# TERRIER SPORTS NETWORK (TSN)

Brooklyn Heights, NY— Director of Athletics Irma Garcia has announced an extension of the Terrier Sports Network for men's and women's basketball games this season. Live video coverage will be available for most home games this season as well as live radio coverage on the road.

"This is the first season of video streaming at the College and I'm delighted that we will be working with Stretch Internet again this season for a lot of our internet broadcasts," said Garcia. "We're really looking forward to giving all of our student-athletes the exposure that they deserve. We certainly feel that we are now on the cutting edge in terms of web broadcasting and video streaming."

St. Francis College play-by-play announcer Nicholas Guerriero will begin his fifth season as the voice of the Terriers.

"I'm really looking forward to entering this season, not only will St. Francis be on the cutting edge in mass media within the conference, but in the NCAA as a whole. This season, the network plans on giving the fans a real treat as far as broadcasts are concerned." "With video streaming, fans inside and outside of Brooklyn will get to see the Terriers in a whole new light."

Broadcasts will consist of pre and post game shows; in-depth analysis of players and coaches as well as interviews during the game from our sideline reporters.

Brian Morales, Assistant Sports Information Intern, will return to the broadcasts on a more behind the scenes aspect. Morales will be in-charge of setting up interviews and coordinating broadcasts while doing day-to-day activities in the Sports Information Department. On select road games, he will join the broadcast as a commentator.

"I am really excited to see the launch of video streaming for St. Francis this upcoming season. While working for the broadcast last season on radio, we (Terrier Sports Network) realized that our fans were really into each broadcast. Since technology is constantly changing, we decided to take Terrier Sports Network to the next level as well," said Morales.

New to the network this season will be student-interns Ashley Kalmar and Deron Cummings. Kalmar, a Communications Arts Major, will be responsible for producing all video components that come along with streaming the games and also will oversee engineering audio functions for the radio contests. Cummings, also a Communications Arts Major, will be the camera operator and will assist in the broadcasts in other various positions.

In addition to broadcasting most men's and women's basketball games live, the network will feature Terrier contests and special events throughout the year. Numerous podcasts featuring interviews with coaches and student-athletes will also air on TSN. All broadcasts will be free of charge for Terrier fans.

All archived shows can be heard through iTunes, and fans will have the ability to purchase old broadcasts through the Stretch Internet website.

## **TERRIER TIDBITS**

### **REJECTED! THERE GOES MR. GREY BEARD**

In twenty-one games this season the Terriers are averaging five blocks per game. Highlights so far saw the Terriers swat eight flying rubber orange balls in their home opener against Manhattan. Then in their conference opener at Robert Morris the team had another eight blocks. Their season high was nine in a loss to Hofstra, and then tied @ Long Island. Nigel Byam and Herman Wrice each had three blocks in those games.

### **HE-MAN: BY THE POWER OF GREY SKULL I HAVE THE POWER**

Junior Herman Wrice is third in the conference in blocked shots averaging 1.8 per game. Wrice's had five blocks against Manhattan on November 26. Wrice then tied the career-high with another five blocks at Robert Morris on December 4th, including two blocks in the final minute of play.

### **"I'M A LIMOUSINE RIDIN', JET FLYIN', KISS STEALIN', WHEELIN' DEALIN' SON OF A GUN. WOOOO!!"**

"Nature Boy" Ricky Cadell's scored a new career high 30 points at Ohio University shooting 11-16 from the field; 2-4 from three and 6-9 from the line while pulling down a season tying high 6 rebounds. His 19 points at Robert Morris was his previous season high and at that time was a single point shy of his then career record of 20 that he notched vs. Monmouth University last season. This season Cadell has dropped 20 points twice against Monmouth and Quinnipiac. Cadell has scored in double digits in eleven games this season. He has since moved to the shooting guard position in the previous month (January) where coach Nash institutes either Jamaal Womack or Justin Newton at the point guard position.

### **WALLY WORLD - CLOSED FOR REPAIRS**

Kayode Ayeni's 14 points – 7 rebound performance at Hofstra was the seventh time this season in which he scored in double figures and had at least seven boards. Last season the junior from Brooklyn had five game in which he had at least double digits and seven or more rebounds (12 points – 9 rebounds @ Maine), (14 points – 13 rebounds vs. Navy), (12 points – 7 rebounds @ Saint Francis), (15 points – 7 rebounds @ Robert Morris), and (19 points – 13 rebound vs. Long Island). Kayode sustained an injury a lower body injury at the Albany game and will be missed for the remainder of the season

### **SENIOR STEPS OUT OF THE SHADOWS**

Senior John Gooden's 19 point performance @Wagner eclipsed his previous 17point career-high from his freshman season. The 6'6" forward shot 8-9 from the field in 24 minutes. Prior to missing his only shot of the night which was an attempted tip-in which would have tied the game with 0.5 seconds remaining; Gooden shot 8-8 from the field. John hit the winning basket in the Columbia game after a

missed three-pointer by Jamaal Womack; it was Gooden who telegraphed the shot and grabbed the rebound and the put back layup as time expired. In four games this season the senior from the Bronx, NY has scored in double digits. He yet again propelled the Terriers to a victory as the connected on a lay-up and a clutch free throw with two seconds remaining against Saint Francis of Pennsylvania on national TV (MSG). “JG” is now 8-12 from the line in crunch time for the Terriers. Gooden also pulled down a career-tying 11 rebounds his most since Monmouth in 2006.

### **NEW YEAR; NEW POSITIONS - GREAT SUCCESS**

Since delivering a speech at the inauguration of new school president, Brendan J. Dugan, this past October, Student Government President Mr. Womack hit his biggest slump of his career in the fall academic semester averaging only eight points per game in the first nine contests. Throughout the winter recess and into the beginning of the spring semester Womack has jumped up an extra 1.6 points per game now averaging 9.6 points in the next ten contests (Columbia through LIU).

Since the change to point guard on January 3<sup>rd</sup> @ Wagner; Womack, is now averaging 11 points per game; 6 assists per game, and shooting 41% from the field. In the 2008 calendar season Womack averaged 7 points per game, 3 assists per game and shot 25% as a shooting guard in twelve games.

Womack has now sunk 197<sup>th</sup> career three point baskets and he is now third all-time at SFC. He ranks second among active Northeast Conference players behind Wagner’s Joey Mundweiler.

Ricky Cadell’s change to shooting guard has also made a minimal effect on his personal performance. Only his shooting percentage has increased as both his points per game and assists stayed at 12 points per game and 2 assists per game.

### **ST. FRANCIS ATHLETICS HOW MAY I HELP YOU? I’M LOOKING FOR MR. 1,000**

When Jamaal Womack hit his 1,000<sup>th</sup> career point vs. Saint Francis University he became the 25<sup>th</sup> member of the St. Francis College Men’s Basketball 1,000 point fraternity. Womack becomes the first player under the Brian Nash era (05-present) to accomplish this feature.

One other player during the Nash era was close to this accomplishment; junior college transfer Robert

Hines scored 935 points in his two seasons in Brooklyn Heights.

During the Ron Ganulin era (91-05) four players accomplished this feat; Richy Dominguez with 1,482 points, Angel Santana with 1,474 points, Clifford Strong with 1,090 points and finally Steven Howard with 1,081 points. Only Allan Sheppard was lone Terrier in-between the era's to not score 1,000 points as he was only 33 points shy.

### **MOVING THE LINE BACK; ONLY MAKES US STRONGER**

Not only did the Terriers hit 17 three point baskets against Hartford, which was the most trifectas made by any Northeast Conference member school since Monmouth hit 19 at Long Island on February 21<sup>st</sup>, 1998; but the Terriers hit 17 against Robert Morris to tie the team record. These accomplishments are game highs for the Terriers in the 22 year history of the three point line since its inception in 1986.

### **SERBIAN SHOOTING, SERBIAN SCORING**

Freshman guard Stefan Perunicic, a native of Belgrade, Serbia, has found a niche as a three point sharpshooter for the Terriers this season. His career-high of 28 points at Robert Morris is a St. Francis NY freshman record for points in a game. His seven trifectas in the game are also a freshman record. Perunicic is averaging 11.4 points per game and is on pace to hit over 90 three point baskets this season. His previous high was 21 points at Navy where he hit five shots from the outside. On the season he has scored in double figures in ten games. Perunicic was named the NEC Choice Hotels Rookie of the Week for the week of January 26th.

### **NEWTON KNOCKING ON GUARDS DOOR**

Freshman guard Justin Newton is already seeing quality minutes off the bench and in-key sports for the team early in the season. The Brooklyn native received 29 minutes vs. Hartford, 26 minutes vs. Navy, and 15 minutes in the season-opener at Seton Hall. Newton played a solid floor game, delivering a career-high five assists, one block and a steal against the Hawks. The continued development of Newton could allow starting point guard Ricky Cadell to play more minutes at the shooting guard position.

### **THE RETURN OF GRIFF**

Assistant Coach Allen Griffin is back for his second stint on the Terriers' bench. Griffin, who was a standout player for Jim Boheim at Syracuse from 1997-2001, coached last season at Providence. Griffin was an assistant coach under Brian Nash in Brooklyn Heights during the 2005-06 campaign. Griffin is just one of five players who accumulated 400 or more career assists and 200 or more assists in one season. As a senior, he captained the team and averaged 10.8 points and 6.5 assists.

For the second time this season the Terriers outrebounded a team by more than three rebounds and only the fourth time this season they actually outrebounded a team. The +11 rebound margin vs. Saint Francis University was in-part a key to success in the victory. Then they outrebounded Fairleigh Dickinson by 7 rebounds. John Gooden and Nigel Byum’s 11 rebounds a piece was a season high for the duo. St. Francis is 9<sup>th</sup> in conference rebounding and does not have a player in the top 20 in conference rebounds per game.

The Terriers are 2-0 this season when the Pope Physical education Center has more than 450 fans. When the Terriers opened up the season vs. Manhattan the game drew 673 spectators. Against Saint Francis University a televised game; the Pope P.E. Center drew 702 fans. When less than 450 fans show up the team is 3-3.

### **NEW JACK CITY**

St. Francis is now ranked 13<sup>th</sup> in the NCAA National Ranking System for three-point field goals per game. Credit freshman Stefan Perunicic for his 59 trifecta’s so far as a reason the team is averaging 9.1 per game. Alright, also credit sophomore Ricky Cadell for his 32 and senior Jamaal Womack for his 31; and lastly Rocco Rubino’s 27 as other reasons were that high.

Freshman Stefan Perunicic is currently 32<sup>nd</sup> in the NCAA in three-point fields goals per game with 3.0 per game, he is also 1<sup>st</sup> in NEC three-pointers made in a game. Perunicic is 66<sup>th</sup> in the NCAA in three-point field goal percentage shooting 38.6%. Junior Herman Wrice is 73<sup>rd</sup> in blocked shots per game with 1.8 per contest and is 3<sup>rd</sup> in the NEC. Sophomore Rocco Rubino is 5<sup>th</sup> in the NEC in three-point field goal percentage shooting 42%. Senior Jamaal Womack is 2<sup>nd</sup> in assist/turnover ratio at 1:69.

## Head Coach: Brian Nash, Fourth Season

### Hometown: Queens, N.Y.

### Alma Mater: Keene State College '92

Nash became the 16th head coach of the St. Francis men's basketball team back on March 30, 2005. He joins a legacy that dates back more than a century. Nash, who played high school basketball in Brooklyn and has strong ties to the local area, came to St. Francis College from Seton Hall University, where he served as assistant coach under Louis Orr (2001-2005).

While at Seton Hall, Nash helped lead the Pirates to the 2nd round in the NCAA tournament in 2004 and the 1st round of the NIT in 2003. During Nash's four-year tenure at Seton Hall, he was primarily responsible for recruiting, opponent scouting, game day preparation, organizing and instructing individual skill workouts, monitoring academic progress for designated student-athletes and performing community service and public speaking engagements.

Prior to Seton Hall, Nash was assistant basketball coach at Siena College (2000-2001) where he also served as the Saint's recruiting coordinator. He was responsible for opponent scouting and game day preparation as well as monitoring student-athlete academic performance and performing various community service and public speaking projects. The Saints finished the season 20-11 overall and 12-6 in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and in a three-way tie for the regular-season title in MACC.

Nash's professional coaching career began at Sacred Heart University (1993-94) before he moved on to work at St. Bonaventure University from 1994 through 2000.

A 1988 graduate of Bishop Ford High School in Brooklyn, Nash played high school basketball under his father, Raymond Nash, a 1963 St. Francis College graduate and St. Francis College Hall of Fame member. He went on to play basketball for four years at Keene State College in Keene, N.H., where he was team captain from 1990-92. After graduating from Keene State College, Nash returned home to serve as assistant coach at his alma mater in Brooklyn.

In addition to Nash's coaching experience at the collegiate level, he was also an assistant coach for the Empire State Games New York City Region open men's basketball team in 2005. In addition, he served as an assistant coach for the US All-Stars Touring Team in Italy and Greece in 2001 and was an assistant coach for the US All-Stars vs. Ukrainian National Team in 1999. Nash has been a basketball instructor at Five-Star, Eastern Invitational and Metro Index basketball camps.

Professionally, Nash is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

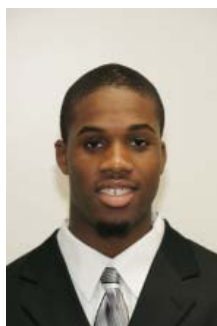

NEWARK,NJ --- Junior forward Kayode Ayeni matched his career-high in points (19) and rebounds (13), but it wasn't enough, as the Terriers fell to Seton Hall, 88-61, Friday evening at the Prudential Center in Newark, New Jersey.

St. Francis took a 17-14 advantage after Ayeni slammed home an offensive rebound at the 11:02 mark. The Terriers later took their final lead of the contest when sophomore guard Ricky Cadell knocked down a jump shot to make it 23-21 with 8:05 to play. SHU took control from then on, ripping off 14 straight points over the next four-plus minutes. Senior John Garcia started the run with a jumper, and he later threw down a thunderous dunk that junior Eugene Harvey followed with a bucket to make it 35-23 at the 3:06 mark.

Paul Gause buried a 3-pointer with 1:30 left to push the lead to 14, and the Pirates carried a 42-28 edge into halftime.

SHU came out of halftime with a flurry as Gause drained another trifecta 15 seconds in before making a steal and feeding Jeremy Hazell (23 points) for a 3-pointer to make it 48-28 and force a Terriers' timeout. Another Hazell bomb at the 18:55 mark completed a 9-1 run out of the break.

Ayeni, who had eight offensive rebounds and equaled his career-best with three blocks, made 5-of-13 field goal attempts and also went 9-of-11 from the line. Cadell added nine points and three steals and sophomore Rocco Rubino added nine points.

The Terriers shot just 35.1 percent (20-of-57) overall and were struggled mightily from three-point land (5-of-27). The Pirates shot 51.7 percent (30-of-58) and were 6-of-13 from long range.

WEST HARTFORD, CT – The St. Francis (NY) Terriers suffered a heartbreaking 91-82 double overtime setback against the Hartford Hawks, Saturday afternoon at Chase Arena at Reich Family Pavilion. Hartford (1-3) outscored St. Francis (0-3), 12-3 in the final overtime period.

Senior guard **Jamaal Womack** led five Terriers in double figures with 17 points. Junior forward **Kayode Ayeni** and freshman forward **Stefan Perunicic** each added 16 points. Sophomore guard **Rocco Rubino** scored a career-high 15 points (4-of-6 three-point field goals) and classmate **Ricky Cadell** chipped in with 10 points, six boards and a career-high seven assists.

The Hawks were led by the tandem of senior Jaret von Rosenberg and junior Joe Zeglinski. Von Rosenberg poured in a game-high 24 points, including a layup and four clutch free throws in the final minute of the contest. Zeglinski finished with 22 points, a game-high 10 rebounds and five assists.

Hartford led 85-82 with under a minute to play in the second overtime when Zeglinski and von Rosenberg hooked up on the play of the game. With the shot clock winding down, Zeglinski found himself swarmed at the top of the key by two St. Francis defenders. He spun through the defenders with the intention of putting up a shot to beat the shot clock, but at the last second changed his mind and found von Rosenberg under the hoop for an easy layup to put the Hawks up five with 47 seconds to go.

While the decisive play in the final period occurred in the paint, the game was largely played behind the three-point arc. Hartford hit 57 percent of its three-point attempts, shooting 16-for-28 from deep in the game and 3-for-5 in overtime. St. Francis shot 17-for-39 from beyond the arc.

For much of the game, it didn't look like overtime would be necessary. Hartford led by as much as 14 points in the first half when sophomore Anthony Minor hit a free throw to make the score 40-26 with 1:01 remaining before the break. St. Francis' Rubino hit a three-pointer with six seconds to play in the half to cut Hartford's lead to 11 at the half, 40-29.

St. Francis clawed its way back into the game in the second half, chipping away at the Hartford lead until it tied the game at 63-63 with 3:56 remaining in regulation. The Terriers took their first lead of the half at 65-63 on a jumper by Ayeni with 2:40 to play. St. Francis led by one when senior Michael Turner went to the free throw line with 22 seconds remaining. He missed on his first attempt but tied the game at 66-66 with his second, and Womack hoisted up a game-winning three-point attempt on the other end that was off the mark from the left wing.

The first overtime saw the team's trade baskets for five minutes. Hartford took a 78-77 lead on a Zeglinski three with 1:23 to play, and freshman Genesis Maciel added a free throw 30 seconds later to increase the lead to two. St. Francis, however, tied the game on its next possession on a jumper by Cadell. The Hawks had the final possession but couldn't get a quality shot, as Zeglinski was forced to put up a long three at the buzzer.

St. Francis won the tip in the second overtime and took a quick lead behind a Womack trey. It would be the Terriers only points in the final overtime, as Hartford answered with 12 straight points. Zeglinski tied the game with his sixth three-pointer of the contest, and the Hawks took the lead on a von Rosenberg free throw. Following a pair of freebies from Maciel, the Hawks pumped the lead to five on the Zeglinski-to-von Rosenberg layup. Von Rosenberg, who scored seven of Hartford's 12 points in the second overtime, closed out the game with four free throws in the final 31 seconds.

BROOKLYN, NY --- Sophomore forward **Kayode Ayeni** (Brooklyn, NY/Laurinburg) scored seven points in the final 3:56 to lift the St. Francis (NY) Terriers to a 70-68 victory against the Manhattan Jaspers, Wednesday evening in their home opener. The end was a fitting bookend to the Terrier's strong start to the contest which opened with freshman forward **Stefan Perunicic** (Belgrade, Serbia) hitting a long NBA-range three pointer off a feed from **Ricky Cadell** (New York, NY/The Patterson School). **Nigel Byam** (Brooklyn, NY/Murrow) scored on a lay-up and converted on a three-point play, increasing the Terriers lead to six at the 18:20 mark. Perunicic then hit his second three from deep on the left wing, increasing the Terriers run to 9-0 at the 18:00 minute mark.

Ken Bulger of Columbia was able to score the first points for the Lions off a Terrier turnover. The Terriers' Byam kept the lead at seven with a huge rejection on Zack Crimmins. **Kayodi Ayeni** also joined the "black party," recording two consecutive blocks down low.

Columbia showed they would not allow the Terriers to run away with the victory as the Lions managed to come roaring back on six straight points off costly turnovers with 7:58 remaining the first half.

Entering the media time-out at the 7:37 mark, the Terriers were only shooting 26.7% from the field while the Lions were at 35.0%. Womack was able cut the Lions lead to a single point when his drive to the hoop connected and was put at the foul line to complete a three-point play. Later, Ayeni hit a 14-foot jumper from the top of the key, which cut the lead back to one at the 6:30 mark after Bova converted on the other end for the Lions.

Showing a strong two-way game, Gooden hit a lay-up and hustled back to draw an offensive foul on the Lions. He continued his heads up play, diving for a loose ball on a missed shot from Womack and found a wide open Ayeni for a two hand slam with 4:57 left in the first half. The Terriers entered the locker room, down six, 29-23.

Perunicic hit the first basket of the second half for the Terriers, cutting the lead to four, but Columbia came right back on a lay-up from Jason Miller to put the Lions up six. Columbia then built their biggest lead of the game after another lay-up, this time from Kevin Bulger with 17:22 remaining in the contest.

At the 13:50 mark, sophomore guard **Rocco Rubino** (Brooklyn, NY/Molloy) was able to find Perunicic for another three-pointer, cutting the deficit to three. The Lions ran the lead back up to seven, with 6:56 remaining in the contest off an inside jumper from Jason Miller.

But, St. Francis was relentless in their attack. With 2:20 left, Womack found Ayeni in the corner. He knocked down a three, once again tying the ballgame.

The Terriers were trailing by one with thirty-four seconds after the Lions converted a lay-up by Joe Bova. Gooden raced down court and put in five foot lay-up off a dish from Ayeni with twenty-one seconds left. An over-anxious Ayeni then committed a loose-ball foul, putting the Lions' Jason Miller at the line. Miller hit on the first attempt but missed the second. Womack tried for the game-winning three but missed, leading to Gooden's right place at the right time game winning shot.

For the game, Perunicic led all scorers with 14 points, on 5-of-11 shooting, 3-of-6 from beyond the arc while Ayeni recorded another double-double, scoring 13 points, grabbing 11 rebounds and contributing three rejections. Rocco Rubino had nine crucial points for the Terriers in his 30 minutes of play, while Nigel Byam recorded eight points and three rejections.

Leading the way for the Lions was Joe Bova, who finished the contest with 11 points and 8 rebounds. Noruwa Agho added 10 and pulled four rebounds in the losing effort for the Lions.

Despite leading for most of the evening, the St. Francis (NY) Terriers were defeated by the Wagner Seahawks, 80-78, in a Northeast Conference contest on Saturday night at the Spiro Sports Center. Freshman guard Stefan Perunicic misfired on a three-point attempt from the left wing and then sophomore guard Ricky Cadell missed a long, off-balance three from the right wing after collecting a loose ball following the initial miss. Gooden had a chance for a difficult putback underneath the basket, but his attempt was off target. Ironically, it was the only miss of the game for Gooden, who went 8-of-9 from the floor in the contest.

The Terriers took their biggest lead of the second half at 62-54 with 9:02 remaining after Herman Wrice converted a layup. Wagner responded with an 11-2 spurt to take a 65-64 advantage, their first lead since the opening minutes of the first half.

St. Francis built a 25-13 advantage with 9 minutes remaining in the opening half. Gooden was the catalyst as the Bronx native scored three consecutive field goals for the Terriers. The Terriers also made four treys during the stretch.

Wagner was able to get right back into the game after outscoring the Terriers by as 12-4 margin over the final 3:20 of the opening half, slicing a 32-22 deficit to just 36-34 at the break.

Cadell and Perunicic (4 treys) each added 14 points for the Terriers, who shot 51.9 percent (28-of-54) in the contest. Gooden ripped down a team-high 9 boards in just 24 minutes off the bench.

Radford went 10-of-12 from the floor en route to a game-high 23 points and 14 rebounds for Wagner. Joey Mundweiler added 17 points for the Seahawks.

The Terriers led 40-30 with 15:23 remaining in the contest but the Red Flash went on a 16-2 run to take a 46-42 advantage with 10:00 left. St. Francis answered as Cadell scored the final five points during a 7-2 run to give the Terriers the lead, 49-48, with 6:22 remaining.

The Terriers never trailed again until Nelson’s two free throws in the closing seconds.

In the opening stanza, the Terriers ran out to a 14-4 advantage at the 12:58 mark. WOMack joined the 1,000 point club after he converted on a long range two-pointer at the 17:12 mark.

The Red Flash battled back as Jukic scored three consecutive points, cutting the Terriers lead to 24-23. The Terriers eventually settled for a 30-27 edge at the break.
