COWBOY QUICK HITS

- ▶ Seven All-Americans and five seniors return to the Cowboys lineup and redshirt-freshman and 2017 Junior World Champion Daton Fix is another key addition at 133 pounds.
- ▶ In 2017-18 the Cowboys went 13-2 in dual meets and wrapped up conference competition at the Big 12 Championships in Tulsa, Okla., claiming their sixth consecutive conference title with four individual champions.
- ▶ The Cowboys enter the 2018-19 season with 11 wrestlers ranked at their respective weights in various polls. Following his NWCA All-Star Dual bout with Youssif Hemida, Derek White is the top-ranked Cowboy, coming in No. 3 at heavyweight.
- ▶ Oklahoma State head coach John Smith assumed the title of winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I wrestling over a year ago. He holds 411 wins for his coaching career. Last season, Smith became the eighth coach to notch 400 wins in division I wrestling.
- ▶ The Cowboys bring in two new faces at 157 and 184 in Andrew Shomers and Dakota Geer, respectively. Both wrestlers transferred from Edinboro and look to have an immediate impact for the Pokes.

MEDIA INFORMATION AND POLICIES

The Oklahoma State athletic communications office welcomes you to another season of Cowboy wrestling. The communications staff is here to assist members of the media in their coverage of Oklahoma State athletics. Please take a moment to become familiar with the following media policies.

CREDENTIALS

Members of the media should contact Emily Lingenfelter in the Oklahoma State media relations office to request credentials to OSU wrestling duals (emily.lingenfelter@okstate.edu or 405-744-416). Credentials can be picked up at the Southwest pass gate to Gallagher-Iba Arena on match days.

INTERVIEWS

Media interview requests for Oklahoma State head coach John Smith should be directed to Sean Maguire in the OSU media relations office. Any requests for assistant coaches and wrestlers should be directed to Emily Lingenfelter in the OSU media relations office. Coaches and wrestlers are typically available for interview before practice starts (usually around 3 p.m. CT), but arrangements can be made to accommodate most schedules.

MEDIA PARKING

Members of the media attending matches at Gallagher-Iba Arena should park in the lot just south of the arena and Boone Pickens Stadium. The entrance to the lot is located off Knoblock Street. No parking pass is necessary for entry into the lot.

VISITING RADIO, PHONE LINES

Phone lines will be provided to the primary radio broadcast crews for both the Cowboys and the visiting team. Additional lines are available to the media on a first-come, first-served basis in the Gallagher-Iba Arena media room.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers may shoot from the east and west sides of the mat, but are prohibited from shooting in front of either team's bench on the north and south sides of the mat.

COWBOYS ON THE AIR

Rex Holt and Roger Moore are in their 14th year together as the radio broadcast team of Oklahoma State Cowboy Wrestling. OSU wrestling can be heard on its primary home of 93.7 KSPI-FM radio in Stillwater. Occasional events are aired on either 105.5 KGFY-FM radio or 780 AM radio Stillwater should programming conflicts arise. Any time the Cowboys are on the air, the live broadcast can also be accessed live on the official web site of OSU athletics, www.okstate.com.

JOHN SMITH

Head Coach | 28th Year | Oklahoma State, 1988

Now in his 28th year, Smith accepted the head coaching position at Oklahoma State in 1992 and the numbers and accomplishments since that time speak for themselves. He has led his alma mater to five NCAA team titles in 1994, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006, and he has coached 32 NCAA individual champions and five Olympians. Under his watch, the Cowboys have brought 18 team conference tournament championships, two Big 12 regular season titles and 114 individual conference titles back to Stillwater. He has seen his student-athletes earn All-America recognition 129 times, an average of 4.8 All-America honorees per year.

STILLWATER - The top-ranked and undefeated Oklahoma State wrestling team picked up its eighth win of the season Sunday afternoon at Gallagher-Iba Arena, moving to 3-0 in Big 12 action with a 31-9 rout of 19th-ranked South Dakota State.

The Cowboys earned five bonus-point victories in the win, including technical falls from redshirt freshman Nick Piccininni, senior Anthony Collica and senior Nolan Boyd, who tallied the 100th win of his career. Senior Austin Schafer ended the match with an exclamation point, pinning Jackrabbit Alex Macki in the first period.

Once again, following up a 20-2 tech fall in Friday's win over West Virginia, Piccininni set the tone for the match at 125 pounds. Piccininni wasted no time banking a 15-0 tech over Ben Gillette to put the Cowboys up, 5-0, on the Jackrabbits early. The redshirt freshman opened with a takedown and a pair of nearfalls in the first period to lead 8-0. It took only 47 seconds into the second frame to end the match, as Piccininni, who elected to start the period on bottom, escaped and tallied another takedown and four-point nearfall to lock up the win.

Redshirt freshman Kaid Brock was upset at 133 pounds, as seventh-ranked Seth Gross came away with a 6-4 decision to give Brock his first loss of the season and only the second of his career.

Reigning NCAA Champion at 141 pounds Dean Heil tallied his second major decision of the weekend to seize momentum back in the Cowboys' favor. Heil scored a takedown on South Dakota State's Isaac Andrade with under 20 seconds to go in the opening period to lead, 2-0, after one. The Cowboy junior opened the second on top and rode out the whole frame, adding a pair of back points, after Andrade elected down. Heil finished off the major in the third, escaping and dropping Andrade for another score on the way to a 9-0 win.

Anthony Collica also picked up his second bonus-point victory of the weekend, working hard for a 23-8 tech fall over 20th-ranked Alex Kocer at 149 pounds. Collica used five takedowns in the opening period to hold a 10-4 lead after three minutes. Five more takedowns in the final two periods and a couple of minutes of riding time allowed the senior to ride off with his first tech of the season.

At 157, Joe Smith came just short of tallying bonus points for OSU against South Dakota State's Logan Peterson. Leading, 9-2, in the third after a four-point nearfall with over a minute of riding time in the bank, Peterson escaped to cut Smith's lead to six. Smith got a couple of good looks, but couldn't convert on one final takedown, finishing with a 10-3 decision.

Redshirt sophomore Chandler Rogers won his eighth-straight match, handling Luke Zilverberg in an 8-3 decision at 165 pounds. Leading, 4-3, heading to the second and starting in the defensive position, Rogers staved off Zilverberg with a takedown with just outside of a minute to go in the match, riding out the clock for the win.

After opening his match in a 6-0 hole early at 174 pounds, Cowboy senior Kyle Crutchmer couldn't dig himself out, giving up a 7-2 decision to No. 20 David Kocer.

Nolan Boyd's 100th win came with bonus points attached, as the senior picked up his second technical fall of the weekend in an 18-2 win over Martin Mueller at 184 pounds. Boyd used a 13-point first period to help propel him to the win, wrapping the match in 5:25. Boyd, the 40th Cowboy in program history to reach to century mark, has now tallied bonus points in four of his last five dual starts for the Pokes.

Facing a tough test against eighth-ranked Nate Rotert, redshirt sophomore Preston Weigel dropped a 3-1 match in sudden victory Sunday. Trailing, 1-0, after two periods after being dinged for his second stalling warning in the second period, Weigel elected to start down and quickly escaped to open the final frame to tie the match. Neither wrestler could score in the final minutes of regulation, sending the match to sudden victory where Rotert would convert the decisive takedown.

Heavyweight Austin Schafer recorded the second fall of his senior season, following up a 16-0 tech fall in his match on Friday with a first-period pin of South Dakota State's Alex Macki. With the triumph, Schafer pushed his record on the season to 16-1 overall with nine of those wins coming with bonus points.

Although the Jackrabbits are not ranked in the dual meet poles, the team is No. 20 in tournament rankings.

ABOUT THE COWBOYS

Coming off a rebuilding year that saw a number of Cowboys utilize redshirts, OSU returns seven All-Americans, adds a pair of transfers and 2017 Junior World Champion Daton Fix to its lineup. A number of familiar faces are back on the mat, including seniors Chandler Rogers, Jacobe Smith, Preston Weigel and Derek White.

Rogers led all Cowboys in falls with 11 and knocked off six ranked opponents on the season. In his first year competing in the orange singlet, Jacobe Smith took home his first All-America nod, finishing eighth after being slotted at No. 13 for the NCAA Tournament. Weigel returns from a season fraught with injuries and looks to make a run at the podium again to wrap up his Cowboy career. One of the Pokes' pleasant surprises in 2017-18 was heavyweight Derek White. Although White fell short of an All-America finish at nationals, he collected a Big 12 title, 51 points in duals and a team-leading 55 takedowns for the Cowboys.

Following up an impressive 13-2 dual record, the Cowboys also claimed the program's 52nd conference title, with Nick Piccininni, Boo Lewallen, Chandler Rogers and Derek White bringing home first-place finishes.

Piccininni looks to secure his third conference title and make his way back to the podium at the NCAA Championships in March. All-American Kaid Brock led the Cowboys in dual points scored with

54 last season. The Cowboy notched eight major decisions and was three takedowns shy of team leader Derek White.

A pair of less familiar faces takes the mat for the Cowboys this weekend at 157 and 184 pounds. Andrew Shomers and Dakota Geer put on the orange singlet for the first time at South Dakota State following their transfer from Edinboro. Shomers made the NCAA tournament for the first time last season and finished in the round of 32. Geer comes into the season after a redshirt year at Edinboro having made the NCAA Tournament in his true freshman campaign for the Scots.

IN THE POLLS

The Cowboys enter the 2018-19 season with wrestlers ranked at each weight and are not lacking in depth. *Intermat* ranks the Cowboys as the No. 2 dual meet team in the country.

Nick Piccininni comes in at No. 4 for OSU, and in his wrestling poll debut, Daton Fix sits at No. 9 in the 133-pound rankings.

Although he is ranked at No. 8 at 174 pounds, Chandler Rogers returns to the Cowboys' 165 slot with Jacobe Smith at 174. Smith is ranked No. 11 at 184 pounds.

Kaid Brock returns to the lineup for the Cowboys stepping in at 141 pounds in place of two-time NCAA Champion Dean Heil. Brock is ranked No. 5 in a tough weight class.

Returning All-American Boo Lewallen is also ranked No. 5. Lewallen entered the starting lineup in place of injured Geo Martinez last season and captured a conference title and an eighth-place finish at the national tournament.

At the upper weights, Preston Weigel looks to rebound from a difficult year at 197 pounds. The Cowboy missed the majority of the season with various injuries, but comes in at No. 6 in the polls. Heavyweight Derek White is the highest ranked Cowboy at No. 3. White knocked off Youssif Hemida at the NWCA All-Star Classic the first weekend of Nov.

Andrew Shomers is ranked No. 20 at 157 pounds and looks to have an immediate impact for the Cowboys. Dakota Geer steps in at 184 as a redshirt sophomore.

Seven members of the Oklahoma State starting lineup claimed titles at the OCU Open on Nov. 4 to begin the 2018-19 season.

Aside from the seven Cowboy wrestlers who earned open titles, OSU had four Cowboys finish second and another earn a medal.

He is also only the fifth coach to win all of his duals at the same school. Currently sitting at 411 career wins, Smith is 10 wins away from tying Jack Childs and T.J. Kerr for fifth on the list. Impressively, of his 411 wins, 142 have come over top-10 teams.

WHITE BEATS HEMIDA AT ALL-STAR CLASSIC

Oklahoma State wrestling redshirt senior Derek White knocked off No. 3 Youssif Hemida of Maryland in the heavyweight bout at the 2018 National Wrestling Coaches Association All-Star Classic in Denver. White upended the 2018 All-American 7-5 in sudden victory after trailing by as many as three in the second period.

The NWCA All-Star Classic is an exhibition dual that matches up two of the best from around the nation in each weight class. Although the result doesn't count for either wrestler's record, the win provides a good bit of confidence for White, who is coming off an unprecedented season that saw the Edmond, Okla. native go 25-4 overall on the way to his first career Big 12 title.

GET YOUR FIX

Oklahoma State redshirt freshman Daton Fix spent 2017-18 competing internationally as a member of the USA Junior World team.

Fix took gold at the 2017 Junior World Championships in August 2017, outscoring his five opponents by a combined score of 53-1 and leading the United States to its first team title since 1984. With the win, Fix became the first Cowboy wrestler to take gold at the event since Alan Fried in 1991.

After blazing through the 2018 Senior World Team Trials, the Sand Springs native fell to world bronze medalist Thomas Gilman at Final X. Fix then participated in a special wrestle-off with Brandon Courtney of Arizona State. The Cowboy outscored Courtney 21-0 in the two matches, sealing a spot on his third-straight World Team.

After storming through the first two rounds in Trnava, Slovakia, Fix lost to Asia Junior Championships runner-up Naveen Naveen, 5-4, in the semifinals. He returned to the mat to collect his third technical fall of the tournament over Kyrgyzstan's Bekbolot Myrzanazar Uulu and bring home a third-place finish.

The win marked his fourth-consecutive top-three finish in world competition.

In his first weekend donning the orange singlet, he is set to wrestle defending NCAA Champion Seth Gross at South Dakota State and turns around Sunday to face Minnesota's No. 6 Ethan Lizak.

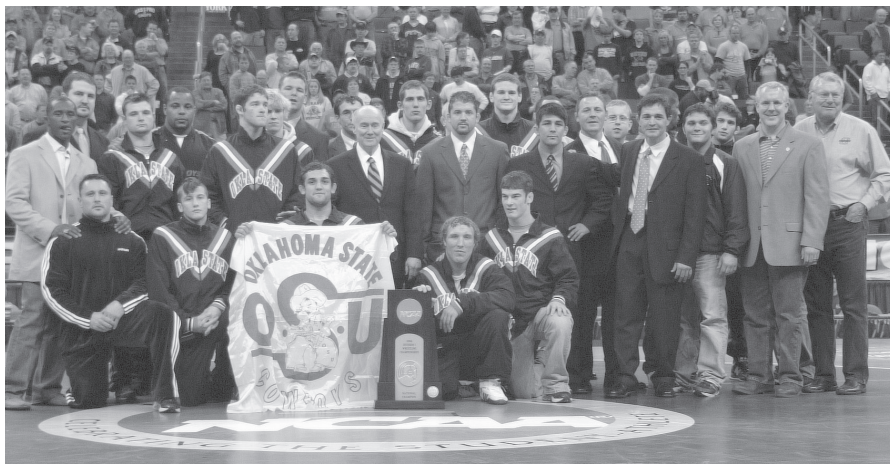

COWBOY WRESTLING TRADITION

Oklahoma State wrestling celebrated 100 years of history three seasons ago. The Cowboys, then known as the Oklahoma A&M Tigers and led by A.M. Colville, wrestled their first match in 1915 against the University of Texas. It was a rough start for OSU as it fell to the Longhorns in its lone dual of the season. But the Cowboys pulled through and went on to win 34 NCAA team championships (the most by any school in any sport), 142 individual champions and 462 All-Americans. Overall, the Cowboys hold an incredibly impressive 1,106-129-23 overall record.

NO OFF-SEASON

The 2018-19 college wrestling season might have ended in March, but several Cowboys competed as late as June with others wrestling through the summer and into the beginning of the fall semester.

On June 1, Nic Piccininni, Jacob Fontanez, Kaden Gfeller, Kaid Brock, Tristan Moran, Boo Lewallen, Chander Rogers, Joe Smith and Cornelius Putnam traveled to Akron, Ohio, to contend for a spot on the United States U23 Freestyle World Team.

Redshirt freshman Bear Hughes clinched a spot on the Junior Greco-Roman World Team. The Cowboy advanced to the finals following winning a U.S. Open title in Las Vegas. He went on to sweep the finals in Indianapolis this summer.

Austin Harris also made a run at the Open, claiming a 97 kg Junior Greco title at the UWW freestyle tournament in April. He finished eighth at the 2017 Junior Nationals to earn All-America Status. The Rosebur, Ore., native went to Fortaleza Brazil, in August, where he spent just over two minutes on the mat on his way to a Junior Pan-American Greco title. Harris also won his weight class in the freestyle bracket.

Daton Fix spent his summer on the mat contending for a position on the USA Wrestling Senior freestyle team and ultimately training and competing at 57kg on the Junior World team.

Fix swept the U.S. Open with five wins over opponents among the ranks of former Cowboy Eddie Klimara, Zane Richards and four-time NCAA All-American Zach Sanders. The wins set the stage for a best-of-three series with two-time world team member Tony Ramos. Fix only needed to matches to get the job done.

He fell at FinalX to World Bronze Medalist Thomas Gilman but moved on to defeat Arizona State's Brandon Courtney in a best-of-three series to earn a spot on the Junior World Team.

The redshirt freshman traveled to Trnava, Slovakia to compete for his second-consecutive World Title, but was upset in the semifinals. The Cowboy fought back and collected a third-place finish, marking his third bronze finish at world competition.

COAST-TO-COAST COWBOYS

The 2018-19 Cowboys roster features 19 native Oklahomans, but the remaining 17 wrestlers come to Oklahoma State from 13 other states, including: California, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Kansas, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Texas, Utah and Virginia.

OKLAHOMA STATE IS "WRESTLING U"

In 2016, Dan Lobdell and Andrew Spey of *FloWrestling* highlighted the best schools at each weight class over the past 15 years. The 10-part series breaks down each weight class using an algorithm that factors in a school's NCAA qualifiers, All-Americans and national champions over that time span to name one school the best at each class.

Oklahoma State took top honors in four weight classes (133, 149, 165 and 174), while finishing second at heavyweight. Not only were the Cowboys one of two schools to take multiple weight classes, but OSU was the only program to take more than two.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Like most years, this season's squad features a number of family ties within Cowboy wrestling.

Coach John Smith promoted his nephew Chris Perry from the volunteer assistant position more than a year ago to a member of the full-time coaching staff. Smith's son and two-time All-American Joe, returns to the mat in 2018-19 after a redshirt year.

Redshirt sophomore Andrew Marsden's brothers Alex and Austin both wrestled for OSU through 2016. Chandler Rogers' older brother Jordan was a Cowboy wrestler from 2012-2017. Redshirt sophomore Wyatt Sheets' father, Mike, was a four-time All-American and two-time NCAA Champion during his time as a Cowboy, while freshman Daton Fix, Wes Ahrberg and Zalin Edwards' fathers both competed for the Cowboys.

CHAMPS IN THE CLASSROOM

Seven members of the Oklahoma State wrestling team earned spots on the Academic All-Big 12 team, and two earned NWCA All-Academic status.

Senior Dean Heil earned first team honors, as Jonce Blaylock, Gary Wayne Harding and Andrew Marsden. Geo Martinez, Donald Cannon and Hestin Lamons received second team honors. Blaylock was honored for his second consecutive season.

Heil and Blaylock were also named to the NWCA All-Academic team, with Heil receiving recognition for the fourth time in his Cowboy career.

SMITH SIGNS SEVEN TO NLI

Oklahoma State wrestling head coach John Smith announced the signing of seven student-athletes to National Letters of Intent on Nov. 15. Brevin Balmececa, Cade Lindsey, Daniel Manibog, Chance McLane, Colt Newton, Triston Wills and Reece Witcraft will join the Cowboys in the fall of 2018.

Balmececa is Flo's No. 6 ranked high school wrestler in the country at 152 pounds and Intermat's No. 3. He boasts two Florida state titles to date. The Cowboy commit won the 2017 Super 32 and is a three-time NHSCA National Tournament champion. He notched a fourth-place finish at Super 32 this year. Balmececa comes to Oklahoma from South Dade High School where he wrestles for his father.

The 2019 Cowboy class also includes Katy, Texas', Daniel Manibog who comes in at No. 9 in Flo's 145-pound rankings. He's a two-time Texas state champion and knocked off multiple top-ranked wrestlers at Fargo this summer to finish fourth. Flo's No. 19 wrestler at 132, Reece Witcraft will also join the Cowboys in 2019.

McLane comes to OSU from Bozeman Montana with two state titles under his belt and a second-place finish at the USA World Greco-Roman Team Trials at 65 kg. McLane competed alongside fellow Cowboy signee Balmececa at Super 32 this fall.

Derby High School teammates Triston Wills and Cade Lindsey are set to join the Cowboys following their senior seasons. Lindsey is a three-time, top-three finisher in Kansas, and Wills took home top honors last season when he knocked off current Cowboy Jalin Harper in the 160-pound Kansas state finals. Oklahoma native Colt Newton also signed this week. He is a three-time state finalist and dropped a finals bout to Witcraft in 2018 after defeating him in the regular season.

COACHED BY THE BEST

When wrestlers come to compete at Oklahoma State, they are coached by the best. John Smith holds six world championships and two Olympic gold medals. Smith, Zack Esposito, Chris Perry and Tyler Caldwell also combine for five NCAA championships and 13 All-America honors. Smith brings in a plethora of international coaching experience. Most recently, he coached the 2017 USA Women's Cadet World Team, for which he was named USA Wrestling Women's Co-Coach of the Year alongside Campbell's Kary Kolat.

Esposito has had a hand in coaching World teams for the past four years, including two Cadet World Teams, a first-place Junior World Team and title-winning World Cup Team.

WRESTLING'S HOUSE OF HORRORS

No venue in America has a richer wrestling tradition than Gallagher-Iba Arena, home of Oklahoma State wrestling since 1939. In its beginning as Gallagher Hall, the gymnasium was named for Edward Clark Gallagher, the Oklahoma A&M wrestling mentor who never wrestled competitively but became the greatest coach of his time.

Since wrestling began in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the Cowboys have won 25 NCAA titles and have had 40 unbeaten and untied campaigns at home. One of their longest winning streaks ran with the arena's opening in 1939 and lasted until Feb. 16, 1951. During that period, Oklahoma State won 37 straight home duals, with no ties.

Gallagher-Iba Arena has proved to be one of the most difficult venues for opponents to win in across all of college sports, as the Cowboy wrestling program boasts an impressive 482-40-6 overall record in the arena.

From the final dual of 1959 through the first five home duals of the 1967 season, Oklahoma State wrestled 67 duals without a loss, finishing with an impressive 60-0-1 record before the streak was broken by Oklahoma, 19-13.

OSU's latest home winning streak of 50 consecutive duals was the second-longest such streak without a loss or tie, as it began near the end of the 1986 season and lasted until Jan. 30, 1993.
