Series Record: The Red Flash have won the last four meetings against St. Francis-NY to take a 35-27 lead in the all-time series, which dates back to 1929-30. Saint Francis won both meetings each of the past two seasons, including a 92-84 triple overtime thriller last Jan. 24, 2008, at DeGol Arena. In the longest game in Saint Francis University history, six players scored in double-digits, including an 8-of-17, 21 point, 11 rebound effort from Devin Sweetney. Grant Surprenant came off the bench to hit 6-of-9 three-point attempts for 18 points. He hit 3-pointers at the end of the first and second overtimes to force tie scores and an extra session. The Red Flash later defeated the Terriers, 63-50, on Valentine's Day in Brooklyn, N.Y. SFU has won two straight, and four of the last five meetings at DeGol Arena.

Scouting the Red Flash: Saint Francis (PA) comes into the game 3-5, 0-1 NEC after falling to Long Island University (73-58) in their NEC opener. The Flash picked up two road victories against Youngstown State (66-65) and Morgan State (65-61). Leading the Red Flash in scoring and rebounding this season is Devin Sweetney averaging 13.9 PPG, and 7.5 RPG.

Up Next: The Terriers will travel back to Brooklyn to host Columbia University on Tuesday night at 7:00 PM, before heading to Nassau County to take on Hofstra University next Saturday at 4:00 PM on MSG+.

Broadcast: The St. Francis- Saint Francis (PA) game can be heard on the Terrier Sports Network on SFCathletics.com. Game coverage begins at 11:40 PM, as Nicholas Guerriero calls all the action from the DeGol Arena. The game will also be televised on MSG at noon with Dave Popkin and Terry O'Connor with the call.

TERRIER SPORTS NETWORK (TSN)

Brooklyn Heights, NY— Director of Athletics Irma Garcia has announced an extension of the Terrier Sports Network for men's and women's basketball games this season. Live video coverage will be available for most home games this season as well as live radio coverage on the road.

"This is the first season of video streaming at the College and I'm delighted that we will be working with Stretch Internet again this season for a lot of our internet broadcasts," said Garcia. "We're really looking forward to giving all of our student-athletes the exposure that they deserve. We certainly feel that we are now on the cutting edge in terms of web broadcasting and video streaming."

St. Francis College play-by-play announcer Nicholas Guerriero will begin his fifth season as the voice of the Terriers.

"I'm really looking forward to entering this season, not only will St. Francis be on the cutting edge in mass media within the conference, but in the NCAA as a whole. This season, the network plans on giving the fans a real treat as far as broadcasts are concerned." "With video streaming, fans inside and outside of Brooklyn will get to see the Terriers in a whole new light."

Broadcasts will consist of pre and post game shows; in-depth analysis of players and coaches as well as interviews during the game from our sideline reporters.

Brian Morales, Assistant Sports Information Intern, will return to the broadcasts on a more behind the scenes aspect. Morales will be in-charge of setting up interviews and coordinating broadcasts while doing day-to-day activities in the Sports Information Department. On select road games, he will join the broadcast as a commentator.

"I am really excited to see the launch of video streaming for St. Francis this upcoming season. While working for the broadcast last season on radio, we (Terrier Sports Network) realized that our fans were really into each broadcast. Since technology is constantly changing, we decided to take Terrier Sports Network to the next level as well," said Morales.

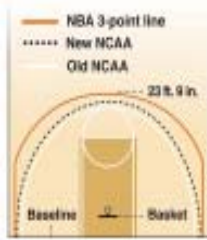
New to the network this season will be student-interns Ashley Kalmar and Deron Cummings. Kalmar, a Communications Arts Major, will be responsible for producing all video components that come along with streaming the games and also will oversee engineering audio functions for the radio contests. Cummings, also a Communications Arts Major, will be the camera operator and will assist in the broadcasts in other various positions.

In addition to broadcasting most men's and women's basketball games live, the network will feature Terrier contests and special events throughout the year. Numerous podcasts featuring interviews with coaches and student-athletes will also air on TSN. All broadcasts will be free of charge for Terrier fans.

All archived shows can be heard through iTunes, and fans will have the ability to purchase old broadcasts through the Stretch Internet website.

TERRIER TIDBITS

MOVING THE LINE BACK; ONLY MAKES US STRONGER



Not only did the Terriers hit 17 three point baskets against Hartford, which was the most trifecta's made by any Northeast Conference member school since Monmouth hit 19 at Long Island on February 21st, 1998; but the Terriers hit 17 against Robert Morris to tie the team record. These accomplishments are game highs for the Terriers in the 22 year history of the three point line since its inception in 1986.

SLICK RICK



Sophomore point guard Ricky Cadell made an immediate impact as a freshman last season. The lead guard averaged 9.3 ppg and averaged 29.8 mpg in 07-08. He notched double-figures in points in 13 games and had a streak of six straight contests with double-digit points. This season the New York, NY native is averaging 12.5 points per game. Cadell has notched double-digits in four games this season.

KAYODE HOWLS IN STARTING ROLE



Forward Kayode Ayeni, now a starter as a junior, has been the most impressive Terriers after the first four contests. The Brooklyn native turned in a terrific outing in the season-opener at Seton Hall on 11/14, matching his career-high output in points (19), rebounds (13), and blocks (3) against the Pirates. Ayeni, who averaged 7.7 points and 5.7 rebounds per game last season, also established a new career-high as he went 9-of-11 from the foul line. He followed that up with his second straight double-double with 18 points and 11 boards at Navy on 11/18. He now has three career double-doubles, two of which have come against Navy. At Hartford, Ayeni added 16 points before fouling out in the team's double-OT loss. In the home opener vs. Manhattan Kay, added 11 points and 7 rebounds in the team's first win of the season.

BOMBS AWAY FOR THE PRESIDENT; 1,000 POINTS ON THE HORIZON



Despite his 5'8" size, senior guard Jamaal Womack is a big man on campus at St. Francis. The Terriers' sharpshooter is the President of the Student Government Association and recently delivered a speech at the inauguration of new school president, Brendan J. Dugan, this past October. Womack sank his 164th career trey against Seton Hall and he is now third all-time at SFC. He ranks second among active Northeast Conference players. Last season, the Bronx native connected on 72 long range bombs. This season, the Bronx native is off to a slow start as he is just 13-of-41 from behind the arc. Womack needs 102 points to reach 1,000 career points

SERBIAN SHOOTING, SERBIAN SCORING



Freshman guard Stefan Perunicic, a native of Belgrade, Serbia, has found a niche as a three point sharp-shooter for the Terriers this season. His career-high of 28 points at Robert Morris is a St. Francis NY freshman record for points in a game. His seven trifectas in the game are also a freshman record. Perunicic is averaging 14.3 points per game and is on pace to hit over 100 three point baskets this season. His previous high was 21 points at Navy where he hit five shots from the outside.



HE'S NOT NEW TO NY, NOR IS NEW TO NAILING ASSISTS

Freshman guard Justin Newton is already seeing quality minutes off the bench and in key sports for the team early in the season. The Brooklyn native received 29 minutes vs. Hartford, 26 minutes vs. Navy, and 15 minutes in the season-opener at Seton Hall. Newton played a solid floor game, delivering a career-high five assists, one block and a steal against the Hawks. The continued development of Newton could allow starting point guard Ricky Cadell to play more minutes at the shooting guard position.



THE RETURN OF GRIFF

Assistant Coach Allen Griffin is back for his second stint on the Terriers' bench. Griffin, who was a standout player for Jim Boeheim at Syracuse from 1997-2001, coached last season at Providence. Griffin was an assistant coach under Brian Nash in Brooklyn Heights during the 2005-06 campaign. Griffin is just one of five players who accumulated 400 or more career assists and 200 or more assists in one season. As a senior, he captained the team and averaged 10.8 points and 6.5 assists.

TERRIERS ON THE TUBE



St. Francis will be featured four times this season on the Madison Square Garden Network. Road games against NEC rivals St. Francis (PA) (12/6), LIU (1/19), as well as a road game at Hofstra (12/13) on their sister station MSG+. The home tilt against St. Francis (PA) (1/24) will also air on the network.

FANTASTIC SEVEN



Head Coach Brian Nash has brought in seven newcomers to the 2008-2009 squad. The group includes four true freshman and three junior college transfers. Three players, FR Stefan Perunicic, FR Tom Ward, and FR Richard Clark come from foreign soil. Perunicic hails from Belgrade, Serbia and Ward and Perunicic are natives of England. In fact, Ward and Clark played together in the Canary Islands last season. FR Justin Newton and JR Nigel Byam are both Brooklyn natives. JR Herman Wrice is from Philadelphia and JR Nigel Lee is from Maryland.

REJECTED! THERE GOES MR. GREY BEARD



In six games this season the Terriers are averaging 5.5 blocks per game. Highlights so far saw the Terriers swat eight flying rubber orange balls in their home opener against Manhattan. Then in their conference opener at Robert Morris the team had another eight blocks.

HE-MAN: BY THE POWER OF GREY SKULL I HAVE THE POWER

Junior Herman Wrice is third in the conference in blocked shots averaging 2.33 per game. Wrice's had five blocks against Manhattan on November 26. Wrice then tied the career-high with another five blocks at Robert Morris on December 4th, including two blocks in the finals minute of play.

“Nature Boy” Ricky Cadell’s 19 points at Robert Morris was a single point shy of his career record of 20 that he notched vs. Monmouth University last season. Cadell has scored in double digits in the last four games after scoring nine points respectively in the first two games. With the addition of Justin Newton running the point for an average of 21 minutes a game, Coach Nash has the option of running Ricky as the shooting guard with combinations of Newton-Cadell-Perunicic or Newton-Cadell-Womack. Ricky scored six points in the final 1:05 against Robert Morris just on foul shoots going a perfect 6-6. In the Manhattan victory Cadell went 3-4 in the final minute from the line. On the season in games that the Terriers pull out with a win, Cadell is 9-10 from the line in the final 1:05 of regulation.

THE MATINEE TICKET



Kayode Ayeni’s 14 points – 7 rebound performance at Robert Morris was the fourth time this season in which he scored in double figures and had at least seven boards. Last season the junior from Brooklyn had five game in which he had at least double digits and seven ore more rebounds (12 points – 9 rebounds @ Maine), (14 points – 13 rebounds vs. Navy), (12 points – 7 rebounds @ Saint Francis), (15 points – 7 rebounds @ Robert Morris), and (19 points – 13 rebound vs. Long Island)

NEWARK,NJ --- Junior forward Kayode Ayeni matched his career-high in points (19) and rebounds (13), but it wasn't enough, as the Terriers fell to Seton Hall, 88-61, Friday evening at the Prudential Center in Newark, New Jersey.

St. Francis took a 17-14 advantage after Ayeni slammed home an offensive rebound at the 11:02 mark. The Terriers later took their final lead of the contest when sophomore guard Ricky Cadell knocked down a jump shot to make it 23-21 with 8:05 to play. SHU took control from then on, ripping off 14 straight points over the next four-plus minutes. Senior John Garcia started the run with a jumper, and he later threw down a thunderous dunk that junior Eugene Harvey followed with a bucket to make it 35-23 at the 3:06 mark.

Paul Gause buried a 3-pointer with 1:30 left to push the lead to 14, and the Pirates carried a 42-28 edge into halftime.

SHU came out of halftime with a flurry as Gause drained another trifecta 15 seconds in before making a steal and feeding Jeremy Hazell (23 points) for a 3-pointer to make it 48-28 and force a Terriers' timeout. Another Hazell bomb at the 18:55 mark completed a 9-1 run out of the break.

Ayeni, who had eight offensive rebounds and equaled his career-best with three blocks, made 5-of-13 field goal attempts and also went 9-of-11 from the line. Cadell added nine points and three steals and sophomore Rocco Rubino added nine points.

The Terriers shot just 35.1 percent (20-of-57) overall and were struggled mightily from three-point land (5-of-27). The Pirates shot 51.7 percent (30-of-58) and were 6-of-13 from long range.

ANNAPOLIS, MD --- St. Francis (NY) freshman guard Stefan Perunicic scored 21 points, but it wasn't enough as the Terriers dropped a 75-63 decision against Navy in Annapolis, Maryland on Tuesday evening. The Terriers fell to 0-2 and Navy improved to 2-1.

Perunicic, who connected on 8-of-11 field goals (5-of-8 three pt. attempts) in the contest, drilled a three-point field goal thirty-five seconds into the second half to give the Terriers their only lead of the game at 32-30. The Midshipmen then went on a 13-3 spurt to go out in front 43-35 with 14:36 remaining. Navy increased their lead to nine points, 50-41, with 11:13 left after Adam Teague hit a jumper. But the Terriers went on a mini 5-1 run to close to within 51-46 as junior forward Kayode Ayeni connected on a trey and Ricky Cadell flipped in a driving lay-up with 9:33 to play. After falling behind 56-46, the Terriers made one final push as freshman Richard Clark came off the bench to score five consecutive points, helping to trim the deficit to 56-51 with 6:53 remaining. However, the Mids answered with five consecutive points of their own to push their advantage back to 10 points, 61-51, with 5:21 on the clock. The Terriers were only able to get as close as seven points the rest of the way.

St. Francis was able to recover from a sluggish start to open the game as they fell behind 14-2 right out of the gate. The Terriers got right back into the game as they scored eight straight points in a span of just under three minutes. Perunicic scored the final five points of the stretch and junior Nigel Byam started things off with a conventional three-point play. After falling behind again by double-figures at 20-10 with 8:26 left, the Terriers stormed back again, embarking on an 11-3 run to trim the deficit to 23-21 with 4:26 remaining. Ayeni scored five of his 18 points during the stretch and later drilled a long range bomb with thirty-five seconds remaining in the half to bring St. Francis within 30-29 at the break.

Ayeni recorded his second straight double-double as he grabbed a team-high 11 rebounds, nine on the defensive end. He converted 4-of-13 field goal attempts (3-of-6 three pointers) and was 7-of-9 from the line. Cadell added nine points on 4-of-8 shooting.

The Terriers shot 40.7 percent overall (22-of-54) and were 9-of-22 from behind the arc.

Navy, who shot 49.1 percent from the floor, was paced by Kaleo Kina's 19 points. Chris Harris added 17 points and four assists.

WEST HARTFORD, CT – The St. Francis (NY) Terriers suffered a heartbreaking 91-82 double overtime setback against the Hartford Hawks, Saturday afternoon at Chase Arena at Reich Family Pavilion. Hartford (1-3) outscored St. Francis (0-3), 12-3 in the final overtime period.

Senior guard **Jamaal Womack** led five Terriers in double figures with 17 points. Junior forward **Kayode Ayeni** and freshman forward **Stefan Perunicic** each added 16 points. Sophomore guard **Rocco Rubino** scored a career-high 15 points (4-of-6 three-point field goals) and classmate **Ricky Cadell** chipped in with 10 points, six boards and a career-high seven assists.

The Hawks were led by the tandem of senior Jaret von Rosenberg and junior Joe Zeglinski. Von Rosenberg poured in a game-high 24 points, including a layup and four clutch free throws in the final minute of the contest. Zeglinski finished with 22 points, a game-high 10 rebounds and five assists.

Hartford led 85-82 with under a minute to play in the second overtime when Zeglinski and von Rosenberg hooked up on the play of the game. With the shot clock winding down, Zeglinski found himself swarmed at the top of the key by two St. Francis defenders. He spun through the defenders with the intention of putting up a shot to beat the shot clock, but at the last second changed his mind and found von Rosenberg under the hoop for an easy layup to put the Hawks up five with 47 seconds to go.

While the decisive play in the final period occurred in the paint, the game was largely played behind the three-point arc. Hartford hit 57 percent of its three-point attempts, shooting 16-for-28 from deep in the game and 3-for-5 in overtime. St. Francis shot 17-for-39 from beyond the arc.

For much of the game, it didn't look like overtime would be necessary. Hartford led by as much as 14 points in the first half when sophomore Anthony Minor hit a free throw to make the score 40-26 with 1:01 remaining before the break. St. Francis' Rubino hit a three-pointer with six seconds to play in the half to cut Hartford's lead to 11 at the half, 40-29.

St. Francis clawed its way back into the game in the second half, chipping away at the Hartford lead until it tied the game at 63-63 with 3:56 remaining in regulation. The Terriers took their first lead of the half at 65-63 on a jumper by Ayeni with 2:40 to play. St. Francis led by one when senior Michael Turner went to the free throw line with 22 seconds remaining. He missed on his first attempt but tied the game at 66-66 with his second, and Womack hoisted up a game-winning three-point attempt on the other end that was off the mark from the left wing.

The first overtime saw the team's trade baskets for five minutes. Hartford took a 78-77 lead on a Zeglinski three with 1:23 to play, and freshman Genesis Maciel added a free throw 30 seconds later to increase the lead to two. St. Francis, however, tied the game on its next possession on a jumper by Cadell. The Hawks had the final possession but couldn't get a quality shot, as Zeglinski was forced to put up a long three at the buzzer.

St. Francis won the tip in the second overtime and took a quick lead behind a Womack trey. It would be the Terriers only points in the final overtime, as Hartford answered with 12 straight points. Zeglinski tied the game with his sixth three-pointer of the contest, and the Hawks took the lead on a von Rosenberg free throw. Following a pair of freebies from Maciel, the Hawks pumped the lead to five on the Zeglinski-to-von Rosenberg layup. Von Rosenberg, who scored seven of Hartford's 12 points in the second overtime, closed out the game with four free throws in the final 31 seconds.

BROOKLYN, NY --- Sophomore forward **Kayode Ayeni** (Brooklyn, NY/Laurinburg) scored seven points in the final 3:56 to lift the St. Francis (NY) Terriers to a 70-68 victory against the Manhattan Jaspers, Wednesday evening in their home opener. St. Francis improved to 1-3 and the Jaspers suffered their first lost of the season and fell to 3-1.

Ayeni, who finished with 11 points, seven rebounds, and three steals, hit a clutch three-point field goal with 3:56 left to give the Terriers the lead for another 59-57. St. Francis, who led by as many as ten points in the second half, watched Manhattan take the lead at 57-56 after junior guard **Darryl Crawford** (Harlem, NY/All Hallows) hit a wild reverse lay-up at the 3:34 mark. But Ayeni answered with a long trey from the right wing on the next possession. The Terriers then ran off four consecutive points to go up 63-57 as Ayeni made two free throws and junior forward **Herman Wrice** (Philadelphia, PA) converted a layup after picking up a loose ball. Pearson led Manhattan with 18 points and seven assists and Crawford added 17.

St. Francis shot 48.8 percent from the floor and made 9-18 from three-point territory. Manhattan converted 40 percent of their field goal attempts and were 9-17 from behind the arc.

Queens, NY - -The St. Francis (NY) Terriers gave the St. John's Red Storm all that they could handle but eventually were edged, 69-61, on Monday evening at Carnesecca Arena. The Terriers dropped to 1-4 and the Red Storm improved to 6-1.

Sophomore guard Ricky Cadell led the Terriers with 15 points on 5-10 from the floor and junior Herman Wrice added a season-high 12 points (6-9 fga) and also corralled six boards.

The Terriers had the St. John's crowd in stunned disbelief as they whittled a 39-20 halftime deficit to just three points, 62-59, with just 2:08 remaining in the game. The Terriers made their run over a three minute stretch of the second half as they went on a 9-1 spurt to close within 52-48 with 10:03 left. Cadell scored seven points during the period. After keeping the game close down the stretch, St. Francis had an opportunity to knot the score at 62 with 1:04 remaining but senior guard Jamaal Womack misfired on a 3-pointer from the left wing. D.J. Kennedy then hit a pair of free throws with fifty-four seconds left to give the hosts a 64-59 edge. Terrier junior forward Kayode Ayeni hit one of two from the charity stripe to trim the lead to 64-60 with thirty-seven ticks remaining. After Kennedy made one of two on the other end, St. Francis sophomore guard Rocco Rubino converted one of his two attempts on the line to make the score 65-61 with twenty-six seconds on the clock. But Paris Horne and Justin Burrell added a pair of layups for the hosts in the final seconds for the games final points.

St. Francis shot just 38.3 percent (23-60) from the floor in the contest but were much better in the second half, hitting 42.9 percent (15-35).

Kennedy led the Red Storm with 17 points and 13 rebounds. St. John's shot 46 percent in the contest but the Terriers held them to just 32 percent in the second half.

MOON TOWNSHIP, PA — Freshman Stefan Perunicic (Belgrade, Serbia) set a St. Francis freshman single game scoring record with 28 points, including 7 baskets from the outside. St. Francis improved to (2-4, 1-0 NEC) as they defeated the Robert Morris Colonials (3-4, 0-1 NEC) 87-79 at the Charles L. Sewall Center on Thursday night in the Northeast Conference season opener.

The Terriers tied a previous season high of 17 baskets from beyond the arc. On the season, the team has connected on 65 trifectas, the most of any NEC team.

Perunicic started off the game with a jumper fifteen seconds into regulation, in what became a twenty point half for the Serb. The Terriers led by many as six, until the Colonials went on an 8-0 run culminating with a Gary Wallace three pointer with 12:02 remaining.

The Terriers regained the lead 25-24 on a Perunicic trifecta with 8:23 remaining. Both teams went shot for shot until Jamaal Womack (Bronx, NY / Our Savior Lutheran), who entered the game averaging 25 points in his previous two outings at the Sewall Center, hit his only three of the half. Kayode Ayeni (Brooklyn, NY/Laurinburg Prep) ended the half with a lay-up sending the team to the locker room up three and also preserved a 2-0 record when the Terriers lead going into the locker room. St. Francis hit a season and conference high nine outside shots in the half.

The Colonials opened up the second half on a 5-0 run, until Perunicic's twenty-third point of the game relinquished the lead and secured the victory. The Terriers went on an 8-0 run, giving them a 51-45 lead until Jeremy Chappell nailed a jumper to cut it back to within four. The Colonials came close to tying the game only cutting it to a one point deficit on two different occasions. Freshman Justin Newton (Brooklyn, NY / Poly Prep) hit a three pointer with 3:11 remaining to give the team their largest lead of the night at eleven.

Sophomore Ricky Cadell (New York, NY / The Patterson School) finished with 19 points, a season high and was a point shy of his career high which was set against Monmouth last season. Cadell shot 2-3 from behind the arc and 7-8 from the line with two assists in 30 minutes of play.

Ayeni finished with 14 points on 5-8 from the field, and 3-4 from the three with seven rebounds.

Defensively for the Terriers, junior Herman Wrice (Philadelphia, PA / Monroe CC) tied a career-high with his second game in which he blocked five shots. Wrice had two rejections in the final minute of play; first with: 57 seconds remaining on a Jimmy Langhurts attempted lay-up then on the next possession with: 30 seconds remaining on a Jeremy Chappell lay-up. The team tied their season high of 8 blocks, with the previous encounter happening against Manhattan the teams other victory.
