

# JACKRABBITS RETURN TO ROAD PLAY AT ORU

BROOKINGS, S.D. —The 2021 college baseball regular season moves into its final month this weekend as South Dakota State travels to league-leading Oral Roberts for a four-game series.

The series kicks off with a doubleheader starting at 3 p.m. Friday at J.L. Johnson Stadium in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Single games are slated for 2 p.m. Saturday and 1 p.m. Sunday. All four games will be available for viewing online at ORUAthletics.com.

South Dakota State enters the week 11-21 overall and fourth in the league standings with a Summit League mark of 6-10 after splitting a four-game home series last weekend against North Dakota State. The series consisted of a pair of doubleheaders, which resulted in splits both April 23 and 24.

ORU, meanwhile, had its scheduled four-game series against Omaha last weekend called off due to COVID-19 protocols. The Golden Eagles are 7-4 in Summit League play and 16-18

**THE SERIES:** Friday's series opener will mark the 73rd meeting on the baseball diamond between SDSU and Oral Roberts. In the series that dates back to 1971, the Golden Eagles hold a 55-17 lead.

The two programs last played each other in 2019, with Oral Roberts winning the overall season series by a 4-3 count. SDSU held a 3-2 advantage in the regular season series, winning the final two games of a three-game series played March 22-23 in Tulsa before the two squads split a rain-shortened two-game series May 10-11 of that year at Erv Huether Field in Brookings. Four of the five regular season contests were decided by one run.

ORU gained the upper hand in the season series by eliminating the Jackrabbits from the Summit League Baseball Championship by notching 5-2 and 4-0 victories back in Tulsa.

SHORT HOPS: Following are a few quick notes about the Jackrabbits heading into this weekend's series:

- SDSU matched a season high by scoring 12 runs in both games of the April 24 doubleheader against North Dakota State:
- The Jackrabbits scored double figures for runs in back-to-back games for the first time since tallying 11 runs in back-to-back games against Western Illinois April 19-20, 2019;
- Drew Beazley pitched five strong innings and later delivered the game-winning hit in second game of the April 23 twinbill against North Dakota State;
- The Jackrabbits combined to hit seven home runs in the four-game series against North Dakota State after entering the weekend with 14 home runs in their first 28 games;
- SDSU has tallied double figures for hits in four of the team's last six games, including posting a season-high 16 hits in the series finale versus North Dakota State;
  - Cody Carlson has pitched at least five innings in seven of his eight starts this season;
- True freshman position players Jess Bellows (29), Garrett Stout (22), Jordan Sagedahl (17), and Avery Mellman (14) have combined for 82 starts so far this season.

**SUMMIT LEAGUE SUCCESS:** South Dakota State has been a consistent winner in The Summit League since it became a league member more than a decade ago. In 13 seasons as a member of The Summit League, the Jackrabbits have compiled a 186-147 (.559 winning percentage) in regular season conference games. SDSU has posted a .500 or better record in league play nine times and has qualified for the four-team postseason tournament 10 out of the 11 years it has been eligible.

The Jackrabbits shared a Summit League regular season title in 2010 and won the Summit postseason tournament in 2013.

**PRESEASON POLL:** South Dakota State was picked to finish fourth in the 2021 Summit League baseball race, according to a preseason poll conducted among the league's five coaches.

Defending champion Omaha grabbed the top spot in the poll with three first-place votes and 15 points, edging Oral Roberts with two first-place votes and 14 points. North Dakota State was third with 10 points, followed by the Jackrabbits with seven. Western Illinois rounded out the poll with four points.

The top four teams will advance to the Summit League Baseball Championship May 26-29 in Omaha, Nebraska. SDSU has qualified for the league tournament in 10 of 11 seasons it has been eliqible for postseason play.

The Jackrabbits finished the COVID-shortened 2020 season with a 5-12 overall record. The season was canceled just before the start of Summit League play.

In addition, Drew Beazley was named as a Summit League Player to Watch and right-hander Adam Mazur was tabbed as a Summit League Pitcher to Watch.

A sophomore from Johnston, lowa, Beazley hit .239, drove in nine runs and shared the team lead with two home runs during an abbreviated 2020 season. He earned Freshman All-America recognition from *Collegiate Baseball* in 2019 and was a second-team all-Summit League selection after batting .275 with four home runs and 21 runs batted in.

Besides playing first base, Beazley is expected to see an expanded role on the Jackrabbit pitching staff in 2021.

Mazur rose to the top of the SDSU starting rotation as a true freshman in 2020. The Woodbury, Minnesota, native made four starts, compiling a 1-2 record. He struck out 18 batters in 20 1/3 innings.

**BADGER'S BIG DAY:** South Dakota State senior Landon Badger wrote his name into the Jackrabbit record book with three home runs in the first game of an April 24 doubleheader versus North Dakota State.

The Pierre native became the first SDSU player to accomplish the feat since Joel Blake on the exact same date in 2009 at Western Illinois. Badger homered in three straight innings, hitting a solo shot in the third inning, a three-run homer in the fourth and a grand slam in the fifth for a total of eight runs batted in.

For good measure, Badger hit his fourth home run of the day and drove in two more runs in the second game of the twinbill. He entered the weekend without a home run this season.

Badger's performances allowed him to earn Summit League Player of the Week honors. He became the second Jackrabbit to earn the award this season, joining Luke Ira on April 12.

**BELLOWS BREAKS IN:** Freshman Jess Bellows started the final three games of the Northern Colorado series for the Jackrabbits and has since put his stamp on the SDSU lineup.

A native of Miles City, Montana, Bellows led SDSU with a .556 batting average (5-for-9) with six runs batted in and six runs scored in the series played Feb. 26-28. He doubled twice and hit his first career home run en route to a 1.111 slugging percentage. Both of his doubles came in extra innings with the international tiebreaker in effect and resulted in three of his RBIs.

Bellows, who has seen action primarily at the corner outfield spots, has hit safely in 25 of the 29 games in which he has played, including entering the weekend with his second sixgame hitting streak of the season.

Overall, Bellows shares the team lead with 34 hits while hitting out of the leadoff spot. His .318 batting average ranks second on the squad, while his 20 runs scored rank third.

**HACKMAN HEATS UP:** While the rest of the Jackrabbit offense was scuffling in the Summit League-opening series against Omaha, catcher/designated hitter Derek Hackman heated up. The Johnston, Iowa, native batted .417 (5-for-12) with two home runs, a double, four runs batted in and three runs scored in the four-game series.

Both of Hackman's home runs were two-run blasts in the Jackrabbits' 7-6 victory on March 20 as he established a new career high with four RBIs. He became the first SDSU player to hit two home runs in a game since Anthony Schneider connected twice against Western Illinois on May 13, 2018. The junior continued his hot hitting against Omaha by hitting the game-winning three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning of the April 11 series finale at Erv Huether Field.

His hitting prowess carried over to last weekend's series against North Dakota State as he batted a team-best .583 (7-for-12) with two doubles and two home runs. In the April 24 series finale, he posted the first five-hit game by a Jackrabbit since Schneider in the second game of the May 13, 2018, doubleheader versus Western Illinois.

Hackman had his streak of reaching base safely end at 20 games in the first game of the April 3 twinbill at Evansville. He currently leads the team in several offensive categories, including batting average (.319), home runs (6), runs batted in (tied, 21), on-base percentage (.463) and slugging percentage (.574).

His third home run of the season came in the Jackrabbits' series-opening win at Western Illinois on March 26.

**BARNETT MOVES UP SAVES CHART:** Junior relief pitcher Bret Barnett recorded the 11th save of his career in the Jackrabbits' win over Kansas on Feb. 20. Barnett notched the final six outs, including three by strikeout, to close out SDSU's first Summit League win of the

With his latest save, March 20 at Omaha, Barnett broke a tie with Chad Coley (10 saves from 1990-93) for sixth place in program history and moved into a tie with Bruce Mogen (11 saves from 1983-86) for fifth place in program history. The Indianola, Iowa, native earned seven saves en route to first-team all-Summit League honors in 2019, and tallied two saves during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season.

In nine appearances this season, including a start in the April 24 series finale against North Dakota State, Barnett has struck out 25 batters over 14 2/3 innings, upping his career totals to 90 strikeouts in 71 2/3 innings. His career mark of 11.30 strikeouts per nine innings pitched ranks second in program history.

MOGEN JOINS TOP 10: Senior right-hander Brett Mogen moved into the SDSU career top 10 for appearances when he pitched the final inning of the Jackrabbits' 12-0 seriesopening victory at Northern Colorado on Feb. 26.

After missing a month due to injury, Mogen made his 66th career appearance in the April 11 series finale against Omaha, putting him in a tie for fifth place on the SDSU charts with Shane Kraemer (2010-13) and Andrew Clemen (2013-16).

Mogen put together his best season in a Jackrabbit uniform in 2019 with a 1-1 record and 1.67 ERA in 20 appearances. His ERA ranked as the sixth lowest in a season by an SDSU pitcher with more than 30 innings pitched.

OLMSTEAD RETURNS, CLIMBS K CHART: Senior pitcher Tyler Olmstead made his first appearance since the 2019 season when he recorded the final two outs of the seventh inning in the second game of the March 19 doubleheader at Omaha.

Olmstead, a Sioux Falls native, has made threeother relief appearances this season, including picking up the win in the April 11 series finale versus Omaha. It was his first victory since pitching a complete-game, four-hit shutout with nine strikeouts against Purdue Fort Wayne on May 3, 2019.

A two-time second-team all-Summit League selection, Olmstead had been sidelined by injuries since the end of the 2019 season. The Sioux Falls native has compiled a 9-7 career record with 27 starts and moved into sixth place on the SDSU career strikeouts chart in his last appearance, April 23 versus North Dakota State. With 177 career strikeouts, Olmstead has passed both Jon Maras (175 strikeouts from 1989-92) and Ryan Froom (176 strikeouts from 2014-19) this season.

Olmstead's 92 strikeouts in 2019 stands fourth on SDSU's single-season list.

MAZUR HONORED: South Dakota State right-hander Adam Mazur was honored as Summit League Pitcher of the Week March 1 after helping lead the Jackrabbits to a fourgame weekend sweep at Northern Colorado.

A returning freshman from Woodbury, Minnesota, Mazur struck out a career-high 12 UNC batters in six shutout innings as SDSU won the Feb. 26 series opener, 12-0. Mazur struck out the side in each of the second, third and fourth innings, fanning eight Bear hitters in a row in one stretch. He allowed three hits and walked two.

Mazur's 12 strikeouts are the most by an SDSU pitcher since Brady Stover set a Jackrabbit Division I-era standard with 13 K's in a 2018 game against Purdue Fort Wayne. In 40 1/3 innings over seven starts so far this season. Mazur has notched a total of 56 strikeouts after fanning 11 batters in seven innings April 10 versus Omaha.

In a March 19 start at Omaha, Mazur retired 14 Omaha hitters in a row in one stretch. He followed that by putting together a streak of retiring 12 consecutive Western Illinois batters en route to his second victory of the season on March 26.

Mazur is expected to be back on the mound for Friday's series opener at Oral Roberts.

**TIEBREAKER TIMES TWO:** South Dakota State excelled in late-inning situations, winning both games of a Feb. 27 doubleheader at Northern Colorado after the international tie-breaker was implemented.

With each extra inning starting with a man at second base, the Jackrabbits erupted for four runs in the top of the 10th of the opener, then posted a three-spot on the board in the ninth inning (scheduled seven-inning game) of Game 2 once play resumed Sunday after being suspended because of darkness the previous day.

In Game 1, Jess Bellows delivered a leadoff double to score Jordan Sagedahl with the goahead run. Luke Ira followed two batters later with a bunt single to plate Bellows and Derek Hackman capped the scoring in a 6-2 Jackrabbit victory with a two-run double to the rightcenter gap.

Game 2 followed much of the same script as Ira broke a 3-all tie in the top of the ninth with a leadoff double to drive in Landon Badger. Bellows closed out the scoring in a 6-3 Jackrabbit victory with a two-run double to the left-center gap that brought home Ira and Ryan McDonald.

The Jackrabbits turned an inning-ending 6-4-3 double play to escape the eighth inning of Game 2 and did not allow a run in any of the three innings played under the tiebreaker rules over the two games.

The international tiebreaker is being used in select nonconference games involving the Jackrabbits this season, but will not be used in Summit League play.

**COACH BISHOP:** Rob Bishop, who has guided college baseball teams to more than 600 victories, was named head baseball coach at South Dakota State University on Aug. 1, 2016. Bishop is the ninth head coach in program history and the fourth in the Division I era of Jackrabbit baseball.

Through four-plus seasons with the Jackrabbits, Bishop holds an 88-107 record at SDSU. In his first season, Bishop's 2017 squad returned to the winning side of the ledger with a 26-24 overall mark, including an 18-12 record for a third-place finish in The Summit League standings. SDSU won its opening-round game in the Summit League Baseball Championship, 6-5, over second-seeded North Dakota State.

In 2018, SDSU overcame a slow start to post a winning record in Summit League play at 14-13 and went on to reach the title game of the Summit League Baseball Championship. The Jackrabbits finished with an 18-32 overall record during a campaign in which they played only six home games.

SDSU bounced back in 2019, posting a 28-22 overall record that included a second-place mark of 19-10 in Summit League play. The Jackrabbits won or split nine of the 10 league series in regular season play en route to making an appearance in the four-team Summit League Baseball Championship for the 10th time in 11 years.

The 2020 season was canceled just before the start of Summit League play, with SDSU posting a 5-12 record in the first month of the season. The Jackrabbits recorded wins at Minnesota, Air Force and Kansas State the final week of the pandemic-shortened campaign.

Overall, Bishop holds a 637-429-1 record (.597 winning percentage) as a collegiate head coach. He earned his 600th career victory in the Jackrabbits' 8-6 victory at UA Little Rock on March 10, 2019.

Individually, Jackrabbit players have been honored as all-Summit League performers 18 times during his brief tenure, including eight all-league selections in 2019. Utility player Nick Smith was honored for the third consecutive season, while shortstop Gus Steiger and starting pitcher Tyler Olmstead were repeat selections in 2019.

Bishop has mentored a handful of Jackrabbit players who have pursued professional careers. Catcher Luke Ringhofer was selected in the 22nd round of the 2017 Major League Baseball Draft by the Baltimore Orioles and relief pitcher Chris Halbur was offered a free agent contract by the Los Angeles Dodgers after Bishop's first season in Brookings.

In addition, shortstop Gus Steiger signed with the Cincinnati Reds following an abbreviated 2020 MLB Draft. In 2019, left-handed pitcher Brady Stover was a 31st-round pick of the Washington Nationals, but opted to return to the Jackrabbits for his senior season.

Prior to becoming head coach at SDSU, Bishop spent six years at NCAA Division II member Montana State University-Billings, where he led the Yellowjackets to back-to-back Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular season titles in 2015 and 2016, attaining the program's first-ever 30-win season with a 30-20 record in 2016. His squads also were honored as the top academic team in the GNAC each of the past three seasons.

Previously, Bishop spent 10 years at Miles City Community College in Montana, where his teams won MonDak conference championships every year. His squads also claimed five consecutive junior college region titles and a Northwest District championship in 2007 to advance to the NJCAA Division II College World Series. Bishop's teams won at least 30 games each of his 10 seasons, including four 40-win seasons. He ended his tenure at Miles City, where he also served as athletic director for five years, with a 377-151 overall record.

Bishop served as a graduate assistant at SDSU under head coach Mark Ekeland during the 1998 and 1999 seasons. In his first season as a head coach, Bishop led Huron University to the South Dakota Intercollegiate Conference title in 2000 with a 38-18 record.

A 1994 graduate of Jamestown College, Bishop earned NAIA All-America honors during the 1992 and 1994 seasons as an infielder.

**THE ROSTER:** The 2021 SDSU baseball roster features 36 players from seven different states. Of the 36 players, 13 are from lowa, 10 are from South Dakota and seven hail from Minnesota. 


