MATCH FACTS

- w Finishing the regular season with three-straight road duals, the Oklahoma Sooners will square off against No. 15 North Dakota State at 7 p.m. CT on Friday, Feb. 10 and No. 16 South Dakota State at 1 p.m. CT on Sunday, Feb. 12.
- w The South Dakota State contest will be televised on FloWrestling.

TRANSFER PORTAL LEADS TO OU

- w The Sooners added three transfers in the offseason, including redshirt freshman Wyatt Henson, sophomore Gerrit Nijenhuis and junior Mosha Schwartz.
- w Gerrit Nijenhuis transferred from Purdue where he was a two-time NCAA qualifier, and finished 18-15 in the 2021-22 season. Nijenhuis recorded eight wins against ranked opponents and reached as high as No. 13 in the nation via FloWrestling. He pieced together the best individual finish by a true freshman at the 2021 Big Ten Conference Tournament since 1987 with a 4-0 record.
- w Schwartz comes to Norman after three seasons at Northern Colorado. In his three seasons with the Bears, Schwartz was a two-time NCAA qualifier at 133 pounds and accumulated a 29-18 record. In his freshman season, he finished as the Big 12 runner-up.
- w Wyatt Henson joined Oklahoma after spending his freshman season at Iowa. As a Hawkeye, Henson redshirted his lone season and garnered a 17-1 record at 141 pounds competing unattached. He picked up titles at the Luther Open, Lindenwood Open and Harold Nichols Open.

MIDSEASON TRANSFERS

- w The OU wrestling program announced the addition of two-time All-American Stephen Buchanan and two-time Oklahoma state champion Gage Hockett to the team on Dec. 30.
- w The duo arrives in Norman after successful careers at Wyoming, where they helped elevate the Cowboys to three of the program's most successful seasons.
- w Last season, Buchanan compiled a 28-3 record with eight falls to earn the No. 1 seed at the Big 12 Championships at 197 pounds.
- w Buchanan went on to claim the 197-pound title, punching himself a ticket to his third-straight NCAA appearance. Earning the No. 2 seed, Buchanan cruised through the bracket before dropping the national semifinal before responding to finish third in the country. He became Wyoming's fourth two-time All-American.
- w Hockett, originally from Cushing, Okla., saw limited time as a freshman at Wyoming, garnering a 1-4 record. Following his freshman season, Hockett posted an 8-2 record, won the UNK Open, and finished as the runner-up at the Mine's Rookie Open as a redshirt freshman.
- w As a two-time OSSAA state champion for Cushing, Hockett tallied 15 victories in his high school career.

YOU ALWAYS FIND YOUR WAY BACK HOME

- w Oklahoma announced the hiring of former two-time OU national champion Teyon Ware as an assistant coach on Oct. 3.
- w Ware joins OU after seven seasons at Wyoming, where he helped guide 33 Cowboys to NCAA berths and a 52-31 record in duals. He also helped four wrestlers win Big 12 championships.
- w Under Ware's leadership, Stephen Buchanan and Bryce Meredith earned All-America honors in 2022 and 2018, respectively.
- w As a Sooner wrestler from 2003-06, Ware won the 141-pound national title in 2003 and 2005 and earned All-America honors in all four seasons. He registered a 112-15 record at OU under former head coach Jack Spates.
- w The Edmond, Okla. native returns to his home state and brings over a decade of coaching experience to Rosselli's staff.
- w In high school, Ware went 132-0 and won four state championships at Edmond North High School. He was awarded the Dave Schultz High School Excellence Award in 2002.

LEGENDS OF THE SPORT

- w The Oklahoma wrestling program had six wrestlers named to FloWrestling's Top 100 American Wrestlers of All Time list.
- w Sooner legends Dave Schultz (No. 12), Mark Schultz (No. 13), Wayne Wells (No. 20), Danny Hodge (No. 26), Melvin Douglas (No. 30) and Andre Metzger (No. 51) all found spots inside the top 100.
- w Oklahoma's five wrestlers inside the top 30 were the most in the country as the Sooners sat third among Division I programs in the total number of wrestlers ranked.
- w

#CHAMPU

- w Since the inception of collegiate wrestling in 1928, Oklahoma has been one of the most dominant wrestling programs in the country. The Sooners have seven team national titles, 24 conference championships, 67 individual national champs, 186 individual conference champions and 277 All-Americans.
- w The NCAA named Oklahoma the fourth-greatest wrestling dynasty in the country in the summer of 2020.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

125 POUNDS - JOEY PRATA (GRADUATE)

- w Secured first place in the 125-pound class of the Bobby Kaufman Memorial Open.
- w Placed second in the 125-pound division at the Michigan State Open.
- w Claimed fourth place at the 2022 Big 12 tournament and went 3-2 at NCAAs to make it to the blood rounds.
- w Transferred to Oklahoma from Virginia Tech before last season. Had a 34-25 record for the Hokies.
- w Placed third at the ACC Championships in the 2019-20 season to claim an automatic qualification to NCAAs.
- w

133 POUNDS - WYATT HENSON (REDSHIRT FRESHMAN)

- w Recorded his first pin as a Sooner against Rider's Richie Koehler at the 5:59 mark.
- w Has tallied five major decisions and compiled a 13-9 record in his first season with OU.
- w Transferred from Iowa and redshirted his only season as a Hawkeye.
- w Registered a 17-1 record at 141 pounds competing unattached in his first collegiate season.
- w Earned titles at Luther Open, Lindenwood Open, and Harold Nichols Open at Iowa.

141 POUNDS - MOSHA SCHWARTZ (JUNIOR)

- w Jumped from No. 21/27 to No. 7 after topping three consecutive top-15 opponents.
- w Strolled past No. 7 Allan Hart 6-1 to earn his 10th straight win and third straight win over a top-15 opponent.
- w Went 2-0 in Iowa with two top-20 upsets, including a 3-2 decision over No. 15 Casey Swiderski (Iowa State) and a 2-1 decision over No. 7 Cael Happel.
- w Upset No. 14 Josh Koderhandt (Navy) with a pin at the 1:34 mark at the Virginia Duals.
- w After recording a bye, decision, fall and a medical forfeit at the Michigan State Open, Schwartz finished second place, falling short due to a stalling call in SV-1 of the 141-pound championship.
- w Transferred from Northern Colorado where he was a two-time NCAA qualifier at 133 pounds.
- w As a Bear, Schwartz amassed a 29-18 record with eight majors and four pins.
- w Was a Big 12 finalist as a freshman and was awarded the title of a 2021 NWCA Scholar All-American and All-Big 12 Academic First Team member.

149 POUNDS - MITCH MOORE (GRADUATE)

- w In his 13 wins, Moore has logged three falls and a major decision. He placed third at the MSU Open after tallying a 14-1 major decision in his first bout, a fall, and a 3-1 decision.
- w Has started at 149 for the Sooners for three straight seasons.
- w Was a two-time NCAA qualifier at 141 pounds while at Virginia Tech from 2018-2020.
- w Was named the 2019 ACC Freshman of the Year.

157 POUNDS - JARED HILL (SOPHOMORE)

- w In his first home start, Jared took down Alex Hornfeck in SV-1 to clinch the 5-3 victory in the West Virginia dual.
- w Won a shutout 3-0 decision in his first collegiate start against Campbell.
- w Recognized as the Most Improved Wrestler by the OU coaching staff in the 2021-22 season.

157 POUNDS - JACOB BUTLER (REDSHIRT SENIOR)

- w Logged two falls en route to a 157-pound title at the Bobby Kaufman Memorial Open.
- w Other three wins via fall all came under 1:30 at the Michigan State Open. He wrestled through the consolation bracket and claimed third place at the Open.
- w Given the No. 30 seed at NCAAs and went 1-2 with a major decision win.
- w Placed on All-Big 12 Academic First Team and NWCA Scholar All-American list.

165 POUNDS - GERRIT NIJENHUIS (SOPHOMORE)

- w Name pronounced NINE-HOUSE.
- w Holds a 10-3 record in his debut season as a Sooner.
- w Transferred from Purdue where he became a two-time NCAA qualifier.

174 POUNDS - DARRIEN ROBERTS (SENIOR)

- w Was named NCAA Wrestler of the Week in November after a strong 5-1 finish between both Journeymen events in his hometown of Bethlehem, Pa.
- w Took down No. 8 Philip Conigliaro and No. 23 Jay Nivison at Journeymen. Finished 5-1 between both Journeymen events.
- w Clinched the 174-pound pool championship at the Journeymen Collegiate Classic.
- w Has been a starter for the Sooners for four straight seasons, originally placed in the 184-pound slot until this season.
- w

174 POUNDS - TATE PICKLO (SOPHOMORE)

- w Knocked off back-to-back top-25 opponents, including No. 12 Lance Runyon (Northern Iowa) by a 9-5 decision and No. 23 Julien Broderson (Iowa State) by a 3-2 decision.
- w Recorded his first collegiate start against Edinboro on Jan. 7, where he secured the 3-1 decision.
- w In his debut at McCasland Field House, the Mustang, Okla. product took down HM Anthony Carman with three seconds remaining to break a 1-1 tie and secure his first home win.
- w Clinched the 184-pound championship at the Bobby Kaufman Memorial Open on Jan. 8.
- w Unanimous No. 1 ranked recruit at 195 pounds in 2021 class and No. 12 ranked recruit in pound-for-pound rankings, making him the highest-ranked recruit of the Rosselli era.
- w 151-4 record at Mustang High School where he won two state championships and was a finalist all four years.
- w Dad, Brian, was a two-time All-American at Michigan State, brother, Cam, wrestles for the Sooners, and sister, Trinity, plays soccer at Oklahoma State.

184 POUNDS - KEEGAN MOORE (REDSHIRT SENIOR)

- w Picked up his first win of his redshirt senior season by an 8-4 decision over Ty Lukens in the Oklahoma-Little Rock dual.
- w Wrestled at the NCAA Championships as the No. 27 seed last season, where he went 2-2 with two upset wins.
- w Named a NWCA Scholar All-American in the 2021-22 season.
- w Transfer from Northern Iowa where he transferred to from Oklahoma State.

197 POUNDS - CARSON BERRYHILL (REDSHIRT JUNIOR)

- w Holds a 6-9 record, including one fall, on the season.
- w Voted 2019 Oklahoma Male Athlete of the Year.
- w Was a two-time Oklahoma state champion.

LOU ROSSELLI

Lou Rosselli was named the head wrestling coach at the University of Oklahoma on August 30, 2016, after spending 10 years on the Ohio State coaching staff. He now enters his sixth year at the helm of the seven-time national champion Oklahoma wrestling program in 2021-22 and is the reigning Big 12 Coach of the Year.

In Rosselli's first year at the helm the program's development was evident as the squad produced a 10-3 mark after the holiday break to finish the season with an 11-6 overall record, including wins over three ranked teams. In addition, the Sooners finished in second place at the 2017 Big 12 Championship, and eight wrestlers qualified for the 2017 NCAA Championships in St. Louis. Rosselli made a mark in the recruiting circuit as he picked up seven top-100 recruits to begin the 2017-18 season.

The Sooners posted an 8-11 mark in Rosselli's second season and sent five wrestlers to the NCAA Championships, held in Cleveland, Ohio. Rosselli continued his trend of high-caliber recruiting, adding four more top-100 recruits to the roster ahead of the 2018-19 season.

Rosselli's third year saw the Sooners go 10-6 overall and 5-3 in conference matches. Dom Demas became OU's 274th all-time All-American wrestler and picked up the Big 12 title at 141 pounds. Demas and four other Sooners qualified for the NCAA Championships.

In his fourth year at the helm, the Sooners qualified six for the NCAA Championships, led by top-10 national seeds and NWCA All-Americans Dom Demas and Anthony Mantanona. Oklahoma continued its high level of recruiting, securing a top-20 class nationally.

Rosselli's fifth year saw the Sooners win their first Big 12 Championship since 2002 and secured his highest-ranked recruiting class since 2016 by signing two No. 1 recruits in Tate Picklo and Alejandro Herrera-Rondon. Rosselli guided Dom Demas to his second Big 12 Championship and Jake Woodley to the podium at NAAs, becoming OU's 276th All-American. The Sooners were ranked inside the top-20 nationally throughout the entire season and tallied the best finish at the national championship of the Rosselli era.

In his sixth season at OU, Rosselli led nine wrestlers to NCAA berths and the team to a second place finish at the Big 12 Championship. Joey Prata and Jake Woodley made it to the blood rounds of the NCAA Championships.

During his time in Norman, Rosselli's squads have produced 31 Big 12 All-Academic honorees, 36 NCAA qualifications and seven conference finalists.

Prior to his arrival at OU, Rosselli was promoted from Buckeyes assistant coach to associate head coach following the 2008-09 season after helping lead OSU to NCAA runner-up finishes in 2008 and 2009. He also played an integral role in helping deliver the program's first national championship in 2015.

A native of Middleport, N.Y., Rosselli was named the 2009 National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and the 2014 USA Wrestling Freestyle Coach of the Year. He mentored four-time NCAA Champion Logan Stieber and two-time champ J. Jagers.

Additionally, the three-time Terry McCann National Freestyle Coach of the Year (2007, 2013 and 2016) has had a large presence with USA Wrestling and has served as a volunteer coach for the U.S. Olympic Freestyle Team at both the 2016 Rio Games, where the U.S. earned two medals (one gold), and the 2012 London Games, where the U.S. won three medals (two gold). As a three-time U.S. Freestyle World Team Coach, Rosselli led his squads to third-place finishes at the 2006 and 2011 FILA Wrestling World Championships, and to a fourth-place showing in 2007.

Rosselli, the 14th head wrestling coach in OU history, was named to the 2015 USA Wrestling coaching staff for the 2015 World Championships, and his 2009 team earned gold at the Pan American Championships. In 2010, he coached the U.S. World University Games Team, and he served as assistant coach when the U.S. placed third at

the 2005 World University Games in Izmir, Turkey.

Rosselli was a wrestler on the 1996 U.S. Olympic Team (114.5 pounds), and earned gold at the 1997 World Cup and silver at the 1998 Pan American Championships. He was also a University National Freestyle champ in 1994 before capturing U.S. National Freestyle titles in 1995, 1996 and 1999.

A two-time All-American, Rosselli wrestled collegiately at Edinboro from 1989 to 1993.

He was named the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference and Eastern Wrestling League Championships Outstanding Wrestler in his senior season and was a three-time PSAC champion at 118 pounds. In his rookie season, Rosselli was named the EWL Freshman of the Year and became the first freshman from Edinboro to qualify for the NCAA Championships.

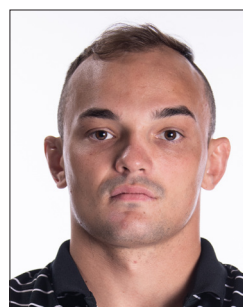
