HEN TRACKS

✦ The Blue Hens went on the road to defeat No. 4 Jacksonville State for the program's first playoff road win since 2007 and are back in the FCS semifinals for the first time since 2010.

✦ Senior Gene Coleman II hauled in a career-best 10 catches for 129 yards in the quarterfinal win, just one reception short of the Delaware program record for catches in a playoff game.

✦ Delaware led the CAA with 16 honorees in this season's All-Conference awards, including eight first teamers.

✦ Rocco finished third in Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year voting and was selected as the AFCA Region I Coach of the Year.

✦ The Blue Hens have forced a turnover in every game this season and have multiple takeaways in all but one. Redshirt sophomore Noah Plack and redshirt senior Nijuel Hill each had interceptions at Jacksonville State.

✦ Delaware will be wearing fist helmet stickers all season long to signify unity between all student-athletes and coaches in the fight against Social Injustice.

✦ The Delaware defensive unit ranks second in FCS in scoring, allowing 11.7 ppg and third in total defense, surrendering 223.0 yards a contest.

✦ As voted by their peers, Delaware features four team captains in redshirt seniors Frank Burton III and Dejoun Lee, along with redshirt junior Nolan Henderson and junior Kedrick Whitehead.

✦ A win will put the Blue Hens back in the National Championship game for the first time since 2010. To do so, Delaware will need to win consecutive road playoff games, a feat it accomplished in 2007.

CAA SUCCESS

The Blue Hens took home a total of 16 CAA postseason honors led by head coach Danny Rocco's selection as Coach of the Year and redshirt senior Dejoun Lee's Offensive Player of the Year Award. Delaware had eight first-teamers and six second-teamers on the All-Conference teams.

COLEMAN'S CATCHES

Senior Gene Coleman II had a career day at JSU with 10 catches for 129 yards. He was one reception shy of the Delaware record for receptions in a playoff game and was the first Blue Hen with double-digit catches in a game since 2014.

PRESSURING THE QB

Delaware had 5.0 sacks at JSU by five different Blue Hens for the most in a single game since 2014. For reference, Delaware recorded just 6.0 sacks in all of 2019. Delaware has 9.0 sacks through its first two playoff games.

OFF AND RUNNING

Redshirt senior Dejoun Lee was a finalist for the Walter Payton Offensive Player of the Year Award. After his impressive regular season, he ranked sixth in all of FCS in all-purpose yards (152.2 ypg) and 12th in rushing yards (99.6 ypg).

OUR COACH

Along with becoming Delaware's first CAA Coach of the Year, head coach Danny Rocco has been selected as the AFCA Region I Coach of the year and a finished third for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award. It is Rocco's fifth conference coach of the year honor after winning his seventh career conference championship and first at Delaware.

BACK WHERE THEY BELONG

Delaware is back in the FCS Playoffs for the second time in three seasons and 22nd time in program history. Delaware hosted a playoff game for the first time 2010 and won its first road playoff game since 2007, advancing to the championship game in both of those seasons.

CREATING CHANGE

Partnering with the rest of the conference, Delaware is proud to be a part of the CAA Family - United for Change Executive Committee. Sophomore offensive lineman James Prince III joins Delaware women's basketball head coach Natasha Adair as the two Blue Hen representatives.

Delaware has also created its own Student-Athlete Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee where redshirt senior running back Dejoun Lee is Co-Chair.

CHASING 1,000

Redshirt junior Thyrick Pitts went over the 1,000 career receiving yards mark at Villanova, becoming just the 30th player in program history to reach 1,000 in their careers. Senior Gene Coleman II is close behind, sitting at 992 career receiving yards, looking to become No. 31.

ROYAL COMPANY

The University of Delaware is one of just three institutions with an alumnus elected President (Biden), a Super Bowl MVP (Flacco), and an NFL MVP (Gannon), along with Stanford and Michigan.

The Blue Hens are also just one of eight FCS programs with 700 all-time victories. A total of just 39 Division I schools have surpassed 700 all-time wins and Delaware did it in style when it defeated Maine in three overtimes in 2019.

WE'LL TAKE THAT

The Blue Hens have forced at least one turnover in each game this season and have two takeaways in all but one. Redshirt sophomore Noah Plack had the first interception at JSU followed by redshirt senior Nijuel Hill's. Delaware has ended its opponents' first possession with a turnover in 3-of-7 games this spring.

THE BOOT

Sophomore kicker Ryan Coe set the Delaware playoff record with a 53-yard field goal against Sacred Heart, bouncing on and over the cross-bar. The All-CAA Second-Team selection even got a shoutout on social media from former NFL player Pat McAfee for representing #TheBrand. Coe has connected on his last seven field goal attempts.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Redshirt junior quarterback Nolan Henderson moved into 20th-place in Delaware history with 2,186 career passing yards. He had touchdown passes in six-straight games to open the season and is 11th in the nation in passing efficiency.

The local product is just the third Delaware native (Smyrna High School) in the past 27 seasons to start for the Blue Hens, joining Sam Postlethwait (2001) and Dale Fry (1993).

GUESS WHO'S BACK

After 869 days, redshirt junior linebacker Colby Reeder returned to the field at Delaware State and did so in a big way. He made three tackles and had a huge sack the put an end to a Delaware State drive. He has a tackle for loss in all three of his four appearances and led the team in tackles at JSU. Reeder was the 2017 CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year and continues the trend of Reeder's playing linebacker at UD.

THE HeNFL

It has been a busy offseason for Blue Hens in the NFL, highlighted by Joe Flacco signing close by with the Philadelphia Eagles. Defensive lineman Zach Kerr also signed with the San Francisco 49ers while long snapper Joe Fortunato inked a deal with the Green Bay Packers.

Currently, there are seven active players, one head coach, three assistant coaches and a general manager from Delaware in the league.

GAME-CHANGING FACILITIES

With phase one of the Delaware Stadium renovation project complete, the Blue Hens hold one of the finest facilities in all of Division I football, FBS included. The new Whitney Athletic Center holds a state-of-the-art weight room, nutrition center, academic center, athletic training center and much more. The building provides next-level resources for all Delaware student-athletes.

WEEKLY WONDERS

After all five regular-season games, Delaware took home at least one CAA weekly award. The last installment gave redshirt junior Nolan Henderson Offensive Player of the Week and redshirt senior Nijuel Hill Defensive honors.

AN EXPLOSIVE START

Redshirt senior Dejour Lee needed just 13 seconds to give the Blue Hens their first lead in 2021 when he took the opening kickoff back for an 87-yard touchdown return. It was the first Delaware season-opening kick return since 1933. He picked up 177 all-purpose yards in the game and was named the CAA Special Teams Player of the Week.

PILING UP THE YARDS

The Blue Hens gained 551 yards of total offense against Rhode Island, the most in a game since 2010. 361 of those yards came via the ground, marking just the fifth time since 2000 that the Blue Hens had over 300 rushing yards in a game.

KEEPING IT CLEAN

The Blue Hens rank fifth in FCS in penalty yards per game, averaging 48.4 yards a contest.

CONTROLLING THE ROCK

Delaware ranks sixth in FCS in time of possession, controlling the ball for an average of 34:01 per contest. The Blue Hens possessed the ball for 41:34 at Rhode Island, good for second-longest in program history on record.

THE BATTLE OF THE BLUE

Delaware snapped an eight-game drought in the rivalry with a 27-20 win at then No. 10 Villanova to earn a CAA title and FCS Playoff bid. This year's matchup was a little bigger, as both teams were ranked inside the top-10 for the first time since Sept. 12, 1998 when the Wildcats topped the Blue Hens, 34-31.

BATTLE TESTED

The Blue Hens bring back seven offensive starters from 2019 and eight on the defensive side. Coach Rocco has spoken highly of the team's depth and versatility, specifically on the defensive line.

A FEW FIRSTS

Redshirt sophomore Anthony Paoletti scored his first career touchdown at URI, a 1-yard rush where he barreled his way into the end zone. Paoletti has been used all season long in the "Wildcat" package and scored again in both playoff games.

Against Stony Brook, redshirt freshman Mateo Vandamia scored his first two career touchdowns, first on a wide-open 21-yard reception and next on a 21-yard fumble recovery, scoop-and-score off a completed Delaware pass. Junior Bryce De Maille had his first career rush on an end-around that found the end zone for his first career rushing touchdown.

NEWARK, Del. - Delaware dominated both sides of scrimmage, piling up 257 yards behind the running of Andrew Pierce and holding South Dakota State to just 25 yards on the ground as the No. 16 Blue Hens posted an impressive win over the No. 9 Jackrabbits.

The Blue Hens (2-0) snapped a six-game losing streak vs. Top 10 opponents - posting their first win since a 20-17 victory over Southern Illinois in the 2007 FCS semifinals - and did so in a big way, jumping out to a 17-0 lead after the first quarter and never looking back in a battle of FCS powers. Pierce was a workhorse, carrying 26 times for 165 yards and a touchdown and becoming the first player in UD history to run for over 100 yards in each of his first two collegiate games. His 165 yards was the third highest single game mark ever for a UD freshman and was just 12 shy of Phillip Thaxton's record of 177 set in 2007.

Delaware quarterback Pat Devlin completed 14 of 25 passes for 143 yards and found seven different receivers in the first quarter alone. He tossed a seven-yard scoring strike to Thaxton just five minutes into the game as the Hens jumped out to a 7-0 lead and never looked back.

The Blue Hen defense was just as impressive for the second straight week. After shutting down West Chester by a 31-0 in the season opener, the Hens almost equalled that effort again as they held the Jackrabbits (0-1) to just 250 total yards, including just 25 yards rushing.

SDSU All-American running back Kyle Minett, who ranked among the national leaders with 1,304 yards and 16 touchdowns in 2009 and entered the game with over 3,000 career rushing yards, was held to just 32 yards on 14 carries, his lowest single game total since taking over the starting duties as a sophomore.

The Hens also picked off SDSU quarterback Thomas O'Brien three times, including two by safety Anthony Bratton. Delaware kept the Jackrabbits out of the end zone all day, stopping the final drive of the game when Matt Macorella intercepted a pass in the end zone. The Hens intercepted three passes for the second consecutive week while keeping another opponent out of the end zone.

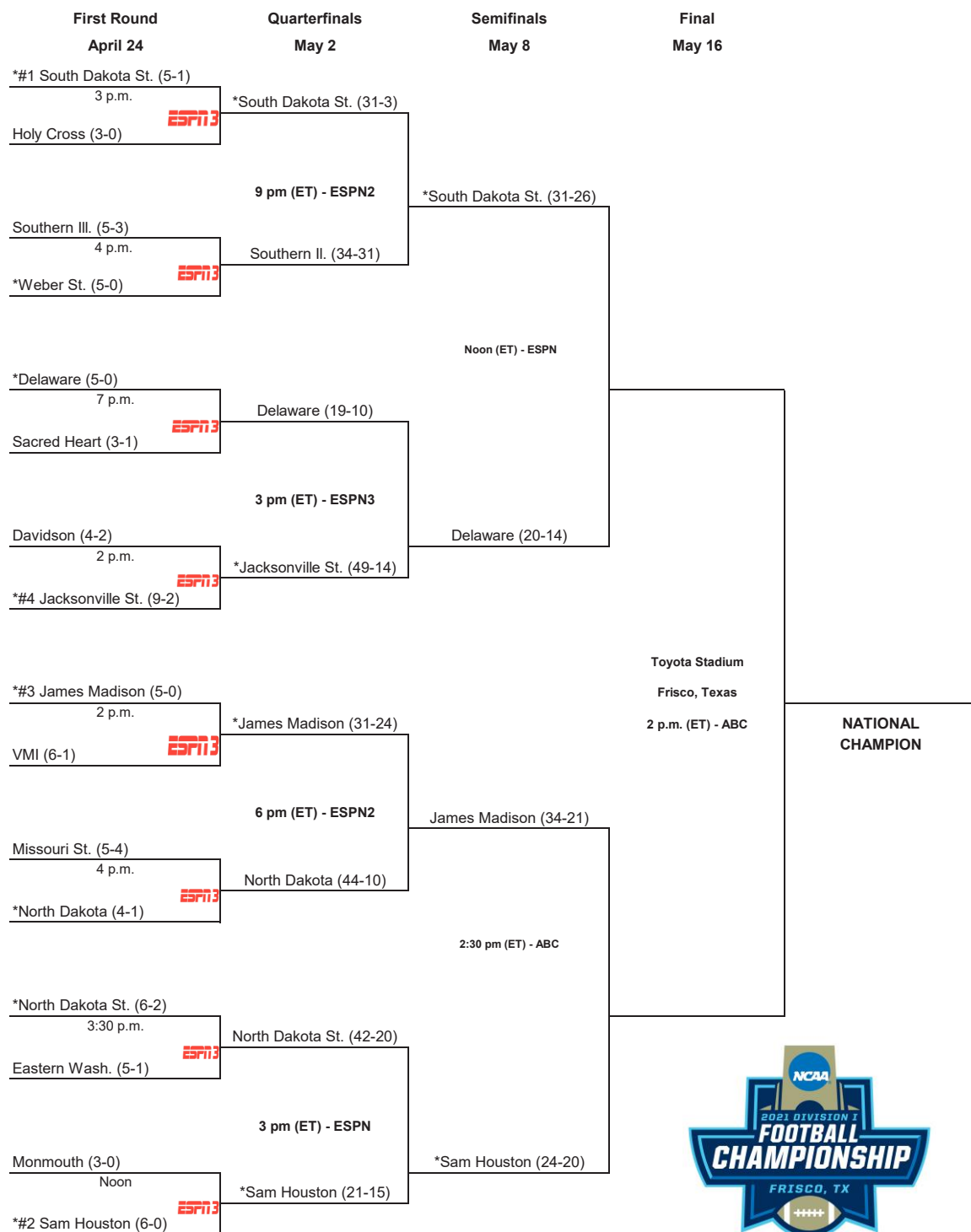

University of Delaware Director of Athletics and Recreation Services Chrissi Rawak announced Dec. 14, 2016 that Danny Rocco, who enjoyed outstanding success at NCAA Division I FCS members Liberty University and University of Richmond, had been selected to lead the Blue Hens as head football coach.

Rocco, 58, who has three 10-win seasons and four NCAA FCS Playoff appearances under his belt, became just the 23rd head coach in Delaware's 125-season history and just the sixth head coach since 1940.

A veteran of 35 seasons as a football coach, including the last 14 as a head coach at the NCAA Division I FCS level, Rocco has found nothing but success. That success has followed him to Delaware in his first three seasons.

Under his tutelage in 2018, the Blue Hens returned to the FCS playoffs for the first time since 2010 after a 7-5 mark, including two wins over opponents ranked in the top-10. In his two seasons with the Blue Hens, Rocco led Delaware to back-to-back seven win seasons, a feat that hadn't happen in Newark in seven years.

In his 14 seasons as a head coach, Rocco has posted just one losing season and owns a career record of 109-58 (.653).

"I'm thrilled that Danny Rocco will be the new head coach for the Fightin' Blue Hens," said UD President Dennis Assanis. "Like all of us at UD, Danny is committed to excellence in everything he does. He brings significant coaching experience at both the collegiate and professional level. Most importantly, Danny is dedicated to the success of our student-athletes, both on the field and in the classroom. We know he will build a powerful team of players and coaches and take UD Football into a strong and winning future."

"We welcome Coach Rocco and his family to our Blue Hen Football family," said Rawak. "This is an exciting day for the University of Delaware, our football program, our student-athletes, and everyone who loves and supports Blue Hen football. During our search we wanted to find someone who had demonstrated outstanding success not only on the field but in building young men as leaders, citizens, and achievers. In Coach Rocco we found the perfect fit and someone who is committed to excellence in every area. We are excited to see the direction he takes us under his leadership. His impact will be felt immediately."

In the 2016 NCAA FCS Playoffs, the No. 12 ranked Spiders defeated No. 17 North Carolina A&T 39-10 in the opening round and rallied to down No. 8 North Dakota 27-24 on the road in the second round before falling at No. 3 Eastern Washington in the quarterfinals.

"It is with great enthusiasm that I accept the head football coaching position at the University of Delaware," said Rocco. "I am very excited to take on this challenge, recognizing that I have full and total support from President Assanis and AD Chrissi Rawak. I have always had an appreciation for the history and tradition of Delaware Football and I am highly motivated to return Delaware to its winning ways and to a position of national prominence."

A native of Huntingdon, Pennsylvania and a 1984 graduate of Wake Forest University, Rocco inherited a program that has won six national championships, finished as national runner-up five times, made 20 NCAA Tournament appearances, and captured 16 conference championships. In just a short time, he turned it into 21 NCAA Tournament appearances.

Rocco transformed the Spiders back into a national power during his five-year tenure. He inherited a team that went 3-8 in 2011 and led the 2012 squad to a five-win turnaround with an 8-3 overall record and a share of the CAA title.

He went on to lead Richmond to a five-year record of 43-22 that included three-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including a berth in the semifinals in 2015 and a trip to the quarterfinals in his final season.

He was named the Touchdown Club of Richmond Coach of the Year in both 2012 and 2015 and was a finalist for the FCS Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year award both of those seasons.

During his 14 seasons as a head coach (five at Richmond, six at Liberty, three at Delaware), he has been a National Coach of the Year Finalist five times, and has won six conference championships and four conference Coach of the Year honors.

He has coached 183 all-conference honorees and 40 student-athletes who garnered All-American honors, 10 of which were Blue Hens including NFL talents Bilal Nichols, Nasir Adderley, and Troy Reeder.

Sixteen different players under Rocco's tutelage have gone on to earn NFL contracts and his teams have finished in the final FCS Top-25 poll in eight of the past 12 seasons, including finishing No. 3 in 2015 and No. 24 in 2018.

During his time with the Spiders, Richmond defeated 14 nationally-ranked opponents, including a victory over then-No.3 James Madison during the 2015 season when ESPN's College GameDay was in Harrisonburg, Va.

Rocco becomes only the third man in Colonial Athletic Association Football (formerly Yankee Conference and Atlantic 10 Conference) history to serve as head coach at two different institutions. Jim Reid coached at former CAA member Massachusetts in 1986-91 before moving on to serve as head coach at Richmond in 1995-2003. Current University of Michigan defensive coordinator Don Brown was head coach at Northeastern in 2000-03 before moving over to UMass in 2004-08.

At Liberty, Rocco made an immediate impact, taking over a program that had gone 1-10 in 2005 and building the Flames into a Big South Conference power. He led his first team to a 6-5 record, the largest turnaround of any FCS program that season, and guided the squad to Big South Conference Championships four times in six seasons.

He posted an overall record of 47-20 (26-5 in league play) and was named Big South Coach of the Year four times. He would go on to be named a finalist for the national Eddie Robinson Award and Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award in each of the final three seasons in Lynchburg. Liberty finished the last four years ranked inside the Top 25 in both major FCS polls.

Before becoming a head coach, Rocco spent 23 seasons at the NCAA Division I Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and National Football League levels.

Prior to his arrival at Liberty, Rocco spent five seasons at Virginia. He was a part of four consecutive bowl appearances for the Cavaliers, including back-to-back Continental Tire Bowl victories in 2002 and 2003. During his time in Charlottesville, UVA piled up 37 wins with Rocco serving as the associate head coach and linebackers coach under Al Groh.

In addition to his coaching duties with the Cavaliers, he also served as the recruiting coordinator during his first two years in Charlottesville. His 2002 recruiting class was ranked in the top-10 in the nation by many of the major recruiting services, including a fifth-place ranking by ESPN.

Prior to UVA, Rocco spent the 2000 season alongside Groh as an assistant linebacker and special teams coach with the New York Jets. Before joining the Jets, he was the linebackers coach at Maryland during the 1998 and 1999 campaigns.

Before his time in College Park, Rocco spent four seasons at the University of Texas, where the Longhorns captured three straight conference titles, including winning the inaugural Big 12 Championship in 1996 and earning three consecutive trips to bowl games (Sun Bowl, Sugar Bowl and Fiesta Bowl).

Before Tom Coughlin was a Super Bowl winning coach with the New York Giants, he was Rocco's mentor at Boston College for two seasons. As a defensive assistant, Rocco was a part of the revitalization of the Eagles, returning the program to the national stage as participants in the 1992 Hall of Fame Bowl and the 1993 Carquest Bowl.

He was no stranger to coaching after growing up in a football family. His father, Frank Rocco, Sr., served as an assistant coach at Penn State before joining the Liberty staff in 2000. Frank Rocco, Jr., also joined the Flames staff in 2000 as a wide receivers and quarterbacks coach and received a promotion to offensive coordinator prior to his departure in 2003. Frank, and brother, Dave, are both currently coaching at the high school level in Virginia.

In January of 2016, Rocco was elected to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees.

Rocco is married to the former Julie Mills and they are the parents of two children, David and Amy. David currently serves as the offensive coordinator at Western Illinois University.
