2014-15 Northeast Conference Champions:

The 2014-15 season was one for the ages as the Terriers captured their first Northeast Conference championship in program history. The historic season was capped off with a 77-62 victory over higher seeded Robert Morris Colonials. With a conference championship under their belts, the Terriers earned an automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament (also for the first time in program history). The Terriers took on the nation's top seeded UConn Huskies in the first round of the tournament.

Series History vs. LIU Brooklyn:

LIU Brooklyn leads the all-time season series (47-26). Despite the Blackbirds having control of the all-time record, the Terriers have enjoyed all the recent success. The Terriers are (6-0) against their local rival dating back to the 2012-13 season. Last year the Terriers swept the season series, and won the 22nd annual "Battle of Brooklyn", 73-49, which was played on March 2, 2015.

Last Time Out:

This past Monday the Terriers were defeated by Bryant University, 70-42 at home in the teams first meeting of the season. Despite the loss senior guard Taylor Watson energized the Terriers in 14 minutes of play off the bench. The senior guard scored a career-high eight points on 3-for-4 (75.0%) shooting, which included an exciting coast-to-coast layup where she beat a defender off of a steal. Watson's hustle on both ends of the floor was evident as she got after every loose ball. Junior forward Olivia Levey added eight points of her own on 4-for-6 (66.7%) shooting. Senior guard Leah Fechko scored four points, grabbed a team-high seven rebounds, swiped four steals, and recorded two assists in 35 minutes of play.

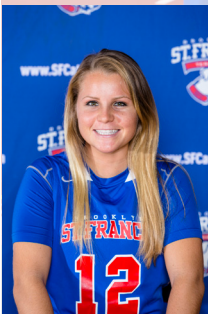

2014-15 NEC Champions



The St. Francis Brooklyn Terriers defeated Robert Morris University, 77-62, on March 15, 2015, to capture their first Northeast Conference Championship. The Terriers advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history, and met the UConn Huskies in the first round.

St. Francis Brooklyn is the first team to go on the road and win all three playoff games to be crowned NEC Champions. They are also the first number five seed to take home the championship trophy.

Sarah Benedetti was named Most Valuable Player after she scored a career and game-high 29 points in the victory.

Benedetti said, "It is a great feeling. I always loved being the underdog and this is the true underdog story. It feels amazing. We have never been in this situation before, but our experience with our 4 seniors and one junior really builds our team chemistry and that helps us when we had to

make big shots to win the game."

An emotional John Thurston said after his Terriers won their first championship, "I want to thank the NEC for putting on a great tournament. They have been so helpful with every step of the way. Congratulations to Robert Morris. To have a team in the NCAA and another team make the finals, it is like us with two teams to make the championship game, your name is out there with some elite programs."

He added, "To Sal and his staff, it is so hard to beat Robert Morris, they are extremely talented. They are so well coached and tough to prepare for. They had a great season. To Irma Garcia, we are so grateful for her dedication and support. Without her vision and support with women's basketball, we wouldn't be here. Irma, and so many other people at St. Francis Brooklyn who have been there for years and have not been able to see a championship, we are grateful to bring them this trophy."

Eilidh Simpson and Jaymee Veney both added 14 points and 5 rebounds a piece. St. Francis Brooklyn took a 32-29 lead into halftime. They turned it on from three-point range in the second half, converting on seven of nine from beyond the arc. As a team, the Terriers shot 10-for-17 from three point range and outscored the Colonials 30-21 from beyond the arc. Overall, St. Francis Brooklyn shot 48.2 % on 27-for-56 shooting.

Simpson said, "Robert Morris played a great game. The first half was a back and forth battle. The second half of the game we were able to pull away after Sarah made some big shots. It was an unreal feeling coming down the stretch. We went to double-overtime with Central Connecticut, so we know it is not over until that final buzzer sounds. To win with these guys is the best feeling in the world"

Veney said, "You never have a feeling of relief when you play here. Robert Morris is a great team, and they are always in it. To win on the road and

beat such a great team is extremely rewarding."

St. Francis Brooklyn and Robert Morris traded baskets in the first half, but the Terriers were able to separate themselves from the defending Northeast Conference Champion Colonials in the second half. The Terriers biggest lead was 18 points.

As the story was all season, St. Francis Brooklyn was nearly perfect from the free-throw line, shooting 13-for-14 from the charity stripe, compared to Robert Morris who shot 3-for-8 from the line. The key stretch in this championship game started at the 11:25 mark when Benedetti hit a three, Fechko scored two layups, then Alex Delaney and Eilidh Simpson hit back to back threes to give the Terriers a 60-44 lead with 8:29 to play.

Robert Morris would pull within 10 with 4:31 remaining after a Ashley Ravelli three-pointer. Simpson responded with a three on the next possession and the Terriers would go on to secure their first Northeast Conference Championship.



Head Coach John Thurston enters his fourth season as the head coach of the St. Francis Brooklyn women's basketball team and 43rd on the sidelines. In his three seasons with the Terriers, Coach T has instilled a winning atmosphere in the program, both on the court and in the classroom.

The 2014-15 campaign was an incredible success for Thurston's Terriers. For the first time in program history, St. Francis Brooklyn Women's Basketball won the Northeast Conference Championship by defeating Robert Morris on March 15, 2015. The Terriers also made their first appearance in the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament and faced the eventual National Champion UConn Huskies in the opening round.

While the success on the court last season was impressive, the Terriers also were champions in the classroom and among their fellow peers. All 13 members of the St. Francis Brooklyn Women's Basketball Team were named to the 2014 Northeast Conference Winter Academic Honor Roll, with six of the 13 being named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll.

As a team, St. Francis Brooklyn Women's Basketball Team finished with a 3.61 overall team GPA this past academic year. They had the highest grade point average in the Northeast Conference for women's basketball, taking home the 2014-15 NEC Team GPA Award. St. Francis Brooklyn Women's Basketball finished second in the WBCA Academic Top 25, placing second with a 3.656 grade point average. That was the highest GPA in either the men's or women's NCAA Tournament field.

As if the accolades weren't impressive already, the Terriers completed the clean sweep of the major awards when they were named the winners of the Northeast Conference Sportsmanship Award for Women's Basketball. The NEC Sportsmanship Award is designed to acknowledge the team in each conference sport that,



in the opinion of its peers, most closely demonstrates good sportsmanship based on the NEC Principles of Sportsmanship and Standards of Conduct.

Academic success has been the foundation of the revival of the Terriers' women's basketball program. In 2011-12, while coach Thurston served as the Associ-

fifth conference victory at home against Sacred Heart.

Thurston is one of only a few coaches who have been a Head Coach at the NCAA DI, DII, DIII and NAIA levels in 26 years of coaching men's college basketball from 1971-1997. During the early 1970's, Thurston's Fairleigh Dickinson-Florham teams were known for their high scoring offense, averaging close to one hundred points per game.

After FDU-Florham, Thurston joined Lou Campanelli's staff at James Madison, where he spent ten years as an assistant and was promoted to head coach in 1985. During his tenure, the Dukes went to four NCAA tournaments and one National Invitational Tournament (NIT). For his tremendous efforts during the 1986-87 campaign, Thurston was named the Colonial Athletic Association "Coach of the Year."

Thurston's next coaching stop found him at Wingate University, where he spent nine years in North Carolina. He served a dual role as Athletic Director and head basketball coach while helping the school transition from NAIA to nationally competitive DII affiliation.

In the fall of 2003, Thurston returned to collegiate coaching as he served as Ann Hancock's top assistant at UNC-Wilmington. Two years later, Thurston moved to West Palm Beach, Florida, where he was hired at Northwood University, to develop the school's first women's basketball program.

In their first two seasons of competition, he led the Seahawks to two Florida Sun Conference titles and their first appearance at the NAIA National Tournament in 2008 in Sioux City, Iowa. Thurston was named FSC Coach of the Year in 2008, and had back-to-back Player of the Year selections in current St. Francis Brooklyn assistant coach Kaitlyn Vican (2007) and Kara Otterbine (2008).

Through his forty-plus year in the game, Thurston has gained the respect as an evaluator and developer of talent, ranging from two NBA players, six overall NBA draft choices, 10 European professionals, four "Rookies of the Year," three "Players of the Year," one "Defensive Player of the Year," 18 All-Conference selections, three 2,000 point scorers and 16 1,000 point scorers. Twelve of his former players have already been elected to their school's respective Hall of Fame.

Thurston is a 1966 graduate of Archbishop Molloy High School, where he was an All-City performer in both baseball and basketball under legendary coach Jack Curran. In June of 1966, Thurston was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 1966 MLB Amateur Draft. He continued his education at Seton Hall University, where he played both baseball and basketball for the Pirates. In 1970, he was awarded the John F. Kennedy Award as the school's outstanding student-athlete.

Thurston and his wife, Candice, have been married for 44 years and have two daughters, Clancy and Corey. During the offseason, he spends time with his four grandchildren, Jack, Rhone, Luke and Elsa.

ate Head Coach, the team first appeared on the WBCA Academic Top-25 as they placed tenth with an overall team grade point average of 3.456. The following season, Thurston's first as head coach, the team finished in a tie with DePaul University for second in the nation with a team grade point average of 3.625. The 2013-14 Terriers capped off a successful season with a fourth-place finish with an overall GPA of 3.608.

In addition to being named to their fourth straight WBCA Academic Top 25 Honor Roll, the Terriers earned their fourth consecutive Northeast Conference Team Institutional Award thanks in large part to having one of their student-athletes, Sarah Benedetti, being named one of 20 winners of the 13th annual Division I-AAA Athletics Directors Association (DI-AAA ADA) Scholar-Athlete Team. In 2013-14, Katie Fox, was one of 20 winners of the 12th annual Division I-AAA Athletics Directors Association (DI-AAA ADA) Scholar-Athlete Team while having 11 Terriers named to the NEC's Academic Honor and four being named to the NEC Commissioner Honor Roll in that season.

Thurston guided St. Francis Brooklyn to their best overall regular season in the program's existence. The Terriers compiled a 19-11 overall mark, the most wins in program history while posting a 10-8 conference record, which set a new school mark. Thurston's Terriers posted a 12-2 record at home, which was the best in school history. The team strung together an impressive eight game win streak that began at the 2013 University of Miami Thanksgiving Tournament consolation game against Hartford and concluded with their

#11 Rachel Iozzia

Thurston's Tidbits: "Rachel has been a real surprise, she is a former walk-on who earned a scholarship. She worked hard to get stronger; she is probably, next to Leah, our most intelligent player. She has really good long-range shooting ability; she is an outstanding passer, probably our best passer. At her size she can create problems for opposing guards, she can also play multiple positions. Rachel has given us an added dimension that we weren't expecting because she can do a lot of different things."

2014-15 (Sophomore): Named to the Northeast Conference Winter Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll... Named to the Northeast Conference Academic Honor Roll... Played a season-high 16 minutes against Sacred Heart on 1/3/15 in the Terriers NEC opener... Appeared in 17 games for St. Francis Brooklyn averaging six minutes per contest... Scored her first collegiate hoop at home against CCSU on 2/9/15... Hit a three from the top of the arc against UConn in the Terriers first-ever NCAA Tournament Game.

Prior to St. Francis Brooklyn: Iozzia, a 5-10 guard, enjoyed a stellar four-year career at Central Regional. While serving as team captain all four years, she averaged 11.4 points per game, while pulling down 1.6 rebounds per contest, and dishing nearly two assists per game. She became just the fifth female to reach the 1,000 career point plateau for the Golden Eagles, and the first one to do so in twelve years as she led Central to a 49-18 victory over Lakewood. For her career, Iozzia netted 1,103 career points, the third highest total in Central Regional school history.

Iozzia recorded the most three-pointers in a season during her freshman campaign as the Bayville native connected on 47 three-pointers. In the first round of the SJ III, Iozzia scored eight points and handed out a school single-game record 15 assists, as the Golden Eagles defeated the 14th seeded Camden Panthers, 56-27. She set the single-season assist record with 143 and left Central Regional as the all-time school leader in assists with 345. Iozzia is third in school history with 224 career steals.

Among her accolades, Iozzia was named to the 2012-13 All-Ocean County Second Team. She garnered Most Valuable Player in each of her four years in high school, while also being named Scholar Athlete. She was the recipient of the Xerox Award during her junior season.

While she was an accomplished basketball player, Iozzia was also an active member of the school's volleyball team, being named Most Valuable Player in 2010 and 2012. She racked up scholar athlete accolades for volleyball from 2010-2013, while anchoring the squad as its team captain.

Thurston's Tidbits: "Blair served in a backup role, a learning role as a freshman last year. She has to step up into a real leadership role as our point guard. She has shown tremendous improvement in her physical readiness from a year ago until today, and I think that is going to allow her to maximize her potential. She is more of a scoring point guard than Katie Fox was, so that adds a little bit of dimension to our offense, and to our system. If she can maintain the same level of defensive ability that Katie Fox showed then I think she is going to be an outstanding point guard."

Thurston's Tidbits: "We're expecting Alex to take over a major role this year, she played the most minutes of any of the freshman last year, and had some starts for us when we had our injuries. She has shown a lot of potential, she is an excellent long-range shooter; she has tremendous knowledge of the game. She picks things up easily, I just think that she is going to have an outstanding career ahead of her, and I hope that down the road she will become the next 1,000 point scorer."

Prior to St. Francis Brooklyn: Delaney, a 5-10 forward, is the third Australian signed by the Terriers' under Thurston's tenure.

Delaney has represented her country at the National Championships for six seasons. She was a member of the U18 team that won the championship in 2012, a second place finish in 2014, and a third-place showing in 2013. In the most recent National Championships, as a U-20 member, Delaney averaged 15.7 points per game while dishing out 5.3 assists. She also pulled down 6.3 rebounds per contest and shot 94.1 percent from the free-throw line.

Among her accolades, Delaney was named Player of the Tournament at the Australian Schools Tournament in 2013, NSW Youth League All Star 5 Team and Sydney Comets Warath League Best Defensive Player in 2013. She was awarded the prestigious Blue Award for her achievements in school sports and was named the Senior Basketballer of the Year for her last three years in high school. Academically, Alex received the High Achievers Award from Monte Sant' Angelo Catholic College for her achievements in the Higher School Certificate (HSC), where she achieved 99.5 out of a possible 99.9 ATAR score.

Prior to St. Francis Brooklyn: Phipps was named to NJ.com's All-Senior Second Team. Phipps scored 1,610 points in four seasons at St. Rose, including 713 in her senior campaign. She sank 153 three-pointers last season to bring her high school career total to 237 made threes. Phipps averaged 22.3 points per game in the 2014-15 campaign with 23 games of 20 or more points. She eclipsed the 30 point mark four times and scored 42 points in a contest with St. Mary's NY. Phipps opened the season with nine straight games scoring 21 or more points. Prior to St. Francis Brooklyn: In her senior season with the Holmdel Hornets, the 5-8 Ehling averaged 13.6 points per game and scored in double-digits in 16 out of 22 contests. She scored 17 or more points in eight games including two games of 22 points and 23 points against Life Center and Manalapan, respectively.

Ehling was a 1,000 Point Scorer at Holmdel. The milestone making basket came in a loss to St. John Vianney on a jump shot in the second quarter. Just like future teammate Leah Fechko, Ehling has ball theft on her mind. She recorded 29 steals in 22 games and recorded three or more steals six times, including one game with five steals against Raritan. In the Quarterfinal Round of the NJSIAA Tournament against Somerville, she scored 12 points en route to a Holmdel victory.

Ehling compiled an impressive resume at Holmdel. Her accolades include: First Team All "A" Division, Arthur Harmon MVP All-Star Game Award 2015, Holiday Tournament 2014 MVP, and Class A Central Second Team. Ehling's Hornets made it to the State Championship Game in 2014. She also competed in the Shore Basketball Coaches Association Senior All-Star Game.



Thurston's Tidbits: *"Lorraine is still a little bit behind because she missed her senior year with an injury. It's very difficult for players to overcome; it's been a long time since she's been in competition. You would say that, her skills are rusty, and her timing is off, but she plays hard and that's why we recruited her. When she gets her timing back and she is fully recovered from her injury I think she is going to turnout to be fine. It was a serious injury at the absolute worst time in her basketball development, it's going to take her a few months of getting into the competitive flow again."*

Prior to St. Francis Brooklyn: Hickman, 6-1, becomes the first New Yorker to join Thurston's squad since Jasmin Robinson '13. Hickman is a three-time All-County Athlete who finished her career by scoring nearly 1,000 points and pulling down over 500 boards. She was named to the All-State Girls 5th Team by the New York State Sports Writers Association.

Against Nassau Conference A-III rival Bethpage, Hickman scored 25 points to go along with 12 rebounds, 16 of her 25 came in the first quarter. In the 2013-14 season, Hickman recorded 11 games of 10 or more rebounds and nine double-doubles. In an interview, Floral Park Head Coach Mike Spina spoke highly of his varsity athlete, calling her one of his hardest workers he has coached in 30 years on the sidelines.

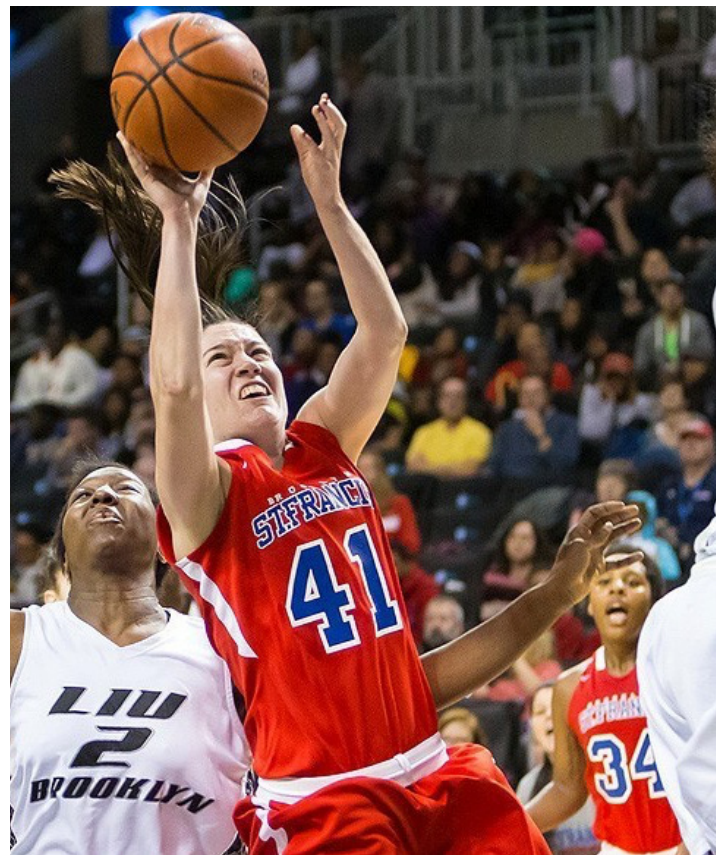

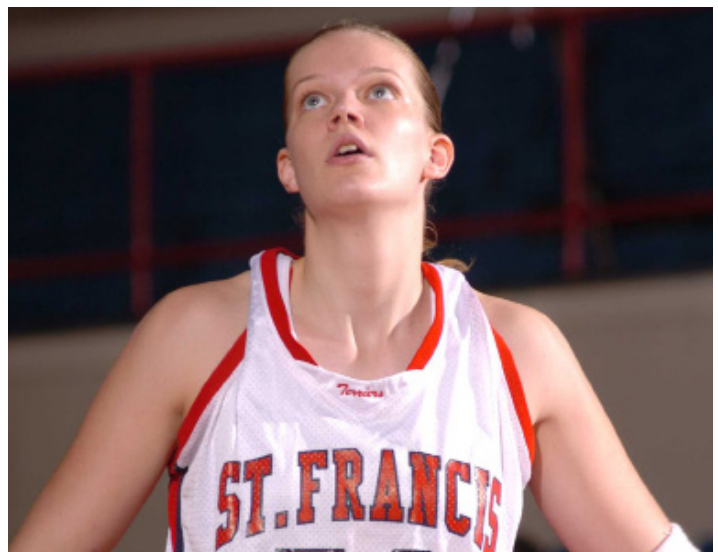
