BROOKINGS, S.D. — The South Dakota State University baseball team will attempt to get on the winning side of the ledger for the first time in 2018 as it travels to Minnesota for a midweek matchup.

First pitch is set for 6 p.m. Wednesday at U.S. Bank Stadium in Minneapolis. Radio coverage begins at 5:45 p.m. on Brookings-based KJJQ 910 AM and online at GoJacks.com. Video streaming of the game is available through Big Ten Network Plus (subscription required).

SDSU is 0-6 on the young season after having each of its first two weekend road trips altered due to inclement weather. The Jackrabbits were swept in a three-game weekend series Feb. 23-25 against Bradley in Edwardsville, Illinois.

Minnesota, meanwhile, enters a game Tuesday night against North Dakota State with a 5-1 overall record. The Golden Gophers recorded three wins by double-digit margins last weekend in Port Charlotte, Florida, defeating Boston College (14-1), Chicago State (16-5) and Mount St. Mary's (16-5).

THE SERIES: Wednesday's game against Minnesota will mark the 45th time the Jackrabbits and Golden Gophers have met on the baseball diamond. Minnesota leads the all-time series, which dates back to 1947, by a 32-12 count after sweeping a two-game season series in 2017, during which both games were played in Minneapolis.

The Golden Gophers recorded a 7-5 victory on March 7, 2017, at U.S. Bank Stadium, followed by a 5-2 victory at Siebert Field on April 18.

In the first meeting in 2017, Anthony Schneider homered twice for the Jackrabbits, leading off the top of the second inning with a solo homer and adding a two-run shot in the fifth.

All of Minnesota's runs scored in two innings — a three-run first and four-run third. SDSU's bullpen pitched six scoreless innings.

In the second meeting, Golden Gopher catcher Eli Wilson went 3-for-4 and drove in three runs, including the go-ahead triple, to lead Minnesota to the 5-2 win.

Matt Johnson accounted for all the Jackrabbit offense, opening the scoring with a solo home run to left-center field in the bottom of the first off Minnesota starter Nolan Birchill and adding a run-scoring single in the third inning to give SDSU the lead back at 2-1.

Wilson's go-ahead triple came with two outs in the fifth off SDSU reliever Brett Mogen and brought home Matt Stemper and Luke Pettersen for a 4-2 lead.

PRESEASON POLL: The Jackrabbit baseball team has been picked to finish second in the upcoming Summit League race, according to a poll of league coaches released Feb. 8.

SDSU received 20 points and one first-place vote, finishing behind defending champion Oral Roberts, which received the other five first-place votes and 25 total points. North Dakota State completed the top half of the poll with 17 points.

Rounding out the second half of the poll were Western Illinois (14 points), Omaha (9) and Fort Wayne (5).

The Jackrabbits, who return six position starters, are scheduled to open Summit League play March 16, when they open a three-game series at Oral Roberts. The 2018 Summit League Baseball Championship is slated for May 23-26 in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

In addition, SDSU shortstop Tony Kjolsing was selected as a Summit League Player to Watch. A senior from Chaska, Minnesota, Kjolsing batted .291 with four home runs and 21 runs batted in while playing in 32 games during the 2017 season.

LAST WEEK: The Jackrabbits let a couple leads slip away in the middle and late innings in falling three times to Bradley in a series played in Edwardsville, Illinois.

Game 1: Bradley 8, SDSU 6

Bradley overcame a four-run deficit, surging in the middle innings for an 8-6 victory over the Jackrabbits in the opening game of a doubleheader Feb. 23.

Trailing 4-0 entering the bottom of the fifth, the Braves got on the board on a two-run home run to left field by Luke Shadid off SDSU starter Brady Stover.

Bradley grabbed the lead with a four-run sixth inning against the Jackrabbit bullpen. Eli Rawlinson delivered the go-ahead run on a groundout and Keaton Rice followed with a run-scoring single for a 6-4 lead.

The Bradley lead grew to 8-4 in the seventh on a two-run single by Derek Bangert.

SDSU put together a rally in the top of the ninth. Phil Velez singled and Tony Kjolsing drew a two-out walk before Newt Johnson plated both baserunners with a double to left field, cutting the deficit to 8-6. Josh Falk was hit by a pitch and Landon Badger walked to load the bases, but Bradley reliever Matthew Richey induced a groundout to end the game.

The game was scoreless until the Jackrabbits scored in the top of the fourth. Falk was hit by a pitch, moved to second on a wild pitch and took third on a fly ball before scoring on a single up the middle by Philip Jacobson.

The Jackrabbits added three runs in the fifth inning. Kolton Michalski opened the inning by reaching on an error and later scored on a sacrifice fly by Nick Smith. Tony Kjolsing and Johnson added run-scoring singles later in the frame.

Bradley finished with a 15-9 advantage in hits, led by Andrew Ivelia with three hits. Gus Steiger, Johnson and Jacobson each tallied two hits for the Jackrabbits.

Stover struck out six, walked one and surrendered five hits in allowing two runs over five innings. Bryce Johnson finished on the mound for SDSU with two scoreless innings.

Brave starter Cole Cook earned the win after striking out six in six innings.

Game 2: Bradley 4, SDSU 2

The Braves grabbed the lead with a three-run seventh inning and added a run in the eighth to complete a doubleheader sweep.

Bradley, which only had five hits through the first six innings, tallied four hits in the seventh inning, starting with a Shadid double to left. K. Rice scored the first run of the inning on a wild pitch and Shadid scored the tying run on a single by Mangieri. Dougherty followed two batters later with a single that plated Mangieri for a 3-2 lead.

Mangieri, who was 3-for-5 to lead the Braves' 11-hit attack, added an RBI single in the eighth.

SDSU scored in each of the first two innings to take an early 2-0 lead. Nick Smith led off the game with a single and scored on Falk's single up the middle for the first run, while Anthony Schneider connected on a solo home run to lead off the second inning. Falk led SDSU's seven-hit effort with two hits.

Jackrabbit starter Tyler Olmstead pitched four shutout innings, striking out three and walking one. Korey Kuhlmann, the third of three SDSU pitchers, took the loss.

Alex Gray threw four innings of shutout relief to pick up the victory for Bradley. Brian Schrimmer struck out five in two scoreless innings to earn the save.

Game 3: Bradley 5, SDSU 1

After having the series finale pushed back a day due to weather, Andy Shadid and Keaton Rice each drove in a pair of runs to lead Bradley to a 5-1 victory and series sweep over South Dakota State Feb. 25 at Simmons Complex.

In sweeping the three-game weekend set, Bradley improved to 5-1 on the season.

Rice opened the scoring for the Braves with a two-run single in the bottom of the second. Brendan Dougherty led off with a base hit, while Eli Rawlinson and Nick McMurray drew consecutive walks against Jackrabbit starter Brady Moxham to load the bases for Rice.

SDSU cut the margin to 2-1 with its lone run of the game in the top of the fourth. Newt Johnson walked with one out, moved to second on a wild pitch and advanced to third on a base hit by Josh Falk before Landon Badger came through with a single to right center to plate Johnson.

The Jackrabbits threatened again in the fifth as Gus Steiger tripled with two outs and Tony Kjolsing walked and later stole second to put runners at second and third. However, Bradley starter Sam Lund posted his eighth and final strikeout of the game to end the inning.

Brooks Gosswein registered five strikeouts over three scoreless innings and Boby Johnson added a scoreless ninth to secure the victory.

The Braves tacked on single runs in the fifth, sixth and eighth innings to put the game out of reach. Shadid connected on a solo home run with one out in the sixth and added an RBI single in the eighth. Andrew Ivelia accounted for the fifth-inning run with a double.

Shadid was 3-for-4 to lead Bradley's 10-hit attack. Falk tallied two of SDSU's five hits. Moxham fanned five and walked two over 5 2/3 innings, allowing four runs on eight hits.

HOT START: Outfielder Landon Badger has excelled on Opening Day in each of his two seasons with the Jackrabbits. Both of Badger's career three-hit games have come in a season opener — he was 3-for-5 with two doubles and three runs batted in during his collegiate debut against Northern Illinois in the 2017 season opener, then went 3-for-4 in the 2018 opener against Austin Peay.

SOLID DEFENSE: The Jackrabbits enter the week as the top fielding team in The Summit League with a .981 fielding percentage through six games. SDSU has committed only four errors and has no made an error in three of the last four contests.

COACH BISHOP: Rob Bishop, who has guided college baseball teams to more than 500 victories, was named head baseball coach at South Dakota State University on Aug. 1, 2016. Bishop is the ninth head coach in program history and the fourth in the Division I era of Jackrabbit baseball.

Overall, Bishop holds a 575-352-1 record (.620 winning percentage) as a collegiate head coach, including a 26-30 mark with the Jackrabbits. Prior to coming to SDSU, he spent six years at NCAA Division II member Montana State University-Billings, where he led the Yellowjackets to back-to-back Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season titles in 2015 and 2016, attaining the program's first-ever 30-win season with a 30-20 record in 2016.

His squads also were honored as the top academic team in the GNAC each of his last three seasons.

Previously, Bishop spent 10 years at Miles City Community College in Montana, where his teams won MonDak conference championships every year. His squads also claimed five consecutive junior college region titles and a Northwest District championship in 2007 to advance to the NJCAA Division II College World Series. He also served as athletic director the last five years of his tenure at Miles City.

Bishop served as a graduate assistant at SDSU under head coach Mark Ekeland during the 1998 and 1999 seasons. In his first season as a head coach, Bishop led Huron University to the South Dakota Intercollegiate Conference title in 2000.

A 1994 graduate of Jamestown College, Bishop earned NAIA All-America honors during the 1992 and 1994 seasons as an infielder.

THE ROSTER: The 2018 SDSU baseball roster features 33 players from six different states and one Canadian provinice. Of the 33 players, 12 are from South Dakota, 10 are from lowa and seven hail from Minnesota. Arizona, Washington and Wisconsin are represented by one player each, as is Manitoba.
