Series Record: The Terriers and Colonials meet for the second time this season tonight on the Peter Aquilone Court. The teams met for the first time on January 27th in Moon Township, the Colonials were victorious 70-46. Robert Morris leads the all-time series record 24-13.

Last Time the Teams Met: The Colonials opened the game on a 8-0 run, but the Terriers cut into the lead 13-6 with 14:53 remaining. Two runs from RMU, 12-6 then 15-10 gave the Colonials a 40-22 advantage at intermission. In the second half, the Colonials mounted a 21 point lead, but the Terriers, with a run of their own, cut the deficit to 17 (43-26). Midway through the half, RMU took control and outscored the Terriers 25-18 and won 70-46. RMU's Monsac had a career-high 32 points, while Linda Warrington led the Terriers with 12 points off the bench.

Terrier Update: St. Francis is currently riding a two game win streak after defeating LIU and FDU. The Terriers are 9th in the NEC, nipping at the heels of Central Connecticut, who has four wins in the NEC. NEC Rookie of the Week, Hill continues to lead the Terriers with 14.4 ppg. Kim Bennett, who has had several solid outputs recently, increased her scoring average to 11.0 ppg. She also averages a team-leading 6.1 rpg.

Up Next: The Terriers will stay at home in Brooklyn and host Wagner College on Saturday, February 12th at 6 pm. This game will be a regionally televised game on the Metro TV channel.

Hill Named Rookie of the Week: Hill is the latest 'Tiffany' to win the *Choice Hotels* NEC Rookie of the Week medal for leading St. Francis (NY) to back-to-back wins last week. Hill takes home her league-leading fourth rookie award, and, along with Mount St. Mary's guard Tiffany Green, has won seven of 11 rookie of the weeks this season. Last week, Hill, a 5-7 guard, helped carry the Terriers, averaging 20.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 3.5 steals, while shooting 52 percent (16-31) from the field. At home against LIU, Hill hit a jumper with 10 seconds left in the game to give the Terriers a 53-51 victory. She finished with 15 points, two rebounds, two steals and a block. On Saturday at FDU, the Orange, NJ native collected a game-high 25 points, four rebounds, one assist, one block and a game-high five steals in the Terriers', 80-73 triumph. Hill shot 11-of-17 from the field, including 3-of-7 from three-point range. On the season, the rookie ranks sixth in the NEC in scoring (14.4 ppg) and 10th in free-throw percentage (.708) after hitting 4-of-5 from the line last week.

80 Point Plateau: In the team's last game at FDU, the Terriers defeated the Knights 80-73, marking the first time this season the team has scored 80 points. Prior to this game, St. Francis' highest scoring output was 70 points in the first game of the season against Iona. The last time St. Francis scored 80+ points in a game was on January 17, 2004 against Quinnipiac (97-83).

Top of the Hill: Freshman Tiffany Hill currently leads the Terriers in scoring, she averages 14.4 points per game. To date, she has scored 273 points and led the team in scoring in over half of the team's games this season. Hill is also averaging a team-leading 1.9 steals per game.

Bennett Stepping Up: Senior forward Kim Bennett is averaging 14.0 points per game over the last five games (MU, RMU, MSM, LIU, FDU) and has also averaged 6.2 rebounds per contest. Over this stretch, Bennett has improved her scoring average to 11.0 ppg - ranking 2nd on the team and 14th in the NEC. Also over this span, Bennett is shooting 55.6% from the floor (25/45) and 74.1% from the line (20/27), including her current streak of 11 straight. She now leads the Terriers in rebounding with 6.1 rpg (14th in the NEC). Bennett is also the Terriers most consistent shooter from the floor, connecting on 47.1% of her attempts (82/174) - ranking 10th in the league.

Critical Stretch for Terriers: The St. Francis College women's basketball team, who now stands in 9th place in the Northeast Conference, has gotten off to a great start in the month of February with their sights set on the NEC playoffs. St. Francis defeated LIU, who is ranked #6, last week and then beat #11 FDU on Saturday. Today, St. Francis hosts the NEC's turn-around team, Robert Morris University, hoping to revenge their loss from late January. Then, on Saturday, February 12th, St. Francis meets Wagner for the first of two matchups in Brooklyn. The Seahawks are currently in 10th place and 1-8 in the NEC.

Last Time Out - February 5, 2005
St. Francis 80 - Fairleigh Dickinson 73

Freshman guard Tiffany Hill (Orange, NJ) paced all scorers with 25 points, leading St. Francis NY to an 80-73 victory over host Fairleigh Dickinson in Northeast Conference (NEC) women's basketball action on Saturday.

Senior forward Kim Bennett (Brooklyn, NY) added 20 points and junior guard Justine Paxhia (Brooklyn, NY) contributed 14 points and eight assists for the Terriers.

Junior guard Krissy Suckow (E. Brunswick, NJ) led the Knights with 19 points and freshman forward Jennifer Walkling (Westminster, MD) added 13.

Fairleigh Dickinson (2-18, 1-10 NEC) built an early 8-4 lead, but St. Francis NY (6-13, 3-7 NEC) went on a 17-4 run, getting six points from Hill to gain control and build a 21-12 advantage midway through the first half.

The Terriers still led by nine at 31-22, when the Knights put together a 7-3 spurt, capped by a Shanay Freeman (Laurelton, NY) three-pointer, to pull within five at 34-29 with 4:07 left in the frame.

St. Francis NY responded by scoring the final seven points of the period, including a buzzer-beating three-pointer from Hill, to go into the break with a 41-29 cushion after shooting 53 percent from the field for the half.

St. Francis NY went on a 9-3 run early in the second half to build a 20-point lead at 58-38, a margin the Knights could not recover from.

Fairleigh Dickinson staged a late rally, exploding for an 18-6 run, capped by a Suckow three-pointer with 20 seconds left to cut the deficit to as few as six points, but could pull no closer as time ran out.

Hill finished 11-of-17 from the field, including 3-of-7 from long distance, while registering five steals and four rebounds. Bennett went 6-of-9 from the floor and was perfect at the free throw line, going 8-for-8.

Suckow converted 4-of-10 from the floor, 3-of-6 from beyond the arc and was also a perfect 8-of-8 at the charity stripe for the Knights.

The Knights shot 50 percent from the field in the second half to finish the game at 38 percent. They hit 29-of-38 (76 percent) from the free throw line. St. Francis NY finished 49 percent from the field.

Paxhia and Hill Named to Iona Tipoff All-Tournament Team - Junior point guard Justine Paxhia and freshman guard Tiffany Hill lead the Terriers to a 1-1 record and a 2nd place finish at the Iona Tipoff Tournament (11/21-22). In the win over Iona, Paxhia scored 15 points, grabbed a team-high 8 rebounds and dished out a game-high 6 assists. On Sunday, against Columbia, she dished out a new career-high 11 assists, scored 8 points and had 8 boards. Tiffany Hill scored 11 points against Iona and then a team-high 14 points against Columbia.

Weir Named to South Floirida/Best Western All-Tournament Team - Senior forward Kim Weir helped the Terriers to a 1-1 weekend in South Florida over Thanksgiving. Weir scored 6 points and grabbed a game-high 9 rebounds against South Floirida and then notched her first double-double of the season in the win over Niagara. She scored 15 points and had 11 rebounds in the victory.

Kim Kombination - In the team's game against Niagara University, senior forwards Kim Bennett and Kim Weir led their team to victory after both players posted double-doubles for the first time this season. Bennett scored a team-high 16 points and Weir notched 15 points. Both players grabbed 11 rebounds each in the game.

Buzzer Beaters - In the final seconds of the team's game against Niagara University, junior Justine Paxhia scored the game winning basket to lift her team over the Purple Eagles (50-48). On December 4th, freshman Tiffany Hill nailed a foul line jumper in overtime to lift the Terriers to a one-point victory over Fairleigh Dickinson University, 63-62.

Bavendam Helps Lead Terriers to Victory over FDU: Freshman Katja Bavendam added a career-high 17 points in the Terriers victory over FDU in early December. Bavendam also grabbed four rebounds and swatted two shots in a season-high 30 minutes.

Prado For Three: against Towson, sophomore Marjorie Prado came off the bench to score a team-high and personal season-high 12 points on four three-point field goals. As a freshman, Prado nailed 25 three-point field goals.

Double-Double for Big K: 6'7" freshman Katja Bavendam earned her first collegiate double-double in her first collegiate start against Rider University. She scored 12 points on 5-of-12 shooting and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds. Bavendam also added a career-high 2 assists in the game.

Warrington Debuts in Boston, Continues Good Play at Home: Against Northeastern on December 18th, freshman Linda Warrington, who hails from Belchertown, Massachusetts, made the most of her then career high 13 minutes of play. Warrington nailed 3 of her 6 attempted shots, including one three-point field goal, scoring a career high seven points. She also added a team high and career high five rebounds in the contest. In the following game against Lafayette, Warrington came off the bench and played 27 minutes, scoring six points, grabbing three rebounds and collecting three steals.

Paxhia Sets Team Record: In her first game back from her injury, junior point guard grabbed 12 rebounds, a team-season-high. She pulled down six defensive and six offensive rebounds, both were game-highs.

Hill's Streak Ends: Freshman Tiffany Hill hit 22 straight free throws before missing one against Central Connecticut State University. Hill is shooting 70.8% (51/72) from the foul line this season - ranking 2nd on the team.

Hill Earns First NEC's Rookie of the Week Honor of 2004-05: Hill earned all-tournament team honors at the Iona College Tip Tournament after guiding St. Francis (NY) to a 1-1 record last week, including a win in the Terriers' season opener against Iona and a loss to Columbia in the championship game. The 5-7 guard added 11 points, six rebounds and three steals in 24 minutes versus Iona after fighting through first-half foul trouble. Against the Lions, Hill played in all 40 minutes, scoring a team-high 14 points, grabbing two rebounds and recording two steals and a block. The freshman shot 11-for-26 from the field combined in the two games.

Hill Earns 2nd NEC Rookie of the Week Award: Tiffany Hill pushed St. Francis (NY) to an overtime, NEC season-opening win against Fairleigh Dickinson. With St. Francis (NY) trailing FDU by three points with 1:21 remaining in the extra period, Hill remarkably scored six points in the final 81 seconds, including the gamewinner as time expired to seal the win for the Terriers. For the contest, the Orange, NJ native, who played the entire 45 minutes of action, collected 23 points, eight rebounds, one assist and one steal, while shooting 9-for-22 from the field and 1-for-3 from three-point range. In a non-conference loss to Towson, Hill recorded two points, two rebounds, two assists and three steals. The 5-7 guard currently leads St. Francis (NY) in scoring (12.8 ppg) and steals (1.8 spg) as well as fourth in rebounding (4.5 rpg).

Hill Earns League-Leading 3rd NEC Rookie of the Week Award: The freshman, who earns her league-leading third *Choice Hotels* NEC Rookie of the Week award, averaged 23.0 points in the Terriers' last two games, including a 33-point explosion versus Pittsburgh. Hill also recorded six rebounds, three assists and a steal, while hitting four three-pointers. Before Christmas against Lafayette, Hill registered 13 points and five rebounds to help St. Francis (NY) mount their largest margin of victory since 1997, dropping the Leopards, 58-33. The Orange, NJ product shot a combined 15-of-38 from the field in the two games, 5-of-13 from behind the arc and 11-of-11 from the free-throw line. The newcomer has guided the Terriers in scoring in six of ten games this season and ranks fifth in the league in scoring (15.9 ppg).

DEFENSE: The Terriers have done a good job on the defensive end holding their opponents to low field goal percentages. As of the NEC statistics on Feb. 7th, the Terriers ranked 2nd in the league in 3-pt field goal percentage defense (30.7) and 4th in the league in field goal percentage defense (40.0).

Off to A Good Start: After going 0-7 in the month of January the St. Francis College women's basketball team won their first two games in the month of February. Last season the Terriers closed in on the NEC playoff race during February, winning three games during the 28 day month.

Bennett Powers Terriers: In the win over LIU on February 2nd, Kim Bennett earned her second double-double of the season as she led all players in points and rebounds. Bennett scored 17 points and pulled down 11 rebounds in the victory. She has scored in double-figures for St. Francis 13 out of 19 games this season.

Warrington 's Scoring Statement: Against Mount St. Mary's on January 29th, freshman Linda Warrington, hailing from Belchertown, Massachusetts, earned her first career start. In the game, she notched a new career-high and team-high with 21 points on 8-for-11 shooting, two threes and a perfect 3-for-3 from the foul line. She also added a new career-high in rebounds with six. In scoring 21 points, Warrington is one of only three SFC players to surpass the 20 point mark this season.

Bratton's Boards: Against Mount St. Mary's sophomore Sarah Bratton came off the bench and grabbed a new career-high eight rebounds in 16 minutes of action. She also added five points, an assist and a steal in the game.

Raising Her Game: Freshman Linda Warrington significantly raised her game during the Pennsylvania-Maryland road trip. Over the two game trip, Warrington averaged 33.0 minutes, 16.5 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals per game. In addition, Warrington nailed two three-point field goals in each of the games.

Brilliant Bavendam: 6'7" freshman Katja Bavendam has shown moments of brilliance early in her collegiate career. Against FDU, she scored a career-high 17 points, against Rider she earned her first double-double (12 pts/11reb) and versus Mount on January 6th, she notched 10 points.

Warrington Shines Bright at RMU: Freshman swingman Linda Warrington came off the Terrier bench to score 12 points at Robert Morris. In the same game, Warrington also added then career-highs in steals (3), field goals made (5) and 3-pt field goals made (2).

Paxhia Returns to Court: Junior guard Justine Paxhia returned to the floor for the first time since December 1st against Mount St. Mary's University on January 6th. Prior to her injury, the Brooklyn native was averaging career-best numbers in several statistical categories. Through the first five games of the season she averaged 10.6 points, 7.8 rebounds, 5.8 assists and 1.2 steals. Paxhia also set new career highs with 11 assists and four steals against Columbia on November 21st. In her first game back she picked up right where she left off scoring seven points, grabbing a game-high 12 rebounds and dishing out a game-high seven assists.

Terriers Lock Down Lafayette: On December 22nd against Lafayette, the Terriers held the Lafayette University Leopards to 33 points in the game, 13 in the first half and 20 in the second, breaking a 29-year record for fewest points allowed in a women's basketball game involving the Terriers. The previous record, 30 points, was in the opening game of the 1975-76 season, a 52-30 victory over New York Community College. The St. Francis defense conceded only ten field goals in the entire contest (10-for-41, 24.4%). The game's margin of victory, 25 points, was the largest margin since the Terriers defeated Fairleigh Dickinson University (82-54) on February 27, 1997.

Her previous career high was 23 points against Fairleigh Dickinson University on December 4th. The last St. Francis player to score at least 33 points was Colleen Carbone's 33 point effort against Mount St. Mary's on January 25, 2003. The last St. Francis College player to score more than 33 points was Christine Cunningham who notched 34 points against Fairleigh Dickinson University on January 19, 1995. The record for most points in a single game is 47 scored by Pam Curcio against CW Post on December 8, 1988.
