### LAST MATCH-UP

Last season, the Highlanders edged St. Francis Brooklyn, 68-66, in Newark. The game featured 13 ties before Damon Lynn hit two free-throws to give the Highlanders the victory with 1:13 left. Lynn paced NJIT with a game-high 22 points. The leading returning scorer for the Terriers was Tyreek Jewell, who produced 14 points. The Terriers led 62-59 with just over five minutes to play but could not hold the lead.

**TERRIER UPDATE:** St. Francis Brooklyn had won two straight (Hartford, Lafayette) before falling to St. John's, 63-56, in the Holiday Festival on Sunday. The Terriers pushed the Red Storm to the limit but ultimately were unable to overcome a 19-2 run by St. John's over the last six minutes of the first half. St. Francis Brooklyn managed to close within two points with under a minute remaining but that was as close as they could get. Junior guard Yunus Hopkinson and senior forward Antonio Jenifer paced the Terriers with 10 points apiece. Senior forward Amdy Fall contributed a team-high 10 rebounds and freshman forward Keon Williams came up with a game-high three steals...Sophomore guard Glenn Sanabria has missed the last two contests with an injury...The NEC regular-season championship and N.I.T. participant banner will be raised prior to tonight's tip-off.

**UP NEXT:** The Terriers will travel to Riverdale to take on the Manhattan Jaspers on Monday evening before they entertain Liberty on Sunday, December 20th.

## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

St. Francis College, often referred to as St. Francis or SFC, is a private, coeducational college located in Brooklyn Heights, New York, in the United States. The campus comprises five interconnected buildings, occupying half of a city block in Downtown Brooklyn. It was founded in 1859 by friars of the Order of Servants Franciscans, a Franciscan order, as the St. Francis Academy and was the first private school in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn. St. Francis College began as a parochial all-boys academy in the City of Brooklyn and has transformed into a small liberal arts college that has 19 academic departments which offer 72 majors and minors.

St. Francis College is a predominantly undergraduate institution, yet does have graduate programs in accounting, project management and psychology. St. Francis has been ranked nationally and regionally by Forbes magazine, Washington Monthly and U.S. News and World Report as one of the top baccalaureate colleges. St. Francis is set in an urban environment and is considered a commuter college. As of 2013, there are 2,900 undergraduates (10% part-time) and 66 graduates (45% part-time). The student to faculty ratio is 18:1 and 43.6% of classes have 20 or fewer students. The 2,900 students that attend St. Francis College come from over 80 countries. St. Francis College has been ranked by the New York Times and Forbes as one of the more diverse colleges in the United States.

SFC has 19 athletic teams that compete in Division I of the NCAA. SFC's teams participate in the Northeast Conference, with the exception of the men's and women's water polo teams which compete in the CWPA and the MAAC, respectively.

The St. Francis College men's basketball team, founded in 1896, is the oldest collegiate program in New York City. In the Terrier's 117 year history, they have won 5 regular season championships and have had 3 NIT bids. The Terriers had their best season in 1953-54 under Daniel Lynch posting a record of 23-5 and reaching the NIT semi-finals. Then during Ron Ganulin's tenure as head coach, in the late 1990s and early 2000s, the team recaptured momentum and was one of the better teams in the NEC; from 1998 through 2004, St. Francis posted a 78-36 conference record. At the time Ganulin's assistant was Glenn Braica, who is the current head coach as of 2010. Braica was most recently an assistant under Norm Roberts at St. John's University.

**2014-15 Rewind:** One of the great stories in New York City hoops last year, St. Francis Brooklyn came within a whisker of claiming the program's first NEC championship after capturing the NEC regular season title for the third time. But the four points that separated the Terriers from hoisting the NEC trophy did little to diminish a season that ranked among the best in school history. SFBK matched the program's single-season record with 23 wins and reached the postseason for the first time in 52 years with an appearance in the Postseason NIT. While sixth year head coach Glenn Braica will no longer have the services of NEC all-time rebound king Jalen Cannon and fellow NEC first teamer Brent Jones, there is plenty left in the cupboard for the Terriers to make another run at the elusive crown.

**NEC Preseason Poll:** The Terriers were selected to finish 5th out of 10 NEC squads.

**Half full or Half empty?:** The Terriers return 50 percent of their offense from last season's NEC regular-season championship team. The squad averaged 69.1 ppg. last year. Cannon (16.1 ppg.), Jones, (14.1 ppg.) Kevin Douglas, (5.1 ppg.), and Lowell Ulmer (3.1 ppg.) have all graduated.

**Terriers Sign Dunn:** 6'2" guard **RASHEEN DUNN** signed with St. Francis Brooklyn during the early period. Dunn is currently a senior at Thomas Jefferson High School in Brooklyn.

**Crown Jewell:** Senior wing **TYREEK JEWELL** is leading the Terriers in scoring at 10.8 ppg. Jewell went for a career-best 20 points in the victory at Hartford and followed that up with a team-high 17 points in the win against Lafayette. His free-throw and floater in the lane put the Terriers ahead for good in the final couple of minutes.

**Let's Go To The Hop:** Junior **YUNUS HOPKINSON** has already scored more points this season than he totalled in all of 2014-15 and is shooting 52 percent from 3-point range (16-of-31), which is second in the league. Playing the last two seasons behind players like Brent Jones and Ben Mockford, Hopkinson had a chance to learn from two of the league's top guards to begin his collegiate career. After averaging 10 minutes per game in his freshman and sophomore seasons, Hopkinson is now making the most of his extended court time this season. Most notably, Hopkinson came off the bench to score 17 of his 20 points in the second half to key a comeback victory at Hartford. He scored eight points in a 15-2 run that erased a 10-point deficit, including the game-tying bucket and go-ahead three-pointer that gave the Terriers a lead they would not relinquish. It marked his second 20-point game of the season. In his first start since his freshman year on Wednesday, Hopkinson scored 10 points and handed out four assists in the win at Lafayette. He drilled a clutch trey that evened the game in the final minutes.

**Hooping It Up:** Senior forward **CHRIS HOOPER** recorded a career-high four rejections in the loss at SLU. In addition, he totalled season-high's in rebounds (8). Last Sunday, Hooper scored a season-high 13 points on 6-of-7 shooting in the victory against Hartford. The Bronx native scored all nine of his points in the second-half in the victory against Lafayette. Hooper is third in the league in field goal percentage (.565).

**Fall Standing Tall:** The NEC's reigning Defensive Player of the Year **AMDY FALL** Leads the Terriers with 13 blocks, 10 steals and 59 total rebounds (7.4 pg.). Fall recorded a career-high 13 boards in the win at Lafayette and added 8 points and a pair of rejections. The native of Senegal recorded his first double-

double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds in the victory at Hartford. He recorded his second straight double-figure rebound game when he pulled down 10 caroms against St. John's on Sunday. Fall is 3rd in the NEC in blocks per game (1.71) and is sixth in rebounding (7.4).

**SFBK's Icelandic Duo:** Freshman guard **DAGUR JONSSON** has joined sophomore forward **GUNNAR OLAFSSON** as a key component on the squad this season. Jonsson is averaging 8.3 ppg. in 23.9 minutes per game off the bench. He scored a career-high 15 points in the win at Lafayette, hitting 3-of-7 treys. Jonsson also grabbed five boards against the Leopards. Olafsson has started all eight contests and is averaging 18.1 mpg. He's shooting at a solid clip thus far, making 12-of-26 attempts (.462) and 6-of-15 treys (.400).

**Garden Lights Shine in Keon:** Freshman wing **KEON WILLIAMS** had misfired on his first nine 3-point tries until he knocked down a couple of tries against St. John's this past Sunday at Madison Square Garden. Williams scored a career-high seven points and also came up with a game-high three steals, also a career-best.

**Jenifer Provides a Spark:** Senior forward **ANTONIO JENIFER** provided the Terriers with 24 solid minutes against St. John's on Sunday. Jenifer hit 4-of-7 field goal attempts, including a pair of 3's for 10 points. In addition, Jenifer added a pair of steals. Jennifer has misfired on eight consecutive long-range attempts before hitting a pair against the Red Storm.

Sixth Season





**Glenn Braica** was named the 17th head coach in the history of the St. Francis Brooklyn men's basketball program on May 20, 2010 and is already the fifth winningest coach at the school. Under his tutelage, the Terriers have qualified for the Northeast Conference Tournament in each of his five seasons, and have opened some eyes both locally as well as on the national scene.

Under Braica's direction, St. Francis Brooklyn tied a school record with 23 victories last season and won their first NEC regular-season crown since the 2003-04 campaign. The Terriers earned a berth in the National Invitation Tournament, the program's first post-season appearance since 1963. Jalen Cannon, one of Braica's first recruits, was named the NEC Player of the Year and was a First Team All Metropolitan Sports Writers Association selection. In addition, Brent Jones earned First Team All-Conference accolades and Amdy Fall was named the NEC's Defensive Player of the Year. It came as no surprise that Braica earned NEC Coach of the Year honors and was the Metropolitan Sports Writers Association's Co-Coach of the Year.

Braica, who has guided the Terriers to a 41-26 record over the past two seasons, has developed a reputation as one of the good guys in the industry and was named a finalist for the prestigious Skip Prosser "Man of the Year" Award the past two years.

On the court, Braica's student-athletes exude the same intensity as their leader does on the sidelines and it's easy to tell why recruits sign up to play for him. A born-and-raised Brooklynite, Braica has spent his entire career in New York City, which began after his playing days at Queens College. He was an assistant at St. Francis Brooklyn for 15 years before a stint at St. John's, returning in 2010 as the program's head coach. That experience has helped Braica navigate through a crowded recruiting scene to thrust the Terriers back in contention to win an NEC championship each season. The current roster includes seven players who hail from New York City.

"The New York guys have been good to us," Braica said. "It's a lot of long-standing relationships, coaches I know and like and they trust us with their kids. "We never used to tell people 'We're from Brooklyn,'" Braica admitted. "But now we advertise it because it's really the place to be."

The Pope Center was the place to be for perhaps the most exciting week in school history last March. Playing in front of sold out and boisterous crowds, the Terriers hosted three NEC Tournament contests, including the championship tilt in front of a national ESPN 2 audience.

"Although we came up just a bit short of qualifying for the NCAA Tournament, we still had a phenomenal year and excited our students, alumni and the local community," said Braica. "The effort was there the entire season and I'm happy that they were rewarded with post-season play. It was a huge accomplishment and one that they can be proud of."

The prior season in 2013-14, the Terriers shocked the country by defeating the Miami Hurricanes in Coral Gables. In the process, Coach Braica and his staff delivered the program's first victory against an Atlantic Coast Conference team.

"This is one of the biggest wins, if not the biggest in the history of our school," Braica told the media during his press conference. "They are the defending ACC champs and are such a great program. I was particularly impressed that our guys had enough left at the end to pull this out after Miami had tied it up to force overtime. To have that kind of mental discipline is not easy so it's a credit to our guys that they were able to hang in there and win the game."

After another impressive victory at Florida Atlantic, Braica's group again had the college basketball world on the edge of their seats just ten days later as they carried the lead against national power Syracuse until the final minute in the Carrier Dome. Despite the heartbreaking defeat, the Terriers bounced back quickly

and went on to tie a Northeast Conference record with nine victories during their non-conference slate. A last second triumph at America East regular-season champion Stony Brook was yet another statement victory for the program.

St. Francis Director of Athletics Irma Garcia was on the money when she introduced Braica to the campus and media for the first time in 2010 saying, "With Glenn we get a true Brooklynite; someone who has spent his entire career making connections within the New York City basketball community. He's someone who cares about his student-athletes not just when they play for him, but years later. He is their mentor for life."

It didn't take long for Braica to get the program back on track. In his first season on the sidelines in 2010-2011, Braica led the Terriers to a 15-15 campaign and the No. 5 seed in the Northeast Conference Tournament. It was the program's best record since the 2003-04 season when St. Francis finished 15-13 and won a share of the NEC regular-season title. Under Braica, the Terriers increased their scoring by more than six points per game from the previous season and were one of the best teams in the country in taking care of the basketball, averaging a conference-low 13.3 turnovers per game. The team also led the NEC with 7.80 steals per game.

In 2011-2012, St. Francis hosted their first home conference tournament game since 1997 after placing fourth in the league standings. Braica's focus on strong defense certainly paid off. That season his squad was one of the best in the nation at guarding the three-point line. The Terriers ranked second in the NEC and 17th in the country in defensive three-point field goal percentage. Braica was rewarded by being named the Jim Phelan NEC Coach of the Year as well as the NABC Division I District 18 Co-Coach of the Year.

In his first stint at St. Francis, Braica was with the Terriers for 15 years and was the Associate Head Coach from the 2000-01 season to 2003-04 under his current assistant coach Ron Ganulin.



The Terriers are 54-34 (.614) in NEC Contests over the past five seasons under Braica.

During Braica's last seven years at St. Francis, the Terriers posted a 118-83 record, including an 88-42 mark in the NEC and captured two regular season titles. They finished with a .500 or better record in the league seven-straight years, at that time the longest active streak in the conference. They also reached the NEC Semifinals five times and had two championship game appearances in Braica's last five seasons. Braica helped Ganulin orchestrate the Terriers' offensive system, which ranked first or second in the NEC in each of the last five seasons he was on staff. During his tenure the squad emerged from the league's lower tier and went on to become one of the conference's marquee programs.

From 1998-2004, the Terriers had one player named the league's Player of the Year, six first-team All-NEC selections, five second-team All-NEC honorees, two players that led the league in scoring, two NEC Rookies of the Year and a NEC Defensive Player of the Year. Braica recruited and coached several student-athletes that would go on to pro basketball careers during his time with the Terriers.

Following his first span at the college, Braica spent six seasons as an assistant at St. John's under Norm Roberts. When Roberts became head coach at St. John's, Braica, a teammate at Queens College, was his first hire.

Glenn is a proven recruiter, scout and strategist, and was instrumental in helping St. John's rebuild its program," said Roberts. "I truly believe that Glenn has the whole package. He brings experience, tremendous coaching ability as well as the personality and demeanor to promote and elevate St. Francis College to the top of the Northeast Conference."

Braica was also praised by Roberts for his ability to reach out to the community and Red Storm alumni, bringing former players back into the fold. He was also one of the co-directors of the Norm Roberts basketball camp, helping to increase enrollment from 75 campers in 2004 to 260 kids per session in 2009.

While at St. John's, Braica recruited and helped develop First Team All-Big East guard Dwight Hardy, Sixth Man of the Year Justin Burrell as well as D.J. Kennedy and Cedric Jackson, who both played in the NBA for the Cleveland Cavaliers.

From 2001-03, Braica was the head coach for the Empire State Games New York City men's open team, which won gold medals in 2001 and 2002, as well as a silver medal in 2003. The teams included former Terriers Cliff Strong, Sean Dantzler, Damien Herard, Devon Neckles, Karl Sanders, and Tristan Smith as well as current NBA player Royal Ivey. Braica has also coached numerous players that participated in the NBA Summer League, including Dwight Hardy (Miami Heat), Justin Burrell (Golden State Warriors), D.J. Kennedy (Cleveland Cavaliers), Paris Horne (Charlotte Hornets), and Justin Brownlee (NY Knicks & Charlotte Hornets).

Since taking over as the Terriers' head coach, several of Braica's student-athletes have gone on to sign professional contracts on the international circuit. Akeem Bennett '11, Ricky Cadell '11, Alex Harrinton '11, Stefan Perunicic '12, Akeem Johnson '13, Alexander Isailovic '14, and Ben Mockford '14 have all enjoyed success overseas.

Braica attended St. Agnes High School and Bishop Ford High School in Brooklyn in the early 1980s and graduated from Queens College in 1989. Braica began his coaching career at New York City Tech as an assistant in 1988. He also served as a teacher at The Recte School and in the New York City Board of Education from 1989-1994.

Braica and his wife, Christine, live in Brooklyn.
