Now in his fifth season as Head Coach of the St. Francis College Terriers, Brian Nash is extremely excited about the team that he's assembled for 2009-2010. "There's no question that we have the talent to be one of the better teams in the Northeast Conference this season," said Nash. "But I think what I like the most about our team is that we have a good group of kids that will be willing to work extremely hard day in and day out."

Last season, Nash did a terrific job of guiding the Terriers into the NEC Tournament after missing the cut in 2007-2008. The team lost one of their top players and leaders, Kayode Ayeni, to a knee injury early in the season but Nash was able to get the most out of the rest of his roster to make up for the loss.

Nash has clearly infused a great deal of talent into the program for this year and the immediate future. The Terriers have added Seton Hall transfer Mike Davis for next season and his addition will give St. Francis (NY) one of the most formidable frontcourts in the conference.

Nash became the 16th head coach of the St. Francis men's basketball team back on March 30, 2005. He joins a legacy that dates back more than a century. Nash, who played high school basketball in Brooklyn and has strong ties to the local area, came to St. Francis College from Seton Hall University, where he served as assistant coach under Louis Orr (2001-2005).

While at Seton Hall, Nash helped lead the Pirates to the 2nd round in the NCAA tournament in 2004 and the 1st round of the NIT in 2003. During Nash's four-year tenure at Seton Hall, he was primarily responsible for recruiting, opponent scouting, game day preparation, organizing and instructing individual skill workouts, monitoring academic progress for designated student-athletes and performing community service and public speaking engagements.

Prior to Seton Hall, Nash was assistant basketball coach at Siena College (2000-2001) where he also served as the Saint's recruiting coordinator. He was responsible for opponent scouting and game day preparation as well as monitoring student-athlete academic performance and performing various community service and public speaking projects. The Saints finished the season 20-11 overall and 12-6 in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and in a three-way tie for the regular-season title in MACC.

Nash's professional coaching career began at Sacred Heart University (1993-94) before he moved on to work at St. Bonaventure University from 1994 through 2000.

A 1988 graduate of Bishop Ford High School in Brooklyn, Nash played high school basketball under his father, Raymond Nash, a 1963 St. Francis College graduate and St. Francis College Hall of Fame member. He went on to play basketball for four years at Keene State College in Keene, N.H., where he was team captain from 1990-92. After graduating from Keene State College, Nash returned home to serve as assistant coach at his alma mater in Brooklyn.

In addition to Nash's coaching experience at the collegiate level, he was also an assistant coach for the Empire State Games New York City Region open men's basketball team in 2005. In addition, he served as an assistant coach for the US All-Stars Touring Team in Italy and Greece in 2001 and was an assistant coach for the US All-Stars vs. Ukrainian National Team in 1999. Nash has been a basketball instructor at Five-Star, Eastern Invitational and Metro Index basketball camps.

Professionally, Nash is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

Nash resides in New Jersey with his wife, Kristen, son, Jack, and daughter, Abigail.

## FORMER SETON HALL BIG MAN MIKE DAVIS TRANSFERS TO ST. FRANCIS (NY)



St. Francis (NY) head coach Brian Nash announced that former Seton Hall big man **Mike Davis** (Brooklyn Academy/Brooklyn, NY) has enrolled at the College. He must sit out the 2009-10 season, and will have two seasons of eligibility remaining when he suits up for the Terriers in 2010-11.

Davis, a 6-11 center, played two years at Seton Hall University in the Big East. Davis appeared in 30 games for the Pirates last season, averaging 2.6 points and

2.3 rebounds a game. He shot 45.6 percent from the field and was third on the team with 17 blocked shots. Davis had a career-high 13 points in a win over the Terriers on November 14 and grabbed a career-high nine rebounds in a win over Monmouth December 2. He also blocked two shots at Notre Dame January 10.

Davis played in 31 games his freshman season, averaging 2.7 points and 2.5 rebounds a game. He scored eight points, grabbed four rebounds and had four blocks against Louisville January 19, and then pulled down seven rebounds at Villanova February 9. Davis notched eight points and had three rejections against Syracuse March 5. He also was on the Big East Academic All-Star Team in 2008.

"I am very excited that Mike has chosen to become a part of our family here at St. Francis College," said coach Nash. A player of his size and skill will have a chance to make a big impact on our program."

Davis, who was ranked the 17th-best center in the class of 2006 by the web site Rivals.com., will be allowed to practice with the team this season.

## MIKE GLOVER SIGNS WITH TERRIERS

St. Francis (NY) head coach Brian Nash announced today that 6-foot-6 power forward **Mike Glover** has signed a national-letter-of-intent to play for the Terriers next season.

Glover, who is currently enrolled at the College of Eastern Utah, is the younger brother of former St. John's standout Anthony Glover. He will provide the Terriers with a strong rebounding presence and is good finisher around the basket.

He guided his prep school, Boys to Men Academy (Ill.), to a national championship in 2006. Glover then teamed with current Sacramento Kings' standout rookie, Tyreke Evans, at America Christian School (Aston, PA) in 2007. That year, he was selected to play for the New York City team in the Jordan Brand Classic Regional Game at Madison Square Garden.

Glover initially committed to Seton Hall and arrived on campus in the summer of 2007, however the NCAA ruled that he was an academic non-qualifier.

Glover, a Bronx native, will join former Seton Hall center **Mike Davis** (Brooklyn, NY / Brooklyn Academy) next season in the Terriers' frontcourt. The 6-foot-11 Davis is currently enrolled at St. Francis and is practicing with the squad this season.

Sophomore forward Stefan Perunicic added 8 points but was just 3-of-11 from the field. Junior Alexander Harrington chipped in with 8 rebounds.

The Terriers were just 18-for-58 (31 percent) from the floor and were outrebounded by a 43-32 margin. Boston College shot at a 45.9 percent (28-of-61) clip.

St. Francis led 7-4 after Perunicic drilled a long trey from the left wing at the 16:09 mark, but the Eagles went on a 15-0 run to grab a 19-7 advantage with 12:15 left in the opening half.

A 9-3 mini-spurt by the Eagles increased their lead to 28-10 at the 8:15 mark.

The Terriers cut the deficit to 32-22 with 1:48 left as Bennett scored back-to-back baskets, but that was as close as they would get the rest of the way.

Tyler Roche led four Eagles in double-figures with 19 points.

### Game 3. Canisius 79, SFNY 69

The Terriers dropped to 0-3 after falling to the Canisius Golden Griffins, 79-69, Saturday afternoon at the Pope Physical Education Center. The Griffs improved to 1-1 on the campaign.

Sophomore guard Ricky Cadell returned to the lineup to lead the Terriers with 22 points and junior Akeem Bennett added 21 points, 6 rebounds, and 4 assists. Sophomore Stefan Perunicic came off the bench to contribute a season-high 17 points.

St. Francis trailed 37-34 at the break but the visitors scored the first four points of the final stanza to grab a 41-34 advantage with 18:24 remaining in the contest. A trey by Cadell brought the Terriers within 4 points, 41-37, with 17:37 left but that was as close as they would get the rest of the way. A 9-3 run by the Griffs extended their lead to 50-40 at the 14:20 mark. Frank Turner, who scored a game-high 27 points, scored 6 of his points during the spurt.

The Terriers were within 50-43 after Cadell delivered another 3-pointer at the 13:52 mark, but the visitors put the game out of reach with an 11-4 stretch that staked them to their widest lead, 61-47, with 8:44 remaining.

St. Francis got off to a good start as the hosts led 9-4 at the 16:47 mark of the opening half. The Terriers still played from in front as they held a 20-17 advantage with 11:25 remaining, but Canisius rattled off 9 straight points to grab the lead for good at 26-20.

Turner (4 steals, 6 rebounds) went 9-of-11 from the floor and 9-of-11 from the line and also handed out a game-high 7 assists for the Griffs.

St. Francis shot just 38.6 percent (22-of-57) overall and were 4-of-17 (23.5 percent) from behind the arc, while Canisius shot 47.5 percent (28-of-59).
