BROOKINGS, S.D. — We meet again.

The last time the South Dakota State football team played a game at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium, the Jackrabbits hosted UC Davis in the opening round of the 2021 Football Championship Subdivision playoffs.

Saturday night, a little over nine months later, the Aggies are once again the opponent as SDSU kicks off a six-game home schedule with the annual Dairy Drive game. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. Central Time, with television coverage on Midco Sports.

Both teams, which are nationally ranked, are coming off losses to Football Bowl Subdivision opponents in their respective season openers. UC Davis, ranked 25th in this week's AFCA coaches' poll, fell 34-13 at Cal on Sept. 3, while the Jackrabbits were edged at Iowa, 7-3, in a game in which neither team scored a touchdown.

SDSU enters the week with rankings of No. 2 in the Stats Perform media poll and third in the coaches' poll.

THE SERIES: Saturday's game will mark the ninth meeting between South Dakota State and UC Davis on the football field. SDSU leads the all-time series, 6-2, on the strength of winning each of the last five meetings and although there have been only eight previous games between the Jackrabbits and Aggies there is plenty of interesting history between the two programs.

The two programs first met in 1997, during the schools' NCAA Division II era and in what was John Stiegelmeier's first game as head coach of the Jackrabbits. SDSU came away with a 17-7 road win in that initial contest on Sept. 13, 1997.

As the two schools made the leap to NCAA Division I and the FCS ranks, both were charter members of the Great West Football Conference, which began play in 2004. SDSU's first-ever game as a D-I program was at UC Davis on Sept. 9 of that year, but that matchup did not go well for the Jackrabbits, who were drubbed 52-0. The Aggies scored 24 first-quarter points and led 38-0 at the half.

South Dakota State won each of the last three games between the two programs as Great West foes and added a 12-8 home victory at Coughlin-Alumni Stadium on Sept. 15, 2012, in the last regular season meeting between the Jackrabbits and Aggies. Zach Zenner rushed for both Jackrabbit touchdowns (61, 23 yards) and linebacker T.J. Lally recorded four sacks to spearhead a stingy SDSU defense.

Leading into last season's playoff matchup, the last four previous meetings between UC Davis and SDSU had been decided by seven points or less. However, a potent Jackrabbit rushing attack racked up an SDSU playoff-record 446 yards and the SDSU defense tied a school record with six interceptions to advance with a 56-24 victory.

DAIRY DRIVE: Now in its ninth year, the Dairy Drive recognizes the importance of the dairy industry to the South Dakota economy and promotes the ties to SDSU as the state's Land-Grant institution.

The Jackrabbits have come out victorious in all eight previous Dairy Drive games against eight different opponents. Seven of the games drew a crowd surpassing 10,000 fans, with the lone exception coming in the pandemic-altered 2020-21 spring season when attendance restrictions were in place.

HOME OPENERS: South Dakota State has fared well in home openers under head coach John Stiegelmeier, who is in his 26th season at the helm of the Jackrabbit football program. The Jackrabbits have compiled a 21-4 record in home openers under Coach Stig, including a 6-0 mark at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

SDSU has won 11 consecutive home openers since a 24-14 loss to Illinois State in 2010.

MVFC-BIG SKY CHALLENGE: Saturday's game is part of the annual MVFC-Big Sky Challenge, which is an effort to publicize current matchups and promote future non-league scheduling between two of the premier Football Championship Subdivision Conferences.

Since being launched in 2017, Missouri Valley Football Conference teams hold a 20-12 advantage in regular season games between the two leagues and have claimed the series each of the four years it has been contested. The MVFC also holds a 8-4 edge in playoff games since 2017.

ELITE COMPANY: South Dakota State is one of only two Football Championship Subdivision programs to reach the playoffs each of the last 10 seasons, including advancing to the national semifinals or championship game in four of the last five seasons.

Defending national champion North Dakota State holds the longest active streak with 12 consecutive trips to the playoffs.

RANKINGS STREAK: By being ranked second in the first Stats Perform FCS poll of the regular season, SDSU has now appeared in the top 25 of 133 consecutive media polls dating back to October 2012.

The Jackrabbits' second-place preseason showing in 2022 marked the highest in program history, surpassing a third-place preseason ranking three times (2018, 2019, 2021).

CAPTAINS: Leading the Jackrabbit football team are seven captains, including three who hail from the state of Iowa:

- Adam Bock, Jr., linebacker, Solon, Iowa;
- Garret Greenfield, Sr., offensive lineman, Rock Valley, Iowa;

McCormick is in his second season as a captain, while all other captains are in their first seasons in the role.

JACKS PICKED SECOND IN VALLEY: South Dakota State has been picked to finish second in the 2022 Missouri Valley Football Conference race, according to a preseason poll conducted among the league's coaches, sports information directors and a select media panel that was announced in early August.

Defending league and national champion North Dakota State earned the top spot in the poll with 446 points and 39 first-place votes, followed by the Jackrabbits with the other two first-place votes and 407 points. Missouri State (355), Southern Illinois (306) and Northern Iowa (304) rounded out the top five.

Since joining the MVFC at the start of the 2008 season, SDSU has been picked to finish second in the league standings on seven occasions and was tabbed as the favorite in 2021.

SEASON 15 IN THE MVFC: The 2022 season marks South Dakota State's 15th as a member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference. Since joining the league in 2008, SDSU is the only program in that span to not have a losing season in conference play.

The Jackrabbits hold a 76-34 record in MVFC games and have won six or more league games six times. SDSU earned a share of league titles in 2016 and during the 2020-21 spring season.

AWARD WATCH LISTS: Four South Dakota State players have been selected for two of the top awards in the Football Championship Subdivision.

Three Jackrabbit standouts are among the 35 players named to the preseason watch list for the 2022 Walter Payton Award, which is presented annually by Stats Perform to the top offensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision. Representing the Jackrabbits on the initial watch list are running back Isaiah Davis, wide receiver Jaxon Janke and tight end Tucker Kraft.

Davis, a junior from Joplin, Missouri, is expected to fill the featured back role after playing alongside two-time Walter Payton Award finalist Pierre Strong, Jr. the past two seasons. Davis missed most of the 2021 regular season due to injury, but managed to finish second on the team with 701 rushing yards and seven touchdowns after three consecutive 100-yard games in the FCS playoffs. He has averaged nearly eight yards per carry through his first two seasons in a Jackrabbit uniform.

A senior from Madison, Janke posted team highs of 72 receptions and 1,165 receiving yards in 2021, while adding five touchdowns. He caught at least two passes in all 15 games last season and tallied 100-plus receiving yards in seven contests, including four in a row to close out the regular season.

Kraft emerged as another top receiving target for SDSU last season, catching 65 passes for 780 yards and six touchdowns.

A junior from Timber Lake, Kraft notched three 100-yard games and hauled in at least two receptions in all 15 games of the 2021 campaign.

On the defensive side of the ball, Jackrabbit linebacker Adam Bock was included in the 35-player watch list for the Buck Buchanan Award. A junior from Solon, Iowa, Bock was the Jackrabbits' leading tackler during the 2021 season, totaling 125 stops in starting all 15 games at middle linebacker. He also registered 9.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, intercepted two passes and forced a pair of fumbles.

Bock tallied 10 or more tackles six times last season, including a career-high 17 tackles in an Oct. 9 game versus Southern Illinois. He was a late addition to the list of finalists for the Buck Buchanan Award last season and tied for 11th in the balloting.

The watch lists will be updated periodically throughout the regular season, with a national media panel selecting the award winner prior to the FCS national title game.

MORE PRESEASON ACCOLADES: Besides the four players named to the Payton and Buchanan award watch lists, four other Jackrabbits received preseason All-America recognition over the summer.

Two of the preseason All-America picks were offensive linemen Garret Greenfield and Mason McCormick. Both have been multi-year starters for the Jackrabbits — Greenfield at tackle and McCormick at guard — who helped pave the way for a balanced SDSU offensive attack to average 36.1 points and 441.1 yards of total offense per game during the 2021 season.

Also earning preseason accolades were defensive tackle Caleb Sanders and senior tight end Zach Heins.

A senior from Glenwood, Iowa, Sanders led the team in sacks for the second year in a row with 6.5 and tallied 13 tackles for loss among his 34 total stops.

The other half of the top returning tight end tandem in the FCS ranks, Heins hauled in 24 receptions for 250 yards in 2021. The Sioux Falls native also tallied six touchdowns.

GRONOWSKI RETURNS: The Jackrabbits welcomed quarterback Mark Gronowski back to the starting lineup in last week's game at Iowa.

A sophomore from Naperville, Illinois, Gronowski helped lead SDSU to the FCS title game during the 2020-21 spring season, but sat out last fall due to an injury he suffered on the first offensive series of the championship game against Sam Houston.

Gronowski started all 10 games as a true freshman during the modified 2020-21 season and was honored as the Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Year, as well as the league's Freshman of the Year. He completed 57.4 percent (108-of-188) of his passes for 1,565 yards and 15 touchdowns, while adding another 577 yards (7.0 ypc) and seven touchdowns on the ground.

In addition, Gronowski finished as runner-up for the 2021 Jerry Rice Award as the top freshman in the Football Championship Subdivision.

BIG-PLAY JACKS: Over its 15-game 2021 season, the South Dakota State offense averaged 6.9 yards per play. The Jackrabbits averaged at least 7.5 yards per play in each of their first three games, highlighted by an average of 9.3 yards per play in their Sept. 11 home opener against Lindenwood.

Conversely, SDSU limited the opposition to 5.2 yards per play, including 3.3 yards per rushing attempt.

The Jackrabbits registered 87 plays of 20 or more yards from scrimmage last season and have most of the same playmakers returning to the lineup in 2022. The longest play from scrimmage in 2021 was an 85-yard touchdown run by Pierre Strong, Jr. Oct. 9 versus Southern Illinois.

In addition, Malik Lofton returned a fumble 97 yards for a touchdown in the game against Southern Illinois. It is the longest such return on record in program history.

SDSU was limited to only one 20-yard play in its Sept. 3 season opener at Iowa — a 20-yard pass from Mark Gronowski to Jaxon Janke on the first play of the fourth quarter.

BOCK HONORED: South Dakota State linebacker Adam Bock was honored Sunday as Co-Missouri Valley Football Conference Defensive Player of the Week after spearheading an impressive performance by the Jackrabbit defense in its season opener a day earlier at Iowa.

A junior from nearby Solon, Iowa, registered a game-high 13 tackles for a South Dakota State squad that did not allow a touchdown and limited Iowa to only 166 yards of total offense in a narrow 7-3 road loss. Bock also forced and recovered a fumble that thwarted a Hawkeye drive in the red zone late in the third quarter to keep SDSU within striking distance.

It was Bock's 10th career performance with double figures in tackles. He shared the weekly award with Indiana State safety Rylan Cole.

JAXON FOR 2K: South Dakota State wide receiver Jaxon Janke reached a career milestone in the Sept. 3 season opener at Iowa, becoming the eighth Jackrabbit to reach 2,000 career receiving yards.

A senior from Madison, Janke caught two passes for 24 yards in the contest to up his career receiving total to 2,015 yards.

In addition, Janke ended the day with 135 career receptions, putting him within three catches of tying Tyrel Kool (138 receptions from 2009-12) for 10th place on the SDSU career charts.

DUSTMAN PULLS DOUBLE DUTY: Junior Hunter Dustman figured prominently in the Jackrabbits' special teams efforts in last week's season opener at Iowa.

Dustman handled all of the kicking duties for South Dakota State, punting 11 times for an average of 41.5 yards (long of 52) and scoring the Jackrabbits' only points on a 44-yard field goal in the second quarter. Dustman's 11 punts mark the most by an SDSU player in the Division I era (since 2004).

PICKING OFF THE COMPETITION: The South Dakota State defense continued a trend of forcing turnovers by leading the Football Championship Subdivision with 21 interceptions a season ago.

Reserve cornerback Dalys Beanum led the Jackrabbits with four interceptions — three of which came in SDSU's opening-round playoff victory against UC Davis, the last of which he returned 59 yards for a touchdown. Beanum also notched a pick-six on his first career interception earlier in the season against Dixie State, covering 36 yards.

As a team, the Jackrabbits tied one of their longest-standing school records with six interceptions in the playoff game versus UC Davis. SDSU also intercepted six passes in a 1950 game against Augustana and in a 1952 matchup with St. Cloud State.

In all, 11 different Jackrabbits recorded at least one interception a season ago and SDSU picked off at least one pass in 12 of 15 games.

To open the 2022 season, junior linebacker Caleb Franci recorded an interception against Iowa for the Jackrabbits' first takeaway of the season. Franci's interception set up a field goal in the second quarter for SDSU's only points of the game.

WINKELMAN, SANDERS CRACK TOP 10s: Senior defensive linemen Reece Winkelman and Caleb Sanders were not only the top two sack artists for the Jackrabbits last season, but the Jackrabbit duo have nearly identical career numbers for sacks and tackles for loss as they both have moved in and out of the SDSU career top 10 in those categories.

Sanders, a defensive tackle from Glenwood, Iowa, moved into seventh place in tackles for loss (34) with one tackle for loss at Iowa and stands just outside the SDSU top 10 with 15 career sacks.

A defensive end from Marshall, Minnesota, Winkelman broke a three-way tie for 10th place in career sacks with Kevin Tetzlaff (15 sacks from 1988-91) and Sanders by notching his 16th career sack in the season opener at Iowa. He also has tallied 32 tackles for loss in his career, putting him in a tie for 10th place on the career list with Eric Cohen (1978-80). Winkelman notched a team- and career-best 6.5 sacks during the 2019 campaign and led the team with 13.5 tackles for loss in 2021.

JANKES SCORE IN TANDEM: Twin brothers Jaxon and Jadon Janke have each caught touchdowns in the same game four times during their Jackrabbit careers.

The first time the tandem scored in the same game was against Holy Cross in the opening round of the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs in the spring of 2021. In that April 24 contest, Jadon scored twice on pass plays of 13 and 45 yards, while Jaxon opened the scoring with an 11-yard TD reception.

The wide receivers from Madison, South Dakota, added three more twin-touchdown games during the 2021 fall campaign, starting with a Sept. 25 victory at Indiana State. Jadon's touchdown reception covered 33 yards in the first quarter, while Jaxon scored from 42 yards out in the second stanza.

They followed the same script Oct. 16 at Western Illinois, with Jadon catching an 8-yard pass to open the scoring in the first quarter and Jaxon adding a 21-yard score to cap a 21-point third quarter.

The brothers again hauled in touchdown passes in the same contest Nov. 20 against North Dakota. Jadon again scored on a 17-yard catch and run early in the second quarter, while Jaxon's TD came on a deflected pass in the end zone from 21 yards out late in the third quarter.

SEEING DOUBLE: The 2022 edition of the South Dakota State football team features three sets of twin brothers.

Returning for their senior seasons are wide receivers and Madison natives Jadon and Jaxon Janke. Jaxon Janke has been the team's leading receiver each of the past two seasons, while Jadon Janke hauled in 14 touchdown receptions during the 2021 calendar year split between the spring and traditional fall seasons.

Another pair of twins with South Dakota roots are sophomore linebackers Aaron and Adam Kusler. Aaron played in three games last season, while Adam contributed mostly on special teams and saw action in 14 of the team's 15 games.

New to the squad this season are freshmen Jason and Justin Harris from New Lenox, Illinois. Jason is listed as a wide receiver, while Justin plays running back.

STAFF SHAKEUP: South Dakota State football underwent some restructuring following a successful 2021 season, with four coaches earning internal promotions and four new coaches joining the staff. The staff shakeup was the result of 2021 coordinators Jason Eck (offense) and Brian Bergstrom (co-defense) accepting head coaching positions at Idaho and Winona State, respectively.

Zach Lujan takes over as the Jackrabbits' offensive coordinator, while continuing to coach the team's quarterbacks. A former SDSU quarterback himself from 2014-16, Lujan began his coaching career in 2018 as running backs coach before moving over to mentor the quarterbacks a year later.

Also on offense, Ryan Olson has moved from coaching the Jackrabbit tight ends to offensive line coach, and has added the title of run game coordinator. Olson joined the SDSU coaching staff prior to the start of the 2020-21 spring season and previously coached the offensive line at Bemidji State from 2017-19.

On the defensive side of the ball, Jimmy Rogers has been named the team's sole defensive coordinator after splitting duties with Bergstrom the past three seasons. Rogers will continue to coach the squad's linebackers and also holds the title of assistant head coach. Another former Jackrabbit player, Rogers is the longest-tenured assistant coach on staff as he enters his 10th season this fall.

In addition, defensive line coach Christian Smith has added defensive run game coordinator to his duties. Smith has coached at SDSU since 2017.

Two of the new coaches are former Jackrabbit football players — Josh Davis as passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach and Jesse Bobbit as safeties coach and recruiting coordinator. Also joining the coaching staff were Chris Meyers as tight ends coach and Mark Kubacki as assistant defensive line coach.

Davis previously served as wide receivers coach at SDSU from 2009-15, when he mentored five players currently in the Jackrabbits' top 10 for career receptions. He spent the past six years at Northwestern College (Iowa), where he was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for a perennial top-10 NAIA program that reached the national championship game in spring 2021.

A standout receiver himself for the Jackrabbits from 2002-05, Davis ended his career as the Jackrabbits' all-time leader in receptions (225) and ranked second in both career receiving yards (3,192) and touchdowns (26). While those marks no longer stand as record, Davis continues to hold the SDSU single-game receptions mark with 16.

Bobbit, who played linebacker at SDSU from 2013-16, began his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant at SDSU in 2019. He moved on to Washington State, where he was a defensive graduate assistant and quality control coach for two years. He worked with the linebackers for a Cougar team that earned a Sun Bowl berth in 2021.

Meyers most recently served as an offensive line graduate assistant at Oklahoma State, where he worked with a unit that cleared the way for 2019 NCAA rushing champion Chuba Hubbard. The 2021 Oklahoma State team played in the Big 12 Football Championship and closed a 12-2 season with a win over Notre Dame in the Fiesta Bowl.

Kubacki, who joined the staff in July, brings a decade of collegiate coaching experience to Brookings. He spent the last five seasons at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota, following a five-year stint at St. Thomas, where he coached on both sides of the ball for a program that compiled a 56-8 record at the NCAA Division III level during his tenure.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS: South Dakota State University offensive lineman Wes Genant earned his fourth career selection to the CoSIDA Academic All-America Division I Football Team and defensive end Reece Winkelman also earned first-team recognition during the 2021 season.

Genant, a Parkston native, was honored on the first team with a 3.90 grade-point average as a human biology major. A multi-year starter at center, Genant also was a first-team selection in 2018 and 2020-21 after earning second-team recognition in 2017. He redshirted during the 2019 season while recovering from injury.

Winkelman, a native of Marshall, Minnesota, was selected with a 3.87 GPA as a business economics major. On the field, he was a second-team all-MVFC selection who led the team with 13.5 tackles for loss and ranked second with 5.5 sacks.

Genant is the only Jackrabbit football student-athlete to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America honors four times. SDSU has placed at least one player on the squad in 15 of the last 17 seasons, including multiple selections 13 times. Overall, SDSU football student-athletes have received Academic All-America recognition from CoSIDA 44 times since 1974.

The Academic All-America program recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom. Candidates, who are first nominated and honored at the district level, must be at least a sophomore in athletic and academic standing, a starter or key reserve on his team and carry at least a 3.3 GPA.

JACKS IN THE PROS: In preparation for the 2022 season, 10 former South Dakota State standouts were members of National Football League teams, continuing the Jackrabbits' long tradition of developing players into pro prospects.

Headlining the list is tight end Dallas Goedert of the Philadelphia Eagles. After being drafted in the second round of the 2018 NFL Draft, Goedert has gone on to record 193 receptions for 2,295 yards and 16 touchdowns in four seasons.

Goedert set a career high with 830 receiving yards on 56 catches during the 2021 season. He established career bests of 58 receptions and five touchdowns two years earlier.

Linebacker Christian Rozeboom earned a Super Bowl ring with the Los Angeles Rams during the 2021 season. A member of the Rams' practice squad in 2020, Rozeboom made his NFL debut with the Kansas City Chiefs early in 2021 before returning to Los Angeles and seeing action mostly on special teams for the Rams for remainder of the regular season and postseason.

Also on an NFL roster in 2021 as practice squad members were cornerback Jordan Brown (Las Vegas Raiders) and Cade Johnson (Seattle Seahawks). Brown, who was originally drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals in 2019, moved on to the New Orleans Saints during the offseason, while Johnson returned to Seattle for training camp and was again assigned to the Seahawks' practice squad for the 2022 season.

For the first time since 1976, the Jackrabbits saw two players selected in the same NFL Draft. Running back Pierre Strong was a fourth-round selection by the New England Patriots, while quarterback Chris Oladokun was taken by the Pittsburgh Steelers. Oladokun was released during training camp by the Steelers, but was picked up by the Kansas Chiefs and assigned to their practice squad.

Additionally, Don Gardner (Tampa Bay), Wes Genant (New Orleans), Michael Griffin II (Tennessee) and Aron Johnson (Baltimore) all received post-draft free agent offers.

In addition, wide receiver Jake Wieneke has caught on with the Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League. Through his first two seasons (2019, 2021), Wieneke recorded 95 total receptions for 1,467 yards with 19 touchdowns. He was named the CFL's East Division Most Outstanding Rookie.

So far in 2022, Wieneke has caught 30 passes for 327 yards and a touchdown.

Another former Jackrabbit standout, quarterback Taryn Christian, recently retired after a brief stint playing with the Ottawa Redblacks of the CFL.

Headlining the list of Jackrabbit pro football alumni are Hall of Famer Jim Langer and the NFL's career scoring leader, Adam Vinatieri.

Langer who played football at SDSU from 1967-69 and also was an All-American in baseball, played center on every offensive down during the Miami Dolphins' perfect season in 1972. He was a first-team All-Pro four times and was selected to play in six Pro Bowl games. He played with the Dolphins from 1970-79 before returning to his home state to finish his career with the Minnesota Vikings from 1980-81. Langer passed away in September 2019.

Vinatieri capped up his playing career after becoming the NFL's all-time scoring leader in 2018 as a member of the Indianapolis Colts. Over Vinatieri's 24 seasons, his totals include NFL bests of 599-of-715 on field goal attempts, 83.8 percent, and 2,673 career points. He also ranks second in career extra points with 874. In all, Vinatieri set 15 NFL records, including 21 100-point seasons.

Several other former Jackrabbit players and coaches have had ties to the professional game, including:

- Bryan Witzmann (player from 2010-13), played for several NFL teams as an offensive lineman from 2014-20;
- Steve Heiden (player from 1995-98), former tight end for the Chargers and Browns who is currently the tight ends coach for the Arizona Cardinals;
- Reed Burkhardt (player from 2004-07), former director of pro scouting for the Minnesota Vikings and now director of player personnel for the Denver Broncos;
- Glen Fox (player from 2006-09), director of pro personnel for the Arizona Cardinals after previously serving as a pro scout for 10 years;
- Shawn Mennenga (assistant coach from 2009-10), former special teams coordinator for the Cleveland Browns and Green Bay Packers;
- Trent Baalke (assistant coach from 1991-95), general manager of the Jacksonville Jaguars and formerly the GM for the San Francisco 49ers;
- Brad Seely, longtime special teams coordinator with numerous NFL teams.

DANA J. DYKHOUSE STADIUM: Jackrabbit football moved into a new home in September of 2016 with the completion of Dana J. Dykhous Stadium.

The stadium, which was constructed in phases on the site of SDSU's previous home field, Coughlin-Alumni Stadium, seats 19,340 spectators and cost \$65 million to build.

The stadium is being funded through private gifts and long-term revenue streams, including concessions and suite, loge box and ticket sales. Bonds are financing nearly two-thirds of the project's construction, with the remaining dollars coming from private support. Lead gifts totaling \$12.5 million from former Jackrabbit football player and Sioux Falls banker Dana Dykhous and philanthropist T. Denny Sanford were announced in October 2013.

The stadium officially opened Sept. 8, 2016, featuring a concert by country music superstars Luke Bryan, Little Big Town and Lee Brice as part of the Jacks Bash opening weekend. The first football game was two days later, on Sept. 10, when the Jackrabbits defeated Drake, 56-28.

Jacks Bash 2 was held this past Sept. 8 and included a musical lineup of Zac Brown Band, Fall Out Boy and Gabby Barrett.

SDSU has gone on to post a 35-7 record at Dana J. Dykhous Stadium during its first five-plus seasons of operation, including an 8-1 mark in FCS playoff games.

The Jackrabbits went undefeated at home in 2018 at 7-0 and again during the 2020-21 spring season with a 5-0 mark.

Dana J. Dykhhouse Stadium was designed by Kansas City-based Crawford Architects, with the construction firm JE Dunn serving as the project manager at risk and Henry Carlson Company of Sioux Falls serving as general contractor.

The stadium won the 2017 Alliant Build America Award from the Associated General Contractors of America South Dakota Building Chapter.

WORKING OVERTIME: South Dakota State holds a 5-6 record in 11 overtime games since overtime rules were implemented in the mid-1990s. The Jackrabbits have won four of their six overtime contests in Missouri Valley Football Conference games, including posting a 2-1 record at Dana J. Dykhhouse Stadium.

South Dakota State rushed for a team playoff-record 446 yards and tied a school record with six interceptions as the Jackrabbits advanced in the 2021 FCS playoffs with a convincing 56-24 opening-round victory over UC Davis Nov. 27 at Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium.

In advancing to meet fourth-seeded Sacramento State, the Jackrabbits improved to 9-3 overall. UC Davis had its season end at 8-4 overall.

UC Davis held a pair of early leads, taking the opening kickoff and marching 60 yards on nine plays before settling on a 32-yard field goal by Isaiah Gomez two and a half minutes into the contest.

SDSU answered later in the quarter with a six-play, 70-yard drive capped by a 2-yard touchdown run by Walter Payton Award finalist Pierre Strong, Jr. It was Strong's 16th rushing touchdown of the season.

The Aggies regained the lead after taking advantage of the Jackrabbits' lone turnover of the day. After a muffed punt was recovered by UC Davis at the SDSU 9, the Aggies converted on fourth-and-goal as C.J. Hutton caught a 4-yard touchdown pass from Miles Hastings.

The Jackrabbit running game hit full stride on the ensuing drive in the second quarter, quickly moving 75 yards — all on the ground — on only four plays. Strong carried for 24 and 31 yards on the first two plays of the drive to set up an 18-yard touchdown run by Isaiah Davis.

On the next SDSU possession, Davis recorded attempts of 40 and 23 yards before Strong tossed his fourth touchdown of the season on a 10-yard throwback to quarterback Chris Oladokun down the left sideline.

The SDSU lead grew to 28-10 moments after the first Jackrabbit interception of the afternoon as defensive end Cade Terveer picked off a pass that was initially broken up by Cale Reeder. On the very next play, Oladokun found Jadon Janke for a 33-yard touchdown.

The Jackrabbits' lead could have been even larger had it not been for three missed field goals in the opening half.

UC Davis cut the margin to 28-17 with a touchdown late in the first half as Ulonzo Gilliam plunged in from 2 yards out. Gilliam gained 73 yards on 10 carries and added game highs of eight receptions and 55 receiving yards.

Each of the Aggies' first four drives of the second half ended on interceptions — two of which SDSU returned for touchdowns. Buck Buchanan Award finalist Adam Bock stepped in front of a Hunter Rodrigues pass on the opening drive of the half and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown.

Don Gardner and Dalys Beanum picked off passes on the next two drives before Beanum came up with his third interception of the game midway through the fourth quarter, one he returned 59 yards for the score.

In between, SDSU tacked on two more offensive touchdowns. Zach Heins caught a 3-yard touchdown pass from Oladokun after runs of 41 yards by Davis and a 20-yard scramble by Oladokun on third-and-19. The final Jackrabbit touchdown came on a fumble recovery in the end zone by offensive lineman Gus Miller after Strong was stripped of the ball just shy of the goal line.

Rodrigues scored the lone touchdown of the second half for UC Davis on a 15-yard run with four minutes remaining.

The Jackrabbits' 446 rushing yards surpassed the program's previous playoff record of 434 yards set in 2012 against Eastern Illinois. Davis carried 15 times for a career-high 217 yards, while Strong added a season-high 185 yards on 19 carries.

Oladokun completed 8-of-17 passes for 89 yards and two touchdowns. Jadon Janke led the receiving corps with 41 yards on two catches.



Isaiah Davis ran for a career-high 217 yards on only 15 carries to lead a potent rushing attack by the Jackrabbits in a 56-24 playoff victory over UC Davis.

Overall, SDSU finished with a 532-402 advantage in total offense and averaged 8.9 yards per play.

Reeder led the Jackrabbits with eight tackles, followed by six each by Bock, Logan Backhaus and Isaiah Stalbird. Besides their six interceptions, SDSU also broke up seven passes.

Iowa won the battle for field position all day, turning two second-half safeties into the decisive points in a 7-3 victory over South Dakota State in the college football opener for both teams Saturday before a sellout crowd of 69,250 at Kinnick Stadium.

SDSU, ranked second in the Stats Perform Football Championship Subdivision media poll and third by the FCS coaches, seemingly played out of the shadow of its own goal line throughout the afternoon. Thanks to the punting by the Hawkeyes' Tory Taylor, six Jackrabbit drives started inside their own 10-yard line, including three inside the 5.

Compounding the Jackrabbits' field-position woes were a number of false-start penalties. Overall, SDSU was penalized 12 times for 66 yards, with Iowa flagged two times for 15 yards.

Iowa, which missed a 40-yard field goal on its second drive of the game after being given a short field after a shanked punt, put the first points on the board later in the first quarter on a 46-yard field goal by Aaron Blom.

The only drive for the Jackrabbits that started in Iowa territory resulted in their only points of the game. Linebacker Caleb Franci's interception and 17-yard return late in the second quarter set SDSU up at the Iowa 38. After picking up one first down on a 12-yard pass from Gronowski to Isaiah Davis on third-and-10, Hunter Dustman knotted the game at 3-all with a 44-yard field goal.

Defenses continued to dominate throughout the rest of the game, with neither team reaching the 200-yard mark in total offense.

Iowa grabbed the lead with a few ticks over four minutes remaining in the third quarter. Following a Taylor punt that pinned the Jackrabbits at their own 1, Jack Campbell broke through the line and tackled Davis in the end zone for the first of two safeties. Campbell led the Hawkeyes with 12 tackles.

SDSU stayed within striking distance as Adam Bock, from nearby Solon, Iowa, came away with the Jackrabbits' second takeaway of the game by ripping the ball away from Leshon Williams at the 7-yard line after the ensuing free kick. Bock posted a game-high 13 tackles.

Despite the momentary shift in momentum, the Jackrabbits couldn't get their offense on track against a stout Iowa defense, giving up their second safety late in the fourth quarter when Gronowski was sacked in the end zone by Joe Evans.

Iowa finished with a 166-120 advantage in total offense. Williams led the Hawkeyes' ground game with 72 yards on 24 carries, while Spencer Petras completed 11-of-25 passes for 109 yards. Arland Bruce paced the Iowa receivers with five catches for 68 yards.

For the Jackrabbits, Davis tallied 50 rushing yards on 18 carries and was the team's leading receiver with five catches for 32 yards. Gronowski, making his first start since being injured in the FCS national championship game in May 2021, completed 10-of-26 passes for 87 yards and was sacked four times.

Dustman also handled the punting duties for the Jackrabbits, averaging 41.5 yards on 11 attempts.



The South Dakota State defense held Iowa without a touchdown and limited the Hawkeyes to 57 rushing yards in a narrow 7-3 setback in the 2022 season opener.
