake punt.

After Vinatieri booted the second of his two field goals to give the Jackrabbits a 48-38 lead with 3 minutes and 16 seconds remaining, Keys ramblled 57 yards to cut the margin to a field goal.

SDSU recovered the ensuing onside kick, but couldn't pick up a first down and was forced to punt. Hale's kick was downed at the 1-yard line, but the Sycamores quickly climbed out of the deep hole as Boyle completed passes of 30 yards to Dante Jones II and 47 yards to Morgan. Indiana State had first-and-goal from the 7 later in the drive, but settled for a game-tying 25-yard field goal by Jerry Nunez as time expired in regulation.

The Jackrabbits won the coin flip and elected to go on defense first. Indiana State had two shots from the 1-yard line, but linebacker Dalton Cox, with help from defensive end Ryan Earith on the second play, again forced the Sycamores to settle for a Nunez field goal.

Cox led the Jackrabbits with 10 tackles.

SDSU kept the ball in the hands of its playmakers during its overtime drive. Christion completed another screen pass to Wallace on third-and-8 to move the chains and again came up big on third down as the senior quarterback hit Cade Johnson for another nine yards. After a pass interference penalty moved the ball to the 2-yard-line, Wallace found paydirt over the right side of the line to end the game.

Wallace gained 81 yards on a career-high 21 carries, while Strong posted a team-high 95 yards on only six carries. Mikey Daniel added 70 yards on 10 carries.

The two squads each finished with 293 rushing yards as Keys tallied a game-high 159 yards on 19 carries.

Christion, who threw touchdown passes of 12 yards to Anderson on the opening drive of the game as well as 9- and 5-yarders to Jacob Brown and Mikey Daniel, respectively, ended the night 20-of-31 passing for 229 yards.



Chase Vinatieri scored on a fake field goal from 15 yards out and added two field goals to help lead the Jackrabbits to a 54-51 overtime win over Indiana State.

His completions were spread among eight different receivers, with Anderson and Kallan Hart each catching four balls for 57 yards.

For Indiana State, Boyle ran for two scores and threw for two more in a 19-for-29 effort with 276 yards. Morgan finished with game highs of nine catches and 155 receiving yards.

Jonas Griffith led all players with 18 tackles for Indiana State.
