Series Record: The Hawks hold a 39-4 lead in the all-time series records between the two schools in women's basketball. The last Terrier victory over Monmouth was during the 2000-2001 season, 74-65.

Terrier Update: The Terriers are currently tied for 7th place in the Northeast Conference. St. Francis is coming off a huge win on Monday afternoon at Long Island 62-57 in the 12th annual Battle of Brooklyn. Senior Kim Bennett was named the game's Most Valuable Player for her 25 point, five rebound, two steal effort. Freshman Tiffany Hill continues to lead St. Francis in scoring with 13.3 points per game. Bennett is right behind Hill averaging 11.7 ppg.

Last Time the Teams Met: Monmouth's senior guard Erin Winston scored a season-high 19 points to pace Monmouth to a 66-53 triumph over Northeast Conference rival St. Francis (N.Y.) Monday night at Boylan Gymnasium. The Hawks have won three in a row to improve to 8-7 overall and 4-2 in the NEC. The Terriers fall to 4-11 on the season, including 1-5 in conference play. Winston scored the Hawks' first five points of the game, on two layups and a free throw, to give MU a 5-3 edge at 17:28. The Terriers tied the game 5-5 after a Tiffany Hill lay-up, but the Hawks went on 7-0 run to take a 12-5 lead. Monmouth would take their largest-lead of the half, 15 points, 30-15 with 6:02 to play in the half. St. Francis cut the Hawk's advantage to eight after a Hill basket with a little less than four minutes to play, but Monmouth pushed its lead to 35-25 by halftime. Out of the half, Monmouth went on a 10-4 run and led by 16 points, 45-29, after a Veronica Randolph jumper at the 14:31 mark. Neither team scored for almost a five minute span in the second half, then the Terriers the lead to 12 after two Kim Bennett free throws. The Terriers would get no closer than 11 points for the rest of the game. St. Francis (N.Y.) got a balanced scoring effort, with freshman guard Tiffany Hill netting 14, and senior forward Kim Weir adding 12 and Kim Bennett added 11 points.

Up Next: The Terriers head on the road for the remainder of the season. First, St. Francis plays at Wagner this Saturday and then next Tuesday, the last day of the regular season, the Terriers will play at Quinnipiac.

Lucky February: The Terriers are now 4-3 in the month of February and are still part of the NEC playoff race. St. Francis stands tied for 7th place with three regular season games to play. Only the top 8 teams will advance to the NEC playoffs. Left on the docket is today's game vs. Monmouth (5th), Wagner (10th) and Quinnipiac (2nd). Going into NEC action on Thursday evening, the Terriers and CCSU are deadlocked at 5-10 and LIU trails with a NEC record of 5-11.

Bennett Named Battle of Brooklyn MVP: In the 12th annual Battle of Brooklyn held at LIU on February 21st, senior forward Kim Bennett was honored as the game's Most Valuable Player. Bennett scored a career and game high 25 points, was 6-for-12 from the floor and 13-for-17 from the line. She also grabbed five rebounds, and had two steals and an assist in the win.

80 Point Plateau: In the team's game at FDU, the Terriers defeated the Knights 80-73, marking the first time this season the team has scored 80 points. Prior to this game, St. Francis' highest scoring output was 70 points in the first game of the season against Iona. The last time St. Francis scored 80+ points in a game was on January 17, 2004 against Quinnipiac (97-83).

Top of the Hill: Freshman Tiffany Hill currently leads the Terriers in scoring, she averages 13.3 points per game. To date, she has scored 319 points and led the team in scoring in over half of the team's games this season.

Bennett Stepping Up: Senior forward Kim Bennett is posting the best numbers of her four year career this season and is a major reason why the Terriers have successfully pulled themselves into the NEC playoff race.

Linda's Lift: Since entering the starting lineup against Mount on Jan. 29th, freshman Linda Warrington is averaging 7.1 ppg and 5.1 rpg while shooting 50.0% from the floor (22/44) and has helped the Terriers to three NEC victories. In addition, she notched a career-high 21 points in her first collegiate start. Prior to being part of the starting rotation, Warrington was averaging 3.8 ppg and 2.5 rpg and shot 38.3% from the floor.

In the Playoff Hunt: The St. Francis College women's basketball team, is currently tied with Central Connecticut State University for 7th place in the Northeast Conference standings. A St. Francis win tonight and an LIU loss, would allow the Terriers to clinch a playoff spot for the first time since the 1998-99 season.

Senior forward Kim Bennett powered the Terriers with a career high 25 points to lead the Terriers past the Long Island University Blackbirds in the 12th annual Battle of Brooklyn. With the win, St. Francis keeps their playoff hopes alive improving to 5-10 in the NEC, 8-16 overall.

The Terriers opened the game with a 10-3 run, capped off by a Kim Weir layup and led 11-3 at the 13:16 mark. Then on the next possession, a three from LIU's Mikaelar Whippy cut the St. Francis lead to five, 11-6.

The Blackbirds went on an 17-1 run over the next 6:47 and led 27-17 with 5:20 to go in the half. St. Francis cut the lead to five on two occasions, first on a Justine Paxhia layup (27-22) and then on a layup from Linda Warrington (29-24), before eight straight from the Blackbirds gave LIU their largest lead of the half, 13 points (37-24) with 1:17 to play. St. Francis' Paxhia hit a three to cut the lead to ten at the half, 37-27.

Kim Bennett knocked in two free throws to cut the LIU lead to eight, 37-29, in the opening minutes of the second half. Slowly the Terriers chipped away at the lead, cutting it to five, 42-37, after another Bennett foul shot.

With 11:26 to play in the game, the Terriers trailed by seven, 46-39, and then exploded on 8-0 run led by four Katja Bavendam points.

Three foul shots from LIU stopped the Terrier run, but then the Terriers go going again and went on a 10-2 run to take a six point lead, 57-51, with just 2:31 to go in the game. An Amber Wirth three brought LIU to within three, but then Kim Bennett scored a layup and knocked down three-of-four from the line in the final minute to secure the 62-57 win.

In addition to Bennett's 25 points on 6-for-12 from the floor and 13-for-17 from the line, also a career high in free throws made, she pulled down five rebounds and collected two steals. Classmate Kim Weir grabbed a team-high eight rebounds and scored six points.

For Long Island, 9-16, 5-11 NEC, Mkaelar Whippy led the team with 14 points. Sara Oblak scored 13 and grabbed 11 rebounds, while Amber Wirth added 13.

The Terriers return to action on Thursday evening when they host Monmouth University on the Peter Aquilone Court at St. Francis College. Prior to the game, the team will honor their three graduating seniors: Candice Abellard, Kim Bennett, Keiya Smith and Kim Weir.

Hill Makes SFC First: Freshman Tiffany Hill's four Northeast Conference Rookie of the Week awards is the most in a season by any St. Francis women's basketball rookie.

Paxhia and Hill Named to Iona Tipoff All-Tournament Team - Junior point guard Justine Paxhia and freshman guard Tiffany Hill lead the Terriers to a 1-1 record and a 2nd place finish at the Iona Tipoff Tournament (11/21-22). In the win over Iona, Paxhia scored 15 points, grabbed a team-high 8 rebounds and dished out a game-high 6 assists. On Sunday, against Columbia, she dished out a new career-high 11 assists, scored 8 points and had 8 boards. Tiffany Hill scored 11 points against Iona and then a team-high 14 points against Columbia.

Weir Named to South Florida/Best Western All-Tournament Team - Senior forward Kim Weir helped the Terriers to a 1-1 weekend in South Florida over Thanksgiving. Weir scored 6 points and grabbed a game-high 9 rebounds against South Florida and then notched her first double-double of the season in the win over Niagara. She scored 15 points and had 11 rebounds in the victory.

Kim Kombination - In the team's game against Niagara University, senior forwards Kim Bennett and Kim Weir led their team to victory after both players posted double-doubles for the first time this season. Bennett scored a team-high 16 points and Weir notched 15 points. Both players grabbed 11 rebounds each in the game.

Buzzer Beaters - In the final seconds of the team's game against Niagara University, junior Justine Paxhia scored the game winning basket to lift her team over the Purple Eagles (50-48). On December 4th, freshman Tiffany Hill nailed a foul line jumper in overtime to lift the Terriers to a one-point victory over Fairleigh Dickinson University, 63-62.

Bavendam Helps Lead Terriers to Victory over FDU on December 4th: Freshman Katja Bavendam added a career-high 17 points in the Terriers victory over FDU in early December. Bavendam also grabbed four rebounds and swatted two shots in a season-high 30 minutes.

Prado For Three: against Towson, sophomore Marjorie Prado came off the bench to score a team-high and personal season-high 12 points on four three-point field goals. As a freshman, Prado nailed 25 three-point field goals.

Double-Double for Big K: 6'7" freshman Katja Bavendam earned her first collegiate double-double in her first collegiate start against Rider University. She scored 12 points on 5-of-12 shooting and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds. Bavendam also added a career-high 2 assists in the game.

Warrington Debuts in Boston, Continues Good Play at Home: Against Northeastern on December 18th, freshman Linda Warrington, who hails from Belchertown, Massachusetts, made the most of her then career high 13 minutes of play. Warrington nailed 3 of her 6 attempted shots, including one three-point field goal, scoring a career high seven points. She also added a team high and career high five rebounds in the contest. In the following game against Lafayette, Warrington came off the bench and played 27 minutes, scoring six points, grabbing three rebounds and collecting three steals.

Paxhia Sets Team Record: In her first game back from her injury, junior point guard grabbed 12 rebounds, a team-season-high. She pulled down six defensive and six offensive rebounds, both were game-highs.

Hill's Streak Ends: Freshman Tiffany Hill hit 22 straight free throws before missing one against Central Connecticut State University. Hill is shooting 69.6% (55/79) from the foul line this season - ranking 2nd on the team.

TERRIER NEC HONOR ROLL

Hill Earns First NEC's Rookie of the Week Honor of 2004-05: Hill earned all-tournament team honors at the Iona College Tip Tournament after guiding St. Francis (NY) to a 1-1 record last week, including a win in the Terriers' season opener against Iona and a loss to Columbia in the championship game. The 5-7 guard added 11 points, six rebounds and three steals in 24 minutes versus Iona after fighting through first-half foul trouble. Against the Lions, Hill played in all 40 minutes, scoring a team-high 14 points, grabbing two rebounds and recording two steals and a block. The freshman shot 11-for-26 from the field combined in the two games.

Hill Earns 2nd NEC Rookie of the Week Award: Tiffany Hill pushed St. Francis (NY) to an overtime, NEC season-opening win against Fairleigh Dickinson. With St. Francis (NY) trailing FDU by three points with 1:21 remaining in the extra period, Hill remarkably scored six points in the final 81 seconds, including the gamewinner as time expired to seal the win for the Terriers. For the contest, the Orange, NJ native, who played the entire 45 minutes of action, collected 23 points, eight rebounds, one assist and one steal, while shooting 9-for-22 from the field and 1-for-3 from three-point range. In a non-conference loss to Towson, Hill recorded two points, two rebounds, two assists and three steals. The 5-7 guard currently leads St. Francis (NY) in scoring (12.8 ppg) and steals (1.8 spg) as well as fourth in rebounding (4.5 rpg).

Hill Earns League-Leading 3rd NEC Rookie of the Week Award: The freshman, who earns her league-leading third *Choice Hotels* NEC Rookie of the Week award, averaged 23.0 points in the Terriers' last two games, including a 33-point explosion versus Pittsburgh. Hill also recorded six rebounds, three assists and a steal, while hitting four three-pointers. Before Christmas against Lafayette, Hill registered 13 points and five rebounds to help St. Francis (NY) mount their largest margin of victory since 1997, dropping the Leopards, 58-33. The Orange, NJ product shot a combined 15-of-38 from the field in the two games, 5-of-13 from behind the arc and 11-of-11 from the free-throw line. The newcomer has guided the Terriers in scoring in six of ten games this season and ranks fifth in the league in scoring (15.9 ppg).

Hill Named Rookie of the Week After Terriers Go 2-0 to Start February: Hill is the latest 'Tiffany' to win the *Choice Hotels* NEC Rookie of the Week medal for leading St. Francis (NY) to back-to-back wins last week. Hill takes home her league-leading fourth rookie award, and, along with Mount St. Mary's guard Tiffany Green, has won seven of 11 rookie of the weeks this season. Last week, Hill, a 5-7 guard, helped carry the Terriers, averaging 20.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 3.5 steals, while shooting 52 percent (16-31) from the field. At home against LIU, Hill hit a jumper with 10 seconds left in the game to give the Terriers a 53-51 victory. She finished with 15 points, two rebounds, two steals and a block. On Saturday at FDU, the Orange, NJ native collected a game-high 25 points, four rebounds, one assist, one block and a game-high five steals in the Terriers', 80-73 triumph. Hill shot 11-of-17 from the field, including 3-of-7 from three-point range. On the season, the rookie ranks sixth in the NEC in scoring (14.4 ppg) and 10th in free-throw percentage (.708) after hitting 4-of-5 from the line last week.

Big Kat: 6'7" freshman Katja Bavendam is the tallest women's basketball player in the Northeast Conference this season and is the tallest player in St. Francis women's basketball history.

Playoff Driven: The St. Francis College women's basketball team has not reached the NEC playoffs since the 1998-99 season. That team was 7th seed in the postseason tournament.

DEFENSE: The Terriers have done a good job on the defensive end holding their opponents to low field goal percentages. In the most recent NEC statistics, the Terriers ranked 2nd in the league in 3-pt field goal percentage defense (30.7) and 3rd in the league in field goal percentage defense (39.2).

Off to A Good Start: After going 0-7 in the month of January the St. Francis College women's basketball team won three of four games to start February.

Bennett Powers Terriers: In the win over LIU on February 2nd, Kim Bennett earned her second double-double of the season as she led all players in points and rebounds. Bennett scored 17 points and pulled down 11 rebounds in the victory. She has scored in double-figures for St. Francis 17 out of 24 games this season.

Warrington 's Scoring Statement: Against Mount St. Mary's on January 29th, freshman Linda Warrington, hailing from Belchertown, Massachusetts, earned her first career start. In the game, she notched a new career-high and team-high with 21 points on 8-for-11 shooting, two threes and a perfect 3-for-3 from the foul line. She also added a new career-high in rebounds with six. In scoring 21 points, Warrington is one of only three SFC players to surpass the 20 point mark this season.

Bratton's Boards: Against Mount St. Mary's sophomore Sarah Bratton came off the bench and grabbed a new career-high eight rebounds in 16 minutes of action. She also added five points, an assist and a steal in the game.

Raising Her Game: Freshman Linda Warrington significantly raised her game during the Pennsylvania-Maryland road trip. Over the two game trip, Warrington averaged 33.0 minutes, 16.5 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals per game. In addition, Warrington nailed two three-point field goals in each of the games.

Brilliant Bavendam: 6'7" freshman Katja Bavendam has shown moments of brilliance early in her collegiate career. Against FDU, she scored a career-high 17 points, against Rider she earned her first double-double (12 pts/11reb) and versus Mount on January 6th, she notched 10 points.

Paxhia Returns to Court: Junior guard Justine Paxhia returned to the floor for the first time since December 1st against Mount St. Mary's University on January 6th. Prior to her injury, the Brooklyn native was averaging career-best numbers in several statistical categories. Through the first five games of the season she averaged 10.6 points, 7.8 rebounds, 5.8 assists and 1.2 steals. Paxhia also set new career highs with 11 assists and four steals against Columbia on November 21st. In her first game back she picked up right where she left off scoring seven points, grabbing a game-high 12 rebounds and dishing out a game-high seven assists.

Terriers Lock Down Lafayette: On December 22nd against Lafayette, the Terriers held the Lafayette University Leopards to 33 points in the game, 13 in the first half and 20 in the second, breaking a 29-year record for fewest points allowed in a women's basketball game involving the Terriers. The previous record, 30 points, was in the opening game of the 1975-76 season, a 52-30 victory over New York Community College. The St. Francis defense conceded only ten field goals in the entire contest (10-for-41, 24.4%). The game's margin of victory, 25 points, was the largest margin since the Terriers defeated Fairleigh Dickinson University (82-54) on February 27, 1997.

Setting a New Mark: Freshman Tiffany Hill scored a career high 33 points against the BIG EAST's University of Pittsburgh on December 28, 2004. Her previous career high was 23 points against Fairleigh Dickinson University on December 4th. The last St. Francis player to score at least 33 points was Colleen Carbone's 33 point effort against Mount St. Mary's on January 25, 2003. The last St. Francis College player to score more than 33 points was Christine Cunningham who notched 34 points against Fairleigh Dickinson University on January 19, 1995. The record for most points in a single game is 47 scored by Pam Curcio against CW Post on December 8, 1988.

Weir Climbing Career Three-Point Charts: Senior guard/forward Kim Weir has already made her mark on several St. Francis College history. She currently ranks among the all-time top ten in several three-point field goal statistics.
