ARENA FACTS

Frost Arena, named in honor of former South Dakota State athletic director and coach, R.B. "Jack" Frost, opened Feb. 2, 1973. On Feb. 11, 1989, 9,456 fans attended the SDSU-Augustana men's basketball game, setting the arena's attendance record. Improvements to the arena over the years reduced the seating capacity to approximately 6,100.

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The South Dakota State football team completes a two-game homestand and wraps up the first half of the Missouri Valley Football Conference slate by hosting Youngstown State this afternoon.

SDSU, ranked eighth in this week's Stats Perform FCS?Top 25, rolled past Western Illinois, 45-10, in its home opener March 6 to improve to 2-1 both overall and in the MVFC.

Youngstown State has yet to crack the win column under first-year coach Doug Phillips. The Penguins dropped to 0-3, with all their losses to ranked opponents, with a 30-22 home setback to Southern Illinois last week.

THE SERIES: Today's game will mark the 22nd meeting on the gridiron between SDSU and Youngstown State, a series that dates back to the 1942 season. The Jackrabbits hold a 14-7 series advantage on the strength of winning 10 of the 12 matchups between the two programs as members of the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

SDSU has won the last two meetings, including posting a 36-7 Hobo Day victory in the last Jackrabbit-Penguin matchup at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium on Oct. 13, 2018.

In last season's game, Oct. 12, 2019, at Stambaugh Stadium in Youngstown, Ohio, the Jackrabbits scored 35 second-half points to overcome a slow start and post a 38-28 victory. Quarterback J'Bore Gibbs sparked the comeback by passing for one touchdown and rushing for two more, including a game-clinching 63-yard TD run in the final minute.

HOME OPENERS: With its 45-10 victory over Western Illinois last week, the Jackrabbits upped their record in home openers under head coach John Stiegelmeier to 20-4. SDSU has now won its last 10 home openers, including all five at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

ANOTHER MILESTONE WIN: South Dakota State's March 6 win over Western Illinois marked the program's 100th victory since joining the Missouri Valley Football Conference at the start of the 2008 season. Overall, the Jackrabbits have posted a 100-55 record (.645 winning record) in that span, including a 68-31 mark in MVFC games.

SDSU has not finished below .500 in league play in any of its 12 full seasons as an MVFC member, making it the only current member (outside of newcomer North Dakota) since 2008 to be able to make that claim.

Since moving to the FCS ranks at the start of the 2004 season, the Jackrabbits have posted a 126-73 overall record (.633 winning percentage). SDSU spent its first four years at the FCS level as a member of the Great West Football Conference.

SDSU has turned in a winning record in 14 of 16 full seasons as an FCS member.

RANKINGS STREAK: With its appearance in this week's STATS Perform FCS Poll, SDSU has now appeared in the top 25 of 109 consecutive media polls dating back to October 2012.

FAST STARTS: SDSU has scored on its opening drive in each of its three games this season for a total of 17 points. Cole Frahm kicked a field goal to open the scoring Feb. 19 at Northern Iowa, while Jaxon Janke caught an 18-yard touchdown on the first drive last week at North Dakota.

Last week against Western Illinois, quarterback Mark Gronowski capped a nine-play, 81-yard drive with a 22-yard touchdown run.

The Jackrabbit defense has yet to allow any points on the opponents' opening drives of games this season.

BALANCING THE ATTACK: One week after having a pair of receivers top the 100-yard mark in a game, South Dakota State turned to a ground-based attack March 6 against Western Illinois, resulting in a pair of 100-yard rushers — both first-year freshmen.

Quarterback Mark Gronowski led the way with 120 yards on only four carries, including touchdown runs of 22 and 80 yards. Running back Isaiah Davis carried nine times for 118 yards, including a 40-yard touchdown run.

The Jackrabbits finished with 347 rushing yards — their most since a 369-yard performance against Drake on Sept. 14, 2019. That also was the last time SDSU had a pair of 100-yard rushers in the same game as Pierre Strong, Jr. (11-129) and C.J. Wilson (10-117) were the Jackrabbit tandem.

CAPTAINS: Leading the Jackrabbit football team on the field and in the locker room are five captains:

Logan Backhaus, Sr., linebacker, Spirit Lake, Iowa;

Wes Genant, Sr., offensive lineman, Parkston, South Dakota.;

Michael Griffin II, Sr., safety, Cottage Grove, Minnesota;

Pierre Strong, Jr.; Jr.; running back, Little Rock, Arkansas, and

Preston Tetzlaff, Sr., linebacker, Brookings, South Dakota.

Backhaus is in his second season as a team captain. All four other captains are in their first seasons in the role.

A LOOK AHEAD: The Jackrabbits continue home action by hosting Youngstown State on March 13. Kickoff is slated for 2 p.m.

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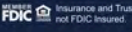

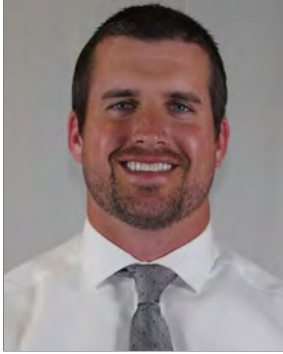

Assistant Coaches



JIMMY ROGERS

- Assistant Head Coach
- Co-Defensive Coordinator/
Linebackers

Jimmy Rogers, a former standout defensive player for South Dakota State, returned to his alma mater in June 2013 to coach the linebackers. He added co-defensive coordinator duties to his coaching responsibilities following the 2018 season and was elevated to assistant head coach after the 2019 campaign.

Under Rogers' guidance, Christian Rozeboom burst onto the Football Championship landscape in 2016 by being named MVFC Freshman of the Year and finishing second in the balloting for the STATS FCS Jerry Rice Award as the top freshman in the Football Championship Subdivision after tallying a team-best 132 tackles. In addition, fellow linebackers Jesse Bobbit and Dallas Brown capped strong careers in 2016. A second-team all-league selection, Bobbit ranked second on the squad with 110 tackles, while Brown led the team with three interceptions.

Rozeboom anchored the Jackrabbit linebacking corps over the next three seasons as he registered 100-plus tackles each year in becoming the SDSU career tackles leader with 475. He also earned first-team all-MVFC honors four times and was a three-time All-America selection. Rozeboom would later sign a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Rams. Rogers has now coached a 100-tackle linebacker in each of his seven seasons leading the position group.

As a player, Rogers lettered for the Jackrabbits from 2006-09 and was a two-time all-conference selection. He led both the team and the Great West Football Conference with 110 tackles in 2007 as SDSU claimed the league title.



BRIAN BERGSTROM

- Co-Defensive Coordinator/
Safeties

Brian Bergstrom was promoted to co-defensive coordinator for the South Dakota State University football team in 2019 and continues to coach the Jackrabbits' safeties — a position he has held since he was hired in March 2017.

Bergstrom brought with him more than a decade of collegiate coaching experience to Brookings, including stops at several schools

in his home state of Minnesota.

During the 2017 season, Bergstrom coached a safeties unit that was credited with more than 200 tackles and seven interceptions. Seniors Chris Balster (69 tackles) and Nick Farina (64 tackles) ranked third and fourth, respectively, on the team in stops, while reserve Lorenzo Williams tallied a team-best four interceptions. Balster was an honorable mention all-Missouri Valley Football Conference selection.

The 2018 season was another successful one for the Jackrabbits despite having to replace both of its starting safeties from the previous year. Transfer Brandon Snyder (58 tackles, 2 interceptions) was named to the MVFC All-Newcomer Team in his lone season with the Jackrabbits, while senior Makiah Slade (42 tackles, 2 pass breakups) held the free safety position. As a group, SDSU's safeties registered five of the team's 17 interceptions.

In taking on an expanded role in 2019, Bergstrom helped direct a Jackrabbit defense that ranked in the top three of the Missouri Valley Football Conference in seven different defensive categories, including a second-place showing in total defense (294.8 yards per game) and third in scoring defense (16.7 ppg).

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Assistant Coaches



JASON ECK

• Offensive Coordinator/ Offensive Line

Jason Eck, who was honored as the 2019 recipient of the Football Championship Subdivision Assistant Coach of the Year Award by the American Football Coaches Association, enters his second season as offensive coordinator and is in his fifth season on the South Dakota State football coaching staff.

A 21-year veteran of collegiate coaching,

Eck arrived in Brookings in 2016 as offensive line coach, a position he continues to hold. Following his first season, he was promoted to run game coordinator before taking the reins of the entire offense in 2019.

During his first season with the Jackrabbits, SDSU featured one of the most prolific offenses in the Missouri Valley Football Conference and the Football Championship Subdivision, posting averages of 33.2 points and 437.5 yards of total offense per game. In league contests, SDSU ranked second out of 10 teams in allowing only 11 total sacks and ranked first in five different offensive categories.

Under Eck's guidance, junior center Jacob Ohnesorge earned first-team all-MVFC honors and also was a third-team All-America selection by HERO Sports in 2016. Left tackle Charlie Harmon received honorable mention all-MVFC recognition for the first of two consecutive seasons. SDSU again posted big offensive numbers in 2017, including setting single-season records for scoring (521 points), total offense (6,141 yards) and total offense per game (438.6 yards), the last of which had stood for 66 years (437.7 yards in 1951).



LUKE SCHLEUSNER

• Passing Game Coordinator/ Wide Receivers

Luke Schleusner joined the Jackrabbit coaching staff in February 2014, and added the title of passing game coordinator in 2019. After serving as tight ends coach for his first six seasons at SDSU, Schleusner has taken over coaching the wide receivers for the 2020-21 campaign.

During his first season at SDSU, in 2014, Schleusner directed a group that complemented the passing game and provided strong run blocking for a Jackrabbit offense that averaged 31.8 points and 435.1 yards of total offense per game.

In 2015, the Jackrabbits featured the top tight end tandem in the Missouri Valley Football Conference as both Dallas Goedert and Cam Jones earned postseason accolades. A first-team all-MVFC selection, Goedert finished second on the team with 26 receptions for 484 yards and three touchdowns. Jones, an honorable mention all-league honoree, added 24 catches for 298 yards.

Goedert emerged as the top tight end in the Football Championship Subdivision during the 2016 campaign, recording a school-record 92 receptions for 1,293 yards and 11 touchdowns en route to becoming a unanimous All-America selection. He repeated as a unanimous All-American in 2017 after posting his second consecutive 1,000-yard season, recording team highs of 72 receptions and 1,111 receiving yards. Goedert went on to be selected in the second round of the NFL Draft by the defending Super Bowl champion Philadelphia Eagles.



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Assistant Coaches



ROB ERICKSON

- Special Teams Coordinator
- Cornerbacks

Rob Erickson joined the South Dakota State football coaching staff in March 2020 and will serve as the program's special teams coordinator, as well as coach the squad's cornerbacks.

Erickson has coached at the collegiate level for more than 15 years, including the last five at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. He

served as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach for the NCAA Division III program that went a combined 56-9 en route to three national semifinal appearances, including a berth in the championship game in 2019.

His defensive units at UWW twice ranked in the top three for sacks and ranked second in the country for scoring in 2018 with an average of 7.1 points allowed per game. Erickson was honored as the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Assistant Coach of the Year in 2016.

Prior to his tenure at UWW, Erickson served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at his alma mater, UW-Platteville, from 2008-14. His teams recorded five shutouts in his seven seasons on the sidelines and made an appearance in the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs in 2013.

Erickson began his collegiate coaching career as defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach at UW-Stevens Point from 2003-04. He moved on to Aurora University in Illinois as defensive coordinator for three seasons (2005-07), where his squads led the conference in turnovers forced in both 2006 and 2007.



JOHN JOHNSON

- Running Backs

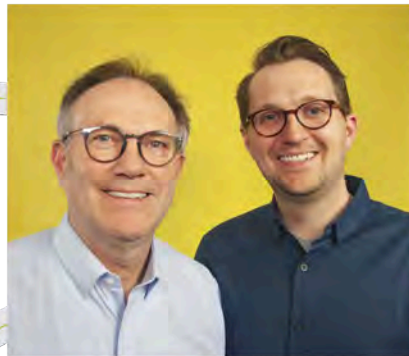
John Johnson rejoined the South Dakota State University football coaching staff in the spring of 2020 and will again mentor the Jackrabbits' running backs.

Johnson previously served as the team's running backs coach from 2016-17 before embarking on a coaching stint at the professional level with the Atlanta Legends of the short-lived Alliance of American Football.

In his first tour at SDSU, Johnson worked with an experienced and versatile group of running backs. In 2016, Brady Mengarelli earned second-team all-Missouri Valley Football Conference honors after rushing for a team-high 754 yards and adding an additional 333 yards in the passing game. The Jackrabbits ranked third in the 10-team league for rushing with an average of 181.9 yards per game in eight league contests and led the MVFC in both scoring and total offense.

The 2017 Jackrabbits reached the Football Championship Subdivision semifinals for the first time in program history with a running game that complemented a potent passing attack. Mengarelli again was an all-MVFC honoree being one of four players on the team to top 1,000 all-purpose yards, including a team-best 849 rushing yards. Fellow running backs Isaac Wallace (516 yards, 5 touchdowns) and Mikey Daniel (482 yards, 11 touchdowns) combined for 998 yards and 16 touchdowns.

As a player, Johnson was a three-year letterman at fullback at Oklahoma State and was a member of three teams that played in bowl games. He completed his playing career in 2008 at Ouachita Baptist.



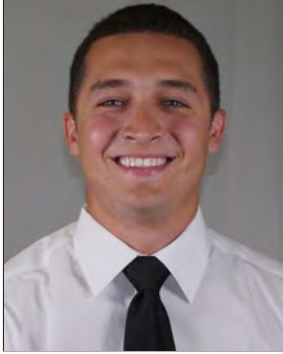
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Assistant Coaches



ZACH LUJAN

• Quarterbacks

Zach Lujan (pronounced LOO-hahn), who helped lead the Jackrabbits to three consecutive Football Championship Subdivision playoff berths as a player, is in his third season as an assistant coach on the offensive side of the ball at South Dakota State University. Lujan has served as the team's quarterbacks coach since 2019, after serving as running backs coach his first season.

He also has taken on the duties of recruiting coordinator in 2020.

As he took over coaching duties for the position he played collegiately, Lujan worked with three different quarterbacks who started — and won — games for the Jackrabbits in 2019. Redshirt freshman J'Bore Gibbs started six games before suffering a season-ending injury in late October, but earned a spot on the Missouri Valley Football Conference All-Newcomer Team after passing for 10 touchdowns and averaging 191 yards of total offense per game.

True freshman Keaton Heide started the final five games of the season, including the team's Football Championship Subdivision playoff contest, and tallied a team-best 1,072 passing yards with seven touchdowns while completing 66.9 percent (85-of-127) of his passes. In addition, Kanin Nelson started two nonconference games in September en route to 293 passing yards and three touchdowns in 2019.

In 2018, Lujan worked with a deep and talented group of running backs that contributed to a rushing attack that averaged 230.1 yards per game — the highest total in the Division I era of Jackrabbit football (since 2004).



RYAN OLSON

• Tight Ends

Ryan Olson joined the South Dakota State football coaching staff in January 2021, filling the role of tight ends coach.

Olson has coached at the collegiate level for nearly a decade, most recently serving as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Bemidji State. Over three seasons (2017-19), the Beavers averaged 205 yards rushing and 34.3 points per game.

Bemidji State led the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in fewest sacks allowed in 2019 with 11, while attempting 335 passes.

During his tenure at Bemidji State, Olson mentored seven first-team all-conference selections, five all-region honorees and three All-Americans. He also filled the role of recruiting coordinator.

Olson began his collegiate coaching career in 2013 as a graduate assistant at Missouri Western State. After one season he was elevated to a full-time position as tight ends and tackles coach before furthering his graduate studies as a member of the offensive coaching staff first at Iowa State (2015) and Buffalo (2016). He received his master's in educational leadership from Iowa State in 2016.

A native of Stoughton, Wisconsin, Olson was an all-conference selection at right tackle for NCAA Division III powerhouse Wisconsin-Whitewater. He was a member of national championship teams in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and played on squads that compiled a 58-2 record in his four seasons, including posting a 45-game winning streak.



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Assistant Coaches



CHRISTIAN SMITH

• Defensive Line

Christian Smith is in his fourth season as a member of the South Dakota State football coaching staff and will again oversee the development of the entire defensive line in 2020. He mentored the defensive tackles each of his first two seasons before moving to an expanded role in 2019.

Smith mentored a Jackrabbit defensive line in 2019 that increased its sack total by 17 from the previous season, improving from 20 in

2018 to 37. SDSU ranked second among Missouri Valley Football Conference teams in total defense (294.8 yards per game) and third in scoring defense (16.7 points per game), rushing defense (128.9 yards per game) and passing defense (165.8 yards per game).

Individually in 2019, senior defensive end Ryan Earith repeated on the all-MVFC Second Team and freshman defensive end Quinton Hicks was named to the MVFC All-Newcomer Team. Hicks also received recognition on a pair of Football Championship Subdivision Freshman All-America squads.

In 2018, Smith worked with a defensive tackles group primarily made up of first- and second-year players. Redshirt freshman nose tackle Krockett Krolkowski was named to the Missouri Valley Football Conference All-Newcomer Team, as well as freshman All-America squads selected by HERO Sports (first team) and Phill Steele (second team).

As a unit, the Jackrabbits' interior defensive linemen combined for 83 total tackles, including 20 tackles for loss and six sacks.



SPENCER ERICKSON

• Assistant Defensive Line

Spencer Erickson is in his second season as a full-time member of the South Dakota State University football coaching staff, and has added the duties of director of player personnel for the 2020 season.

He was elevated to assistant defensive line coach in 2019 after serving as defensive quality control his first season with the program in 2018. In making the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs for the eighth consecutive

season, the 2019 Jackrabbits upped their sacks total by 17 — from 20 in 2018 to 37 a year later.

Under Erickson's guidance, defensive end Ryan Earith was a second-team all-Missouri Valley Football Conference selection in 2019, and freshman end Quinton Hicks earned a spot on the MVFC All-Newcomer Team and recognition on a pair of Freshman All-America teams.

As defensive quality control in 2018, Erickson oversaw organization of the scout team offense and assisted with video breakdown for a Jackrabbit program that finished second in the Missouri Valley Football Conference and reached the semifinals of Football Championship Subdivision playoffs for the second year in a row.

Erickson was a part of a successful football program at Wisconsin-Oshkosh before moving on to Bemidji State for the 2017 season. With the Beavers, Erickson coached the outside linebackers and mentored two players who earned all-Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference honors: touchdowns allowed, ranked fifth

2020-21 Jackrabbits Football

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Football Facilities

South Dakota State University football features some of the top playing and practice facilities within the Football Championship Subdivision.

Jackrabbit Football moved into a new home in September of 2016 with the completion of Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

The stadium, which constructed in phases on the site of SDSU's previous home field, Coughlin-Alumni Stadium, seats 19,340 spectators and cost \$65 million to build. The stadium is being funded through private gifts and long-term revenue streams, including concessions and suite, loge box and ticket sales. Bonds are financing nearly two-thirds of the project's construction, with the remaining dollars coming from private support. Lead gifts totaling \$12.5 million from Sioux Falls banker Dana Dykhouse and philanthropist T. Denny Sanford were announced in October 2013.

The stadium project was approved by the state Legislature during the 2014 session and signed into law by Gov. Dennis Daugaard. Construction began in the fall of 2014, with the east and south stands completed prior to the start of the 2015 season. Construction of the west tower and installation of a new AstroTurf playing surface were completed in August 2016.

The stadium officially opened Sept. 8, 2016, featuring a concert by country music superstars Luke Bryan, Little Big Town and Lee Brice as part of the Jacks Bash opening weekend. The first football game was two days later, on Sept. 10, when the Jackrabbits defeated Drake, 56-28.

Among the features of Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium is the largest video board within the Football Championship Subdivision. Manufactured by Brookings-based Daktronics Inc., the video board measures 148 feet wide and 84 feet high, and provides 3,150 square feet of display.

Also housed within the stadium is the Great South Dakotans Wall, which honors the achievements of SDSU's most accomplished alumni and supporters.

Several areas that commemorate the tradition of Jackrabbit Football are featured inside Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium, including the Coughlin-Alumni Lounge which features an area providing distinctive views of the campus.

Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium was designed by Kansas City-based Crawford Architects, with the construction firm JE Dunn serving as the project manager at risk and Henry Carlson Company of Sioux Falls serving as general contractor.

Located in the north end zone of Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium is the Dykhouse Student-Athlete Center, which serves as the headquarters for Jackrabbit Football. Construction on the Dykhouse Student-Athlete Center began in the fall of 2008 and was completed in 2010, marking the first stage of a master plan to dramatically modernize athletic facilities at SDSU.

A number of the coaches' offices in the building contains windows offering views onto the field. The building's interior includes team meeting rooms with technology for editing and viewing game film.

The Jackrabbit football team's locker room is located on the lower level of the Dykhouse Student-Athlete Center. Also on the lower level of the building are two academic center spaces equipped with study areas, computers, tutors, and other educational aids for all SDSU teams.

The Dykhouse Student-Athlete Center is connected to another state-of-the-art facility in the Sanford-Jackrabbit Athletic Complex. Recent renovations have provided additional space for sports medicine and strength and conditioning.

The \$32 million Sanford-Jackrabbit Athletic Complex opened in the fall of 2014. The multi-use facility features an indoor practice and competition space of more than 149,000 square feet and a human performance area of nearly 15,000 square feet. One of the only eight-lane, 300-meter tracks in the region is housed in the facility, along with 100 yards of synthetic turf. The building measures 61 feet high at midfield.

The facility dedication for the SJAC was held on Oct. 11, 2014.

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FCS Polls

CAA Football and the Missouri Valley Football Conference continued to flex their muscles in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25, which was announced Monday, March 8.

The two conferences combined for five of the first six spots and 12 overall in the national media rankings. James Madison (3-0) remained No. 1 and one of five ranked CAA teams after it escaped with a close conference win at Elon on March 6. The MVFC again matched its all-time high with seven ranked teams, led by No. 3 North Dakota (3-0).

At least one team from the CAA or MVFC, and sometimes both conferences, have advanced to the FCS championship game in the last 18 seasons.

Weber State (1-0), the three-time defending Big Sky champion, held the No. 2 spot for the second straight week. Rounding out the top five are MVFC members Northern Iowa and North Dakota State.

Other ranked teams from the Missouri Valley Football Conference include South Dakota State (eighth), Southern Illinois (tied for 10th), South Dakota (21st) and Illinois State (22nd).

A national panel selects the Stats Perform FCS Top 25, which this spring includes only schools that have committed to playing a regular schedule. A first-place vote is worth 25 points, a second-place vote 24 points, all the way down to one point for a 25th-place vote.

Offensive Player of the Week: Mark Gronowski, 6-3, 200, Fr., QB, South Dakota State (Naperville, Ill.)

Gronowski accounted for four first-half touchdowns, running for two and passing for two, in South Dakota's State 45-10 home win over Western Illinois on March 6. He opened the scoring with a 22-yard touchdown run. In the second quarter, he sandwiched an 80-yard touchdown run around TD passes of 44 and 12 yards to Jadon Janke and Mason Leighton, respectively.

For the game, Gronowski was 12-of-19 passing for 178 yards and carried four times for 120 yards.

Defensive Player of the Week: Spencer Cuvelier, 6-3, 245, Jr., LB, Northern Iowa (Cresco, Iowa)

Cuvelier notched 11 tackles, two tackles for loss and a strip-sack to help lead the UNI defense in a stifling defensive performance in the 20-10 win over No. 15 Illinois State on March 6. The Redbirds racked up 447 yards of offense the previous week, but the Panthers held ISU to just 185 yards, including just 69 yards through the air.

Cuvelier forced a fumble late in the fourth which led to a turnover and a touchdown to clinch the 20-10 win.

McLaughlin had his best performance by far for the Penguins in his third game. He had rushing scores of 10 and 1 yard in the first half of the game. They were his first YSU touchdowns.

Offensive Lineman of the Week: Garret Greenfield, 6-6, 295, So., RT, South Dakota State (Rock Valley, Iowa)

Greenfield helped pave the way for a Jackrabbit rushing attack that rolled up 347 rushing yards and four touchdowns, averaging 7.9 yards per carry, in a 45-10 home victory over Western Illinois on March 6. Greenfield graded at 95 percent and did not allow a sack or quarterback pressure.

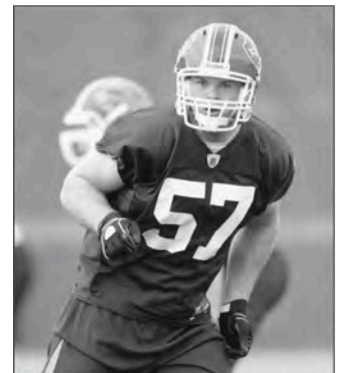
Wagner native Doug Eggers played professionally for the Baltimore Colts (1954-57) and Chicago Cardinals (1958).



Ed Maras was drafted in both football and baseball following a standout athletic career at South Dakota State.



Steve Heiden played 11 years in the NFL, splitting time between the San Diego Chargers and Cleveland Browns. He is currently a coach with the Arizona Cardinals.



Danny Batten was the first Jackrabbit player in the Division I era to be drafted, when he was selected by Buffalo in the sixth round of the 2010 draft.

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On top of game action, the Jackrabbit Sports Network and Cubby's Sports Bar & Grill team up for one-hour weekly shows highlighting the sports. The John Stiegelmeier Radio Show airs Monday nights in the fall, while the Jackrabbit Basketball Coaches Show features both head men's coach Eric Henderson and women's coach Aaron Johnston in the winter.

Additionally, fans can stay up to date on all 19 SDSU varsity sports with the Jackrabbit Daily Sports Update, a three-minute report that airs every weekday on all network stations.

All game broadcasts and coaches shows can be heard live throughout the world wide web or can be accessed on-demand. It's all free at Jackrabbits All-Access on GoJacks.com. Fans can also access the broadcasts via TuneIn.com or the TuneIn mobile app by searching "Jackrabbits."

WNAX-AM 570 is the flagship station of the network and works with Learfield IMG College and SDSU athletic broadcast services to produce and distribute each broadcast. WNAX-AM 570 airs every daily show, coaches show, football, men's and women's basketball game. In the event that both the men's and women's basketball teams play simultaneously, the men's games air on WNAX-AM 570 while the women can be found on WNAX-FM 104.1.

Additionally, Brookings Radio's five-station cluster partners with the Jackrabbit Sports Network. KJJQ 910 AM "The Ranch" is the Brookings affiliate for football and men's and women's basketball while also serving as the flagship for SDSU baseball coverage each spring.
