HEAD COACH BRIAN NASH

Now in his fifth season as Head Coach of the St. Francis College Terriers, Brian Nash is extremely excited about the team that he's assembled for 2009-2010. "There's no question that we have the talent to be one of the better teams in the Northeast Conference this season," said Nash. "But I think what I like the most about our team is that we have a good group of kids that will be willing to work extremely hard day in and day out."

Last season, Nash did a terrific job of guiding the Terriers into the NEC Tournament after missing the cut in 2007-2008. The team lost one of their top players and leaders, Kayode Ayeni, to a knee injury early in the season but Nash was able to get the most out of the rest of his roster to make up for the loss.

Nash has clearly infused a great deal of talent into the program for this year and the immediate future. The Terriers have added Seton Hall transfer Mike Davis for next season and his addition will give St. Francis (NY) one of the most formidable frontcourts in the conference.

Nash became the 16th head coach of the St. Francis men's basketball team back on March 30, 2005. He joins a legacy that dates back more than a century. Nash, who played high school basketball in Brooklyn and has strong ties to the local area, came to St. Francis College from Seton Hall University, where he served as assistant coach under Louis Orr (2001-2005).

While at Seton Hall, Nash helped lead the Pirates to the 2nd round in the NCAA tournament in 2004 and the 1st round of the NIT in 2003. During Nash's four-year tenure at Seton Hall, he was primarily responsible for recruiting, opponent scouting, game day preparation, organizing and instructing individual skill workouts, monitoring academic progress for designated student-athletes and performing community service and public speaking engagements.

Prior to Seton Hall, Nash was assistant basketball coach at Siena College (2000-2001) where he also

served as the Saint's recruiting coordinator. He was responsible for opponent scouting and game day preparation as well as monitoring student-athlete academic performance and performing various community service and public speaking projects. The Saints finished the season 20-11 overall and 12-6 in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and in a three-way tie for the regular-season title in MACC.

Nash's professional coaching career began at Sacred Heart University (1993-94) before he moved on to work at St. Bonaventure University from 1994 through 2000.

A 1988 graduate of Bishop Ford High School in Brooklyn, Nash played high school basketball under his father, Raymond Nash, a 1963 St. Francis College graduate and St. Francis College Hall of Fame member. He went on to play basketball for four years at Keene State College in Keene, N.H., where he was team captain from 1990-92. After graduating from Keene State College, Nash returned home to serve as assistant coach at his alma mater in Brooklyn.

In addition to Nash's coaching experience at the collegiate level, he was also an assistant coach for the Empire State Games New York City Region open men's basketball team in 2005. In addition, he served as an assistant coach for the US All-Stars Touring Team in Italy and Greece in 2001 and was an assistant coach for the US All-Stars vs. Ukrainian National Team in 1999. Nash has been a basketball instructor at Five-Star, Eastern Invitational and Metro Index basketball camps.

Professionally, Nash is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

Nash resides in New Jersey with his wife, Kristen, son, Jack, and daughter, Abigail.

LAST TIME OUT VS. WAGNER

The host St. Francis (NY) Terriers reversed a 51-47 deficit with 2:53 remaining and held on for a 57-54 Northeast Conference victory over the Wagner Seahawks, Saturday afternoon at the Pope Physical Education Center. The Terriers, who have now won four straight conference games, improved to 9-10 (6-2 NEC) while the Seahawks dropped to 3-18 (1-7 NEC).

Junior guard Ricky Cadell (5-9, 3-pointers) scored 19 points and joined the 1,000 point club to lead the Terriers. Classmate Akeem Bennett (4 steals) added 16 points and sophomore Justin Newton (4 steals) distributed a career-high 10 assists.

Wagner used consecutive treys by Chris Martin to take their first lead of the game, 51-47 with just 2:53 remaining. But Terriers' sophomore forward Stefan Perunicic responded with a 3-pointer from the left wing to initiate a 10-0 run, and trim the deficit to just 51-50 with 2:31 left.

Senior center Herman Wrice completed a conventional 3-point play with 1:36 left and the hosts never trailed again. Bennett followed with a steal and layup at the 1:09 mark and Perunicic converted a layup after a Newton steal with 46 seconds remaining to extend the Terriers lead to 57-51.

The Seahawks refused to go away as Doug Elwell connected on a trifecta with 23 ticks left to bring the visitors within 57-54.

The Terriers then missed three straight one-and-one opportunities to leave the door open for the Seahawks, but Martin misfired on a long 3-point attempt with two seconds remaining and St. Francis was able to run out the clock.

The Terriers led by as many as nine points in the second half, 40-31, at the 13:40 mark, but the Seahawks held the hosts to just two field goals over the next 6:50 and eventually knotted the score at 45-45 with 4:40 remaining.

Danny Mundweiler (5-8, 3-pointers) scored 17 points to pace Wagner and Elwell (4-8, 3-pointers) added 12 points and 9 boards.

St. Francis was 20-of-46 (43.5 percent) from the floor and Wagner shot 41.7 percent (20-for-48).

The Terriers are off to their best start in the NEC since the 2003-2004 season when they won a share of the regular-season title

ALEXANDER HARRINGTON TO MISS REMAINDER OF THE 2009-10 SEASON

Junior forward Alexander Harrington will miss the rest of the 2009-10 season after injuring his knee (meniscus) against Hartford on December 8. Harrington was averaging 4.9 points and 4.3 rebounds per game in 18.1 minutes. He started two contests. Harrington's role was expected to be expanded in Northeast Conference play. He'll apply for a medical redshirt and should have two years of eligibility after only appearing in 8 contests this season.

NIGEL BYAM TO MISS REMAINDER OF THE 2009-10 SEASON

Senior forward Nigel Byam will miss the remainder of the season after injuring his shoulder. Byam was averaging 4.3 points and 3.3 rebounds per game in 15.8 minutes. He enjoyed a career-game with 17 points and 11 rebounds in an opening night start against Brown on November 13.

CADELL PLAYS ROLE OF MR. CLUTCH; JOINS 1,000-POINT CLUB

Junior guard Ricky Cadell has already won two games for the Terriers this season with last second shots. The Manhattan native beat the buzzer with a long jumper in the 66-65 win at Colgate on November 28. He also drained a 3-pointer to break a 60-60 tie with four seconds remaining against Hartford on December 8. In the win against the Mount (1/14), Cadell scored 9 points in the final 6:23. Cadell joined the 1,000-Point Club with a 3-pointer in the second half against Wagner (1/23). He drilled is 100th career 3-pointer against Lafayette.

BENNETT & NEWTON STEALING THE SHOW

The Terriers continue to lead the Northeast Conference in steals at 8.63 per game. Sophomore guard Justin Newton and junior guard/forward Akeem Bennett are both tied for second in the NEC in steals per game (2.21).

NEWTON SPREADING THE LOVE AND TAKING CARE OF THE ROCK

Sophomore point guard Justin Newton is leading the NEC in assist-turnover ratio (2.33) in conference games. Last Saturday against Wagner, Newton distributed a career-high 10 assists against just one turnover.

PERUNICIC CLIMBING 3-POINT CHARTS

Sophomore guard Stefan Perunicic, a member of the 2008-09 NEC All-Rookie team, is currently 10th in the NEC in 3-point field goals per game (2.11 pg.). Last season, he was second (2.90 pg.). He has already hit 127 treys, which is 9th on the all-time school list.

AYENI ENJOYING SUCCESSFUL RETURN FROM KNEE INJURY

Senior Kayode Ayeni has recovered from a serious knee injury to be one of the most consistent Terriers this season. The forward is averaging 10.9 points and 5.6 rebounds per contest. He enjoyed a career game against Bryant as he scored 23 points and 14 rebounds, leading the Terriers to a 54-48 victory. He also came up big in the win at Colgate, coming off the bench to score 22 points on 11-of-16 shooting.

BENNETT STUFFING THE STAT SHEETS

Junior guard Akeem Bennett has made an instant impact in his first season with the Terriers. He ranks among the Top 20 in the league several major categories. The Long Island native leads the league in free-throws made (92) is 9th in the league in scoring (14.2 ppg.), 14th in rebounding (5.5 pg.), and is 6th in assists (4.0). He also ranks second in steals (2.11 pg.)

A LITTLE EXTRA HELPING OF WRICE

Senior center Herman Wrice is not regarded as a key offensive threat for the Terriers. However, the Philadelphia native has been extremely efficient from the floor this season, shooting .556 percent. Wrice has hit 25 of his last 37 (.676) attempts from the field over an 11-game stretch. Wrice is also 8th in the NEC in blocks (1.00 pg.). He delivered a huge conventional 3-point play in the 57-54 win against Wagner (1/23) with 1:36 remaining.

FRESHMAN AKEEM JOHNSON NO LONGER JUST "THE OTHER AKEEM"

The league is very aware of junior transfers Akeem Bennett's impact this season. However, freshman Akeem Johnson has been asked to play major minutes with the injuries to Harrington and Byam. Johnson is averaging 18 minutes over the last seven contests after playing just 7.5 mpg. over the first 11 games. Johnson is 21-for-32 (.656) from the field with 22 rebounds over the seven games. He came up big with 9 points and 5 rebounds in the win at the Mount on January 14. He also added a huge block in the closing seconds to secure the victory. On Thursday he scored a career-high 12 pointson 6-of-9 shooting in 24 minutes off the bench.

TERRIER SCORING OUPUT; TALE OF TWO HALVES

The Terriers have struggled to get off to good starts this season as they have had much more luck putting up points in the second stanza. St. Francis has scored 35 or more points in nine different games in the second half. the Terrers have only scored 35 points in the opening half once (Mount, 1/21). Further, the Terriers have scored under 30 points in the opening half in 13 of 19 games this season. They have scored 30 or more points in the second half in 12 of 19 games. The Terriers are averaging 26.0 points in the first half and 34.0 in the second half.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Terriers won three straight on the road for the first time under Head Coach Brian Nash. The Terriers defeated Columbia, Mount St. Mary's, and Wagner. St. Francis (NY) is now 4-5 away from Brooklyn Heights this season. St. Francis will play seven of their last 10 games away from Brooklyn Heights. The Terriers snapped a 6-game road losing skid at the Mount on January 14, 2010.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

While the offense has struggled somewhat this season, the Terriers continue to play good team defense. St. Francis is second in the league in scoring defense at 64.2 ppg. The Terriers have yielded just 58.5 points per game over the last eight games and St. Francis is 6-2 during the stretch.

TERRIERS OFF TO BEST NEC START SINCE 2003-2004 CAMPAIGN

The Terriers have now won four straight conference games and are off to their best start in the league since the 2003-04 season. That year, the Terriers went on to tie for the regular-season title with Monmouth with a record of 12-6.

WHAT A MONTH!

At 6-2, the Terriers are enjoying their best month since January of 2004 when they went 8-2.

FORMER SETON HALL BIG MAN, MIKE DAVIS, TRANSFERS TO ST. FRANCIS (NY)



St. Francis (NY) head coach Brian Nash announced that former Seton Hall big man **Mike Davis** (Brooklyn Academy/Brooklyn, NY) has enrolled at the College. He must sit out the 2009-10 season, and will have two seasons of eligibility remaining when he suits up for the Terriers in 2010-11.

Davis, a 6-11 center, played two years at Seton Hall University in the Big East.

Davis appeared in 30 games for the Pirates last season, averaging 2.6 points and 2.3 rebounds a game. He shot 45.6 percent from the field and was third on the team with 17 blocked shots. Davis had a career-high 13 points in a win over the Terriers on November 14 and grabbed a career-high nine rebounds in a win over Monmouth December 2. He also blocked two shots at Notre Dame January 10. Davis played in 31 games his freshman season, averaging 2.7 points and 2.5 rebounds a game. He scored eight points, grabbed four rebounds and had four blocks against Louisville January 19, and then pulled down seven rebounds at Villanova February 9. Davis notched eight points and had three rejections against Syracuse March 5. He also was on the Big East Academic All-Star Team in 2008.

"I am very excited that Mike has chosen to become a part of our family here at St. Francis College," said coach Nash. A player of his size and skill will have a chance to make a big impact on our program."

Davis, who was ranked the 17th-best center in the class of 2006 by the web site Rivals.com., will be allowed to practice with the team this season.

FORMER SETON HALL SIGNEE, MIKE GLOVER, TO SUIT UP FOR TERRIERS NEXT SEASON

St. Francis (NY) head coach Brian Nash announced that 6-foot-6 forward **Mike Glover** has signed a national-letter-of-intent to play for the Terriers next season.

Glover, who is currently enrolled at the College of Eastern Utah, is the younger brother of former St. John's standout Anthony Glover. He will provide the Terriers with a strong rebounding presence and is good finisher around the basket.

He guided his prep school, Boys to Men Academy (Ill.), to a national championship in 2006. Glover then teamed with current Sacramento Kings' standout rookie, Tyreke Evans, at America Christian School (Aston, PA) in 2007. That year, he was selected to play for the New York City team in the Jordan Brand Classic Regional Game at Madison Square Garden.

Glover initially committed to Seton Hall and arrived on campus in the summer of 2007, however the NCAA ruled that he was an academic non-qualifier.

Glover, a Bronx native, will join former Seton Hall center **Mike Davis** (Brooklyn, NY / Brooklyn Academy) next season in the Terriers' frontcourt. The 6-foot-11 Davis is currently enrolled at St. Francis and is practicing with the squad this season.

Update: Glover is averaging a team-high 14.9 points and 6.5 rebounds per game this season at the College of Eastern Utah. He's averaging 22.8 minutes per game and is shooting a blistering 54 percent from the floor (92-169).

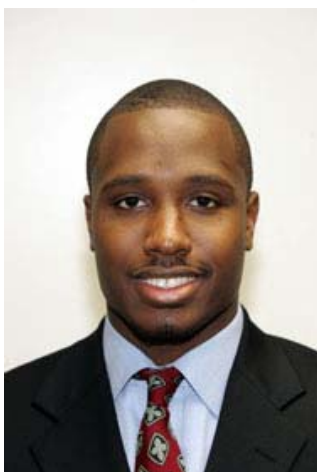

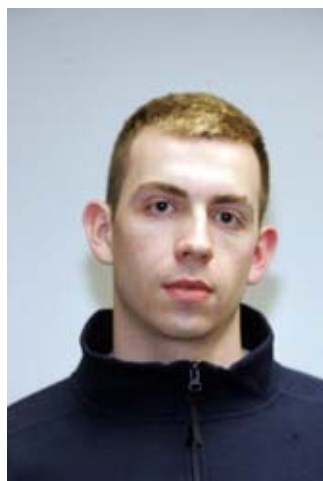

The Terriers fell to 0-4 on the season after dropping an 83-65 decision at UMass on Tuesday evening in Amherst, Massachusetts. The Minutemen improved to 2-2 on the season.

Junior guard Ricky Cadell led four Terriers in double-figures with 17 points. Junior forward Alex Harrington and sophomore forward Stefan Perunicic each added 12 points, while senior forward Kayode Ayeni added 10 points in his first action since his knee injury (ACL) last December.

St. Francis trailed 42-30 at halftime after being down by as many as 17 points in the opening half, but put a scare into the Minutemen by trimming the deficit to as little as 53-50 with 12:46 remaining in the contest.

St. Francis shot 45.1 percent (23-of-53) overall and were 8-of-19 (42.1 percent) from 3-point land.

UMass converted 49.1 percent (28-of-57) and were 9-of-19 (47.4 percent) from behind the arc. The Minuteman also were better from the line as they hit 18-of-24 (75 percent) compared to 11-of-20 (55 percent) by the Terriers.

Junior guard Ricky Cadell's 3-pointer with four seconds remaining lifted the host St. Francis (NY) Terriers to a 63-60 non-conference victory over the Hartford Hawks, Tuesday evening at the Pope Physical Education Center. The Terriers improved to 3-5 and the Hawks dropped to 2-8. Cadell, who went 7-of-16 from the floor (5-of-11 treys), paced the Terriers with 19 points and added three steals. The Terriers let the clock run down and then Cadell found himself free after fighting around a screen on the right wing. The Manhattan native calmly hit nothing but the bottom of the net. It was the second game-winning shot for Cadell over the last four contests as he beat Colgate with a buzzer-beater on November 28 in Hamilton, New York. The Terriers led 57-49 with 6:32 remaining in the contest after senior center Herman Wrice converted a pair of free throws. But the Hawks scored the next seven points to close the gap to 57-56 at the 4:55 mark. Junior guard Joe Zeglinski scored five consecutive points to cap the spurt. Hartford eventually tied the game for the sixth time after Joel Barkers made two free throws with 2:27 remaining, and took their final lead at 60-58 after a layup by Brothers with 1:39 on the clock. Junior Akeem Bennett then drew a foul with 1:10 left and tied the score at 60-60 with two free throws. Hartford was unable to take the lead as Terriers' sophomore guard Justin Newton came up with a big rebound of the Brothers' missed jumper. After Cadell's game-winner, Hartford had one last chance to tie the game but Morgan Sabia's long 3-point attempt from the right wing near the sideline was way off the mark. Hartford jumped out to a 12-4 advantage at the 15:56 mark of the opening half, but St. Francis went on a 16-7 run to take their first lead of the game, 20-19, with 9:51 left. The Terriers settled for a 34-32 halftime edge, just the second time that they have taken a lead into the break this season. St. Francis shot 43.1 percent (22-of-51) from the floor and were 9-of-23 (39.1 percent) from behind the arc. The Hawks shot at a 46.7 percent clip (8-for-22) and were 8-of-22 (36.4 percent) from downtown. Both teams grabbed 29 rebounds but the Hawks turned the ball over 17 times compared to just 10 by the hosts.

The #6 ranked Syracuse Orange handed the St. Francis (NY) Terriers a 75-51 defeat in front of 19,381 fans at the Carrier Dome on Sunday afternoon. The Terriers fell to 3-6 and the Orange improved to 10-0.

Game 13 Robert Morris 67, St. Francis (NY) 63

Brooklyn Heights, NY -- The host St. Francis (NY) Terriers erased a 21-point halftime deficit against the Robert Morris Colonials but fell in the closing seconds, 67-63, in a Northeast Conference contest on Saturday afternoon at the Pope Physical Education Center. St. Francis had an opportunity to even the score one last time with 21 ticks left, but Cadell misfired on a 3-pointer from the left corner following a timeout. Robert Morris went 4-of-6 from the line to close out the contest.

Robert Morris, who never trailed in the contest, raced out to a 15-6 lead at the 13:22 mark of first half. Cadell hit a trey to make it 17-10 at the 9:55 mark, but the Colonials outscored the hosts by a 24-10 margin the rest of the stanza to take their largest lead of the game, 41-20, at the halftime break.

The Terriers held the Colonials to 26.3 percent (5-of-19) from the floor in the second half to get back into the contest. Game 15 St. Francis (NY) 61, Mount St. Mary's 58

The St. Francis (NY) Terriers came up with a dramatic, 61-58, Northeast Conference victory against the Mount St. Mary's Mountaineers, Thursday evening in Emmitsburg, Maryland.
