BROOKINGS, S.D. — After having its schedule altered several times due to inclement weather and playing its first 36 games of the season outside of Brookings, the South Dakota State University baseball team will play its first official home games of the 2018 campaign this weekend by hosting Omaha in a three-game Summit League series.

The series opener is slated for 3 p.m. Friday at Erv Huether Field. Games Saturday and Sunday are set for 1 p.m. starts. All three games will be broadcast locally on KJQ 910 AM with Tyler Merriam calling the play-by-play, and also available for listening through the Jackrabbits All-Access media portal at GoJacks.com. Radio coverage begins 15 minutes prior to scheduled first pitch each day. Live stats can be viewed at GoJacksLive.com.

The Jackrabbits enter the week in second place in the Summit League standings with a 10-8 mark in conference play. SDSU has won nine of its last 12 Summit contests, including winning two of three games at Fort Wayne last weekend.

Omaha, meanwhile, is a game behind the Jackrabbits at 9-9 in league play. The Mavericks, 14-25 overall, dropped two of three games last weekend at North Dakota State to fall out of a tie with SDSU.

THE SERIES: South Dakota State and Omaha will play for the 159th time, when the two squads meet in Friday's series opener. The Mavericks hold an 82-75-1 lead in the series that dates back to 1949. The two programs were longtime rivals in the North Central Conference before both moved to Division I and The Summit League.

SDSU won all six meetings last season and have claimed nine of the last 12 meetings dating back to 2016. However, the Mavericks claimed the first series of this season by winning two of three games March 30-31 in Omaha. The Mavericks swept a March 30 twinbill by scores of 5-3 and 8-5 before SDSU claimed the series finale, 6-2, behind a 10-strikeout performance by Tyler Olmstead.

PRESEASON POLL: The Jackrabbit baseball team was picked to finish second in the 2018 Summit League race, according to a poll of league coaches released Feb. 8.

SDSU received 20 points and one first-place vote, finishing behind defending champion Oral Roberts, which received the other five first-place votes and 25 total points. North Dakota State completed the top half of the poll with 17 points.

Rounding out the second half of the poll were Western Illinois (14 points), Omaha (9) and Fort Wayne (5).

The Jackrabbits, who return six position starters, will attempt to qualify for the Summit League postseason tournament for the ninth time in 10 years. The 2018 Summit League Baseball Championship is slated for May 23-26 in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

In addition, SDSU shortstop Tony Kjolsing was selected as a Summit League Player to Watch. A senior from Chaska, Minnesota, Kjolsing batted .291 with four home runs and 21 runs batted in while playing in 32 games during the 2017 season.

SUMMIT LEAGUE SUCCESS: South Dakota State has been a consistent winner in The Summit League since it became a league member a decade ago. In 10-plus seasons as a member of The Summit League, the Jackrabbits have compiled a 158-123 (.562 winning percentage) in conference games. SDSU has posted a .500 or better record in league play seven times and has made eight appearances in the four-team postseason tournament out of the nine years it has been eligible.

The Jackrabbits shared a Summit League regular season title in 2010 and won the Summit postseason tournament in 2013.

LAST WEEKEND: The Jackrabbits moved into sole possession of second place in the Summit League standings by winning two of three games in a road series April 27-29 at Fort Wayne.

Game 1: South Dakota State 8, Fort Wayne 6

South Dakota State scored multiple runs in each of the middle three innings en route to an 8-6 series-opening victory over Fort Wayne.

Trailing 3-1, the Jackrabbits tied the game with a pair of runs in the top of the fourth. After Newt Johnson and Josh Falk opened the inning by being hit by pitches, Landon Badger singled home Johnson and Derek Hackman followed with his second consecutive run-scoring hit to plate Falk.

SDSU gained the lead for good with a three-run fifth. After loading the bases with nobody out, Johnson came through with a sacrifice fly to score Anthony Schneider with the go-ahead run and Falk plated two more with a double to left field.

Schneider provided the final tally for SDSU with a two-run home run in the sixth. It was his fourth home run of the season and staked the Jackrabbits to an 8-3 lead.

Although he wasn't as sharp as his first outing of the season against the Mastodons when he fanned a career-high 13, Brady Stover was credited with his third win of the season after striking out eight over five innings. The sophomore left-hander allowed a run on a sacrifice fly in the second inning, then gave up a two-run homer to Jacob Dickson in the bottom of the third for Fort Wayne's lone lead of the day.

Stover walked five and surrendered three hits before giving way to Derek Feige. Fort Wayne touched Feige for a pair of runs in the sixth on a walk, two hits and a balk, then pulled to within 8-6 on a solo home run by Robert Young III in the eighth.

Alex Marro pitched a 1-2-3 ninth to earn his fourth save of the season.

SDSU out-hit the Mastodons, 12-7. Tony Kjolsing was 3-for-5, while Hackman, who opened the Jackrabbit scoring with a two-out RBI single in the second inning, and Nick Smith each tallied two hits.

Fort Wayne's seven hits were spread among seven different players.

Game 2: Fort Wayne 6, South Dakota State 5

The South Dakota State University baseball team had its comeback bid fall just short in a 6-5 loss at Fort Wayne on April 28 at Mastodon Field.

Trailing 5-0, the Jackrabbits got on the board in the top of the fifth on a two-run double by Newt Johnson that scored Anthony Schneider and Tony Kjolsing.

Fort Wayne got a run back in the home half of the fifth on an RBI single by Mike Snyder, but the Jackrabbits responded with two more runs in the sixth as Kjolsing came up with a two-out, two-run single that drove in both Landon Badger and Schneider.

As Jackrabbit reliever Bryce Johnson kept the Mastodons off the board with 3 2/3 scoreless innings, SDSU made it a one-run game in the eighth. The first two Jackrabbit batters reached and moved into scoring position on a sacrifice bunt by Ian Cote. Schneider then lifted a fly ball to left field that scored Badger to make the score 6-5, but the trail runner on the play was thrown out at third base after Badger crossed home.

SDSU again placed the first two batters of the ninth inning on base as Kjolsing drew a leadoff walk and Nick Smith singled. However, Fort Wayne pitcher Cameron Boyd induced

a double-play grounder and notched his only strikeout of the game to end the Jackrabbit threat and the ball game.

Fort Wayne took advantage of three wild pitches to score twice in the second inning, then added three runs in the third inning against the Jackrabbit bullpen to build a 5-0 lead. Dylan Wilbert plated the first two runs in the third with a single, while Snyder was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded to force in the other run.

Mastodon starter Damian Helm struck out five and walked two over six innings to earn the win. Boyd pitched the final three innings to pick up the save.

The Jackrabbits held a 10-9 edge in hits as Badger went 3-for-4 to lead the way. Schneider, Smith and Newt Johnson each added two hits. Brady Hettinger and Zak Kellogg each tallied two hits to lead Fort Wayne.

Game 3: South Dakota State 11, Fort Wayne 5

Newt Johnson drove in three runs and Anthony Schneider scored four times to lead South Dakota State to an 11-5, Summit League series-clinching victory over Fort Wayne.

SDSU led wire to wire, jumping out to a 2-0 first-inning lead on Johnson's two-run single to left field, which came after Johnson's at-bat was extended by a dropped foul ball. Schneider and Nick Smith scored on the play.

The Mastodons scored in the bottom of the second to pull to within 2-1, but SDSU scored the next five runs with a three-run fourth inning and two-run sixth. The fourth inning was highlighted by a sacrifice fly by Smith, which was sandwiched around runs scoring on an error and wild pitch. In the sixth, Schneider plated Skyler Wenninger with a double to left-center, then scored on a sacrifice fly by Tony Kjolsing.

Jackrabbit starter Brady Moxham picked up his first win in an SDSU uniform by pitching six strong innings. The sophomore right-hander from Oakville, Montana, struck out two, walked two and allowed two runs on four hits.

Alex Marro finished the game with two scoreless innings, striking out two.

SDSU continued to put runs on the board in the late innings, putting two across in the seventh, followed by single runs in the eighth and ninth. Singles by Wenninger and pinch-hitter Logan Holtz plated the seventh inning runs, while Gus Steiger recorded a run-scoring single in the eighth.

Johnson accounted for the final run of the game for SDSU with the team's third sacrifice fly of the game in the ninth.

The Jackrabbits held a 14-10 advantage in hits and were led by Kjolsing's 3-for-5 afternoon at the plate. Schneider, Josh Falk and Steiger each notched two hits. Zak Kellogg was one of three Fort Wayne players with two hits and drove in a pair of runs.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: South Dakota State featured the Summit League Player of the Week in its lineup twice during the month of April.

Sophomore first baseman Josh Falk was named Summit League Player of the Week on April 16 after helping lead the Jackrabbits to a doubleheader sweep of North Dakota State with an impressive day at the plate.

In the April 12 twinbill in Sioux Falls, Falk went a combined 7-for-10 and homered in each game. In the opener, he tallied three hits with two runs batted in and a pair of runs scored. A sophomore from Minnetonka, Minnesota, Falk was 4-for-5 in Game 2, belting the go-ahead two-run home run in the sixth inning en route to a 12-9 Jackrabbit victory.

Falk's totals included a 1.300 slugging percentage as he recorded his team-best ninth and 10th multi-hit games of the season and extended his hitting streak to six games.

Outfielder Phil Velez was the first Jackrabbit honored as Summit League Baseball Player of the Week, earning the award April 9 after helping lead the Jackrabbits to a weekend sweep of Fort Wayne.

In two games, Velez batted .857 (6-for-7) and drove in seven runs, highlighted by a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning of the series finale April 8 in Joplin, Missouri. A senior from Des Moines, Iowa, Velez went 4-for-4 in the second game of an April 7 doubleheader, then was 2-for-3 with a career-high six runs batted in the next day. He also tallied a 1.429 slugging percentage, scored four times and threw out a runner at home plate during the series.

LET'S PLAY TWO: When the 2018 Jackrabbit baseball schedule was first put together, SDSU had one true doubleheader — March 10 at Northern Colorado — on the docket.

Fast forward to late April and the Jackrabbits played their seventh doubleheader of the season April 20 against Oral Roberts thanks to inclement weather that seemingly followed them wherever they went over the first two months of the 2018 campaign. SDSU played a doubleheader in each of the first five Summit League series in which it managed to play more than one game.

In those seven doubleheaders the squad has played, the Jackrabbits have turned in a 5-9 record. SDSU was swept in each of its first four doubleheaders, then turned the tables with sweeps of Fort Wayne (April 7) and North Dakota State (April 12). The Jacks and Oral Roberts split an April 20 doubleheader in Council Bluffs, Iowa.

SDSU has yet to play a true home game this season due to the extended wintry weather that has affected the Upper Midwest this spring. Instead, the Jacks were forced to move home series to Joplin, Missouri; Omaha, Nebraska/Council Bluffs, Iowa, and Sioux Falls.

K ZONE: Two of the three pitchers who have held starting roles for the Jackrabbits in Summit League play are averaging better than a strikeout an inning.

Sophomore left-hander Brady Stover has recorded 58 strikeouts in only 38 2/3 innings pitched. In an April 7 start versus Fort Wayne, Stover set a new Jackrabbit single-game mark in the Division I era with 13 strikeouts. He allowed only one hit — an infield single — over 6 1/3 innings.

Two starts later, Stover fanned 10 Oral Roberts batters in 6 2/3 shutout innings.

Stover's current pace of 13.50 strikeouts per nine innings pitched ranks seventh in NCAA Division I this season and is ahead of the SDSU single-season record of 12.86 set by Bob Ehrke in 1953.

Sophomore right-hander Tyler Olmstead also has more strikeouts than innings pitched. Olmstead, who fanned a career-high 10 batters in a March 31 start at Omaha, has since upped his season strikeout total to 44 in 41 1/3 innings.

SDSU's other weekend starter, Brady Moxham, is just off the pace with 49 strikeouts in 55 2/3 innings pitched.

Out of the bullpen, senior Derek Feige has struck out 24 batters in only 19 1/3 innings. Austin Suhr (22 strikeouts in 22 2/3 innings) and Otis Roby (12 K's in 12 1/3 IP) also are averaging nearly one strikeout per inning pitched.

ELITE COMPANY: Prior to Brady Stover's 13-strikeout performance April 7 against Fort Wayne, the SDSU record for strikeouts in a Division I game was 12, and was shared by Robby Apo (2006), Caleb Thielbar (twice in 2009), Blake Treinen (2010) and Layne Somsen (2013). Thielbar, Treinen and Somsen all have since gone on to pitch in the Major Leagues.

SMITH HEATING UP: Nick Smith has made the most of his return to the Jackrabbit lineup after battling through injuries the first two months of the season.

Filling the designated hitter role out of the No. 3 spot in the lineup, Smith put together a team-best 14-game hitting streak that was snapped in the April 29 series finale at Fort Wayne. During his 14-game streak, Smith batted .431 (25-for-58) with seven runs batted in and 13 runs scored, raising his season average to a team-best .344.

A junior from Chanhassen, Minnesota, Smith earned second-team all-Summit League honors in 2017 as a utility player after leading the team with a .340 batting average and sharing the team lead with two triples.

JOHNSON CONNECTS TWICE: Senior infielder Newt Johnson became the first SDSU player this season to homer twice in the same game as he connected on a pair of round-trippers in the first game of a doubleheader March 17 at Oral Roberts. It was the second two-homer game of Johnson's career, with the first coming on Feb. 27, 2016, versus Virginia Commonwealth in a game played in Wilmington, North Carolina.

Prior to Johnson's two-homer game, Anthony Schneider was the last Jackrabbit to homer twice in a game — March 7, 2017, at Minnesota.

The Rapid City native is tied for fourth in The Summit League with five home runs — all of which have come against left-handed pitchers. Johnson also leads the Jackrabbits and ranks third in The Summit League with 32 runs batted in.

Johnson has reached base safely in 29 consecutive games, which is the longest streak by a Jackrabbit this season.

GRAND OLD TIME: Phil Velez's game-winning grand slam against Fort Wayne on April 8 was the second grand slam hit by a Jackrabbit this season.

Anthony Schneider connected on a pinch-hit grand slam in SDSU's March 2 game at Southeast Missouri State.

MARRO IN THE NINTH: Junior right-hander Alex Marro has taken over the closer's role in the Jackrabbit bullpen in recent weeks.

Marro has not allowed a run over his last five appearances, covering 6 1/3 innings. He has recorded three of his team-high four saves over that span, during which he has given up only one hit and one walk, while striking out eight.

His streak began by pitching a combined three scoreless innings in an April 12 doubleheader against North Dakota State in Sioux Falls. He pitched one scoreless inning in the opener, then earned the save by striking out four in two innings in the nightcap.

Marro also notched saves April 20 versus Oral Roberts and April 27 at Fort Wayne.

PRESSING THE ISSUE: South Dakota State enters this weekend's series against Omaha as the Summit League leader in stolen bases. The Jackrabbits took over the league lead with 51 stolen bases after swiping a combined 11 bases in a three-game series last weekend at Fort Wayne. SDSU matched a Division I-era single-game high with seven stolen bases in the April 29 series finale.

Individually, Tony Kjolsing ranks second among Summit League players with 15 stolen bases (in 19 attempts). Newt Johnson ranks second on the team with nine steals, while Landon Badger and Anthony Schneider each have tallied seven stolen bases.

COACH BISHOP: Rob Bishop, who has guided college baseball teams to more than 500 victories, was named head baseball coach at South Dakota State University on Aug. 1, 2016. Bishop is the ninth head coach in program history and the fourth in the Division I era of Jackrabbit baseball.

Overall, Bishop holds a 587-370-1 record (.613 winning percentage) as a collegiate head coach, including a 38-48 mark with the Jackrabbits. Prior to coming to SDSU, he spent six years at NCAA Division II member Montana State University-Billings, where he led the Yellowjackets to back-to-back Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season titles in 2015 and 2016, attaining the program's first-ever 30-win season with a 30-20 record in 2016.

His squads also were honored as the top academic team in the GNAC each of his last three seasons.

Previously, Bishop spent 10 years at Miles City Community College in Montana, where his teams won MonDak conference championships every year. His squads also claimed five consecutive junior college region titles and a Northwest District championship in 2007 to advance to the NJCAA Division II College World Series. He also served as athletic director the last five years of his tenure at Miles City.

Bishop served as a graduate assistant at SDSU under head coach Mark Ekeland during the 1998 and 1999 seasons. In his first season as a head coach, Bishop led Huron University to the South Dakota Intercollegiate Conference title in 2000.

A 1994 graduate of Jamestown College, Bishop earned NAIA All-America honors during the 1992 and 1994 seasons as an infielder.


