

## SETTING THE STAGE: SFNY VS. ST. FRANCIS (PA)

**Series vs. St. Francis (PA):** The Red Flash lead the all-time series by a 36-28 margin. Last season, the Terriers defeated St. Francis (PA) by a score of 58-57 in Brooklyn Heights and were defeated 69-65 in Loretto, PA.

### Odds & Ends

The Terriers have shot a higher percentage than their opponent only twice this season (Colgate and Fairfield).

St. Francis (NY) is tied for last in the NEC in free throw shooting at .602 percent.

The Terriers lead the NEC in steals (8.45 pg.).

Head Coach Brian Nash has used 7 different starting line-ups this season.

The Terriers have trailed with 5 minutes to go in the ballgame in 10 of 11 games this season. The only exception was against Hartford on December 8.

St. Francis is 1-6 in evening games and are 2-2 in afternoon games.

The Terriers are 3-1 when they outshoot their opponent from the foul line.

St. Francis is 3-2 in games decided by 5 or less points.

## HEAD COACH BRIAN NASH

### FIFTH SEASON

### HOMETOWN: QUEENS, N.Y.

### ALMA MATER: KEENE STATE COLLEGE

Now in his fifth season as Head Coach of the St. Francis College Terriers, Brian Nash is extremely excited about the team that he's assembled for 2009-2010. "There's no question that we have the talent to be one of the better teams in the Northeast Conference this season," said Nash. "But I think what I like the most about our team is that we have a good group of kids that will be willing to work extremely hard day in and day out."

Last season, Nash did a terrific job of guiding the Terriers into the NEC Tournament after missing the cut in 2007-2008. The team lost one of their top players and leaders, Kayode Ayeni, to a knee injury early in the season but Nash was able to get the most out of the rest of his roster to make up for the loss.

Nash has clearly infused a great deal of talent into the program for this year and the immediate future. The Terriers have added Seton Hall transfer Mike Davis for next season and his addition will give St. Francis (NY) one of the most formidable frontcourts in the conference.

Nash became the 16th head coach of the St. Francis men's basketball team back on March 30, 2005. He joins a legacy that dates back more than a century. Nash, who played high school basketball in Brooklyn and has strong ties to the local area, came to St. Francis College from Seton Hall University, where he served as assistant coach under Louis Orr (2001-2005).

While at Seton Hall, Nash helped lead the Pirates to the 2nd round in the NCAA tournament in 2004 and the 1st round of the NIT in 2003. During Nash's four-year tenure at Seton Hall, he was primarily responsible for recruiting, opponent scouting, game day preparation, organizing and instructing individual skill workouts, monitoring academic progress for designated student-athletes and performing community service and public speaking engagements.

Prior to Seton Hall, Nash was assistant basketball coach at Siena College (2000-2001) where he also

served as the Saint's recruiting coordinator. He was responsible for opponent scouting and game day preparation as well as monitoring student-athlete academic performance and performing various community service and public speaking projects. The Saints finished the season 20-11 overall and 12-6 in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and in a three-way tie for the regular-season title in MACC.

Nash's professional coaching career began at Sacred Heart University (1993-94) before he moved on to work at St. Bonaventure University from 1994 through 2000.

A 1988 graduate of Bishop Ford High School in Brooklyn, Nash played high school basketball under his father, Raymond Nash, a 1963 St. Francis College graduate and St. Francis College Hall of Fame member. He went on to play basketball for four years at Keene State College in Keene, N.H., where he was team captain from 1990-92. After graduating from Keene State College, Nash returned home to serve as assistant coach at his alma mater in Brooklyn.

In addition to Nash's coaching experience at the collegiate level, he was also an assistant coach for the Empire State Games New York City Region open men's basketball team in 2005. In addition, he served as an assistant coach for the US All-Stars Touring Team in Italy and Greece in 2001 and was an assistant coach for the US All-Stars vs. Ukrainian National Team in 1999. Nash has been a basketball instructor at Five-Star, Eastern Invitational and Metro Index basketball camps.

Professionally, Nash is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

Nash resides in New Jersey with his wife, Kristen, son, Jack, and daughter, Abigail.

## LAST TIME OUT VS. FAIRFIELD

St. Francis (NY) watched a six-point halftime lead fall by the waste side as the Terriers dropped a 65-58 decision against the Fairfield Stags, Tuesday evening at Alumni Hall in Fairfield Connecticut. The Terriers have now lost three straight and are 3-8 on the season while the Stags improved to 9-3.

Terriers' junior guard **Akeem Bennett** paced the squad with a game-high 16 points and also grabbed nine rebounds. Senior forward **Kayode Ayeni** chipped in with 11 points and seven boards and junior guard **Ricky Cadell** added 11 points off the bench.

St. Francis, who led from start to finish in the opening period, limited the Stags to 21.9 percent shooting to claim a 29-23 halftime edge. The Terriers raced out to a 16-6 advantage at the 12:29 mark behind the strength of four 3-point field goals. Ayeni, who scored seven quick points, capped the run with a trey from the left corner. The hosts closed to within 20-17 with 6:46 remaining, but the Terriers ran off six straight points to extend to a nine-point advantage with 4:49 left, and settled for the six-point halftime lead.

Fairfield turned up the defensive heat with an effective full court press and scored the first nine points of the second half to take a 32-29 advantage with 17:40 remaining in the game. After falling behind 38-33, the Terriers took their final lead of the game, 39-38, with 13:59 remaining as they scored six straight points. Sophomore forward **Stefan Perunicic** and Cadell drained back-to-back 3-point bombs to key the spurt.

But the Stags erupted for 15 straight points over the next 5:41 to take a commanding 53-39 lead with just 8:19 to go. Fairfield capitalized on their advantage in the paint as they scored several baskets on the interior.

The Terriers did manage to make it fairly interesting down the stretch as they trimmed a 59-47 deficit at the 3:52 mark to just 59-53 with 1:24 remaining. Bennett converted a layup and hit one of two free throws and Cadell buried a long triple during the 6-0 run. But Fairfield answered with six straight points off their own, and were able to restore a 65-53 advantage with just 45 seconds left.

Fairfield, who scored 26 points off 25 Terriers' turnovers in the contest, shot 51.7 percent in the second half and held St. Francis to 39.3 percent shooting in the second period. Although they were just 1-of-13 from behind the arc, the Stags enjoyed a big advantage from the line as they outscored the visitors by 15 points from the charity stripe. Fairfield went 20-of-28 and the Terriers were just 5-of-12.

St. Francis connected on 9-of-23 (39.1 percent) from downtown but committed 9 more turnovers and were outboarded by a 46-35 margin.

## ALEXANDER HARRINGTON TO MISS REMAINDER OF THE 2009-10 SEASON

Junior forward Alexander Harrington will miss the rest of the 2009-10 season after injuring his knee (meniscus) against Hartford on December 8. Harrington was averaging 4.9 points and 4.3 rebounds per game in 18.1 minutes. He started two contests. Harrington's role was expected to be expanded in Northeast Conference play. He'll apply for a medical redshirt and should have two years of eligibility after only appearing in 8 contests this season.

## NIGEL BYAM TO MISS REMAINDER OF THE 2009-10 SEASON

Senior forward Nigel Byam will miss the remainder of the season after injuring his shoulder. Byam was averaging 4.3 points and 3.3 rebounds per game in 15.8 minutes. He enjoyed a career-game with 17 points and 11 rebounds in an opening night start against Brown on November 13.

## CADELL PLAYS ROLE OF MR. CLUTCH; NEARS 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Junior guard Ricky Cadell has already won two games for the Terriers this season with last second shots. The Manhattan native beat the buzzer with a long jumper in the 66-65 win at Colgate on November 28. He also drained a 3-pointer to break a 60-60 tie with four seconds remaining against Hartford on December 8. Cadell needs 151 points to reach 1,000 for his career. He drilled his 100th career 3-pointer against Lafayette.

## BENNETT & NEWTON STEALING THE SHOW

The Terriers continue to lead the Northeast Conference in steals at 8.45 per game. Junior guard/forward Akeem Bennett leads the league (2.27 spg.) and sophomore guard Justin Newton is third (2.09 pg.).

## PERUNICIC CLIMBING 3-POINT CHARTS

Sophomore guard Stefan Perunicic, a member of the 2008-09 NEC All-Rookie team, is currently 3rd in the NEC in 3-point field goals per game (2.64 pg.). Last season, he was second (2.90 pg.). He has already hit 116 treys, which is 9th on the all-time school list.

## AYENI ENJOYING SUCCESSFUL RETURN FROM KNEE INJURY

Senior Kayode Ayeni has recovered from a serious knee injury to be one of the most consistent Terriers this season. The forward is averaging 12.8 points and 6.1 rebounds per contest. He enjoyed a career game against Bryant as he scored 23 points and 14 rebounds, leading the Terriers to a 54-48 victory. He also came up big in the win at Colgate, coming off the bench to score 22 points on 11-of-16 shooting.

## FORMER SETON HALL BIG MAN, MIKE DAVIS, TRANSFERS TO ST. FRANCIS (NY)



St. Francis (NY) head coach Brian Nash announced that former Seton Hall big man **Mike Davis** (Brooklyn Academy/Brooklyn, NY) has enrolled at the College. He must sit out the 2009-10 season, and will have two seasons of eligibility remaining when he suits up for the Terriers in 2010-11.

Davis, a 6-11 center, played two years at Seton Hall University in the Big East. Davis appeared in 30 games for the Pirates last

season, averaging 2.6 points and 2.3 rebounds a game. He shot 45.6 percent from the field and was third on the team with 17 blocked shots. Davis had a career-high 13 points in a win over the Terriers on November 14 and grabbed a career-high nine rebounds in a win over Monmouth December 2. He also blocked two shots at Notre Dame January 10.

Davis played in 31 games his freshman season, averaging 2.7 points and 2.5 rebounds a game. He scored eight points, grabbed four rebounds and had four blocks against Louisville January 19, and then pulled down seven rebounds at Villanova February 9. Davis notched eight points and had three rejections against Syracuse March 5. He also was on the Big East Academic All-Star Team in 2008.

"I am very excited that Mike has chosen to become a part of our family here at St. Francis College," said coach Nash. A player of his size and skill will have a chance to make a big impact on our program."

Davis, who was ranked the 17th-best center in the class of 2006 by the web site Rivals.com., will be allowed to practice with the team this season.

## FORMER SETON HALL SIGNEE, MIKE GLOVER, TO SUIT UP FOR TERRIERS NEXT SEASON

St. Francis (NY) head coach Brian Nash announced today that 6-foot-6 forward **Mike Glover** has signed a national-letter-of-intent to play for the Terriers next season.

Glover, who is currently enrolled at the College of Eastern Utah, is the younger brother of former St. John's standout Anthony Glover. He will provide the Terriers with a strong rebounding presence and is good finisher around the basket.

He guided his prep school, Boys to Men Academy (Ill.), to a national championship in 2006. Glover then teamed with current Sacramento Kings' standout rookie, Tyreke Evans, at America Christian School (Aston, PA) in 2007. That year, he was selected to play for the New York City team in the Jordan Brand Classic Regional Game at Madison Square Garden.

Glover initially committed to Seton Hall and arrived on campus in the summer of 2007, however the NCAA ruled that he was an academic non-qualifier.

Glover, a Bronx native, will join former Seton Hall center **Mike Davis** (Brooklyn, NY / Brooklyn Academy) next season in the Terriers' frontcourt. The 6-foot-11 Davis is currently enrolled at St. Francis and is practicing with the squad this season.

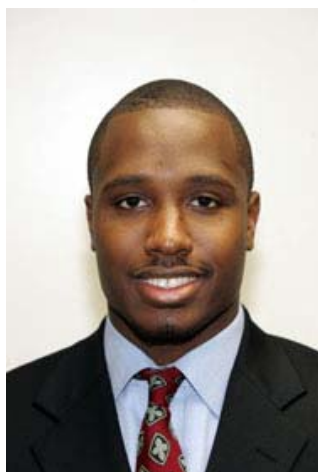

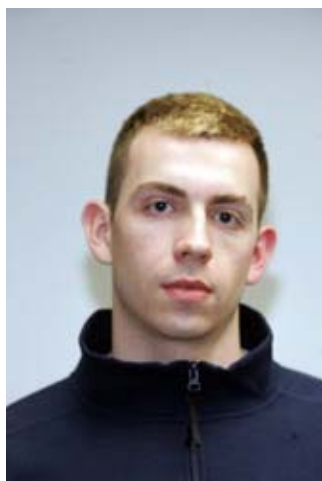

The Terriers fell to 0-4 on the season after dropping an 83-65 decision at UMass on Tuesday evening in Amherst, Massachusetts. The Minutemen improved to 2-2 on the season.

## Game 7 SFNY 63, Hartford 60

Junior guard Ricky Cadell's 3-pointer with four seconds remaining lifted the host St. Francis (NY) Terriers to a 63-60 non-conference victory over the Hartford Hawks, Tuesday evening at the Pope Physical Education Center. The Terriers improved to 3-5 and the Hawks dropped to 2-8. Cadell, who went 7-of-16 from the floor (5-of-11 treys), paced the Terriers with 19 points and added three steals. Junior guard Akeem Bennett contributed 15 points, 3 steals, and a season-high 9 rebounds. Sophomore forward Stefan Perunicic and senior forward Kayode Ayeni each chipped in with 10 points. St. Francis called a timeout to set up the winning play with 31 seconds remaining after Hartford's Clayton Brothers misfired on a jumper. The Terriers let the clock run down and then Cadell found himself free after fighting around a screen on the right wing. The Manhattan native calmly hit nothing but the bottom of the net. ## Game 9 Syracuse 75, SFNY 51

The #6 ranked Syracuse Orange handed the St. Francis (NY) Terriers a 75-51 defeat in front of 19,381 fans at the Carrier Dome on Sunday afternoon. The Terriers fell to 3-6 and the Orange improved to 10-0.

Junior guard Akeem Bennett recorded his first career double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds to lead the Terriers. Senior center Herman Wrice scored a season-high 12 points and junior guard Ricky Cadell added 11 points.

The Terriers trailed only 38-26 at the break, but the Orange scored the first eight points of the second stanza to take a commanding 46-26 advantage at the 17:19 mark. Syracuse extended their lead to as many as 31 points, 68-37 with 8:17 left in the game.

St. Francis made the hosts work in the opening half as they trailed just 19-18 with 9:51 remaining. After falling behind 17-7, the Terriers settled down and went on an 11-2 spurt to hush the large crowd. Cadell scored eight consecutive points (2 treys) and Bennett drained a triple to end the run. However, the Orange answered with 12-3 run to restore a 10-point advantage at 31-21 with 4:23 left.

The Terriers, who had won two straight contests, shot just 29.3 percent (17-of-58) overall and were 8-of-24 (33 percent) from behind the arc. The Orange made 53.7 percent (29-of-54) of their field goal attempts, and were 8-of-18 from long range.

St. Francis outrebounded the hosts by a 40-35 margin and tracked down a season-high 21 offensive rebounds. The Orange dominated the Terriers down low, holding a 32-14 advantage in points in the paint and they rejected 10 shots compared to just two by the Terriers.

Arinze Onuaku paced the Orange with 14 points and Wes Johnson added 12 points, 4 blocks, and 9 boards.

## Game 10 Lafayette 74, SFNY 69

The visiting Lafayette Leopards shot a blistering 56.5 percent from the floor and held on for a 74-69 victory over the host St. Francis (NY) Terriers, in a non-conference contest on Tuesday evening at the Pope Physical Education Center. The Terriers fell to 3-7 and the Leopards improved to 7-5.

Terriers' sophomore guard Stefan Perunicic scored a season-high 22 points on 8-of-15 shooting, which included 6-for-12 from 3-point range. Senior forward Kayode Ayeni added 17 points and junior Akeem Bennett was also in double-digits with 11 points.

Lafayette appeared to bury the Terriers for good with 7:12 remaining as they took their largest lead of the game at 60-43, but St. Francis rallied to pull within just three points with under a minute to play. The Terriers even had an opportunity to tie the game in the closing seconds but Bennett was whistled for a traveling violation with 12 seconds left. Leopards' guard Michael Gruner converted a pair of free throws with only nine seconds remaining for the final points of the contest.

The Leopards outscored the Terriers by a 13-5 margin over the first 2:46 of the second half to stretch their 25-21 halftime edge to 38-26. Ryan Willen (13 points) hit consecutive treys to initiate the spurt and Jared Mintz (15 points) added five points during the run.

St. Francis managed to close within seven points on six different occasions midway through the second stanza before the visitors went on an 11-1 run to take their largest lead at 60-43 with 7:12 remaining.

But the Terriers did not go down without a fight as they rattled off 10 consecutive points in less than two minutes to climb within 60-53 at the 5:37 mark. Perunicic drilled back-to-back 3-point bombs after Ayeni and senior Herman Wrice hit on layups. Jim Mower (team-high 16 points) ended the run with a trey for Lafayette, but St. Francis scored the next six points to close within 63-59 with 4:03 remaining.

The teams traded several hoops and free throws down the stretch, but the Terriers were given a golden opportunity in the closing seconds as Jeff Kari missed three of four free throws for the Leopards, leaving the door open for the equalizer prior to Bennett's traveling violation.

Lafayette converted 26-of-46 field goal attempts and were 11-of-23 (47.8 percent) from behind the arc. The Leopards went 11-for-17 (64.7 percent) from the line.

St. Francis shot a season-high 51.9 percent (28-of-54) and were 8-for-22 (36.4 percent) from 3-point territory. They went 5-for-8 (62.5 percent) from the charity stripe.
