BROOKINGS, S.D. — For the second week in a row, the South Dakota State University baseball team will say, “Meet me in (or near) St. Louis” after having its travel plans changed due to unfavorable forecasts and field conditions.

Instead of traveling to Nacogdoches, Texas, for four games this weekend, the Jackrabbits are now slated to play a three-game series against Bradley in Edwardsville, Illinois, Friday and Saturday. The series is slated to begin with a doubleheader starting at 11 a.m. Friday at the Simmons Complex on the SIU Edwardsville campus, with a single game Saturday at a time to be determined. SDSU was scheduled to play Bradley in the opening game of the weekend set in Nacogdoches.

Last weekend, SDSU dropped three games versus Austin Peay and Illinois after having its original series at Mississippi Valley State canceled. Bradley won two of its three games last weekend at the Atlanta Challenge, dropping its opener to Georgia State before recording wins over Georgia Tech and Kennesaw State.

THE SERIES: This weekend’s games between South Dakota State and Bradley will mark the first time the two squads have met on the baseball diamond.

PRESEASON POLL: The Jackrabbit baseball team has been picked to finish second in the upcoming Summit League race, according to a poll of league coaches released Feb. 8.

SDSU received 20 points and one first-place vote, finishing behind defending champion Oral Roberts, which received the other five first-place votes and 25 total points. North Dakota State completed the top half of the poll with 17 points.

Rounding out the second half of the poll were Western Illinois (14 points), Omaha (9) and Fort Wayne (5).

The Jackrabbits, who return six position starters, are scheduled to open Summit League play March 16, when they open a three-game series at Oral Roberts. The 2018 Summit League Baseball Championship is slated for May 23-26 in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

In addition, SDSU shortstop Tony Kjolsing was selected as a Summit League Player to Watch. A senior from Chaska, Minnesota, Kjolsing batted .291 with four home runs and 21 runs batted in while playing in 32 games during the 2017 season.

LAST WEEK: The Jackrabbits opened the season had their season-opening weekend series altered by weather, playing neutral-site games against Austin Peay and Illinois instead of making their originally scheduled trip to Mississippi Valley State.

Game 1: Austin Peay 4, SDSU 2

Austin Peay scored twice in the bottom of the seventh inning and held off a late South Dakota State threat for a 4-2 season-opening victory in college baseball action Feb. 16 at Billiken Sports Center in St. Louis, Missouri.

After Jackrabbit third baseman Newt Johnson drove in his second run of the day with a solo home run in the top of the seventh inning, Austin Peay put together the decisive rally in the home half of the frame. Garrett Kueber drew a leadoff walk against SDSU reliever Austin Suhr, advanced to second on a sacrifice bunt, took third on a fly ball and scored the go-ahead run on a wild pitch. Andrew Flaherty provided an insurance run later in the inning with a run-scoring single that plated Parker Phillips.

SDSU threatened with two outs in the top of the ninth. Back-to-back singles by Skyler Wenninger and Landon Badger put runners at the corners, but the Governors' Ross Walker came on in relief and induced a foul popout to end the game.

The Jackrabbits scored first, taking advantage of Austin Peay's lone error of the game in the top of the first. Tony Kjolsing reached on an infield single, took second on an error and moved to third on a passed ball before scoring on a sacrifice fly by Johnson.

Austin Peay grabbed the lead in the bottom of the second on a two-run double by Kueber off SDSU starter Brady Stover. It was the only hit Stover allowed in three innings, but the sophomore southpaw walked five and hit two batters.

Suhr, who made his Jackrabbit debut, pitched three scoreless innings before allowing the go-ahead runs in the seventh. He walked three and fanned one. Tyler Olmstead retired all four batters he faced to finish on the mound for SDSU, striking out two.

Badger was 3-for-4 to lead SDSU's seven-hit effort. Austin Peay's four hits were scattered among four different hitters.

Austin Peay starter Michael Costanzo struck out seven and walked only one over five innings, but did not factor into the decision. Brett Newberg earned the victory after giving up one run with three strikeouts in 3 2/3 innings of work.

Game 2: Austin Peay 9, SDSU 3

Austin Peay scored six times in the top of the seventh inning and added a pair of runs in the eighth to defeat South Dakota State, 9-3, in college baseball action Feb. 17 at GSC Credit Union Ballpark in Sauget, Illinois.

The Jackrabbits carried a 2-1 lead into the late innings behind a strong debut from right-hander Brady Moxham. A sophomore from Oakville, Manitoba, struck out eight and walked only one over five innings. The lone run Moxham allowed came in the third inning, when Garrett Giovannelli singled, stole second and scored on Andrew Flaherty's base hit to right center.

SDSU grabbed a 1-0 lead as Tony Kjolsing hit a solo home run to left two batters into the game. The Jackrabbits regained the lead at 2-1 in the home half of the fifth. Josh Falk led off the frame with a single, advanced to second on a passed ball and later scored on the lone Austin Peay error of the game.

Austin Peay sent 11 batters to the plate against three different Jackrabbit relievers in the fateful seventh inning. The Governors only managed two hits in the inning and were aided by an error and five walks.

The two eighth-inning runs for the Governors both scored on groundouts after Nick Walker and Giovannelli opened the inning with consecutive singles. Walker and Giovannelli each collected two of Austin Peay's nine hits.

The Jackrabbits' final run of the game came in the home half of the seventh as pinch hitter Anthony Schneider plated Landon Badger with a sacrifice fly. SDSU managed only three hits against three different Austin Peay pitchers, including starter Jacques Pucheu, who struck out nine over 5 1/3 innings.

Otis Roby took the loss in his Jackrabbit debut. After pitching a scoreless sixth inning, Roby ran into trouble in the seventh although only one of the four runs he allowed was earned.

Game 3: Illinois 5, SDSU 2

Ben Troike provided the early offense and Andy Fisher pitched four scoreless innings to help lead Illinois to a 5-2 victory over South Dakota State in college baseball action Feb. 18 at the Billiken Sports Center in St. Louis, Missouri.

Illinois was playing its season opener while the Jackrabbits fell to 0-3 in concluding its opening weekend.

After Zac Taylor was hit by a pitch to load the bases with two outs in the second inning, Troike lined a Corey Kuhlmann pitch to right field for a long single that cleared the bases to give the Fighting Illini an early 3-0 lead.

SDSU drew to within 3-2 in the fourth inning with a clutch two-out hit of its own. Skyler Wenninger reached on an infield single and Newt Johnson walked to set up Landon Badger, who doubled down the left-field line to score both runners.

The Jackrabbits threatened again in the fifth, knocking out Illinois starter Ty Weber. However, Sean Leland came on to record the final out of the frame and then gave way to Fisher, who allowed only one hit and one walk to go along with four strikeouts en route to the save.

Illinois added single runs against the SDSU bullpen on a solo home run by Doran Turchin to lead off the sixth inning and a squeeze bunt in the ninth.

Troike led Illinois' seven-hit attack by going 2-for-4. Tony Kjolsing was 2-for-3 with a walk as SDSU finished with six hits.

Kuhlmann struck out four and did not walk a batter in his Jackrabbit debut, which lasted 5 1/3 innings. Brett Mogen added 2 2/3 innings of scoreless relief, striking out two.

HOT START: Outfielder Landon Badger has excelled on Opening Day in each of his two seasons with the Jackrabbits. Both of Badger's career three-hit games have come in a season opener — he was 3-for-5 with two doubles and three runs batted in during his collegiate debut against Northern Illinois in the 2017 season opener, then went 3-for-4 in the 2018 opener against Austin Peay.

NEW ARMS: Seven Jackrabbit pitchers made their SDSU debuts on the opening weekend of play in Missouri and Illinois. Brady Moxham and Corey Kuhlmann each started games for SDSU, while Otis Roby, Austin Suhr, Alex Marro, Bryce Johnson and Mitchell Oehme made appearances in relief.

COACH BISHOP: Rob Bishop, who has guided college baseball teams to more than 500 victories, was named head baseball coach at South Dakota State University on Aug. 1, 2016. Bishop is the ninth head coach in program history and the fourth in the Division I era of Jackrabbit baseball.

Overall, Bishop holds a 575-349-1 record (.622 winning percentage) as a collegiate head coach, including a 26-27 mark with the Jackrabbits. Prior to coming to SDSU, he spent six years at NCAA Division II member Montana State University-Billings, where he led the Yellowjackets to back-to-back Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season titles in 2015 and 2016, attaining the program's first-ever 30-win season with a 30-20 record in 2016.

His squads also were honored as the top academic team in the GNAC each of his last three seasons.

Previously, Bishop spent 10 years at Miles City Community College in Montana, where

his teams won MonDak conference championships every year. His squads also claimed five consecutive junior college region titles and a Northwest District championship in 2007 to advance to the NJCAA Division II College World Series. He also served as athletic director the last five years of his tenure at Miles City.

Bishop served as a graduate assistant at SDSU under head coach Mark Ekeland during the 1998 and 1999 seasons. In his first season as a head coach, Bishop led Huron University to the South Dakota Intercollegiate Conference title in 2000.

A 1994 graduate of Jamestown College, Bishop earned NAIA All-America honors during the 1992 and 1994 seasons as an infielder.

THE ROSTER: The 2018 SDSU baseball roster features 33 players from six different states and one Canadian province. Of the 33 players, 12 are from South Dakota, 10 are from Iowa and seven hail from Minnesota. Arizona, Washington and Wisconsin are represented by one player each, as is Manitoba.

By class, seven are seniors, 11 are juniors, eight are sophomores and seven are incoming freshmen.
