The St. Francis College women's basketball team enters the 2012-13 season with a new leader, a re-organized staff, three new players and a foundation established after last year's largest recruiting class in program history.

New Head Coach John Thurston expressed "I don't want us to be considered young, inexperienced or rebuilding. I want us to be considered as solid, sound, and prepared." Coach Thurston conveyed his overall expectations for the 2012-13 season.

"There are several things that really intrigue me about the upcoming season. First, is the fact that we will be moving from a completely inexperienced team that started five freshmen to one in which eleven players have already played significant minutes at the Division I level. The second is the possibility of having close to a completely healthy roster and seeing what some of our players can do when they are unburdened by injuries and lay-offs [Last year five players lost extended time due to injuries with one not playing at all].

Lastly, I believe we have quality depth, which I have

always felt is a key to making progress as a program."

As Coach Thurston gets set to embark on his first season as head coach, he joins a small fraternity of women's head coaches who were formerly head coaches in Division I men's programs having served at James Madison University from 1985-88.

Early in the summer, Thurston added Nettie Respondek as an assistant coach to the staff, joining holdovers Dionne Dodson and Kaitlyn Vican.

Dodson, who was promoted to first assistant by Thurston, enters her fifth season in the Heights while Vican embarks on her second year. Respondek has experience coaching in the New York City area, with stops at Fordham University and more recently, Columbia University.

"I feel very comfortable with this staff," mentioned Thurston. "I've worked with Dionne for the past two seasons here at the College. Nettie and I worked together at Fordham while Kaitlyn has been with me as either a player or coach for seven years. Dionne

will handle all aspects of recruiting, Nettie will be our go to 'X and O' person and Kaitlyn does the work of three people."

The Terriers return all five starters from last year's squad. Sophomore forward Jaymee Veney, who was named to the Northeast Conference All-Rookie Team last season, will look to improve on her stellar first season in Brooklyn Heights. After starting in 23 of 29 contests, the native of Fairborn, Ohio led the team in scoring (8.9 points per game) and rebounding (5.7 per game).

Veney was the Terriers' most consistent shooter, finishing the year at 49.5 percent, which was second in the Northeast Conference and holds the 7th highest field goal percentage in a single season among all St. Francis College women's basketball players. The 6'0 forward will look to add to her 13 career double-digit scoring games and two career double-doubles once the regular season commences.

Fellow classmate Jessica Kaufman had an injury-plagued debut season on Remsen Street. When healthy, the Melbourne, Australia native was the team's second leading scorer (8.4 points per game),



despite missing a total of 13 games.

Kaufman displayed flashes of brilliance, as her first collegiate start proved. She scored a career-high 16 points in the overtime loss at UPENN and ten days later, in her home debut, pulled down a personal best of ten rebounds.

Sophomore Sarah Benedetti will be looked upon to be the Terriers primary long-range threat. Starting in 21 of 29 contests last season, the native of Canton, Connecticut, tied the St. Francis College women's basketball program record with seven made three-pointers against Robert Morris in Moon Township, Pennsylvania.

On the year, Benedetti finished sixth in the Northeast Conference in three-point field goals made (51) and was in the top-15 amongst all NEC players in three-point field goal percentage, connecting for 32.5 percent from beyond the arc.

Junior guard Jasmin Robinson brings an explosive dynamic to the Terriers' backcourt. Her ability to score was evident back on February 25th as the Brooklyn native recorded her first double-double, notching twenty points and 13 rebounds in a road victory at FDU.

In all, Robinson has notched 18 double-figure scoring games, 12 coming last season. Robinson also finished in the Top-15 in the Northeast Conference in steals last season.

Sophomore point guard and Team MVP Katie Fox was the lone Terrier to start in all 29 contests last season as she led all Terriers in minutes played. The native of Twinsburg, OH looks to improve on a team-high six-

ty-one assists for the season.

Two newcomers who are expected to provide depth in the backcourt are freshman combo guard Leah Fechko (Twinsburg, OH) and freshman guard Taylor Watson (Southampton, NJ).

Fechko helped lead the Twinsburg Tigers to consecutive OHSA Division I Girls state basketball title runs, averaging 13 points, 5.5 rebound, 3.7 assists, 3.0 steals as a senior while playing three positions.

Watson, who stands at 5-8, was named New Jersey All-State Group III at Seneca High School this past season. Throughout the season she was ranked among the top three-point shooters in New Jersey.

Eilidh Simpson (3.5 ppg, 1.5 rpg) played through injuries last season and the coaching staff expects her to play a pivotal role after off-season surgery.

Senior guard Stefanie Bingham (4.7 ppg, 2.6 rpg) enters her final season in Brooklyn Heights. Named tri-captain for the 2011-12 season, Bingham played in all 29 games for the third straight year while starting in 13 contests.

The Willingboro, NJ, native grabbed a season-high eight rebounds at Quinnipiac and swiped a career-best seven steals at home against the Central Connecticut State Blue Devils back on December 11th, 2011.

Junior Ozana Marginean (1.4 ppg, 0.8 rpg), saw her playing time increase significantly in her second season with the Terriers.

The frontcourt depth should be a strong point as well with six players vying for playing time. Newcomer



Casey Cummings (Leesburg, VA), a 6-1 center, averaged 11.0 points and 13.0 rebounds at Loudoun County High School. The Raiders won the Region II championship and were runner-ups in the Virginia Division 4 state championship game.

Sophomore Kiley Grabbe, a 6'2 forward (2.7 ppg, 2.7 rpg;) will be back in the mix after sitting out last season due to a medical redshirt.

Sophomore Colette Hounshell (2.7 ppg, 1.3 rpg) will be looked upon for key minutes in the post after being slowed by injuries last season. Fellow classmate Kelly Myers (3.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg) will redshirt this season while she recovers from foot problems that have plagued her since last year.

HEAD COACH JOHN THURSTON



John Thurston enters his first season as head coach of the St. Francis College women's basketball program. Overall, Thurston embarks on his 40th season on the sidelines. Thurston takes over for Brenda Milano, who announced her resignation after nine years on the sidelines.

Coach Thurston finished his second-season with program, serving as the Associate Head Coach last year, as he brings a wealth of experience to the program. "Although we are sad to lose Brenda, I'm excited about the impact that John will make as head coach," explained Director of Athletics Irma Garcia. "In just two seasons, he's helped make great inroads in all facets of the program. Our recruiting has improved tremendously and he's brought fresh ideas with regards to practice preparation and game strategy."

"I would like to thank President Dugan, the members of the Board of Trustees and most especially Irma Garcia for the opportunity they have given to me to lead this program," Thurston said. "I want to personally thank Brenda Milano for her support, without which, this opportunity would not have occurred. I'm looking forward to working with the outstanding young women on our team. Their enthusiasm, desire and work ethic are the building blocks upon which we will base our program."

Thurston is one of only a few coaches who have been a Head Coach at the NCAA DI, DII, DIII and NAIA levels in 26 years of coaching men's college basketball from 1971-1997. During the early 1970's, Thurston's Fairleigh Dickinson-Florham teams were known for their high scoring offense, averaging almost 100 points per game.

During the following ten years as an assistant and three as Head Coach at James Madison University, the Dukes went to four NCAA tournaments and

one NIT. For his tremendous efforts in the 1986-87 season, Thurston was named the Colonial Athletic Association "Coach of the Year."

In nine years at Wingate University he served the dual role of Athletic Director and Head Basketball Coach and is credited with moving the athletic department from NAIA status to nationally competitive NCAA DII affiliation.

From 2001-2003 Thurston held the position of General Manager at Atlanta's Suwanee Sports Academy establishing widely respected basketball training programs and bringing national events such as the adidas Showtime Championships and adidas Top Ten All-Star game to the Atlanta area.

While planning the Suwanee Sports Academy venture Thurston took over the girls program at Marist

HS in Atlanta in 1999. During his three years at the helm the War Eagles broke school records for wins each year advancing to the State Tournament each year with a pair of Elite Eight appearances. His teams were ranked in the Top Ten in GA all three years and six of his players went on to play college basketball, five at the D I level.

Thurston returned to collegiate coaching in the fall of 2003 to serve as Ann Hancock's top assistant at UNC-Wilmington and has been involved with the women's game for eight years on both the major and small college levels.

In 2005, Thurston moved to Northwood University in West Palm Beach, FL to develop the school's first ever women's basketball program. In their first two seasons of competition, he led the Seahawks to two Florida Sun Conference titles, and their first appear-

ance at the NAIA National Tournament in 2008 in Sioux City, Iowa. He was named FSC Coach of the Year in 2008, and under his guidance, Katie Vican (2007, current assistant coach of the Terriers) and Kara Otterbine (2008) were named FSC Player of the Year.

Thurston has gained respect through the years as an evaluator and developer of talent, ranging from two NBA players, six overall NBA draft choices, seven European professionals, four "Rookies of the Year", three "Players of the Year", one "Defensive Player of the Year", eighteen All-Conference selections, three 2000 pt. scorers and thirteen 1000 pt scorers. Twelve of his former players have already been elected to their school's Hall of Fame.

A 1966 graduate of Archbishop Molloy High School he was an All-City performer in both baseball and basketball under legendary Coach Jack Curran and was a 1966 draft choice of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

He continued his education at Seton Hall University graduating with a degree in Government. He played both baseball and basketball for the Pirates and was awarded the John F Kennedy Award in 1970 as the school's outstanding student-athlete.

He and his wife, Candice, have been married for 40 years and have two daughters, Clancy and Corey and four grandchildren, Jack, Rhone, Luke, and Elsa.

Dionne Dodson enters her fifth season with the Terriers and will serve as head coach John Thurston's first assistant coach.

"Coach Dodson has done an outstanding job of recruiting, academic support and NCAA compliance here at St. Francis and will continue to do so," said Thurston. "She has been extremely loyal to the college and the women's basketball program. She is deserving of this promotion. Dionne has done it all in her twelve-plus years as an assistant and I believe she is ready to be a head coach."

Dodson spent two seasons at Fordham University where she was involved in all aspects of the program. Her duties included coordination of the entire recruiting system, assisting with scouting and tape breakdown and on-floor coaching and organizing summer camps. Previous to Fordham, she served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Manhattan for three years. She helped recruit three players who earned Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) All-Rookie honors, two in 2004 and one in 2005.

Prior to coming to New York City, Dodson was an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Coastal Carolina University in 2002-03. Her responsibilities at Coastal Carolina included coordination of the entire recruiting system, assisting with scouting and on-floor coaching.

Dodson received her start in coaching at Saint Francis University in Loretto, Pennsylvania where she served as an assistant coach from 1999- 2002, help-

ing the Red Flash win the 2000 and 2002 Northeast Conference(NEC) regular season and tournament championships and advance to the NCAA Tournament.

She also helped recruit the 2002 NEC Tournament MVP while also being responsible for developing and monitoring the strength and conditioning program as well as monitoring the academic progress of the student-athletes. She also assisted with on-floor coaching and with scouting as well as organizing community service activities.

A 1997 graduate of Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio, Dodson received a Bachelors degree in Psychology from the school before going on to earn a Masters degree in Sports Management from Slippery Rock University in 2003.

Nettie Respondek commences on her first season on the Terrier sidelines as assistant coach. Respondek spent the last two seasons with the Columbia University women's basketball team as an assistant coach under head coach Paul Nixon.

Coach Thurston goes on to say that Nettie "was an outstanding collegiate player and has a terrific knowledge and feel for the game. Our student athletes will benefit from her playing and coaching experiences. Nettie will work with our wing players and will be involved with recruiting but her primary responsibilities will be in scouting, game preparation, post-game analysis, practice planning and on-court instruction. Personally, I have known Nettie for a few years now and feel very comfortable with her enthusiasm and professionalism.

This past May, coach Respondek was one of three American college coaches chosen to travel to the town of Lira in Uganda, Africa for the International Sports Connection. For 12 days, Respondek had the opportunity to teach 200 Ugandan coaches the fundamentals of basketball. To date, the coaches' clinic that she was a part is the largest of its kind in that particular region of Uganda.

Prior to her stint in Morningside Heights, Respondek held a similar assistant coaching position at Fordham University from 2006-08. Vican is a 2010 graduate of Fordham University, where she majored in Communications and Media Studies. She was a member of the Rams women's basketball team from 2008-2011. Prior to her stint at Northwood, Vican attended Eastern York High School where she finished as the career rebound leader, grabbing 853 caroms during her career. She ranks 2nd on the Knights all-time scoring list with 1,313 points while garnering accolades on the Street and Smith Honorable-Mention following her junior season, the York Interscholastic Association (YAIAA) all-star honoree, a two-time YAIAA "coaches pick" All-Star team.

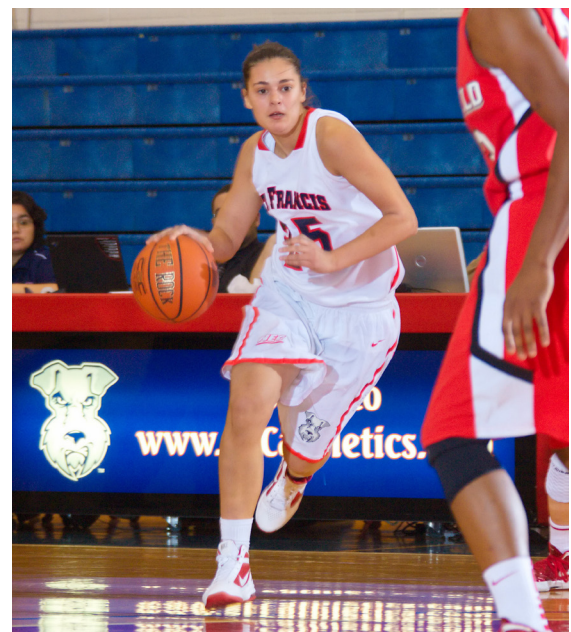
