Series vs. Bryant:

The Terriers have won all three meetings with Bryant. The Terriers scored the last 12 points of the game to defeat the Bulldogs, 54-48, on December 5th in Brooklyn Heights.

Odds & Ends

The Terriers have scored 35 or more points 11 different times in the second half. They have scored 35 points in the first half just one time. (vs Mount St. Mary's, 1/21/10).

On average, the Terriers net 7.4 more points per game in the second half than the first half. (26.1 vs. 33.5)

The Terriers have not reached 30 points in an opening half in 14 of their last 15 games. They are averaging just 23.8 points over the last 9 games in the opening half.

St. Francis has trailed at the half in 20 of 27 games.

St. Francis has failed to score 70 points in a regulation game this season.

The Terriers are 3rd in the league in scoring defense (65.0 ppg.)

The Terriers are 6-2 when they hold their opponent under 60 points.

The Terriers are 3-10 when they commit more turnovers than their opponent.

The Terriers are 4-12 when they fail to have a player reach 20 points.

St. Francis is 3-14 when they trail with 10 minutes left.

The Terriers lead the NEC in steals (8.0 pg.).

Head Coach Brian Nash has used 10 different starting line-ups this season.

St. Francis is 7-1 when they lead with 5:00 remaining.

The Terriers are 7-2 when they outshoot their opponent from the foul line (percentage).

St. Francis is 7-6 in games decided by 5 or less points.

HEAD COACH BRIAN NASH

FIFTH SEASON

HOMETOWN: QUEENS, N.Y.

ALMA MATER: KEENE STATE COLLEGE

Now in his fifth season as Head Coach of the St. Francis College Terriers, Brian Nash is extremely excited about the team that he's assembled for 2009-2010. "There's no question that we have the talent to be one of the better teams in the Northeast Conference this season," said Nash. "But I think what I like the most about our team is that we have a good group of kids that will be willing to work extremely hard day in and day out."

Last season, Nash did a terrific job of guiding the Terriers into the NEC Tournament after missing the cut in 2007-2008. The team lost one of their top players and leaders, Kayode Ayeni, to a knee injury early in the season but Nash was able to get the most out of the rest of his roster to make up for the loss.

Nash has clearly infused a great deal of talent into the program for this year and the immediate future. The Terriers have added Seton Hall transfer Mike Davis for next season and his addition will give St. Francis (NY) one of the most formidable frontcourts in the conference.

Nash became the 16th head coach of the St. Francis men's basketball team back on March 30, 2005. He joins a legacy that dates back more than a century. Nash, who played high school basketball in Brooklyn and has strong ties to the local area, came to St. Francis College from Seton Hall University, where he served as assistant coach under Louis Orr (2001-2005).

While at Seton Hall, Nash helped lead the Pirates to the 2nd round in the NCAA tournament in 2004 and the 1st round of the NIT in 2003. During Nash's four-year tenure at Seton Hall, he was primarily responsible for recruiting, opponent scouting, game day preparation, organizing and instructing individual skill workouts, monitoring academic progress for designated student-athletes and performing community service and public speaking engagements.

Prior to Seton Hall, Nash was assistant basketball coach at Siena College (2000-2001) where he also

served as the Saint's recruiting coordinator. He was responsible for opponent scouting and game day preparation as well as monitoring student-athlete academic performance and performing various community service and public speaking projects. The Saints finished the season 20-11 overall and 12-6 in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and in a three-way tie for the regular-season title in MACC.

Nash's professional coaching career began at Sacred Heart University (1993-94) before he moved on to work at St. Bonaventure University from 1994 through 2000.

A 1988 graduate of Bishop Ford High School in Brooklyn, Nash played high school basketball under his father, Raymond Nash, a 1963 St. Francis College graduate and St. Francis College Hall of Fame member. He went on to play basketball for four years at Keene State College in Keene, N.H., where he was team captain from 1990-92. After graduating from Keene State College, Nash returned home to serve as assistant coach at his alma mater in Brooklyn.

In addition to Nash's coaching experience at the collegiate level, he was also an assistant coach for the Empire State Games New York City Region open men's basketball team in 2005. In addition, he served as an assistant coach for the US All-Stars Touring Team in Italy and Greece in 2001 and was an assistant coach for the US All-Stars vs. Ukrainian National Team in 1999. Nash has been a basketball instructor at Five-Star, Eastern Invitational and Metro Index basketball camps.

Professionally, Nash is a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

Nash resides in New Jersey with his wife, Kristen, son, Jack, and daughter, Abigail.

LAST TIME OUT VS. FDU

Brooklyn Heights, NY - -Senior forward Alvin Mofunanya hit a 15-foot jumper from the right corner with three seconds remaining to give the visiting Fairleigh Dickinson Knights a 56-55 victory over the St. Francis (NY) Terriers, in a Northeast Conference contest on Saturday evening at the Pope Physical Education Center.

Junior guard **Ricky Cadell** paced St. Francis (10-17, 7-9 NEC) with 18 points and classmate **Akeem Bennett** was also in double-digits with 12 points.

The Terriers, who have now dropped seven of their last eight contests, led 55-54 after senior center **Herman Wrice** hit one of two free throws with 12 seconds left in the game. But following a timeout, Mofunanya, who had missed his first four field goal attempts, calmly drained the game-winner off an assist from guard Terence Grier. After a timeout, sophomore forward **Stefan Perunicic** took the inbounds pass but was not able to get off his runner from the foul line before the final buzzer expired. His shot was off the mark even if the buzzer had not sounded.

The Knights, who had dropped six straight against the Terriers, led for most of the contest until St. Francis made a huge run at the eight minute mark. FDU went up 52-41 after John Galvin converted a jumper with 8:02 remaining but the hosts rattled off 12 straight points to take a 53-52 advantage with just 3:01 on the clock. It was the Terriers first lead since the 12:28 mark of the first half. Cadell and Perunicic hit 3-pointers during the spurt and Wrice converted a pair of layups, including the go-ahead bucket off an assist by Cadell. Bennett also delivered a hoop.

FDU reclaimed the lead, 54-53, after Kamil Svrldlik (13 points) hit both of his free throw attempts with 2:35 remaining, but Terriers' sophomore guard **Justin Newton** connected on one of two free throw attempts to knot the score at 54-54 with 1:04 left. Neither team scored until Wrice's free throw, which momentarily gave St. Francis the lead.

St. Francis trailed just 17-16 with 8:28 remaining in the opening half until the visitors went on a 16-4 run to widen their lead to 33-20 with 16 seconds left in the stanza. Perunicic scored on a layup at the buzzer to make it 33-22 at the break.

FDU took their largest lead of the game, 36-22, after Svrldlik hit a free throw at the 19:11 mark of the second half. The Terriers answered with a 13-2 run to trim their deficit to just 38-35 with 15:12 remaining. Perunicic and Cadell drained back-to-back 3-pointers to cap the run. But the Knights responded with a 12-3 spurt to grab a 50-38 advantage at the 10:11 mark.

The Terriers shot just 37.5 percent (21-of-56) from the floor but did hit 10-of-23 (43.5 percent) treys to stay in the contest. They did, however, hurt themselves at the line going just 3-of-12 (25 percent).

The Knights, who went 9-of-13 (69.2 percent) from the line, shot 44 percent (22-of-50) overall and were 3-for-8 (37.5 percent) from long distance.

Sean Baptiste scored a game-high 21 points for FDU and Mike Scott chipped in with 10 points and nine assists before fouling out with 5:15 remaining.

ALEXANDER HARRINGTON TO MISS REMAINDER OF THE 2009-10 SEASON

Junior forward Alexander Harrington will miss the rest of the 2009-10 season after injuring his knee (meniscus) against Hartford on December 8. Harrington was averaging 4.9 points and 4.3 rebounds per game in 18.1 minutes. He started two contests. Harrington's role was expected to be expanded in Northeast Conference play. He'll apply for a medical redshirt and should have two years of eligibility after only appearing in 8 contests this season.

NIGEL BYAM TO MISS REMAINDER OF THE 2009-10 SEASON

Senior forward Nigel Byam will miss the remainder of the season after injuring his shoulder. Byam was averaging 4.3 points and 3.3 rebounds per game in 15.8 minutes. He enjoyed a career-game with 17 points and 11 rebounds in an opening night start against Brown on November 13.

CADELL PLAYS ROLE OF MR. CLUTCH; JOINS 1,000-POINT CLUB

Junior guard Ricky Cadell has won two games for the Terriers this season with last second shots. The Manhattan native beat the buzzer with a long jumper in the 66-65 win at Colgate on November 28. He also drained a 3-pointer to break a 60-60 tie with four seconds remaining against Hartford on December 8. In the win against the Mount (1/14), Cadell scored 9 points in the final 6:23. He also hit a game-tying trey with 7 seconds left in the second overtime in the triple-overtime win at LIU. Cadell joined the 1,000-Point Club with a 3-pointer in the second half against Wagner (1/23). He drilled his 100th career 3-pointer against Lafayette.

BENNETT & NEWTON STEALING THE SHOW

The Terriers continue to lead the Northeast Conference in steals at 8.2 per game. Junior Akeem Bennett is second in the league (2.23) and Newton is third (1.96).

NEWTON SPREADING THE LOVE AND TAKING CARE OF THE ROCK

Sophomore point guard Justin Newton is third in the NEC in assist-turnover ratio (1.83) ratio. Newton distributed a career-high 10 assists against just one turnover against Wagner on January 23. He also added 7 dimes against just one turnover at LIU.

PERUNICIC CLIMBING 3-POINT CHARTS

Sophomore guard Stefan Perunicic, a member of the 2008-09 NEC All-Rookie team, is currently 9th in the NEC in 3-point field goals per game (2.00 pg.). Last season, he was second (2.90 pg.). He has already hit 137 treys, which is 9th on the all-time school list.

AYENI ENJOYING SUCCESSFUL RETURN FROM KNEE INJURY

Senior Kayode Ayeni has recovered from a serious knee injury to be one of the most consistent Terriers this season. The forward is averaging 10.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per contest. He enjoyed a career game against Bryant as he scored 23 points and 14 rebounds, leading the Terriers to a 54-48 victory. He also came up big in the win at Colgate, coming off the bench to score 22 points on 11-of-16 shooting.

BENNETT STUFFING THE STAT SHEETS

Junior guard Akeem Bennett has made an instant impact in his first season with the Terriers. He ranks among the Top 20 in the league in several major categories. The Long Island native is second in the league in free-throws made (120) is 9th in the league in scoring (14.5 ppg.), 11th in rebounding (6.0), and is 6th in assists (4.17). He also ranks second in steals (2.17 pg.).

A LITTLE EXTRA HELPING OF WRICE

Senior center Herman Wrice is not regarded as a key offensive threat for the Terriers. However, the Philadelphia native has been extremely efficient from the floor this season, shooting 55 percent. Wrice has hit 35 of his last 56 (.628) attempts from the field over a 16-game stretch. Wrice is also 10th in the NEC in blocks (0.96 pg.). He delivered a huge conventional 3-point play in the 57-54 win against Wagner (1/23) with 1:36 remaining.

FRESHMAN AKEEM JOHNSON NO LONGER JUST "THE OTHER AKEEM"

The league is very aware of junior transfers Akeem Bennett's impact this season. However, freshman Akeem Johnson has been asked to play major minutes with the injuries to Harrington and Byam. Johnson is averaging 17 minutes over the last 10 contests after playing just 7.5 mpg. over the first 12 games. Johnson is 44-for-66 (.667) over the 14 games. He came up big with 9 points and 5 rebounds in the win at the Mount on January 14. He also added a huge block in the closing seconds to secure the victory. He scored a career-high 14 points (7-for-8 fga) in the loss at Quinnipiac on Thursday.

TERRIER SCORING OUPUT; TALE OF TWO HALVES

The Terriers have struggled to get off to good starts this season as they have had much more luck putting up points in the second stanza. St. Francis has scored 35 or more points in 11 different games in the second half. The Terriers have only scored 35 points in the opening half once (Mount, 1/21). Further, the Terriers have scored under 30 points in the opening half in 21 of 26 games this season. They have scored 30 or more points in the second half in 18 of 26 games. The Terriers are averaging 26.2 points in the first half and 33.2 in the second half.

FORMER SETON HALL BIG MAN, MIKE DAVIS, TRANSFERS TO ST. FRANCIS (NY)



St. Francis (NY) head coach Brian Nash announced that former Seton Hall big man **Mike Davis** (Brooklyn Academy/Brooklyn, NY) has enrolled at the College. He must sit out the 2009-10 season, and will have two seasons of eligibility remaining when he suits up for the Terriers in 2010-11.

Davis, a 6-11 center, played two years at Seton Hall University in the Big East.

Davis appeared in 30 games for the Pirates last season, averaging 2.6 points and 2.3 rebounds a game. He shot 45.6 percent from the field and was third on the team with 17 blocked shots. Davis had a career-high 13 points in a win over the Terriers on November 14 and grabbed a career-high nine rebounds in a win over Monmouth December 2. He also blocked two shots at Notre Dame January 10. Davis played in 31 games his freshman season, averaging 2.7 points and 2.5 rebounds a game. He scored eight points, grabbed four rebounds and had four blocks against Louisville January 19, and then pulled down seven rebounds at Villanova February 9. Davis notched eight points and had three rejections against Syracuse March 5. He also was on the Big East Academic All-Star Team in 2008.

"I am very excited that Mike has chosen to become a part of our family here at St. Francis College," said coach Nash. A player of his size and skill will have a chance to make a big impact on our program."

Davis, who was ranked the 17th-best center in the class of 2006 by the web site Rivals.com., will be allowed to practice with the team this season.

FORMER SETON HALL SIGNEE, MIKE GLOVER, TO SUIT UP FOR TERRIERS NEXT SEASON

St. Francis (NY) head coach Brian Nash announced that 6-foot-6 forward **Mike Glover** has signed a national-letter-of-intent to play for the Terriers next season.

Glover, who is currently enrolled at the College of Eastern Utah, is the younger brother of former St. John's standout Anthony Glover. He will provide the Terriers with a strong rebounding presence and is good finisher around the basket.

He guided his prep school, Boys to Men Academy (Ill.), to a national championship in 2006. Glover then teamed with current Sacramento Kings' standout rookie, Tyreke Evans, at America Christian School (Aston, PA) in 2007. That year, he was selected to play for the New York City team in the Jordan Brand Classic Regional Game at Madison Square Garden.

Glover initially committed to Seton Hall and arrived on campus in the summer of 2007, however the NCAA ruled that he was an academic non-qualifier.

Glover, a Bronx native, will join former Seton Hall center **Mike Davis** (Brooklyn, NY / Brooklyn Academy) next season in the Terriers' frontcourt. The 6-foot-11 Davis is currently enrolled at St. Francis and is practicing with the squad this season.

Update: Glover is averaging a team-high 15.3 points and 6.9 rebounds per game this season at the College of Eastern Utah. He's averaging 22.8 minutes per game and is shooting a blistering 54 percent from the floor (124-228).

KENNY MOORE SIGNS WITH TERRIERS

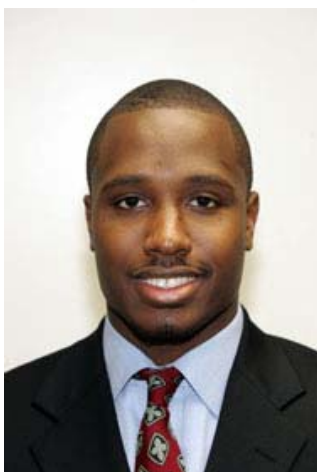

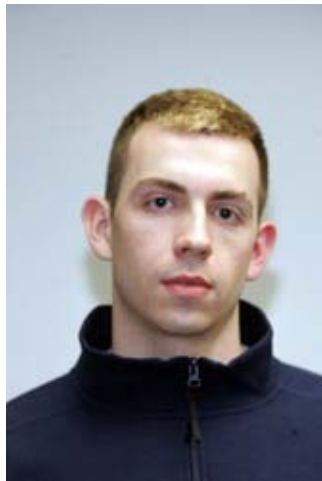

Game 4. UMass 83, SFNY 65

The Terriers fell to 0-4 on the season after dropping an 83-65 decision at UMass on Tuesday evening in Amherst, Massachusetts. The Minutemen improved to 2-2 on the season.

Junior guard Ricky Cadell led four Terriers in double-figures with 17 points. Junior forward Alex Harrington and sophomore forward Stefan Perunicic each added 12 points, while senior forward Kayode Ayeni added 10 points in his first action since his knee injury (ACL) last December.

St. Francis trailed 42-30 at halftime after being down by as many as 17 points in the opening half, but put a scare into the Minutemen by trimming the deficit to as little as 53-50 with 12:46 remaining in the contest.

A 10-4 run by the Terriers after the hosts had taken a 44-32 lead with 18:51 remaining brought St. Francis within 48-42. Cadell capped the spurt with a layup off a feed by Ayeni at the 16:15 mark. The Terriers trailed by eight, 53-45, after freshman Freddie Riley hit a trey for UMass, but the feisty Terriers scored five straight points as Cadell knocked down a triple and Perunicic converted a fast-break layup at the 12:46 mark.

The Terriers were still within just five points, 58-53, at the 9:32 mark, but the hosts rattled off six straight points to extend their advantage to 64-53 with 7:59 left. St. Francis was able to close to within single-digits on a couple of occasions, the latest coming at 68-59 after junior guard Akeem Bennett converted a steal and a layup with 5:58 on the clock.

St. Francis shot 45.1 percent (23-of-53) overall and were 8-of-19 (42.1 percent) from 3-point land.

UMass converted 49.1 percent (28-of-57) and were 9-of-19 (47.4 percent) from behind the arc. The Minuteman also were better from the line as they hit 18-of-24 (75 percent) compared to 11-of-20 (55 percent) by the Terriers.

Game 7 SFNY 63, Hartford 60

Junior guard Ricky Cadell's 3-pointer with four seconds remaining lifted the host St. Francis (NY) Terriers to a 63-60 non-conference victory over the Hartford Hawks, Tuesday evening at the Pope Physical Education Center. The Terriers improved to 3-5 and the Hawks dropped to 2-8. Cadell, who went 7-of-16 from the floor (5-of-11 treys), paced the Terriers with 19 points and added three steals. The Terriers led 57-49 with 6:32 remaining in the contest after senior center Herman Wrice converted a pair of free throws. But the Hawks scored the next seven points to close the gap to 57-56 at the 4:55 mark. Junior guard Joe Zeglinski scored five consecutive points to cap the spurt. Hartford eventually tied the game for the sixth time after Joel Barkers made two free throws with 2:27 remaining, and took their final lead at 60-58 after a layup by Brothers with 1:39 on the clock. Junior Akeem Bennett then drew a foul with 1:10 left and tied the score at 60-60 with two free throws. Hartford was unable to take the lead as Terriers' sophomore guard Justin Newton came up with a big rebound of the Brothers' missed jumper. After Cadell's game-winner, Hartford had one last chance to tie the game but Morgan Sabia's long 3-point attempt from the right wing near the sideline was way off the mark. Hartford jumped out to a 12-4 advantage at the 15:56 mark of the opening half, but St. Francis went on a 16-7 run to take their first lead of the game, 20-19, with 9:51 left. The Terriers settled for a 34-32 halftime edge, just the second time that they have taken a lead into the break this season. St. Francis shot 43.1 percent (22-of-51) from the floor and were 9-of-23 (39.1 percent) from behind the arc. The Hawks shot at a 46.7 percent clip (8-for-22) and were 8-of-22 (36.4 percent) from downtown. Both teams grabbed 29 rebounds but the Hawks turned the ball over 17 times compared to just 10 by the hosts.

Game 9 Syracuse 75, SFNY 51

The #6 ranked Syracuse Orange handed the St. Francis (NY) Terriers a 75-51 defeat in front of 19,381 fans at the Carrier Dome on Sunday afternoon. The Terriers fell to 3-6 and the Orange improved to 10-0.

Game 12 St. Francis (NY) 69, St. Francis (PA) 57

St. Francis (NY) junior guard Akeem Bennett recorded his second "double-double" of the season with 18 points and 10 assists to help lead the host Terriers to a 69-57 Northeast Conference victory over the St. Francis (PA) Red Flash on Thursday evening at the Pope Physical Education Center. The Terriers improved to 4-8 (2-1 NEC) and the Red Flash dropped to 4-10 (2-1 NEC).

Game 13 Robert Morris 67, St. Francis (NY) 63

Brooklyn Heights, NY -- The host St. Francis (NY) Terriers erased a 21-point halftime deficit against the Robert Morris Colonials but fell in the closing seconds, 67-63, in a Northeast Conference contest on Saturday afternoon at the Pope Physical Education Center. Dartmouth forward David Rufful completed a 3-point play with 0.9 seconds remaining to give the host Big Green a 65-64 non-conference victory over the St. Francis (NY) Terriers, Monday evening at Leede Arena in Hanover, New Hampshire. Game 23, St. Francis (NY) 88, Long Island 84

The St. Francis (NY) Terriers defeated the Long Island Blackbirds, 88-84, in triple overtime, capturing perhaps the most thrilling "Battle of Brooklyn" contest in the history of the series. The Terriers, now in a three-way tie for third place in the Northeast Conference, snapped a three-game losing skid to improve to 10-13 (7-5 NEC) and the Blackbirds fell to 9-14 (7-5 NEC).

St. Francis junior guard **Ricky Cadell**, who played 52 minutes, was named the game's Most Valuable Player with 21 points and five caroms. The honor could have been awarded to several Terriers who delivered clutch plays down the stretch. Junior guard **Akeem Bennett** (6 boards, 5 assists) scored a game-high 22 points before fouling out in overtime and senior **Kayode Ayeni** (16 points, 6 rebounds) and **Stefan Perunicic** (12 points) were also in double-digits. Senior center **Herman Wrice** added 9 points and a team-high 12 boards and sophomore guard **Justin Newton** chipped in with seven assists and three steals.

LIU looked to have the game in hand as they led 39-29 with 14:26 remaining in the second half, but the gritty Terriers scored seven straight points to make it 39-36 at the 10:44 mark. St. Francis forged ahead, 46-45, for the first time since the first half after Cadell converted a layup off a great dish by Bennett with 6:48 to play.

The game went back-and-forth in the closing minutes until Cadell hit a jumper with 1:55 left to give the visitors a 54-53 advantage. After several turnovers and fouls for both teams, LIU's Jaytornah Wisseh (13 points) had an opportunity to give the hosts a lead with 18 seconds left, but the senior hit just one of two from the line to knot the score a 54-54. Bennett then misfired on a jumper with a second left and the game went into overtime.

St. Francis led 61-58 in the first extra period after Ayeni scored inside with 3:12 remaining, but LIU ripped off six consecutive points to take a 64-61 edge with just 56 ticks left. Wisseh hit 3-of-4 free throws to cap the run. But the Terriers closed within a point, 64-63, after a pull-up jumper by Perunicic with 32 seconds remaining. Wisseh then knocked down a pair of foul shots to restore a three point edge for LIU with 28 seconds remaining, but Perunicic calmly drilled a deep 3-pointer from the right wing to tie the game at 66-66 with 16 seconds left. Wrice then blocked Wisseh's three-point attempt as the horn sounded to force a second overtime.

In the second overtime session, Cadell converted a layup to spot the Terriers a 68-66 advantage with 3:12 remaining, but LIU went on an 8-0 run to go ahead 74-68 with only 1:07 remaining. The Terriers answered back with five straight points to close within 74-73 with 36 seconds left. Wrice converted inside and Cadell scored on a conventional 3-point play. LIU's Kyle Johnson (21 points) sank two free throws with 15 seconds on the clock to make it a 3-point game, but Cadell saved the day with a long trey from the top of the circle to force a third overtime with seven seconds remaining.

The Terriers led the entire third and final overtime period as Wrice scored the first four points to give his team momentum. Perunicic hit one of two from the line and freshman post **Akeem Johnson** (8 points, 5 rebounds) converted a layup to make it 83-76 with 2:34 left. The Blackbirds closed within two, 83-81, after David Hicks (16 points) scored five straight points with 1:22 left, but the hosts misfired on six straight field goal attempts and St. Francis made 5-of-8 free throws to put the game out of reach. Michael Culpo connected on a 3-pointer at the buzzer for the game's final points.

St. Francis, who reached 70 points for the first time this season, shot 41.3 percent (33-of-80) for the game. They connected on just 9-of-32 (28.1 percent) from behind the arc and hit just 13-of-25 (52 percent) from the charity stripe.

Game 26, Monmouth 51, St. Francis (NY) 49

Brooklyn Heights, NY -- -Sophomore guard Will Campbell hit a pair of free throws with four seconds remaining to give the visiting Monmouth Hawks a 51-49 victory over the St. Francis (NY) Terriers, in a Northeast Conference contest on Thursday evening at the Pope Physical Education Center.

Junior guard **Akeem Bennett** recorded his third "double-double" of the season as he notched 15 points and 12 rebounds to pace the Terriers, who fell to 10-16 (7-8 NEC). Classmate **Ricky Cadell** (4-10, 3-pointers) was also in double-figures with 14 points.

St. Francis, who have now dropped six of their last seven contests, had possession of the ball with the score knotted at 49-49, but Terriers' sophomore guard **Justin Newton** committed a turnover with 25 seconds left. After a timeout, Campbell (10 points) drove the lane and Newton was called for a blocking foul, which led to the game-winning free throws for the Hawks, who are now 12-15 (8-7 NEC).

The Terriers had an opportunity to send the game into overtime but missed two great looks at the basket in the closing seconds. St. Francis elected not to call timeout and executed a well-executed play as Cadell got free along the left sideline and drove to the bucket for a chance at the equalizer. However, his lefty layup rimmed out of the hoop and Bennett's follow did the same at the buzzer.

Monmouth, who led 28-23 at the break, extended their lead to 38-29 after a dunk by sophomore forward Travis Taylor (16 points) at the 14:27 mark. But the hosts scored the next nine points of the game to knot the score at 38-38 with 9:54 remaining. Cadell drained a trey to start the run and Bennett ended it with a 3-pointer from the right wing.

Once again, the Hawks surged ahead as they answered with a 9-2 spurt to grab a 47-40 advantage with 5:24 remaining in the contest. But the hosts fired right back with a 9-2 run of their own to tie the contest for the fourth and final time of the game, 49-49, after a Cadell triple from the left corner with 1:21 left.

St. Francis got off to a slow start to open the first half as the visitors jumped out to a 10-0 advantage at the 14:37 mark. But the Terriers went on a 13-2 run to grab a 13-12 lead after a 3-pointer by sophomore guard **Stefan Perunicic** with 8:58 left in the opening stanza. The Terriers took their final advantage of the first half, 20-18, after a trifecta by Cadell with 3:51 on the clock. Monmouth closed out the period with a 10-3 spurt.

Monmouth also got 14 points from junior guard Justin Sofman, who hit 4-of-8 treys.

The Terriers shot just 39.6 percent (19-of-48) from the floor and hurt themselves at the line by hitting only 4-of-11 attempts (36.4 percent). The Hawks shot just 37.3 percent (19-for-51) but hit 6-of-7 free throws (85.7 percent). Both teams knocked down seven treys.
